

Shire President's Report February 2013

Minister for Agriculture Visits Beverley

The Hon. Terry Redman MLA, Minister for Agriculture and Food, Forestry and Housing, and the Hon. Mia Davies MLC were part of a group who visited Beverley just before Christmas in 2012 to look at Avondale. The delegation were also shown around the Railway Station Cultural Precinct and Beverley Mens Shed, concluding their day engaging with young farmers from the Beverley/Brookton area for an informal question and answer session.

Recreation Project

The recreation project at the oval is still progressing well, with the building really starting to take shape now. Advertising of the Tender for the provision of new netball courts occurred in January.

Council Meeting 26th February 2013

The first Beverley Council Meeting for 2013 is Tuesday 26th February. Meetings are held on the fourth Tuesday of the month, commencing at 2pm. Public Question Time is held at the beginning of each meeting should there be questions you wish to put to Council. If seeking to make a Presentation or Delegation please contact the CEO in the week prior to arrange a suitable time.

Beverley Town Centre Revitalisation Survey

Council is initiating redevelopment planning for the main street precinct. Although in the very early stages of this process, a survey was included with the 2012 rate notices seeking community feedback. Of the 28 responses received, underground power was clearly on the top of everyone's mind. Other recurring comments included more shade, trees, planter boxes and flower beds, improved façade of empty

shops, upgrade of Federation Square, more fixed seating, historic plagues for buildings stating age and their original purpose and acknowledgement of Noongar heritage. There will be more opportunities for community consultation in due course.

We wish Janet well following the stressful loss of her possessions and caravan and look forward to her bubbly self resettling in at the new location. The Beverley Caravan Park continues to attract a steady stream of visitors and favourable comments regarding the Park and our town.


Hopefully I will have some good news from the funding front in my season wind up of the April issue. It will help to keep improving our complex so fingers crossed.

When heading home from work the last thing you expect to see in the middle of the road would be abandoned kittens, which is exactly what we found on Thursday 17thJanuary.

These two gorgeous ginger kittens were so hungry and frightened that it took us awhile to approach and pick them up. We are very lucky we found them when we did because they may not have been able to survive very long without help or they would have started hunting native animals such as the endangered Red-Tailed Phascogale.

To the person who dumped these kittens if you come forward and ring me I will not reveal any information regarding you to the authorities. You will not be prosecuted if you allow us the sterilise the mother cat to prevent this from happening again.

The good news is these kittens have been taken to our Vet in Mundaring and will be sterilised, vaccinated, micro-chipped and found a new loving home.

Hello Again,

This will be the last article I will scribe as the relieving Officer in Charge of Beverley Police Station. February will see the return of your Sergeant Darrell Hagan from a well-earned break.

With the news of the fire and devastation in our sister states, I think it is timely to remind people of their responsibilities when it comes to fire bans and movement bans. While I may be preaching to some already well informed people, some fires can be started unintentionally by those who have little or no understanding of these bans or the possible consequences of their actions.

TOTAL FIRE BANS

These affect everyone, whether you live near bush or in a built up area. They are a prevention measure to warn you of a day of predicted adverse fire weather. On these days you should be particularly careful not to cause a fire to start. Department of Fire and Emergency Services (DFES) consults with Bureau of Meteorology to determine when dangerous weather conditions are likely. You can check if your shire has a ban on the DFES website at www.dfes.wa.gov.au or by calling 1800 709 355 or by listening to ABC local radio.

The DFES website has further information in relation to the terms and conditions that apply to Total Fire Bans (including frequently asked questions). I encourage you to visit the site or if you do not have computer access, pick up an information brochure from the Beverley Police Station. The penalties for ignoring a total fire ban? You could be fined up to \$25 000 and/or jailed for 12 months if you ignore the ban.

HARVEST & VEHICLE MOVEMENT BANS

Bans are issued by local governments when our Bushfire Control Officer is of the opinion that the use of engines, vehicles, plant or machinery during the prohibited burning times or restricted burning times or both, is likely to cause a fire or contribute to the spread of a bushfire. To find out if a Harvest and Vehicle Movement Ban has been imposed you need to contact the HARVEST BAN HOTLINE on 9646 0145.

HOUSE / PROPERTY IDENTIFICATION FOR EMERGENCY SERVICES

This brings me to my next item – house/property identification. Could emergency services find you in a hurry? All too often precious time is wasted trying to find a house or property number to identify the exact location of where our emergency services are required. Please ensure your number or property name is clearly displayed and visible from the roadside. Local knowledge is a wonderful thing but when officers attend from outside your town or area specially at night, something as simple as a clearly displayed reflective name or number, could mean the difference between saving a life or death, particularly in rural locations.

THANK YOU

Every day I drive through town and see your smiles, people stopped on the footpath and engaged in conversation and laughter. I am still overwhelmed by your sense of community. It has been a pleasure to serve you; I have thoroughly enjoyed my time in your town.



View From The Shed Mental Health and Staying Safe

When we think about mental health our most common thought is to flick straight to illnesses associated with poor mental health. We know about poor mental health conditions which are often talked about, things like depression, anxiety and post traumatic stress.

While some people have a predisposition to mental illnesses we very often fail to realize that most of these "illnesses" start from situations that are unresolved in our lives. I call this type of problem "Situational Distress" and if left unattended can be very debilitating.

These situations, or life events, can come from many places and can include relationships, finance, physical health or just dealing with difficult times in our work life. The possibilities for where they come from are endless.

What can happen if we don't deal with these "situational distressors" is that they erode our ability to cope with everyday life, the worry, anxiety and depression takes over our life to the point of desperation and despair. If we are living with excessive stress

(situational distress) or anxiety it will alter the chemical balance in the mind to the point where you become dysfunctional in decision making. You begin to overlook critical relationship and safety issues that you would normally respect and observe. This experience is similar to our response to chronic physical pain.

If you are experiencing situational distress you can also have a secondary problem, that is trouble sleeping. This can lead to fatigue which diminishes your ability to stay well even further. As a result of these compounding factors you may also experience temper outbursts that can lead to irrational behavior and dangerous, thoughtless actions putting your safety and/or the safety of others in jeopardy.

Mental illness is often underestimated and very insidious in the way it affects behavior and work practices. Be prepared to acknowledge when the going is tough, or when you are feeling tired or fatigued. Take extra care and protect yourself and others from the effects of "situational distress". Stop and ask yourself "what is causing me to be distressed" and then ask "what I am doing to prevent this

becoming a mental illness that may have the potential to destroy my quality of life".

The simple message is always evaluate the risks in the context of your current capacity to cope. This may involve stepping back, putting in place extra protection or rethinking in some way. Often discussing a problem with a partner or good friend highlights other options that may have been missed by you.

However you choose to deal with problems remember "situational distress" can often be the underlying cause of serious mental illness which we can avoid if we can start to recognize the signs.

10 Hints and Tips to SPEED UP CLEANING



- 1. Buff your marble tabletop or benches with car polish. It leaves a thin, invisible film that helps in reducing the risk of stains.
- Eucalyptus oil removes the gummy residue left by shop stickers.
- keep spiders and other crawlies out of shoes that you keep outside, (farm boots, gumboots etc.). Place old stockings over the top of them. Make sure the stockings don't have holes in them, and if they do not fit snugly over the top, use an elastic band to secure them.
- To clean a microwave oven, add four tablespoons of lemon juice to one cup of water in a microwave safe bowl. Boil for five minutes in the microwave, allowing the steam to condense on the inside walls of the oven. Then simply wipe them with a soft cloth.
- 5. To clean a stainless steel sink, put the stopper in the sink with two denture-cleaning tablets and half fill with water; leave for several hours or overnight and the next day it should be sparkling. Then use the water to clean the draining board too.
- To remove fingerprints from stainless steel appliances, place a small amount of baby oil on a napkin/paper towel and wipe the affected areas. The fingerprints will just wipe away.
- 7. To remove marker pen off hard surfaces, spray on hair spray and then wipe it off.
- 8. To remove cat and dog hair from clothes and furniture, rub them with damp rubber gloves.
- For a quick fix in ridding the hard floors of your home from animal fur, place a stocking over your normal broom and sweep as per normal and the fur will collect on the stocking.
- 10. To prevent ash from flying everywhere when cleaning out a fireplace, use a spray bottle filled with water to cover the ashes with a light mist.

General Information

This publication touches on FINANCIAL HARDSHIP, repossessions and foreclosures.

We all live in trying times. There are some, whose lives are changed in an instant, e.g. you have lost your job (with no notice), you have been in an accident or lost your property and all your belongings in a fire - WHAT HAPPENS?

THEN IN SOME CASES, You have NO savings and no one to turn to, how does one cope?

The information at hand, from consumer experts, is where property/goods are mortgaged or are on hire purchase: contact the lenders (finance). Explain your position or seek help from someone qualified or an advocate, who can speak for you. Whether you have to negotiate re-financing, if they advise you to do so, basically avoid shelving the matter, the reminder letters for late payments will not go away, which will even lead to 3 final notices and thereafter to legal action for non payment, default, as per sections of the mortgage or hire purchase contracts, eventuating in a court order to foreclose or repossess, this will conducted by the authorised court officer (bailiff).

those above state of events to which occur, (via our TV sets and/or statistics) show that most watchers, believe, it will never happen to them.



The International *Back to Back* Wool Challenge Story

In 1811at Newbury in Berkshire, UK, a one thousand pound wager was made to make a coat from the sheep's back to a mans back in one day.

Watched by 5000 people, the coat was completed in thirteen hours.

The sheep was eaten with much quaffing of beer to celebrate.

Todays Challenge began in 1992 when Richard Snow, a keen young spinner at the Scottish Wool Centre at Aberfoyle in Scotland, developed thyroid cancer.

His desire to raise funds for cancer research sparked off their Back to Back Challenge,

a competition very similar to that run almost two hundred years ago.

The event created enormous interest in the UK, not only because of the clever wool promotion but also because of the funds raised for cancer research.

That same year, Australia held a similar contest.

Teams representing football clubs The Cats, Geelong, Victoria and the West Coast Eagles, Western Australia competed in a race to spin & knit a football scarf from freshly shorn wool. When Australian Wool Showcase member, Wendy Dennis took part in the 1994 Fourth World Congress on Coloured Sheep at York University, UK, she also visited the Scottish Wool Centre. With similar annual competitions held in Scotland and Australia, combined with fundraising for Cancer Research, the seed was sown for a combined International Competition and the rules were developed to suit.

Teams consist of a blade shearer, a sheep and seven handspinners & knitters. Team nominate time keepers, assessors & coordinators monitor each team competing at their own wool related venue. All teams follow the identical Challenge rules and pattern exactly as they are written.

The 1995 inaugural Challenge with nine teams competing from three Australian States, Scotland and the Shetland Isles, was won by the Shetland Isles in 5 hours 57 mins 58 sec.

Over 1,350 Pounds was raised by the Scottish Wool Centre for the Cancer Research Campaign. 1996 saw twenty two teams competing, sixteen in Australia from four States. USA entered a team from Michigan and the UK had teams from Scotland, the Shetland Isles, Devon and Cambridge. Again, the Shetlands were unbeatable, breaking their blistering 1995 record by 39 minutes.

They clipped another nine minutes off the next year.

In 2004, Merriwa, New South Wales, Australia broke the 5 hour barrier.

Their time: 4 hours 51 minutes 14 seconds is now in the Guinness World Records book.

Merriwa also raised a record \$15,000 for Cancer Research.

Ireland, Wales, Canada, New Zealand, Japan, Czech Republic & Republic of South Africa have since joined the Challenge.

In just a few short years, the Challenge has developed at a remarkable rate. It is a simple and direct method of promoting wool from 'sheep's back to spinners back' using the ancient skills of blade shearing, spinning and knitting.







LITTERING IS ILLEGAL

Under Western Australia's *Litter Act* 1979, littering is illegal. The Act authorises Keep Australia Beautiful Council (as part of the WA Department of Environment and Conservation), local government, police and other litter enforcement agencies to take action against those who litter. This action can be in the form of 'on-the-spot fines', or as reports to the Keep Australia Beautiful Council which are followed up by infringement notices being sent to the offenders.

Not paying your fine can lead to court action or result in your fine being sent to the Fines Enforcement Registry which has the power to withdraw licences until the fine is paid.

NEW PENALTIES FOR LITTERING

In August 2012 the Western Australian Parliament passed amendments to the *Litter Act 1979* which resulted in an increase in littering penalties and a greater range of littering offences.

How will these changes affect the public?

Littering fines will now cost more.

- Cigarette butt littering fines have increased from \$75 to \$200 for individuals and \$500 for corporations (businesses).
- Corporations can now be fined \$500 for littering offences by their workers.
- Fines for some offences have increased to \$500 for individuals and \$2 000 for corporations.
- If taken to court, maximum penalties for littering offences have increased to \$5 000 for individuals and \$10 000 for corporations, or in the case of offences against the litter regulations(in the table below), \$5 000 for both individuals and corporations.



Vehicle owners will now have to take responsibility for any littering from their car or boat.

In cases of littering from vehicles, where neither the litterer nor the driver of the vehicle can be identified, the person responsible for the vehicle (usually the registered owner) will be deemed to have committed the offence and will have to pay the fine unless they can identify the offender.

There is a greater emphasis of littering that is hazardous to the community.

A new littering category called "Littering that creates a public risk' will attract an infringement penalty of \$500 for individuals and \$2 000 for corporations. Examples include (but is not limited to) the littering of car bodies and car parts, batteries, hazardous chemicals or medicines, fridges and freezers with doors attached, tyres, lit cigarettes and syringes.(Details in table below).

What else do I need to know?

In Western Australia littering infringements can be issued by authorised officers that include: police officers, local government rangers and other officers employed by government departments that oversee the protection of the environment and waterways.

The Keep Australia Beautiful Council, through the Litter Report Scheme, issues infringements in response to litter reports from community members who are registered litter reporters.

The December 2012 meeting was attended by eight members with

three apologies. There was general agreement that the 30^{th} Anniversary Garden Party of the Garden & Tree Society held in the Dead Finish Garden in November was a resounding success.



A traditional afternoon tea setting was prepared in the Dead Finish Meeting Room for the 30th Anniversary Garden Party. The display included silver tea service, hand-embroidered linen

table cloths and napkins. Fine English china teacups, plates, silver serving dishes, teaspoons and cake forks. Thanks Peg & Maree for this much admired display.



We had also had visits from two schools towards the end of the school year. The Year Twos from Beverley DHS had their now traditional "Olden Days" activity morning with silver cleaning, dressing up, writing with a nib-pen dipped in ink, and hand-washing using Sunshine Soap, Reckitts Blue and glass scrubbing boards. As usual each student went home with their own piece of Australian history – a pre-decimal currency penny copper coin.

Year Eights from Rossmoyne SHS were studying the transition from the Agricultural Age to the Industrial Age. From our collection we showed unique examples of the "Self-Sufficiency" of pioneers in pre-industrial years when people made their own furniture, clothes, tools, kitchen utensils and gifts.

A research request from a descendant of **Amelia Victoria Smith** revealed this industrious widow sold pies from the Settler's Arms (now Dead Finish) verandah before opening a boarding house opposite the Court House. This building sadly burned down in 1908.

Donations included more Beverley Boy Scout troop memorabilia - receipts, certificates & a Leaping Wolf Badge.

We noted the obituary from the *West Australian* of writer, **Athol Thomas**, who was born in Beverley & compiled the History of Beverley book published in 1946.


