

SHIRE OF BEVERLEY PRESIDENT'S REPORT



Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Act, 2021

The Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Act (ACH) 2021 is scheduled to come into force on the 1st July, 2023. The previous Acts will be repealed (Aboriginal Heritage (Marandoo) Act 1992 and Aboriginal Heritage Act 1972). The new Act is designed in part, to recognise, protect, conserve, and preserve Aboriginal cultural heritage. This Act will affect all owners of land whose area exceeds 1,100 square metres.

There is much confusion over the operation of this Act. At the recent Central Country Zone Conference held in Dumbleyung on Friday 23rd June, a Departmental representative, Mr. Ben Harvey, gave a presentation on the important facets of the Act. While it was detailed, many questions from the delegates were not able to be answered definitively and many doubts remained.

From a Shire perspective, there are several areas that still need clarification. The Department is recommending the communities take any queries to their local Shires but after Friday 23rd the Shires themselves may not have sufficient information to provide the communities with a reasonable answer.

New Federal Government Funding Scheme.

The Commonwealth Government Growing Regions funding scheme recently launched was seen as a possible source of funding to begin work on the Swimming Pool. It was envisaged that the total redevelopment be staged with Stage 1 being an upgrade to the plant room, filtration system, main bowl access, children's pools, and concourse renewal.

Unfortunately, further information on this scheme has revealed that the scheme is based upon projects that have a regional focus; namely, several Shires working together to achieve a common project. On this basis, the swimming pool does not qualify.

Strategic Community Plan.

All relevant information is now with Mrs. Caroline Robinson who is working towards presenting the Plan to Council in July. I would like to thank all those who participated in this process with submissions.

Road Construction.

Council have agreed to contract out full construction works for Waterhatch, Mawson, and Morbinning roads in the 23/24 road programme. The three projects were advertised using WALGA E-quotes with a final decision to be made at the June Council meeting.

Local Government Elections.

Local Government elections are set for October 2023. Beverley Council will have three vacancies and for anyone interested in lodging a nomination, this will occur in August, 2023. There is a requirement that those wishing to nominate need to be aware that it is a requirement to complete a <u>free online induction course</u> which will provide a basic understanding of the functions and responsibilities of a Council member. This course will also inform the nominee of the laws governing the way a nominee should conduct their election campaign. This course is compulsory.



Pursuant to Clause 4(1)(a) of Schedule 2, Part 2, Division 2 of the *Planning and Development (Local Planning Schemes) Regulations 2015*, notice is hereby given of Council's intention to adopt a new Local Planning Policy – Beverley Airfield Precinct.

The objectives of the Local Planning Policy – Beverley Airfield Precinct are as follows:

- The Beverley Airfield Precinct Local Planning Policy aims to set the strategic framework for future spatial development of land uses within the Beverley Airfield Precinct;
- To provide for orderly and proper development within the Beverley Airfield Precinct;
- To provide guidance and development provisions for applicants seeking to construct aviation related infrastructure like hangars, etc;
- To provide guidance to Council and Council's officers when considering applications made under this policy.

Submissions are invited on the draft policy with all comments to be submitted to PO Box 20 Beverley WA 6304, within 21 days of the date of this notice.



UPDATE FROM THE FRAIL AGED LODGE COMMITTEE

[Alex Miles Lodge]

The Committee has had a busy year. As most of you know, we now have a backup generator in case of a major power failure and I must give thanks to generous donations from the Hospital Auxiliary committee, Sandy Dawson Concrete for donating the cement pad, and Karl Smith Beverley Electrical for all the extra work he did to install the generator.

Our next project is to put an atrium roof over the courtyard west of the kitchen. For this to happen, we employed an architect to plan the project. We have recently engaged a builder to do the work, which involves putting up an insulated perspex- type roof with all-weather blinds on the north and west sides. Our local committee hopes to have this project completed before the end of 2023. We will then upgrade the floor area to make it suitable for residents to use.

As a result of the 2019 Royal Commission into Aged Care in Australia, Commonwealth Government funds have been allocated for improvements at facilities throughout Australia. The Alex Miles Lodge is a beneficiary of a substantial amount of these funds. The project, to be managed by the WA Country Health Service [WACHS] will upgrade some of the facilities at the Frail Aged Lodge.

For example, the kitchen dining area will become a café-type environment with new flooring, kitchen cabinetry and wall tiles. A doorway will be created to connect the dining room with the newly enclosed courtyard.

All ensuite bathrooms will be upgraded with particular attention given to new vanities and fittings.

The lounge area will be repainted and new artwork installed.


Upon completion of these improvements, the Frail Aged Lodge Committee [local] funds will replace the carpets in the passageways with a product that meets the required Health Department standards.

So, there are changes to look forward to that will make the Alex Miles Lodge environment more homely and comfortable for the residents. The Health Department has not yet given a time frame for their project, but Zoe Lear HSM [Beverley Health Service Manager] and WACHS [Project Officers] will provide us with updates that we will share with the community.

We look forward to continued interest and support from the Beverley community.

Training is as always well attended, and for the next couple of months Major Trauma is the programme for Training. Knowing how to handle a patient with a spinal injury and transporting to hospital with these types of injuries. Let's hope we never have to use these skills. Also practicing splinting of a broken limb. Our crews are trained to deal with a wide and varied range of skills throughout the year. The Crews this year have been involved with attending Community Events such as Football, Pony Club & Motor Cross. For some groups they cannot hold an event unless they have an Ambulance and Crew on site for the duration of the event. Thanks to our untiring crew who regularly put up their hand to man these events during the day.

Sometime ago we had a map made up thanks to the help of the Beverley CRC showing where the AED's are in town, in the next few weeks will be placed around Beverley showing where they all are located and the accessibility to them. Thanks to the Shire for helping by placing them around Beverley.

Have you heard of THE FIRST RESPONDER?

Question - Do you know what the term means?

Answer :The St John WA Community First Responder program is a free service that aims to get defibrillators to cardiac arrest victims in the vital minutes before an ambulance arrives.



When a person unexpectedly collapses due to a cardiac arrest, bystanders may not know if there is a defibrillator close by. Organisations that are part of the St John Community First Responder program have their defibrillator location and a contact person registered with St John WA. This helps a defibrillator to be retrieved as soon as possible and applied to the patient in the time critical period before an ambulance arrives.

Contrary to popular belief, sudden cardiac arrest can strike any person regardless of age, gender or health status and approximately 33,000 Australians die every year from this condition. The single key contributing factor to improving survival rates of sudden cardiac arrest is the time taken to administer early CPR and defibrillation. Where CPR and defibrillation are administered within five minutes of an event, studies have shown dramatic improvements in survival rates.

How the CFR system works

In the event of a sudden cardiac arrest, the flow of events is:

- A person suffers a sudden cardiac arrest
- Bystanders call triple zero (000)
- An ambulance is dispatched
- The first responder is called by the St John Ambulance triple zero (000) call centre and deployed OR the caller is advised where the closest defibrillator is so that it can be retrieved
- The first responder carries out CPR and applies the defibrillator if necessary An ambulance arrives and paramedics take over the care of the patient

Benefits of becoming a CFS location:

The benefits of adopting the Community First Responder system in your organisation or community include:

- The knowledge that you will be playing a key role in helping to save lives in your local community or workplace.
- Peace of mind that a well-coordinated response plan to medical emergencies is in place.
- Being informed of incidents of cardiac arrest as they are happening.
- A direct communication link between your organisation and St John WA.
- Ongoing support and customer service.


Volunteering offers many incredible benefits and opportunities. Volunteers create, support, and sustain organisations delivering services and activities that are essential to our communities.

What Do You Do When Someone Close to You Is Struggling But Won't Seek Help?

I was speaking with a bloke not long ago, Joe, who was feeling really frustrated when trying to help a mate who was avoiding Joe's attempts at support and refusing to seek help, even though he was obviously in some emotional distress. As is often the case Joe felt powerless in this situation and asked how he might better approach things.

So, what do we do when someone close to us, often a friend or family member, won't seek help? How do we manage the sense of obligation we may feel or the emotions that come with this?



First and foremost, we must remind ourselves that we do not carry the responsibility for other people's health and wellbeing, they do! However, in the above situation it is important to try and understand the reasons why some people are less likely to seek help when it is needed. We need to recognise that often when people are in the middle of a tough situation, simply making a decision to admit something is wrong can be a difficult and daunting thing. It can take time for some people to become comfortable enough with their situation to then contemplate the idea of accessing help. For others, negotiating feelings of embarrassment and shame can be quite overwhelming.

I take my hat off to Joe because, like him, we all need to recognise our role as primary carers, that is, everyday people in the community actively supporting and looking out for our mates.

Whilst our intentions can be coming from a good place, trying to get someone to change or seek help can put more of a strain on your

friendship/relationship. Alternatively, simply avoiding the issue can foster stronger feelings of isolation and possibly result in the person becoming even more resistant. This can prove difficult when the time comes, and they are ready to reach out but may no longer feel comfortable with the idea of approaching you.

As difficult as these situations can seem, it is important to be there for people who are going through a tough time. You can do this just by letting them know you are available to listen when they need it and help when they do decide to reach out. In the meantime, you could take the opportunity to do a bit of research into what specialised local support options might be available, if required, such as a counsellor, financial/legal support or the GP, so you can be prepared and direct them when they do reach out. We also need to remind ourselves that the ability to listen effectively is one of the most important skills we can possess. Being a good listener can have a big impact on improving our relationships and helping others.

At the end of the day, it's also important to look after yourself. Setting clear boundaries is healthy and is all about understanding our limits. If you are starting to feel overwhelmed, talking to someone yourself can provide a good outlet and perhaps some insights into ways to manage the situation.

Most of the time, giving someone the space they need to arrive at seeking help is a good thing. However, if you do have concerns that someone is at imminent risk or danger to themselves or others, it is important that you act on this and seek professional help immediately. In these circumstances you may be worried about going against a person's wishes, but realistically most of us would rather deal with an angry response than a situation where the person we care about is seriously hurt or in trouble.



European wasp close of season



Entrance of a subterranean (underground) European wasp nest. The nest entrance is easily hidden amongst leaves.

The European wasp 2022-23 season has drawn to a close with 21 nests found and destroyed.

The optimum time to detect and locate European wasps (*Vespula germanica*) has passed. Traps have been cleaned and now is the time to reflect on another fruitful surveillance season. It is also time to say thank you to everyone across WA who adopted a surveillance trap, kept an eye out and reported anything unusual!

How did we go?

Nest numbers were much lower than last season; 21 compared to 53. Nest distribution indicates multiple areas of incursion across Perth, predominantly in and around industrial areas — which is typical of this hitchhiking pest. The nests detected did not show signs of 'overwintering', which means they were created this season. This is a promising indication that nests were not missed during last season's surveillance activities.

Public awareness and reporting remained strong. Residents, businesses, and local government all detected wasp activity in good time. This allows for nests to be found and trapping areas expanded where required. And finally, there have been no signs or reports of wasp activity since April!

Season highlights:

- 2,800 surveillance traps deployed across the Perth metropolitan region
- 75 regional traps deployed with 0 detections
- 171 new traps adopted by the community, bringing the total of 'Adopt a trap' subscribers to 1076
- 350 public enquiries, with 4 confirmed detections
- 21 nests found and destroyed across 6 Local Government Areas, all in the Perth metropolitan region
- the majority of nests were found in embankments of water sumps and drains
- a nest was located in a wood log at primary school playground – yikes!
- wasp flight paths were tracked to locate a nest on Perth Airport grounds
- no public injuries were reported from disturbing these cryptic and often hidden nests



The Church was built as a memorial to Henry Lukin of Haisthorpe. It was an imposing building with a high-pitched roof and decorative gable. The porch had unusual arched openings on either side.



From there ↑ the Beverley Historical Society members & friends ventured around to Northbourne Rd and the North Beverley school site **\Psi**which opened from 1906-1921.



A brief westward deviation provided a fantastic panorama from the top of Piccadilly Rd. Ψ



On to the East Beverley townsite at the corner of Dongadilling & Mawson Rds where a hall, a school & tennis courts once stood. Ψ



The hall was built in 1896 by local builder Thomas Davey and advertised for sale in 1963.





East Beverley School went from 1904-1923

School was held in the hall & later a school building was erected across the road. ▶



Across country to Morbinning Rd and Morbinning Hall Ψ for a morning cuppa.



The Morbinning school **♦** was located just past Ewert Rd. It operated from 1909 to 1914.



The school is typical of pre-WW1 buildings; made of weatherboard with tin roof. Chimneys indicate there was heating in the winter.



Down Ewert Rd to turn into the east end of Bally Bally-County Peak Rd for the County Peak School site. This plaque is almost in a ditch & is often obscured by long grass. ▶





County Peak school operated from 1910-1933. At the west end of Bally Bally-County Peak Rd is the site of the Bally Bally School. ▶



The old photo below was taken in the 1920s. The pupils have warm-weather clothes and everyone is waring a hat. The teacher is protecting her dress with an apron.





This school opened from 1914-1936 and is just a couple of hundred metres behind the Bally Bally Hall.

This old photo of the hall shows the telephone exchange that was attended twenty-four hours a day up until the 1970s. Operators lived in a nearby cottage & manually connected telephone users to each other by plugs on the switchboard.



We had a late lunch at the hall before returning.

Many thanks to members and friends who assisted in clearing the sites; to Mark Petchell for driving and to the Shire of Beverley for supplying the bus & access to the two halls.


AUSKICK
