

President's Report April 2012

Structural Reform/Amalgamations

The South East Avon Regional Transition Group comprising of Beverley, Cunderdin, Quairading, Tammin and York continue to meet on a regular basis and representatives from each Shire have recently undertaken a deputation to South Australia visiting amalgamated Councils. Preparation of Service Delivery Plans is underway, to integrate services of the partner Councils as a component of the Future State Business Plan. The Community Strategy Plan and Current State Business Plan documents are available for viewing from the Shire. Council will be required to make a decision by the middle of this year if it considers progressing to amalgamation will be in the best long term interests of our community and district. I plan to provide an information letter to all rate payers and residents in the near future.

Beverley Aged Care Plan

The consultant engaged by Council to provide a planning framework to support the development of aged care services, facilities and seniors housing for Beverley and its surrounding catchment that meets current and future demand will be holding an afternoon and evening community forum in Beverley on Tuesday 3rd April. <u>Avondale</u>

Very disappointingly the National



Trust did not receive any funding in the recent Royalties for Regions Action Agenda funding round which is a major set back for this significant Regional and State asset. The apparent lack of support toward Regional Heritage by the State Government creates difficulty in attracting funding from other sources. Please keep an eye out for future updates and to register your support.

Road Programme

Shire staff have put in a huge effort over the last month to ensure the bituminising, reseals and bridge upgrade programmes are achieved. The doctors surgery carpark is also due for surfacing, with the contractor the hold up. Gravel sheeting is next on the agenda as per the 10 year road programme.

"Events and Activities in Beverley that attract visitors to our Town" is the theme for the main street banners which are hopefully up before Easter. Comments and future ideas welcome (bearing in mind it's planned to retain the banner poles until a comprehensive future streetscape plan can be developed).

Whilst the desk pad format with pages that can be taken off as required is commonly used in other tourist information centres, it's a first for Beverley and will greatly assist our visitors.



The entertainers were also most impressed with the work of our sound technicians (thanks Steve and apprentice Tim). Thanks too to our wonderful committee for their all-round time and effort.

A beautiful new dance dedicated to Christina Henri's bonnet cause was premiered on the night to the delight of not only Christina but all who were there. 

Hello Beverley,

WE NEED YOUR HELP......

Over the past month there has been an increase in offences in and around Beverley. While the amount of offences that have occurred will not have us labelled the crime capital of Australia, in a small country town it has a massive impact.

So with your help we want to catch the people responsible. This is not just about you apprehending someone when they are doing something wrong. It is about observing what goes on in your street or when you're driving and when you see something that you don't think is quite right.

A lot of times the things that you see and don't think much of may very well be the missing information that we need to catch the offenders. Below is a list of some of the things that should alert you to suspicious behaviour:

A person running: If he or she were looking about furtively, as if he or she were being watched or chased.

A person carrying property: If he or she were carrying property, such as a stereo, office equipment, or a locked bike, at an unusual time or location.

Someone going door-to-door in the area: This person may be looking for an opportunity to steal unattended property from unsecured residential areas.

Anyone forcing their way into a locked vehicle: This is highly suspicious especially at night.

Business transactions being held at a vehicle: Someone could be conducting an illegal drug or stolen property sale.

One or more people sitting in a parked car checking out the area: They may be lookouts for a crime in progress (burglary/robbery).

Increased activity of vehicles or people to a house: If there is an unusual amount of vehicles or people visiting a house and do not stay long and are regular visitors. This could be the sale of illegal drugs.

A person showing unusual mental or physical symptoms: He or she may be injured in an accident, be under the influence of illegal drugs or prescribed medications, or need other medical or psychiatric help.

Strange noises: gunshots, yelling, fighting sounds, dogs barking incessantly.

Clothing: Dependant on the weather conditions, clothing can be a good indicator. People over-dressed during the warmer months, wearing long coats, gloves, scarves and hats, may be a good indication that someone is suspicious.

Actions: 'Customers' who avoid eye contact or who look up at CCTV cameras are worth a second look. If a person is avoiding staff or appears to be concealing something under their clothing they may, again, be worth noting as suspicious. People watching your premises or houses for extended periods of time. People remaining on your premises for extended periods without buying or looking at your goods or services.

Questions: 'Customers' who ask questions relating to opening and closing times, lunch breaks and other unusual enquiries may raise your suspicions.

Not your usual customer type: You will know your customers and have an idea of who uses your premises. People who stand out may be suspicious.

Vehicles: Parked cars with people sitting in them. At opening and closing time be aware of any vehicles with occupants in the vicinity of your premises. When cars are parked they are normally left by their owners. If the occupants of the vehicle are watching you or your premises this should increase your suspicions. During the trading day be aware of activity around your premises, during lunch or coffee breaks, if leaving the premises, be aware of who may be watching you or your premises.

What information we need:

If you witness anything you think is suspicious the information that we will want from you will be some of the following:

Description of the person: Gender, height, build, age, complexion, hair colour, length of hair, clothing worn (shoes, shorts/pants, top/jumper), any other unusual features.

Direction of travel: Where they were heading, Where did they com from, What were they travelling by (bike, walking, vehicle.)

Description of vehicle: Registration number, make and model of vehicle, colour, other features (roof racks, stickers, dents etc.)

Time, Date and Location: Exact time, date and location of when you saw the suspicious behaviour.

How do you report it?:

There are several ways you can report your suspicious behaviour. If you believe that a crime may be in progress or it requires immediate police action. You can call us on 9646 3333 or 131444 and if we do not answer you can speak to an officer in Northam or Perth who will arrange for police attendance. If life threatening call 000.

If it is non-urgent and you think it is something that police should know then you can email us on <u>Beverley.Crime.Ewatch@police.wa.gov.au</u> or come into the station. You can report anonymously to Crime Stoppers on 1800 333 000.

REMEMBER that we treat all information given to us confidential and your personal details and the information given to us will never be given to anyone else. **AND** all information **WILL** be acted upon.

Now that I have gone on about reporting suspicious behaviour I do want to leave you with this thought:

'Sometimes we read or hear too much news that makes us fearful or suspicious of others. We can forget that most of the people that we know, or at least encounter regularly, are decent and friendly'. (<u>Adrienne</u> <u>Clarkson</u>)

Health staff to help smokers butt out

People who visit allied health professionals, community nurses and child health nurses in the Wheatbelt from March will be asked if they smoke and if so, have they considered quitting?

Those who wish to seek support to quit will be provided with a recommendation for an appropriate quit smoking service.

Primary Health Manager Gemma Tuxworth said, "Research shows that most smokers wish they had never started and would like to give up smoking." "Health professionals are perfectly placed to link people to a quitting service," said Gemma.

To ensure those people who want to quit smoking can access a support service in their own community; your local Health Promotion Officer will be running a Wheatbelt Quit Smoking program across the Avon and Central health district which covers the Shires of Goomalling, Dowerin, Toodyay, Northam, York, Beverley, Quairading, Cunderdin, Tammin and Meckering.

This program will include individual advice on nicotine replacement therapy, *Fresh Start* Quit Smoking groups and a motivational text or email messaging service.

Safety investigation launched into imported Off **Road Vehicles**

Consumer Protection has begun an investigation into the safety and quality of imported Off Road Vehicles after receiving several complaints from WA consumers in recent weeks.

Automotive and product safety officers are conducting inquiries into the imported quad bikes, dune buggies and motorbikes, principally low cost models of Chinese origin, some of which come in kit form and must be partially assembled by the purchaser.

Six incidents have been reported, which were not caused by misuse, and include:

A front wheel collapse on a quad

bike while being ridden by 10 year old girl in Leinster;

- A rear suspension mount collapsed on a dirt bike while being ridden by a 15 year old girl in Mundaring;
- A front wheel rim fractured and came off a quad bike while being used in Gidgegannup;
- Fuel leaked from a quad bike and a starter/kill switch failed on a dirt bike, both purchased by a consumer in Busselton;
- Bolts became loose on a dune buggy after only one hour of use by a consumer in Carramar; and
- Three dirt bikes which either failed to start or stalled during use.

Commissioner for Consumer Protection Anne Driscoll is concerned about these reports and the potential for serious injury.

"It's particularly alarming considering these motorbikes are often ridden by children and may pose a serious risk to their safety," Ms Driscoll said.

'To fully investigate this issue and determine the appropriate action, we are keen to hear from other consumers who may have had trouble with these types of off road vehicles and I urge them to contact us as soon as possible.

'Concerned owners should have their dirt bikes and quad bikes thoroughly checked. In the first instance, purchaser should approach their supplier. Alternatively, if purchasers want to obtain an independent assessment, they could pay a licensed vehicle or motorcycle repairer to examine their vehicle with a focus on the safety of the wheels, frame and suspension.

"| strongly recommend that purchasers of kit vehicles not undertake the assembly themselves, not only for safety reasons, but because warranty claims could be jeopardised."


A View from the Shed Understanding our Prostate

This year at Regional Men's Health we are focusing attention on broadening public knowledge about the male prostate gland. Andrology Australia and the Prostate Cancer Foundation have done a good job of drawing attention to the issue of cancer in this part of a man's anatomy, however, there still remains a lot of misunderstanding and even ignorance about this part of a man.

Although Prostate cancer is a big issue, killing more men than the number of women dying from breast cancer, it is not the major problem this gland creates. Most of us know that some older men have trouble emptying their bladder. Sometimes this means getting up often during the night and not able to do anything when they do, which is a nuisance and embarrassing.

Many men are unaware this problem is often caused by their prostate gland. This little gland is shaped like a donut and the tube we pee through goes through the centre. The problem is that as a part of the aging process the prostate keeps growing, just like our ears and nose, and as the prostate enlarges it inhibits our ability to urinate.

Throughout Australia hundreds of thousands of men suffer from this condition and as men we need to act on this if it is affecting us. We need to find out if it is just part of the natural process of ageing and not some-



thing more serious such as a blockage which can cause repeated urinary tract infections or result in bladder or kidney problems or it could be cancer. Unfortunately the symptoms of several conditions are similar.

If you are troubled by urination problems, you should see a doctor - no matter what your age. If your doctor agrees that your symptoms need further evaluation and treatment, you may need to undergo a few tests.

Some of these conditions are a direct result of living longer but dealing with them can make the extra years far more enjoyable. We also know that eating 150 grams of nuts a week (30 grams a day) and incorporating natural red foods such as beetroot, tomato and watermelon into our diet helps keep our Prostate, and the rest of our body, in good condition.







It detected a different surface on the ground with a light sensor and it went forward, hit a bin, detected the bin and sensed that it had to turn around, and it did. After he had showed how it worked and how to do it, he told us to team up and program our robot on this special programming page on the laptop. We programmed it and then we tested it. After a lot of testing we got it right and the robot did exactly what we wanted it to do. I liked programming the robot and seeing it do what we asked it to do. By Zoe
