Old School Roof Replacement

Council is in the process of engaging a company to undertake the roof sheeting replacement of the Old School Building in Vincent St (current CRC location). The building has been in need of this restoration work for many (many) years, and follows the floor replacement and foundation renewal undertaken in 2014/15.

<u>Roads</u>

Councillors and staff recently undertook a bus tour to inspect various roads and issues around the Shire, breaking to have lunch with the Avon Tourism Board who held their meeting in Beverley that morning. The road inspection was followed by discussion regarding the road programme.

Collins Road has now formally been dedicated as road reserve after successfully being excised from the timber reserve it is located in.

Verge spraying – this year the Shire engaged a contractor to undertake verge spraying along shire owned roads. This has been very successful and positive feedback has been received from many residents

Shopfront Assistance Altered

Council in the past has offered a small financial incentive to main street shop owners to assist with enhancement of their shop fronts to improve the appearance of the main shopping precinct. This strategy has been cancelled and funds redirected into main street beautification ideas being presented collectively by local business, Tourism planning and Main Street Redevelopment Plans being developed by the Shire.

Avondale

The National Trust WA has submitted an application into the recent funding round of the Royalties for Regions Regional Grants Scheme to upgrade houses at Avondale which is in line with recommendations in the 2011 Avondale Master Plan. The houses project is a key step towards making the place sustainable; it is proposed to enable short term accommodation for individual tourists, families, groups, educational organisations and corporate weekend stays, providing a unique education and tourism offering in the Wheatbelt. The outcome of the application will not be known until well into 2017.

Country Choir Bash

Hosted by Beverley Station Arts and presented by Voice Moves, the September Country Choir Bash was a very enjoyable afternoon, opening the Platform Theatres' summer season of events. Two of the (8) choirs provided an interesting Beverley slant into their performance, the Station Singers had their own little surprise, the weather held off and afternoon tea was again a huge example of country hospitality. What a varied and busy weekend in Beverley with the Avon Association Hockey Grandfinals hosted by our local Redbacks hockey club, Wyandotte Fanciers poultry show, golf and motocross.

NOTICE TO ALL RESIDENTS

During September, October and November 2016, the Bushfire Risk Management Team will be conducting on-site field assessments of all land within the Shire of Beverley.

This is part of an ongoing project to identify assets at risk from Bushfire and to create a Bushfire Risk Management Plan. The inspections do not require the land owner/occupier to be present however private land owners are welcomed to participate should they wish. Due to the large number of properties that have to be inspected individual appointments cannot be made.

The officers will be in a clearly signed white Toyota Prado wearing Shire and DFES (Department of Fire and Emergency Services) uniform and will also carry photo ID should anyone wish to confirm their identity.

If they are unable to access your property a notice will be left for you to make contact with them. Alternatively you can contact the Bushfire Risk Management Planning Co-ordinator, John Hansen at the Shire office on 9646 1200.


FIREBREAKS AND HAZARD REDUCTION NOTICE

<u>Townsite Land</u>

- All lots an area of 2.012ha (5 acres) or less, shall be clear of all inflammable materials or have grass mown to a height no greater than 15cm.
- All lots or combination of lots that comprise of one holding and having an area greater than 2.012ha (5acres) shall be either clear of all inflammable material or have a firebreak 2.2 meters wide free of all inflammable material inside and along all external boundaries.

Beverley IT Making IT Simpler

Setting up a Wi-Fi Hotspot

In last month's Blarney article I did not cover connecting your PC to the Internet via a mobile phone or tablet. This is becoming more relevant now that more households have fixed Internet connections. Why? Because when you leave the house you may not be able to connect the PC to the Internet.

How are PCs connecting to the Internet?

Many PCs are now connecting to the Internet using ADSL or wireless NBN in the town, or satellite NBN in country areas. All these are fixed Internet services. They are cheaper, have good bandwidth allowance, are fast enough to watch videos and are more reliable than using Mobile Broadband. The downside is that if you take your laptop away from the house you can no longer connect to the Internet, unless you connect to another person's WiFi. You could keep your mobile broadband service as a solution, but that is expensive.

Internet connection through your phone

An alternative is to connect your PC to the Internet through your smart phone or tablet. Most modern smart phones and tablets have WiFi Hotspot and/or Internet Tethering capability. Providing that you have a mobile phone plan that has a data allowance you can use your laptop anywhere where there is mobile coverage.

Not all phones or tablets have WiFi Hotspot or Internet Tethering capability. If they do not have WiFi Hotspot or Internet Tethering then you may want to consider upgrading your phone and getting an appropriate phone plan. Then you do not need to keep the mobile broadband service.

WiFi Hotspot

When a phone or tablet is connected to the mobile network the WiFi Hotspot will broadcast the Internet to other devices locally. To use a WiFi Hotspot on your phone/tablet go into "Settings"; make sure "Mobile Data".is "On" and "WiFi" is "Off"; and find "WiFi Hotspot", usually under "Settings/General/Networks" [however location varies even for the same make!!] Turn the hotspot "On" and make sure it is password protected. Then connect the PC to the WiFi.

Internet Tethering

Internet tethering extends the Internet to your PC but, instead of using WiFi, uses a cable from the phone/tablet to a USB port on the PC. The phone charging cable can be used if it has a USB connector on the end that normally plugs into the power plug. Set up of Internet Tethering is similar to the WiFi Hotspot above. You may need to install special software on your PC for Internet Tethering to work. An IPhone or iPad needs to have iTunes installed on the PC.


Our sincere thanks to John Lane who drove so well and was so patient with us all. It was not an easy task manoeuvring the bus in and out of the confined spaces.





The Official Opening from the Beverley Times Friday 9 September 1938:-

Erected on the site of the Mechanics Institute which for over 30 years had served the district's social needs, the new Beverley Town Hall Buildings were officially opened on September 1st by the Lieut. Governor, His Excellency, Sir James Mitchell, K.C.M.G., the opening Ball, which was organised by the Beverley Road Board with the assistance of a committee of local ladies being attended by more than 700 people, including many visitors from the city and adjacent centres.

As was befitting, the ball held in connection with the official opening was the most brilliant social gathering held in the district. Had it not been for the fact that the Road Board had set a limit to the attendance, conditions would have been most uncomfortable for patrons. As things were the dance floor was not as crowded as many had anticipated would be the case and the dancing was thoroughly enjoyed and was spiritedly carried on till a very late hour. Regrets are extended to those who came along but on account of the Board's restrictions were not able to gain admittance. Those so disappointed accepted the position philosophically. Music was provided by Jas Black's five piece orchestra who were accommodated on a dais at the front of the hall, the decorated stage being used to accommodate the Vice Regal party and other visitors. Mr. H. Brody acted as M.C. in his customary efficient manner. A feature of the Ball was the presentation of nine debutantes, this ceremony taking place early in the evening. After being presented to His Excellency the young ladies and their partners danced a minuet.

ST JOHN AMBULANCE CONFERENCE 2016

Record numbers attended this year's St John Experience and with 8 events over 3 days there was certainly something for everyone. The theme "First Response, Stronger Together" showcased how all facets of this great organisation come together to deliver the best possible healthcare and first aid education to the community.

Leesa Morrell, Chris Lawlor and Marie Carroll attended the State Conference with over 1,042 attending each day and a further 400 joining for the first time via Live Streaming. The Perth Convention Centre was taken over by men and women in green and the set-up was just amazing. The exhibition area had over 28 exhibits boasting interactive skills testing. One popular exhibit set up by the Communication Centre, allowed participants to experience the life of a ooo call, from the receiving end to the dispatching of the ambulance crew. Station managers were also very interesting to watch monitoring

their various ambulance crews and the patients loads in the various metropolitan hospitals. Complex rescue exercises took place during both days with paramedics and specialised rescue teams displaying their skills and equipment. State-of-the-art equipment was also on display and Ferno had the latest stretcher called "The Striker" which we all fell in love with, including. the flashing red and white lights. But at a price tag of \$54,000, we were told that it wasn't going to be on this year's Christmas list....

We had some amazing speakers throughout the conference, from the educational such as Guest Speaker Dr Jeremy Rawlins, a burns specialist talking about the importance of first aid and the difference we make as first responders to patient outcomes, to the inspiring; such as Peter Baines who led the teams during the Boxing Day Tsunami tragedies in Thailand. 



MyWeedWatcher app enhances community surveillance of weeds in Western Australia

Western Australia is free from many invasive weeds and pests that are present in other parts of the world but surveillance for biosecurity threats doesn't stop with Quarantine WA's border biosecurity.

Community surveillance and reporting plays a key role in maintaining our State's enviable biosecurity status and clean environment.

Home gardeners, growers and biosecurity groups now have a chance to join the biosecurity surveillance community with the launch of a free mobile device app, MyWeedWatcher.

Designed and developed by the Department of Agriculture and Food, Western Australia, the app improves identification, mapping and management of declared weeds that impact agriculture and our biosecurity status.

The app is a perfect companion for home gardeners and industry stakeholders; it allows for quick and identification of common easv weeds and provides an easy way to report unusual or declared weeds.

The app joins a suite of pest surveillance apps developed by the department to enhance surveillance and protect agriculture from biosecurity threats.

MyWeedWatcher's in-built guide helps users identify weeds plant's according to the characteristics, including the type of plant, flower colour and leaf shape, and a reporting feature allows users to map the location of the weeds, add photos and include information





such as the density of weeds, and any weed control undertaken.

Reports are sent directly from smart devices to the department for identification or verification, and the response and outcomes are mapped online.

The MyWeedWatcher app can be downloaded free from <u>iTunes App</u> Store or from <u>Google play.</u>

Alternatively, people without a mobile device can report declared weeds using the___ online tool available on the department website at <u>agric.wa.gov.au</u> by searching for 'weed surveillance'.

The MyWeedWatcher app was developed as part of the Department of Agriculture and Food's \$20 million Boosting Biosecurity Defences project, made possible by the Royalties for Regions program.

We have started a new group called Wildlife Emergency Rescue Team WA to work with the wild life coming in from Main Roads staff.

Like many places through the Wheatbelt are seeing an increase in both the wildflowers and the visitors coming to see them. The everlastings are looking brilliant and the orchids are in full swing. members of York Wildflower society and Bree Phillips from DPaw to discuss our Eremophilia and had a look at her maps of the most likely places around Beverley it could exist. We have lots of homework to do now to try and find other specimens throughout our Shire. Hopefully we will find other populations.

Our bush cleanups have been going really well. We can see a huge difference where we have been working and it is wonderful to see some things that show the history of Beverley. Some of this rubbish has been here a very long time. Our next cleanup days are 04 and 18 of October at 9.00am for brekky and about 9 30am start time. EMERGENCY TELEHEALTH SERVICE

The Emergency Telehealth Service (ETS) is a service that provides TELEMEDICINE for WA Country Health Service (WACHS) Emergency Department patients. The ETS brings doctors into the Emergency Department via video conferencing to support local staff delivering patient care at your local hospital.

WACHS employs Emergency Medicine Consultants to provide this service. These specialists are based in Perth and have strong links to the metropolitan hospitals and RFDS.

THIS EMERGENCY DEPARTMENT UTILISES THE ETS WHEN REQUIRED

Where a local doctor is not available, the ETS will be called when you need a doctor.

Your local doctor may also call the ETS for specialist advice should it be required.

The doctor comes into the room with you via a private video network link.

- Your local nurse will take your details, assess you and your presenting complaint.
- You are given a 'triage' score as per any normal ED presentation.



- With the nurse in the room you will consult with the doctor-the nurse will assist with the examination.
- The ETS doctor is advised of your presentation with a standardised handover document sent by your nurse to the ETS doctor.
- Your privacy is maintained as with any normal ED presentation. \Rightarrow
- It is like being in a 'virtual ED' and you may have to wait for the doctor to see you. -
- The ETS doctor may manage your case over the phone, however he/she is likely to dial in on \rightarrow the secure video link and talk to you directly.
- You will see the doctor on the television screen and with the nurse in the room, you will consult

DEPENDING ON THE DOCTOR'S ASSESSMENT, AND IN CONSULTATION WITH YOU AND YOUR FAMILY, THE OUTCOME MAY BE ONE OF THE FOLLOWING:

- You receive treatment, advice and are discharged home with agreed follow up as required;

Colourful Fruits and Vegetables That Boost Your Immune System

This month I will write about all green vegetables.

Green leafy vegetables are the tender edible leaves consumed from a wide variety of cultivated plant species. While there are many different types available, most share basic nutritional qualities with some unique characteristics specific to each variation. Chlorophyll-rich edible greens have healing and protective assets that help to cleanse the blood, balance body pH and are an energizing super food for boosting cognitive and immune functions. They contain a range of phytochemicals including carotenoids, insoles and saponins, all of which have anti-cancer properties. Leafy greens such as spinach and broccoli are also excellent sources of folate. Grandma always told us they were good for you. Everyone knows by now veggies are a must in any healthy diet – the phrase 'eat your greens' has been drilled into us since childhood. But fewer than 10 percent eat the recommended amount of it. And fewer people choose the dark green vegetables that boast a myriad of disease-fighting health perks. Even if you are not a fan of dark green produce (I recommend you give it a second chance), you can still reap tons of health benefits from a variety of green veggies. Greens are the No 1 food you can eat regularly to help improve your health. That's because they are brimming with fiber along with vitamins, minerals and plant-based substances that may help protect you from hearth disease, diabetes and as mentioned before even cancer. Did you know the name "broccoli" comes from the Latin word brachium, which means "branch," or "arm." Here is a list of the top 10 greens to eat:

Kale, Collards, Turnip Greens and Swiss Chard which have red and yellow stems, Mustard Greens, Broccoli, Brussels Sprouts, Cabbage, Romaine Lettuce, Iceberg Lettuce, Wheat Grass the absolute super booster, which needs to be juiced. It can be grown in trays on your veranda. Asparagus is one of top 5 green vegetables because it is a high source of protein, vitamin A, vitamin C, calcium and iron. Spinach is also the No 1 Green Foods.

Here is my favourite recipe involving Broccoli and Spinach. This can be done in no time at all.

Broccoli, Spinach and Potato Soup

Ingredients 1 onion chopped, 2 cloves garlic chopped, 1 Litre stock or stock cubes, 400 gm potatoes chopped, 450 g broccolis cut up (including the peeled stalk), 80 g spinach, handful of basil or parsley, a dollop of natural unsweetened yoghurt.

Fry onions gently for a few minutes in olive oil, add garlic, fry for 1 minute on medium heat, and add stock and potatoes. Simmer for 5 minutes. Add broccoli, simmer 2 minutes (leave them a bit crunchy to preserve the green colour), add spinach and let wilt, add basil.

Turn off heat, let cool lightly, and blend with stick blender roughly. Serve in bowl, add parsley and yoghurt.

Summer Broccoli-Salad with bacon and almonds.

Ingredients

2 large heads of broccoli

6 rashers of nitrate free bacon, finely sliced, olive oil,

- 3 firm red tomatoes, halved deseeded and finely chopped
- 1 small bunch of fresh chives (with flowers), finely chopped

Dressing

1/2 clove garlic, peeled and finely grated

2 tsp Dijon mustard

6 Tb. extra virgin olive oil

2 Tb. apple cider vinegar

Sea Salt and freshly round black pepper

Cut broccoli in very small florets including the peeled stalk, cook in salted boiling water for 60 seconds only, drain and wrap broccoli in a clean tea towel to let it steam on its own in the towel.

Fry the bacon in a little olive oil until crisp, drain on paper towels.

Place broccoli and bacon in bowl; add tomatoes and chives.

For the dressing mix the ingredients in a small bowl and whisk well until emulsified.

Pour over the salad and let stand for about an hour.

Add some chopped almonds or walnuts to the salad and serve.



Do you own a firearm? If you do, do you still have a genuine reason and a genuine need to have them? I ask you to take the time to seriously consider this question: Why?

A large quantity of firearms were recently stolen from a rural property and while they were correctly stored and secured there was no one living on the property and so thieves took full advantage of this. After some searching the keys were used to access one firearm cabinet with the second cabinet forced open with tools they found in the shed; 12 firearms were taken in total.



If you own firearms that you no longer use, please consider either handing them in for destruction or if they are of value, selling them. If you no longer reside on the property, please do not leave the firearm cabinet keys in the house; better still, think about relocating the gun cabinet and firearms to your new residence. Thieves love remote rural locations, especially when they know there is no one else around to detect or disturb them; someone is actively targeting remote rural farms in our sub-district. If you have any information to assist us with our inquiries please phone Crimestoppers on 1800 333 000, you can remain anonymous.

4WD Stolen

We have had further unwanted activity in our outer areas with another 4WD vehicle being stolen from a farm. Unfortunately this was made easy with the keys left in the vehicle. It also appears there was some suspicious activity noted by residents just after the vehicle was stolen but again this information came to light well after the event. If you have someone come onto your rural property uninvited and you do not know who they are, I suggest you ask them to politely leave making note of their vehicle registration and a mental note of their appearance prior to phoning us immediately. We can then assess the value of this information and take the required action.

Talk to a mate... It will help!

The message that underpins everything we do at the Regional Men's Health Initiative is "before it all gets too much 'Talk to a Mate'. Human beings are fundamentally social in nature, staying connected and feeling valued for who we are is of primary importance to us. Talking to other people about issues in our lives or telling our stories helps us to normalise our experiences and realise we are not alone in having them. As blokes we have a tendency to retreat into ourselves when things are turning pear shaped, 'cave time'. Much to the frustrations of most women this is a normal part of the way men tend to start processing their problems.

Metaphorically stepping into the cave can be helpful to get a handle on things but it is important that we are able to acknowledge and recognise when it is time to step back out and seek the support we need. Having a plan already in place that identifies who our mates are that we can turn to is really important. Without a network of true mates we become susceptible to feelings of isolation and loneliness. As blokes we can recognise three main categories from where we find and establish real mate ship. These exist usually in the forms of a partner (intimate relationship), a peer (someone around the same age that perhaps has a similar experience of lifestyle and activities to us) and a mentor (an older person who's lived experience we place value upon). A real mate is more than just an associate, it's someone that knowingly respects and values who we are and is willing to make the time to genuinely listen to us. Think about who you would classify as a mate; and about the blokes you know who perhaps have few or none of these categories in their lives?

Often it is said that blokes in general don't really like to talk about stuff but the reality is quite different. Given the right environment, in which they feel comfortable most men will willingly share their story and talk about issues that matter to them. Being a good mate is about supporting a person in that space and genuinely listening to what they have to say. We don't have to be an expert or necessarily have any of the answers to people's problems, just the ability to listen.

Being a good mate is also about actively looking out for the people we care about and taking action when we recognise that something is not quite right. A simple question like the one proposed by the recent R U OK? Campaign can be a significant step in connecting with someone and giving them the opportunity to chat about what's on their mind. If you have a gut feel that someone you know is not travelling well ask them how they are going and don't be afraid to ask more than once!

Remember, Talk to a mate!! It will help.



Lyme is an old disease, not a new disease. What's in a name?

Lyme disease is a controversial name and a very misunderstood disease. Technically the name Lyme disease refers to infection with *Borrelia burgdorferi sensu stricto* bacteria, common in the East Coast of USA. In Europe and in Russia it is called Lyme borreliosis and caused by the *Borrelia burgdorferi sensu lato* group of which the American Borrelia is a member. Relapsing fever Borrelia has a global distribution (including our neighbours Indonesia, Thailand, Japan and India and the West coast of USA).

In Australia we have Lyme-like illness the causative agent has not yet been isolated, similar to Brazil where they have named the Brazilian Lyme-like disease, Baggio-Yoshinari syndrome.

The <u>causative agent</u> has not been observed as a spirochete but only a round form. All illness caused by a Borrelia species should be called borreliosis, which is a complex infection which can have delayed onset and broad symptomology. Borrelia affects multiple body systems and is pleomorphic, that is it can change its form from spirochaete (spiral shaped) to round bodies and cysts. Untreated it can have high morbidity and mortality.

Borrelia can be transmitted by a tick bite and potentially by any blood sucking insect can transmit Borrelia. In humans Lyme borreliosis is caused by at least three different strains of the Borrelia bacteria. In the USA, the predominant strain is Borrelia burgdorferi sensu stricto, while in Europe it is B. garinii and B. afzelii. Other European strains include B. valarisiana, B.lusitanae and in Asia B. japonica. Relapsing fever borrelia include B. parkeri, B.hermsii, B.miyomotoi. (In addition there is another class of Borrelia that has hybrid characteristics of B. burgdorferi sensu lato and relapsing Borrelia named reptile-associated Borrelia. This class of Borrelia has not been associated with disease because it has not been identified in humans. Currently we don't know which Borrelia causes Australian and Brazilian Lyme-like illness. Research into this area will deliver the answer. Donations to the Karl McManus Foundation will help to deliver the answers sooner.

Although Lyme disease has been named after the town Lyme in Connecticut, where this disease was first identified in 1975, borreliosis as an infectious disease was identified in Europe back in the early 1920's. The diversity of borreliosis symptoms problems, skin arthritis, neurological, cardiac, ophthalmological - were already characterised. Some European examples include Bannwarth's syndrome for neurological symptoms, chronic lymphocytic meningitis, poly meningoradiculitis, erythemamigrans rash (see above- presentation can range from 10-90%). The development of EM is dependent on the genospecies of Borrelia.

The many names that describe an infection with Borrelia whether related to the town in the USA where it was described or the many European descriptions of symptoms can lead to confusion. It would be correct and appropriate for the World Health Organisation (WHO) to decide on a global name for an infection with Borrelia.






