SHIRE OF BEVERLEY PRESIDENT REPORT - JUNE 2017



Removal of Licence and Stamp Duty Concessions for Local Government

A letter from Treasurer Ben Wyatt MLA to the Shire President of Corrigin, who chairs Regional Road Group South of which Beverley is a member, indicates the new State Government will continue to implement a decision made by the former State Government to discontinue vehicle licence fee and vehicle licence duty concessions for Local Government Authorities (LGAs). This will affect LGAs to varying degrees depending on the number of vehicles they have, and as reported in the March Blarney, it is expected to equate to an additional annual cost in the Shire of Beverley's budget for licencing of approximately \$14,600 and an average annual cost due to removal of stamp duty concessions on plant of approximately \$24,000. These increases could be funded by increasing fees, charges and rates (which we are working very hard to keep to a minimum), or they could be absorbed by reducing some other service or capital works. The Treasurer claims this decision needs to be implemented due to the requirement for urgent State budget repair and that as "revenues from vehicle licence fees support the cost of constructing, improving and maintaining an ever increasing road network, LGAs will continue to benefit directly from the investment of these revenues in transport infrastructure around the State". This is ironical as a reduction in the road program could well be where the LGA endeavours to absorb the cost, not to mention the State budget also proposes a reduction in funding to Main Roads. Once again, I say this is extremely disappointing for our residents and ratepayers as Local Government already picks up the slack on behalf of their constituents in many ways.

Council May Meeting

Council had a busy May meeting as various aspects of the 2017/2018 budget were discussed, including proposed fees and charges, and projects in the capital expenditure program, 15 year plant replacement program and 4 year road construction program for inclusion in the budget.

Council also acknowledged the work undertaken by the Tourism Steering Committee to progress development of a "Beverley Brand" and endorsed the preferred message concept and logo as a unique identifier available for use by Beverley tourism stakeholders. More information regarding this project will be provided to stakeholders and community in the very near future.

Staffing Changes

Council and staff have welcomed back Stefan De Beer as Shire Planner following a short time away in Queensland. Stefan's role has been expanded to include some functions of the development role following Kathryn McLean's resignation.

Western Australia Natural Disaster Relief and **Recovery Arrangements (WANDRRA)**

Following the January/February emergency weather event the Shire engaged the services of Core Business Australia as a matter of urgency to undertake damage assessment and cost estimate to the nature and extent of impairment to the Shire road network. The report is nearing completion and will be forwarded to Main Roads WA for approval for a WANDRRA claim to contribute toward the repair work.

Avondale

It's pleasing there is more progress occurring across a range of areas in relation to Avondale. A position is being advertised for a part time Executive Liaison Officer, which the Shire and National Trust have agreed to co-fund, to strategically activate and seek funding for implementation of the Avondale Masterplan. The Community Survey has now closed and the collated results will provide valuable information toward Masterplan priorities, and perhaps some new ideas. Work is continuing in the Bush Reserve, including fire hazard reduction, to enable reinstatement of the walk trail. There is the possibility of establishing a volunteer landcare group specifically for the Bush Reserve. Minor maintenance is proposed for the old landcare building to better service groups visiting the property. There are many opportunities to contribute toward the redevelopment of Avondale if you are interested?





A QUICK HELLO AND GOODBYE

As you may be aware, Sgt. Berry has been on leave and enjoying time away for the last five weeks. In her absence, Senior Constable KERR and I from York Police have been making our best efforts to fill her shoes. For me it has been a whirlwind three weeks here and whilst my time has been short, it has been productive. From a personal point of view I would like to have been able to stay longer and spend more time getting to know the community here as Beverley is a very unique town with many opportunities and challenges and great people.

That said, upon returning to York I will undoubtedly be visiting Beverley fairly frequently for one reason or another. Should you see me or any of my York colleagues in your town, please come and have a yarn. We are usually never far from a coffee outlet! (Insert donut joke here)

OFF-ROAD MOTORCYCLES

There has been an increase in complaints regarding the use of off-road motorcycles in public areas, particularly on gazetted roads around town. I will take this opportunity to serve as a timely reminder for those people who choose to do the wrong thing and to the parents of youngsters who allow their children to ride in areas where these bikes are not permitted.

If you are caught riding an unregistered motorcycle on a road, firstly, **the bike will be seized**. The owner will be liable for costs involved in the seizure and storage of the vehicle and you may very well lose the bike for good. Secondly - you may be charged and face a magistrates court which can ultimately affect your driving license with suspensions and some hefty fines being issued.

If the rider happens to injure another person whilst riding, they are not insured and any injury caused to another party as a result may leave the rider (or their family) liable to civil action for all financial losses to the injured party. May I ask that if you are one of those parents whose children have an off road motorcycle, please teach them responsible riding behaviours and use the facilities provided in the area. Use a trailer to get the bike to a suitable off-road location and of course, wear protective gear!

SUSPICIOUS ACTIVITY

Over the last few weeks we have had numerous reports of suspicious activity around the town. Of note, there were some new concrete culverts awaiting installation stolen from the roadside on McKellars Road. If you see something suspicious, please report it. Any details you are able to provide could prove crucial. Unfortunately the cost of stealing hits us all with insurance premiums rising, so anything we can do to help prevent and detect these crimes will benefit us all. Not all suspicious activity turns out to be criminal, but it's better to be safe than sorry.

WET WEATHER DRIVING

With winter just around the corner and the wet weather on the increase, now is the ideal time to check over your vehicles to make sure they are prepared and road worthy for the wet weather. Please be sure to pay attention to your brakes, tyres, lights and indicators and make sure the windscreen wipers and wash are all functioning. The wet weather can obviously increase the risk of accidents but you can make sure you're doing your part to stay safe by conducting some quick easy checks on the items listed above and driving to the conditions.

The National Trust and I would like to thank all, your assistant was greatly appreciated. It is valuable work managing a huge fire risk in the bush reserve. The aim in the near future is to set up a Landcare group specifically for the reserve, the bush reserve requires a lot of work as there is enough dead wood in there to keep England warm for a whole winter.

A study was carried out and pinpointed 4 priority plants, which means that they are growing way outside of their usual range. These are Hemipenis platyphylla, they are a low growing shrub about 30 to 40cm high. We endeavour to protect these species as much as possible.





BEVERLEY HISTORICAL SOCIETY

WHAT WAS IT LIKE TO CALL THE DEAD FINISH YOUR HOME?

Well, the members of The Beverley Historical Society were curious about this! So in May we were very pleased to host two former residents of the Dead Finish - Heather McLean and Ailsa Scott (formerly Reynolds). We also enjoyed some local visitors joining us and sharing their stories in a lovely informal conversation with Heather and Ailsa. Thank you all for coming along.

Heather and Ailsa's father - Mike (Gordon) Reynolds qualified as a carpenter/builder in the 1930-40's under his father George Reynolds, also a local Builder. As work was short during the depression Mike went to work up north in WA and then to Fremantle first as a shipwright and then on the Catalina flying planes in Perth during WWII.

In 1943 Mike married and in 1946 the young family moved into the Dead Finish on Hunt Rd in Beverley. Their brother lan was born after they moved. The family shared the residence with Mrs Abbey – who was the last licensee of the Hotel (according to the Beverley Times - White Hart Hotel and Dead Finish were de-licensed as part of a reduction of licences in Beverley). We understand Mr and Mrs Abbey shared the hotel residence with various people. Some being the Cameron family (Bev Vivian`s mother) Eric Boyle`s family, and lastly Mrs Abbey shared with the Reynolds family from 1946 to?

Heather and Ailsa remember the area being like a farm with few buildings around. There was an almond orchard all the way to Mr Eynon's house. They remember having a large orchard with beautiful peaches, a pomegranate and an apple tree and a vegetable garden. There were tin stables.

Heather remembers planting the lilac tree that is growing beautifully in the garden today. The house to the north on Hunt Rd was built in 1960's. The ladies said that "Dad really loved the building, but their mother longed for a 'proper - more convenient' home." The family occupied the front entrance room as their kitchen/lounge room (now the Barber Shop and formerly the Hotel Bar) and the current large meeting room which Dad divided with a simple partition to make the family bedrooms for her parents and the 3 children. Mrs Abbey had the rest of the building using the current 'Finery room' as her bedroom.

The wood stove provided hot water for the kitchen and a bathroom which their dad built outside the kitchen to the east side. The bathroom has now been removed. Ailsa recalls the walls being covered in paper picture advertisements that were painted over. They removed this and painted the walls. (Maree Hutchinson remembers that some of these papered walls remained in the 1980's when the Museum was started.)

"To the north side Dad enclosed the verandah so they had a play area and Heather recalls her mother drying nappies on the louvres of this verandah. There were no fly screens so insects were sprayed with the hand pump sprayer". The ladies clearly remember having two toilets outside and the `night cart` coming to clean the toilets out. In later years when Mrs Abbey left and the family had the whole building an Aunt and Uncle came to live with them for a few years. Heather recalled the girls playing a joke on Uncle Ted by sneaking behind the toilets in the dark and banging the flap of the toilets to frighten him!!

WHAT WAS IT LIKE TO CALL THE DEAD FINISH YOUR HOME?

CONTINUED.....

With the use of the whole building the current kitchen at the rear was used as a laundry, the girls bedroom was the museum dining room, they had a spare room for friends to stop over and they played in the current storeroom. This had a bright skylight which is still there.

Annie Lucy's room, which was the first school teachers room and is located on the outside of the building, was used by their father as a tool store. We learned that the nails remaining on the wall today were put there for Mike to hang his tools on. They didn't use the large cellar as Heather said it was rather dark and damp and they didn't require it.

Life at the Dead Finish was pretty good – the kids used to play cricket and footy on the road with all the local kids - using an orange box for wickets. Heather recalls when Ailsa got out she'd pick up the wicket, bat and ball and take off. It was her way of getting back at them all when they were mean to her!! Despite many stories to the contrary they said there were no ghosts in their time - though their very Scottish mother was quite superstitious.

Other memorable recollections were:

- Snakes coming up from the bulrushes in the gully
- The girls having to apply polish to the wood floors and then hand polishing them
- A horse stuck it's head through their bedroom window one night
- The terrifying time a lightning bolt came through the kitchen window, across the dining area and out through the west window.
- Her mother was particularly scared as she had experienced severe storms in the Goldfields
- The time a fire got away from the railway line and burned all the way to their orchard and the old tin stables area
- The children had to beat off the swooping magpie on their walk to school.

Heather also spoke of a stone cottage over the road. This was built by Dr House but was occupied by two ladies Mrs Stone and Mrs Hack. It had dirt floors in front of the fireplace. Mrs Reynolds would cook cakes and food for them which the girls delivered. As they were quite elderly Heather said she used to help by threading the needles for them with dark colour cottons. The ladies came over for Christmas with the Reynolds family.

In 1966 Heather left to get married and Ailsa commenced her nursing training in Perth while Ian trained as a carpenter with his father. Mr and Mrs Reynolds moved out in 1976 to retire to his parents home in Beverley.

During their working life in Beverley, Mike and his father George built many homes in town and on farms, the Alex Miles Lodge, Nurses Quarters and rebuilt the Golf Club after a fire in 1958. The last home Mike built was for Heather on their County Peak farm.

Heather would very much like to hear from you if you have any information at all about buildings constructed by either George or Mike Reynolds. Please contact her on 0428 461 375.

This will be an interesting history for her family, our district and the Museum.

BROOKING STREET RESERVE

We have raked little fire breaks around the trees so that when we burn it will help protect the trees. Mike and I have worked there every day since Good Friday and Don has done so much work on his own. Thank you to you both it has been very much appreciated. We would also like to thank John Hansen who has helped with this work but also has taken the time to teach us about fire and the best ways to lessen the risks. He has had so much patience and understanding and has listened and understood our main concerns for this Reserve and has come up with very good ideas and practical advice to help prepare this area for our burns. I am terrified of our burn but have complete faith in John, Tyrone and Troy and we are hoping for favourable weather conditions to get the best results. Thanks also to Lorna for all your help and especially the thermoses of water for our coffee. Thanks also to Angie for your help and laughter and always having a smile and a laugh with us. We also found our first Bunny Orchid for the season and will protect it from the fire as it is in our fire zone. We are only burning around the perimeter so most of the other orchids will be safe and untouched. We also have some beautiful big habitat trees which we will protect and have paid particular attention to the area around them.

fabulous time it was. This was run by Wheatbelt NRM in conjunction with Beverley Naturalist Club. 



Cyber Attack

In this month's Blarney I was going to cover Identity Theft and Ransomware. However as there has been a huge amount of press about the latest Ransomware attack I will deal with Identity Theft next month.

Is Ransomware new?

There has been a lot of hype in the press about the recent Ransomware 'attacks' but ransomware is not new it is just that this latest version of Ransomware, WannaCry, has more effective methods of entering your PC. You can be sure that there will be more attacks, even more effective than this one.

I dealt with two Ransomware cases last year locally:

- A customer in Westdale had all their files encrypted by CryptoWall. They did not pay and as they had no backup, they lost all their files.
- A business in York realised there was something wrong and called me. I advised them what to do and immediately went to help. It took me an entire day to clean up their PCs and server but due to their prompt action, only half their files were destroyed. They refused to pay but fortunately, they had off-line backups of all their files, so they could recover all their information.

Please make sure that you take all the precautions I suggest below to ensure that YOU are not affected by the next attack!

What is Ransomware?

Once Ransomware enters your PC it starts encrypting all your files on the PC - photos, documents, spreadsheets, pdf files - everything. If you examine the file contents all you will see are seemingly random letters, numbers and symbols. When a file is encrypted it cannot be opened by any of your programs until it has been decrypted. The files are encrypted using an encryption key which is a long string of random characters. The key is also required to decrypt the files. If you don't have the key then it could take hundreds of years to find the key, using current technology. The criminals 'offer' to send the key to recover the files if you pay a ransom using bitcoins with a complicated payment procedure over the Internet. If you pay they will probably ask for more!

Protecting your Information

My recommendation is don't pay - you will be encouraging further crime. Instead you should protect yourself as follows:

- The best protection is to backup all your personal files regularly. If attacked the encrypted files can be deleted after cleaning the PC and good files restored from backup. You will only lose files created since your last backup.
- The best backup is an external hard drive. **Do not backup** on a PC internal drive – the backup will be encrypted.
- Do not leave your backup drive connected all the time only when doing backups. Otherwise the files on the backup drive will be encrypted too.
- Ensure that the operating system is up to date. Take all updates. Many updates are security updates.
- Install a good quality virus protection there are good ones available FREE on the Internet from reliable sources.
- Scan your PC for malware regularly.
- Do not open attachments or click on links in email unless you know the email is from a reliable source. Otherwise delete the email. If it seems suspicious, it probably is.
- Do not click on adverts or links in web pages or download software unless you know the source is reliable.
- Scrap any XP or Vista PCs. They are no longer supported by Microsoft. Therefore, they are a security hazard.
- Finally, do not try and remove a crypto virus from a PC yourself unless you are an expert. Often many copies of the program are hidden on the PC. Get professional help.



Found a tick? - submit it for research

A small research project between an Australian doctor and a German lab requires Australian ticks. If you have a dead tick that you've removed from yourself or your pets then you can tape it to a piece of paper and send to the address below. The project is especially seeking common kangaroo ticks.

How do you remove ticks?

It is important that ticks are not covered in methylated spirits, rubbing alcohol, bi-carbonate of soda, vaseline, or burnt with a match in an attempt to remove. Such action can induce a tick to release spirochetes and/or other pathogens known to cause Lyme disease and/or Lyme-like Illness into its host's blood stream.

•Use fine-point tweezers or a special tick-removing tool. Grasp the tick as close to the skin as possible. If you don't have tweezers, protect your fingers with a tissue.

Pull the tick straight out with steady, even pressure. View a <u>Tick's Mouth</u> and why it is so important to pull out the tick correctly.

- •Avoid squeezing the tick, breaking it, or allowing any blood to remain on your skin.
- •Place the tick in a small plastic bag or vial with blades of grass, leaf, or moist (not wet) piece of tissue.
- •Label the bag with your name, date, site of bite and how long tick was attached.
- Have the tick identified and tested by a lab, health department or veterinarian.
- •Wash your hands, disinfect the tweezers and bite site.
- •Educate yourself about tick-borne diseases and consult a doctor to see if treatment is warranted.





Cauliflower and Brocolli Cheese

If you are after a healthier version of this winter classic, then look no further. Here is a quick and easy version of cauliflower and broccoli cheese.

Ingredients

- ½ head cauliflower, cut into florets.
- 1 head broccoli, cut into florets.
- 1/3 cup water.
- 2 Tbsp plain flour.
- 2 cups of low fat milk.
- Pepper, to taste.
- ½ cup of reduced fat cheese.

Method

- Preheat oven to 180°C
- Place cauliflower, broccoli florets and water into a microwave safe and ovenproof dish.
- Microwave on HIGH (100%) for 5 minutes. Carefully drain off the water and set aside.
- Put flour into a tall microwave safe jug. Add 2 tablespoons of milk and whisk to a smooth paste with no lumps. Season with pepper. Add the remainder of the milk and stir.
- Microwave the milk mixture on HIGH (100%) for 1 minute. Stir.
- Heat again for 1 minute and stir. If needed, heat again for 30 seconds intervals and stir until thick and creamy.
- Add grated cheese and stir until melted through.
- Top cauliflower and broccoli with cheese sauce.
- Bake in oven for 15 minutes or serve immediately.
