DISCOUNT ON RATES 2022/23.

It is important to note and remind everyone that the method of providing the 10% discount on rates for the 2022/23 financial year <u>has changed</u>. For ratepayers to take advantage of the 10% discount, rates MUST be paid 21 days from the date of issue of the Rates Notice.

Previously, the date for the 10% discount coincided with the same date the rates were due and payable which remains at 35 days from the date of issue.

The exact dates for the discount will be provided in the August Blarney.

Planned Upgrade to the Swimming Pool and facilities.

In 2018 the Shire commissioned a feasibility study regarding the community's desire for the future of the pool and in 2020 final designs were completed regarding the upgrade of the swimming pool. Quantitative Surveyors costed the design at \$7,000,000. In 2022, the Shire revisited the cost for planning purposes and were advised that under the current economic conditions the total cost of the project had risen to \$11,750,000. With inflation currently at 7% in WA and showing no signs of changing, it can only be expected that costs for this project will continue to escalate.

We would have to acknowledge that this cost is prohibitive for the Shire and community and certainly requires a complete rethink on how to update our swimming pool and facilities. There are obviously going to be some hard decisions to be made.

When community pools were built in the 1960s, the need was obvious and over these 60 years many in the Beverley community enjoyed the pool and surrounds. Unfortunately, today, attendances have dropped markedly and continue to do so year by year. It then begs the question; "What does Beverley need as a Pool/Water Park?" And, one that can be financially afforded?

It would seem that the preference in the community is to maintain a 50-metre pool. An integrity test of the bowl was undertaken in 2018 and while the contractor advised that it was in a good condition it could not be expected to remain so for another 60 years.

In 2015, Councillors and management visited a number of Shires who had recently upgraded their aquatic facilities and learned that the move had been made into a 'Water Park' concept where the emphasis was placed on facilities for children and youth with 'Beach entry' pools, sprinklers and overhead water fountains. 50-metre pools replaced with 25-metre pools. The only community which had maintained a 50-metre pool was Wagin.

The important factor in all of this is attendance. Whilst we don't have records going back further than 2014/2015, over these eight years the average attendance has been 6,531 of which 630 were spectators. This equates to about 36 per day.

Vincent Street Streetscape Project

Works in the Street are progressing but perhaps not as swiftly as some would like. Nevertheless, the footpaths are nearing completion on the north side of the Street and the light poles have been installed. These will be powered up soon but we require the services of Western Power to accomplish this.

The final sealing of the Forrest Street / Vincent Street intersection, the IGA carpark, the Figtree carpark, and Jutland Parade, are scheduled for completion early July.

Concreting of the footpaths on the southern side of the Street is also scheduled to begin in early July (2022 that is!) as is the kerbing here and in the IGA carpark.

Installation of Wombat Crossings, landscaping and street furniture to commence end July. Final seal for main street is scheduled at this stage for mid-August with final completion set for the whole project is scheduled for 26th August.

Community Grants

Another reminder to Clubs and Community Groups that the next round of Community Grants will be open in July. Grants have been heavily subscribed in recent rounds so Council will be looking for quality applications whose projects/events have maximum benefit to the applicant and community.

The Shire of Beverley will be conducting one day Bushfire Safety Awareness courses during the months of August, September and October for all Shire of Beverley Bush Fire Brigades (BFB) volunteers and anyone who may provide operational support to firefighters during fire emergencies. This course will be made available on Wednesdays during these months to be held at the Shire of Beverley Amenities Building on Forrest Street. Alternative days may be arranged should there be sufficient demand. Lunch and light refreshments will be supplied to course participants.




This course in the minimum training competency standard considered to be compliant with the new Workplace Health & Safety Act 2021. This will attempt to alleviate the implications of severe financial penalties (up to \$10 million dollars) and potential criminal charges that could be imposed upon the Shire should a health or safety incident occur during a fire emergency in Beverley. Along with minimum training requirements all persons attending active firegrounds will be required to meet the minimum dress standards of long trousers, long sleeves and boots. Volunteer BFB members are issued with Personal Protective Clothing that can be collected from the Shire when required.

If you are an existing Shire of Beverley BFB Volunteer please email your name and Brigade to the Shire's Community Emergency Services Manager (CESM) troy.granville@beverley.wa.gov.au to confirm initial registration.

If you wish to sign up to a Shire of Beverley BFB, (Avondale, Beverley Central, Beverley South East, Beverley North East, Dale/Kokeby, Dale West) please email your name to the same email address.

Once you are confirmed as registered with a Volunteer ID number we can organise for you to be enrolled on a particular date to attend the training course.

BFB members who are likely to crew a BFB fire appliance (Beverley Central 4.4, Beverley South East 2.4 or Dale West 4.4) will be required to complete an additional two day course known as Fire Fighter Skills and can apply for enrolment via email to the CESM.



Beverley Ag Museum News

'Wet' would be a descriptive word that could best describe the contents of the Museum Building on Saturday June 18 when we last met up, persistent rain with leaking gutters and roof (awaiting repairs) certainly did not help on a cooler day, but regardless our members came in numbers with increased enthusiasm towards the maintenance and restoration of the collection.

Although our Ag Museum was open to the public that morning we did not expect any visitors with the inclement weather, so it was a nice surprise when Richard Fisher came to visit and donated some of his own Workshop and Parts Manuals, many of which we have Items to match within our collection, this sort of information is vital for the proper upkeep of any machinery, okay some would say "see Mr Google" but that is not always convenient as many locals know with a



poor to non-existent Phone signal in the area, and like the Farm Machinery, books too have their place in our Wheatbelt history.

Bob was in no position to do much this time having just had surgery on his shoulder so no 'crank handles' for him, Paul was in 'full swing' and raring to go after a short break visiting his Mum in the UK, and with his more 'confident knowledge' of vehicle electrics he soon found the Starter Motor on the International C30 Truck to be faulty, well it is either that or the 6 volt battery needed 'pumping up'.

Kevin Lupton had visited previously and came along to assist us, his life's knowledge and experience with Farm

Machinery is well appreciated, having worked with many of the equivalent items we have. His first interest was the Field Marshall Tractor and getting 'her' started. Now there are two ways (3 if you want to Tow it around the paddock) of starting a Field Marshall, with a crank handle or with the assistance of a Hammer, now even with all the fuel/air leaks we still persisted, Eric and myself helped with the supply of fuel (it needs nearly half a tank just to bleed it) while Paul & John Hawke put a vigorous effort into the crank handle, and when Paul tried the Hammer method we did get a load bang and a puff of smoke, much to the excitement of members who may not have experienced this before, but sadly 'Close but no Cigar'.

After morning Tea and 'chewing the fat' we had one last attempt at the Field Marshall, and yes, it is on the 'to do list'.

It was past knock off time when Kevin (there is no stopping the man!) showed interest in the J Series Bedford Truck and its noisy water pump, so far, all efforts to buy a new Pump have been negative, but as it did not take long to remove it was decided to try and replace the bearing instead, being cast iron there is no corrosion like we see on many modern vehicle parts, hopefully we will be able to locate a new bearing or kit for it soon.

Hopefully the place will have dried out a bit before we next meet on the Third Saturday of the month (February to November) being July 16 between 8.30am and 12.30pm or even later maybe!



Cancer Council WA is encouraging people to guit alcohol for the month of July, in a bid to raise much-needed funds for the 13 11 20 Cancer Information and Support Line: a free service for all Australians affected by cancer.

Going dry for July is a great opportunity to look at how you can reduce your overall alcohol use. Alcohol is a cause of cancer; research shows that every year more than 3.200 cases of cancer can be attributed to alcohol use, such as mouth, pharynx, larynx, oesophagus, liver, bowel and breast cancer in women.

There is no safe level of alcohol use, as any level increases the risk of developing an alcohol-caused cancer. The more you drink.

and the more often you drink, the greater your risk. To reduce your cancer risk, the message is avoid alcohol.

Committing to the Dry July fundraiser is a great way to raise funds for an important cause. Our 13 11 20 Information and Support Line is a confidential service run by experienced cancer nurses and is available to those affected by or concerned about cancer. If the flags are up and there 'on duty' at the front door we are in the station or in the townsite of Beverley (not too far away) however, if there is 'patrol' on the door we could be on Brookton highway flint or as far as Mawson road, Mawson.

Beverley police have a huge area to patrol and cover and will try and assist everyone in a timely

manner.







WARRIOR WELLBEING ARTICLE Men's Sexual Health and Wellbeing

BY THE REGIONAL MEN'S HEALTH INITIATIVE July 2022

Now that I have your attention, please read on. Men's sexual health and wellbeing encapsulates three broad areas; it is about the physical (male reproductive system; our anatomy); mental (psychological wellbeing); and our social/spiritual wellbeing (effective communication, knowing ourselves, our identity).

What are some of the components that make up men's sexual health and wellbeing?

- What is sex?
- What is the prostate and its problems such as enlargement and cancer?
- · Erectile dysfunction.
- Infertility and testosterone deficiency.
- Testicular cancer.
- Sexually transmitted infections.

Now, because I'm a bloke I want to talk about a couple of bits that aren't discussed very often. The first point is sexual dysfunction in men. Because us blokes don't talk about sexual health in a holistic way there is a lot of myth and secrecy about what presents as normal sexual function. Quite often men boast about their sex life and/or the lack of it, but this is different from our overall sexual health. What is normal sexual health function?

There is some recent research which is a great guide in what may be normal regarding sexual function. Whether we want to believe it or not this is linked to age. It goes like this:

- In our 50's 50% of men are sexually dysfunctional.
- In our 60's 60% of men are sexually dysfunctional.
- In our 70's 70% of men are sexually dysfunctional.
- In our 80's 80% of men are sexually dysfunctional.

It is a normal part of ageing, and us blokes need to talk about it a lot more so it's not a great shock to us when it starts to happen. Is there more to life than sex and what is sex? It is a biological activity that all living creatures partake in, both to propagate the species and for enjoyment. The latter presents the biggest problem with human sex and that is males and females having different sexual needs (which can be challenging for some men). We can't have a positive sexual relationship without connection and intimacy.



To maintain a positive connection, the social/ spiritual aspects of our relationship require constant attention. This connection then allows everything else to fall into place.

Some important points to remember in relation to men's sexual health are:

- talking to your partner and your doctor is essential;
- suffering sexual dysfunction increases in men over 50 years of age;
- sexual dysfunction can be a sign of other diseases such as diabetes or heart problems;
- quite often the problem is a combination of physical, mental and social/spiritual wellbeing;
- try and maintain a health and fitness program.

A fun time for fungi

Fabulously fun fungi!

It is a fun time for fungus fans as the environment starts to become moist and humid – making it the perfect habitat for all sorts of weird and whacky fungi to grow in mulch, lawns, dead tree stumps, and on living trees. This is because the wet season and drop in temperature bring about environmental cues for fungi to start producing fruiting bodies (the mushroom or reproductive part of the fungus).

Fungi are active throughout the year as minute hyphae, hidden in mulch, soil and root systems. They help to break down organic matter, recycling and releasing nutrients for plants to access. The fruiting bodies only last for a few days to a week and will then decompose. The fungus may reproduce again as the winter progresses, or other varieties with different coloured and shaped fruiting bodies will grow in the same area.

Fungi are neither plants nor animals but make up their own highly diverse kingdom with thousands of species. Interestingly, almost every living plant has several fungi that it depends on to help collect micronutrients. In return, the fungi are paid back in sugars and other macronutrients for assisting the plant. This symbiotic relationship is so important that

some plants, such as orchids, won't grow without their fungi friends.


Not always fun...

Fungi are important for making foods like bread, cheese, natural colourings and beverages such as beer and wine. However, some fungi can potentially decimate food crops or kill humans and animals if ingested. So just because they can sometimes look like mushrooms from your local grocery store, it doesn't mean it is safe to touch or eat them - as they can contain fatal chemicals detrimental to human health! While some fungi are fabulous to look at, it is highly encouraged that you leave them where you find them - because their plant partners depend on them for growth and chemical regulation.

If you want to know what fungi you've found, take some photos and then search for fungi factsheets from the Department of Biodiversity, Conservation and Attractions (DBCA). The fungi search site is also available on www.anbg.gov.au/fungi/ and explore www.fungimap.org.au for further information on Aussie fungi, including their conservation. If you have noticed the presence of unfamiliar rusts or fungi associated with native plants or agricultural crops, please report your findings to us for biosecurity screening.

Remarkable Women of Beverley

The "Fastidious" Mrs Bennett and the three Misses Bennett

Mrs Theresa Ellen Bennett, a widow, and her three daughters, Ellen Alice, Hannah and Maggie, arrived in Albany from the Eastern Colonies aboard the steamer "Federal" in 1896. Her brother Walter Bartlett was living in East Brookton with his wife and family, which included Theresa & Walter's sister, Alice Bartlett. Getting to Brookton from Albany was easily accomplished as there was a daily train service.

MRS. BENNETT, VINCENT STREET, Washing, Ironing, Mending, Etc. REASONABLE CHARGES.

(It can be presumed that Mrs Bennett did not want to be a financial burden to her brother and endeavoured to find an income for herself and her daughters.)

By June 1905, Mrs Bennett and her daughters were residing in Beverley. In York's Eastern Districts Chronicle it was noted on 17 June 1905, that an Eating, Boarding and Lodging House License was granted to Theresa Ellen Bennett of Beverley

Then in July 1905 Mrs Bennett opened the Beverley Laundry in Vincent St, advertising Washing, Ironing, Mending, etc. at reasonable charges. However, they had a social and a commercial association with Brookton:

BACHELOR'S BALL. The Brookton bachelors have been for some time past organising a grand ball which duly eventuated on Friday evening last. A large number of invitations were issued, and there were altogether about seventy-five couples who attended. The hall was artistically decorated, and when everything was in full swing the spectacle presented was most gay and brilliant. The catering by Mrs. Bennett, of Beverley, was all that the most fastidious could desire, and viewed from every aspect the ball was an unqualified success. The music was supplied by Mr. P. Neal, who was ably assisted by Misses Williams and Bennett, and Mr. A. Bartlett. (Beverley Times 30 September 1905)

In August 1906 the Misses Bennett announced, in the advertising columns of the Beverley Times, that they

had opened the Crystal Dining Rooms in Vincent St, where the wants of patrons would be well looked after. All meals at the popular price of one shilling. In December the same year, an Eating and Boarding House License was granted to Miss E A Bennett.

During these two years both Mrs Bennett and the Misses Bennett maintained their close connection to Brookton by attending many Brookton balls & dances and singing at concerts. Their dresses, as described in the newspaper, were always fashionable.

CRYSTAL DINING ROOMS. BEVERLEY.

THE MISSES BENNETT have opened the above Dining Rooms in Vincent-st., Beverley, where they trust to receive a fair share of public patronage.

ALL MEALS: ONE SHILLING.

In April 1906, Alice Bartlett, the aunt of the Misses Bennett, married W F Noack, a member of a local family. Miss Hannah Bennett was a bridesmaid. The bride was given away by her brother, Walter Bartlett. Mr J Bennett was the best man.

By February 1907, Mrs Bennett advertised she was now residing in Brookton, and it was her intention to apply for an Eating, Boarding and Lodging House License in the shop or rooms she now occupied in William St, which were owned by Miss H Bennett.


It was reported in 1911 that Mrs Bennett was having a new boarding house put up. Mrs Bennett's establishment was known as the Brookton Coffee Palace. In 1912, the license for this name was removed to new premises and Mrs Bennett applied for a temporary license for the Railway Coffee Palace, Brookton.

Then in December 1912, Ellen Alice, Mrs Bennett's eldest daughter was married in the Wesley Church, Brookton to Leslie Fletcher Jones (from Melbourne, but the brother of Mrs Bodey). Both sisters of the bride, Hannah and Maggie, were bridesmaids. The bride was given away by her uncle, Walter Bartlett. The wedding breakfast was held at the home of Mr & Mrs Bodey, local landowners.

In October 1914, Mrs Bennett was the defendant in the local court, being sued for non-payment of provision of building materials. Mrs Bennett's lawyer argued that the materials were not delivered. The magistrate ruled "a non-suit".

It seems as if the Bennett family moved away after this as no further mention is made of them in the newspapers. In 1920 Walter Bartlett disposed of his farm and opened a margarine factory in another district.

Conclusion: Mrs Bennett and the Misses Bennett, having to make their own way in the world, had the education, intelligence and the work ethic to use what domestic skills they had to make a living. They seemed to have a comfortable income, wore elegant clothes and presented individual gifts at family weddings. It helped that they had the support of close family. Career choices for women at that time were limited, but they worked hard and were able to buy property. They only resided in Beverley for two years.



The Feast of Saints Priscilla and Aquila is another cause for celebration. Within the life of the Church, they are

commemorated as the patron saints of marriage. Ss Priscilla and Aquila were a Jewish couple from Rome who had been exiled to Corinth. In the first century they hosted St. Paul on his visit to that city. They are mentioned in the New Testament in glowing terms by their friend Paul, "Greet Priscilla and Aquila, who work with me in Christ Jesus, and who risked their necks for my life, to whom not only I give thanks, but also all the churches of the Gentiles. Greet also the church in their house" (Romans 16:3-5a). They were tentmakers as was St Paul.

Priscilla was a woman of Jewish heritage and one of the earliest known Christian converts who lived in Rome. She is often thought to have been the first example of a female preacher or teacher in early church history. Aquila, husband of Priscilla, was originally from Pontus and was a Jewish Christian. According to tradition they were martyred in Rome on their return, probably around the same time as St. Paul.

Their ministry will be celebrated on Sunday, 10th July at 10.30 a.m. at St Mary's Church.


