

Budget and Rates

By the time you are reading this the 13/14 budget would have crossed the Council table. The overall increase in income from rates has been set at 4%. Visit by WALGA President & CEO

President of the Western Australian Local Government Association Cr Troy Pickard and CEO Ricky Burges visited Beverley at the end of July. Councillors Foster, Murray, White, Gogol, Pepper, Ridgway and the CEO discussed a range of issues affecting Beverley and provided an overview of current projects.

Local Government Convention

The Beverley Design Studio Old & New Imaginations of A Great Place Beverley



After a recent inspiring and heart-felt long-weekend of meeting and sharing many yarns with community, the Beverley Design Studio is in full swing.

This community project is about enjoyable partnerships and genuine community collaboration – where The University of Western Australia landscape architecture design students, staff, Beverley Community and the Shire Council are doing their level best to *share-communicate*; to *share-dream* and to *share-pragmatise* around the future design realities of the Beverley township.

The UWA students will initially focus on ideas to re-design the town and some of its parts – where main street revitalization, town ecology and recreation, water management, community histories, social cohesion and the arts, for example, might be held high as creative ways to reconfigure the inclusive physical landscape realities of Beverley. The students will then focus on a range of specific town sites, - including the town river park; the public information arrival bay; town walkways, or the main street - and prepare detailed design drawings for further community review.

This community-based project takes on a 'steady-steady-as-we-go' design approach to townscape change and to sustainable community development specifically for Beverley. The UWA students will share their initial thoughts at the forthcoming Beverley Show and with exhibitions at the 'One 1 8' shop in down-town Vincent Street (the recently renovated blue shop near the Chemist) and with presentations to the whole of community over the weekend of 18-19th October, 2013, and then also later in the year.

The UWA design team wish to thank the Shire of Beverley and the Beverley Community for all their warmth and generous hospitality and participation with this important project. There is much work to be done and further community feedback is most welcome.

The Studio is being undertaken by senior UWA Landscape Architecture Students as an important final year project.

Council Elections

IMPORTANT - not to be confused with the Federal Election on 7 September 2013

Election Date

In accordance with the Local Government Act 1995 (and regulations), an Ordinary Election is held every two years on the third Saturday in October.

The Local Government Ordinary Election will be held on Saturday 19 October 2013

Venue / Polling Place / Time

Shire of Beverley Office - 136 Vincent Street, Beverley

Open from 8:00am until 6:00pm on Election Day, Saturday 19 October 2013

The count commences at 6:00pm that same day and the results are normally available later that evening.

Members of the public are welcome to attend and watch proceedings.

Eligibility to Enrol and Vote

You are eligible to enrol if you are:

- 18 years or age or older;
- An Australian Citizen;
- · Correctly enrolled on a State or Commonwealth electoral roll; and
- A resident or a non-resident owner of rateable property or land within the Shire of Beverley.

If you own more than one property within the same ward, please note you are only able to vote once. If you own property in two or more wards, you are eligible to vote in each ward and therefore an Enrolment Eligibility Claim should be completed for each ward if you have not already done so.

Enrolments close at 4:00pm Friday 30 August 2013

How to become an Elected Member (Councillor)

If you want to make a difference in your community and have a say in local decision making, stand for election as a local government Councillor. There are many benefits from being involved in your local council; namely the sense of satisfaction you will achieve from serving your community and being involved in making important decisions for the future.

The decision to stand for Council is a very personal one and you must consider your own circumstances and decide whether you are able to make the commitment required.

Nomination Requirements

Candidates are required to make an appointment with the Returning Officer (CEO) to lodge:

- A completed nomination in the prescribed form signed and witnessed.
- A single A4 page profile containing not more than 150 words of biographical information about the nominee
- Candidate and statements of the candidate's policies or beliefs
- A non-refundable, nomination deposit of \$80 (cash, bank cheque or postal order)
- A recent passport-sized photograph (optional)

When an agent lodges a nomination on a candidate's behalf, the candidate must fill in the prescribed form with a written authorisation and sign it.

Nominations open on Thursday, 5 September 2013 at 8:30am and close on Thursday, 12 September 2013 at 4:00pm

CAT OWNERSHIP UNDER THE CAT ACT 2011



THE SHIRE OF BEVERLEY

THE CAT ACT 2011

An Act to –

- Provide for the control and management of cats; and
- Promote and encourage the responsible ownership of cats, and for related matters.

Cat owners now have to sterilise, microchip and register their pets according to legislation passed in the State Parliament in 2011. This legislation takes full effect from 1st November, 2013.

The new Cat Act gives local governments the power to deal with cat owners that are not responsible, including cat hoarders, and with cats that are not owned.

The legislation will make way for better management of the unwanted impacts of cats on the community and the natural environment, causing nuisance and damage to property.

It also provides for the reunion of cats with their owners.

Administration and Enforcement

Under the Act, Local Governments are authorised to administer its local laws and are authorised to do all other things that are necessary or convenient to be done, for, or in connection with, performing its functions under this Act. Further information PTO

Registration and Tagging

The owner of a cat that has reached 6 months of age must ensure that the cat is registered with the local government in whose district the cat is ordinarily kept.

Penalty: \$5,000 fine for non-compliance.

Owners of cats that are ordinarily kept in the district of a local government must make application for registration (appropriate forms available from the Shire Office).

Cats must be:

- Microchipped; and
- Sterilised

(unless exempt under the Act)

Applicants must be:

- Over the age of 18
- Not convicted within the previous 3 years or convicted of 2 or more offences against:
 - * The Cat Act 2011
 - * The *Dog Act 1976*
 - * The Animal Welfare Act 2002

Verification of information supplied for the purpose of cat registration will be required, either by way of suitable documentation or by statutory declaration within 21 days.

Local Governments are required by law to refuse applications for registration if the applicant does not comply with the requirements within this specified time.

Local Governments are also required by law to cancel the registration of a cat if:

- The cat has died;
- Is no longer kept in the State;
- Has been registered with another local government; or
- Found to have been incorrectly identified as sterilised

All registered cats will be allotted a registration number, and the owner will be given a registration certificate and a registration tag.

The owner of a registered cat must ensure that when the cat is in a public place the cat is wearing its registration tag.

Penalty: \$5,000 fine for non-compliance.

Microchipping

The owner of a cat that has reached 6 months of age must ensure that the cat is microchipped, unless the cat is exempt under the act from microchipping.

A microchip implanter who implants a microchip in a cat is required by law to give notice in writing to the microchip database company who then must keep and maintain this information in respect of the cat.

Penalty: \$5,000 fine for non-compliance.

Sterilisation

The owner of a cat that has reached 6 months of age must ensure that the cat is sterilised by a veterinarian unless the cat is exempt under the act from sterilisation. This veterinarian is required by law to provide a certificate of sterilisation and to notify the microchip database company within 7 days of the cat being sterilised.

Penalty: \$5,000 fine for non-compliance.

\$5,000 fine will apply to anyone incorrectly

identifying a cat as being sterilised.

Management of cats

The Act enables local governments to issue Cat control notices and direct the owner of the cat/cats to comply with a provision of the Act, the regulations or a local law in respect of the cat/cats within a specified period.

The Act also enables local governments to seize any cat that an authorised person believes or suspects, on reasonable grounds, to be the subject of an offence.

The authorised person is to ensure that a cat seized is taken to its owner or is impounded in a proper cat management facility. The owner of a cat kept in a management facility is liable to pay costs associated with:

- Removing and impounding the cat;
- Keeping and caring for the cat;
- Implantation of a microchip in the cat;
- Sterilisation of the cat; and
- Destruction and disposal of the cat.

Breeding of cats

A person may <u>not</u> breed cats unless the person is an approved cat breeder.

Penalty: \$5000 fine for non-compliance.





Finding Prostate Cancer Early

Throughout the Wheatbelt Region of WA, the Find Cancer Early Campaign is urging people to pay attention to changes in their body and if they notice differences that may be symptoms of cancer, to tell their Doctor.

This month we're focusing on the common signs and symptoms of prostate cancer:

- \checkmark Blood in your pee or semen once off
- Waking frequently at night to M pee
- Sudden or urgent need to V pee
- Needing to pee more often ☑
- Difficulty starting or stopping M peeing
- Slow flow when you pee \checkmark
- Pain when you pee ☑
- Dribbling at the end of ☑ peeing
- Bladder doesn't feel quite ☑ empty after peeing
- Being unable to control the \blacksquare bladder (incontinence)
- Unexplained weight loss ☑

If you have had any of these signs or symptoms, tell your doctor. It doesn't mean you've got prostate cancer usually they turn out to be something less serious. But it's important to tell your doctor and get them checked.

Remember, if it is prostate cancer, the earlier it's found, the earlier it can be treated.

Prostate Cancer Myths and Facts Myth: Only elderly men get prostate cancer.

Fact: Although risk increases as men get older, about 1 in 3 prostate cancers occur in men under 65 years old.

Myth: Difficulty peeing or peeing more often are just normal signs of getting older.

Fact: Having problems when you pee can be an important symptom of prostate cancer, regardless of age




Station Gardens






CRANA ABORIGINAL CORPORATION INC

Firstly, may we offer our thanks and appreciation to our CEO, Mr Steve Gollan, and Shire President, Mrs Dee Ridgway, for inviting four CRANA members to Meet Professor Grant Revell and 20 plus graduate students at the Shire chambers. Professor Grant is from the faculty of the University of WA. Interests -Social Science, Indigenous Studies, Landscape, Design and Architecture.

As such, after the introduction we all then proceeded to the Aboriginal Reserve on Duffield Street. We were all very interested to listen to Jesse Ugle tell us about her early childhood days spent on the Reserve. They all had discussions with Mitch Henry, Margaret Mourach and Mal Roberts. Dee, the Shire President, then asked Mal Roberts to outline the Project Plan that relates to putting up a building on the Reserve (Crown Land). Mal then brought up the legal issues, from all quarters, that they are facing. Even though the Shire of Beverley is the legal caretaker of the land, many government bodies seem to be involved. On hearing this, Professor Grant, then made an offer to Mal Roberts, that he and his students may be able to help us with our project and stated that they were involved with a similar situation at Northam, where an Aboriginal Community Cultural centres was built on Crown Land. Professor Grant also offered to design and help with our similar project. Dee Ridgway, then asked Mal if this was acceptable by CRANA and Mal in response immediately accepted and offered his thanks to Professor Grant and his students and also to our Shire President and the CEO for their strong support and the good relationship that they have with the indigenous people in Beverley.

It was also mentioned by Mal Roberts, that once the building (to be known as THE INDIGENOUS COMMUNITY CULTURAL & EDUCATION CENTRE) was built, we would request to have an Official Opening by the Shire President and the Local Member for Pearce and thereafter fly the Aboriginal Flag -GOOD NEWS ALL AROUND.



NEW LAWS - UNPAID FINES - if amount owed exceeds over \$2,000.00 vehicles will be:

- a. Clamped
- b. Number plates removed
- c. Defaulters named on the UNPAID REGISTER.

Those in doubt and/or facing hardship please phone Fines Infringement Notices. These Laws come into force on **21 August 2013** by Court and Tribunal Section, Attorney Generals Department, WA

Some information on MISCONDUCT RESTRAINING ORDER (MRO) - a complaint is lodged with the local police, where one person is being threatened, intimidated, harassed and abused by another person. The police will then guide you through the steps to be taken. Application must be made and lodged in the Magistrates Court. The person that feels threatened, then lodges the Application (Applicant). The person making the threats and intimidation is known as the Respondent. At the hearing date the Magistrate will examine the application to see who is telling the truth. The safety issue is also in question and breach of the peace. The Magistrate will rule thereafter by making conditions, if it is felt there is a case.

If there is a breach of the Court Order, then the Applicant can take out further MRO's. If the matter escalates to violence, then once again lodge a complaint with the police and they may lodge a VIOLENCE RESTRAINING ORDER (VRO) on your behalf, the application for which, will have to be lodged at the Court of Petty Sessions. Phone the Clerk of Courts for further information or get legal advice.

Whilst all this is going on, where there is proven evidence that the Respondent has been making slanderous and defamatory/libellous statements against the Applicant see a lawyer (civil). However, please proceed with caution as these cases attract huge legal and court costs, which in the past has forced some Litigants to even sell their property to cover costs. The 'rule of thumb' is - malicious gossip, advertising libellous material can cause one plenty of grief and money, as court cases can drag on for years - not surprising

Talk to a Mate!!

The message we give in everything we do is ... before it all gets too much... Talk to a Mate or talk it over.

It is important for us to talk about issues in our life or tell our story so we can realise we are not alone and that it is safe to do so. As blokes we quite often isolate ourselves and we go into our cave and don't talk to anyone about our stuff. Now that's all right, as long as we remember to come out of the cave. One of the problems is we don't identify who our true mates are in the good times, this then leads to isolation and loneliness which are often precursors for other wellbeing issues.

Who are our Mates?

We say as blokes we have three broad categories of mates to talk to about our stuff or tell our story to. These usually come under the categories of a mentor, a partner and a peer.

These mates are quite often different than the associates or the mates that we play sport with and/or socialise with. Personally I think I am lucky because my wife is my best mate and I still have a mentor category in my old man who is my other mate. Think about the blokes you know that have no one to talk to!

What is the benefit of talking to a Mate?

It's about sharing your story, and the value there is in realizing that there are other men experiencing the same things, (no matter what the issue) I have never met a bloke yet that hasn't wanted to tell his story. Sometimes we just need the right environment!

The Men's Shed movement in Australia and particularly here in WA provides a very important conduit for men to both meet and talk. Their vision is "a safe place for all men." Part of this is providing a suitable environment for men to meet and chat.

Ask three times if concerned!

If you have a gut feel that someone you know is not travelling well ask them how they are going, more than once! We can all be that mate to someone at some time, most often it is as simple as listening. Talk to a mate!! It will help.

An Unusual Sighting in Beverley

WW2 Volunteer Air Observer Corps

During WW2 a network of Volunteer Air Observers Corps units were set up around Australia, covering an area up to 150 miles inland from Cairns in far north Queensland right around to Port Lincoln in South Australia, and from Albany to Geraldton in Western Australia. The units were principally staffed by civilian volunteers. WAAAF (Women's Auxiliary Australian Air Force) general clerks were used as recorders in operations rooms in Volunteer Air Observer Corps regional Headquarters around Australia.

When the observer spotted an aircraft they would note the direction, number of engines, height and attempt to identify the aircraft if possible. They would then ring the Telephone Exchange and ask for "Air Flash". The Operator would then, if necessary, disconnect current calls to put the call through to the VAOC centre. Each spotter had their own Code Name. (www.ozatwar.com)

The Beverley Air Observer Post

A building in Vincent St (near current hairdressers) was the Air Observer Post in Beverley town (there were others dotted about on farms) during WW2. The walls were lined with pictures of planes in side view, front view and from below to assist the observers to identify air traffic.

The post was equipped with an acoustic listening device on the roof, in the form of a funnel (similar to a loud hailer) with a microphone, attached to a tube that went down through the ceiling to an inside control device (similar to a U-shaped joystick) that allowed the funnel & microphone outside to be turned in any direction. Listeners inside could hear all movement and noises in the vicinity such as people walking along the streets (like the baker who regularly walked to work early every morning), vehicles of all types, roosters in back yards, sheep baaing across the river and, of course aeroplanes approaching. The observers did day and night shifts – mostly married women in the daytime & men at night. There were always two spotters rostered on at any one time. There was a bed for the night shift volunteers to take turns resting.

Not a Tiger Moth

One day Geoff Edwards' mother, Mrs Ruby Edwards, who then resided in Hunt Rd, & next-door neighbour Mrs Connie Wilhelm were on duty and sighted a plane flying south to north. This was unusual as most planes were Tiger Moths flying east/west to/from the Cunderdin training base to the Beverley Aerodrome. They reported the sighting by phone to the Perth headquarters. The unusual report apparently caused some concern in Perth as they were phoned back and asked if they were sure. Later that night, while the men were on duty, the spotters were phoned back again and told to congratulate the two women on their alert observation.

Was it the Enemy?

After the war it was reported in the newspaper that the Japanese had maps with the locality of the airfields at Wagin, Narrogin & Beverley. Could the plane seen by Mrs Edwards & Mrs Wilhelm have been from an enemy vessel off the southern coast, flying north over Beverley & then in a curve out to the ocean again?

A Routine Annual Service Check with the DR!

There is a strong correlation between male attitudes to machines and male wellbeing. If we do not service machines regularly it eventually catches up and the mechanical and performance problems are compounded. Why do we think it is any different for us as Men?

If we neglect our health in any area (physical, mental or social/ spiritual) it will catch up with us in the same way as neglected machine servicing.

There are a lot of similarities between vehicles and machines, and the way a human functions.

With our vehicles and machines we know that clean fuel and regular servicing will prolong the service life of the machine. It is also true that regular attention to our wellbeing will prolong life.

Routine vehicle services have a checklist. When you visit your GP take your list with you for your annual check. You need to be sure to ask the right questions and check off each item.

Some suggested items are:

- Blood Pressure
- Heart Check
- Skin Check
- Weight
- Sight & hearing test
- Aches pains & lumps
- Sleeping Problems
- Erectile dysfunction
- Prostate Check (over 45)
- Testes (lumps)

Your GP may suggest further checks.

- Blood test for cholesterol and PSA (prostate)
- Diabetes test
- ☑ Stress test
- ☑ X-Rays
- Further hearing tests
- ☑ Further sight tests
- ☑ Bowel Cancer (50+)

Remember it is your health! Not your doctors, your wife's or your partners.

Be prepared to ask questions, right down answers (if possible). If you don't understand, ask your doctor to explain.

At RMHI it is field day and show season and we put approximately 2000 blokes across the pits with our Fast Track Pit Stop Program. So think about making a service visit to the doctor when you are not busy and while you are healthy!

When booking an appointment, ask for a longer appointment time.

Visiting your doctor may identify some of the things we are neglecting; often minor adjustments can have a major impact on aspects of your health, work and relationships with your partner, children and others. Cheers


