President Report January 2016

As we enter 2016... This time last year Council had endorsed the Beverley Water

Harvest Project Planning Report and a grant application to the Department of Water for implementation was in the "pipeline"! The grant was successful and works are now well underway in preparation for the forthcoming winter. Resolving ongoing internet and mobile coverage issues around the district has not been as positive.

Multipurpose Community and Visitor Hub

Unfortunately the Shire was not successful with its application to the National Stronger Regions Fund Round 2 for the Multipurpose Community and Visitor Centre project. Feedback is being sought on the submission and analysis of Round 3 guidelines is underway as Council determines a course of action to progress this important community and economic development facility.

Shire Office

Some in the community may have already heard that the shire office was broken into several weeks before the end of 2015. The intruder was found sleeping in the building by a staff member first thing in the morning and subsequently detained by local police. Fortunately there was no damage however staff had a large untidy mess to rectify once police and forensics gave the OK. Whilst this is a very rare incident in terms of the Shire building being broken into, it is alarming that such characters are visiting Beverley from time to time. Please be vigilant.

Roadwork

Preparation and sealing work continues on the York Williams road which will result in the remaining section within the Shire of Beverley being bituminized in the not too distant future.

February - Local Government Training in Beverlev

In February the Shire of Beverley will host one of several 4 day programmes of training opportunities for Elected Members to be held at regional locations around the State. The WA Local Government Association (WALGA) and Government Department of Local Communities (DLGC) are working in partnership Dee Ridgway - Shire President

to provide high level training opportunities for Country Local Government members to build their skills and improve governance and decision making. Course topics include Serving on Council, Meeting Procedures and Debating, Land use Planning, and Strategy and Risk Management.

Central Country Zone of 16 Local Governments

The Central Country Zone of Local Governments comprises the Shires of Beverley, Brookton, Corrigin, Cuballing, Dumbleyung, Kulin, Lake Grace, Narrogin (Town and Shire due to merge in 2016), Pingelly, Quairading, Wagin, Wandering, West Arthur, Wickepin, and Williams. Each Council has two elected member delegates and Beverley is represented by Cr Ridgway and Cr Murray with Cr Buckland as proxy. Cr Ridgway has been re-elected onto the Zone Executive. Shire of Cuballing President Cr Mark Conley, is the new Zone President.

Beverley Christmas Lights

It was lovely seeing Christmas lights up during the festive season and thankyou for the time taken to do this (especially as once they go up, there's more work to get them back down and packed away!) Travellers along Great Southern Highway between Beverley and Brookton were even treated to a Christmas light display by new district residents on their Mt Kokeby property.







bread and drank something. Then we got a penny and lollies. *Mya*


I am going to keep my coin forever, literally ever! It might be a family heirloom. *Jade*



SUCCESSION PLANNING - A SERIES OF COMMENTARIES [8]

Formal business meetings

It is also our recommendation, based upon the experience that we have in these matters, that formal and regular structured meetings should occur amongst the members of the Business who have an interest, either direct or indirect, in the Business to ensure that the core values, goals and philosophy of the Business are maintained, any risk to the Business is minimised and any misunderstandings between members of the Business addressed at an early stage. For example, we recommend that regular and formal business meetings occur no less than once every quarter and be supported by an agenda, minutes of previous meetings and notices of any resolutions that will be moved at the next meeting. Those documents should be circulated amongst all the members of the Business and notice thereof given within a reasonable time prior to the meeting (which we considered to be not less than seven days before the meeting).

A formal meeting structure is of particular benefit to those who are "off farm" and not privy to the day to day discussions and decisions which are made and which impact upon the direction, profit and success of the Business.

Strategic plan

As part of the suite of documents we recommend be prepared by the members of a farming business, a strategic plan is very important.

The strategic plan should be for a period of not less than three years and probably not more than five years and must interface seamlessly with the constitution and the expectations of the members of the Business.

Annual retreats

From our experience and from discussions with clients, we recommend that annually the strategic plan and the progress of the Business be reviewed by a meeting of all members of the Business whether they be "on farm" or "off farm" and that the review occur away from the Business so as to give each attendant the opportunity to fully focus on the review. We recommend the review last not more than one day and not less one half day.

Role of the advisors

The task of completing a business constitution and strategic plan is somewhat daunting and can be made more simple by the use of your trusted advisors and banker. To that end, we recommend that during the process, and sooner rather than later, you involve your banker, your accountant, your farm advisor and your lawyer to assist in the completion of the process. The combined knowledge and experience of the members of the Business and their advisors will have a substantial impact upon the quality and longevity of a successful business.

Checklist

There are many other matters that should be included in the constitution and strategic plan of a business. It is our recommendation that a checklist of those matters be prepared before holding the meetings necessary to prepare those documents. We have prepared a checklist of those matters and are more than willing to make our checklist available to you upon request.



Warriors Wellbeing Article - SELF-WORTH vs SELF-ESTEEM



Self-worth and self - esteem are often confused as being synonymous (the same), however they are very different.

Self-esteem is about measuring yourself based on external actions; Self-worth is about valuing your inherent worth as a person. In other words self-worth is about who you are, not about what you do.

Society pushes for the need to have a high self-esteem but the problem with this is that you are always valuing yourself against others. The competitive nature of men in particular, tells us we need to be better and above average to feel really good about ourselves (keeping up appearances). When you look at this way of building your self-esteem it can be a losing battle because there will always be someone who is more handsome, slimmer, richer, owns bigger and better equipment and so on.

Self-esteem is pretty transient and can change in an instant depending on what happens, for example we may be feeling pretty good about a new piece of machinery or the quality of our stud flock and then someone makes a negative comment and our self-esteem falters and we feel completely crushed. That's how fragile our self-esteem can be because it can also be fixed by a compliment that bolsters us again. Much anxiety may be created in striving for acceptance or approval and maintaining our ego or pride.

Probably the best way to understand self-worth is to ask yourself how valuable you are, or how much you deserve to have something you prize. It is a deep knowing that you are of value, that you are loveable and necessary to this life. One may feel a high self-esteem because they are good at something, yet still not feel they are loveable and worthy. When you have a healthy self-worth (at the very core of yourself) you have a deep knowing that you are fundamentally a valuable and worthwhile person regardless of -

- \Rightarrow what others may say or do to you;
- \Rightarrow what your successes or failures are;
- \Rightarrow what you win or lose;
- \Rightarrow what you have or don't have;
- \Rightarrow whether you are sick or healthy.

The concept of self-worth is really about knowing that you are always going to be worth more than all of your achievements put together.

It is definitely a good thing to think and feel good about ourselves but what happens when our self-esteem is crushed, does that mean we are no longer valuable? **Absolutely not** however many people do think that they are no longer valuable. For example Robyn Williams, the highly regarded actor and held in high esteem by millions, completed suicide probably not because of a low self-esteem but more likely a low sense of self-worth.

Self-worth and self-esteem are vital beliefs for empowering oneself. A valid sense of self worth is necessary in order to attain love and a sound mind. A valid sense of self-worth precludes the possibility of depression and the worthlessness that can lead to despair or possible suicidal behaviour.

Situations, or life events, can come from many places. As these situations develop we need to value our self-worth to reduce anxiety for ourselves. *Remember …before it all gets too much… Talk to a Mate!*



Claire Broun - Designer of the Town Entry Statement

ell travelled: Claire Broun, senior landscape architect with JMD Design in Sydney, takes StreetChat through designing for Copenhagen and Sydney.

Tell us about yourself. What drew you to landscape architecture?

My father is a fifth generation wheat farmer and my mother an artist. I grew up in an old homestead on a property in Western Australia's wheatbelt.

A flourishing garden surrounds the verandahs where, as a child, I would often forage for plants to dissect and draw. I realise now, looking back, that these environments, both within and beyond the garden fence, are fundamental to who I am today.

I showed talent as an artist throughout high school and was enthusiastic about continuing my interest with studies at university. This, combined with a developing interest in the land, lead me to enrolling in Landscape Management at UWA.

A second year elective sent me to the Architecture, Landscape and Visual Arts (ALVA) campus for a lecture on 'A sense of place.' I walked through the landscape architecture studio, full of drawing boards, and decided then and there to switch courses.

For a new graduate, how was the experience of working in Scandinavia?

Winning a scholarship upon graduating from university took me to Copenhagen for three years. My first job as a graduate, in the Scandinavian city known for its 'livability' was a bit of a Hans Christian Andersen fairytale–like dream.

I embraced my position, thoroughly enjoyed the Copenhagen lifestyle and took every opportunity to travel. It was an exciting time for me as a young graduate, often flying to meetings in Paris or London.

Overall, the projects I worked on varied in scale and location. Memorable projects were Aalborg's Opera House, a 50ha park in Amman Jordan, residential developments in London and a number of competitions throughout Denmark and Europe.



Most of these projects were documented in English however the first project I worked on was for some deep-sea baths in Sweden. Like most Scandinavian interactions my boss spoke Danish and the client Swedish so I spent initial meetings focusing on differentiating the two languages.

My first job as a graduate, in the Scandinavian city known for its 'livability' was a bit of a Hans Christian Andersen fairytale–like dream.

How does Scandinavian design compare to Australian?

The general population of Scandinavia has a good understanding of design and

importantly landscape architecture is a much more established profession there, so people are more aware of the contributions we can make.

I can only speak for one Danish firm, though there were some noticeable variations in the design approach. A great awareness of the nuances of materials and of place informed concepts, often leading to responses that would embody a classical quality, with an element of timelessness, naive to a style or trend.

The adjustment between countries was not so much in the design process, but more in the consideration of local, cultural and environmental factors.

Which Australian projects have you been working on?

I was fortunate to be involved in the early masterplan stages of Central Park, working through concept and design development from 2007 while I was in Denmark.

I then relocated to Sydney for the documentation and construction of the main park, adjacent plaza and streets, along with various other areas throughout the precinct. Like any project, seeing it come to life after so many years in the making was rewarding. This was especially so when Balfour Street was opened up, providing a connection to the park from Broadway through to Chippendale and beyond. Seeing such large numbers of people use a space that was previously walled off to the public is really something.

What influences your designs?

I'm mostly inspired by travel. Experiencing how other cultures use space, noticing ecological differences, different plant characteristics and assessing how my own behaviour changes in response to new environments.

I love spending time in galleries, and revisiting favourites to notice details I hadn't seen previously. I'll never tire of places like Louisiana Museum's sculpture garden.

What are you excited to be working on at the moment?

I'm currently working on Parramatta Square. JMD is part of a great lead design team consisting of TCL, TZG and Gehl Architects.

Many of the projects I've worked on have been collaborations, which is important in striving for a unified and integrated outcome. I find the initial stage we're in, when everyone is throwing ideas around, an exciting part of the process.

Lyme Disease Association of Australia

Have your say, tell your story

In <u>November</u>, the Senate asked a committee to look into Lyme-like illness in Australia. The committee announced their plan with a list of points they will cover. The committee refer to this as a 'Terms of Reference'. You can find the <u>full terms of reference</u> on the Senate website.

The committee want to:

1. find out how many people have a Lyme-like illness and where they live;

2. find out how to protect patients, doctors and researchers from poor treatment;

3. understand how people get diagnosed with Lyme-like illness. They want to know about pathology laboratories, the types of tests in use and how they work. They want to know how laboratories, and people, can make sure they are doing the right tests the right way. They are interested in overseas tests and if they are different, why? They want to know why tests done overseas are not accepted in Australia;

4. find out how much money was spent on research. They want to know what research is looking at the germs and bugs that people get from ticks. They want to know what research is looking at other ways people can become sick with Lyme-like illness;

5. find out if there is research looking for a unique Australian bug/s that is causing many people to have a Lyme-like illness;

6. find out what types of signs and symptoms people have when they have Lyme-like illness. They want to know how those people are being treated and how patients and families are impacted by their illness; and

7. if there is anything else they need to know.

It's important that everyone who has a Lyme-like illness, and their friends and family make a submission telling the Senate committee about their story. This is your opportunity to stand up and be counted. You don't need to answer all the points, you can simply tell your own story about how you became sick and how you've been treated. You can provide your opinion on any of the other points too. The committee are especially interested in hearing from people with a lived experience of Lyme-like illness.

The committee accepts written submissions. If you are unable to make a written submission, the committee will accept an audio submission and will have your submission transcribed and published with your permission.

This is really important for anyone you know who may fall into this category. There is a template available on the Lyme Disease Associations web site, which is easy to follow & helpful to fill. It can be a family member filling in, if the person is too ill to be able to do it. All submissions will be accepted by the Association and forwarded to the Senate inquiry where Members of the Association will be present in person to present all the submissions. This is our chance to be heard and we need a very loud voice so please encourage anyone you know who is suffering, to participate. For more information please contact Jeff & Wendy Murray.
