

## SHIRE OF BEVERLEY PRESIDENT'S REPORT



#### **Moort Wabiny Park**

Thank you to everyone who attended the Official Opening of Moort Wabiny Park on 12 February. The weather was very kind and a lovely morning had by all. As mentioned on the day we are pleased to announce the running of skate clinics for Beverley kids. The clinic details will be advertised very soon via the Shires Facebook page and the Beverley Bulletin, register your interest at the Shire Office. The speech notes can be found on page 17 of this months Blarney.

#### **LRCI Funding Updates**

- ⇒The Gymnasium swipe card access is complete. This is an added safety feature for gym users. If you are interested in joining the gym please contact the Customer Service Officers at the Shire.
- ⇒Work has commenced on the Lesser Hall courtyard. The courtyard will feature paving, fencing, seating and planter boxes which will be available to use as part of the Lesser Hall hire.
- ⇒The AV upgrade to the Town Hall will be completed 23 24 February and the foyer doors are expected early March.

#### **Reconciliation Action Plan**

Council have agreed to the Terms of Reference for Reconciliation Action Plan Working Group at the February Council meeting. Invitations to join the Working Group will be sent out to local Beverley indigenous families. Council are inviting four members of our Indigenous Community to join the working group.

#### **Vincent Street Streetscape Project**

Council have agreed as per the 2020/21 Budget, to raise a loan of \$1.25M to progress the undergrounding of power construction which is scheduled to commence in May 2021. Civil construction activities (roadworks, footpath upgrading & landscaping) are expected to commence in August/September 2021. Though Council has secured \$1,534,122.00 from Building Better Regions Funding towards the estimated \$4M project, the payment of this funding is not due until the next financial year as milestones are met. Given the low cost of borrowing and the low future impost on rate payers to service the loan, Council agreed that the raising of the loan funds to assist with Council's portion of the project go ahead. The Vincent Street Streetscape Project will address all the current issues including accessibility, safer access, stormwater drainage, kerb heights, uneven footpaths and general aesthetics of our beloved mainstreet.

#### Round 2 - 2020/21 Community Grants

Congratulations to the Beverley Bowling & Croquet Club, Beverley Golf Club and Beverley Historical Society who were recipients of the latest round of Community Grant Funding. The next round is in the new financial year – July 2021. We encourage you to start your planning early to make sure you meet all the requirements, terms and conditions.

#### **Road Works**

- ⇒Council have accepted a tender to replace Grader BE 001.
- ⇒Maintenance grading will continue in the west of the Shire.
- ⇒Bethany Road is to be bitumised in the coming months. Other road reseals will commence mid-March.

#### **Restricted Burning Period**

The Shire has now moved from the Prohibited period to the Unrestricted Burning Period. Permits must be obtained to burn. Permits are applied for online at <a href="https://www.beverley.wa.gov.au/services/emergency-services/fire-control.aspx">https://www.beverley.wa.gov.au/services/emergency-services/fire-control.aspx</a> and you need to allow 48 hours (working days) for the permit to be issued.

#### 2019/20 Annual Report and Annual Electors Meeting

Council and the Audit & Risk Committee are still waiting for final approval from the Office of the Auditor General to receive and adopt the Annual Report and hold an Annual Electors Meeting. Advertising will take place when approval is given from the Office of the Auditor General.

#### **Council Agenda and Minutes**

You are also welcome to call into the Shire Office to collect a paper copy free of charge. Council minutes are also available in the Library.

#### **Beverley 2022 Celebrations**

Council have approved the preliminary plans for a festival for the 2022 Milestone Celebrations in recognition of 150 years for the Beverley Road Board and 150 years of the Dead Finish Museum (the oldest building in Beverley) and other significant achievements for the Shire of Beverley. Thank you to the community members who are volunteering their time to help bring these celebrations together. As details come to hand and are confirmed over the next 12 months they will be advertised and promoted in the Blarney and via social media.

#### Caravan Park Units

There have been many enquiries as to when the units will open. Construction is well and truly underway and we hope to take the first bookings for the start of July.

#### **Integrated Planning**

Throughout 2021 Council will be reviewing the Strategic Community Plan, Workforce Plan, Local Emergency Management Plan, Corporate Business Plan and 10 year Long Term Financial Plan.

#### State Election – Postal Vote Registration Available Until 10 March

As part of their COVIDSafe voting plan for the 2021 State general election, the Western Australian Electoral Commission (WAEC) is encouraging everyone who has concerns about attending a polling place to vote prior or on election day, to register for a postal vote. Postal Vote registration is available 04 February to 10 March. Information can be found on their website: elections.wa.gov.au or by phoning 13 63 06. Polling day is Saturday 13 March 2021.

When visiting the tip, please abide by the signage and make sure you put your rubbish in the correct location. If unsure, ask Paul and he will guide you. The Department of Water and Environment do not take kindly to rubbish being in the wrong spot and we want to make sure our tip passes all inspections and remains open for the community.







Good Morning and welcome to the Official Opening of Moort Wabiny Park.

I would like to welcome, acknowledge and pay respect to our Elders, Traditional Owners, past and present of the land on which we meet today.

I also welcome Councillors; members of the Youth Precinct Working Group; Beverley District High School Principal Adrian Lister, and Students; those who have worked on the project; those who have generously donated and supported the project, and importantly the Beverley Community.

Apologies for today's opening have been received from the Hon. Christian Porter MP, Hon. Mia Davies MLA, Lotterywest and the State Government, Graeme McDonald of Inkosi Design, ADC Projects, Skate Sculpture and Darryl Storer.



Council are very proud of the youth activity area in which we gather today. Moort Wabiny in Noongar means Family Play and it has been fantastic to see families and children gather here daily to interact, enjoy physical activity, and activate a previously underutilised space.

Back in June 2013, 29 children attend a Youth Forum in the Town Hall to brainstorm their own wants, ideas, initiatives, and dreams for Beverley. By the end of the day, out of more than 50 ideas the top 3 ideas were a skatepark, a go-kart track and KFC! After explaining that Council can't provide a KFC, it was replaced with hip hop classes.

During the period 2013 to 2019 Council completed several community projects including the Water Harvesting Programme, Airstrip Lighting, Recreation Grounds and the Cornerstone Building. It was during this period that a committed group of young people and their parents approached the Shire to discuss the establishment of on outdoor youth area. After several visits to Council to present ongoing ideas of skate tracks and pump tracks, Council jumped on board. In the 2018/19 financial year we made a budget commitment and allocation to progress planning for the Youth Precinct. In February 2019, the Youth Precinct Working Group was established with Council appointing five community members and appointing Skate Sculpture to facilitate the consultation and design process.

Between March and August 2019, the working group, Council, the wider community and our school aged children were involved in the design of the Youth Precinct with two school workshops and two public workshops. On 25 June 2019, Council endorsed this very location for the Youth Precinct and two months later the final design concept was also received by Council.

Up to this point Council would like to formally recognise Stacy Stanfield, Eric Ellis, Darryl Brown and Kylie Watts for their dedication in lobbying Council. To the Youth Working Group community members - Julie Paull, Eric Ellis, Stacy Stanfield, Jaime-Lee Williamson, Marie Ricks and Larissa Atkinson for their time attending meetings and planning sessions. To Beverley District High School for enabling the all important planning and design sessions with the Children and to Skate Sculpture for facilitating the process.

After the design and location were finalised, funding was sought from Lotterywest. The Lotterywest application was supported by various local funding that was raised by the Beverley Market Group (consisting of Val Tylor, Dalene Davies and Jenny Foster); John & Nicolette Whittington; John Maxwell from Hotel Beverley and the Beverley Agricultural Society. The Application was also supported by the Beverley CRC, CRANA Aboriginal Corporation and the Beverley Early Years Network. It was a very happy day in the Shire when we learned the grant application was successful.

Without the grant from Lotterywest this project could not have come to fruition so quickly. On behalf of Council, I thank Lotterywest for their support of Moort Wabiny Park. I urge our community to continue to support our local Lotterywest agency as Lotterywest is unique – it remains the only lottery in Australia which is State Government owned and operated with a majority of money spent on tickets going back to the people of WA through prizes and grants. Last financial year this amounted to \$292 million for the WA community, and Lotterywest is proud to support community projects like this one, to help build a better WA together.



Council were also successful in receiving funding from the Stronger Communities Programme and the Drought Communities program both of which are Federally funded and we thank the Hon. Christian Porter MP for his support of our project. These federal funding initiatives are intended to provide short-term support for local economies by boosting local employment and procurement, and to address social and community needs. In our case we have now addressed a long-term community need which brings locals and visitors to our business centre.

The construction of the park went very well. Even with COVID interrupting our lives we managed to meet online, continue construction and produce a great facility for everyone to enjoy. For the construction process we would like to thank ADC Projects, Phase 3 Construction, Skate Sculpture and Inkosi Design who were professional and reliable companies throughout the project.

There are parts of the park that contain local donated elements and we would like to sincerely thank the Beverley Men's Shed for the bin surrounds and in particular Darryl Storer and Ken Sherwood for their wonderful restoration of the red Austin Truck at the front of the park. Grant Hobbs for the sluice gates. Duncan and Tarni Young for the rocks and to Elders Beverley who provided invaluable site access and power whilst we were waiting for the power to be connected.

Finally, on behalf of Council I would like to thank all the Shire Staff for their efforts from community liaison, planning, grant submissions, project management, demolition, construction, and maintenance. I am sure the community are aware we are very lucky to have a Shire Office of inside and outside staff who predominately live and socialise in Beverley so always have the benefit of our community in mind.

To further encourage the ongoing use of this space, I am very pleased to announce that the Shire has been successful in securing funding to run a six-week skateboarding and scooter clinic from the Department of Sport and Recreation. Students of Beverley District High School I encourage you to attend and let your fellow students know. Details for all the Community will be in the Blarney.

I would now like to ask Miss Grace (Pictured top right with Shire of Beverley CEO, S Gollan and President D Davis) to come forward and help me officially open Moort Wabiny Park by revealing one of two

plaques which will be displayed permanently on site. It was Grace who suggested Moort Wabiny Park in her entry in the community naming competition last year.

The park is now officially open, congratulations and thank you to the entire Community for your efforts. I hope this space will be enjoyed for many generations to come.





## REMINDER TO SLOW DOWN WHEN YOU SEE EMERGENCY LIGHTS SLOW DOWN, MOVE OVER



The SLOMO laws took effect in Western Australia on 2 March 2018. The legislation requires drivers to reduce their speed to a maximum of 40kph when approaching a stationary emergency vehicle that has its emergency/flashing lights activated. It further requires the driver to move over, or change lanes, where this is possible and safe to do so.

We routinely deal with incidents on the roadside, which is inherently a dangerous place to be working, especially on high-speed roads. This new law offers better protection not only to police officers but also to DFES, St John Ambulance, Main Roads WA Incident Response,

breakdown services and towage personnel.

#### HAVE YOU PAID YOUR VEHICLE AND MOTOR DRIVERS LICENCE?

The number of people driving without a current valid driver's licence has recently increased in Beverley resulting in those we encounter being summonsed to court.

If your motor vehicle registration has expired by more than 3 months we will remove the registration plates and you will need to make application to have the vehicle re-licensed. You can check on the status of both motor vehicle and driver's licenses on the Department of Transport website <a href="https://www.transport.wa.gov.au">www.transport.wa.gov.au</a>

#### **EMERGENCY WA**

Emergency WA is co-ordinated on behalf of the government of WA by DFES and created so you can find emergency information easier than before. The site has a map-based display with the best available emergency information from across the state. Here you can find information about fires, floods, storms, earthquakes, tsunamis, hazardous material incidents and traffic crashes. The best way to keep informed during an emergency is to seek information from a variety of sources. You can get information by:-

- Using the EMERGENCY WA website
- Staying in touch with neighbours, family and friends
- Being alert and aware of your surroundings
- Listening to ABC local radio
- Tuning in to 6PR in the metro

If someone you know tells you about a possible emergency, or if you can see or smell something that might be dangerous, that's your warning. Take immediate action to stay safe. Do not wait to receive a warning or text message. The warnings on the emergency WA website are also available by calling the relevant agency, for example the DFES emergency information phone line (13DFES or 133337) or the Bureau of Meteorology's phone lines.

You can also follow emergency agencies social media accounts, RSS feeds or download smart phone apps such as EWN or Emergency AUS.

During an emergency, you may also receive a text or voice message from the emergency services to your telephone – visit emergency.wa.gov.au to find out more.

Remember – NO WARNING SYSTEM IS FOOLPROOF. So use a range of sources of information.







# **Beverley Soaring Society, Currently Ranked Number 1 Globally**

**Gliding is a sport** that has relatively a small footprint when compared to other sports globally. Glider pilots are a competitive bunch, particularly the ones at Beverley and they

like to know how their gliding colleagues in Australia/NZ and around the world are performing. To measure and gain an insight to our individual and club performance globally we are registered on the <a href="https://www.onlinecontest.org">www.onlinecontest.org</a>, who are <a href="https://www.onlinecontest.org">the operators of a global online database and scoring system for gliding. Their database currently has 64 gliding clubs in Australia/NZ and 676 clubs registered globally. So far this year, 2421 pilots from clubs around the world have uploaded their flights from their flight computers to this global online database. The database applies a complex algorithm to each flight, this determines the global ranking of each pilot and ranking for each gliding club. At the end of 2020 Beverley Soaring Society (BSS) was ranked number 2 in Australia/NZ and 10<sup>th</sup> globally. At the time of writing this article BSS was ranked number 1 in Australia and the world. Not a bad effort for a mid-sized gliding club!



WA has just received a blunt reminder that COVID-19 is not just a reality for tens of millions of people around world. This recent lockdown has just demonstrated that COVID-19 can happen to "us" anytime. At the Beverley Soaring Society (BSS) we are doing our bit for the community, members, and visitors with a vigilant respect for COVID-19 by maintaining a range of hygiene and distancing strategies to keep our members and visitors as safe as possible. BSS also uses the SafeWA app which is an easy to use and effective strategy to record attendance and if necessary, assist in contact tracing anyone that has visited BSS. Community members are always welcome (not during lockdowns)

to visit but please bring your mobile phone with the SafeWA app. Take a deep sweet breath, we have had a bit of a scare but most of us can thank our lucky stars that we live in WA.

Our membership has increased significantly in the last 6 months. There are several contributing factors apart from the usual marketing for this growth. Even prior to COVID-19 the number of people travelling and seeking recreational experience within Australia was on the increase. Since the second wave of COVID-19 in June 2020 travelling within Australia has doubled. Small towns like Beverley and clubs like BSS have indirectly and directly benefited from this growth. One casual observation is the relatively significant surge in caravanners, day trippers and bikers coming to town particularly around the wildflower and canola season. We also know and



appreciate that the Beverley Council organises a number of events that attract visitors to Beverley. Many of these people visit BSS to view the gliding operations, have a chat with pilots and some visitors will have a flight. A small percentage of visitors will join the club.

The Beverley Soaring Society Webpage has recently had a significant makeover which includes YouTubes produced by photographer Ben Hammersley, a visitor to our club. Ben uses the latest 360 degree camera technology to capture the inspiring spirit of flying in a surreal environment. Documentary Producer David Fosdick in his YouTube has provided an excellent bird's eye view and insight into gliding. All the YouTubes are relatively short and definitely worth watching. If you like to give gliding a go but you are a bit worried about leaving terra firma, these YouTubes may assist to put your mind at ease.

#### Keeping an Eye on the Crown Jewels

The title might suggest that this article relates to a security firm engaged at Buckingham Palace, however what we're actually talking about is monitoring an aspect of our sexual health, specifically testicular cancer. Testicular cancer is a relatively rare cancer, however it seems to be becoming more prevalent and is the most common cancer in men aged between 20 and 35.

It's ironic that blokes will quite often joke or boast about their tackle but will find it very difficult to discuss the same appendage with their GP. Becoming comfortable and familiar with our penis and testicles is the first step in being able to notice any changes over time. The first thing that some blokes notice (and get concerned about) is that one testicle may hang lower than the other. This is perfectly normal and is actually an evolutionary trait that prevents them bashing into each other like some runaway desk ornament when we walk or run.

Testicular cancer usually affects one testicle. There are some symptoms to keep an eye out for which shouldn't be ignored:

- a feeling of heaviness in the scrotum
- a lump in either testicle
- enlargement of a testicle
- dull aching in the abdomen or groin
- a sudden collection of fluid in the scrotum
- tenderness and/or enlargement of the breast tissue

A key point to remember is, initially, and in some cases even in the later stages, testicular cancer might not cause any pain or discomfort. A small painless lump is the most common symptom, and if you have any of these symptoms, it doesn't necessarily mean that you definitely have cancer. These symptoms can also indicate a range of benign (non-cancerous) causes, but they should always be checked by a doctor.

Because some of these symptoms are not always glaringly obvious, it's important to self-check your testicles. The best way to examine your testicles is after a warm bath or shower and it's a fairly straight forward process:

- Cup your testicles in the palm of one hand. Pay attention to the size and weight. This helps you identify any future changes.
- Locate the epididymis. This is the tube that carries sperm to the penis. It can be felt at the top-rear of each testicle. This lump is meant to be there.
- Examining each testicle in more detail by rolling it between your thumb and fingers, press gently but firmly to feel for any lumps, swellings or variations in firmness.

Repeat this examination every couple of months or so. The outlook for treatment of testicular cancer is very good. With early diagnosis, 96% of patients can be completely cured. Even after the cancer has spread, up to 80% of men can still be cured.

If you do find anything unusual, don't wait for it to disappear or start throbbing - see your doctor.



#### **Beverley Garden and Tree Society**

We hope that you and your garden have managed to survive the heat and strong winds this summer and we are now heading into Autumn.

Gardening in March is a great time as autumn has arrived. Autumn is a good time to plant almost anything!

**Vegetables to plant in March** – beetroot, broccoli, cabbage, carrot, leek, lettuce, radish, spinach, spring onion and turnip.


Flowers to plant in March – alyssum, lobelia, stock, pansy, snap dragon, sweet pea and viola.

March is a great time to attend to the following tasks in your garden:

- ☑ Prune geranium and pelargonium by two-thirds to encourage new bushy growth before winter
- Remove weeds before they go to seed. The best time is after rain
- Attract butterflies to your garden by planting red, orange, purple, white and blue flowers
- ☑ Prune petunias to keep them flowering well into autumn
- ☑ Coffee grounds can be put to good use in the garden as slug and snail repellent or in the compost bin
- ☑ Divide agapanthus plants from autumn through to early spring
- ☑ Prune off citrus branches hanging lower than 1m above the ground to reduce the spread of brown rot
- ☑ Plant bee food plants such as brachyscome, angophora, eucalyptus, callistemon, melaleuca, scaevola, grevillea, hibbertis, tea-tree and westringia
- Scorched leaves can be a sign that soil is water repellent. If the soil is dry, apply a wetting agent and water well
- ☑ Divide clumping grass-like plants, such as dianella, lomandra and kangaroo grass. Keep several shoots per clump and remove dead material
- Harvest radish regularly to stop them becoming too hot and spicy, woody or pithy
- Start planning spring bulbs
