SHIRE OF BEVERLEY PRESIDENT'S REPORT



Triathlon 2024

On Saturday 23rd March the Beverley Triathlon was run again after an absence of 5 years. About 80 entries were received which included Nippers, Juniors competing in their courses, and adults who participated in either the Short Course or Long Course events.

The weather was perfect for the Triathlon and Brad had the pool in in wonderful shape.

Thanks go to the volunteers who registered and marshalled the whole event. A special thanks to Kelly Mann and Sam Fricker whose work to get this up and running at such short notice was exemplary.

It is hoped that funding can be secured in the future to ensure that the triathlon becomes a permanent event on the Beverley calendar.

Old School Building / Civic Centre

Work is proceeding on the renovations to the building which are expected to be completed by the end of April with an official opening sometime later.

Electric Vehicle Charging Station

Plans are now in hand to place an electric vehicle charging station at the rear of the Cornerstone Building. There will be availability for two vehicles and it will be a quick charge meaning about 45 minutes to an hour. Hopefully this will put Beverley on the favoured route for the EVs.

Local Laws

During the past twelve months the Shire has engaged a consultant to draft a new set of Local Laws. Having now been tentatively approved by Council these Laws are now ready for public submission before they are finally Gazetted.

Road Construction

Reconstruction of the shoulders have been completed on a section of the Mawson road ready to widen next year while hotmix has been laid on the intersection of Vincent Street, Mawson, and Morbinning Roads.

<u>Bridges</u>

-3203 Kokeby East Road bridge replacement. The last headwall is being installed after which it will be backfilled with gravel prior to sealing the road surface.

-3205 Bremner Road. Box culverts have been scheduled to commence production on 15th April with completion by 30th May and delivery by 6th June.

-3200 York Williams Road. The existing pile bands need replacing on most of the piles as it has been noticed with the fall in water levels, they have rusted off.

-Termite inspections and treatments have been completed on eleven bridges.

Tree Lopping

Rural lopping commenced on the 25th March and it is anticipated that this will take 35 days to complete. Proposed roads to be completed are: Piccadilly Road, Northbourne Road, Kennedy Road, Wyalgima Road, Simms Road, Potts Road, Mills Road, Glencoe Road, Dobaderry Road, and Westdale Road.

<u>Air Show</u>

Preliminary discussions with Beverley Soaring Society were held with a view to plan another Air Show for Beverley. Initially it was hoped to hold this in September 2024 but when the logistics were explored it was realised this was impossible. A committee has now been formed with a view to holding the Show in March 2026.

PUBLIC NOTICE SHIRE OF BEVERLEY LOCAL LAWS

In accordance with s3.12(5) of the *Local Government Act 1995*, the Shire of Beverley gives public notice that the Council of the Shire of Beverley resolved on 28 November 2023 to commence making the following local laws for the district.

Animals, Nuisance and Environment Local 2023

The purpose is to protect the environment, public health, safety and amenity within the district including the management of animal care and numbers, pests and vermin control. The effect of this local law is to

- Eliminate or reduce of threats to the environment and public health, safety and amenity.
- Regulate keeping of animals (other than dogs and cats) in terms of types, number, how and where they can be kept;
- Prescribe the minimum standards for keeping all animals;
- Prescribe requirements for owners and occupiers of land to manage activities to prevent nuisance including vermin control, refuse control, dust prevention, light and odour emissions.

Trading in Thoroughfares and Public Places Local Law 2023

The purpose is to regulate private and commercial activities in thoroughfares and other public places.

The effect of this local law is to

- Protect public health and safety;
- Preserve neighbourhood amenity;
- Preserve pedestrian and vehicle access to and movement within thoroughfares;
- Protect public infrastructure and local government assets;
- Make provision for objection and appeal rights against certain decisions;
- Preserve adequate access in thoroughfares for public works and utility services;
- Provide for issuing approvals and permits for specified activities in thoroughfares and public places; and
- Provide for the enforcement of this local law

Standing Orders Local Law 2023

The purpose is to provide for the conduct of meetings of the council, its committees and electors.

The effect of this local law is to:-

- Better decision-making at meetings;
- The orderly and efficient conduct of meetings;
- Greater community participation and understanding of the business of the Council; and
- More open and accountable local government.

Health Local Law 2023

The purpose is to provide for the regulation, control and management of day-to-day health matters within the district to enable people to live in a safe and healthy environment. The effect of this local law is to establish various health standards and requirements which people living, visiting and working within the district are required to observe.

Dogs Local Law 2023

The purpose is to provide for the regulation, control and the management of the keeping of dogs within the district.

The effect of this local law is to:-

- To establish the requirements with which owners and occupiers of land within the district shall comply in order to keep dogs; and
- Provides the means of enforcing the local law.

Cemeteries Local Law 2023

The purpose is to provide for the orderly management of cemeteries under the care, control and management of the Shire and to create offences for inappropriate behaviour within cemetery.

The effect of this local law is to

- administer and supervise burials, memorials and within the cemeteries,
- administer the process and applications for funerals,
- provide services to maintain the cemetery.
- to enhance, public safety, convenience and amenity

Bush Fire Brigades Local Law 2023

The purpose is to provide for the establishment of a bush fire brigade for carrying out normal brigade activities.

The effect of this local law is to establish bush fire brigades that will be organised and managed to comply with this local law.

Repeal Local Law 2023

The purpose of the Local Law is to repeal outdated or unused local laws that have been superseded by other legislation or no longer have any effect.

The effect of this local law is to ensure the local laws are repealed.





This term the Year 7 students have been learning cadet qualities and values and Year 8 students have learned survival skills such as map reading, using a compass and tying knots.








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Beverley Men's Shed

Remember to get your wood orders in early as we all know there is a cool change coming.



Proceedings began with our President Peter Cashmore (flanked by the Vice President John Fricker and Secretary Bob Green) giving us a welcoming speech.


This was followed by the unveiling of a commemorative plaque dedicated to those members who are now deceased. One

With a new season came the reopening of the community of Beverley's Agricultural collection housed in the grounds of Avondale Farm in Waterhatch Road just 5.5kms away, and it was gratifying to have interested guests visit us on Saturday March 9 from Bakers Hill, Beverley and Perth after the very 'hands on' efforts of the guys the previous month cleaning the exhibits and ensuring the Museum was hazard free for visitors, as many are aware this is a 'Working Museum' and often items will be in operation during opening times, very much a bonus for those present, so a safe working environment is foremost in our minds.

Paul & assistant Bob continued their efforts with restoration of the 1930's International C30 Truck and fired her up only to find an oil pressure issue, having just spent several hours



ensuring the wiring was correctly connected.



But when one job comes to a halt there is always another one waiting with Bob showing interest in the 35X Fergie and her fuel issues, evidently, she is full of air ----and it's not hot!

John H brought in some plumbing fittings and as a group (mainly

John H) we did some repairs to the aging internal guttering system that has caused us so much grief for many years now, it is hard to impress visitors when they are 'walking in (and on) water'.



New member Tim experimented with sealing the very dusty floor (when it is not wet!), while Gerry & Eric started to remove the Brake Master Cylinder from the FX Holden Ute, the piston is stuck in the cylinder, so she has no brakes----yet.

the visitors and no doubt sharing his past experiences in farming while I spent a lot of my time assisting those that needed it.

The visitors from Bakers Hill not only showed interest but also offered their knowledge and experience to our group, and it was not long before the air was filled with the 'music' of single cylinder stationary engines which had laid dormant for well over half a decade, as many of the more

long term residents know, these engines were started during the Harvest festivals held at the Farm, sadly only a memory with today's busy lifestyle and a lack of volunteers.





BEVERLEY HISTORICAL SOCIETY presents The Former Methodist Church built 1907

Last month members and friends of the Beverley Historical Society visited the former Methodist Church as part of their ongoing program to view Beverley's oldest buildings.

The first Methodist church services in Beverley were held in the home of PC Edwards, Beverley's first resident policeman. His home was 'Rockfield' on Hunt Rd, opposite & down from the Settlers Arms (now Dead Finish Museum).

A Methodist church building was erected on the land at 50 Hunt Rd (now Great Southern Highway) about 1893. According to reports, it had one distinctive feature for a church in the fact that a fireplace was provided. The minister lived in two rooms at the rear of the church. This first building - later demolished - was used as a hall when a new church was built in 1907, Ψ (1930 photo).



The building measures 40ft by 26ft by 16ft high and has a distinctive decoration above the porch. The church was built by contractors, Davey & Trew and two foundation stones were laid. \clubsuit



Mrs Horace Smith was Julia Edwards, a daughter of PC Edwards. Rev R R Fleming was the incumbent Methodist minister.

The Methodist church remained active in Beverley for the next seventy years. A new hall was built & opened in 1955 attached to the rear of the church. It cost £2060 and was to be used for Sunday School, Ladies Guild meetings and social occasions.

On our visit we were welcomed into this hall by Bev and Mel Vivian with a delicious morning tea Ψ .





The Methodist Church of Australia joined with Presbyterian & Congregationalist churches to form the Uniting Church in the 1970s. Uniting Church services in the former Methodist Church were first advertised in the *Beverley Times* in 1976.

The church remained a Uniting Church until 1993, according to Mel Vivian who presented a brief outline of the history of worship in the building up until the present time. A series of evangelical leaders and preachers used the building including the Assembly of God and the Oasis Christian Fellowship from 1994 to 2014.

In the year 2000 the building was still owned by the Upper Avon Methodist/Uniting Circuit that had headquarters in Pingelly. Bev Vivian bought the church when it came up for sale. In 2018 she sold the building to Gan, a kind & generous landlord.

In 2014 the Beverley Real Life Church Fellowship was incorporated, and pastors have included Brad Makin, Mal Kehlet and Barrie Johnston.




Bev Vivian kindly donated some historical artefacts to the Dead Finish Museum: memorabilia of the 100th anniversary in 2007 and a case of records & documents from the Methodist Ladies Guild ↑.





The BHS group then inspected the church \clubsuit . The church was said to seat 160-180 people in 1907. The bright white walls (recently repainted) are nicely contrasted by wooden pews and a wooden ceiling. The ceiling is distinctive, being built into the slope of the roof with alternating diagonal boards \clubsuit .





The window is dedicated to the memory of Vernon Robert Potts, 30th October 1962. The sheep grazing in the paddock give the image a local flavour.

Whilst artist in residence at the Station Art House in Beverley **David Giles** will be showing his latest abstract landscapes "The Wonder of Nature".

He is the owner of two art galleries in Fremantle, The David Giles Art Gallery, representing thirty WA artists and Studio Eleven Art Gallery which hosts twelve permanent artists in residence. He has been facilitating art workshops for more than twenty years through his Freedom School of Painting. More than a thousand people have participated over the years with many going on to become multi-award winning artists.





THE BEVERLEY HOSPITAL AUXILIARY COMMITTEE WE HAVE JUST TURNED 80 YEARS OLD ON 11TH MARCH 2024!!!!



During those 80 years, there have been countless numbers of community members – far too many to list - who have contributed to the ongoing recognition of the Hospital Auxiliary as an outstanding provider of amenities and equipment for the Health Services in Beverley.

IN THE BEGINNING.....

- 1. **11th March 1944.** A public meeting was called to enlist support for Hospital Funds. A committee was appointed. Mrs Norman [Lillian] Broun was elected President and Mrs Tebbutt Secretary/Treasurer. 20 women and 5 men formed the committee. The wives of the Hospital Board plus each of the two doctors' wives were invited to join. Dr Hodgson & ?
- 2. 28th April 1944. First meeting at Town Hall Lounge. The Matron joined the committee. First project to mend the hospital fence with funds donated by Mrs Chester from her Dance. Other funds raised from a fete, raffle, a children's dance, 5 stalls, afternoon tea. Balance is now 86/17/9 [Pounds, shillings and pence]. First purchases furniture for rooms, easy chairs and hall chairs, curtains. Mr Carr gave a cow for milk and hay to feed same! Enamel paint unobtainable, similarly material and clothing without coupons due to war.
- 3. **September 1945** Circulars sent to residents who had been patients during the year asking for donations. Funds raised by Mrs Clarke from a dance [7 pound 5 shillings] went towards the purchase of a wireless for the staff.
- 4. **1946** -The committee called for more domestic help at hospital, mending sent out to Red Cross committee.. A public appeal collected 4 Pound . No spare clothing coupons. The younger set was asked to invite nurses to their groups so they could meet people of the District and keep them happy here. CWA helped by making curtains for the children's ward.
- 5. **1948** Town Hall Lounge. Alterations to Hospital discussed. Nurse's quarters still need home comforts e.g. pictures, clock, heaters. Mrs Hodges always sells raffle tickets for Auxiliary.
- 6. **1949** Meeting at Town Hall Lounge Saturday afternoon. Agreed to pay one third of large Xray machine. Staff shortage. Mr & Mrs L Doncon supervised planting of new rose bed.
- 7. 1951 On slack days, nursing staff helped with mending. Mrs H Blechynden organised Hospital Visiting by committee. Always took flowers, cakes etc. Tennis courts gravelled. New nets and balls. Hospital Board to be asked to invite visitors to play at the discretion of the Matron and all staff be permitted to play. Staff still need to be made to feel welcome. Names of patients to be listed in "The Beverley Times".
- 8. **1952** Hospital addition. Contributed 300 pound to help cost of Pan Room. New trustees nominated. Chairman of Hospital Board [Mr E. Edwards] and Chairman of Road Board [Mr Len Doncon] automatically become Auxiliary members to administer the money.
- 9. 1953 Lotteries helped fund items. Money raising left till alterations completed. New block opened 14th May 1953
- 10. June 1954 meetings held every 2 months, social life of nurses still a problem.
- 11. 1956 bath heaters for nurse's quarters. No public appeal for 5 years it's time to try again.
- 12. *May* **1957** Monster Carnival. All Clubs and organisations helped; 5/- adults, 1/- children; Profit 324 pounds. penny piles in hotels; collection tins at pictures; marching girls and Pipe bands [Auxiliary paid travelling costs. PIX magazines bought for patients, book drive for patients. Xmas gifts for patients. Crockery for nurses and domestics.
- 13. **1957** Some dissention with Hospital Board and Medical Dept they thought the Auxiliary should give as dictated; NOT SO; Auxiliary wants to say how their money is spent. Decided to have a committee from both and a **Constitution** to be drawn up.
- 14. Decided against Constitution drawn up by Hospital Board. Decided to register as a Charitable Organisation to work for hospital patients and be only responsible to Medical Department.

So, as you can see, some things change and some things remain the same! But always, the care and respect for patients and staff in Beverley and the support of community health initiatives has remained the same!

What a great time to be gardening in April. The days are getting shorter and the nights are much cooler. A perfect time to be planting in the garden.

Vegies to plant in April include – broccoli, cabbage, leek, lettuce, onions, peas, radish, shallots, spinach, spring onion and turnip.

Flowers to plant in April include – alyssum, cornflower, snapdragon, stock, statice, pansy, sweet pea and viola.

April is a great time to attend to the following tasks in the garden:

- Aerate compacted lawns with a garden fork
- Lift and divide bearded iris
- Remove and discard any diseased or rotten fruit that may be hanging in trees
- Repot plants that have outgrown their containers. Use fresh potting mix and a slow release fertiliser
- Mass plant ground covers to create a living carpet to suppress weeds. Good native ground covers include native violet and grevillea
- Empty compost bins and use it to condition vegetable and flower beds and spots where you plan to plant bare-rooted trees and shrubs in winter
- Prune hedges of lavender and rosemary
- Plant annuals for winter and spring colour. Try pansy, cineraria, viola, poppy, primula and stock
- Prune summer fruiting trees that have finished cropping. Pruning after harvest reduces the risk of fungal disease and gives the trees a chance to put on some growth before winter
- Trim native shrubs by about a third after they have finished flowering
- · Prune any potted plants that are looking tired and lanky by half
- Top up slow release fertilisers in all pot plants to replace nutrients leached out by regular summer watering
- Apply a wetting agent to pots if water runs straight down the side of the pot and the potting mix below the surface stays dry

• This is the perfect time to establish native trees and shrubs such as bottlebrush, wattle and banksia There is certainly plenty to do to keep you busy in your garden in April!


