SHIRE OF BEVERLEY PRESIDENT REPORT - AUGUST 2018



2018/2019 Budget

Council adopted the 2018/2019 balanced budget at the July Council Meeting. Mindful of the current economic climate, Council has supported a modest 2.5% overall increase in rate revenue. The Shire of Beverley 2018/2019 budget enables ongoing provision for services and facilities for our community and capital refurbishments and replacement.

Please note that the percentage increase in total rate revenue may not translate to the same percentage increase for individual properties due to changes in UV and GRV valuations affected by a number of factors throughout the year including revaluations by the Valuer General (Landgate), land amalgamations and subdivisions.

Rates

The rates are expected to be mailed out in the first week of August. A 10% discount is again applicable to rate payments received in full by 10th September 2018. An instalment plan is also available, but is ineligible for the 10% discount. Rates not paid in full or the 1st instalment made by 10 September 2018, are subject to an 11% penalty interest rate.

Cornerstone

The Cornerstone has now reached Practical Completion and the Shire has taken possession of the building. Internal fitouts of the museum and library are to be completed. It is hoped the Beverley CRC will begin moving in by late September. The Visitor Centre Volunteers have been undertaking a range of activities in preparation for assisting the CRC with the Cornerstone Visitor Centre, including recent customer service training workshops arranged by the CRC.

Lifestyle Package

As part of the 2018/19 Budget, Council has developed a Healthy Lifestyle Package which is a 12 month Gymnasium membership and a Season Pool Pass for \$373 for adults and \$199 for seniors and is a 20% saving on buying the passes individually. To make the most of your two memberships ensure you purchase a membership prior to 1 November 2018.

Avondale Ag Museum

The third Saturday of July saw intense activity in the Avondale Museum collection, and it was a learning curve for many of the volunteers, with shared knowledge being key.

Richard and John Hawke fitted the new clutch master cylinder to the FJ Land Cruiser, but found the slave cylinder supplied was from a later model, so it was back to restoring the C30 International truck where the resoldered joint on the starter motor needed insulating before reassembly. Meanwhile Kevin and Kerry made attempts at starting a New Holland baler fitted with a V4 petrol Wisconsin engine, after a bit of tweaking of the points by John Alexander she fired - literally through the exhaust, but with a temporary fuel supply and a leaking carby it was concurred that in the interests of everyone's eyebrows (as the exhaust was at head level) that more work was needed before the next attempt.

But it is not all fun and games all the time, with Duayne spraying the weeds under our outside exhibits and Luke cleaning up the Shearing Shed. John P gained some knowledge from 2 visitors from Wickepin who informed him that one of the wooden open hay carts would have been used to transport hav to the Kalgoorlie Goldfields region, a rather long slow trip in those days.

Due to the Beverley Show in August there will be no 'Big Boys toys' but the Museum will be open from 12.00pm to 4pm on Saturday and the usual 10am to 4pm on Sunday.

LOTTERYWEST GRANT TO FUND MAJOR PROJECTS FOR STATE'S HERITAGE

Avondale is one of the recipients of a significant grant allocation to the National Trust of Western Australia.

The Western Australian Government, through Lotterywest, has provided over \$2.8 million in grant funding to the National Trust for a three-year program to implement its Strategic Plan across key areas of heritage activity.

The funding will enable the National Trust to undertake important conservation works at priority places, enhance community engagement programs, improve access to Trust places and collections, support and grow membership and volunteering, support Aboriginal heritage programs, and enhance the visitor experience at Trust places. Avondale Farm will receive \$80,000 of this funding for directional, way finding and interpretive signage.

SHORT TERM ACCOMODATION AT AVONDALE FARM

Work is continuing on the refurbishment of the houses at Avondale Farm. Structural maintenance will be complete within the next few weeks. The fit out of the houses will follow.

AUSTRALIAN BUSH PRODUCE INDUSTRY INCUBATOR AT AVONDALE FARM

The proposal to establish Avondale Farm as an incubation hub for the emerging bush produce industry has received broad support. The project has progressed from a concept proposal to project scoping and feasibility assessment. The Trust has engaged Australian Venture Consultants to provide consultancy services to undertake this work and is actively seeking project funding to complete the assessment.

The National Trust and NLE (Noongar Land Enterprises) are working together to ensure the Ballardong people (Ballardong boodja) have a significant involvement in the governance and implementation of the Avondale Feasibility Study.

BEVERLEY HISTORICAL SOCIETY presents:

Recollections of James Mason Porter born 1898 & interviewed in 1986/7 by a Battye Library Oral History Officer

After the bombing of Darwin people thought that the Japanese were not too far away, and

James Porter: ... emergency stations were being established. So one day I was told by Sergeant Jeffries that I had to go to **Beverley**. We went up on the truck to Beverley. There were only seven of us.

The main object was to make arrangements for a thousand bed hospital at Beverley under canvas. All the houses in Beverley were visited to see what **verandah space or rooms they had for to billet soldiers** that should be send to that district. I was sent to Cooper's place in Hunt Rd, Beverley. That as a matter of fact is where I met my wife. Being such a good little boy I used to get up in the morning and hop into the wood heap and chop them enough wood for what they wanted. They reckoned they never had their wood being so good. I don't know why the men --, of course the men that were on farms were mostly all away, and it was a real delight for [them] to have plenty of wood for to do the cooking.

We was up there and we thought to ourself --, we took over the whole of the railway station and the whole of the goods yards in Beverley, including a big shed. Behind the station, or those goods yards, there was a hotel there, an old hotel [White Hart now RSL], and that was kept there. We could use it, but on a Sunday morning the **volunteer brigades** used to come in and that was their headquarters for Sunday morning. They used to go out training. Believe it or not they used to do good training. As a matter of fact they swum the Avon River there, that was at Beverley, full pack and all, just the same as what an ordinary soldier would do, although they had their own horses and all. ...

While I was there the train, it was a real train that came up with all these floorboards, tents, linen, and every facility with the exception of surgical instruments, for **a thousand bed hospital.** It was all to be packed in that big goods shed. That's what we were there [for], to unload the train. While we unloaded it, and got it all in different order – how if anything did happen – that whoever came along they'd be able to say, "Well, there's the floorboards, and here's the tents." Nothing had been done further than that in that shed. But in Beverley itself they had pegged out the ground from behind the reservoir, right down to the township, for where the hospital would be [opposite the Dead Finish].

Now at that time the Air Force – I think it was – I doubt if it was the Americans – it must have been, because they had quite a number of small planes there, which they made a runway, just a little bit from where we were stationed in this big shed [old airfield by wheat bin]. One day, six or seven of them, they took to the air, and **they practiced bombing Beverley**. They'd make a run in, and of course they scared everyone out of their wits because it wasn't very nice to see these planes coming down the main street, and they were very low. Of course there were a protest about that and there weren't any more air raids as far as I know.

Now another time while we was there, the town – at that time the electricity was run by [Selby] Ford. Now that Ford, you may remember, he was the one that built the plane itself that's in the Beverley [Aeronautical] Museum. It had already done one flight, but they stopped it after that. So Ford had the electricity, but he also had a hooter there, and it was rather strong. So they give him instructions for to blow the hooter at a certain time, and he blew the hooter, and **each and every one of us had to take out of the houses into the pad-docks**. And you can just imagine what like it was, to see them, they'd no idea where it was best to go, and everything was as black as night, as the saying is. It wasn't very nice running over those paddocks to the certain places they wanted us to go.

Interviewer: Now was that just the military, or the civilian population as well?

James Porter: That was the civilian population [that] had to do that. Of course we being soldiers – we had to be stationed at certain places for to direct different ones that came along. They <u>had</u> to come along, they couldn't come along in their cars unless they were over a certain distance, but they had to, with their lights dimmed all the time. How there weren't any accidents I don't know, but there were none. Everyone knew where they had to go and what trench they would go into if the Japs come in to bomb, which would have been ---. Well it was discovered afterwards it was a ridiculous place for to put people, because Beverley is only an hour and a half by motor car, it would be about a minute and a half by plane to get there, the planes that the Japs had. So there was really no security in it.

Then one day while I was there, I was told I had got to go back to Hollywood. So I went back to Hollywood.

Some hints and tips

Prune any dormant plants, especially <u>rose bushes</u> – always prune at a 45 degree angle to help the plant heal better while also limiting the risk of pests and disease taking hold.

Wait for the end of August or early September to start applying a slow release fertiliser to all of your plants.

Apply a healthy layer of mulch to lock in as much moisture as possible. Aim for layer of 5cm to 10cm.

Start planting spring fruits and vegetables, such as; spring onions, leeks, peas, lettuce and strawberries.

Plant tomato seeds in trays but keep undercover for now to protect them from frost.

Start planting annuals such as Petunias, Marigolds, and Vincas.

Tax Help- August 2018

Tax time is here and the ATO Tax Help service will be assisting low-income earners with simple tax affairs to complete their tax return online with myTax. Tax Help volunteers provide a free and confidential service for people on low incomes of around \$60,000 or less to get their tax right.

They can help with lodging and amending tax returns online using myTax, or to claim a refund of franking credits. Volunteers can also help you claim any deductions and offsets you may be entitled to.

If you're eligible for Tax Help and use email, you will need a myGov account linked to the ATO. Volunteers can help you create your myGov account and link it to the ATO if you haven't done this already. If you don't use email our Tax Help volunteers can still assist. Call the Beverley CRC on 96461600 to find out if you're eligible for help and make an appointment. Appointment days will be Tuesdays, bookings are essential.

Remember to bring the following along to your appointment.

- your myGov user ID and password (if you have one)
- your bank account details (BSB and account number)
- your tax file number
- an original or amended notice of assessment from any one of the last five years
- income statements from all sources
- all your receipts for gifts, donations and work-related expenses
- details of any child support payments made
- details of any losses on investments in shares and rental properties (net investment losses)
- if you had a spouse (married or de-facto) at any time during the financial year, you also need to bring details of their taxable income or a reasonable estimate.

A prawn in my lawn!?

Lawn shrimp, *Arcitalitrus sylvaticus*, pose no threat to humans, pets or the environment, but can give people a shock when they appear in mass numbers in and around homes and other buildings in winter.

What are they?

Lawn shrimp are terrestrial crustaceans and need to live in moist soil. If the soil is too wet or too dry the shrimp escape only to find themselves quickly dying of dehydration and starvation.

Although rarely seen except when weather conditions force them to the surface, these tiny 5-20 mm nocturnal soil dwellers are doing an important job.

Found within the top centimetre or so of soil and mulch they feed on dead organic material, particularly eucalyptus debris, turning it into fertiliser for the garden. Lawn shrimp are related to marine and freshwater crustaceans but lack the waxy coating on their exoskeleton which aids retention of moisture. Equipped with seven pairs of leg like appendages, they move with a springing action using their three pairs of "hind" legs.

Mated female lawn shrimp lay eggs in a pouch on the underside of their body. The babies are a smaller version of the adults and leave the pouch soon after hatching.

Lawn shrimp are native to south eastern Australia but have spread worldwide, mostly through the transportation of eucalyptus plants.

Cleaning tips

 A brush or high pressure hose may be required to clean stubborn or dried chemical residue

Toolbars and Search Bars

I have seen many potentially malicious toolbars and search bars on PCs recently. These tend to push unwanted adverts at you, some of which may be dangerous, if you accidentally click on them.

What are toolbars? Toolbars appear on web browsers and give you access to facilities that either configure browser or improve your web search. Toolbars are common and are mostly built into web browsers. For instance, Internet Explorer, which is included in all Microsoft PCs, has the following built-in olf you purchase goods online unwanted bars may be intoolbars:

Menu bar allowing you to configure the browser

Favourites bar to access your favourite web sites quickly Command bar, similar to the Menu bar

addresses of links to other web sites.

Other web browsers e.g. Google Chrome or Mozilla Firefox, will have similar toolbars. The built-in toolbars are safe to use.

What are search bars? All web browsers have built-in search bars that you use to easily search the internet, by putting in key words or sentences. If there is no search bar, then you would have to put in the exact web address e.g. http://xyz.com/help

Examples of search bars are:

- \Rightarrow Bing Search in Microsoft Edge or Internet Explorer
- Google Search in Google Chrome \Rightarrow
- \Rightarrow My Search in Mozilla Firefox

There are hundreds of other Search bars available often configured for special tasks, e.g. you can use the Wikipedia search bar if you use Wikipedia regularly. In most web browsers you can change the default search bar for another search bar or add extra search bars if you wish, but you must be careful which toolbars you add.

The toolbars above are all safe.

Many websites also have search bars that you can use to search the within the website. These are safe to use - unless you go to an unsafe website!

How do extra toolbars or search bars get on my

PC? You can add extra bars yourself but sometimes they appear on your PC seemingly by magic. For instance,

- When installing peripheral devices, such as printers or audio systems, sometimes toolbars are added so that you can use the devices more effectively. These are not malicious but can be a nuisance and can slow down your PC.
- When Installing software there are often tick boxes which add extra software or bars you don't need. Make sure you tick or untick the boxes as appropriate to prevent unwanted downloads. However sometime there are no tick boxes and the additional bars, etc. are downloaded without your knowledge.
- o If you click on an advert in a web page unwanted bars may be installed.
- stalled.
- o If you download software from an unsafe website you are very likely to get unwanted malicious software or bars. Carefully check that websites you download from are safe.

Status bar to change the display size and see the Why are some toolbars or search bars unsafe?

Malicious bars may push unwanted and potentially dangerous adverts to you, guide you to unsafe websites or download malicious software. Always check out sites/software/bars before downloading.

The simplest check is:

Only make a query on a search bar you know is safe

Put the following query in your browser search bar "<Name of site/software/bar> virus"

If the search comes up with many references to viruses then it is very likely the site/software/bar is unsafe.

If you have an effective virus protection program this should warn you if you are about to download potentially dangerous software.

It is better to be safe rather than sorry! If you are not sure if a tool bar or search bar is safe, then do not install it or use it. If you find a toolbar or search bar on your browser that you don't know - remove it. However, you may need to also uninstall the program that installed it or use a virus scanning tool to remove it.

Additional search bars are not necessary, so it is safest to not install and use them. Toolbars can be useful but choose carefully.

Warrior Wellbeing Article Testosterone and Men's Wellbeing

We've all heard of the hormone testosterone, but we might not know just how important it is that we look after our testosterone levels for our physical and mental health and wellbeing. Hormones themselves are the chemical messengers that the glands in our body send through our blood to our organs. They are necessary for growth, reproduction and wellbeing. The ones that are particularly important to men are the male sex hormones called androgens. Testosterone is the most important androgen and affects everything from our metabolism, our recovery time after physical exertion, our mood and of course our sex drive, performance and health. All things that we care about, that help define us as men and that we don't want to compromise on.

As testosterone is such a vital part of living a full and healthy life, it's important to keep a lookout for signs of testosterone issues, most commonly testosterone deficiency. It is normal for men to have their testosterone peak between 20 and 30 years of age; and from there fall gradually as we get older to one third of our maximum amount. In fact, by 45 years of age 4 out of every 10 men have symptoms of male hypogonadism (lowering testosterone). Despite it being common it is still important to keep an eye on it as testosterone deficiency can have severe consequences.

In our youth it can present as failure to go through normal puberty, including not having our voice break, not getting a normal growth spurt or even developing breasts. This is all to be avoided if possible! In adults there are a range of potential symptoms including weight gain, mood changes, reduced strength, difficulty getting erections and a lower sex drive. These symptoms and others can have a detrimental impact on our health and quality of life so being aware of testosterones' role in our lives and the difficulties we can have with it is important to all men.

If we find ourselves experiencing these issues we should go to the doctor and have a simple blood test that will check our testosterone levels. If we are suffering from a severe deficiency it is likely we will be administered Testosterone Replacement Therapy (TRT) in the form of injections, gels, lotions, creams, patches and tablets; some of which can come with negative side effects. Fortunately, there are ways to increase our testosterone short of pharmaceutical help. Primarily through lifestyle choices. That is getting enough sleep, avoiding alcohol and drugs, staying active; especially through weightlifting, minimising stress levels and getting all our vitamins and minerals through a balanced diet, will all have a significant impact on our testosterone levels and general health.

Like with most aspects of our health the same fundamentals affecting everything else also affect testosterone levels. Good health is a holistic process and if we do these things to take care of our testosterone we will enjoy the benefits of healthy testosterone levels throughout our lives. As always if there is any doubt it's important to speak to your GP, especially when something as important as testosterone is involved.
