Regional Arts Australia National Volunteer Awards



Recent statistics pulled from the Wheatbelt show that 1 in 5 adults smoke.

The Wheatbelt Quit Smoking Program provides support to smokers wanting to quit over 12 weeks.

There are three support options available including nicotine replacement therapy advice, Fresh Start group sessions and motivational SMS or emails.

The program is free, and participants qualify for Nicotine Patches and Champix (prescription medication) at a reduced price of \$34.40 per month (even less with a health care card).

Evaluation of the Fresh Start group sessions outlines 35% of participants are still smoke free 6 months after participating.



A View from the Shed Attitudes, a key to good health

I recently read an article written in 2009 by Japanese Doctor, Shigeaki Hinohara, which amazed me. Dr Hinohara was 97 years old and still working 18 hours a day, 7 days a week. He wrote about his views on retirement and had some valid theories which may be well worth considering.

He wrote about longevity and made the following observation; regardless of race or gender people who live long productive lives have one thing in common – none are overweight. He stated that he doesn't get hungry because he focuses on his work, which is still his passion.

He wrote about where his energy came from; Dr Hinohara stated that we place too much emphasis on diet, rest and exercise. He believes energy comes from feeling good and suggests we remember what we were like as children. When you were playing as a child did you ever get so involved you forgot about eating or sleeping? I think most have had that experience and Dr Hinohara suggests keeping that attitude to keep up our energy levels.

He wrote about pain; he said pain is mysterious and having fun takes our mind off our problem which is often the best way to combat pain. Again think of childhood; if a child has a toothache and starts playing a game more often than not the child will forget the pain for a time. As adults we should use the same strategy.

Dr Hinohara also suggests we should not be obsessed with amassing material goods as too often this detracts from real living. He believes that up to about 60 years of age we are building up resources and knowledge, plus supporting our family, and after this age we should focus on giving back to society to build a better future.

For me some of these points are important to reflect on as too often our life is consumed with things that don't really matter. We all need enough to provide and support our family but we can lose sight of the big picture. Older members of society have so much to offer others in their later years. Dr Hinohara celebrated his 100th birthday on the 4th of October 2011 and is still continuing to inspire others. He also has plans to attend the 2016 Tokyo Olympics.

The simple message is to stay involved in life, keep active as long as you can, maintain a healthy lifestyle and most importantly a healthy attitude. We can all achieve a long productive life!

The SOUTH EAST WHEATBELT to become a focus for CARNABYS CONSERVATION

BirdLife Australia (formerly Birds Australia), the country's largest, not-for-profit bird conservation organisation, wants landholders to participate in a new project to help conserve the threatened Carnaby's Black Cockatoo.

The BirdLife project, funded by the Australian Government's Caring for our Country Program, is focused in the south east Wheatbelt within a cluster of four Important Bird Areas, said Cheryl Gole, BirdLife Australia's WA Program Manager.

"Fitzgerald River National Park and the nature reserves of Lake Magenta, Dragon Rocks, Dunn Rock and Lake King are known as hotspots for Carnaby's Black-Cockatoo breeding", Ms Gole said.

"We'd like to work with landholders, local governments and other stakeholders in the area between these sites, as there is important bushland on private land that is really important for Carnaby's."

BirdLife Australia would like to hear from you if:

- You know you have Carnaby's Black-Cockatoos nesting on your property, or the birds regularly feed there
- You have large, mature salmon gums on your property and are not sure if Carnaby's nest in them
- You are interested in participating in this project and you are prepared to undertake activities such as fencing off remnant bushland, nest hollow repairs, or control of competitor species such as galahs on your property.
- You are interested in assisting with revegetation projects specifically aimed at using local native plant for Carnaby's Black species Cockatoos.

The population of Carnaby's has declined by at least 50 percent due to loss of nesting and feeding habitat, and other factors such as competition for nesting hollows by galahs and feral bees.

Ms Gole said that Carnaby's rely on having hollows in nesting trees, as well as, native bush for feeding and these are often on private and public land. Ms Gole also said that some funds are available to help landholders to protect the cockatoos on their land.

The birds prefer hollows in salmon gum and wandoo woodland for nesting. In the Wheatbelt, they feed on plants such as hakeas, grevilleas, banksias and the seeds of some weeds.

BirdLife Australia is calling on all landholders and land managers in the project area to participate in the project.

RDA Wheatbelt is aware that there is still a lot of uncertainty about what the NBN roll-out will involve and what it will mean for communities in the Wheatbelt. With this in mind we have organized for NBN Co and the Department of Commerce, Digital Economy Branch to visit the Wheatbelt in August to run four community information sessions. 



Riders practiced bridge, tarp, and riding through streamers. They sound easy but tend to need lots of trust to train a pony to do them confidently.


