SHIRE OF BEVERLEY PRESIDENT REPORT - APRIL 2018



Recent Fire Emergency

A recent fire emergency in the western part of the shire was thankfully brought under control relatively quickly considering its potential. The response from local Volunteer Bush Fire Brigades, support of Community Emergency Service Manager (CESM), and access to aerial water bombers saw a favourable outcome which still required managing for several days following the event. Thankyou to everyone involved in the response. Knowledge and information to assist should these events unfortunately occur are invaluable and there will be opportunities during 2018 to be involved in training.

Administration Centre Flags

Council proposes to seek grant funding in 2018/2019 to purchase two new flag poles for the administration building to fly the Australian Flag and the Aboriginal Flag. The Australian flag currently flown on the town hall as a mark of respect on the passing of current and previous Beverley residents will be replaced by the Shire of Beverley flag. This has been a long standing practice valued by our community however Council is aware that the manner in which this is done is outside of protocol for flying the national flag. The Shire will be flying the Aboriginal flag in front of the administration building from 8 - 15 July during NAIDOC week 2018.

Draft Strategic Community Plan 2017 - 2027

The draft Strategic Community Plan 2017 - 2027 is soon to be advertised for public comment. Watch out for your opportunity to review and provide feedback.

Alfresco Parking Bay Project

There has been quite a buzz along Vincent Street following installation of the relocatable Alfresco dining platform. Much positive feedback regarding this Main Street activation project has been received. As a trial the structure was made available free of charge to each of the food houses for 2 weeks, with a draw deciding the order of placement. Following this time the Shire will provide information on future availability of the "Alfresco".

Bremner Road Bridge Replacement

The southern end of Bremner road has been closed to traffic for the replacement of bridge 4739. This should be finished by the beginning of April however please take note of advisory signage until the works have been completed.

Beverley Aquatic Centre Review

A Focus Group comprising of Cr Brown, Cr Martin, Cr Seed, Pool Manager Brad Miller, Swimming Club President Zoe Wilkinson, Community representative Ben Murray and Deputy CEO Simon Marshall will be assisting CMCPL Consulting with the Beverley Aquatic Centre Review. In March various Focus Group members and Shire Councillors visited Wagin and Quairading to inspect the respective aquatic redevelopment projects in each of those towns. Stakeholder engagement is an important aspect of the review process so please watch for your opportunity to provide feedback.

Admin Office Power Saving

In the second half of 2017 solar panels were installed at the administration building and fluoro lighting was replaced with LED's. Council has been able to achieve a significant reduction in power usage when comparing the same period year on year. Excess power has also been exported back into the grid. As a rebate is currently not available to Synergy business customers investigation is underway on how to best utilise this excess power production.

Colin Tincknell MLC Visit

Hon. Colin Tincknell MLC and Electorate Officer Rod Caddies recently visited Beverley and met with the CEO and Shire President. Discussion included road funding, government grants commission and the proposed reduction in funding for CRC's. The visitors also enjoyed a tour of the town and visit to Avondale.

BEVERLEY GETS FUNDING!

The Shire of Beverley has been successful in obtaining over \$90,000 in grant funding through the Mitigation Activity Fund (MAF) which will help to reduce the Bushfire threat to the town site. These funds have been made available from the Royalty for Regions programme managed by the Office of Emergency Management (OEM).

Areas recently identified by the Bushfire Risk Management Planning (BRMP) team have been essential in making Beverley one of 15 Local Governments eligible for this special funding. Consultation with stakeholders has been undertaken and in some cases still occurring. Permits/clearances for the works have also been thoroughly investigated and approved.

Weather permitting works along the river within the town site will soon be starting and it is envisaged will be completed by 30 June 2018.

The BRMP team and the Shire are very excited that thanks to the funding they have been able to identify these areas of concern and reach the point of reducing the risk.

The Beverley soaring society was thrilled to be placed third, in the people's choice award, out of the 70 artworks exhibited on Cottesloe beach this year. As reported in the February Blarney, Beverley Soaring Society collaborated with pilot artist Geoff Overheu to convert an obsolete Blanik glider into the visually exciting sculpture "final approach". Members spent many hours on the project lending their varied skills to bring Geoff's vision to life. The sheer size of the artwork was a mission to transport and install, anchored on a 3.5 tonne block of concrete buried in the sand.

Beverley Soaring Society president Roy McInnes said "the project is testament to the clubs ability to pool resources, work together and rise to the challenge, qualities that have made our club one of the most successful glider clubs in Australia".



Remembering THEM - 1918

One hundred years ago, Australians fought in battles on the Western Front at Amiens, Villers-Bretonneux, Dernancourt, Le Hamel, and Mont St Quentin. Villers-Bretonneux was finally secured by Australians on April 27, 1918, never to be lost to the Germans again (see photos below). The Australians captured Montbrehain, a position beyond the Hindenburg Line on October 5, 1918. This was the last action that Australians were to undertake in the war

A future for Avondale in bush produce research



The National Trust of Western Australia is working with the Shire of Beverley to determine a sustainable future for Avondale Farm which respects the history and significance of this place. Although established as freehold farming land, in 1918 it was made available as a training farm for returned servicemen and in 1926 agricultural research activities began and Avondale Farm became one of several experimental farms across the state. It is acknowledged as a place of significance to the local Ballardong Noongar people.

In keeping with its long history in the areas of research and investigation the Trust and the Shire propose to work with the Ballardong Aboriginal people and other interested parties to position Avondale as an Incubation Hub focussing on research for the emerging Bush Produce industry in Western Australia. The purpose of Avondale Farm will be to support the development of the industry to grow, value add and market Native Bush Produce. Demand is growing for bush produce, in restaurants, in the home and from the pharmaceuticals and nutraceutical industries who have an interest in the medicinal properties of Australian native plants.

As well as research activities the preservation of Avondale Farm's unique combination of historical, Aboriginal and natural heritage will also be considered through tourism programs, training opportunities and community access. The sorts of initiatives which could be considered include a café specialising in bush tucker food, an Aboriginal art gallery or cultural centre and continuing access to a further developed heritage precinct, the bush reserve and farm machinery museum. The activities being considered at Avondale Farm, complement and provide strong links to other tourism activities on offer at Beverley in the areas of the arts, nature trails and heritage tourism.

Planning for a re-activated Avondale Farm has begun with support for the concept received from local indigenous representatives, the Shire of Beverley, Regional Development Australia, the Wheatbelt Development Commission and ANFAB (Australian Native Food and Botanicals). The next step is to undertake a comprehensive planning phase that will involve attracting support and resources from a number of important stakeholders for this exciting project.

The planning phase for the Avondale Farm Bush Produce proposal is expected to take two years. In the meantime, the National Trust and the Shire of Beverley, with the support of AFPA, continue to undertake works at Avondale Farm to conserve and upgrade buildings and facilities to increase their potential for future uses.

LIVESTOCK THEFT

- SHEEP producers are being targeted by opportunistic thieves as wool and sheep meat prices hit historic highs in WA. Don't become complacent and think it won't happen to you. No one ever thinks they will be a victim of crime. Below are some theft prevention hints to help you protect your valuable commodity:-
- Livestock owners should keep all fences and gates in good condition to protect their livestock. Regularly check you stock and the paddocks and fences where the stock are grazing – daily if possible – especially around sale days – to ensure suspected losses are recognised and reported to police as soon as possible.
- Loading ramps in paddocks or on farms away from direct supervision should be kept locked or obstructed at all times.
- Keep all paddock, shed and stockyard gates closed and locked. Use locking posts to obstruct large openings to yards.
- Ditches form a natural barrier. Cattle grids should be removable and locked out of position when not in use.
- If you consider buying an additional farm, remember: "absentee landlords gather no crops". Rather try and buy close to your residential farm.
- Be particularly watchful during full moon, weekends and at the end or beginning of a month or during periods that you know from your own experience, when stock thefts (slaughtering for the pot) occur.
- Livestock owners should at all times report livestock theft cases on their property immediately. The longer the delay, the less the possibility of achieving success in an investigation.
- The regular herding and counting of animals are of obvious importance. If it is not possible to count your livestock every day, try counting your animals at least twice a week on irregular days. Shortages and signs indicating possible thefts should be reported immediately.
- When considering applicants for employment, enquiries should be made with previous employers. Establish what kind of criminal record the applicant has – a National Police Clearance Certificate is recommended.



- Employees should be trained to pay attention to irregularities. Ask your employees to be careful about what they say in the presence of strangers regarding activities on the farm. Careless talk can lead to livestock losses.
- The necessity of a thorough stock register cannot be emphasised enough. Commit to paper as much detail as possible and keep the register up to date yourself.
- The use of electronic identification is strongly recommended. Many farmers believe that the introduction of the National Livestock Identification Scheme is ideal for the control of stock theft. This involves stock being identified by a micro-chip in the ear or with a bolus which is inserted down the throat of the animal where it remains lodged in the rumen of the animal for its lifetime. These devices offer unalterable permanent identification.
- Go around you property and look at it through the eyes of a thief. Look for areas where thieves could easily operate. This particularly applies to paddocks that border a public road.
- Be visible on your property. Leave tyre tracks and evidence that you are frequently checking your paddocks.
- Rural watch get to know your neighbours. You are best placed to spot things that are out of the ordinary. Do not hesitate to report any suspicious behaviour or activity in your area, be aware of strangers or unfamiliar vehicles in your area. Write down their registration number and all other relevant information and pass it onto your local police and alert your neighbours. Due to the extensive area we patrol and our limited resources, your local Police rely heavily on you to be our eyes and ears in rural areas.

Beverley Garden and Tree Society

The first meeting for 2018 was held at the Dead Finish Museum on Tuesday 06 March with 24 members in attendance and we had 7 apologies. Much of the meeting was devoted to our 2018 programme, it promises to be brimming with activities and outings.

In the garden now....

Autumn is the best time of year to be in the garden. The soil is warm and we have good growing weather. There's a bit of rain around and that will soak in well if we take the opportunity to add soil wetting agents, particularly to lawns. Plants put in can establish roots, so when summer next sets they won't get stressed.

Don't wait until spring to plant – by then it will be almost too late.

If anything hasn't survived the summer, don't get emotional, get ruthless. Take it out and get another plant that will do well in a hot position. If something has burnt bits, give it a trim. Give roses a light prune and feed. Most spring-flowering shrubs should be pruned after flowering, not at this time of year, so ignore those.

This time of year is for planting: broccoli, silverbeet, Chinese cabbage, lettuce, beetroot, rhubarb, potatoes, peas, English spinach, Asian greens and carrots, and herbs such as marjoram, oregano, coriander and parsley. You don't need big spaces, just good soil in the pot or ground, five or more hours of sun as a general guide and regular fertilising with a liquid blood and bone or fish-based fertiliser, or organic granular fertiliser.





Warrior Wellbeing Article Social Media and Maintaining the Balance

At Regional Men's Health we are always promoting social wellbeing and connectedness through appropriate communication and social networks because we are all social creatures at heart. However, in some ways social media is taking over as the predominant form of social connection, especially with younger blokes. This isn't totally a bad thing, there's a lot to be said for being able to open a group chat with your mates and stay engaged with your friends even if you're working or studying a long way from home. Social media is a form of social activity and can be very helpful, especially in maintaining friendships and as a convenient way to organize real world activities. So social media isn't this other world as it sometimes gets characterized but can be a simple extension of already existing social groups and dynamics.

Therefore, we must be vigilant and mindful of living in the here and now and staying connected to others. This is particularly important for blokes and must be maintained through the age-old channels of community. That can be the local sporting club, either participating or watching with a friend or simply having a drink/cuppa with our neighbour and dropping in on our mates.

These are some ways to stay present in the physical world that avoid the issues that the use of social media can raise, especially if we are young. These issues unfortunately are in most cases the result of deliberate programming and design by the creators of the tech companies. That's because Facebook, Twitter, Instagram and Snapchat amongst others make their money based on advertising; it's their goal to maximise the attention that you give to their platforms. Knowing that people are more engaged by negative emotion; things that cause us to feel outrage, anxiety, tribalism and envy are often highlighted or even manufactured to reflect the worst aspects of our nature to monopolise our attention.

It's well-known that on social media we get shunted into our own echo chambers, socially and politically. We are also taught to value internet points that can be withheld from us, we're shown the highlight reel of other people's lives which we compare to our own day to day. As the saying goes "comparison is the enemy of happiness' and young people especially are inundated with examples of lives that seem better than their own, with political information that outrages them and then the deliberate delaying of likes and positive attention on their own posts. It's no surprise that social media can be a place where young people feel more isolated and less social.

So, what does this mean for blokes that are rightfully worried by this technology and how it affects us? Well the answer is not to abandon it, instead we must understand its limitations and its consequences while using it to its best purpose. That means instead of looking at people's holiday pictures for hours, taking pictures of every meal or reading the latest Donald Trump controversy, use it to remember birthdays, organise a barbecue with your friends, to keep track of what music festivals are coming up and other simple activities that bring you closer to people, not feeling further away.

Beverley IT Making IT Simpler

Reliable Internet

I've had quite a few calls recently from people whose PCs are running slow – some extremely slow or static! Many of these were not because of viruses. So, I thought I should give some tips to help you maintain a reliable Internet connection.

Are you connected to the Internet? Look for the simple solution first. This may seem obvious, but sometimes you may think you are connected, but there's actually no information flowing. If your browser (Edge, Internet Explorer, Google Chrome, or Mozilla Firefox) is not connecting then it very likely that you have no working Internet connection.

If your device (PC, Mac phone or tablet) is connected to your router by WiFi it may seem that you are connected to the Internet. But is the router connected to the Internet? The most common cause is that your Internet Service Provider (ISP) has disconnected you because you have run out of your allowance (or not paid your bill!). Then you ARE connected to the Internet but no information is flowing. A quick call to your ISP and a handful of dollars will usually solve this.

Poor mobile coverage? If you connect to the Internet using a mobile network with a modem or a Mobile Hotspot on your phone, it can be difficult to work out the cause of issues. Your account could have run out (see solution above), but it could also be that the mobile signal is too weak. This is common in country areas. If you see only one bar then there is not enough signal for a reliable connection. Also, if there is high traffic on a mobile network the cell size shrinks and the most distant connections are dropped.

You may improve the signal by moving your modem so that it can 'see' the tower, preferably near a window facing the tower. The WiFi signal from the modem is usually strong enough to reach across the house to your device.

There's another trick worth trying. Many modems and mobiles can choose which network they connect to, either 4G (LTE) or 3G (WCDMA). When the signal is weak the modem or phone may keep switching back and forth, interrupting your Internet connection. Try changing to '3G Only' or '4G Only' and compare the number of bars. The 3G signal may be stronger as most devices connect to 4G first.

Are updates killing your Internet connection? Not handling updates well causes problems for many people – particularly with Windows 10.

For phones, tablet and Windows 7 and 8 this is not usually an issue as updates are smaller. And, you have significant control over downloading and installing updates for Windows 7 and 8.

Windows 10 updates can be very large (up to 6GB) and there is nothing you can do to stop them. If you have a small Internet allowance updates can quickly chew up all your allowance. For some control go to 'Settings\Update & Security\Windows Update':

- 'Restart Options' allows you to schedule a restart time
- You can 'Change active hours'
- In 'Advanced options \Delivery optimization \Advanced options' you can set a download limit.

However, none of this stops Microsoft downloading the updates. It is specifically stated "We'll automatically download and install updates, except on metered connections (where charges may apply). In that case we'll automatically download only those updates required to keep Windows running smoothly."

Note: to turn on 'metered connection" go to 'Settings\Network & Internet \Status\Change Connection Properties'. This change will only affect the current WiFi internet connection. You cannot set this for an ethernet connection.

How do Windows 10 updates slow/stop my PC? If you don't change any settings Windows 10 will start checking for updates as soon as you turn on your PC - then install them. This can slow the PC right down and on a low-end PC can make it almost unusable. This may make you think you have a virus or other issues. If you then force shut down your PC – the updates will start again next time you turn on the PC. If you do this too many times you may use up all your monthly allowance. Or, more seriously you may corrupt the operating system. Then it can take hours/days of restarting to fix and uses lots of download allowance.

You can see that Microsoft make it very difficult for you to control Windows 10 updates – they want to force you to take the updates! If you have Windows 10 it is better to ensure that you have enough monthly download allowance and download speed to cope with large updates than mess around with the options above!





Beverley water supply improvements

Temporary pressure fluctuations Water Corporation is in the final stages of completing work to improve the water supply to customers in Beverley. This has included the construction of a 4 million litre tank and 3.4km of water main to connect the new tank to Beverley's existing network, with a new pump station still to be constructed.

In the coming months customers may notice pressure fluctuations, as we temporarily increase the pressure in the main supplying Beverley. We need to do this in order to finalise the integration of the new tank into Beverley's existing network.

As we have previously advised, we anticipate the new tank will be fully operational by mid-2018. Once this occurs many customers will be supplied with a higher and more consistent pressure on an ongoing basis, which is one of the long term benefits of the project.

We appreciate the community's understanding while this essential work is undertaken and apologise for any temporary inconvenience.

Perth champion gets State blazer pocket

Bert Wansbrough, the 1955 premiership vice-captain, and his wife Norma, didn't know what to expect when three club members visited their Beverley home recently.

Brian Sweetapple and Greg Dart from the Past Players and Officials Association, and Peter Kennedy, were on a mission: to deliver a replica of the crest on Bert's 1956 State team blazer pocket for the national carnival in Perth.

Bert is very proud of a montage of crests from various football and other blazers he has worn during a celebrated sporting career. But the 1956 carnival blazer pocket was missing.

His friend David White noted this gap and made inquiries as to how it could be rectified, without Bert's knowledge. Eventually he contacted Peter Kennedy, who suggested Brian Sweetapple might have access to a 1956 blazer through the club's History Centre.

Brian got to work with Greg Dart, and together they hit the jackpot. There was indeed a pocket with the crest in good condition, which they had duplicated. The gap in Bert's collection was filled.

Bert was also presented with a mounted cutting from The West Australian, noting his crucial role in Perth's nail biting two-point win over East Fremantle in that 1955 grand final. It was headed "Wansbrough Comes To Side's Rescue" and noted how, after being switched at half time from centre half back to full forward, he had kicked four goals in the third quarter to put Perth within reach of victory after a poor first half.

An epic last quarter, in which the whole side lifted and champion ruckman Merv McIntosh played at his brilliant best in his last game, saw Perth break a 48-year premiership drought.

Bert travelled from the family farm each week to play 127 games between 1952 and 1958. He kicked 167 goals for Perth and was named on a half back flank in Perth's Team of the Century. He was Club Legend in 2008.

Bert continued his football career with Beverley, adding to his illustrious record by leading the home team to a premiership as well.

He has the Demons' 2018 fixtures on his desk and plans to make the trip to the city to see a winning game at Lathlain Park.

Beverley did struggle with numbers during the year but once again has continued to develop and encourage our juniors to play senior cricket.






