Shire President's Report December 2012

### De Lisle Street Industrial Project

A letter expressing extreme concern has been forward to Minister Grylls regarding the ongoing delay of the current De Lisle St light industrial development seeking the Ministers urgent assistance. Council has not been able to confidently advise when land will be available and subsequently there have been many lost opportunities.

### **Deputy Chief Executive Officer**

Deputy CEO Simon Marshall commenced work with the Shire of Beverley on Monday 5<sup>th</sup> November, which just happened to be the day of the Wild Women of the West Seminar, so he has seen Beverley in action from the word go! Council and staff look forward to Simon's involvement in the smooth running of our Shire and we welcome him into our community.

For over 12 months David Vaughan has made an invaluable contribution to the executive team in a part time capacity as Special Projects Officer and Acting Deputy CEO. David's knowledge and wealth of experience following many years involvement in Local Government is highly valued by all staff and Councillors.

### **Local Planning Strategy**

As mentioned in the November Blarney, the draft Local Planning Strategy is available for public comment until 31<sup>st</sup> January 2013. The Strategy document can be viewed on the Shire website or in

hard copy at the Shire office or Community Resource Centre.

### Roadworks

Following bituminising of 1.8km in November, the Beverley section of the Greenhills South Rd has now been sealed from the Mawson Rd to the York boundary. The carpark at the Doctors surgery is also receiving a facelift.

### **National Trust Award**

The CEO and I attended the National Trust AGM on 7<sup>th</sup> November to receive an award on behalf of the Shire of Beverley for the Shire's relationship with the Trust and our assistance regarding Avondale.

### <u>Beverley Harvest Festival at</u> <u>Avondale - Sunday 25<sup>th</sup></u> <u>November 2012</u>

The commitment from the Avondale Farm Project Association towards Avondale is remarkable. The Harvest Festival was a day for all ages attracting a crowd of around 2000, was supported by well over 60 volunteers, and received impressive feedback, particularly from city visitors. Congratulations to all involved.

#### Avondale

The potential financial risk to the National Trust (or any public

body) in retaining the property in its current state of deterioration creates a very fragile situation for Avondale. Indeed, I have just received advice from the National Trust Chief Executive Officer that executive team have reluctantly agreed that due to this risk, the property should be prepared for disposal. This is despite the fact they believe Avondale could be one of the Trust's greatest educational tools present and future generations. The final decision in relation to this will most likely be made by the National Trust Council early in 2013.

There are many interlinked facets that could be developed to achieve a sustainable outcome for Avondale, with the community educational aspect highlighted as a priority. Without a capital injection to reverse the many years of infrastructure decline it will be difficult to move forward, and as reported previously, that required capital has so far been elusive.

The National Trust CEO regularly quotes that in his twenty years plus in the role, he has never seen such community and other support for a place like Avondale and that the potential for education, tourism and regional development is enormous.

You will find more information on page 30. I propose to provide a community update at the Annual Electors meeting in December and the January edition of the Blarney.


### **Christmas in Beverley**





### Local girls shine at Graduation





Hello All,

Firstly I'd like to introduce your new local police officer, First Class Constable Ian Roberts. Ian arrived a few weeks ago with his wife Annette. Some of you have already had the pleasure of meeting and extended them a warm welcome, thank you!

**STOCK THEFT** - Livestock theft is the most significant rural crime. Clear identification limits saleability of stock and greatly aids identification and return of stolen stock.

### To assist police:

- \* Maintain good stock records. Keeping accurate records of all livestock bought and sold.
- \* Regularly check your stock and the paddocks, fences and where the stock are grazing.
- \* Keep all paddock, shed and stockyard gates closed and wherever possible, locked.
- \* Use locking posts to obstruct large openings to yards.
- \* If possible, locate stockyards or loading ramps away from public roads or main entrances to your property. Keep them locked when not in use.
- \* Ensure loading ramps are stored out of sight when not in use.

If you have livestock stolen you should contact the Police. Beverley Police will attend the scene of every reported stock theft within our area. Do not disturb the area; police will conduct a forensic examination of the area. You will be asked a number of questions in order for us to obtain a better description of the livestock. You will need your brand and PIC details. We will be increasing our vehicle stops of vehicles carting livestock. If you are stopped carrying livestock, the driver will be asked for a stock waybill or National Livestock Vendor Declaration. The only exception to this is where a primary producer has been given a letter of authority from Department of Agriculture for regular transport between different farming locations under the PIC.

Also, please show some courtesy and slow down when a road sign indicates a farmer is moving sheep ahead. They are a flighty animal and can be difficult to settle if spooked and become a traffic hazard if scattered across a road.

**HOLIDAY SEASON - TAKE CARE** Over 55% of road fatalities occur in Regional WA and it's a myth that those killed are city people who are inexperienced at driving on country roads. The truth is its country people dying on roads they travel on every day.

The road environment in Regional WA means drivers there need to take special care. Long distances, higher speed limits, fatigue and an unforgiving driving environment all contribute to an increased risk of fatal or serious injury crashes.

Drivers should always wear seatbelts, take extra care, slow down and allow plenty of time for long journeys, stopping now and again for driver breaks. Driving while tired can be as dangerous as driving under the influence of alcohol.

Every road crash affects more than just the person killed or seriously injured. It also affects husbands, wives, sons, grandparents, daughters and friends - often for the rest of their lives. Beyond this, there are the effects of road trauma on those who have to directly deal with it - police, ambulance officers, doctors, nurses and so on.

The fact is, everyone who uses the roads has a role to play in road safety, and we can't do enough to all build a culture of safe driving.

**GOPHERS** These vehicles are a highly prized possession for those who are no unable to drive a car. They give the owner the independence and freedom to travel at a slow but steady pace safely from A to B. Please do not interfere with or take any liberties with them when left unattended. A reminder to the drivers of these vehicles; you are a person in charge of a motor vehicle and as such will be subject to a breath test and charged if over the limit.



to celebrate the 30th Anniversary of this wonderful long standing community group.





### RECYCLING IN THE SHIRE OF BEVERLEY



### YOUR FIRST COLLECTION WILL BE ON: FRIDAY 4 JANUARY 2013

The Shire of Beverley and their Contractor, Avon Waste, are pleased to introduce your new Kerbside Recycling Collection.

Please read the following information to familiarise yourself with the recycling process.

### **How The Collection Works:**

- You will be provided with a new 240 Litre Recycling Bin. This bin is for recyclable materials only – NO RUBBISH.
- Your bins will be collected each fortnight.
- Place your rubbish bin and your recycling bin on the kerb next to each other, leaving a gap of about ½ a metre between the bins.
- Remember: Your rubbish and recycling bins will **not** be emptied at the same time, please leave your bins out until the truck has emptied them.
- Please <u>do not</u> place your recycling in plastic bags; it must be loose in your recycling bin.
- Make sure your recycling material is clean, <u>do not</u> put full cans, jars or bottles in your recycling – empty and clean them first.

### **Useful Tips:**

- Have you thought about putting a second bin in your kitchen? It saves sorting through rubbish to find recyclables, and each bin can be easily emptied into your wheelie bin for collection when they are full.
- Flatten your cardboard boxes and stack them inside each other, this will save room in your bin.
- Make sure you don't jam your bin. If your bin has only been half emptied, it is because the recycling didn't fall out when the bin was tipped up. Place heavier items at the bottom of the bin, they will help to force out lighter items.

- 1. Remove Sec 25 which allows state to make laws.
- 2. Remove Sec 5 (26)
  Allows the Government to make Special Laws for our people.
- 3 Add a new Section (51A) to recognise Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Occupation of the Land and relationship to the land and water.
- 4. Add a new Sec (116A) which will specifically prohibit racial discrimination.
- Add a new Sec (127A) for recognition of the languages and protect the role of that language in our community.

### Beverley Community Para-Legal and Referral Services

The following is from a most unusual case and is taken from the ABC Law Report—Radio National of 22.11.2012.

### **Family Court Case Hearing**

Couple 'S' got married in 1971. No problems throughout their married life.

1999 - Wife went into Age Care Residency.

1999 - Daughter appointed as Guardian for the parents.

1999 - Husband living in his own property (life tenant).

2010- Wife diagnosed with Dementia.

2010 - Thereafter - Daughter lodged application to the Family Court, claiming her inheritance, as property settlement. Even though both her Mother and Father were still alive. The Family Court in it's wisdom ordered the Husband to pay his Daughter \$613,000.00 - The Husband( father of the claimant) had no savings. He would have to sell his home - value \$1.3 million.

2011 - Wife passed away then husband appealed to the High Court, to challenge the decision of the Family Court. Thereafter the High Court ruled by overturning the

decision of the Family Court. Bases: Even though the wife had Dementia and passed away; prior to that , the couple were married for 37 years, had no problems and had NO intention to divorce. The husband had life tenancy and where would he go, at the age of 83.

Lawyers comment: This is the most unusual case, more or less of extreme legal significance - Why?

- Firstly a claim for inheritance is normally made after the person has passed on (not while they are still alive).
- The matter is dealt with Estate/Grant of Probate etc. property settlement which has to be lodged through the Supreme Court and NOT the Family Court.
- 3. This case "S" will create a tremendous amount of interest in all legal circles.

Final Comments: Before any family wish to appoint a Guardian, Attorney of Enduring Power of Attorney. Think carefully and discuss as to whether a trustee company or a family member is more suitable for the responsibility.

Dementia is a cruel and sad affliction, thousands of families feel the pain and their interests need to be protected.

### And that's when the Argument started!

### View from the Shed

Arguments often start because we don't, or can't see another person's point of view. We always tend to see things our way so when someone doesn't have the same idea on solving a problem sparks can fly!

An example of this happened to my wife and I on our recent trip to the United States. Our plan was to drive across America following Route 66 (the old mother road). This was really my trip, part of my bucket list, so I booked a Mustang for the journey.

All was going to plan, we had a few days in San Francisco and then went to the airport to get the car. This is when I was informed there were no more Mustangs! Now the car bloke was polite, informing me he had this beaut little European upgrade which he was sure I would enjoy driving! Was I happy, NO and I informed him politely that I hadn't come all the way from Australia to drive some European scrap metal - I wanted a Mustang!

Now my wife saw this quite differently. She was interested in the trip and the places we were going to visit, but the car, well the make and model just didn't matter to her. For her a car is a means of getting to a destination and this little European thing looked the part, and that's when the argument started...

Very often people have very different ideas about the same thing. When an issue threatens to blow up it often requires slowing down, counting to 10 and contemplating other points of view. If we don't do this we apply our own emotionally charged perspective without considering the other person's viewpoint and we can end up in a heated discussion with little chance of a mutual resolution.

In my case the car hire company miraculously found a brand new red Mustang within minutes, so the situation quickly dissolved. Sometimes situations aren't as easily resolved and my suggestion would be to step back, get your emotions in check and try to consider another point of view perhaps by putting yourself in their place. If we do this we can usually reach a compromise that avoids a confrontation.

At this time of year, when we are all busy our nerves can be a bit raw. Take time to consider before over reacting. It will save an unnecessary argument starting simply because we reacted prematurely. Better to avoid confrontation than having to dig yourself out of a tricky situation later.

The best Christmas present you can give yourself is time *now* to look after yourself. Many people put off seeking help about their health in the lead up to Christmas.

Taking time in the lead up to Christmas to see your doctor about possible signs/symptoms of cancer is an important message of the Cancer Council WA's Find Cancer Early campaign.

"The lead up to Christmas gets pretty hectic and it's easy to forget about looking after yourself. If you know something isn't right we encourage you to see your doctor well before - it's the best present you can give yourself", said Mandy Harding Find Cancer Early Project Officer.

During the development of the Find Cancer Early campaign, researchers spoke to a number of people from regional WA with cancer. Christmas was a common reason why people postponed getting help.

"We were over-whelmed by the number of people who spoke about having symptoms before Christmas, but because they were so busy they put off seeing their doctor," said Professor Jon Emery, GP and lead researcher at the University of Western Australia. "But because of the Christmas shut down, when they were ready to see someone there were big delays that pushed things back even further."

Evidence shows that delaying seeing the doctor for just 5 weeks can have a big impact on patient outcomes, which is why the campaign's message 'the earlier cancer is found, the greater the chance of successful treatment' is so important.

"Recognising symptoms early is important, so we want to encourage people to put themselves first. Find Cancer Early is all about helping people to recognise symptoms early and giving strategies to overcome excuses or barriers to seeking help" said Mandy Harding.

If you are over 40 and have coughed up blood or had blood in your pee once off tell your doctor. You should also tell your doctor if you have had any of these symptoms for more than 4 weeks: blood in your poo; problems peeing; looser poo (diarrhoea); unexplained weight loss; an unusual pain, lump or swelling anywhere in your body; becoming more short of breath; or a persistent cough.

Having these symptoms doesn't mean you have cancer – often they turn out to be something less serious, but it's important to tell your doctor. More information is available at: <a href="www.findcancerearly.com.au">www.findcancerearly.com.au</a>.

### 1913 -2013 **Brookton's Old Police** Station turns 100

2013 is the Year for Celebration of the Old Police Station and Quarters Centenary. The Brookton & Districts Historical Society invites the community to participate in several events to mark this occasion.

The Brookton community began its quest for a resident police presence in 1906 but it took until 1913 to achieve that goal - even after the Road Board Secretary had pointed out early in 1912 that a Police Station was warranted because of "a large numbers of men of all descriptions drinking and rolling about the streets".

From 1913 to 1969 the building served as accommodation for a succession of Ione Police Officers and their families. By 1975 the number of serving officers had grown to three - all of whom had to work from the small Charge Room at the same time. As the Charge Room also served as the Court Room on Court Day, working space was at a premium so in 1980 a new Police Station and separate quarters were built. The old building changed is role to "Museum" in 1986.

To begin the celebratory year there will be:

A POSTER COMPETITION which is open NOW to all age groups. The Launch of the Celebrations on 22<sup>nd</sup> February 2013 when the PRIZES for the POSTER COMPETITION will be awarded; a new exhibition about the Brookton Co-op will be opened and the Museum will be open to the Public on that day and the 23<sup>rd</sup> February.

I receive many favourable compliments regarding Stickybeaks windows displays. Each week I attempt to theme the windows by colour or current events.



As hay cutting and the preparations for this year's harvest are underway, please note that it is essential that you are safe when moving farm equipment on public roads.

There have been complaints from local police that some of the farming community are not complying with safety regulations as set down in the "Guide to the use of Towed Agricultural Implements in WA". Failure to follow these guide lines could result in a tragedy or at least a heavy fine.

Please remember that large and over-width farm equipment that is self-propelled is covered by the Traffic Act.

It is important that you consider not only your safety and the safety of people working for you (OH & S), but the other road users who may not be accustomed to meeting slow oversized vehicles on our narrow roads.

It is also a good safety measure to use UHF radios when moving farm equipment to communicate with other road users and broadcast you movements on Channel 40.

## CHRISTMAS, PARTIES & ALCOHOL

Lots of drinking often occurs during the festive season and it can be helpful to know how to minimise the risks.

#### **Christmas Cheer!**

#### Too much Christmas Cheer can result in harm for drinkers and others

- Last Christmas 2 million Australians knew someone who was injured/harmed as a result of binge drinking.
- 1.3 million Australians experienced abuse or violence arising from binge drinking.
- 70% of Australians were negatively affected by someone else's drinking e.g. excessive noise, verbal abuse, traffic crashes, physical and sexual assault.

#### **Hosting a Christmas Party**

#### Be the perfect host

- Food: food slows the rate of alcohol absorption and eating slows the pace of drinking.
- Non-alcoholic drinks: provide mineral water, soft drink, juice, tea and coffee.
- **Alcohol alternatives:** provide low alcohol drinks such as mid-strength beer and low alcohol wine. Serve in small glasses.
- Entertainment: provide diversions so drinking isn't the party's focus.
- Friends: offer food and non-alcoholic alternatives to the quick drinkers.
- Closing Time: stop serving alcohol and start serving tea and coffee.
- **Transport:** get guests home safely by taxi, public transport, or picked up by parents or friends, and suggest in your invitation that if people are going to be drinking to leave the car at home.

#### **Christmas Party Goers**

#### Have fun... and be invited back next year

- Start with a soft drink and have a spacer or Mocktail (non-alcoholic drink) every 2 or 3 drinks.
- Use standard drinks to keep track of how much you drink using information on labels\*
- **Drink slowly** and avoid drinking games that encourage 'skulling' or 'shooters'.
- Eat before and while you are drinking and avoid salty snacks that make you thirsty.
- Stick to one drink at a time and don't let people top up your drink.
- Stay busy with activities such as playing pool or karaoke.
- Drink low alcohol alternatives such as low or mid-strength beer and low alcohol wine.
- Be strong and don't be pressured into drinking too much.
- Don't medicate with alcohol if you suffer from mental health issues such as depression. Seek support instead.
- Enjoy Yourself!
- \* (the National Health and Medical Research Council recommends for reduced lifetime risk of harm no more than 2 standard drinks for men and women on any one occasion and no more than 4 drinks on a single occasion reduces the risk of alcohol related injury).



One in four Australians have convict heritage and many are unaware of it.



#### View from the Shed - Exercise for Cardiovascular Health

We need to link exercise to our heart health first and then the other factors associated with exercise will fall into place, which may include weight loss, change in our metabolism, feeling energised and in control of who we are.

The group of diseases linked under the cardio-vascular category are the leading causes of deaths in Australia today. When our lifestyle incorporates exercise and a well-balanced diet we will reduce the risk of poor health outcomes.

#### Physical activity and participation in sport is associated with:

>improving our psychological wellbeing;

reforming social networks which can provide support;

>maintaining a healthy body weight;

reducing the risk of many chronic conditions and injuries.

From a recent National Health Survey 42% of males (18 years and over) reported that they exercised enough to obtain benefits for their health. However the rate of physical activity reported changed with age. Activity generally decreased in males between ages 18-24 and 45-54 years, but increased from 55 to 74 years and then declined substantially after that.

Interesting! At all ages males were more likely than females to exercise sufficiently.

#### Busy time of the year

Whether it is harvest time or any other busy time of the year, we can use this as a starting point to include exercise as part of our weekly routine. It's always busy and we are good at making excuses to not exercise.

We factor holidays into our diary. We should factor exercise into our daily lives.

#### What are the recommendations for physical activity?

The National physical activity guidelines for adults sets out steps to better health for Australian adults. These are:

- 1. think of movement as an opportunity, not an inconvenience;
- 2. be active every day in as many ways as you can;
- 3. put together at least 30 minutes of moderate-intensity physical activity on most, preferably all, days. (examples of moderate intensity activity are brisk walking, swimming, doubles tennis and medium paced cycling);
- if you can, enjoy some regular vigorous activity for extra health and fitness (examples of vigorous physical activity are jogging, football and basketball).

#### Start now!

This can then mean we can perhaps indulge in a few extra treats – whatever they may be.
