Annual Electors Meeting

Thankyou to community members who attended the 2017 Annual Electors Meeting held on Tuesday 15 November where the 16/17 Annual Report which was unanimously received. There were no questions in relation to the Annual Report and in General Business various questions were asked on a range of topics including Beverley Medical Practice; ANZAC Lane bituminising; Corella Destruction Licence; public toilet vandalism; secondary river crossing; Bushfire Preparedness meeting; Vincent Street speed limit, banner poles, paving, redevelopment plans, drainage and flooding. Meeting participants were invited to join Councillors for supper and to view the new 3D "fly-through" presentation of the Cornerstone Building. Meeting minutes will be available from the Shire office and website.

Solar Power for the Shire Office

On 22 November 2017 a solar power system installed at the Shire Office was switched on. The new system, together with installation of LED lighting, should result in a significant reduction in power bills going forward.

Swimming Pool

Following a slight delay in opening the Beverley swimming pool for the summer season as bowl painting and joint replacement work was completed, the pool is now open for action. The kiosk exterior and change rooms are also looking very fresh and I'm sure Pool Manager Brad Miller joins Council in encouraging everyone to take advantage of this great community facility.

Local Government Act 1995 Review

The Local Government Act provides the framework for Western Australian local government. Local governments are created by the Act which sets out the functions, responsibility and powers of local government. Western Australia has changed greatly since the Act was introduced in 1995. Public expectations of government and what can be achieved through technology have evolved. While the Act has been regularly amended, key aspects seem outdated.

Phase 1 of a two phase Local Government Act 1995 review being undertaken by the McGowan State Government considers:

- Making information available online
- Meeting public expectations for accountability
- Meeting public expectations of ethics, standards and performance
- Building capacity though reducing red tape

Tourism Planning Framework Updates

Beverley Tourism Officer Jenny Murray has been doing a terrific job progressing actions identified in the Beverley Tourism Planning Framework 2016 – 2020. This has included roll out of the BeverleyWA branding, refurbishment of the beverleywa website, development of the Welcome to Beverley WA visitor information booklet, social media revitalisation and working with the Community Resource Centre who are the Visitor Centre Manager. With the impending addition to her family Jenny has stepped back from the role and the Shire has engaged Jacinta Murray to fill the position from February until the end of the financial year when Council will have reviewed current tourism initiatives as part of the 2018/2019 budgetary process.

Avon Tourism Board

Thank you to John Maxwell, Hotel Beverley, who will represent Beverley on the Avon Tourism Board. Avon Tourism is a regional tourism organisation and currently represents the Shires of Beverley, Chittering, Goomalling, Northam, Toodyay, York and Victoria Plains. John is also a participant on the Beverley Tourism Advisory Group which provide feedback for the Tourism Officer as various actions from the Beverley Tourism Planning Framework are developed.

Banner Poles Feedback

Council is seeking feedback regarding the Banner Poles in middle of Vincent Street. CORNERSTONE UPDATE

The Cornerstone building is progressing on time as planned. To date the pre-lay of the plumbing and electrical services is complete along with the pouring of the main concrete slab by Wongan Concrete, a regional supplier.

Over the next month the following should take place – completion of the retaining wall, installation of the stormwater drainage, levelling of the carpark, pouring of the remaining slabs and then hopefully prior to Christmas the steel framing and roof will be erected. The Shire will be advertising for Expressions of Interest in February 2018 in relation to the commercial office space leasing.

This project is made possible with partnership funding from the Shire of Beverley, Department of Industry, Innovation & Science (Building Better Regions Fund), Lotterywest, Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development, Wheatbelt Regional Grants Scheme and the Beverley Community Resource Centre.

Warriors Wellbeing Keeping Safe - Everyone's Responsibility

At this time of the year we are all busy, often feeling tired, our nerves can be a bit raw and sometimes we are just "over it". Everyone gets a bit tired and rundown, from kids at school to mums and dads at home or at work.

We all know there's lots of work to get done to get us through to the end of the year. This may include finishing the harvest, various stock work, that last FIFO swing before holidays, getting that last job finished and having kids end of year school events to attend. This can lead to us working beyond our limit.

We all have a varying capacity to both absorb those extra things thrown at us and our ability to get the job done, this can differ depending on an individual's work ethic. We should never assume "what I can do is the norm", then place that expectation on family members, employees or work colleagues.

Occupational Health & Safety (OHS) gives us a legislative framework to guide us, but it doesn't allow for the cultural context in which us blokes sometimes operate. The cultural context means our approach to risk taking (we are hard wired risk takers); our need to get the job done (task orientated/deadlines); and our approach to winning. These behaviours can cloud our judgement around keeping safe both in the workplace and in our personal life. We need to be aware and manage our behaviour otherwise we will invariably fail in our responsibility to stay safe.

Keeping safe needs to start somewhere, it is no different to our individual health. I always say that my health is my responsibility, it is not my doctors, my workplace or my wife's. However, my wife is very good at giving me a good kick up the backside to get me to the doctor to do my annual service visit, my dentist appointment or my skin check.

So, when it comes to keeping safe it is everyone's responsibility. It is up to all of us whether we are in the workplace, belong to a community group, or within our family setting to be vigilant about keeping safe.

Tips to keeping safe:

- ☑ Constantly remind ourselves about work protocols;
- ☑ As employers, have realistic expectations of our employees;
- ☑ Look out for work colleagues, be aware and respond to behaviour changes. Talk to them about it!
- ☐ Try and maintain a balanced life, we can only do so much before fatigue becomes an issue;
- ☑ Outside busy times, take time out;
- ☑ Enjoy what we do.

As another year winds down let's keep safe by staying focused on the job at hand, so we all can get to enjoy the upcoming holiday break.







For the Information of the Beverley Community

I am a former Catholic school History and Religious Education teacher who has had the privilege of studying most of the world's major faiths in depth at university and elsewhere since the 1980s. Islam and Judaism were particular focuses of my studies. In the course of my teaching career, I had the good fortune to meet people from many different faith backgrounds and some with none at all. Indeed, my expertise in the area of comparative religions was recognised by the Western Australian government which in 2002 commissioned me to co-author the *Religion and Life* course of study which is offered to Years 11 and 12 students in many private schools across WA.

In the many interactions I have had with Australian Muslims over 30 years, both professionally and in my private life, I've been greatly impressed by their decency, humanity and loyalty to our great nation – it was my concern that the Muslim Community is being discriminated against which led to erecting a sign on my property welcoming them to "COME IN AND SHARE A CUPPA". This has unfortunately been vandalised on several occasions.

More recently I have been subjected to further vandalism as a sign reading RESIST ISLAMOPHOBIA on the rear of my 4WD vehicle was ripped off while the car was parked in Vincent Street on 21 October. I was inside the Beverley Council chamber at the time following the count for the local election in which I was a candidate. It dismays me, as I'm sure it does most fair-minded Aussies that a few individuals in our community are prepared to violate another person's right to free speech. Anthony Shane Negus

Should I Connect to NBN?

As I said in last month's article, you do not have a choice which NBN service will be connected to your home. However in some cases you can chose whether and when to connect.

NBN Fibre to the Node (FTTN). If fibre is installed in your area then connection to the NBN is compulsory. You can choose when to change over to NBN, but after 18 months the existing ADSL and telephone service will be disconnected. If you don't change over to NBN by then you will have no data or telephone services to your home.

[Note: NBN Fibre is currently being installed in Beverley but has not yet been activated. Fibre has been activated in York and Brookton]

NBN Wireless. If NBN Wireless is installed in your area then changeover to NBN is **not** compulsory. In most cases NBN Wireless is faster and cheaper than existing ADSL services. If you have ADSL1 (on the ADSL fringe areas) NBN Wireless will definitely be faster.

[Note: if you currently have ADSL then the 18 month rule will apply - see the comments for NBN FTTN above.].

NBN Satellite. Connection to NBN satellite is **not** compulsory. However NBN Satellite is faster than all existing data services (except ADSL2) and is available to every home in Australia not covered by NBN Fibre or NBN Wireless. [Note: if you currently have ADSL then the 18 month rule will apply - see the comments for NBN FTTN above.]

Replacement phone service (all NBN services).

You can replace your existing telephone with a mobile or use a fixed phone service over the NBN. If you choose an NBN fixed phone service you can transfer your existing phone number to the NBN. If you have poor mobile coverage in your home then a new mobile service is available called WiFi Calling. See the panel for more information.

Mobile WiFi Calling

Do you have poor (or no) mobile coverage in your home? If so there's an amazing new service you should investigate - and it's free. The mobile operators are offering it free as it saves them money on their mobile network! The service is ideal for many farmhouses and other locations with a good data service (e.g. NBN Satellite) but poor mobile services.

This service has been available in the US for some time and is currently creeping into use in Australia. Currently it is only available if you have a post-paid service directly with a mobile operator (Telstra, Optus or Vodafone). Mobile resellers, e.g. Boost, Virgin, iiNet etc. are not able to provide this service yet.

It works like this — A mobile phone is always searching for a mobile signal. If you have WiFi Calling on your mobile phone and there is a weak or no mobile signal, the mobile instead connects via your WiFi and the Internet to the mobile network.

It's a no-brainer where there is no mobile coverage, but also where there is poor mobile coverage. All you have to do is hide in a corner of the house which has no known mobile coverage but has good WiFi coverage and you can make/take mobile calls via your WiFi!

To use the service now you must have:

- A post-paid service with a telecom mobile operator (Telstra, Optus or Vodafone).
- The right type of (new) mobile phone with WiFi Calling (check in the settings to see if it's available on your phone)
- A type of phone that is approved by the mobile operator
- WiFi-Calling turned on.
- 4G turned on.
- Be within range of WiFi from a fixed Internet service, e.g. NBN or ADSL.

In low coverage areas you can use WiFi Calling instead of expensive mobile booster boxes.

To find out more information put "WiFi Calling" and the name of your operator (Telstra, Vodafone Australia or Optus) in your Internet search engine (e.g. Google).
