Conclusion to 2022

So, we come to the end of another calendar year. For the community it marks the conclusion of one of the largest infrastructure projects undertaken by the Shire being the Vincent Street redevelopment. At this time, I think it useful to also reflect on the past eleven years where the Shire Council has undertaken a number of significant projects of which Vincent Street marks the conclusion.

- 1. Additions and renovations to the sporting complex at the oval including the construction of new netball courts (to which the Netball Club contributed significant funds). The playground also extended beyond its initial establishment.
- 2. The construction of two Independent Living Units in Dawson Street.
- 3. The construction of the Cornerstone Building which houses the Community Resource Centre, Visitor Centre, Library, Day Care Centre, and four leased offices.
- 4. The installation of solar panels on both the Shire offices and the Cornerstone building.
- 5. The construction of the Moort Wabiny Park which incorporates numerous activities for our youth.
- 6. Reroofing the Town Hall and Lesser Hall and the replacement of the flooring in both halls.
- 7. The complete renewal of the kitchen in the Lesser Hall.
- 8. Installation of new doors in each hall as well as the replacement of the Stage curtain in the Town Hall.
- 9. The re-roofing of the Old School building.
- 10. The re-roofing of the old Courthouse building and the establishment of a gymnasium within.
- 11. The construction of six cottages near the caravan park comprising three two bedroom and three one bedroom units.
- 12. Water Harvesting Project led by the Community which has reduced reliance on scheme water.
- 13. Other projects include: industrial land project, footpath renewal and extension programme, solar panels on the Ram Shed for the Pool, and resealing the runway at the airstrip.

In all, these projects, including the Vincent Street project, undertaken by the Shire over the past 11 years have cost a total of about \$16 million. Funding has largely come from State and Federal Grants as well as Lotterywest and the RAC. Shire contributions have come from Reserves and Loans.

Future Projects

Other projects envisioned for the future include:

- 1. The redevelopment of the swimming pool.
- 2. The redevelopment of the Avon River Park including work of the River Pool.
- 3. Acquisition of the Nurses Quarters and potential collaboration with the Health Department to build housing for Nurses

Of these, the swimming pool is the most problematic. The plan for the redevelopment was costed at \$6 million on inception but revised to \$11.6 million in 2021. Notwithstanding though, the real issue is going to be the economic situation that may present from 2023 onwards and the ability of the Shire to deliver.

Western Australian Heritage Awards

As part of the Vincent Street redevelopment, investigation went into establishing an Heritage Trail along Vincent Street to highlight the various heritage buildings. This project was nominated for the Western Australian Heritage Awards for 2022. There are seven categories in these awards and the Beverley nomination came under the 'Heritage Tourism Project' category.

To become a finalist in these awards is an achievement in itself as there are quite a number of nominations from which the finalists are selected. We were pleased to learn that we were one of the three finalists in our category.



Our peak tourist season in Beverley has come to an end, but there is still plenty happening behind the scenes to promote Beverley.

In collaboration with Destination Perth and our partnering Avon Valley Shires strategic marketing campaigns have been conducted throughout the year. These include print advertising in the West Australian and The Australian Traveller magazine. Additionally, a campaign ran over 9 weeks on Transperth buses to increase the awareness of the Vintage and vibrant Avon Valley brand that was launched in April this year.

The new 'Vintage and Vibrant' branding features in the Hello Perth Map that was produced for the Caravan & Camping Expo earlier this year which unfortunately did not go ahead due to covid restrictions. All is not lost as the map is displayed throughout the state including at the airport when visitors arrive to Perth and the 2023 Expo is scheduled for March where the Avon Valley will be on show.

A new holiday booklet for the Avon Valley is being compiled by Scamper Designs. Again, Destination Perth have guided this creation and will include our Avon Valley neighbours York, Northam, Toodyay and Goomalling too. To ensure that the imagery across the Avon Valley is consistent Destination Perth facilitated the engagement of an internationally published photographer to take spectacular images across the region to be used in the publication. Thank you to the Beverley Soaring Society, Freemasons Tavern and our local 'talent' who assisted the photoshoot providing meals, flights and more.

There have been some additions to our trail offerings in the Shire with the new Vincent Street Heritage Trail installed in the main street, which includes an app to guide you along the way. This fantastic trail has recently been nominated as a finalist in the WA Heritage awards! Also, the recently completed Dale River Reserve walk trails are now marked and ready for exploring – you may want to wait until after Summer though.

We are also currently working with the Beverley Early Years Network and Nature Play WA to bring a Play Trail to Beverley which will involve an appbased trail. The Nature Play trail will consist of locations in the town where the family will play a small game or activity to earn points. This Nature Trail is expected to be complete by Easter 2023.

Artists-in-Residence at the Station



BEVERLEY HISTORICAL SOCIETY presents A Rare Photograph

Some years ago (about 1997) a photograph of the Great Southern Railways locomotive BEVERLEY was found on the rubbish tip at Bridgetown. The CEO of the Shire of Bridgetown sent it onto the CEO at Beverley.

This was the first engine of that class in service (10 January 1889) on the Great Southern Railway and the photo shows all the staff of the company workshops in Albany who put the engine together after its arrival from England.

According to Rail Heritage WA, photographs of GSR locomotives with their nameplates are rare and this is the only known photo of BEVERLEY.

We have seen a photograph of the Locomotive "Beverley" taken by Mr. Otto, and as far as such a piece of mechanism can be made to look beautiful he has succeeded; it is a really capital photo.

Thank you to Beverley Men's Shed and good work by the road users passing through the Beverley townsite on 17/11/22.










The year is nearly over but there are still jobs to do in the garden during December before relaxing over Christmas.

Vegies to plant in December include – capsicum, eggplant, lettuce, tomato, zucchini, beetroot, celery and pumpkin.

Flowers to plant in December include – portulaca, sunflower, begonia, marigold, petunia, verbena, salvia and impatiens.

December is a great time to attend to the following tasks in the garden:

- Protect ferns from burning sun and strong winds. Maiden Hair ferns don't like to dry out at all
- Add mulch to outdoor potted plants to conserve water
- Watch for fungal diseases on roses and vegies. Help keep plants healthy by removing disease affected leaves
- Harvest leafy green vegies when the leaves are small and young and harvest often
- Bundle pots together for easier watering, especially if someone is looking after your garden while you are away
- When harvesting Basil, take a bit from each plant rather than stripping one. Pinch out tips to encourage lots of new growth
- Cover your worm farm with damp hessian to keep it cool and shaded
- Keep an eye on any new plantings. Nursery plants are constantly watered so you need to give new plants extra water until their root system has established
- Check irrigation systems to ensure they are all working properly, with all spray heads and drippers running freely
- Top up mulches to reduce moisture loss and moderate soil temperatures during summer. It also helps to suppress weeds
- Ripen green tomatoes by placing them on a sunny window sill

Enjoy your time in your garden in December.



Work/Life Balance - Strike it Right

How many times have we heard the phrase getting the balance right; what does this even mean? If we look up the word balance in the dictionary we will find 18 definitions, depending of course on the way in which the word is used. The context of a work/life balance also depends on individual circumstance and attitude; whether we are single or married, studying, self-employed, contracting, FIFO, caring for someone or raising a family.

To assess if we have a healthy work/life balance, firstly identify the prominence of work in your situation and how do you define work? Does it challenge/drive you, is it enjoyable, does it provide a sense of satisfaction/purpose or is it just a means to an end? Let's be realistic and honest, for most of us if we don't work, we don't get paid, if we don't get paid, we can't live the life we want or do the things we enjoy. It's always a bit of a mix and getting the balance right is important.



The *life* side of things for most of us is usually enjoying some form of interaction with others. This can happen through our hobbies, sport, children, family, religious congregation, social and community groups, or by volunteering (ironically work can also provide interaction with others).

The best fit when considering *work/life balance* is to have these two areas *well-proportioned and harmonious*. It's important for us blokes to remember that there is more to our lives than just our jobs and we must be encouraged to invest in the other areas of our lives.

This work/life balance can be disturbed when we are under pressure or feeling distressed by events in our life. It is common for blokes to disengage from others and try to solve problems and deal with stressors alone. Unfortunately, by doing this we remove ourselves from valuable support systems, which in turn creates and exacerbates feelings of loneliness and isolation. It's important to remember during difficult times to maintain and re-engage with social opportunities as this is a significant part of positive mental health, coping and overall wellbeing. Something as simple as taking time out, talking, having a laugh with others and even if we are busy, making time to have that game of bowls or connecting with our kids or partner, is essential to get the work/life balance back on track.

Having a busy life may lead us to feel that there is more to do than what seems reasonable in any given day. We all get equal measures of time, there is 24 hours in a day for everyone. Why then, is it that for some of us 24 hours never seems enough, while others seem to have plenty of time? Perhaps we need to ask ourselves *is time the problem, or is it our ability to manage our time*? How much we have on our plate varies throughout the year, so we need to be aware to continually monitor our time to ensure that for most of the year we have a well-proportioned and harmonious work/life balance.

Christmas beetles

'Tis the season

As they're often abundant in mid-summer, these beautiful beetles have been dubbed 'Christmas beetles', and now is the season to see them.

Christmas beetles are a type of scarab, belonging to the family Scarabaeidae, which also includes dung beetles and cockchafers. Like other scarabs, Christmas beetles (genus *Anoplognathus*) are large and chunky and are somewhat noisy and clumsy fliers. Most species of these beetles are 2-3 centimetres in length. They are slightly flattened in shape and come in a variety of colours including metallic browns, greens, yellow/gold and pinks. There are 36 species in the genus with all but one unique (endemic) to Australia.

Naughty but native (and nice)

The beetle's larvae are white curl grubs and feed on the roots of grasses and decaying organic matter. The adults generally feed on *Eucalyptus* leaves. They prefer open woodland to forest and thrive in pastures wherever trees have been retained.

Some species are economically important pests of eucalypt plantations, while others are implicated in the decline of mature trees in some NSW

Report suspect pests



MyPestGuide™ Reporter via app or online mypestguide.agric.wa.gov.au landscapes. However, over the last century, anecdotal evidence of a decline in Christmas beetles has been compelling, with the Australian Museum attributing the decline to habitat loss.

In WA, Christmas beetles aren't often reported as pests, except in farmland, where eucalypt trees are scarce. This makes tube stock, saplings, and young trees more vulnerable to the appetites of Christmas beetles, which can form dense masses over the foliage. This is near impossible to prevent, and treat, but the larger the size and number of trees the better the trees' survival. It's also hard to blame them for eating too much at Christmas!

If you have a native garden with *Eucalyptus* species or next time you walk through some native bushland, keep an eye out for these living ornaments, decorating (and nibbling) the trees.

We hope you have enjoyed learning a few things on the variety of insects, weeds, and diseases we have profiled this year.


