SHIRE OF BEVERLEY PRESIDENT'S REPORT



Roadworks and Bridges

Prior to the recent storm, the Council had a number of bridges that had reached a stage of needing attention. Funds to attend to these are only available through the Commonwealth and State Governments.

Since the storm, major damage has been caused to various roads within the Shire with culverts washed away and severe washouts being left. A review by Shire staff has determined that the total cost to repair these roads is of the order of \$3,000,000. Applications have been lodged to have our area declared a disaster area so that the Shire can qualify for emergency funding from the State and Commonwealth. Unfortunately, this process is complex and time consuming and the Council is not able to provide a timetable for when these repairs will be carried out. The urgency is acute as many residents who travel these roads will be aware.

As a result of this funding issue, the bridge on Talbot Road which was marked for replacement and was due to be carried out in the next financial year, has been put on hold by Main Roads. The original estimate to replace this bridge was \$2,700,000 but Main Roads reviewed the estimate to \$6,000,000 based on similar projects currently around the State.

While many in the community might think the Shire is dragging its feet in having all these repairs carried out, I can assure you we can only work within the bureaucratic framework created by the State and Commonwealth and sadly, it is not underpinned by speed.

I would like to conclude by sincerely thanking all those community members who helped the Shire in clearing roads and debris generally to enable roads to be opened in such a quick timeframe. Such assistance is unique to our communities and greatly appreciated.

The Workforce

Since the Covid years, employers throughout Australia have come against the shortage of people able or even willing to come back into the workforce. At the Shire, this has shown up in difficulty locating plant operators and gardeners. I would like to thank those former employees who have come out of retirement to fill vacancies and help out in the short term.

As of writing we are pleased to have been able to engage two people to work in the gardening team and two plant operators.

Integrated Planning

In the previous month's report, I gave notice that the Community Strategic Plan was now due for review and renewal. This process begins on Wednesday 26th April with Council engaging Mrs. Caroline Robinson to begin the process. Further community engagement will be on the following date: Thursday 8th June @ 6:00 pm in the meeting room at Cornerstone, but please check with the Shire website, Facebook, and electronic notice board outside the Cornerstone.

Fairbridge Festival

The Committee of the Fairbridge Festival recently visited Beverley to asses our capacity to stage the event. We have been notified that we are now on a short list of four.





Design & Technology Term 1 Year 4

This term, Year 4 students were tasked with the team challenge of designing and building a house. The house needed to be able to withstand wind and rain and could only be made using recycled household products; and what a fantastic job they did.

These creative thinkers worked together to provide innovative and practical solutions to the challenge. Our Year 4s were put to the test, allowing them to flex not only their creative muscles, but also their practical thinking skills.

The design process included developing ideas, planning production steps, and evaluating their project plans and strategies. Before students could commence building, they also needed to examine the properties and characteristics of the materials they were choosing and think about this in relation to stability and purpose. They were required to examine ways to join, connect and assemble components that would ensure success.

After models were completed, designs were then put to the test in a rigorous practical exercise which utilised the forces of nature, or more practically, a garden hose and blower vac, to simulate storm conditions. Although some homes were damaged, most homes were able to withstand the storm.

After the 'storm' students reflected on how well their design met the challenge criteria while also evaluating their design's function and aesthetic qualities. Students performed exceptionally during this exercise. They all displayed great team spirit, working well, and encouraging all members of the class, not just those in their team. I am very proud of everyone's efforts and all students should be congratulated on a job well done.



A Look at the Beverley Repertory Club

The Beverley Repertory Club began in September 1938 following a meeting in the Town Hall lounge. The election of officers resulted as follows - Patrons: Mr J Mann, M.L.A. and Mr G L Weaver. President: Mr G Hickey. Secretary and Treasurer: Mr L C Duffield. Press Agent: Mr A L Oliver. Casting Committee: Mr E M Gulliver, Miss I Coe and Mesdames G L Weaver and T. W Ward. Wardrobe Mistress: Miss J Miller. Social Committee: Mesdames S Crisp, R L Duffield, T W Ward and W Eyles. Music Committee: Mesdames Crisp and R P Hodgson, Miss Gwen Broun and Mr W C S Gifford. The annual subscription was fixed at 2/6.

The club was very active – holding social evenings every month and putting on performances several times a year. Shows included one-act plays, full length offerings and musical items. The first performance in September 1938 was a 3-Act Comedy "People in Love". The club went into voluntary recess during WW2 reopening in 1946. In 1947 the club assisted in the organisation of a "Search for Talent" in the Beverley Town Hall that was broadcast live to air on the Whitford Broadcasting radio stations 6PM in Perth & 6AM in Northam.

A variety of plays were chosen including those written by Noel Coward, George Bernard Shaw, Ivor Novello, JB Priestly & Phillip King. Over the years a propensity for choosing English "drawing room" comedies was criticised by the Editor of the *Beverley Times* (see below)

Repertory Play

A cast of ten Beverley, Repertory Club members gave an adequate interpretation of the Ivor Novello play, "Full House" before large audiences at the Town Hall on Tuesday and Thursday of last week. There were good individual performances by members of the cast and any failure of the piece to arouse the audience to any pitch of enthusiasm was due rather to the vehicle chosen rather than its interpretation.

Play patrons have perhaps had a surfeit of English drawing room comedies. In these days of strong competition from television and other sources Repertory must tackle something with more impact if it is to justify itself. We have had instances right here in Beverley that the talent is available.

In an important role, newcomer, Thelma Rollo acquitted herself well whilst Mary-Weaver, who produced the play in association with Warren Eayrs, and Leslie Barrett-Lennard gave praise-worthy performances. Making his debut before a local audience Gerard Hodgkinson, in a Jewish role, remained in character throughout and his playing was one of the best things of the evening. Another newcomer to the boards was Raymond Priest whilst others of the cast were -Andrew- and James Williams. In the role of servants of the Household (what would an-English play be without a servant or two about the place!) were Kaye Schleicher and Kevin Paulsen. Graeme-Prideaux was another of the younger members of the cast to do well.

The dressing was a feature of the production. During the intervals Mrs-Hodgson and Mr. S. Efford played extracts from Novello's "The Dancing Years". Other of the credits listed were: Decor, Joy Atkins; Evening Gowns, Joy Atkins; Scenery, Dean Barnsley; Properties, Warren Eayrs, Ian Melrose; Kevin Dear,' Robin Goulder; Lighting, Grahame Ford; Make-up, Esther Efford.

The repertory club took this constructive criticism to heart and a year later had outstanding success with a one-act play by a New Zealand writer, Jean Laurence.



Beverley Times reported, Friday 15 September:

"Pity, My Betrayer" is a drama, the scene of which is the interior of a main room in a poor mill hut in New Zealand. This is not a play about the colour bar but about the tensions that stem from incompatibility, and the snobbery of heredity and race. Clare Hanare (Therese Safe) is an English girl married to Jim, who is a quarter-caste Maori (W. O'Callaghan). Their child Kit (Pauline Safe) is shunned at school because of her part Maori blood, and a poignant situation develops concerning her relations with the other children. Rex O'Reilly (Brian Pearse) self-assured, easy-going manager of the mill tries to break down the resistance

of Clare Henare after she has admitted that her marriage to Jim is a mistake. Jim comes home from the "back bush" slightly drunk. On his way to the mill hut he has heard from Mrs. Collins (Mary Weaver) that Rex O'Reilly has been visiting his wife during his absence. He arrives home feeling rejected and unwanted and just drunk enough to be belligerent. The tension that builds up, and the final denouement has all the elements needed for good theatre.

Repertory Club Scoops Pool

Remarkable success attended the Beverley Repertory Club players when they went to Narrogin on Saturday last to compete in the Great Southern Drama Festival in which clubs from three other centres (Narrogin, Williams and Pingelly) competed. The plays were presented before a packed audience at the Narrogin Town Hall.

Beverley scooped the pool, winning all awards. The play presented, Jean Laurence's "Pity, My Betrayer", was adjudged the best offering of the night, and Mrs. E. Efford won the award for the best production. The best actress award was shared by Mrs. T. Safe and Miss Pauline Safe (daughter of Mr. and Mrs. J. Safe) and the best actor was Mr. Brian Pearse.

It is unusual for one Club to take all awards at such gatherings and is a striking testimony to the high level of the talent available in Beverley.

The Beverley Times commented on Friday 29 September 1961:

It was Repertory at its best and a triumph for all concerned in the production. Jean Laurence's New Zealand play of racial prejudice called for acting ability of a high order if it was to succeed.

As the English girl married to a quarter cast Maori, Therese Safe came up with a piece of sustained acting of the highest order whilst Pauline Safe's performance as the schoolgirl daughter of the union was an impressive and sometimes moving one. The other woman member of the cast was Mary Weaver who took over the role of the garrulous Mrs. Collins at short notice and with much success.

Brian Pearse's performance as a mill manager was adjudged at Narrogin as the best performance on the male side of the cast. He was most effective but without detracting from the merits of his performance he was, in our opinion (at Beverley at any rate) shaded by Bill O'Callaghan as the part-Maori, Jim Hanare. Much depended on the latter's handling of the climax and in this he revealed histrionic ability of a high order indeed.

The Beverley Repertory went into recess in 1967, briefly revived in the late 1970s but was wound up in the 1980s.

Beverley Garden & Tree Society

The April meeting of the Garden The April meeting of the Garden club was held at the Dead Finish Museum after a two hour Busy Bee where we followed up on our previous work. We now have most of the garden under control and ready for winter rains. We will continue to do maintenance work prior to some of our meetings.

The May meeting has been cancelled but we will visit Grant Hobbs's garden on Thursday the 4th of May. We will meet at the Dead Finish at 9.30am for anyone who wishes to car pool or needs guidance to Grant's home. After visiting Grant's garden we will have a cuppa at Linley's home.

There couldn't be a better time for gardening than in May. There is still time for plants to become established before the really cold weather hits us.

Vegies to plant in May include - broad beans, broccoli, cabbage, cress, spinach, lettuce, onion, radish, shallots, spring onion and strawberries.

Flowers to plant in May include - cornflower, pansy, poppy, stock, statice, viola and calendula. May is a great time to attend to the following tasks:

- Lift and divide clumps of native violets and replant in the shade. Keep soil moist.
- * Snap off the flowers of herbs to keep the tasty leaves growing
- Thin overcrowded fruit on apple, pear, citrus and plum trees so the remaining fruit can develop to full size and flavour
- If you have an area of persistent weeds, cover them with a thick layer of overlapping newspapers, then a 5-8cm layer of mulch over that
- Overcrowding of bulbs in containers can look really good so pack them in closer for maximum effect
- * Prune bottlebrush once autumn flowering has finished. Prune behind the flower heads
- * Now is the perfect time to plant coriander
- * Transplant any shrubs that are in the wrong spot or are being crowded out
- * Lift and dry garlic and onion once the leaves start dying
- * If you find aphids on new shoots, squash or squirt them off with a jet of water
- * If you have black spot on roses, remove affected leaves, avoid overhead watering and ensure good light and airflow around plants
- Move cold-tender indoor plants away from cold windows and cut back on watering in the cooler seasons
- * Fertilise a newly planted rose once it puts on about 5cm of new growth
- * Water citrus regularly as the fruit is maturing. A lack of water can cause fruit to drop before it reaches full size
- Add slow release fertiliser to pot plants
- * Give bulbs plenty of water while growing but stop watering when their leaves start to die
- Pumpkin is ready to harvest when the stalk attached to the vine starts to whither and change colour

Enjoy your time in your garden in May.

Beverley Ag Museum News

Although the Museum collection has numerous exhibits covering over 150 years of farming in the Wheatbelt region, we are extremely grateful to David Lillico for his recent donation of an Oxford Allen 'toe cutter' Scythe which is still in working order, powered by a Villiers Two Stroke engine, these units were produced by John Allen & sons of Cowley, Oxfordshire England between 1935 and 1973, they had a variety of implements that could be fitted to them including the standard triangular blade mower, (hence the nick name of Toe Cutters because they operated all the time the engine was running), other items that could be fitted were Rotating Brushes, Air or Water Pumps, Saw Blades (we have a similar example of such in the collection) and Hedge Trimmers, on a personal basis I can recall working on such a unit during my apprenticeship in the early 1970's. This is a very welcome contribution to the collection that will be located near the 'Widow maker' log cutter, ---never heard of it? Why not pay us a visit, see the Beverley Bulletin for opening times.

Our group met up again on Saturday 15th April, quite often I find myself forgetting jobs (both at home and at the Museum) we had previously discussed that needed doing, so I wrote a list this time which seemed to work well as it gave everyone an opportunity to choose rather than ask, often as you get older sometimes the 'files' in your mind are not always in the right place!

Naturally Paul continued his work with restoration of the International C30 truck, Bob and myself focused upon cleaning, sorting and improving the workshop area, a job that has been well overdue, while Eric made an excellent effort ensuring the back sliding door worked okay after the recent storms helped accumulate leaves and gravel into the door runners, he also made a good start to clearing away the long dead grass from the area. And a big thank you to Danny from the Shire for removing the fallen branch from near the door.

Many thanks to Phil at the National Trust for his help with organising a plumber to replace the outside tap and suppling a quote for a new water supply to the workshop sink, it is heartwarming to see so much progress with the maintenance of the building.

On Saturday the 22nd a group of Plein Air Painters came to Avondale Farm and utilised the Beverley Agricultural Museum as their base, not only enjoying the natural surrounds but also finding plenty of examples to paint. Naturally Moo, the resident Emu came to see what was going on, suddenly it was brushes down and mobile phones and cameras clicking, quite a celebrity is our Moo.


SERVICES AUSTRALIA "BLUE GUM TRUCK"

Influenza is a highly contagious disease.

The virus is spread through air or water droplets when someone coughs, sneezes or talks. These droplets can settle onto hard surfaces, e.g. doorknobs, so you can catch influenza from touching a contaminated surface with the influenza virus on it, and then touching your mouth, eyes or nose.

In most cases, someone with influenza will recover naturally within 2 to 7 days. If you have mild symptoms and are not at increased risk of developing severe illness from influenza, you should stay at home and rest until you are well.

Recommended treatment for mild to moderate influenza

Take paracetamol to help reduce fever and head and muscle aches.

Get plenty of rest - Stay home from school or work and avoid contact with other people. Drink plenty of fluids. Eat healthy food.


Wash your hands often, especially after coughing, sneezing or blowing your nose and before you prepare any food.

Use disposable tissues and immediately throw used tissues in the bin.

Cover your mouth when you cough or sneeze.

Clean surfaces and objects regularly such as doorknobs, keyboards, phones and toys.

If any community members are interested in local history and eventually helping on roster on Sundays, we are looking for new members and volunteers.






WARRIOR WELLBEING ARTICLE Understanding Stress

Stress is usually associated with not being in control of a situation or an environment leading us to feel uncomfortable in body and/or mind. It is a part of life and it affects everyone at one time or another. Stress is normal, a certain amount of stress energizes people consequently improving performance and efficiency.

When stress levels get too high, problems can develop and start to take their toll on our mental health, physical health and social/spiritual wellbeing, sometimes with dire consequences. At RMHI we refer to *situational distress* to explain those times in our lives that create extreme stress which can start from situations that are unresolved in our lives. If we are always saying things like I haven't got enough time, I must get this done before..., I'll never finish in time, I can't get anything done; we might be in danger of moving from stressed to being distressed.

It is important to remember that what might be stressful for some may not be stressful for others. We all deal with things differently and have different capacities to cope.



How do you currently cope with stress? Are your coping strategies healthy or unhealthy, helpful or unproductive? Many people cope with stress in ways that compound the problem.

Below are unhealthy strategies that may temporarily reduce stress but will cause more damage in the long run:

- · Sleeping too much;
- · Filling up every minute of the day to avoid facing problems;
- Withdrawing from friends, family and activities;
- Taking out your stress on others (lashing out, anger outbursts, physical violence);
- · Drinking too much;
- · Procrastinating;
- Overeating or undereating;
- Over analysing;
- · Smoking;
- · Using pills/drugs to relax;
- Zoning out for hours in front of the television or the computer.

Here are some tips that may help deal with stressful situations:

- Avoid the stressor. Learn to say no, limit time with those
 who stress you out (if possible), control your environment
 i.e. turn the news off if it makes you anxious, give the
 bookwork to the bookkeeper.
- Alter the stressor. Communicate your concerns i.e. Talk to a Mate®, ask for a behaviour change but be willing to also compromise, be more assertive, manage your time better.
- Adapt to the stressor. If you can't change the stressor, change yourself, look at the stressful situation more positively, will it matter in the long run? If the answer is no refocus elsewhere, set reasonable standards not perfectionism, look at all the good things in your life if feeling stressed out.
- Accept the stressor. Some stressors are unavoidable, in such cases accept things as they are. This can be difficult but easier than railing against an unchangeable situation.

Finding and creating ways to relax when you are stressed out will also help i.e. exercise, get a massage, listen to music to calm down and/or ... before it all gets too much ... Talk to a Mate®!! Most importantly if you feel you are not coping, despite your efforts to do so, we recommend a visit to your GP before you reach a crisis point.

Prohibited aquatic plants

Fret over these floaters

Keep your eyes peeled for aquatic plants such as Salvinia and water hyacinth – two highly invasive weeds that we need to report and eradicate from Western Australia. They have the ability to negatively impact our local ecosystems by outcompeting local species and reducing water quality.

The costs and efforts taken to remove these aquatic plants once they enter our environment are massive. They can impede water flow, increase flooding and erosion, block agricultural irrigation channels, create health hazards and displace natural vegetation. Some aquatic plants can even form thick mats to resemble groundcover, creating drowning hazards for people and livestock.

Salvinia, (Salvinia molesta), is a non-flowering, free-floating aquatic weed that has pairs of oval leaves connected by a horizontal stem. They have a multitude of hair-like structures on top of the leaves which split and re-join at the tips to form eggbeater like structures helping them to be buoyant. They produce vegetatively - meaning that even small stems that break apart can form entirely new plants.

Water hyacinth, (Eichhornia crassipes), is a notorious floating weed with large funnel-shaped lilac flowers that have 6 petals and a yellow centre.

These flower summer to early autumn. The leaves are hairless, glossy and have a spongey base that helps them to float. This weed can double in size in just two weeks via flower pollination, or vegetatively. They have submerged fruits that can carry up to 300 seeds each, and these 1 mm seeds can be viable for up to 20 years!

Don't get caught out!

These plants are sometimes advertised on platforms like Facebook Marketplace, Gumtree or other channels, but they're illegal to have in WA. Salvinia and water hyacinth are prohibited species under the *Biosecurity and Agriculture Management Act 2007* and cannot be sold, traded or cultivated. This also applies to several other aquatic plants including *Rotala rotundifolia*, water lettuce (*Pistia stratoites*) and Sagittaria (*Sagittaria platyphylla*).

You can be a responsible gardener and report any suspect illegal plant sales, or the presence of these declared weeds in the environment. Reporting options include the Pest and Disease Information Service (PaDIS), the MyPestGuide® Reporter app or webpage, or you can anonymously report an illegal agricultural matter on crimestopperswa.com.au or phone 1800 333 000. If you're unsure about the plant, report it anyway.







RAKALI / AUSTRALIAN WATER RAT (Hydromys chrysogaster)

The name Rakali comes from the Aboriginal language around the Murray Darling River System. Local Aboriginal names include Muriyya, Moytj and Ngurju in the SW of WA.

The Rakali is a large aquatic rodent that is highly adapted to its environment, has broad partially webbed hind feet to aid swimming, long, thick and muscular body and usually a white tipped long tail, that is just shorter than its body. It has a long broad slightly flattened face with long whiskers and small eyes, ears and nostrils sit high on the head. The dense water repellent fur is shiny, varies from slate grey to almost black above and white to orange below.

Behaviour:

Often the only sign of Rakali you will see are small deposits of the shells (feeding Middens) on logs and rocks located along the banks of rivers and pools where they carry their food to feed on larger prey. Their footprints can also be seen in muddy areas with distinctive imprints of their webbed back feet. They rest in nests built in hollow logs or at the end of burrows dug into riverbanks.

Friends Of The Dale River Continued

Habitat and Distribution:

The Rakali use riparian vegetation in the vicinity of permanent pools in rivers, lakes and dams of fresh or brackish water (including western parts of the Avon Wheatbelt) and also coastal marine environments.

Diet:

The animals are aquatic predators feeding on marron, gilgies, insects, fish and mussels. They sometimes also eat small mammals and birds when they can catch them.

Reproduction:

Rakali live for 3-4 years, are known to breed all year round but mostly from spring to late summer. Females are mature at 8 months of age, gestation is around 34 days and they have 3-4 young which follow the mother until they are independent at around 8 weeks.

Threats:

The population declines in Western Australia have been caused by habitat loss and degradation in the areas close to rivers. This has enabled both natural predators (snakes, birds of prey and quolls) and introduced species (foxes and cats) to place additional pressure on individual population. Water quality, changes in hydrology and climate change all impact populations and food sources of the species.

Management Actions:

Improving management of riverine vegetation and therefore water quality through activities like fencing and revegetation and leaving natural features like logs and rocks. Control of stock access to waterways and of introduced foxes, cates and rodents. Stop using harmful marron traps on private properties or ensure Rakali can't get into the traps.

On a catchment level reduce the inputs into the river from chemicals, fertilisers and sediment through improving land management practices.
