### **SHIRE OF BEVERLEY PRESIDENT REPORT - AUGUST 2017**



### 2017/2018 Budget

Council adopted the 2017/2018 balanced budget at the July Council Meeting. Mindful of the current economic climate and uncertainly over the forthcoming State budget, Council has supported a modest 2.5% overall increase in rate revenue. The Shire of Beverley 2017/2018 budget enables ongoing provision of services and facilities for our community and capital refurbishments and replacement. Please note that the percentage increase in total rate revenue may not translate to the same percentage increase for individual properties due to changes in UV and GRV valuations affected by a number of factors throughout the year including revaluations by the Valuer (Landgate), land amalgamations and subdivisions.

A 10% discount is again applicable to rate payments received in full by 11th September 2017.

### **Disallowance Motion Supported**

Council's disappointment has previously been raised that the new State Government proposed to implement a decision made by the former State Government to discontinue vehicle licence fee and vehicle licence duty concessions for Local Government Authorities. Following majority support toward a Disallowance Motion put forward in the Legislative Council by Hon Rick Mazza MLC just prior to the end of June the decision has been reversed. This is a good outcome indeed. As the proposed change was already set to take effect on 1 July any local governments due to pay their vehicle licence fees early in the new financial year, such as Beverley, will be reimbursed those concession fees toward the end of August. Unfortunately there may be a down side with the State's commitment to road funding still unclear.

### **WANDRRA Funding for Flood Damage**

Main Roads WA have advised the Shire that approval has been granted for an estimated \$1,019,331 of Natural Disaster Relief and Recovery Arrangement funding for the use of contractors to re-instate road infrastructure following the 2017 January-February flooding event. Council contribution in the 17/18 budget is \$153,400 and tenders for the work have been called by Core Business Australia who are managing this project.

Unfortunately there have been an increasing number of reports and complaints that dog droppings are left to become someone else's problem. If you see someone abusing this facility please report them to the Shire ranger or Shire administration.

In accordance with the Local Government Act 1995 (and regulations), an Ordinary Election is held every two years on the third Saturday in October.



### Beverley water supply improvements - progress update

Water Corporation is currently undertaking a suite of water supply improvements in the Shire of Beverley. This work includes the construction of a four million litre water storage tank and 3.9 kilometres of water supply main to connect this tank to the town's water supply scheme.

At the end of August, we will start installing a water supply main along the road reserve of Vincent Street and we will be directly notifying residents who may have their driveway access restricted, whilst we complete this work. RCR Water, the contractor for this work, will work with residents to ensure they can enter and exit their driveways when required. All trenches in front of driveways, will be backfilled at the end of each working shift and traffic management will be in place.

As part of the water supply main installation, work will continue within farming paddocks near Waterhatch Road and Vincent Street.

The construction of the four million litre tank is in full swing with the tank foundation constructed and the concrete for the tank floor being poured next month.

In early September we will also start installing water supply main within the road and road reserves of Hunt Road, Sewell Street, Dempster Street and Hutchinson Street. This work will result in traffic impacts, however traffic management will be put in place and the community will be updated regarding this work in the coming weeks.

### **Proposed Mobile Base Station – Bally Bally**

Interested and affected parties (IAP) are hereby notified of a proposal to establish a new telecommunications facility at the proposed site at Lot 1 Caroling - Bally Bally Road, BALLY BALLY, WA, 6304, to provide improved mobile network coverage in the Bally Bally and surrounding areas, as part of the Federal Government's Mobile Phone Black Spot Programme.

The telecommunications facility proposed will involve the installation of six (6) new panel antennas (not more than 2.8m) to the existing Guyed Mast structure and the installation of ancillary equipment.

The Black Spot Programme is an initiative set up by the Federal Government and supported by the State Government to improve mobile phone coverage and competition in regional and small town areas across Australia. As part of the programme, both Federal and State Governments along with a number of Councils, businesses and community organisations have committed funds to new and upgraded telecommunications facilities over a four year period. Telstra has submitted considerable private sector investment as partners to this programme to roll out 429 of 499 identified new or upgraded facilities across the nation. This is a programme that is expected to provide upgraded, much needed, handheld coverage to 68,600 square kilometers of regional Australia.

### WA grain, seed and hay growers invited to comment on the operations of the **Grains, Seeds in Industry Funding Scheme**

The Grains, Seeds and Hay Industry Funding Scheme (IFS) Management Committee is conducting a survey of grain, seed and hay growers to discover industry views on the operations of the scheme.

The scheme uses funding authorised under the Biosecurity and Agriculture Management Act 2007 (BAM Act), whereby producers raise funds to tackle priority pests and diseases. The scheme is overseen by a Management Committee of growers appointed by the Minister for Agriculture and Food. All grain, seed and hay growers in the South West of the State participate in the scheme, unless they have opted out.

Your opinion is important. The IFS is industry-driven - the committee relies on input from industry to determine which pest and disease threats require action.

### The Trilogy of Fermentation – Part 5

A Probiotic Gem cultured with Probiotic Jewels - Kefir

What is kefir? Kefir pronounced keh-fear is a health-promoting nutritious, sour culture-milk beverage similar to buttermilk. The word kefir comes from a Turkish word keif, which loosely translates to pleasure, good feeling, or feel good. This is because drinking kefir is renowned to increase a sense of well-being. Some 40 aromatic compounds and 05% to 1% alcohol content give kefir a pleasant aroma and unique flavour. A recent discovery found kefir contains a powerful heat and pH stable antioxidant. Kefir and the unique natural mother-culture kefir grains, essential for making kefir from fresh milk, are functional food. This means they contain components that provide a potential benefit to health, well-being and disease-resistance beyond the expected benefit from their main, nutritional components.

As you read on, it should become obvious why the writer of this series regards kefir as a Probiotic Gem and kefir grains as Probiotic Jewels. These are the more promising super foods among functional food, and good science is helping us to realize the potential of kefir. Dating back over 1,000 years, the origin of kefir is the northern slopes of the Caucasus Mountains, possibly northern Ossetia. The tribe-folk of this region were renowned for good health and longevity. Here, kefir was known as the drink of the Prophet, and the natural mother-culture, the grains of the Prophet Mohammed. The term grains refer to the granular appearance of the mother-culture, and not because of any associated with cereal grains, legumes or seeds. The traditional method for kefir involved continuous fermentation of raw Cow or Goat's milk stored in a leather pouch with kefir grains. After 24 hours fermentation, the grains were separated by forcing them to a corner of the bag by hand; the liquid-kefir (similar to runny yoghurt) was enjoyed as a nutritious beverage. Due to the crude method of straining any small portion of grains that poured out with the liquid-kefir, the grain was also consumed. Kefir grains grow in full cream milk, and to avoid overcrowding, some grains were removed from the leather bag regularly. The spare milk grains were eaten, air-dried for long-term storage (backup culture), or traded among the tribe-folk for other essentials. An important relationship exists between the consumption of fresh kefir and the longevity with little to no known disease that the tribe-folk of this region enjoyed. The author's aim is to increase awareness of this relationship any fermented food has on our gut flora. The powerful heat and pH stable antioxidant of kefir is well absorbed by body and brain cells. Kefir is a good preventative against mutagenic and degenerative cell damage, which cause cancer and brain diseases the latter of which includes Dementia, Alzheimer, Parkinson's and Huntington's disease etc. We continue with more on kefir next month. Until then keep away from cold's and flu's.

### **Avondale Community Survey**

Anne Brake

Manager, Community Engagement, National Trust WA

In April – May this year the National Trust of Western Australia, in conjunction with the Shire of Beverley, conducted a community survey focusing on the future options and opportunities for Avondale. Thank you to those who participated.

A part time Executive Liaison Officer is going to be appointed soon. Their main task will be to review the survey findings and recommendations of various reports and plans produced over the past 10 years to prepare a strategic approach to Avondale which supports the aspirations of the National Trust, the Shire and the community.

As clearly indicated in the survey, Avondale holds a special place in the hearts of locals and many are keen to see a range of activities which will attract visitors and bring benefits to the community. Many of those who undertook the survey put up their hands to assist with future programs and tasks and the range and diversity of skills, interests and ideas was impressive. Harnessing and maintaining this interest and support is important and needs to be carefully managed. As well as identifying a working model for the site and the ways volunteers can contribute to it, there needs to be an active program of recruitment, training and support for volunteers. Avondale is seen by locals as a community asset and could provide great social and health benefits through the effort and exertions of volunteers helping with visitor services (including events), general maintenance and upkeep, fundraising and specialist care of the museum collection and the bushland. The important work of the Avondale Farm Project Association is integral to this mix.

Many who completed the survey believe group tours, including schools, service organisations and commercial operators as well as families, would be attracted to a redeveloped Avondale. While there are a number of buildings which could be redeveloped for short stay accommodation, a significant amount of capital would be involved to bring them up to speed. Assessing the viability of this idea will be included in the upcoming review and deliberations.

It is anticipated the survey will be run again, this time for people outside of the local area, to gauge interest from others. Avondale is well positioned as a day trip destination or as part of a weekend itinerary for people from Perth given the right attractions on site. Organisations and institutions involved in running tour groups will also be approached for their input into possible programs.

The National Trust and Shire of Beverley remain committed to the appropriate redevelopment of this significant site. Stay posted for further developments.

### **Working with Warriors** Cardiovascular Awareness - "How's your pump and pipes?"

This year the team at Regional Men's Health is focusing on Cardiovascular Awareness and encouraging blokes in Regional WA to have a think about their "Pump & Pipes".

It's no surprise that when we combine disease associated with the heart (pump) and blood vessels (pipes) it's our biggest killer, largest health problem, and places a great burden on our economy and health system. This of course is without even considering the issues around grief, loss of function and care requirements that can also impact individuals and families.

### SOME STATISTICS:

Cardiovascular Disease (CVD) is the major cause of death in our country. It kills one Aussie every 12 minutes, which equates to just over 45,000 deaths (2015). It affects one in six of us (4.2 million) and was the main cause for 480,548 hospitalisations and a contributing factor in a further 680,000 in a single year (Heart Foundation Aust).

### WHY PUMP & PIPES?

If you think about a pump moving water through a series of pipes, over time sediment can slowly build up and slow the flow of water or even cause a blockage. Most blokes would understand this would result in the pump having to work harder which can cause it to eventually fail or blow a hose.

This is no different to (coronary heart disease) which occurs through the build-up of fatty deposits (plaque) in the arteries that feed the heart. Narrowing reduces the supply of blood and oxygen to your heart and if this becomes too narrow it can cause angina (pain/discomfort in chest) or if a blood clot causes a complete block then this can cause a Heart Attack. This is similar to when a clot occurs in blood vessels to the brain causing a Stroke.

Factors that contribute to CVD include family history (which we can't change) but some of the other risks we can manage by making healthy lifestyle choices:

- maintain a healthy diet;
- do regular exercise;
- reduce our alcohol intake (take a couple of days off a week);
- monitor our body weight;
- don't smoke:
- reduce our salt intake; and
- look after our mental health & wellbeing.

It's important we acknowledge that a lot of CVD is preventable but it's essential that we understand our individual risk factors that may impact on us developing diseases associated with our heart and blood vessels. The onset of other health issues such as diabetes, obesity, poor health, even erectile dysfunction can be an indicator that our pump and pipes could be under pressure.

So just remember like any good piece of machinery, there are some basic **Operating Tips** to keep things running at optimal performance!



All research has the potential to 'find' or 'not Dr Richard Schloeffel find' something. explained to us that even 'not finding' something offers an important piece of the puzzle. With Professor Peter Irwin's most in identifying recent success pathogens in ticks, a very important next step is to determine if the same advanced technology is effective in human samples.

There are still more samples needed. It's pretty easy to do. On hearing of patients having trouble getting their doctors to sign, our president, Sharon Whiteman, went to her local bulk-billed, medi-center saying she had a history of being sick after a tick bite and would like to participate in a new research project. She brought the paperwork and it was clear, the doctor understood easily and signed. The next step was the pathology collection and then the process was complete. Granted, it may not always be that easy, but be strong, persist and when in doubt check in with other Lyme patients in your

If you've been bitten by a tick in Australia and have a positive lab test for tick infections, you qualify. All the instructions are available from the Lyme Disease Association so let us know if we can be of assistance.

Remember, if you get an invoice for the pathology collection, simply take a photo of the invoice along with proof of your submission to the research project and the LDAA will pay the invoice direct to the pathology.

### Community Service Information from the **Beverley Voluntary Community Services**

- 1. INFORMATION: It should be noted that our volunteers do not provide transport or legal services.
- 2. BVCS: We assist strictly to those in need or facing hardship e.g. of cases for referral.
  - a) unable to cope financially and have no money to put food on the table. Especially where there are young children - our concern is
  - b) family break-up, where one partner and children are left homeless and have no family in Beverley.
  - c) Wherever possible and health permitting some of our volunteers visit only the needy cases in hospital.
  - d) In all such cases, it is suggested that the patient make contact with both, the ward clerk and social worker and discuss the transport. The information that has been given to us is: the discharging hospital is responsible for the patients transport. This is still a very grey area. In Perth - public hospitals, some give patients a bus pass or taxi voucher. It is still unclear, whether this procedure applies to country patients, that are single, live alone and have no family to pick them up
  - e) Mal Roberts' concern for such patients that live alone, has been discussed with the hospital, Shire CEO and Members of Parliament. f) Mr Gollan, Shire CEO and Mal Roberts worked it out, that Mal bought this matter of transport for country patients (being discharged) to Mr Max Trenorden MP some 19 years ago.
  - g) This matter will now be bought to Mr Mark McGowan Premier: Notice and Action - with copies to all relevant Ministers and government bodies including the Shire of Beverley.
  - h) Wheatbelt Community Legal Centre offers advice on civil and criminal matters. They have informed Mal Roberts that they do not offer legal advice on the preparation of wills and enduring power of attorneys. In matters that are beyond their legal expertise they will refer you to a specialist in that field.
- 3. Referrals: up to date all recipient's have been satisfied and their needs have been met, e.g. special payments, Homeswest renovation and rent and bond assistance. On matters relating to Centrelink, Department of Veterans Affairs and immigration, please contact their offices in person.
- 4. Volunteers: not all of our volunteers are retired, some work part time in the nursing and medical profession, yet they manage to do voluntary work for BVCS. We say a big thank you to all our very dedicated volunteers in Beverley and York.
- 5. Indigenous Support: at a meeting in June the committee very kindly agreed to pay for the setting up costs of BVCS. Mal Roberts declared his interest as the BVCS President and spokesperson. CRANA update will be in the Blarney September 2017 edition.

I have been informed by a party to an estate, that they now wish to sight a certified copy of the will by a JP an ID requirement to transfer the name change to the current user.



### Hello Everyone,







From some of our encounters whilst driving under priority, it is clear that some drivers are unsure what to do when an emergency vehicle approaches. To clarify:-

If an emergency vehicle (police, fire and ambulance) has blue or red flashing lights and/or sounding an alarm, you MUST clear the way to let it easily pass.

When an emergency vehicle is approaching:

- stay calm and check to see where it is;
- give way to it by moving as far to the left of the road as possible;
- if you can't move left, slow down, indicate left and let the emergency vehicle drive around you;
- use your indicator to signal your intentions to the driver of the emergency vehicle;
- if you are in the left lane, allow other vehicles from an adjacent lane to move into your lane if they need to.

When giving way to an emergency vehicle DO NOT break the law (e.g. drive through a red light, or speed).

### **Penalty**

Failure to give way to an emergency vehicle = 4 demerit points and \$400 fine.



If you have an unregistered firearm that you wish to surrender to WA Police, please abide by the following:

- You will be able to surrender the firearm at any police station across Western Australia;
- Plan ahead. Contact your local police station to advise them of your intent to hand in a firearm;
- Ensure the firearm is unloaded, if you are unsure or do not know if it is loaded, explain that when you first arrive at the police station;
- Do not point the firearm at any person;
- Take the bolt/firing mechanism out if possible;
- 'Break' the firearm if mechanism allows; and

Carry the firearm in a suitable firearm carry bag, case, box or other covering. Do not carry the firearm uncovered. If you have any queries, please contact 9454 1347 or 1300 071 011.

# **Mobile Hotspots**

In the past most people outside cities were connected to the Internet using Mobile Internet. Now many people have a fixed Internet connections in their home or office, using either NBN (wireless, satellite or fibre) or ADSL. If you want to take your PC away you will have difficulty connecting to the Internet (unless they are staying with rellies or using free Internet in cafes etc.). Many people have kept their Mobile Internet service as a result. This is no longer necessary.

### Connect to the Internet at home or office



At Home or Office

Fixed Internet connections usually has a network terminal on the wall which is connected to the NBN or ADSL network. A router is connected to the Network terminal using Ethernet (usually blue). Devices (phone, tablet or PC) within the home/office connect to the router using WiFi. Some PCs connect directly to the Router using Ethernet. This is effectively the same as using WiFi.


Sometimes there is no router and the PC is connected directly to Network Terminal. In this case you will not be able to connect your phone or tablet to the fixed Internet service.

You will need the following settings on your phone/tablet.

Mobile data OFF WiFi ON Mobile Hotspot OFF

Unfortunately I cannot guide you to the settings as they are different on nearly every phone/tablet!
