Road Works





Suspension concentrates (Atrazine, Simazine, etc)





Use methylated spirits to remove dried residue. If this doesn't work, fill the container with water and soak for at least 24 hours before rinsing.

Oil-based chemicals

(ULVs, LVs)



Rinse container immediately after use as all chemical residues are much harder to remove when dry Some containers may require





MEDIA STATEMENT 16 March 2020

RSLWA has cancelled the conduct of all ANZAC Day commemorations as a result of Friday's announcement by Prime Minister Scott Morrison, backed by the Commonwealth's Chief Medical Officer and State Premiers.

The Prime Minister and state and territory leaders want all non-essential gatherings of more than 500 people to be suspended from this Monday amid fears about the continued spread of coronavirus.

RSLWA State President Peter Aspinall said that the decision of the Prime Minister and state leaders means that the traditional ANZAC Day 2020 services in the Perth CBD, namely the Kings Park Dawn Service, the Street Parade and the Commemorative Service, will not take place.

The State President and his Board have considered all relevant advice and have made the regrettable decision that it is necessary in the interests of veterans' health and safety to cancel all Anzac Day commemorative services in WA this year.

He said that, while RSLWA commemorations could still be held with gatherings less than 500 attendees, the risk is still too high.

As such, the Board is to advise its 125 Sub-Branches throughout the State that all commemorations on ANZAC Day be cancelled.

"RSLWA has a duty of care to its members and all veterans – many of whom are elderly and the most vulnerable as the coronavirus worsens," Mr. Aspinall said.

"Irrespective of how many veterans turn out, the risk is still too great. This is a very difficult but necessary course of action, especially considering our duty of care and the vulnerability of our older members."

RSLWA has the strong support of the Australian Medical Association (WA) to cancel all commemorations.

"For us, one death of a veteran, a family member or any member of the general public as a result of attending a RSLWA-organized service is one too many," Mr. Aspinall said.

The safety, health and welfare of all veterans and their supporters is paramount and, while cancelling the iconic and traditional ANZAC Day services is sad, health and wellbeing come first.

RSLWA will be looking at others ways of recognition of those who served and those who died but not in the form of public events on ANZAC Day.

Practice News!!

Every year the Beverley Medical Practice prepares to manage outbreaks of infectious diseases especially around the influenza season, our staff are committed to keeping our patients safe by providing up to date health advice and information.

With regard to the COVID19 pandemic we are following guidelines set out by the Department of Health.

Health Direct help line 1800 020 080 is a dedicated information line where you can discuss with a nurse how to proceed if you have any concerns at any time.

What should you do to protect yourselves and others- Practice good personal hygiene, by washing your hands thoroughly and frequently with soap and or hand sanitiser such as Aqium gel or similar, coughing into a tissue or the crook of your elbow and staying at home if you are unwell? Wherever possible practice social distancing keep at least 1.5 meters away from others and refrain from physical contact such as shaking hands and hugging. Anyone who is returning from overseas must put themselves in self-isolation for 14 days. If you are feeling unwell and are not able to attend work you must also stay at home and away from public places such as shops, pharmacies etc. If you need assistance ask a friend, family member or contact the practice and we may be able to arrange some support.

What should you do if you feel you have contracted the virus and have recently returned from overseas or have been in contact with someone who has tested positive?

Contact the Practice via telephone 9646 1241 <u>Do not present in person</u> let our staff know your symptoms and travel history then our staff will organise for our Doctors to attend a consult and collect swabs which will be forwarded to PathWest for analysis. If you feel unwell and are experiencing shortness of breath and need urgent medical help call 000 make sure to let them know your symptoms and travel history, you can also present at the major hospitals via their Emergency Departments, it is important to contact them first and give them your symptoms and travel history.

INFLUENZA IMMUNISATION

We are fast approaching the flu season and the government funded influenza immunisation program (WA) is due to start this month.

- Annual vaccination is the single most effective measure to prevent influenza and its complications.
- Protection against influenza starts to wane within 3 to 4 months following vaccination
- Providers will be informed via on-line ordering in early April and we can then let our patients know when the vaccine will be
 available
- All products supplied are quadrivalent influenza vaccines (QIVs) and are latex free.
- The dose of influenza vaccines for all ages is 0.5ml including for young children
- For adults aged over 65 the adjuvanted QIV, Fluad Quad is recommended over standard QIVs.

Kinetic Sculpture - Community Poll - Closes 19 May 2020

The Kinetic Sculpture was commissioned by Council as a tourism point of difference from our neighbouring towns with the intention of providing economic benefit. Several locations were initially considered by Council including the Station Arts Carpark, the garden of the old school building, the gravel carpark on Vincent Street adjacent to the train line, in the pond at the information bay on Hunt Road, near the retirement village on Hunt Road and in the garden at Apex Park.

Council at a Corporate Strategy Meeting discussed that the preferred location would be in the pond at the information bay on Hunt Road. The reason for this location was to capture the interest of passing traffic and to view the sculpture from a distance to take in its full effect. It was thought that on seeing the sculpture, tourists and road users may stop to visit or return to Beverley and provide an economic boost to the town.

When the sculpture was ready for installation in early August 2019, the pond was still full of water so it was agreed that it be temporarily installed on the Old School lawn to show case to visitors patronising the 2019 Beverley Agricultural Show.

The sculpture was constructed with the intention of always being located at the pond site. It will cost approximately \$9000 to move and reinstall the sculpture.

Council is keen to hear community thoughts.

The current location and the location in the pond near the information bay are the only two locations being considered.


Online scammers taking advantage of COVID-19

People and business are particularly vulnerable in these times and scammers (criminals) are taking advantage of this to get into your bank account

More Australians are now working from home offices and kitchen tables as social distancing measures ramp up. But this change makes us more vulnerable to cybersecurity threats.

Australia's cyber spy agency has warned of increased scams and phishing attempts as criminals take advantage of the disruption. Scamwatch has received 94 reports of COVID-19 scams this year, and rapidly rising.

For example, Phishing scams using COVID-19-themed text messages are circulating in Australia. The one shown here appears to come from GOV, but the link and the



sender are fake. Clicking on the link could install malware designed to steal your banking details. For more information search for "Coronavirus phishing scams Australia" or "Scamwatch"

Do not click on anything unless you are **absolutely** sure it is **not** a scam.

Windows 7 upgrades to Windows 10

I have found that free software upgrades to Windows 10 are available from Microsoft, although this service is not advertised to home users. However, this may not apply to all versions of Windows 7. I can install this as part of an upgrade service.

Some older PCs may not be suitable for upgrade and a new PC would then be recommended. Please phone to discuss suitability.

COVID-19 way of working

During the COVID-19 isolations and shutdowns I can still provide PC support services to my clients. However, I will not be visiting your homes and offices. Services will be charged at a fee-for-service or an hourly rate — there will be no call-out fees.

- Drop-off and pick-up at my home/office. Social distancing will be maintained. PCs and other equipment will be sanitised before being picked up.

Office 2007 and 2010 support ending

It is no longer safe to use Office 2007 or earlier on your PC as support ended in 2017. This means that Microsoft will no longer fix any security issues found in Office 2007 or earlier.

Office 2010 Extended support ends this year.

I have recently found that there can also be incompatibility issues if you use Office 2007 with Windows 10.

Since Office 2007 support ended in 2017 Microsoft have changed the default Internet browser to Edge and have pushed Internet Explorer into the background.

While doing so, Microsoft changed the way links work from Office applications (Word, Outlook etc.) to a browser (Edge, Firefox, Google, etc.). But Microsoft also removed the way that links work between Office 2007 (and earlier) and browsers.

For example, if you click on a link in Outlook 2007 in Windows 10 you may get this unhelpful message:

"This operation has been cancelled due to restrictions in effect on this computer. Please contact your system administrator."

Usually, you are the Administrator, so this doesn't make sense!

As Office 2007 is no longer supported, Microsoft won't fix this issue. They would prefer that you buy the new Office 365! There is a fix, but I also recommend that, for security, you update to Office 365.

Should the situation ever arise you need to use one of these units, a call to 000, with you giving your location, will direct you to the nearest AED available to you. Alternatively, if you have St John WA First Responder App, you will be able to find the location of all registered units.

The Beverley Sub Centre of St John maintains the upkeep of these units by checking them every 12 months, making sure that the pads and batteries are in date and replacing them as required. To assist with this the Beverley sub centre has several donation tins around town. Please feel free to donate to these tins to assist in maintaining these life-saving devices.

In 2019, Beverley sub centre held AED Information sessions with several community groups. These sessions are free and are aimed to familiarize people with AED's and how to use them, should the need arise.

The feeling of not being in control and the subsequent stress that we feel has probably never been more widespread than it is today with the threat of Covid19 (The Coronavirus) affecting not only Australia, but the world.

Stressful events can creep up on us, however the current situation is more like that big wave bearing down on us at the beach, we're watching it, but we just have to brace ourselves and hang on. Stress is an entirely normal response to a perceived threat and it's useful when preparing us to take action. That fight or flight mechanism, getting us ready for impending trouble can serve us well, but given free reign, can also result in us becoming dysfunctional.

Letting unresolved stress overburden us is termed "situational distress" and it's important that we understand (depending on our individual capacity and other contributing factors) staying in this distressed state for prolonged periods can push some of us towards a mental illness diagnosis.

What Not to Do

- Retreat into ourself and shun the support of friends and family.
- Self-medicate with alcohol or drugs.
- Ignore surrounding events and do nothing or procrastinate about making any preparations.
- Over-analyse or dwell upon the mountain of negative media and sensational reporting.
- Catastrophise and hoard toilet paper and face masks for the zombie apocalypse.

So, What Can We Do?

- Maintain social networks (within guidelines of self-quarantine if ill, and by phone if necessary).
- Make reasonable and prudent preparations for the contingencies that are within our control. An
 example might be to have enough supplies for a possible 14-day self-quarantine period. This
 doesn't constitute hording; it's a balanced and proportionate response.
- Have discussions with family around what we will do if someone in the household does get sick. What is the most appropriate room for them? Bathroom access (easier if there is two)? Meal preparation options and shopping options (friends/family/online)?
- Brush up on our sick leave/carer entitlements. Have a discussion with our employers around whether working from home might be an option should we be sick and short of leave.
- Reinforce to our kids and ourselves and importantly practice, good hygiene. The most effective preventative step we can take is as simple as washing our hands thoroughly.

Three ways that we can alleviate the burden of stress are to: **Avoid the stressor**; so be informed but don't dwell or pore over the inexhaustible mountain of sensationalist press. **Adapt to the stressor**; make reasonable and proportionate precautions. **Accept the stressor**; sometimes we just need to realise that some things are beyond our control. This can be difficult but it's also healthier than railing against an unchangeable situation.

Finding ways to relax are also important, so meditation, music, fishing or any favourite pastime, may help us to get things back on an even keel. Most importantly it's our connection with others that has undeniably the greatest health benefits, so ...before it all gets too much...Talk to a Mate!!



Beverley GARDEN AND TREE SOCIETY

The first meeting of the Garden Club was held on Tuesday 03 March at the home of our president, Colleen McAdam. We had a wonderful attendance with 27 members present. Most of the meeting was taken up with discussing our activities for the year which includes several outings plus our usual involvement with the Beverley Agricultural show and the Rose Show. After the meeting and morning tea we crossed the road to Ailsa's home to admire the landscaping she has underway in her garden. Ailsa has certainly put in a lot of hard work. We also have a Busy Bee at the Dead Finish garden planned for Monday 06 April from 8.30am onwards. Any help will be gratefully received.

Garden Tips

- It's time to love your leafy greens! Asian greens, lettuce, mizuna, cabbage, silverbeet, rocket and spinach!
- Pop in some carrots during April.
- In the herb patch plant coriander (try a slow bolting variety if it's still warm), parsley, lemon grass, chamomile and oregano.
- Time to plant potatoes too.
- Veggies include artichoke, beetroot, broccoli, brussel sprouts, cauliflower, tomatoes, chilli, garlic and radish.
- Plants feel the need for a feed at this time of year. A seaweed tea, or any low environmental impact liquid fertiliser, is perfect for giving them a kick start as they establish. Apply to the soil early in the morning and in the concentrations mentioned on the packet.
- Pretty up the patch with these flowering fancies marigolds, sunflowers and pansies, cornflowers, violas, snapdragons, stock, verbena and lavender. Putting these in around your veggies will give some colour and interest to the patch, and act as beneficial insect attractors!
- Consider a green manure crop to add some life and love to an overworked patch. At this time of year, try millet, oats, lupins or field peas. This will improve your soil incredibly, and, as a bit of forward planning, you'll find it well worth the effort!
- Water smarter at this time of year. Water first thing in the morning, and instead of quick irrigation, a nice, deep drink a couple of times a week is far more beneficial! Always check soil moisture before watering at this time of year... don't waste your precious drinking water if Mother Nature has already done all the hard work for you!
- Top up mulch on your veggie patches, herb gardens and ornamental beds, especially important for weed suppression at this time of year. A hot tip is to mulch after watering the patch, to a depth of about 7cm. Keep mulch clear of plant stems... especially young seedlings. Choose a sustainable, low environmental impact mulch, one that will enrich your soil as it breaks down.
- Weeding is an awesome job to do at this time of year. It may sound tedious, but it's incredibly rewarding!

Since this meeting we have encountered the advent of the Corona virus, so have reluctantly cancelled all meetings and outings until further notice. The busy bee will go on as planned.



All workshops have been cancelled for now. We will advise everyone of rescheduled dates later in the year. Thank you for your support. Stay safe everyone.

If these wasps aren't ruining your BBQ or eating from your dog's bowl, they may just find their way into a surveillance trap - attracted to the protein (fish) lure inside. Your watchful eyes and reports are helping us detect wasps and find their nests. DO NOT STOP LOOKING! As winter approaches, wasps start to turn off protein (favouring sugars) and we'll lose the opportunity to find them.



Know what to look for

Unlike the widespread and similar looking black and yellow paper wasp, European wasps (Vespula germanica):

- Scavenge on human and pet food
- · Feed on fruit like grapes and stone fruit
- Nest underground nests are now larger than a basketball and have a small (golf ball sized) entrance hole
- · Have black antenna
- Do NOT dangle their legs when flying







Update on COVID19

From the Golf Australia Website

25/3, GA has received advice from the office of the Federal Sports Minister that golf can continue to be played while adhering to strict social distancing measures as announced by the Federal Government, and in conjunction with state/territory licensing laws.

From Clubs WA

The playing of golf can continue provided social distancing measures are in place. All licensed clubhouses should be immediately closed, with no food or beverage service taking place. Clubs should not provide any seated areas.

In light of last night's announcements by the Prime Minister in order to seek clarity, Golf Australia has been advised by the Office of the Federal Minister for Sport that golf can continue to be played in line with all social distancing and other restrictions advised to date.

- Clubhouse including licensed bar to be closed effective immediately. Only Authorized personnel allowed entry into clubhouse. (President, club captains, secretary and treasurer).
- No golf scoring cards will be allowed because of cross contamination. You will have to use the app called Hole 19. This will be explained further on our first day.
- Entry only allowed by players to toilet areas. Maximum 2 persons on toilet area at one time.
 Only use one door and door to be wedged open during social games.
- Only 1 person allowed in buggy room at one time
- Only one person per motorized cart. Player to sanitize cart utilizing disinfectant before and after use.
- Flag pins and green scrappers should not be handled unless using the hand wearing a golf glove.
- All advice pertaining to avoiding actual contact between players should be observed. Two club lengths' distance at all times (1.5 metres)
- Wear at least one glove at all times while playing.
- Regularly wash your hands with hot soapy water as often as possible.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth.
- Use alcohol-based hand sanitiser frequently.
- The practice of Social Distancing (i.e. 1.5 metres apart, no handshakes, maintaining distances etc.)
- Only 3 persons per playing group.
- When you finish playing, you must go home.

Also:

If you have recently returned from overseas, you are now required by law to self-isolate for 14 days upon their return, as of midnight on Sunday, March 15. During this period, you should not visit the golf club for any reason.

It is hoped that by following these guidelines that we provide a safe environment for those wanting to play golf whilst still permissible by the Australian Government. Please make sure you follow this for the safety and well-being of not only yourself but everyone else in the community.

Please take care of yourself and your family in these very different and challenging circumstances.

BEVERLEY 'REDBACKS' FOOTBALL CLUB

2020 SEASON POSTPONED

In a united decision with the AFL and other State football bodies, the West Australian Football Commission has agreed to postpone all senior and junior community football in both metropolitan and regional Western Australia.

Consistent with the decision yesterday in relation to State League football and talent programs, all community football competitions will be postponed until 31 May 2020.

This includes Auskick, AFL 9s and community AFLX competitions, and also extends to football training sessions and face-to-face education courses.

The recommendation was collectively agreed upon based on the nature of shared public facilities across community football clubs and the health and safety of football's volunteer network.

WAFC CEO Gavin Taylor said the health and well-being of players, coaches, umpires, officials, volunteers and the local community was at the forefront of the decision. "The WAFC is determined to be part of the whole of community response to slow down the spread of Corornavirus and help the broader community and our health systems to cope," he said. "We strongly agree with the AFL and other State football bodies that given the current climate of uncertainty and complexity it is best to take decisive action now."

"We will be working through this postponement with all senior and junior competitions and affiliates throughout WA over the coming days and remain committed to offering our full support to community football during this time."

"Football is part of the fabric of our community and we will do everything possible to ensure we can overcome this unprecedented challenge together so that football not only survives, but thrives."

The WAFC will continue to meet with the AFL and other State football bodies in relation to community football and will continually review this decision based on the changing circumstances and advice from government and relevant health authorities and medical experts.


