

SHIRE OF BEVERLEY PRESIDENT'S REPORT





BEVERLEY HEROIC

Congratulations to Toby Hodgson and his crew who did a fantastic job organising the Heroic cycling event and promoting Beverley. Sadly the Sunday rides were cancelled due to some last minute red tape however the rides that were held on Saturday, road time trials and CycloX, were still very well attended. The main street has not been that busy for quite some time. The historic display in the Town Hall was educational and well worth the visit.



BEVERLEY AMATEUR DRAMATICS

Congratulations to the local Beverley Amateur Dramatics group for their 4 nights of the Cocky's Crossing performance. Who knew there was so much local talent!?

VINCENT STREET STREETSCAPE PROJECT

Council continue to work to progress the Vincent Street project. Early indicative costs have come in over our allocated budget, so Council are exploring contingencies and various options to move forward. Actual costs will be known once Council receives the formal quote from Western Power and civil works tenders are received in the coming months.

MOORT WABINY PARK



Moort Wabiny Park is now open and it is fantastic to see it being used all the time, particularly after school. The Shire has received many positive comments, emails and calls. The park was filled with young cyclists on Sunday 18 October taking part in the Rock n Roll Bike program. Shire staff are now working on grants to apply for a series of Skate Workshops.

As the Shire's Facebook page mentioned – please no motorbikes, motorised scooters or any other motorised equipment in the park.

We also ask for your own safety that you do not use the park after dark. You could easily trip or fall in the dark. The power should be connected just prior to Christmas. Once this happens the lights will be on where you can skate, ride, play and BBQ safely. When the lights go out, the park is closed and no one should be in there. A note to all that the area is monitored by CCTV so please do the right thing and respect the park that was built for the entire community to enjoy.

Details of the Official Opening will be distributed in the coming weeks.

ONSITE CARAVAN PARK ACCOMMODATION

Work is due to commence early November with fencing, drainage and sand pads being laid by local and regional contractors and the Shire. Staff have completed the internal fit-out selection and are working on the daily operational program.

TOWN HALL FLOOR REFURBISHMENT AND SMALL PROJECTS

A reminder that the Town Hall will be closed from November 2020 until February 2021 while it receives new timber flooring and an upgrade to the AV System. Thank you to the affected clubs and community groups which have moved locations or finished their season early to enable the works to proceed.

Shire staff are also looking into the replacement of the Town Hall entrance doors. Universal access sliding doors are being investigated. Other small projects underway are replacement of the artificial turf at the Station Arts, Lesser Hall courtyard upgrade, painting at the Station Arts, extension/beautification of the Recreation Ground Playground area and Courthouse reroofing.

These projects are made possible by the Federally funded Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program.

WORKS

Various areas along the river and around town have been fogged for mosquitoes. This has been carried out three times with approximately 10 days between applications.

Shoulder Grading - the shoulders on Mawson Road and Morbinning Road have been reformed along the edge of the bitumen.

Work is currently underway for the widening, stabilising and sealing to 7 metres on a 4km stretch of Westdale Road.

BROOKING STREET RESERVE



Thank you to Phyllis Facey and Lorna Johnson of the Beverley Naturalist Club, along with CESM Troy Granville and Tourism Officer, Jacinta Murray for showing Council the recent upgrades to the Brooking Street Reserve.

The guided walk, which included a talk on activity, signage, species identification and fire mitigation was very informative.

SENIOR'S WEEK

Council had booked a Piano performance called "Don't shoot me I'm only the Piano Player" by David Scheel to celebrate Seniors Week, but unfortunately due to the COVID-19 border restrictions Mr Scheel was unable to travel to Western Australia. The show has been rescheduled for 2022.

ANNUAL ELECTOR'S MEETING

The Annual Elector's meeting is expected to be delayed as the Annual Audit is now carried out by the Office of the Auditor General. It is unknown how long the delay will be.

Shire of Beverley Prepare for Fire Season

The Shire of Beverley's Community Emergency Services Manager along with the Chief Bush Fire Control Officer are reminding all property occupiers to prepare their properties for the coming fire season.

Firebreaks on Small Rural Holdings less than 100 hectares need to be installed before 01 November this year and maintained until the 15 April next year.

The minimum requirements for a firebreak in the Shire of Beverley is for the break to be at least 2.20 metres wide of bare mineral earth which means no vegetation (dead or alive) or flammable materials can be present.

Townsite Land occupiers can clear their properties of all inflammable materials or maintain grass mown to a height of less than 15cm or provide a 2.20m firebreak if the property is greater than 2 hectares.

Larger rural properties should ensure that they have an operational independent mobile water filled firefighting unit with a water capacity of not less than 600L to be ready to deployed throughout the Prohibited and Restricted burning periods.

Fire breaks play some part in reducing the spread of fire but more importantly they can provide a safer space for fire fighters to work from when trying to combat a fire.

Now mandated in the Beverley Fire Break Order is access to properties by large fire appliances. Generally this means making sure that there is an adequate gate width of at least 3 metres and to ensure that there are no overhanging branches or obstructions below 4 metres high over entry points and access driveways to allow fire appliances to safely navigate your property should they need to defend it from fire.

Prohibited Burning within the Beverley Shire is scheduled to begin on November 01 after which time no fires are permitted to be lit..

PROHIBITED BURNING PERIOD


All Permits to Burn in Beverley are being withdrawn from **1st November 2020** due to unfavourable fire conditions.

No fires are permitted from this date until 15th February 2021.

An exemption until 15th November allows small piles of garden refuse (less than 1 cubic metre) to be burnt between 6pm and fully extinguished before midnight. <u>You must notify</u> <u>DFES Communications on 1800 198140 before lighting</u> and you must ensure that there is 5 metres clear of all flammable material surrounding the pile.

St Mary's Church

RESTORATION APPEAL

We drive past it and possibly do not give it a second thought, but this iconic building of our town has been around since 1892. It once held a prominent place in society with many a wedding, baptism, confirmation and funeral held here at St Mary's. It remains a local landmark on the corner of John and Husking Streets, and still contributes to the community's sense of place.

The foresight of the first Rector, the Revered Groser who not only was a theologian of note but also had a nous for business, was quite remarkable. As he was able to drive the fund-raising efforts and enthusiasm of the local community to donate their valuable time and significant resources to build the Church from local stone. Heavy stone was carted in by horse drawn wagons, then lifted higher and higher to complete the structure over an eight month period. All done voluntarily. Time and resources freely given.

Description from the State Heritage Office in 2013

"This was the first Anglican Church in Beverley townsite. It cost 475 pounds and was consecrated by Reverend Parry on 30th November 1892. The Chancel and Vestry were added in 1904 at a cost of 290 pounds. A memorial tower to Mr WH de Lisle, added in 1914, was too heavy for the foundation and was removed in 1926. The Lynch Gate was a War Commemoration and was dedicated on Remembrance Day 11 November 1956. The Porch was added in 1963 in memory of Mena Smith."

The Memorial Lynch gate mentioned is the only one of its type in Western Australia.

RESTORATION APPEAL

Now, the Church has fallen into some disrepair and is in need of attention. We would not be appealing for funds if we were able to source from elsewhere. The Anglican Diocese of the Church is unable to offer any significant assistance, the National Trust, State Heritage and Lotteries Commission no longer supply funds for Churches. We are researching possible grant funding, however we need more than what may be available through that process.

The Church building itself is not only a symbol of our spiritual faith, as it was for previous generations who lived in the district, but it is also a building of historical significance to our Beverley community. As we go forward that historical significance can only become more and more important to future generations.

Please help us to restore and preserve this significant iconic community building.

Most of the discussion centred around arrangements for the annual Rose Show which will go ahead as planned. The date is set for October 23 and 24 so by the time this goes to press, the show will be over. See the next issue for results.

The next meeting will be at the Dead Finish at 10.30am on Tuesday 03 November which will be the Annual General Meeting.

NOVEMBER IN THE GARDEN

VEGETABLES: Plant out capsicums, chilli, cucumbers, tomatoes, sweet corn, eggplant, lettuce, zucchini, rocket and squash.

HERBS: How about basil (both sweet and purple), parsley, sage, pyrethrum, lemongrass, oregano, rue and marjoram. Mint is a great herb for adding to your healthy dinners and drinks, but it'll take over, so plant it in a pot to keep it contained.

FLOWERS: Some colour in the patch isn't only pleasing to the eye, but can help us destress and relax. The pollinators and other good guys will love it too. Try some nasturtium, dianthus, gerbera, verbena, snapdragons, petunias, marigolds, phlox and celosia.


GREEN MANURE: Build some muscle into you and your soil by planting green manure, try cow pea, mung bean, soy bean and millet. Next season's hungry plants will love it.

GARDEN BEDS: Top up your mulch on all your garden beds. Make sure you choose sustainable, low environmental impact mulch, that'll enrich your soil as it breaks down.

HEAT PROTECTION: For the heat Make a couple of shade cloth tents. They don't have to elaborate, just a simple, moveable structure that you can put over the top of some of the sun sensitive veggies.

FRUIT TREES: Got grafted fruit trees? Check for shoots growing up from below the graft and cut them off. The rootstock will take over your trees if you let them go.

GARLIC: Check your garlic, if some of the leaves are turning yellow and the stalks softening, it's time to start harvesting.

We've had a lot of queries regarding the new recycling program and wanted to compile some local information for you.

To receive a refund, you will need a Scheme ID which you can register for on the Containers for Change website here https://consumer.containersforchange.com.au/create-account? scheme=WA

Eligible containers can be dropped off in bags at a bag-drop located at the end of Council Rd near the cardboard recycling bin.

Please make sure you place your Scheme ID is legible on your bags (tape and permanent marker work just fine).

Currently, bag drop off is on Wednesday and Saturday afternoons from 1pm until 4pm. In the future, a separate bin will be permanently placed there and emptied weekly – meaning you can drop your bags off at any time!

Refunds appear to be processed within approximately 72 business hours.

Are you a traceability ace?

Stock traceability is the first step in good biosecurity and is a key part of everyday sound farm management practices. Traceability is essential to maintain access to export markets and for food safety. It allows stock to be traced for disease or residue purposes and deters stock theft.

How are animals traced?

If you own cattle or other livestock, you must register as on owner of livestock, identify stock correctly, obtain a property identification code (PIC) for each property where you keep them and record movements to your property on the National Livestock Identification System (NLIS) database.

Cattle must have a registered identifier (brand and/or earmark) and an NLIS electronic device that enables animals to be tracked from property of birth to slaughter or export.



Are your cattle registered to your property?


The Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development (DPIRD) find that half of all traceability non-compliance issues involve cattle that are not registered to the PIC they are leaving from. This breaks our traceability chain, is a potential biosecurity and market risk and can also hold up processing at the abattoir.

Don't get caught out!

Now - and not when loading the truck - is the time to check that your cattle are registered to your property by using an NLIS scanner. Scan the tags and DPIRD can assist you to run a check on the NLIS database and to update any missing movements.

If you do not have a scanner, they are easy to use and available to loan from DPIRD Northam, the Pingelly Community Resource Centre or by contacting **1300 WA NLIS (1300 926 547)**, or email <u>nlis@dpird.wa.gov.au</u>. 



- 5.Joint secretary-Verna McKelvie has been a great help to Mal Roberts during his stint in 2 hospitals between April and June 2020, and tirelessly sorting out paper work, making phone calls, going to Centrelink and Homeswest offices, and transporting Mal Roberts for endless medical Perth appointments in (throughout the lockdown period- 4 plus months). Verna has made numerous personal phone calls, visits. and messages on behalf of Mal Roberts. Many thanks Verna.

Another Beverley Pioneer Walter John Boyle (Jack) Born: 25th May 1893 at Greenhills, WA Married: 22nd December to Ivy Lavinia Grover at Beverley, WA Died: 10th May 1964 at Beverley, WA



Jack was very well known in the Beverley area as an excellent horseman and bushman. He loved horses and would go out into the bush and catch wild brumbies which he would then break in and sell to locals and buyers in nearby districts. Breaking in horses was a sideline for Jack and he usually worked in the local area on farms and for contractors.

Jack was a proficient storyteller and loved to entertain his family and friends with his many tales about his life. His grandchildren could often be found seated in a circle around him listening to his stories. Jack would ride through the bush for 15-20 miles, arriving at Andrew Strange's at midnight. Andrew would get out of bed and they would yarn for the rest of the night, this was a common occurrence.

A local versifier penned the following tribute to Jack Boyle on his passing....

There's a small country town in Westralia, where friendship is ever in force. That has just lost a real dinkum Aussie, and among his best friends was his horse. They will miss his old handshake and laughter, they will miss his old humour of course. And when they meet again in the hereafter, I'll bet you he's riding a horse! *Beverley Times* Friday 22 May 1964, page 7 **Jack Boyle's Demise**

Born nearly 71 years ago of parents who had farmed in the Greenhills area for a long period, Walter John Boyle, a very well-known resident of these parts, passed away after a long illness at the Beverley Hospital on May 10th. With his demise there disappeared a droll character who has been a part of the Beverley scene for as long as most residents can remember. Slow of speech, he was quick to acknowledge with a handshake every friendly greeting, and his acquaintances stretched from one end of the district to the other. He must have shaken hands with most of his friends on hundreds of occasions. It could be a twice a day ritual.

Jack Boyle was a lover of horses and until recent years was usually to be seen mounted on one of his ponies. He specialised in trading in brumby equines which he used to break in and for which he appeared to find a market here and in adjacent areas. In addition to this activity, which was something of a sideline, he worked during his life on local farms and with local contractors.

He was one of a very large family, there being six brothers and five sisters. Several of these have passed on including two very well-known brothers in "Sonny" Boyle, who was a chaff cutting contractor in these parts for many years and Tommy who was a very well-known York farmer until his death last year. Those still living are George, Ted and Mick, whilst sisters comprise Edith, Maud, Eva, Amy and Alma.

Jack married Miss Ivy Grover, of Beverley, over fifty years ago and from that time on spent almost all of his time in this district. Of the union a family of eight was born, these comprising Maurice, Eric, Marjorie (Mrs Reg Carr), Robin, Archie, Syd (of Goomalling), Max, Rita (Mrs Stan Cummings and Elvie (Mrs John Thompson, of Perth). The people of Beverley recognised Jack Boyle as a man without pretensions and the extremely large attendance at the funeral held at the Anglican cemetery on Tuesday, May 12, after a service at St. Mary's Church was a striking tribute to his popularity and to the sympathy felt for the bereaved widow, family, and relatives.

Warrior Wellbeing Article Mindfulness - The Gift of Being Present

Simply put, mindfulness is the act of keeping our mind in the present moment. One of the common ways to practice mindfulness is through meditation. While meditation is a practice many people find helpful for their health and wellbeing, the term meditation might make us think of people sitting cross-legged repeating mantras to Tibetan meditation music. This might not appeal to all us blokes and may turn us away from the practice, but meditation is just one avenue to incorporate mindfulness into our lives.

For all of us our mind often gets caught ruminating over the past or worrying about the future. It's important to spend time in the future to plan for upcoming events and also to spend some time in the past to learn from our mistakes. However, spending too much time dwelling on negative events of the past or having our mind consumed by worry about bad things that *could* happen in the future will lead to heightened anxiety levels. This is why mindfulness and mindful meditation is sometimes used in the medical industry as a tool to help tackle diagnosed mental illnesses, such as anxiety disorders. Extensive research into the practice has shown that it improves mental health and wellbeing outcomes in addition to other areas in our lives such as chronic pain management and addiction.

Our time perspective encompasses the amount of time we spend with our mind in the past, present or future. To practice mindfulness, we need to bring our thoughts back to the present. Pay more careful, non-judgmental attention to the here and now. If our mind starts wandering, simply accept the thought and bring ourselves back to the present.

There are some simple ways to practice mindfulness in everyday life:

Mindful breathing – Spend time (ideally seated) with our thoughts focused on our breath as our chest moves in and out. If we are trying to calm ourselves during a stressful moment it might help to take an exaggerated breath to bring ourselves back to the present.

Mindful Driving – Have you ever had a long trip in the country and not remembered the drive? This is because we are often 'mindless' when driving. To practice mindful driving, we start by bringing our focus to the breath and our mind to the present – we bring our attention to the feel of our hands on the steering wheel and sound of road noise.

By incorporating mindful exercises into our life, we may come to realise that we are spending a lot time completely mindless. And, over time, we will be better able to enjoy life's pleasures as they arise. When we take timeout to smell the roses, we might just see an improvement in our overall health and wellbeing.
