### BEVERLEY WATER HARVEST PROJECT

The Beverley Water Harvest Project was one of fifteen projects funded through the 2015 round of the Department of Water Community Water Supply Program.

This project has come to fruition after many years of research and the coming together of a community committee who communicated the potential of a storm water harvesting project to reduce water costs to the community in an increasingly dry environment. The committee provided the knowledge in the first instance to design the system that will capture storm water at the bottom of both Edwards St and John St and be pumped to the Town Dam on Hunt Rd. The committee worked with consultant engineer, Rod Munns, Beverley Electrical Services, RA-AN Enterprises, Dawson's Concrete, other regional contractors and Shire of Beverley staff to achieve what the Department of Water described as an impressive outcome. This project will reduce our reliance on scheme water and increase capacity for irrigating public open space, public works and for emergency services. The system also enables the future possibility of providing a non potable emergency water supply during dry seasons from a standpipe system.

This project relies on the already good system of drainage that runs in the vicinity of John St, Forrest St and Edwards St. From approximately 30,000m² of street surface area and approximately 178,000m² of built infrastructure, including housing, hospital, lodge, BDHS, and natural surrounds the estimated annual water harvest volume from this project is 30,000kL. This figure is based on an average annual rainfall of 380mm.

At the official opening on Friday 10<sup>th</sup> June, the Minister for Water, Hon Mia Davies, MLA congratulated the Beverley community on making water management a priority. Department of Water representatives were impressed by the forethought of the community in taking steps to safe guard our future by developing a sustainable option to manage our water resources efficiently. #### President Report – July 2016

#### Beverley Water Harvesting Launch

On Friday 10 June 2016 the Hon Mia Davies MLA, Minister for Water; Sport and Recreation; Forestry (and Member for Central Wheatbelt) officiated the launch of Beverley's Water Harvesting Project.

Whilst Council has long considered the benefit of such a proposal, its path to realisation was finally achieved following the formation of a committee of interested community members, success in securing a Department of Water grant for \$100,000, the Shires engagement of a Development Officer to assist with projects that provide long term benefit for the community, and Council's financial and in-kind support through the budgetary process.

Congratulations to all involved, and thankyou to the many community members who attended the launch.

The Minister also made an announcement that the Beverley P&C and School had been successful with their application to the Department of Water Community Water Supply Program and would be receiving a grant of \$98,000 toward water harvesting at the school!

#### Road Works

Maintenance grading has been occurring on Edison Mill, Dale Bin North, Dobaderry, Kokedin, Kiera, Dale Kokeby and Walgy roads and the shoulders have been graded on the Top Beverley Rd. Work has been undertaken on a section of Morbinning Rd reconstructing shoulders with extra gravel and gravel sheeting will commence on Nicholas St (road to rubbish dump) in preparation for proposed bituminizing in 16/17.

#### Age Friendly Community Plan

Work on developing an Age Friendly Community Plan for Beverley is due to commence. This is supported by a successful Department of Local Government Grant and once completed will assist in future planning for our community including relevant grant applications.

#### Bus Stop Relocation – Date to be Advised

A date for relocation of the Transwa bus stop from Elizabeth St to Council Rd is yet to be advised. The cement pad at the new location has been extended to support universal access and accommodate a new shelter, which will be installed in the near future.

#### Beverley Heroic – 08/09 October 2016 – save the date!

The 2016 Beverley Heroic cycling event was recently announced as one of the successful applicants from the 16/17 round of Regional Events Scheme. In its third year the event is increasing in popularity, bringing many visitors to Beverley and the Avon Valley. Community organisations may apply for Minor Grants in each of the funding rounds, however, each grant must be for a separate project. (Where an organisation applies for more than one Minor Grant they must prioritise their applications).

#### CAP ON LOCAL GOVERNMENT RATES FOR PENSIONERS FROM 2016-17

#### What's changing?

The State Government has approved a \$750 cap for local government rates applying to pensioner households as of 1 July 2016.

Local governments are required by legislation to implement this policy change on behalf of the Government when they issue rates notices to affected pensioners.

This means your local government rates notice now includes a concession that is the lesser of \$750 or 50 per cent of the rates payable.

For pensioner water service charge concessions, the capped limit is \$600.

The 2015-16 Budget originally announced that the 50 per cent concession available to pensioners on their local government rates and water service charges was to be capped to \$550 and \$600 respectively with effect from 1 July 2016. After listening to community concerns and stakeholder groups, including the Western Australian Self-Funded Retirees Association Inc, the Government increased the cap for local government rates to \$750.

Note: Seniors cardholder rates concessions remain unchanged at 25 per cent up to a capped amount, as has been the case for many years.

#### Why is this happening?

The population of senior citizens in Western Australia is expected to increase from its current 458,000 to 865,000 in the next two decades. Supporting an ageing population is a significant policy challenge faced by all levels of government.

To ensure social concessions are better targeted and concessions provided by the State are sustainable over the longer term, the Government has made the difficult decision to cap the amount of the concession allowed for pensioners on their local government rates and water service charges.

Difficult and necessary decisions such as these changes ensure that the State's finances remain sustainable, while at the same time continuing to deliver high quality services and infrastructure to the Western Australian community.





# SHIRE OF BEVERLEY IMPORTANT INFORMATION

The Shire of Beverley wishes to remind residents who occupy a property within the Beverley townsite of the following Local Health Law:

#### Roosters, Geese, Turkeys, Peafowl's and Gamebirds

5.4.4 (1) An occupier of premises within a townsite that is not zoned 'Rural Residential', 'Rural Townsite', 'Special Rural' or 'Farming', shall not without the written approval of the Council, keep or permit to be kept on those premises, any one or more of the following fowl -

- a) A rooster;
- b) A goose or gander;
- c) A turkey
- d) A peacock or peahen;
- e) A gamebird (includes emus and ostriches)
- (2) The Council may upon written application, grant approval with or without conditions to the owner or occupier of premises to keep any one or more birds as specified in subsection (1) of this section.
- (3) A person who has been granted approval under this Section to keep a bird may keep the bird on the premises only while he is the occupier thereof.
- (4) The Council may revoke an approval granted under this Section if it is of the opinion that the keeping of the birds specified in the approval is causing a nuisance or is injurious offensive or dangerous to health.

Penalties may apply for non-compliance

#### Ruins & Restoration: Homes and Townsites to the East of Beverley

Beverley Historical Society Field Trip - 23 May 2016

Members of the Beverley Historical Society were joined by family and friends on a fine fresh day to examine some of the ruined dwellings and almost deserted townsites out to the east and northeast of Beverley. We ventured over into the Shire of Quairading as many local & Beverley farming families eg Minchin, Hastings, Draper, Murray, Morgan, Louden, Aiken, Veitch - had utilised the facilities available closer to home in times gone by.




Out first stop was the Lonely Grave of Jack Natup, a Native Assistant Policeman who was, according to the old plaque, "speared by natives at East Beverley" in June 1888. He was buried in a paddock just off the Beverley-Mawson Rd at East Beverley

and in 1980 the Beverley Historical Society further preserved the gravesite by the addition of a concrete surround.

A few hundred metres on the right is the East Beverley Historical Site. The cairn there has the Foundation Stone of the Agricultural Hall, laid in 1896 by Mrs E Powell with Edwards Evans, Architect and T Davey, Contractor. Another plaque recalls the East Beverley School of




1904 to 1923 with first pupils from Barndon, Bateman, Draper, Hastings, Heal & Smith families. The school was purported to be held in the Hall but local residents maintain the school was a separate building across the road. The hall was in sad disrepair before it was demolished.



Turning onto the Balkuling Rd then Glencoe Rd we identified the **ruins of Ivydale** homestead, the home Donell Draper built before WW1. The house, as described by Marion Alexander in 2006, was constructed of red bricks laid end-to-end for three courses with the fourth course laid the opposite way. There are only two rooms with a passage-way still standing. Floorless and roofless, a chimney rears up at each end of this rectangular building.

On to Balkuling town site once a thriving community with a rail siding, wheat bin, Co-op, post office, school, hall, garage, tennis courts, golf course & cottages. Balkuling (named after Balcooling Spring) became a locality in the 1890s with the townsite surveyed in 1919. Streets were named Minchin, Morgan, Young, McDonald and Hatfield.

The railway opened in 1908, with a siding, wheat handling operations and Balkuling listed as a Post Receival Office from 1909.

The now **ruined Post Office**, listed as an attended office from 1925, operated in a house that had the telephone exchange as well. The first public telephone was on Minchin's verandah.



The Co-op opened in 1920 on a part-time basis until 1925 when a full-time manager was appointed. Up to 5 staff were employed including Kath Veitch, Daphne Murray and Avis Minchin.

The Balkuling Agriculture Hall opened in June 1922 with a mixed sports program followed by tea and a dance till midnight. It served the district well with dances, balls, church services, school, film shows, political meetings, polling booth for elections and at least one wedding.



Balkuling School was established in the Hall from 1922 with some closings and openings due to fluctuating attendance figures. The first pupils came from the Fowler, Aitken, Horne, Morgan & Veitch families. In cold weather school was held in the Hall kitchen with the wood stove going. A purpose built school was moved from Bellakabella in 1947 & used until schooling ceased in 1977. This building still stands and has been used by community groups such as Landcare over the years. We had morning tea at the school.



Jacob's Well was our next destination. The Government Well is still there but the school, hall, store, railway buildings & wheat bins are gone. There is a plaque marking the school site but it is not readily accessible.



On nearby Clulow Rd is a sizable ruin of an old mud **brick house** believed to belong to the Baty family. The farm block had access to Clulow Rd in the north & Batys Rd to the south.



From there we ventured into Quairading Shire and on to Toapin Weir where we had lunch. The weir was full of water after all the early rain and the picnic area has been well-maintained and improved over the years. Information boards describe the local flora & fauna; and tell the story of the Weir originally an AA Dam (Agricultural Area Dam) but now used to supplement scheme water.

Our final destination was the historic townsite of Dangin that has a guided tourist trail with comprehensive information signs. Dangin was the main town in the area for a couple of decades at the beginning of the C20th before Quairading became the preferred business centre. Dangin now has a handful of nicely-restored houses and a beautiful red brick church - the old Methodist Church.

# BEVERLEY PATCHWORKERS AND QUILTERS

One stitch at a time is a sure way to create beautiful quilts along with much dedication and commitment.

Amanda began her current project at the beginning of last year and while she has completed other quilts and projects along the way she continues to return to her beautiful Baltimore patterned quilt.

Amanda's quilt has been taken from a Karen Cunningham design featuring a replica of a wreath block originally made in the 1860s which the designer has called The Jester.



The center of the quilt will have four repeats of the block shown in the photo, then surrounded by two boarders, the inner boarder is machined triangles and the outer boarder will be appliqued panels.

The patterns are appliqued. Every piece is traced onto kitchen paper which is ironed onto the fabric, cut out leaving extra for a hem and the edges fold under before being blind hemmed, by hand onto the back ground fabric. The finished quilt is 80" square so there is a lot of work to do. The second photo shows the beginning details of the outer boarder.

#### Lyme Disease Association of Australia

What is Lyme disease?

Lyme disease is an infection caused by a bacteria known as *Borrelia*. The bacteria, a spirochete, is transmitted when an individual is bitten by a vector e.g. tick. Lyme disease can impact many bodily systems and organs and can in some cases mimic other illnesses e.g. Lupus. As well as giving people Lyme Disease, the ticks often also transmit other diseases (<u>co-infections</u>).

#### Like syphilis, Borrelia is a great imitator.

The clinical symptoms of chronic, stage 3 Lyme Borreliosis can imitate many chronic diseases including motor neurone disease, multiple sclerosis, Parkinson's disease, Alzheimer's, fibromyalgia and chronic fatigue syndrome.

These chronic diseases are on the rise for reasons unknown. The Nobel Prize laureate Luc Montagnier has stated "chronic diseases = chronic infections" as an increasing number of scientific articles present, the evidence is building.



Borreliosis has a myriad of symptoms. These symptoms can start a week after a tick bite or much later, and include sinusitis, stiff neck, sweat attacks, muscle twitches, muscle weakness, involuntary jerking of limbs, arthritis, Bell's palsy, cramps, paralysis, depression, brain fog, insomnia, balance problems, light sensitivity, noise sensitivity, optic neuritis, nerve conduction defects, numbness, ECG (cardiac conduction) abnormalities, swallowing difficulties, tinnitus and more.

It can also be asymptomatic (no symptoms), the major determinants being the load and type of bacteria present and the immune status of the individual.

Working with Warriors an Innovative Approach to Men's Wellbeing and Health and in particular Mental Wellbeing

The Regional Men's Health Initiative is a state-wide program empowering men and communities to take responsibility for their wellbeing and health.

This program's primary role is community education on men's holistic wellbeing.

This is delivered in three ways:

- Warrior Education Sessions;
- Fast Track Pit Stop;
- Advocacy.

The RMHI emphasis is on men's holistic wellbeing and health, which means the whole person and understanding problems/issues in the context of life. When we consider the individual we believe we are more than just physical and mental beings, the often neglected element is our "social/spiritual" wellbeing. We promote the requirement that it is important to know and understand the story behind our identity and what it is that makes us an individual.

Modern Western Medicine is too often about:

- Diagnosing ills;
- Prescribing pills; and
- Sending bills

The "human factor" can get lost in the medical mix.

It has been said to me in the past that the definition of a good accountant is, "they get to know the people in the business"; this is no different to the functioning of a good doctor or specialist. In the work we do this is obvious, especially in the case of both the diagnosis and marketing of mental health issues.

We talk about "situational distress", which is the space between being well and being diagnosed with a mental illness. Quite often we fail to

realize that most mental illnesses start from situations that are unresolved in our lives. Sometimes we have to allow people, in particular blokes, to be in this space which is about people having a "normal reaction to an abnormal event".

Often men know the issues but we don't want to show ourselves as the "only one" with a problem. Men in particular struggle because we think we are failing, rather than realizing we are battling issues beyond our making and/or control. A lot of the time it is about giving blokes permission and pointing blokes in the right direction to seek the best medical advice the can.

Blokes are warriors and that winning and macho attitude is very prevalent which often inhibits help seeking behaviour and can contribute to delays in men getting to the doctors. In regional areas the distance factor and lack of services also plays a role.

Our slogan "...before it all gets too much...Talk to a Mate!!" is the basis of all our initiatives. Mateship, empathy and appropriate use of humour is the key to connectedness in our programs and presentations. We don't do health assessment but we do health awareness, which is quite often the missing link.



#### Rehabilitation at Avondale bushland reserve

Sarah Gosney from consultancy Wandoo Environmental has been contracted by the National Trust to manage acquittal of a State NRM grant for Avondale Discovery Farm. Key tasks for this Grant include managing the acquittal of the \$14,000 grant that was applied for back in September 2016, Sarah's tasks will include liaising with stakeholders and to co-ordinate volunteer and in-kind support.

The grant outputs include, photo-point monitoring, feral animal control, an updated fauna survey, installation of new gates and the mending of fencing, weed control, revegetation. look into the installation of cages and the use of Elliott traps with the guidance of infrared camera traps; and place nesting boxes within the reserve and habitat installation

Farm warden Mon has undertaking some baiting but at present it is on hold due to the lambing season. The impact has been difficult to quantify as the reserve gates are left open to allow movement of kangaroos in and out.

The grant will fund fauna monitoring with installation of camera traps, cages and additional fox bait to help maintain a more definitive estimate of the quantity of native and introduced animals within reserve at any one time. Baiting and trapping will continue after lambing season. To help reduce the feral cat population along with fox control.

Fence inspections are regularly conducted and have identified areas where repair is needed. New reserve gates have been installed

and vermin proofed. It is proposed that fence repairs are undertaken by volunteers on a planned community day on 16 July. The work will include cutting fallen branches that are resting on the fence; reattaching skirting layers; add missing skirting to an area on the eastern boundary, and pegging skirting and filling holes dug under the fence.

It is also proposed that habitat within the reserve be improved through the installation of nesting boxes and creation of habitat in the form of logs etc. along the walk trail path. Fallen log habitats can be created by securely stacking a pile of sturdy branches together near the base of a tree or near rock piles that are naturally occurring.

Photo points have been established to monitor progress of the reserve rehabilitation that was carried out back in early 2014. Recent photos show that previous revegetation appears to have been successful along the majority of the north-western border.

The ultimate goal of the revegetation is to protect the interior part of the reserve from seed blown in from the neighbouring farmlands. New plantings will be understory and ground cover plants along the north-western border and within bare patches along the southern border.

Beginning a seedbank with collected seed from the reserve as well as a herbarium to document plant species would be a good start to developing independent seed propagation for the reserve and the use of a building on site is being

investigated for this purpose in the future.

A revegetation plan is currently being created to follow on from work undertaken and ensure retention of the conservation values of the bushland into the future. Weed spraying has been undertaken prior to the community day when volunteers are needed to help with the proposed planting.

Bonfire piles have been created within the reserve as the quantity of dry wood is a dangerous fire risk. The current weather conditions have made lighting difficult. Planting trials will need to be run on the burnt areas. A controlled burn that will successfully avoid both the priority 4 flora and the Jam trees (acacia accuminata) has been surveyed. It would remove a very large quantity of dead wood from the reserve and encourage recruitment of dormant seed within the seed bank. When weather and ground conditions are ideal, DFES and the Emergency response team from Beverley have agreed to help with a prescribed burn.

A community day will be held at Avondale on 16 July with assistance from the National Trust, Avondale Farm Project Association, Beverley Naturalist Club and Men of the Trees. She has exhibited in numerous exhibitions, the most notable being at Sculptures by the Sea, Cottesloe from 2011 to 2014 and Bondi in 2013.

On 06 - the 9 July Susan Payne plus three others from the WA Watercolour Society will be at the Gallery with an exhibition of their works so please call in to view their painting during gallery hours or if the sign is out on the pavement.

Arriving July 12 is Dr Myer Taub who was to return for a two month stay mid-June, bringing with him three other artists, but due to work and travel constraints the time has now been shortened to just one month.

Dr. Myer Taub is a lecturer in the Drama Department at the University of Pretoria, South Africa, where he teaches a variety of courses in the theatre and performance studies programs. His research scope includes areas such as Performance as Research (PaR), identity, performance as intervention and artistic practice within the theme of garbage and waste. He is a core researcher in the Capitol Cities Project, based at the University of Pretoria and a research leader in the Social Life of Waste Art, (SLOW) network based in the





Southern African region. His international network includes being part a member of the PaR Working Group based within the International Federation of Theatre Research. Outside of the university he actively works in areas such as theatre making, live art - performance projects situated in museums and heritage sites and places concerned with the environmental humanities.

He is will be based at the Beverley Arts Station from July 13 where he will be working on several art performance projects with themes associated with treasure, presence and collaboration.

He will also be bringing along to Beverley during his residency tenure at Beverley several Australian and South African artists including Andrew Lamprecht from the Michaelis School of the Arts who in in collaboration with Dr. Myer Taub, has been exploring the intersection of performance, fantastical fiction, fine art and the nature of historicity in a series of deeply researched performances in South Africa over the last decade. The opportunity to extend this art-esearch in Beverley will allow the work to break the bounds of a South African context and highlight links that exist between the two countries.

Additionally, the type of site-specific performance that will be produced aims to open up new and different modes of fine art per formative practice, embedded in an understanding and exploration of the local landscape and drawing in collaborators from both South Africa and Australia.

Professor Alain Said, originally from the University of Talagashee, New Zealand now based in Cape Town is an independent scholar in art history and artefact will present some of his seminal findings on the relationship between Ley-Lines, Charles Darwin, the Occult, UFOs and The Holy Grail at the Beverley Town Hall, Shire of Beverley, Western Australia on Friday 29<sup>th</sup> and Saturday 30<sup>th</sup> July. 





# **Backups**

It is now more than ever critical that you do regular backups of your files. Backups are the only protection from catastrophic PC failure, your own mistakes, and the worst effects of a severe virus attack.

### Why Backup

**PC Hard Drive Failure:** Hard drive failure is common (I've had 6 fail but always have backups). Files may be recoverable from a failed hard drive but this is not guaranteed, **and** inspection and recovery will cost more than \$1000. On my current PC the hard drive failed when it was only 9 months old.

**Crypto Viruses:** A PC can be infected with a Crypto virus, the worst virus on the Internet (check on Google). Criminals encrypt all your files so they are unusable, then demand a ransom to restore your files. If you don't pay, your files will be lost forever. Even if you pay there is no guarantee getting your files back - you are dealing with untraceable criminals. Some of my clients have lost some or all of their files as they had no up-to-date backup.

**PC Repair:** One of my clients unintentionally invited someone into their PC for online repair. When he refused to pay, the 'repairer' left malicious software on the PC. When I tried to remove the malicious software, it caused the PC to reload the operating system, destroying all the user files. I had backed-up first so all the files could be restored.

Your own mistakes: It is easy to make mistakes while you are working on your PC. You can accidentally delete

files or overwrite files.

### What and When to Backup

You do not need to back up everything on your PC. The system files and programs can always be restored from within the PC or from the Internet. However, it is important to back up all the user files for all users of the PC. Otherwise this information cannot be recovered if it is not backed up.

Regular backups on an external drive are the only way to guarantee not losing your files. I recommend backing-up at least once a week – you never know when something will go wrong. For a business consider backing -up daily.

Only connect the backup drive while you are backing-up or recovering files. If you leave a backup drive connected then a Crypto virus can encrypt your backup as well as the PC files.

Do not back up to the internal hard drive in the PC - if something goes wrong your backup may be destroyed Do you have a Backup Drive?

If you don't have an external back-up hard drive — do yourself a favour and go and buy one as soon as possible. A 1 Terabyte drive will cost about \$90 online or in a store.




