SHIRE OF BEVERLEY PRESIDENT'S REPORT



New Council 2021 - 2023

These are my first Blarney notes as Shire President. Thank you to my fellow Councillors for electing me to this position. For anyone who does not know me, my name is David White and I have been a Councillor since first elected in October 2011.

Prior to Council, I served on the Beverley Hospital Board for 9 years and have been a member of the Beverley CRC Committee since 2012. Whilst being on Council over the last ten years I have enjoyed watching Beverley slowly but steadily progress, some highlights include the development of a tourism brand, the redevelopment at the oval, the construction of Moort Wabiny park, the widening of the Vincent Street bridge and most importantly the establishment of the industrial area. I firmly believe that encouraging industries and new business to Beverley will create for employment and it should always be considered an important priority.

There are other issues facing local government such the expectation State of and Commonwealth governments Local Government to take on more roles without providing the funds to carry out the tasks; and there being an increasingly greater regulation placed upon Local Governments without assessing their capacity to cope. I will endeavour to hold the regulatory authorities to account on behalf of local government.

Council 2021 – 2023 comprises Cr Chris Lawlor (Deputy President), Cr Don Davis, Cr Peter Gogol, Cr John Maxwell, Cr Alan Sattler, Cr Sue Martin and Cr Tim Seed. Council formally welcomed Cr Maxwell and Cr Sattler at a swearing in ceremony on Monday 18 October 2021.

There is one vacancy on Council due to the resignation of Mr. Terry McLaughlin. An extraordinary election will be held on Friday 21 January 2022. The formal advertising calling for nominations will begin in the 4th week of November. If you are thinking about joining Council, please do not hesitate to contact me, another Councillor or the CEO.

Vincent Street Streetscape Project

The undergrounding of power has well and truly commenced. Thank you for your patience as drilling continues under the footpaths. Please travel slowly down the main street as there are many workers and pedestrians on the road.

On Saturdays, please look for extra parking behind the Cornerstone Building, behind the Shire Office and between the Town Hall and Men's Shed. You can also utilise the space between the Pharmacy and the old co-op building (across from the Butcher).

Western Power's contractors who are completing the undergrounding of power are expected to be here until Christmas. New light poles will go in November/December and in the New Year the civil works will ramp up. Civil works include road, drainage, footpath and garden works.

Fire Control

Firebreaks are to be installed by 1 November and be maintained until 15 April. For full details on the Fire Break Order you can refer to the Shire website or the leaflet sent out with the Shire rates.

We are currently in the restricted burning period which means you need a permit to burn. To apply for a permit please visit the Shire's website and remember to allow at least 48 hours for the permit to be issued.

The Prohibited Burning period is expected to commence on 14 November, this is where no fires are allowed. Please check the Shire's website page to stay informed.

Tourism

The town is still enjoying an influx of visitors and tourists. The Shire's three accommodation sites; caravan park, cabins and RV friendly park are being booked and used. We trust this is economically assisting our local business. Once the tourist season slows down, we will look to have an official opening of the cabins so everyone can have a little look.



Chairman's Report

Beverley Frail Aged Lodge

September 2021

The past 12 months have been quite busy with regular meetings although there are a lot of issues yet to be resolved.

It was decided to seek charity status so any fund raising would be a tax deduction to those who wished to donate. Our application was rejected as our constitution did not meet their requirements. Thanks go to Jack Barrett-Lennard who helped us with our initial enquiries.

Several alternatives have been put forward for an auxiliary power source at the lodge. These have included a small generator that would need to be started when power failed or a larger more expensive unit that is plumbed into start automatically or a solar powered battery setup and, finally for the lodge to be linked to the large generator at the hospital. John Lane made a visit to inspect the generator at Corrigin which was put in at the cost of \$40,000. Graham MacDonald and Karl Smith have both been contacted for their input. Hopefully, we will be able to make a final decision subject to finances, as soon as possible.

Upon receiving a grant from the Shire, we have been able to employ a consultant Caroline Robinson to do some future strategic planning. Thanks to Dee Ridgway for successfully applying for the grant. A business plan will be necessary if the Capital Grant Funds are directed to the Lodge.

A new, long term, lease agreement has been drawn up by WA Country Health Services (WACHS). It now includes a rental payment to the Frail Aged Lodge committee account of \$22,500 per year. This will enable us to have a capital base to do improvements to the Lodge.

Thanks to all those on the committee for their input and to our Secretary/Treasurer, John Lane, for his commitment. I would also like to acknowledge the work done by the HSM Michelle Bauer. Michelle has a very demanding role but is always very approachable and has the best interests of the lodge, the residents, and the staff in mind. Her assistance in directing me to the right contact person in the health department to gather information and following up some issues herself, has been invaluable.

I think 2021-2022 is going to be a busy year for the Lodge Committee. The Lodge building is now 49 years old and needs updating to meet the Health Department standards and to continue to serve the needs of the aged in our community. It is a valuable and necessary asset to our town and the onus is on us to continue to maintain an improved the Alex Miles Lodge, set up by the dedicated work of the original committee.





Beverley Volunteer Community Services Update

<u>Matters Dealt With:</u> Housing Problems, displaced persons living in a friends shed, due to marriage breakup. Had to seek legal advice for settlement in the family court, property settlement, children visitation rights etc.

Other marriage breakup, warrant, legal advice from the lawyers at the Citizens Advice Bureau. I am unhappy with the service and lodgement of formal complaints for being rude to a lady in the district that I did refer her to the CAB an apology has been given and the matter sorted out and is now preceding in the family court.

I now work closely with share and care where there are seasonal or singular issues, such as partnership breakups, becoming homeless, financial problems, pro bono lawyers, Centre Link, synergy to make up entitlement of the needy person and the financial officer meets with my referral person and sorts the problem one by one checking if there is money to put food on the table especially if children are involved.

<u>Complaints:</u> My work consists of largely helping the needy and the not so fortunate and those that cannot speak for themselves. At times I must phone parliament house to get the name and phone numbers of the minister overseeing the department. This entails advocating to the premier of WA and the ministers to seek fair and equal justice for those I speak for.

<u>Centre Link:</u> To avoid problems, keep your information, change of circumstances, job seeker entitlements. In some cases, I have been to centre link to speak for others and settle matters.

Those having payment problems in the workplace, I have been referred to contact the Fairwork Ombudsmen and disabled persons can contact both Fairwork and the discrimination minister. If you get no satisfaction, see me, I will take the matter up with Premier McGowan.

<u>Justice of the Peace:</u> Witnessing of Documents, in both medical practices, and in the shire, by appointment only, in the conference room with Mr. Steve Gollan as the authorised second witness, thanks Steve. This practice as the CEO of the Beverley Shire, with the former CEO and the current CEO, Mr Steve Gollan, has been going on for some 30 years. They deserve thanks and more. As a JP I witness some documents in my carport. I do not visit homes due to the covid virus unless someone is wheelchair bound – also we are not allowed to visit homes unless it is safe to do so re infection. I always wear a mask.

<u>Covid Virus Rules, Regulation & Info:</u> I phoned up the minister of health office and was referred to the covid virus information hotline, then referred to the Infectious Diseases department who then referred me to the local GP who was unavailable to give an exemption, medical certificate, exemption certificate. I was then referred to a government hospital where an application must be made online 4 pages of why you want an exemption or test for Covid – a merry go round.

I sent an email to Premier McGowan complaining of the Merry Go Round, and no result. You have a covid information centre who can provide info, I expressed my disgust at the run-around to the Premier.

<u>Family Court, Estate and Properties:</u> Be Very Careful before you seek legal advice, costs can start at \$432 for the first visit or taking someone to court or if you defame a person of high status (slander or defamation).

Court cases – proof of evidence, verbally or written – attract hefty payouts (under the Law of Torts). Many have lost their houses in slander cases.

If ever a bailer serves you with a warrant, it is a court order or it may be local police. First thing is phoning the Clerk of Courts for more information and what is involved, whether you must swear and give answers on the stand, some people break down. Check you may need a lawyer to speak for you. Note: This is information only, always seek legal advice)

Wills: Most legal firms suggest you make fresh wills every 2 years and get it witnessed by a qualified person.

Note: that the above is information only and not legal advice. If in doubt seek legal advice or get help from your local MP.

<u>Finally:</u> A big thank you to our secretary Sylvia Seddon been with us for over 30 years. Ralph Edwards our former treasurer was a loyal and strong supports for over 20 years and Verna McKelvie – (joint/local) secretary, who handles all the email and payment work. Many sincere thanks to you all. A big thank you to CEO Steve Gollan, the shire for providing me with an office for some 25 years.

Remembrance Day

Thursday November 11,2021

History of Remembrance Day

Remembrance Day was originally called 'Armistice Day', and 2 minutes of silence was observed for the first time at 11 am on 11 November 1919 to remember those who had died.

It's a day when we acknowledge those who died while serving in wars, conflicts and peacekeeping operations. Remembrance Day is held on 11 November each year. This is the anniversary of the Armistice that ended fighting with Germany in World War I. People in Australia, and many other countries, observe 1 minute's silence at the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month because that's when the Armistice came into effect. It's a time to honour our service personnel who died in service of Australia.

In 1918, Australia made a promise never to forget the service and sacrifice of 416,000 Australians who enlisted and over 60,000 who died. For over 100 years, we have kept this promise. We remember them still.

Coping with Change

As individuals we all have a different capacity to handle life events and stress. This capacity and our own innate level of resilience is tested when challenged by change either on a personal front or in the workplace. Our life's journey will have many unknowns and the only guarantee in that journey is that there will be *change*.

Dealing with change will often throw up a number of variables. Some people are more at risk than others of becoming dysfunctional during the change process. From studies undertaken those who may struggle with change can be identified as follows:

- individuals who get meaning from a single purpose, like work. This is usually us blokes as we are primarily defined by our role and function e.g. our job. The social/spiritual dimension of most blokes often goes unexplored, and as blokes we just don't talk about issues close to our heart:
- individuals whose role is threatened;
- individuals who are passionate about their role;
- individuals whose security is threatened.

Research tells us that half the population will take change in their stride having little or no effect on their wellbeing. The other half of the population will be affected, and the percentage affected can be broken down into the following categories:

- 20% showing stress signs for up to six weeks (is this normal?)
- 20% showing stress signs for up to 12 months;
- 10% showing profound affects (chronic trauma distress unresolved).

If we fit into one of the 20% or 10% categories, we need to seek support and have a chat to someone about our distress. It may be through our EAP (Employment Assistance Program), doctor or private counsellor and/or involve talking to a mate (close friend or a family member). Vocational wellbeing is extremely important because we spend a majority of our time at work. Some points we may want to consider before making decisions on the work we do, or making a change are:

- be happy and enjoy what we are doing;
- be passionate about what we are doing;
- keep the work life balance right;
- keep growing our experience, it's never complete.

Coping with change in our life is a daily event, sometimes not all the changes are good, especially around bureaucracy. To thrive we must work at it and even though it is challenging at times, the process of change often gives us new skills, increases our capacity and flexibility in life and guite often sends us off in a direction that we would never have allowed ourselves to go.

CRANA Notes

Mal Roberts remains on as a Hon Advisor and speaks for the CRANA members or any indigenous person under authority but has no official financial management or voting powers.

Information and Clarification:

- a) What is a Certificate of Aboriginality? Proof of Aboriginality and decent, and who qualifies and who is qualified to issue this certificate?
- b) Some awareness which is based on aboriginal law (customary law based on 60,000 years of traditional culture)
- c) Firstly, the applicant and their ancestors must have 3 to 4 generations of connections to their roots e.g. Some in Beverley, if you qualify, must provide to the local elders here in Beverley.
- d) Nevertheless, customary traditional law states that the local elders decide who is a person of Aboriginal decent and their ancestor's connection. Once the elder (local) decide and agree the chosen elder authorises Mal Roberts to prepare and issue the Certificate, signed by the president of CRANA and witnessed by Mal Roberts. This is done authorisation as it is a legal document. For employment or sporting bodies this certificate is a requirement.
- e) Note: Mal Roberts has discussed this matter with the Minister of Indigenous Affairs office; that the local aboriginals decided who is an aboriginal person and not the government or any minister of the crown.

Mal Roberts is currently trying to finalise matters with Shine Lawyers and keeps in touch regularly.



What's bugging my *Pittosporum*?

Speckled sap suckers

With summer just around the corner, it's time to look out for these notorious, native bugs on your Pittosporum plants: Pseudapines geminata or the 'Pittosporum bug'. These bugs are come from a large family of shield bugs called Pentatomidae. As their common name suggests, these speckled sap-sucking insects feed primarily on Pittosporum plants but occasionally love to munch on our very own native bluebell creepers and Rottnest Island pine.

Pittosporum is a genus of flowering shrubs native to Australia, New Zealand and some parts of Asia and South Africa. Despite each Pittosporum plant species usually having a shield bug species that is specific to them, the most common Pittosporum bug species we see around in WA is Pseudapines geminata across all Pittosporum plant species.

Did you know?

The relationship between the Pittosporum bug and its Pittosporum host plant is complex and

symbiotic (meaning a close, long-term biological interaction between two different organisms). The wingless nymphs (juvenile form) of these bugs resemble the black sticky seeds of the Pittosporum plant, which also serve as an important food source for the nymphs and adults. When the shield bugs are predated upon by birds, these seeds stick to the birds and are carried away, aiding seed dispersal and subsequent propagation of the Pittosporum plant! In cases of insects mimicking their food source (seeds), the bugs that most resemble the seeds are harder to find by the predators and therefore will not be eaten.

Critter Control - If Needed

Pittosporum bugs can quickly build up to large numbers and cause serious damage to your Pittosporum shrubs if not controlled early. With regards to control, there are several organic options which target these sap-sucking insects including pest oils and soaps, however for severe infestations, a systemic insecticide may be needed to get them under control.

Got unfamiliar pests bugging your plant? Take photos, record the plant species and report it!

Many of her paintings have sold and are held in private collections in USA, Barbados, Northern Cyprus, the UK and here in



Beverley Tree & Garden Society

The October meeting was largely given over to plans for the Rose Show. By the time this issue is printed, the show will have been held and winning exhibitors awarded. Full results will be in the next issue. Several of our members rolled up their sleeves for a busy bee at the Dead Finish TREE & GARDEN SOCIETY museum garden resulting in a good tidy up. Thank you to all who assisted.

The next meeting will be held at 10.30am on November the 9th at the Dead Finish and will include our AGM.

The hot weather is upon us with a few showers in between and there is lots to do in the garden during November.

Vegies to plant in November include - beetroot, capsicum, cucumber, pumpkin, lettuce, sweet corn, tomato, zucchini, radish, spinach and spring onion.

Flowers to plant in November include – alyssum, marigolds, petunia, portulaça, sunflower, salvia, calendula, lobelia and impatiens.

November is a great time to attend to the following tasks in the garden:

- Plant fast growing leafy green every 6 weeks for continuous cropping
- Lift and divide chive clumps to increase stock
- Tip prune Passionfruit to promote flowers and fruit that form on new growth
- Trim daisies to remove old flowers
- Dress roses with a 5cm layer of well rotted cow or chook manure to feed and condition the soil for summer growth
- Prune old or tatty canna stems to ground level
- Dead head roses so they put their energy into producing new blooms
- When there are just 4 or 5 green leaves left on the stem, your garlic is ready to be dug up
- Harvest sweetcorn when the silks are brown and the kernels seem plump and emit a milky fluid when squeezed
- Plant silverbeet and rainbow chard as a gap filler, even in your ornamental garden
- Fluctuations in soil moisture can cause root vegetables and fruit to split
- Sweet potato loves the heat. Buy a tuber and plant it. Trim off the runners into 20cm lengths and plant the cuttings

Enjoy your time in your garden in November.

The 'Beverlettes' Marching Girls squad



In June 1957 a Beverley Marching Girls squad formed as a result of discussion at a P & C Meeting: -a senior team for girls aged 14 and over, and a junior team for girls aged 12 to 14. The Headmaster of the Junior High School, Mr Bill O'Callaghan, undertook the training. They had to raise money for uniforms and until then they wore their hockey clothes. Their first public appearance was at the school sports day where their display included precision marching involving many intricate movements.

The 'Beverlettes' uniform of bright pink blazer & cap with white pleated skirt, white boots and gauntlets was admired when they marched in complete uniforms in February 1958 down Vincent St from Dawson St to Forrest St. Motorists were asked to give the girls plenty of room for their manoeuvres. Later that year they made their first appearance at the Beverley Annual Agricultural Show.


By 1959 there were four teams of Marching Girls - Seniors, Juniors, and two Midgets - led by Nancy Tobin, Beryl Jones, Roslyn Winfield and Maureen O'Callaghan. Their demonstration at the Beverley Show, was received with enthusiasm with special applause for the 'Tiny Tots'.





A Carnival at Midland Junction in November 1959 enabled the team to compete against city squads. Beverley was the only country team at the carnival. The Beverlettes made appearances at Beverley Anzac Day Parades and appeared at an indoor venue for the first time at an Entertaining Musicale in the Beverley Town Hall in July 1961.

A blazer owned by Denise Strange (nee Boyle) is on display at the Dead Finish Museum.
