Waste Water Reuse

Commissioning of Reuse Water to the oval is nearing completion with final testing underway.

Vincent St Bridge Refurbishment

The Vincent Street bridge has been recommended for \$3,876,000 funding from the Roads to Recovery Programme. Work includes design and construction and is expected to be fully funded by the Federal Government in the 2017/2018 financial year.

<u>Grants</u>

The Shire has been successful with a Royalties for Regions Community Chest application and will receive \$27,834 toward the Beverley "Flying through History" project to provide interpretation panels around the Vampire jet in Hunt Road and a scale model and short film history of the Silver Centenary.

The National Trust WA was successful with an application to the Royalties for Regions Regional Grants Scheme for \$200,000 to upgrade the 6 existing houses at the State Heritage listed Avondale farm.

Preparation of documentation to seek tenders for the Beverley Cornerstone is underway. This will include options to stage the project and enable Council to review funding arrangements.

<u>Council</u>

After a break in January the first Ordinary Meeting of Council for 2017 will be held on Tuesday 21st February commencing <u>3pm</u>. A later start time is being trialed and the meeting is being held on the third Tuesday instead of the regular fourth to enable Elected Member attendance at regional training. As a matter of interest the next Local Government Elections will be held in October 2017.

Cleaning tips

The following tips will help to ensure your difficult-to-clean eligible farm chemical containers will be accepted for recycling at your local *drumMUSTER* collection centre.



Suspension concentrates (Atrazine, Simazine, etc) Rinse your container immediately

after use to ensure any chemical residue does not dry

Use methylated spirits to remove dried residue. If this doesn't work, fill the container with water and soak for at least 24 hours before rinsing. **Oil-based chemicals**

(ULVs, LVs)



Follow specific instructions on the product label or contact the manufacturer for further assistance



Other chemical residues

Rinse container immediately after use as all chemical residues are much harder to remove when dry

Some containers may require additional rinsing (more than three rinses)

 A brush or high pressure hose may be required to clean stubborn or dried chemical residue

I am happy to report Beverley has been crime free for 2017. To say I'd be ecstatic if it stayed that way, would be an understatement. As I previously mentioned, working together is integral to keeping our community safe and so I thank you for your efforts and information provided to us in the past and encourage you to continue to do the same.

We like to be as proactive as possible and so with this in mind, our attention over the next few months will be on firearms, specifically, security. We will be conducting inspections on all firearms cabinets within the Beverley sub-district. Our intent is to educate and ensure compliance so that none of these firearms finish up in the wrong hands.

We will provide you with written notice of our intention and phone prior to arrange a mutually agreeable time to conduct these inspections. So if you need to check if your cabinet is compliant, you can visit <u>www.police.wa.gov.au</u> Look under the heading About Us/Our Agency/Police Licensing Services/Firearms/ Firearms Storage for information about minimum specifications for storage cabinets.

Alternatively, you can drop into the station, we have free copies of Firearms Regulations 1974 Schedule 4 – specifications for storage cabinets or containers.

February is Ovarian Cancer Awareness Month

- 0 Ovarian cancer is the growth of abnormal cells in one or both ovaries. Left untreated, ovarian cancer can spread to other parts of the body.
- 0 Ovarian cancer is the 9th most common cancer affecting women in Australia and the leading cause of gynaecological cancer deaths in Australia. Each year in Australia, approx. 1300 women are diagnosed with ovarian cancer approx.1000 women die.
- 0 70% of women with ovarian cancer are diagnosed at an advanced stage of disease.
- 0 Only 40% women with ovarian cancer survive five years beyond their diagnosis.

Risk factors

- 0 getting older: women over 50 are more likely to develop ovarian cancer than younger women (average age at diagnosis is 63). However, ovarian cancer can affect women of all ages.
- 0 inheriting a faulty gene (gene mutation) increases the risk of ovarian cancer
- 0 having a strong family history of ovarian cancer, breast cancer, or some other cancers, including bowel and endometrial cancer. It is important to remember that only around 5-10% of all ovarian cancers are due to inherited factors
- 0 endometriosis, when the tissue lining of the uterus (the endometrium) is found outside the uterus
- 0 hormonal factors such as early puberty, late menopause or the long-term use of hormone replacement therapy (HRT)
- 0 Your risk of ovarian cancer is increased if you smoke, are overweight or obese, don't exercise, drink alcohol or have a poor diet.

Symptoms

- Ovarian cancer can be difficult to diagnose in its early stages as symptoms can be non-specific or similar to those of 0 other diseases. Symptoms include:
- 0 a swollen, bloated abdomen
- 0 pressure, discomfort or pain in the abdomen
- 0 heartburn, nausea and bloating
- 0 changes in toilet habits (e.g. constipation, diarrhoea, frequent urination due to pressure, increased flatulence)
- 0 tiredness and loss of appetite
- 0 unexplained weight loss or weight gain
- 0 changes in your menstrual pattern or postmenopausal bleeding

It is important to know these symptoms, but it is equally important to know ovarian cancer often develops without symptoms. What's more, having these symptoms does not mean you have ovarian cancer, as they may be caused by other conditions. However, if you do have any of these symptoms you should see your doctor as soon as possible.



Australia's Triple Zero Awareness Working Group has developed a smartphone app for iOS, Android and Windows devices to: provide the caller with information about when to call Triple Zero provide the caller with information about who to call in various non-emergency situations

- State Emergency Service (SES) (132 500)
- Police Assistance Line (131 444)
- Crime Stoppers (1800 333 000)
- Health Direct Australia (1800 022 222)
- <u>National Relay Service</u>

For the Service of Humanity

- assist the caller to dial the relevant number
- display the GPS coordinates of the phone's location that the caller can read out to the emergency operator.
- The app is free of charge and available for download from iTunes, Google Play and Windows Stores.

Other emergency-related apps

There is a range of other publically available apps that claim to assist callers in an emergency. Some of these apps simply provide information about who to contact, while others claim to assist callers in requesting emergency assistance or to provide information about the caller's location to an emergency service organisation.

If you are considering using one of these apps, be aware that:

- not all of them can do what they claim and could delay emergency assistance
- the only way of contacting Triple Zero (000) is with a voice call—you cannot use SMS, email, instant
- messaging, video calling or social media to contact emergency services via Triple Zero (000)
- apps are not able to automatically provide details of your location to Triple Zero (000) or an emergency
- service organisation—however, you can read out your GPS coordinates to the emergency operator if they are provided on your smartphone.

You should not rely on any smartphone app as your only way of requesting emergency assistance. In an emergency it is always best to call Triple Zero (000) direct.

TRIPLE ZERO KIDS CHALLENGE

The Triple Zero Kids Challenge game is designed for children of kindergarten and primary school age and consists of nine safety scenarios. The estimated game-play time is one hour, but can be played in shorter intervals. You can access the game & more information for parents & teachers by visiting the website: <u>http://kids.triplezero.gov.au/</u> The Game has 'closed captions' for those players who do not have a sound card, cannot use their computer's audio or who may have hearing difficulties. Just click on the icon in the top right-hand corner of each game scenario to activate closed captions. The game

relies on narrative and voice-prompts. On starting the game, the children will be asked to enter their postcode. You can assist by having this available to them. At the beginning of the game, children will see a scrolling 'credit screen' of logos of supporting emergency services and agencies. Please assure them that this is normal. You might challenge them to identify the ones applicable to their area.

Successful completion of a safety scenario generates a 'reward' for children in the form of a print-out or certificate. Please ensure that these can be printed for the children from the computers they are using.

Builders announced; four Wheatbelt Health Service refurbishments

York, Southern Cross, Moora and Beverley Health Services are one step closer to receiving refurbishments with the selection of builders announced for each site. The following builders have been chosen:

- York Health Service ADCO Constructions
- Southern Cross Health Service Devlyn Constructions
- Moora Health Service Firm Construction
- Beverley Health Service BGC

Acting Regional Director Wheatbelt, Sean Conlan, said the builders would be moving on site around the end of November to early December and that residents would start to see construction underway shortly after that time.

"This is good news for local residents who are looking forward to seeing improvements made to their local health services," Mr Conlan said.

"Investment in regional healthcare is a priority and refurbishments such as these help to provide people with the care they need, closer to home." Mr Conlan said there would be no disruption to services during the refurbishments.

Beverley Health Service will receive a redeveloped Emergency Department including two new treatment bays and x-ray area, three new multipurpose consultation rooms, a refurbished ensuite in the aged care ward, a refurbished kitchen, an enhanced staff station and new driveway including parking for mobility scooters.

The health service refurbishments were all funded by the State Government's Royalties for Regions as part of the half a billion dollar

Southern Inland Health Initiative being delivered by the WA Country Health Service.

The Southern Inland Health Initiative's \$300 million capital works program is more extensive and complex than any project previously undertaken by the WA Country Health Service, with new builds and upgrades to 37 hospitals and health services in the Great Southern, Wheatbelt, South West and Midwest.

Borers are back!

With the onset of hotter weather, adult borers are coming out of the woodwork. The larvae, having munched their way through wood for months, even years, have pupated in their wooden nurseries and, as adults, are emerging to enter the mating stage of their lifecycle.

Most borers are the larvae (immature stages) of certain moths and beetles, and in Western Australia (WA) we have a mixture of native and non-native species.

While the emphasis is often on European house borer (EHB), you are more likely to see native longicorn beetles, auger beetles and weevils in your garden or trees. These are the most commonly reported borers to our Pest and Disease Information Service (PaDIS) at present.

EHB is a destructive pest that can cause major structural damage to homes built with untreated pinewood. Damage is caused by the larvae making tunnels through pinewood, weakening its structural integrity. In WA, EHB can live undetected as larvae for 2 to 5 years before emerging from the timber as an adult beetle. These beetles then lay eggs in the same piece of timber from which they have emerged to begin the life cycle again.

EHB is only found in dry pinewood such as dead branches on living pine trees, furniture, structural and non-structural timber, crates and pallets. EHB does not damage living (green) timber. If the tree is not pine, it is not EHB. For more information visit agric.wa.gov.au and search 'EHB'.

The native eucalyptus longicorn beetle, *Phoracantha semipunctata*. lays eggs under bark or in cracks of the host tree. They target native trees such as *Eucalyptus* species. Eggs are laid singly or in small batches by the adult beetles, and the larvae hatch and bore into the tree. The life cycle from egg to adult is approximately two to three years.

Backyard Buddies



The common auger beetle, *Xylopsocus gibbicollis*, is a native borer that attacks mostly grapevines, while the native larger auger beetle, *Bostrychopsis jesuita* is often reported emerging from backyard fruit trees.

Adults and larvae feed on eucalypts and a variety of other native and ornamental plants. They are also a pest of cultivated vine crops.



Other insect borers include fig longicorn beetle, Acalolepta vastator, vine weevil, Orthorhinus klugi, fruit-tree borer moth, Maroga melanostigma, and vine borer moth, Echiomima species.

Borers rarely infest healthy plants growing in their preferred environments. However, when trees or shrubs are transplanted, or stressed from drought, soil compaction, sun scald, or injuries, this can weaken them and make them more susceptible to attack. For this reason borers are generally considered a secondary problem and effort should be made to keep the plant as healthy as possible so it can resist borer attack.

Early signs of borer infestation can include wilting terminal shoots and branch or crown dieback, while more obvious signs include exit holes with sawdust-like frass in the trunk or limb of the plant.

Treatment

Take the best care of the plant you can, as healthy plants can often withstand some borer attack. Correct identification of the type of borer will also help guide any treatment options.

Sadly, in most cases systemic insecticides, whether applied as injections or as soil treatments, will have little effect, and while pushing a piece of wire into borer exit holes may sometimes kill an adult beetle or larva intersecting that tunnel, it will not provide effective control. Look after your plants as best you can and report unfamiliar insects to help guide your treatment options.



Visiting your GP... Tips for the average bloke!

We often talk to blokes about the importance of visiting their GP for a routine service visit or 'check-up' regardless of whether they feel unwell or not. These visits help you to stay health aware and if you do have particular risk factors, such as a family history of a certain disease, then regular check-ups may help your doctor pick up early warning signs. For example, high blood pressure may be an early warning sign of cardiovascular disease. I recently had my check up and I guess having a medical background puts me at a bit of an advantage when it comes to this sort of stuff, but for a lot of blokes it can be a bit of a daunting and at times confusing process.

First and foremost I think there are a lot of benefits in having a regular doctor and practice that you visit. This gives you the opportunity to build a relationship over time, to the point where you are more comfortable talking openly about things. Your doctor gets to know you and will have a better understanding of your health needs and concerns. Your medical history also stays under the one roof making it easier to keep things up to date.

With the average GP consultation time being around 10 to 15 minutes it's important that you have a fairly clear idea of what you want to talk about (write a check list starting with the most concerning issue). Usually for two or more health issues you will need to book a longer consultation time. Be prepared! For a general health check, your doctor will want to talk to you about a range of stuff including your medical history, your family's history, your lifestyle, diet, weight and how much you exercise. Be honest about your health and your concerns and most of all, don't worry too much about being embarrassed. Doctors are usually very difficult people to shock and more than likely have seen or heard it all before.

We all need to take responsibility for our own health and wellbeing. A lot of guys I talk to have no idea of what their blood pressure is normally or what it means for that matter. Get to know your normal parameters and other things like your cholesterol and PSA (Prostate specific antigen) blood tests so you can engage in conversation with your GP about them. It often helps to keep your own record of results and a list of any medications you may be on and what they are for.

As we get older we inevitably encounter the increased risk of developing particular health issues such as prostate issues (over 45 years). Most GPs are pretty good at prompting us when needed but we still need to be an active participant. Don't feel intimidated, you have the right to request certain tests and question things the doctor suggests. After all, this is about you and your GP working together.

So when visiting your GP be prepared (take a checklist) and be involved, it's your health, you are the expert on you.





Windows 10 "Anniversary Edition"

In the August Blarney I explained about Windows 10 Updates. My clients are still having difficulties with updates particularly the recent Windows 10 "Anniversary Edition" this update is huge!

The new Microsoft update policy.

In the past there were a number of different Windows operating systems: XP; Vista; 7; 8 etc. Microsoft seemed to interleave good systems with bad systems e.g.: XP and 7 were very good and lasted a long time; Vista and 8 failed and were soon replaced. Because of the huge failure of Windows 8, Microsoft have changed their update policy. Microsoft will not be issuing new operating systems, but instead will be continuously upgrading Windows 10. The "Anniversary Edition" is the first of these major updates and is effectively a new operating system.

The "Anniversary Edition"

The "Anniversary Edition" is a new system and is being rolled out progressively to all Windows 10 PCs. The update is called "Feature update to Windows 10, version 1607". It is very large - 7 Gigabytes! :

- It takes a long time to download
- It can bust your monthly download limit
- If it continuously retries to download or is interrupted during installation it can corrupt the operating system.

Long time to download.

Because updates are automatic, many people are unaware updates are in progress, so often shut down the PC during an update. Windows 10 is supposed to cope with this situation, but often it doesn't and updates fail. When you turn your PC back on Windows 10 starts the update(s) again (and again!), consuming download capacity. During download the PC can be slow and many people think this is caused by viruses. I have recently rebuilt several PCs that were corrupted during the "Anniversary Edition" update and would not start.

Slow or limited Internet connection.

If you have a limited download allowance or a poor Internet connection, e.g. using a 3G mobile connection, it is possible to provide some control over updates. Go to <Settings + Network & Internet + WiFi + Advanced Options> and turn on <Set as a metered connection>. This only works on a WiFi connection. Make sure you download all updates manually. The "Anniversary Edition" is so large you may need to take the PC to family or a friend that has a fast, reliable internet connection with plenty of spare download allowance.

Avoiding interruptions.

Before shutting down go to <Settings + Update & Security + Windows Update>. If updates are in progress, keep the PC on until the updates have downloaded and installed. Make sure that you have enough Internet download allowance to cope with updates. You may also need to set your WiFi connection to "Connect Automatically", keep the power on, and in the "Power options" change your plan settings to "Never" put your PC to sleep or hibernate while plugged in.


