SHIRE OF BEVERLEY PRESIDENT REPORT - SEPTEMBER 2016



Pay Rates by Monday 12 September to Receive Discount Don't forget to pay your rates in full by the due date, Monday 12 September 2016, to be entitled to receive a 10% discount.

Telstra Towers Upgrades

Telstra representatives briefed Council prior to the July 2016 Council meeting and advice has since been received that the following Telstra tower sites are approved and funded to be upgraded. Providing no unforeseen circumstances they are scheduled to proceed this year as follows:

Beverley 4GX upgrade to be completed in September/October, Mawson 4GX upgrade to be completed in September/October, and Westdale 4GX upgrade to be completed in December/ January.

There will be an outage to base stations during the day when the upgrade occurs and further information will be provided closer to the relevant dates to let the community know when and why this is happening.

Regional Grants Scheme

The Shire was successful with an application to the Royalties for Regions Regional Grants Scheme, receiving \$195,000 towards the Beverley Cornerstone project.

Bushfire Risk and Management

The issue of bushfire risk and management is a concern which Council takes seriously and the following may be of interest:-

- Beverley has 8 Volunteer Fire Control Officers (FCO) whose services are highly valued, as are those of volunteer bushfire fighters throughout the Beverley and surrounding Shires. FCO details are on the Shire website www.beverley.wa.gov.au
- The Shire engaged a Community Emergency Services Manager (CESM) in 2011, a role shared and part funded by the Shires of Beverley and York and largely funding by DFES. Amongst other things, the CESM assists our FCOs' and the Local Emergency Management Committee (LEMC)
- Subsequent to a bushfire risk management workshop attended by the President and CEO in 2014, and a register of interest by the Shire, Beverley is one of the first Shires to receive total funding to engage a Bush Fire Risk Management Planning Coordinator for the period required to undertake the task of relevant mapping in our Shire
- Firebreak Order Following a review by the FCO's and endorsement by Council a new requirement for small landholdings has been included in the firebreak order requiring all rural properties in the Shire equal to or less than 100ha to construct and maintain a 2.2m firebreak along all external boundaries, or provide on the property an operational, independent mobile water filled fire-fighting unit of not less than 650lt to be at the ready during the Prohibited and Restricted burning period. (Note:- exemption applies when small landholdings are managed by a neighbouring

landholder for agricultural purposes and this information is provided to the Shire in writing). The Firebreak Order is available in the Shire of Beverley Information booklet sent out with rate notices, on the Shire website or at the Shire Office

- The recent August Council meeting was delayed by 2 hours to enable Councillors Alexander, Gogol and Shaw and the CEO to attend a breakfast presentation by Waroona Bushfire Special Inquirer, Euan Ferguson. This was followed by a workshop to inform the WA Local Government Associations advocacy to the State Government regarding the Emergency Services Levy
- The Beverley Community Resource Centre is working with the Shire CESM to host a community safety event in the near future.

Swimming Pool Condition

Our beloved swimming pool (which was opened in 1962) is starting to need a little more than just TLC. I hope the community will get behind the Shire as we work through a planning process to determine what will be required to keep a swimming pool in Beverley for another 55 (and more) years. Details on page 3 in the Blarney.

Beverley Hospital Upgrade Works

It is very pleasing for our community that work proposed for Beverley Health Service has gone to tender and is anticipated to commence before the end of 2016. The upgrades include emergency department, nurses station, kitchen, front entrance and some bathroom facilities. Once the work commences the hospital will be functioning as per normal, with every endeavour to reduce inconvenience. I'm sure our tolerance and support will be greatly appreciated by the staff during this busy but exciting time.

<u>Avondale</u>

The Shire and National Trust WA continue to work together with the aim of community engagement and information regarding Avondale in the near future. Please review last month's Blarney which includes 2011 Avondale Masterplan proposed works. Congratulations and thankyou to those involved with the recent planting day and ongoing work in the Avondale bush reserve.

BEVERLEY MEMORIAL SWIMMING POOL REPAIRS & FEASIBILITY STUDY – COMMUNITY INFORMATION

The Beverley Memorial Swimming Pool was built in 1962 and has provided the community with over 50 summers of aquatic enjoyment. Over the last 8 weeks the Pool Manager and Shire have noticed a severe decline in the water level of the swimming pools.

A specialist company were called in to investigate any possible leaks and it was discovered that the main pool has major leaks on two control joints spanning the width of the pool. The Shire of Beverley is now obtaining quotes to make interim repairs to the pool, enabling it to remain open over the 2016/17 summer.

Information to date indicates that the Beverley Swimming Pool will need to be either rebuilt or replaced in the future. The Shire of Beverley will engage a consultant to prepare a Feasibility Study with community engagement to support grant funding. Some important points to consider during this process are:

- The approximate cost of replacing a swimming pool is \$2 to \$4 million.
- Does the community still want or need a 50m pool or should a smaller pool at a reduced cost be considered?
- Would groups/clubs/individuals consider fundraising or contributing to a new pool?

Community information will continue to be distributed via the Blarney as repairs are made and a Feasibility Consultant appointed.



MAKING THE CHANGE ASSOCIATIONS INCORPORATION ACT 2015 WORKSHOP

On 01 July 2016 the new Associations Incorporation Act 2015 came into effect. The new law will replace the current Associations Incorporation Act 1987.

The requirement of the new law means that all associations will need to amend their rules.

DEVELOPMENT OF BEVERLEY AVIATION DISPLAY ON HUNT ROAD (& DEMOLITION OF AERONAUTICAL MUSEUM)

The Beverley Aviation History Interpretation Project has evolved through the planning for the construction of the Beverley Cornerstone building which will see the Beverley Aeronautical Museum (and old Infant Health Building) demolished and its collection relocated. This project recognises the perceived, promotional advantage of retaining the Vampire jet on Hunt Road and involves protecting the plane from the elements and displaying information from the Aeronautical Museum about local Beverley aviation history. Interpretative signage incorporated into the design of the shelter for the plane will showcase this <u>local</u> aviation history. Information provided in the Significance Assessment for the Beverley Aeronautical Collection (January 2016) will guide this interpretation.

Beverley is home to a number of museums and collections, all of which are only available to the public through the tireless efforts of a declining number of volunteers. By establishing a self-guided point of interest, this project will create an economically sustainable and relevant attraction. The display will serve as a link to a small aviation display in the new Visitor Information Centre at the Beverley Cornerstone.

Further to this project, the Amana memorial will be relocated to the new display area on Hunt Road, the second Vampire jet and any remaining items in the collection will be returned to donors (if possible) or relocated from Beverley and recognition of the origins of the Aeronautical Museum as a home for the Silver Centenary will be included within the Beverley Cornerstone development. Dependant on funding, a scale model of the Silver Centenary is an option that may be considered for the Cornerstone building.

IMPORTANT CHANGES TO THE SHIRE OF BEVERLEY FIREBREAK ORDER

RURAL RESIDENTS AND RURAL LAND

All rural properties equal to or less than 100 hectares in size are required to have constructed and maintained a 2.2 metre firebreak clear of all flammable material along all external boundaries **or** provision on the property of an operational independent mobile water filled firefighting unit with the water capacity of not less than 650 litres to be at the ready throughout the Prohibited and Restricted burning period.

Note: An exemption applies when the small landholding is managed by a neighbouring/adjoining landholder for agricultural purposes and this information is to be provided to the Shire in writing by the landowner.



Firebreak Order 2016/2017

Pursuant to Section 33 of the Bush Fires Act 1954, all residents and ratepayers within the Shire of Beverley are required to clear a fire break of all flammable material in their land as set out below. Due Date: 1 November 2016

Maintained Until: 15 April 2017

FAILURE TO COMPLY MAY RESULT IN A FINE OR PROSECUTION

TOWNSITE LAND

All lots with an area of 2.012ha (5 acres) or less, shall be clear of all flammable material or have grass mown to a height no greater than 15cm.

All lots or combination of lots that comprise of one holding and having an area greater than 2.012ha (5acres) shall be either clear of all flammable material or have a firebreak 2.2 metres wide free of all flammable material inside and along all external boundaries.

RURAL RESIDENTS AND RURAL LAND

All rural properties equal to or less than 100 hectares in size are required to have constructed and maintained a 2.2 metre firebreak clear of all flammable material along all external boundaries <u>or</u> provision on the property of an operational independent mobile water filled firefighting unit with the water capacity of not less than 650 litres to be at the ready throughout the Prohibited and Restricted burning period.

Note: An exemption applies when the small landholding is managed by a neighbouring/adjoining landholder for agricultural purposes and this information is to be provided to the Shire in writing by the landowner.

A fire break of at least 4 metres wide and not more than 60 metres from the perimeter of all buildings (including temporary dwelling e.g. caravans) and/or haystacks or groups of buildings and/or haystacks so as to completely surround the building, haystacks and/or fuel drums.

A fire break 20 metres wide shall be maintained immediately inside the external boundaries of all land which has been bulldozed, chained or prepared in ant similar manner for clearing by burning (whether it is intended to burn the bush or not).

PLANTATIONS

- All plantations firebreaks must be maintained.
- All new plantations and extensions to current plantations must have minimum 6 metre fire break installed on all boundaries.

FIREBREAK VARIATIONS

If for any reason it is considered impractical to clear firebreaks on any land as required by this Order a Firebreak Variation can be applied for. All requests for variations must be received at the Shire Office by 01 October 2016. The request must be in writing and provide a sketch of the property with existing fire breaks and the proposed alterative.

If permission is granted it will be in writing and shall remain valid until revoked.





BEVERLEY PATCHWORKERS AND QUILTERS

Many of you may have viewed our beautiful quilts hanging on the Saturday of the Beverley Show. Some, just completed, had not yet been seen even by the group ladies. It was quite a special occasion for their first airing. We hope you enjoyed then as much as we did.

Two of our of ladies have recently completed 'Rag Quilts'. Denise made hers from a pack of cotton material with a bee theme which she acquired from a quilting trip we made last year, and Bette made hers from a flannelette fabric which even looks warm for our cool winter nights.

Rag Quilts usually have their blocks completed with batting, backing and quilting before they are sewn together. The blocks are joined with a wide seam exposed to the front of the quilt. The frill is then cut every inch or so to create a ragged look. When it is washed more fraying occurs and all this gives the quilt an interesting appearance.





Connecting to the Internet

There are several different ways you can connect to the Internet. What is available and the cost will depend where you are and what service you use.

ADSL

Asymmetric Digital Subscriber Lines are connected via your Telstra phone line. This service is reasonably priced, has a good bandwidth allowance, good performance and is the most reliable service (unless there is a cable fault in the area, e.g. a cable pit is flooded). This service is only available in the central area of the Beverley town site. If you have an ADSL service, don't change it, you have the best.

Wireless NBN

The National Broadband Network wireless broadband service was implemented in Beverley last year. This is a fixed wireless data service which can also come with a phone. The service is currently only available in the outer part of the Beverley town site but coverage will be extended to cover the whole town site. However, there are some dead spots as the antenna is low down, near the old race track. This service is only installed in the home, you cannot roam around using it. This service is also reasonably priced, has a good bandwidth allowance, good performance and is reliable. There are a number of providers for this service so you need to do an investigation on the Internet and chose a service provider that whose price and service suits you.

Installing a New Data Services?

If you are installing a new data service in your home get the installer to demonstrate it that it works on **your PC**. A demonstration on the installers PC is not good enough. If the service is not working correctly on your PC it can take weeks of frustrating phone calls to get it fixed.

Satellite NBN

The new NBN satellite service is now available across the whole of Australia. The satellite is positioned over the centre of Australia and is wholly owned by the NBN, unlike earlier satellites which were shared with other countries. If you live in a country area this is the only service available that gives a good bandwidth allowance, good performance and a reliable service. Installation is free in country areas. Most people using the new satellite are very satisfied with the service, although there have been some issues with support. There are 8 service providers providing a range of services. Contact me for a copy of my analysis of the costs.

Mobile Broadband

This service is based on mobile networks. Only Telstra, Boost, Optus and the Optus resellers provide service in Beverley. However, there is no 4G service and service is non-existent in many parts of the Shire. The service is expensive (more than 7 times other services), has a low upper capacity limit and has extremely poor service during the daytime in Beverley due to heavy usage by smart phones and tablets. However, it is the most flexible service as it can be used anywhere in Australia where there is 3G/4G mobile coverage.

Backyard Buddies

Bees – friend and foe

As the weather warms and spring arrives, it's a good time to talk about the European honey bee (Apis mellifera) and how you can help protect Western Australia's bee industry by reporting unfamiliar bees or insects.

Honey bees are familiar to most of whether us. through visiting our gardens, being trod on at local the swimming pool or avoiding a bee swarm in spring. They're also more

commonly seen than the estimated 2000

native bee species we have in Australia. As the name suggests, European honey bees are not native to Australia and were first introduced by early European settlers to supply honey. Today, in addition to the production of honey, bees provide important pollination services for our horticulture and agriculture sectors. Thirty five industries depend on honey bee pollination for most of their production.

Unfortunately, honey bees have also become an invasive species colonising most of Australia. Having left their man-made beehives, these wild or 'feral' bees can out-compete native insects for floral resources, disrupt native pollinators and displace endemic wildlife such as birds and possums from their homes in tree hollows or artificial nest boxes.

Unless you have a beekeeper with beehives living nearby, your flowers, fruit trees and vegetables are most likely being visited (and pollinated) by feral bees.

During spring, bee swarms are often seen as bees leave their parent colony in search for a new home. This can cause concern to property owners if that new home is in your wall cavity, compost bin or letter box. Honey bee workers may also sting people and domesticated animals when defending themselves or their hive. Their sting may trigger allergic reactions in some people, which can sometimes be life threatening.

As with most pests, a balance must be struck. In this case the cost and benefits of providing local pollination versus environmental protection, health and safety.

It's also important to understand that the removal or destruction of problematic bee swarms or hives in domestic, recreational or bushland/conservation areas poses little to no impact on the health of the bee industry in WA.

To support the WA honey, horticulture and agricultural industries and continue to enjoy home grown produce, we need to protect the health of all bees. The

greatest health threat to our bees comes from the entry and spread of exotic pests and diseases.

For assistance with bee removal contact a licensed pest controller, local apiarist or see the WA Apiarist Society's website (waas.org.au) for a list of swarm collectors.

How you can help

If you find dead bees or can safely take close up photos (especially showing the vein pattern of their wings) please send these to us with the location and a brief description. We screen samples and photographic reports for exotic bees and pests not yet present in WA, such as the honey bee, Apis Asian cerana (established in far north Queensland). bumble bee, Bombus terrestris (common in Tasmania) and varroa mites, Varroa destructor and Varroa jacobsoni (the latter species was recently detected on Asian honey bees in QLD).

Before sending in samples, please contact us (phone or email) so we can provide tailored advice to your situation. To find more information on bees – see our website agric.wa.gov.au and search 'bee'.

The Department's Pest and Disease Information Service (PaDIS) screens enquiries for new weeds, pests and plant diseases, which could negatively impact the success of WA's local horticulture and agricultural industries and the ability to grow home produce.





Date and Muesli Slice



Ingredients

- olive or canola oil spray
- 2 medium apples, core removed, coarsely grated with skin on
- 1/3 cup water
- 1/4 cup margarine
- 2 cups dates, seeded
- 2 cups natural muesli
- 1/2 cup plain flour
- 1/2 cup wholemeal plain flour
 1 tsp ground cinnamon

Method

- 1) Preheat oven to 180°C (160°C fan forced).
- 2) Lightly spray a slice tin (approx. 25x30cm) with oil.
- 3) Add apple, water, margarine and dates to a small saucepan and bring to the boil.
- 4) Reduce heat, cover and simmer for a further 5 minutes until the apple is soft.
- 5) Cook uncovered for a further 5 minutes and stir occasionally until mixture thickens to a paste-like consistency.
- 6) While apple and date mixture is cooking, place muesli in a large frypan. Stir over low heat for 5 minutes until lightly browned.
- 7) Sift flours into a large bowl, returning husk remaining in the sieve to the bowl.
- 8) Add cinnamon and muesli to the flours and mix to combine.
- 9) Stir into the date mixture then spoon into prepared tin.
- 10) Bake for 20 minutes until firm.
- 11) Cool in tin before cutting.

As part of my Immune boosting series we will look into the colours Red/Blue/Purple.

Red fruits and vegetables are coloured by a natural plant pigment called lycopene.

Purple/Blue in plants is created by a plant pigment called anthocyanins. This is also an antioxidant and protects cells from damage; they help reduce the risk of cancer and stroke. Antioxidants fight diseases and promote good health. Red, Purple and Blue Fruits and Vegetables may prevent Stroke and protect from Alzheimer's, they may even slow down the aging process. Eating the Blues can keep you healthy, feeling young and should be eaten as often as possible.

Beet Salad with Carrot, Quinoa & Spinach

1 cup cooked Quinoa 1/3 cup slivered almonds, pepitas or sunflower seeds toasted

- 1 medium raw beet, peeled
- 1 medium to large carrot peeled (or 1 additional beet)

2 cups packed baby spinach or other greens

1 small avocado, cubed

Vinaigrette

3 tablespoons apple cider vinegar, 2 tablespoons lime or lemon juice, 2 tablespoons olive oil, 1 tablespoon chopped fresh mint or cilantro, 2 tablespoons honey or maple syrup, ½ to 1 teaspoon Dijon mustard to taste, ¼ teaspoon salt, freshly ground black pepper *Instructions*

Toast nuts or seeds in a small skillet over medium heat, stirring frequently to prevent burning until they turn golden on the edge, about 5 minutes. Transfer to a large serving bowl to cool.

Prepare the vinaigrette: whisk together all of the ingredients until emulsified.

Assemble the salad ingredients, toss gently and finally drizzle dressing over the mixture, toss gently again. You might not need all of the vinaigrette.

Our previous bashes have clearly been popular as this year there are 8 choirs singing!! The president of Voice Moves, Leonie Thorogood, who organizes the event, has indicated that this event has again proved popular with choirs around the state, by saying she "can ALWAYS rely on at least a couple to pull out but this time - no-one is!!! So it will still be a big afternoon of singing even without the primary school" (yes, our Beverley School Choir is unfortunately unavailable this year).

Because of the increase in people expected on the day Beverley Station Arts is calling for volunteers to help bake for the afternoon tea we offer. Sponge cakes are particularly in demand but anything is welcome!

From the 28 - 31 August I have been invited by CircuitWest to attend the Performing Arts Exchange in Melbourne which I am very much looking forward to as I am keen to experience all that PAX has to offer in regards to networking and development, and the opportunity to explore new ways for audiences to see and experience live performance.

We had a taste of live street performance in Beverley with our South African artists-in-residence and those who attended TIME FLIES AND THE VAMPIRE OF HUNT ST can surely attest its uniqueness and engaging style. Well, Dr Myer Taub his colleagues Andrew Lamprecht, Palesa Matabane, and photographer Aliza Levi from Melbourne promised to produce some contemporary work whilst here and this they

did with performance projects themed on treasure, presence and collaboration. Myer reflected that Time Flies proved to be developmental for its process as an innovative social historical interactive parody and was much appreciative of experimenting with it in Beverley!

In lay terms it began with an hilarious 'historical' lecture in the Town Hall by Professor Alain Said who spoke of the town of Beverley and it's connection to Beverley in England and the holy

grail. The 'vampire' link was based on the two Vampire planes, one in the main street and the other in Hunt St; and then there was the reference to sheep being a focus our rural town and the 'fact' that Prof Said is a renowned expert on the education of sheep. Hence followed a treasure hunt with cryptic clues throughout the town in search of the chalice. Performances by the four South African artists-in-residence were frenetic alongside a few of Beverley's local talent.

Here are some pics of their time in Beverley photographed by Aliza Levi (who is presently executing a solo exhibition in South Africa which includes images taken at night of some of Beverley's houses).

Artist-in-Residence

From 15 - 30 August, photographer Josh Wells, was the artist-in-residence and his images on the walls of the main gallery of the Station were stunning. He is holding a popular and very informative workshop on Saturday 27th August.

The next artist to arrive is another photographer. York visual journalist and writer, Paul Amyes, will be the Beverley Station Arts artist in residence for September 2016. During that time there will be an exhibition of some of his work called *Sex, Lies*







and Flowers. Sex, Lies and Flowers is a project on the terrestrial orchids of the Wheatbelt of Western Australia. The word orchid comes from the Greek "orchis", which literally means 'testicle' (with reference to the shape of its tuber). Orchids are distinguished from other flowers by their uniquely shaped column which is comprised of the fused stamens and pistils. Often the petals are modified to mimic the shapes of insects to attract male insects to mate with the faux female and pollinate the flowers. Some of the forms they take also resembles human genitalia Hence the title "Sex, Lies and Flowers".

Over the last eight years Paul has travelled the Wheatbelt photographing the plants on location. Instead of taking the standard approach of photographing the plant in its environment showing its full structure he has chosen to photograph them in a style more used in portraiture so as to bring out the distinguishing features and characteristics of the plants. The aim is not to produce an exhaustive catalogue of the plants but to



produce a series of images that show case the beauty of the plants and raise awareness of them and how fragile they are.

Following this was the highlight of the evening - a discussion between WAFarmers President Tony York and Pastoralists Graziers and Association President Tonv Seabrook which focused on ongoing and future issues for the state's agricultural sector and the potential for an amalgamation of the organisations.

While it was stated that an of amalgamation the two organisations would not occur in the near future, with differences in policy focuses cited as the main deterrent, both Presidents acknowledged the groups' continued working relationship and welcomed opportunities for further collaboration mutually beneficial issues. on

In addition to this keynote discussion, presentations were heard from Maddison McNeil, WAFarmers Executive Officer – Grains,



Beekeeping and Transport (Ports and Rail) and AgConnectWA Vice Stephen President, Brown, WAFarmers CEO, Ley Webster from 2 Work in Oz, Jeff Murray, Sheepmeat Council of Australia President and WAFarmers Livestock Council representative, and Tony Hansson from Keystart Country Home Loans.

Avon Zone President Ken Clark said the meeting was highly successful and had attracted a number of new faces, particularly from a younger demographic.

"We were very pleased with how well attended this Zone Meeting was, especially as there were many younger farmers in attendance who we don't often see at these meetings," Mr Clark said.



Early years focus pays off in NAPLAN results

At Beverley DHS, we have been focusing for the last two years on ensuring that our students are making good early gains in their literacy skills and receiving early intensive support if they need it. This early focus certainly seems to be paying off ...our Year 3 students have achieved significantly higher rates of 'excellent' progress and achievement, and significantly lower rates of 'limited' progress and achievement, than students in demographically similar schools in both reading and writing. As such, their results are higher (2.4SD) than the expected results.

For students who have not yet achieved the minimum standard, we have special programs in place to ensure that they receive extra help. For example, we run the innovative research-based Macqlit program from Macquarie University for students from Year 3 and up.


Design and Technology program

I must start this Blarney with a heartfelt apology for those of you who were looking for us at the Beverley Agriculture Show – sorry but duty called. Just to give you some appreciation of what we do in a day, it started with a phone call at 5.00am requesting our attendance to relieve York officers at a scene guard after a fire at the York ambulance sub-centre. We left York mid-morning with a job waiting in Westdale; while at the scene investigating this matter we received a phone call from VKI requiring our attendance back at the station. Just as we arrived at the station our phone rang again advising us of a traffic crash on Edison Mill Rd x Brookton Hwy, Flint. I am happy to report this crash was not as serious as first reported, with the rider of the quad bike suffering relatively minor injuries. Below is a photograph of the air-ambulance paramedic being winched down to treat the rider as the terrain prevented them from landing.



On returning to the station to catch up with the necessary paperwork and the remaining outstanding job I sadly watched the steady flow of vehicles past the station as they were heading home from the recreation ground and another show day drew to a close. I was, however, very grateful that mother nature smiled on Beverley and provided an almost perfect day for the event.

Rural Crime

It is very encouraging to see the increasing number of Crimestoppers reports we have been receiving, however, I would like to point out that with the passage of time there is a high potential for the loss of evidence. So please report any suspicious behaviour or activity AS AND WHEN IT IS OCCURRING. With the previously mentioned rural burglaries, possible vehicles of interest were sighted but not reported until after the event. If something looks out of place then call 131 444 and bring it to our attention sooner rather than later.

Over the coming month we will be acknowledging and rewarding good driver behaviour. While it is still in the development phase, we will be educating drivers about various related traffic matters through a series of short and sharp articles. Still time to complete your Census

The Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS) reminds Australians there's still time to participate in the 2016 Census and help make a difference to the nation's future.

Since taking the online Census form down as a precautionary step on 9 August to protect people's data, more than half of Australian households have now completed the Census.

Head of the Census Program, Duncan Young, said the online form has been performing smoothly since it was re-opened, and with good responses over the weekend, the Census is progressing well.

"We thank the many Australians who have already completed the Census and we apologise again to everyone for the inconvenience caused on Census night," Mr Young said.

"If you have not completed the Census, we remind you to complete it as soon as possible. Your information is safe and you won't be fined for completing it after Census night, but it is important to complete the form either online or in paper as soon as possible.

"If you have lost your online Login or require a paper form, please call our help lines now and we will send you one. If you are having trouble accessing the online form, this might be due to the tight security protocols we have in place, so please try a different device," Mr Young said.

The ABS has 38,000 Census Field Officers now working across Australia to visit households. They will remind people to complete their Census, and make sure they have the Census materials they need. Field Officers will be able to provide houses with a 12-digit Login code to facilitate online completion, or provide a paper form, with a blue Reply Paid Envelope.

Reminder letters containing 12-digit online Logins required to access the online form will also shortly be sent to households that haven't yet returned a Census form. If you don't have your Login or a paper form, please wait for your letter or visit.

The Census Inquiry Service is still open seven days from 8am to 8pm local time, to help with any questions people have about completing the Census online or on paper. The dedicated Paper Form Request service is also still available 24 hours a day.

Davies welcomes new Container Deposit Scheme

Member for Central Wheatbelt Mia Davies MLA has welcomed the announced introduction of a container deposit scheme for beverage containers in Western Australia.

The scheme is expected to start in mid-2018 and will help improve recycling and reduce littering in the State.

Under the scheme, consumers will be able to get a 10 cent refund on containers for soft drinks, bottled waters, small flavoured milk drinks, sports drinks and spirit-based mixed drinks.

"Communities are rightly proud of their natural environments and they want to ensure those natural values are protected through better waste management and recycling," she said.

"Containers from a wide range of drinks are constantly in our litter stream and they end up in the environment, along roads and in parks and gardens.

"This scheme will benefit local communities by helping to reduce litter while also generating jobs and economic activity in the recycling sector."

Ms Davies said community groups that undertook regular fundraising, such as charitable groups, sporting clubs, Scouts and Guides, would now be able to profit by participating in recycling activities.

Member for the Agricultural Region Martin Aldridge MLC said it was a practical way to reduce litter in the region and help keep places like the Wheatbelt beautiful.

"With a 10 cent refund on drinks containers, Western Australians will be rewarded for their recycling efforts. This initiative will complement our recycling culture and is a win for the environment, jobs, the community and the recycling industry," Mr Aldridge said.

The container deposit scheme will complement the Western Australian Waste Strategy: Creating the right environment and the Litter Prevention Strategy for Western Australia 2015-2020.



Sun Smart Getting enough Vitamin D

We need vitamin D to maintain good health, in particular to keep bones and muscles strong and healthy.

Vitamin D forms in the skin when it is exposed to UVB radiation from sunlight. Vitamin D levels can naturally vary throughout the seasons. Most of us will produce enough vitamin D in summer, when UV levels are higher. However, most people's levels will be lower in winter, when UV levels are low, as people tend to cover their skin and stay indoors. Our bodies only store enough vitamin D to last between 30 and 60 days.

Now with some beautiful sunny days upon us, and when the UV is below 3, it's a great time to get outdoors, roll up our sleeves and top up our vitamin D levels. During winter it is recommended that people be physically active outdoors in the middle of the day, with some skin exposed. The amount of vitamin D you make is also related to the amount of skin exposed to the sun – if you expose more of your skin, in most cases you'll make more vitamin D. Be guided by your local UV Index forecast and cover up when it reaches 3 or more.

A really great website for learning about the UV Index, including finding out what the UV is right now and the **SunSmart app**, is www.**myuv.com.au**

While you are there, **download the SunSmart app** to your phone and use it daily. It is free and fun and can be tailored to your location – The app lets you know when you need sun protection, the daily UV level and weather forecast, set a reminder for putting on sunscreen, and how much (it has a sunscreen

calculator!), vitamin D tracker, find out when it's safe to get some sun for vitamin D – check it out on **myUV.com.au**

Remember UV3 is the key!

At UV3+, cover up.

Below UV 3, no sun protection is required.

Warrior Wellbeing Too Strong and Too Silent

A very common issue I am called to help men with in the country is a seemingly "without notice separation" that leaves a dumbfounded male struggling to make sense of what just happened. Today women are more likely to be career orientated, more independent financially, more educated and empowered and divorce no longer carries the stigma it once did, and rightfully women no longer are as accepting of abuse or not getting their needs met.

Given this societal change there is even greater need for effective communication in relationships. Getting men to talk more is slowly changing, however, too often men tend to be stoic and un-communitive about how their relationship is going, "Too Strong and Too Silent".

Relationships breakdown for many reasons for example: Emotional disconnection, differing views on finances; too much work; not enough time with the family; stonewalling; lack of respect; or not being appreciated; to name just a few.

If we don't communicate what is going on within us, we are not resolving such issues and setting up our relationships to fail. A common quote is "*I tried but he just never listened*" OR "*I work hard every day, dawn to dusk to provide, I thought I was doing the right thing*".

If we talk about things as they arise, resolution is more likely. Men tend to be "*too silent*" but again women can be as bad at communicating as well. I often hear comments like "*if only she had said something*" or "*I didn't know*". Chances are may-be we were told or didn't want to deal with it or simply didn't listen. We need to learn to communicate more and listening to your spouse is paramount.

Here are 4 tips to improve listening to your spouse:

1. Body language: you may say you're listening to your spouse but the body language says otherwise. Body language accounts for 93% of communication. Face directly to each other, look into your spouse's eyes. Be cautious about your pose, things like being fidgety or folding your arms, tends to give a message of disinterest.

2. Ask questions: asking questions shows your spouse you're interested and heard what was said. eg. "so then what happened" or paraphrase " so what you're saying is"

3. Avoid one-upmanship: listen to the bad day story without jumping in with your worse bad day. Instead ask questions, listen and show interest, otherwise the message your spouse gets is you don't really care.

4. Don't try and fix it: this is a really good thing to remember especially for blokes. Men will often offer a solution to the problem and try to fix it. We really just need to listen and be engaged. Women prefer that blokes don't jump in with their best solution unless asked.

Good effective communication is essential for a healthy relationship. don't be TOO STRONG AND TOO SILENT


<u>Lyme Disease</u> <u>Association of Australia</u> <u>News - NATA Testing</u>


We've recently had many people come to us saying they tested negative to Lyme disease (testing standard from Australian Medicare / NATA labs) via disease neurologists/infectious doctors, even though they have since being diagnosed with Please be aware that Lyme. testing NEGATIVE via these labs could still mean you have Lyme disease. Australian testing has been flagged by the Chief Medical Officer of Australia (CMO) as 'inconsistent' or 'discordant'.

If you have a negative test result via these means and you still have no answers for your ill health, and suspect you may have Lyme disease, then you should follow up with a Lyme aware doctor and/or testing (contact the LDAA for a physician list in your area).

Australian health officials do not recognise Lyme (-like) disease in Australia, which has resulted in inadequate testing options. Australian testing is based on overseas strains of the pathogen (s) that cause Lyme.

While the government is taking steps to correct the discordant NATA testing, in the meantime, the LDAA advises against relying on NATA testing as the final answer for your Lyme disease diagnosis. For conclusive answers you should seek the assistance of a Lyme aware doctor. It is also important to note that 'world's best practise' for Lyme disease diagnosis is a clinical diagnosis by an experienced Lyme-literate doctor. Having a positive blood test is a bonus, but not necessary for diagnosis.






