On Tuesday 26 March 2019 saw a visit from members of the local Men's Shed to the Agricultural Museum at Avondale. Many thanks go to John Islip and Avondale Executive Liaison Officer Mandy McLean for arranging the visit and to John for driving the community bus.

John Alexander opened up the Museum and gathered interesting information from the visitors, many of whom had previously been involved with Avondale and had carried out volunteer work at the Museum with restoration and maintenance of the collection when the property was run by the Department of Agriculture.

One of the group, Barry Ferguson, who also has a prized vintage collection at his house in town, proved to be an excellent source of information for the visitors given his past life when he sold tractors for a living.

Richard "Bolla", who volunteers at the museum maintenance day on the third Saturday of the month, decided the John Deere needed a de-cobweb with a long overdue start up. Either a case of she deciding it was her day off, or Richard being a little older than the last time they met and not being able to swing the external flywheel over fast enough by hand, this was not to be. No doubt the maintenance team will be taking a closer look soon along with other operating exhibits in the Museum.

Beverley Blarney and Social Media

Council is reviewing the Social Media Policy to establish protocols for such use and are also considering if there are more effective means to make the Beverley Blarney available to community members and interested persons.

Town Hall Kitchen Redevelopment

Community members are reminded that the Town Hall Kitchen will be unavailable to use during June, July and August 2019 due to renovations. The Hall is still available to hire without the kitchen.

Roadworks and Plant Replacement

As per the 18/19 budget the New Holland 4055 tractor used for slashing, spraying and sweeping prior to bitumen sealing has been replaced with a John Deere 4066. Following inspection by staff and a Councillor representative the Case 410 skid steer has been replaced and upgraded to a Case SR175 which is fitted with an air-conditioned cab. The footpath in Edwards Street along the school's Kindergarten entrance has been replaced with a concrete path and a section of along Forrest Street near Freemasons Hotel has been replaced. The first cattle grid on Ski Road at Yenyening Lakes has been replaced and upgraded to Main Roads Standards. Budgeted roadworks continue around the Shire.

<u>Local Government Elections</u> Saturday 19 October 2019

Local government ordinary elections are held in WA on the third Saturday in October every two years, the next local government ordinary elections will be held on 19 October 2019. Four Shire of Beverley Councillor terms expire in October.

Property owners are reminded that if Beverley is not their residential address on the State electoral role they will need to contact the Shire to be included on the register of Owners and Occupiers to be able to vote in the forthcoming Shire of Beverley elections.







Beverley GARDEN AND TREE SOCIETY

Our April meeting was held in the garden of the Dead Finish Museum and was attended by 15 members. This was a special general meeting to discuss the proposed updated constitution which was accepted unanimously.

A pre-Easter busy bee was organized for the 09 April in order to have the garden looking its best for the Easter weekend. Some of the plants in pots are in need of repotting and the broom bush needs trimming plus a general tidy.

The month of May means a cooling of temperatures and shorter days. It's a great time to get out in the garden and prepare your yard for the cooler days ahead with our May garden tips.

Shrubs, Trees & Climbers

- Prune fruit trees ensuring you don't remove next year's fruiting spurs
- Prune and thin out climbing roses and deciduous trees
- Start planting bare-rooted shrubs and trees
- Prune Hydrangea stem above two plump buds and remove old branches at ground level

Bulbs, Perennials & Annuals

- Prune summer flowering perennials such as salvias, buddleia and daisies.
- Mulch flowerbeds
- Prepare new beds dig over the soil, working in compost and spread with a protective layer of mulch
- Now is your last chance to plant winter and spring flowering bulbs
- Divide out evergreen perennials lift them from the soil, divide at the roots and re-plant into well-conditioned soil

Tubs & Containers

- Plant strawberries in hanging baskets and pots
- Plant Hyacinths and Tulips in tubs and pots for spring flowering
- Reduce the amount of water given to any indoor potted plants

Lawns & Hedges

- Apply a slow release fertiliser to give one last boost before the growing phase slows and to provide food over the cooler weeks and months
- Repair any bare patches
- Treat any weeds and pests to stop them from taking over during the colder weather
- Aerate any compaction soil and apply lime if the soil is acidic complete a soil pH test to determine
- Trim hedges to keep them compact and bushy from ground level
- Gather any fallen leaves and use them for your compost bin

Top tip for your May Garden

May is a great time to make new plants from cuttings. Just take a 10cm cutting from hardwood herbs such as bay and rosemary – remove the lower leaves, dip cuttings into hormone powder and plant in small containers of premium potting mix. Keep the cuttings slightly moist and shelter from strong sun and wind.





PURPLE BENCH PROJECT

By the time this article is published, you may have noticed a distinct purple bench in the main street of town. What is this about?

The *Purple Bench* acts as a stark reminder that **as a society we can make a difference,** with both little and large steps to raise public awareness of Domestic and Family Violence. Changing public perception of violence against women and children in particular requires a commitment from all levels of government and the community at large. The Beverley Shire have shown their support for this initiative by approving for the existing bench situated on Vincent Street, Beverley near the railway gravel carpark, to be painted a very distinct shade of purple.

The presence of the *Purple Bench* in this location is to raise public awareness and provide the opportunity for this important issue to remain visible as well as providing a physical place to reflect about the important work achieved to date and how we can move over the next generations to **bring an end to domestic and family violence.**

Why Purple? In Nova Scotia, Canada purple benches are located in public places to honour the memory of women murdered by their partners and to provide help numbers for people experiencing Domestic and Family Violence. They are known as Barb's Benches and were launched in 2015 to mark the 25 year anniversary of the murder of Barb Baillie by her husband.

Purple is associated worldwide with the Domestic and Family Violence awareness movement.

The Women's Council for Domestic and Family Violence Services (WCDFVS) was established in 1977 and represents 64 Women's Refuges and domestic and family violence services in Western Australia.

The WCDFVS is a state-wide peak organisation committed to improving the status of women and children in society. They seek to ensure that all women and children live free of domestic and family violence (DFV).

Their role is to provide a voice on domestic and family violence issues that facilitates and promotes police, legislative and programmatic responses relevant to women and children who have experienced DFV.


BDHS OPEN AFTERNOON

Drugs and Alcohol - Your Health & Wellbeing is at Stake

We promote the point that choice around our lifestyle is mostly up to us. While genetics, environment and the health system can also impact on our health and wellbeing, in the context of drugs and alcohol the choice is ultimately ours and the consequences of use and misuse are clear and so are the laws.

As a community we need to have an honest conversation on why people use and abuse drugs and alcohol. Some reasons are:

- •Risk taking as boys and men we are hard wired to take risks;
- •Experimental and boredom;
- Peer pressure;
- Habit/addiction;
- •Recreation to have fun;
- •To feel good and forget, to cope with difficult times in our life, to self-medicate and mask.
- •The reasons are complex and varied and through our life we have been challenged and we will continue to be challenged.

Recent research reveals some alarming statistics around drug use:

- •46% of drug users use for fun!
- •54% of drug users used for self-medication.

Regarding using drugs for fun, surely there are many other things we can do that don't damage our body and mind (i.e. embrace and explore our passions and interests). The consequences of drug use are serious from several angles:

- •The risk factor is extremely high for many illicit drugs, we may only have three chances with a drug before we are affected either medically and/or by addiction;
- •Purity of the drug is unknown and varied (often we don't know what's in it?);
- •Health effects can be permanent (psychosis);
- •Many legal and financial implications for users;
- •Relationships become fractured (conflict, violence, distrust).

With regard to self-medication, we need to acknowledge some of the *stuff* going on in our lives and some of the pain we may be suffering. Denial of this, exacerbated by drug use, and the shit will hit the fan. We need to talk about and ultimately deal with stuff in our life, not self-medicate.

Alcohol is our biggest societal drug of choice, there is a lot of literature and research suggesting how alcohol is dangerous to our body when misused. This usually focuses on the appropriate daily standard drinks consumption, links to various diseases such as cancer and then societal issues around binge drinking. On an individual level we need to work out if we can drink, and how do I behave when drinking (do I get angry and aggressive, take unnecessary risks). Because alcohol is a mood enhancer, we need to know what our safe limit is, have regular alcohol-free days and not use it to self-medicate (when distressed) but enjoy it.

The difficulty in life is choice, illicit and excessive use of drugs and alcohol is all our personal responsibility. What then can we do, as a society, about the misuse/abuse of drugs and alcohol? Primary care is standing up and saying "no, it's not all right" (culture). As a collective we can make a difference whether that is in the family, community group and/or workplace, you are not alone. As peers we can make a difference whether it be in the school, workplace or footy club by saying "no, it's not all right". We all have a right to a safe place!

Community Information from Beverley Voluntary Community Services Mal Roberts

The following information has been sourced from the ABC and GWN television channels on 09/04/2019. Broadly, it relates to: Royal Commission funding investigations. Witness statement re. Insurance and superannuation Consumer protection investigations, suggestions, advice Comments and advice from former treasurer Mr. Peter Costello on superannuation ACCC role re: Superannuation and national broadband network- their findings and advice to all consumers.

- Superannuation- be mindful of smooth talkers. Check management fees, income protection insurance. Check superannuation statements regularly for fees and charges, and unemployment/ disability/death cover. Check financial advisors fees and whether they are licensed and certified. Cases cited and portrayed on tv (some after 6-8 years) lost all their superannuation on fees and charges. In one case, unemployment insurance (direct debit) was deducted from the account ten years after the workers death. In other cases, workers paid into superannuation for many years-short term employment and the superannuation was paid into the fund. Mal Roberts was made aware of two cases where both workers lost over \$20,000 and the employers can't be traced. Expert advice- it is an offence for unlicensed financial advisors to give advice and apply charges. If so, report matters to both the consumer protection and the ACCC.
- 2) National Broadband- experts find that it is an offence to make false claims as the promising fiber optic connection (high-speed) on NBN or connecting to fixed wireless (similar to ADSL). Always check the information provided, compare the monthly rates and how much date you consume, what plan (limited, basic or unlimited) use. Ask questions also regarding connection fee to NBN and minimum period of contact. Does it include landline phone (rental or no rental) calls free or charged? The consumer experts and bodies suggest the monthly rate should be between \$50-\$60.
- 3) Very few of us are IT experts. It was stated that the laws on superannuation and NBN are so complex that even a lawyer may need legal advice from another lawyer.
- 4) Mal Roberts contacted two of Australia's top leading Telco's. The first telco answered a few basic questions on a basic NBN connection to Duffield St Beverley, monthly fee of \$70, low GB usage on a basic plan with no phone rental. They were unable to tell me whether the NBN was part of the optic fibre connection. I also reminded the sales rep of their legal obligation and that all advice and information must be confirmed to me by the telco to my email address. After that, I gather that I was seen as a hard customer and I have not heard from them in 2 weeks.
- 5) On 10/04/2019, I phoned the 2nd biggest telco. The consultant gave me a thorough explanation as to how the NBN works (location, zone, postcode, maps, and streets) How far from fibre cable, and possibility of fibre connection at this point in time to Beverley- was not scheduled. Fast and fixed wireless, unlimited GB is possible, not as many GB in speed. \$99 connection fee, \$59 p/m plan fixed for 18 months, then no connection fee, free phone line rental. If connection fee paid, then I can pull out at any time. No plan as such. A complete comprehensive plan, info confirmed my discussion and then so video email to me. This info is a guideline only- it is not advice. Contact your own telco of choice and ask relevant questions. There are huge penalties for Telco's who give false or misleading information (according to consumer protection commissioners).

In summary Superannuation- if one gets laid off are they covered with income protection insurance? If the policy covers disability and death- some policies cost \$680/pa management fees (as cited on ABC) unemployed but received no income. NBN- what sort of connection can you get from Telco's in Beverley, what is the installation feed, monthly plan and GB allowance? Get expert advice from qualified people.

NB- BVCS do not advice. We present it to you the reader to decide. Do no act until you receive professional advice? Mal Roberts - President

Windows 10 Updates

Windows 10's Forced Updates to be Abandoned.

Microsoft announced in April that beginning with Windows 10 version 1903, to be released in May, Windows 10 will no longer automatically install the major feature updates every six months. Also, Home users can pause minor updates. Windows will even let you pause minor updates after checking for them!

A big change. This is Microsoft's biggest change in Windows strategy since they released Windows 10. Microsoft is giving up on "Windows as a service" that automatically updates.

A Microsoft spokesperson explained "We will provide a notification that an update is available, and a recommendation, but it will be up to the user to initiate the update. All customers will now have the ability to explicitly choose if they want to update their device when they check for updates or to pause updates for up to 35 days."

What's changing with Windows Update? Starting with the May 2019 Update you will see a notification that the update is available when Microsoft thinks it's ready for your PC. However, it's your choice when-and whether-to install it. Windows 10 won't download and install it until you click "Download and install now."

When you click "Check for Updates" in Windows 10, you can choose whether to install the resulting updates or pause updates for up to 35 days. This was before only available in Windows 10 Professional.

This change also applies to minor security, stability, and driver updates. You can only pause these minor updates 7 days at a time, but up to 5 times in a row - a maximum of 35 days. I recommend taking all minor updates as they are important for PC security.

But still some automatic updates. Windows 10 will still automatically install a major feature update when the major update reaches "end of service." This happens after about 18 months. So feature updates will eventually be forced. Microsoft has promised to put more work into testing feature updates after some users had significant problems with two Feature Updates in 2018.

Are you tempted to update drivers?

Driver update software that is pushed at you in adverts on the Internet can be very dangerous.

See the full explanation below.

Driver Update Programs

I have had to fix several PC's recently that had been corrupted by "Driver Update" programs. One Windows 7 PC was so corrupted that an update to Windows 10 and a rebuild were needed - which would have been uneconomic. The customer bought a new PC.

What are drivers? Drivers are small pieces of software used to operate peripherals e.g. keyboard, mouse, screen, memory, hard drive, WiFi, USB ports, printers, etc.

How are drivers updated? In Windows (all versions) drivers are updated in the background, often without any notification. In most cases you are totally unaware that drivers are being updated, although sometimes they will be installed as a Windows Update. Sometimes manufacturer's driver update software will appear as a program, but in most cases drivers and their update are completely invisible.

So why do I need Driver update programs? You don't! If you suspect that a driver needs updating, you should only get the update from Microsoft or the peripheral manufacturer.

I see adverts for Driver Update software - why?

The vendors are exploiting the fact that driver updates are automatic and invisible - it makes you think "I have never seen my drivers updated" and thus prompting you to buy their program. Most driver update programs are malicious, deliberately corrupting drivers on your PC then offering to fix the issue for you - at a price! There are some genuine driver update programs, but they are unnecessary.

It is almost impossible to determine whether a driver update program is genuine or not, therefore my advice is never to install a driver update program - it may cost you dearly!






Who's been out and about?


State Tetrathlon Championships at Dardanup HPC - 30 and 31 March: Emily Maxwell qualified for this event and competed against the best in the state and


