#### New Election Regulations for Local Governments

Local Government Reform Legislation has now passed through the State Parliament and among the many changes are those to the voting method to be used from this year onwards.

It is known as 'Optional Preferential Voting'.

#### Optional Preferential Voting

With this new system you can still vote for as many or as few candidates as you wish <u>BUT IF</u> you wish to vote for more than one candidate YOU MUST NUMBER THE BOXES of the candidates for whom you are voting. DO NOT USE CROSSES, TICKS, OR ANY OTHER MARK. If you do, your vote will be invalid.

#### Budget 2023 / 2024

Against the back drop of higher than expected inflation, the Shire has endeavoured to maintain the same level of works programmes and community infrastructure as achieved in previous years. Inflation at about 7% in the March quarter is proving to be difficult to achieve this aim and keep any rate increase to a minimum.

Impacting on the rate setting process this year is the fact that the Valuer General has revalued most farming land by an average of 23%.

The Capital budget for 2023/2024 is approximately \$11,438,128 of which the cost to the Shire is expected to be approximately \$2,124,750. The balance is coming from Grants and Reserves. Among the projects planned for the forthcoming year are: upgrades to Shire owned buildings, road and bridge construction, purchase of a new community bus, and installation of new lighting at the airstrip.

The largest item proposed is work to the swimming pool complex. A formal development plan was costed some years ago at about \$5,000,000. While this cost was untenable, this estimated cost has now increased to about \$12,000,000. Nevertheless, this work cannot be delayed indefinitely as it will result in the complex becoming unsuitable for human use. (And to think that people once swam safely in the River!!) Therefore, it is proposed to enter into a staged redevelopment. Stage one includes a wet deck, disabled access, and a new pump room with associated plumbing and filtration. Budgeted at \$2,000,000, it is to be funded from Grants, Reserves, and a new loan of \$1,000,000.


The result is that Council has approved an increase of 5% for 2023/2024. This is against an average annual rate rise of 3.07% from the years 2012/2013. While this is higher than we would otherwise like, the fact is that unless the economy settles into something like normalcy soon, a greater rise next year cannot be ruled out right now.

#### <u>Annual Beverley Show</u>

I would like to conclude by acknowledging the work and effort by the Committee in organising and conducting this annual event. It is a great plus for Beverley as it draws so many visitors to our town and enables us to showcase all the benefits of living here. Well done and thank you. Remember Saturday 19<sup>th</sup> August.



Last month we had the article about First Responder in the Blarney, this month we have followed up on the article if you would like to install the App on your MOB Phone.

We wish to thank those who have supported the recycling of the cans and bottles at the sub centre, we have cashed them in and have received over \$200 so far. Clay and Linda instigated this at the sub centre and continue to look after the project.

Training has been well attended for July and crews this month have been focusing on burns and splinting of patients. Of course there is the usual banter along with the learning.

The Sub Centre have purchased two recliner chairs & a small table for the main hall, sometimes a Crew from another town come to Beverley and need a little relax time before they head home, so now we have 2 very comfortable chairs for them to relax in and the facilities for them to make a cup of tea or coffee. #### St John First Responder App

#### Help us find you in an emergency

We know that sometimes pinpointing your exact location can be difficult but when a situation is life threatening, every second counts. The St John First Responder App sends your GPS coordinates to the operator when you call Triple 000 for an ambulance, speeding up the time it takes to confirm your location and dispatch an ambulance.

#### Features of the St John First Aid App

The St John Ambulance First Responder App is an invaluable tool in an emergency situation. It offers users access to vital information, such as first aid instruction guides, location of the nearest medical centre and emergency department, as well as real time updates on emergency department waiting times and more.

Over 200,000 Western Australians have downloaded the app which also contains other resources, including:

- First aid instruction guides helping you to treat a range of injuries and illnesses.
- Defibrillator (AED) locator showing all the defibrillator locations near you.
- Upload the location of new defibrillator (AED) locations that aren't currently appearing on the app.
- Locate nearest medical centres and emergency departments including live ED waiting time information.
- Patient transport services information.
- · Your first aid course information and refresher reminder notices.
- First aid tips and special offers keeping you up to date with handy first aid information.

#### Help others in an emergency situation

The St John First Responder app allows qualified first aiders in Western Australia to sign up and become a registered first responder. If a nearby emergency occurs (in a public place within 500 meters), you will be notified and given the opportunity to assist until the ambulance arrives.

To become a first aid responder, you will need to provide evidence of having completed a first aid course within the last three years. Minimum qualification level of HLTAID001 Provide cardiopulmonary resuscitation. We now offer the ability to become a BASIC level first responder in the app, by uploading your Photo ID.

The St John Ambulance First Responder is a free app that is compatible with iPhones, iPads and android devices. It is available on <u>Apple's App Store</u> and <u>Google Play</u>. You can find out more about how to use the app in our <u>First Aid Responder App Guide</u>.

#### **Edwards Crossing & South of Beverley Historical Sites**

Members & friends ventured out on Monday 12 July to complete our tour of historical sites in Beverley. The first trading site in the Beverley area was at Edwards Crossing from 1850-1870.




The plaque notes the essential services available.



Nearby is a monument erected by the Edwards family in 2009 to honour pioneer farmers by the Dale River crossing, William & Eleanor Edwards. ◆











Just south of the town is the site of a lonely grave  $\uparrow$  that marks the burial place of Francis Joseph, baby son of Matilda & Joseph Wansbrough who, it is believed, came to work on the railway & lived at the area known as Main Camp.

At Mt Kokeby **♦** the plaque honours the town that was declared in 1902, as well as the school that operated from 1905 until it burnt down in 1945,



as reported in the Beverley Times:

#### INQUEST HELD

At the Beverley Court House on Friday, May 11, 1945, the Coroner (Mr. F. A. Bateman, S.M.) held an enquiry into the circumstances surrounding the fire which destroyed the Mt. Kokeby School. After hearing the evidence of some sixteen witnesses the Cormier found that the Fire was deliberately started by some person or persons unknown





Out on Yenyenning Lakes Road is the site of **↑** Erindale State School named for the nearby property of the Blechynden family. The school only lasted four years from 1906 to 1910,

The school building from here was relocated to the Bally Bally school along from the hall.

Scholars from Erindale State School had held their concerts in the Bally Bally Hall (see below).

### Beverley Ag Museum Another icy cold morning did not deter the volunteers from meeting up on Saturday July 15, in fact

Another icy cold morning did not deter the volunteers from meeting up on Saturday July 15, in fact they came in numbers with three new faces happy to be involved in the restoration and maintenance of the Beverley Communities Agricultural Collection housed at Avondale Farm located 6kms outside of town on Waterhatch Road.

With the fast-approaching date for the Annual Beverley Ag Show (Saturday August 19) our group were focused upon what items would be appropriate for display given our absence for several years due to a lack of willing volunteers, health and safety insurance issues and let's not forget (although most of us are happy to) Covid! All this is behind us and with the full support of the Beverley Shire Council we hope to exhibit a cross section of items from the collection on the day. So, it was no surprise to see John Hawke taking the Bedford J Series Truck for a run, one of the working items which will be on show, now that is enough Show information, for the rest of our display you will need to patronise your local event and hopefully come and have a chat with the members. One of the new volunteers Phil (from Parkerville) made an effort to start and find out why one of our McCormick Deering Tractors uses so much fuel (previously it ran out of fuel while on a test run), one contribution to the excess fuel usage is the leaking carburettor, which is now undergoing repairs, many thanks Phil.

Tealah and Rhys (who travelled up from Katanning) focused their efforts on starting the Massey Ferguson 585 Harvester fitted with a Perkins diesel, although the engine was heard to 'fire up' (and ran) several times, she was not at all happy to keep going, possibly due to air leaks into the fuel system or maybe just not a lover of the cold morning. As I explained to our much younger (and very enthusiastic) Rhys, like me the equipment is old and unlike the modern (less tired) machines he is used to working on, so can often be cantankerous (the machinery not me haha, although my wife may express a different opinion). The pair then moved onto the Farmall Tractor nearby, but she was not impressed at starting and maybe given a bit more battery 'Umph' will give a more positive result next time.

As always Eric and I concerned ourselves with ensuring the tyres were not deflated, before Eric moved onto manually 'Turning over' some Stationary Engines a project (starting them up) both Bob and Paul are 'champing at the bit' to get started on. Paul continued his efforts with restoration of the C30 International Truck, and Bob secured the Bench Grinder stand and Pedestal Drill to the floor while continuing his efforts to sort out many years of disorganisation in the workshop.

There were many visitors (mainly from Perth) who came to visit us and several who 'dropped in' even after our official closing time, some were out and about looking to entertain their children (8 in all) given the end of the school holidays on what turned out to be a beautiful day weatherwise. We are meeting up again a week earlier than our normal on Saturday August 12 (Closed on Show Day) so feel free to visit between 8.30am and Noon, otherwise we hope to see you at the Show. The days are finally starting to become longer and there is plenty of gardening to do in the garden in August as we get ready for spring.

Vegies to plant in August include: beetroot, cabbage, carrots, lettuce, onion, parsnip, peas, silver beet, artichoke, potato and rhubarb.

Flowers to plant in August include: marigold, begonia, carnation, gazania, nasturtium, dianthus and statice.

August is a great time to attend to the following tasks in the garden:

- · Harvest citrus fruit daily. Over ripe fruit will become dry
- Shape deciduous trees while you can see their framework
- Occasionally wipe the leaves of your indoor plants with a damp cloth to remove dust. It will help the plant to breathe better
- · Pick pears while a little unripe and allow to ripen in the fridge or at room temperature
- After flowering, prune poinsettia below waist height. Wear gloves and eye protection as the sap can burn
- After harvesting broccoli, leave the plant in the ground as smaller heads will shoot (similar to broccolini)
- Give your garden soil a moisture test by digging a hole a spade's depth and checking if water has
  penetrated to root level. If not, apply a soil wetting agent
- Discourage cats from digging in your garden by planting citrus perfumed plants such as lemon verbena and lime scented geraniums
- Harvest fruit regularly from avocado trees. If left too long, the tree could end up cropping every 2
  years instead of annually
- · To help train climbers up poles, tie them on loosely with plastic ties
- Plant comfrey near your compost and add leaves to your heap. They are rich in nutrients and break down quickly
- If your dog loves to chew plants, ensure the following toxic plants are not around aloe vera, daffodil, lily, sago palm, tulip and yesterday, today and tomorrow

Enjoy your time in your garden in August.



# WARRIOR WELLBEING ARTICLE

#### Self-Care - What Does it Look Like for Blokes?

#### BY THE REGIONAL MEN'S HEALTH INITIATIVE August 2023

A statement I often find myself saying to family members, friends, and individuals I interact with through the work we do at Regional Men's Health is look after yourself mate! This message does come from a genuine place of concern for these people and encompasses a key component of our vision statement which is to empower men and communities to take responsibility for their wellbeing and health. However, what does it really mean and look like for blokes living and working in regional, rural and remote WA?

Looking after oneself is best described as *self-care*. This involves a deliberate and self-initiated act to help maintain our physical, mental, or social/spiritual wellbeing. As humans, we all live different lives and the circumstances around our work, family commitments, individual capacity and environmental factors can change, so self-care will vary from person to person. However, for most of us we should endeavor for it to be:

- Regular & ongoing (it's not just a one-off thing we do and forget about for the rest of the year).
- More than just the time left over. Don't leave yourself the dregs, time for self-care must be a necessity not a luxury! Factor it into our daily, weekly, or monthly routine/planning.
- An important part of our work-life balance. It can help us cope with challenging times and makes us more effective managing the demands of daily life

For a lot of men, the pursuit of business goals and success (warrior attitude - winning) often pushes personal wellbeing and health issues down our list of priorities. When we think about it, acts of self-care give us the opportunity to reset and gives a circuit breaker effect on the daily grind and rat race that life can often feel like. Especially in these times of fast-moving technological advances, bombardment of social media influences, information accessibility and blurring of work-life balance (i.e. working from home, 24/7 access through smart phones). Self-care makes us more effective and offers us a buffer from the bumps in the road of life and ignoring this fact can result in us not being up to par in any aspect of our lives. Relationships can become strained, we can suffer burn out, harbor resentment, and miss out on the things that we don't realise are important until they're gone.

There is a varying range of definitions for self-care, but they all point towards us as individuals making the time to do things on a regular basis to help us live well and supports good physical, mental and social/spiritual wellbeing, including but not limited to:

- Starting with small changes that we can manage. Ask yourself 'what's in my control, do I need to learn to say no to unhelpful habits, behaviors, or extra commitments?'.
- Changing our mindset and putting ourselves first.
   We shouldn't see this as selfish but a form of good self-management. We must actively plan and commit for self-care to happen.
- Being connected to our passions, interests and a sense of belonging (family/community).
- Eating well, regular exercise and a good sleep routine.
- Getting a checkup with our GP and other health care professionals.

#### Are those prawns in my garden?





Lawn "shrimp", Arcitalitrus sylvaticus,

#### Forget shrimp on a barbie, what are they doing in my garden?

The recent wet weather has contributed to an interesting report of some "tiny flea looking... prawn things" in a Perth resident's garden. This prompted us to re-visit a previous article on these curious crustaceans.

Lawn shrimp, *Arcitalitrus sylvaticus*, also referred to as lawn prawns or landhoppers, are terrestrial crustaceans from the family Talitridae. These tiny 5-20 mm nocturnal soil dwellers are normally found within the top few centimetres of soil/mulch, where they feed on dead organic material (particularly eucalyptus debris), turning it into fertiliser for the garden.

Heavy rain in winter can prompt a sudden emergence of lawn shrimp, sometimes in their hundreds, giving people a shock when they appear across lawns, garden beds and paving. Don't worry, they don't pose a threat to people, pets, or the environment.

Lawn shrimp are related to marine and freshwater crustaceans but lack the waxy coating on their exoskeleton which aids the retention of moisture.

They need moist soil to live and feed in, but if the soil is too wet or too dry the shrimp emerge from the soil looking for more suitable habitat. Sadly, they often find themselves on paving or driveways dying of dehydration and starvation. Poor things.

Equipped with seven pairs of leg-like appendages, they move with a springing action using their three pairs of "hind" legs. It's likely this movement, and their tiny size, that leads people to suspect they're fleas.

Lawn shrimp breed year-round and the mated female lays eggs in a pouch on the underside of their body. The babies are a smaller version of the adults and leave the pouch soon after hatching. How cute!

#### Do I control these?


There's no need for control. Just sweep them up and return them to the garden to add to the organic content in the soil.

If present in your garden, these cute little crustaceans will disappear with the return of drier weather. If you haven't seen them, why not take a closer look for these little curiosities!

### ULURU STATEMENT FROM THE HEART

We, gathered at the 2017 National Constitutional Convention, coming from all points of the southern sky, make this statement from the heart:

Our Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander tribes were the first sovereign Nations of the Australian continent and its adjacent islands, and possessed it under our own laws and customs. This our ancestors did, according to the reckoning of our culture, from the Creation, according to the common law from 'time immemorial', and according to science more than 60,000 years ago.

This sovereignty is a spiritual notion: the ancestral tie between the land, or 'mother nature', and the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples who were born therefrom, remain attached thereto, and must one day return thither to be united with our ancestors. This link is the basis of the ownership of the soil, or better, of sovereignty. It has never been ceded or extinguished, and co-exists with the sovereignty of the Crown.

How could it be otherwise? That peoples possessed a land for sixty millennia and this sacred link disappears from world history in merely the last two hundred years?

With substantive constitutional change and structural reform, we believe this ancient sovereignty can shine through as a fuller expression of Australia's nationhood.

Proportionally, we are the most incarcerated people on the planet. We are not an innately criminal people. Our children are aliened from their families at unprecedented rates. This cannot be because we have no love for them. And our youth languish in detention in obscene numbers. They should be our hope for the future.

These dimensions of our crisis tell plainly the structural nature of our problem. This is the torment of our powerlessness.

We seek constitutional reforms to empower our people and take *a rightful place* in our own country. When we have power over our destiny our children will flourish. They will walk in two worlds and their culture will be a gift to their country.

We call for the establishment of a First Nations Voice enshrined in the Constitution.

Makarrata is the culmination of our agenda: the coming together after a struggle. It captures our aspirations for a fair and truthful relationship with the people of Australia and a better future for our children based on justice and self-determination.

We seek a Makarrata Commission to supervise a process of agreement-making between governments and First Nations and truth-telling about our history.

In 1967 we were counted, in 2017 we seek to be heard. We leave base camp and start our trek across this vast country. We invite you to walk with us in a movement of the Australian people for a better future.



Meg Bradford-Seeley OAM
Meg is a botanical style artist
who works in watercolour,
painting mainly WA wild
flowers. Following her
retirement from nursing (for
which she was recognised
with an Order of Australia
medal in 2018 for Services to

Community Health), she found the time to pursue a desire to paint. Meg had experienced much of the Australian bush and outback, both on the ground and, as a pilot, from a small aircraft. She finds the constantly changing colours and textures related to vegetation and terrain endless and quite transfixing.

While at the Station Gallery Meg will be working on her entries for the Watercolour Society of WA exhibition in October. She will have framed paintings on exhibition, some prints available, plus blank greeting cards of her paintings, as well as tea towels and 2024 calendars. "If my painting gives you pleasure, and causes you to look more deeply into creation and nature as a result, then I have truly shared my gift with you, and I am happy." Meg has not planned any workshops but is happy to share her knowledge of botanical art to those interested.



Anthea-jo Taylor studied Art and Design at Fremantle and Perth TAFES before travelling overseas and studying printmaking at the Falmouth School of Art in Cornwall and later, whilst living in Scotland, became a participating member of the Edinburgh Print Studio.

On return to Australia she accepted a four year contract teaching Indigenous adults in the Kimberley and taught art to trainee teachers. Later, whilst living and working in Canberra, she became a participant member of the *Megalo Print Studio* and on return to

Perth, joined the *Printmakers Association of WA* (PAWA) and regularly participates in short courses at the *Fremantle Arts Centre* and the *Midland/Mundaring Arts Centre*. Over the years she has undertaken various commissions and pro bono illustration and editing work. Jo is happy to share with others her visual media interests, techniques and skills while AiR at the Station.



**Diana Drachenberg** studied Fine Art at Newcastle N.S.W. Art School then in Perth worked as a Cadet Artist at the West Australian Newspapers, before overseas work as a Commercial Artist in Scotland and the U.S.A. On her return to WA

she worked as a Geological Draughtsman for Western Mining in Kambalda before settling in Walpole where she gave art and craft classes and established a Tourist Bureau marketing local art and crafts.

She subsequently started a Tourist Bureau in Mt Magnet while teaching art and crafts at Community workshops and at the High School. She also organised art displays and competitions in Mt Magnet, Geraldton and Perth.







SECONDLY, lets take a look at our traffic regulations with E-Rideables

We have concerns from the community that we need to address:

### **Electric Rideable Devices** Road Traffic Code Amendment Regulations (No.4) 2021

The Road Traffic Code 2000 was amended to regulate the use of electric rideable devices such as e-scooters and e-skateboards and came into effect on 4 December 2021 and create a number of offences. some of which include:

- Exceeding 10km/h on footpaths.
- •Exceeding 25km/h on carriageways, bicycle paths or shared paths.
- Riding a device on a road with a speed limit exceeding of 50km/h.
- •Riding a device without an approved helmet.

Electric personal transporters (Segways), electric bikes power assisted pedal cycles), motorised wheelchairs and motorised scooters are governed by separate regulations.

Where an electric rideable device does not meet the definition and it is driven on a road, it is an unlicensed motor vehicle they are not capable of being licensed.

Since Beverley has not been enforced previously, Our Local Police will consider education over enforcement until mid August.

Except in the cases of anti-social and/or unsafe road user behaviour.

### If You Own one, you're responsible for your action/s

# What is an ERD? Regulation 3A of the Road Traffic Code 2000 (RTC) defines an ERD

- as a scooter, skateboard, or other vehicle that:
- · Has at least 1 wheel
- · Is designed to be used by a single person
- · Has an electric motor or motors
- · Is fitted with an effective stopping system controlled by use of brakes, gears or motor control
- When propelled only by the motor or motors, is not capable of going faster than 25 km/h on level ground
- Has dimensions no bigger than 1250 mm in length, 700 mm in width, 1350 mm in height and weighs no more than 25 kg

### What is NOT an ERD?

### An ERD does not include:

- · motorised scooters.
- · motorised wheelchairs.
- · electric personal transporters,
- · a vehicle with pedals or
- · wheeled toys.

Regulation for these devices is contained within the Road Traffic Code 2000 (RTC)





