

New Election Regulations for Local Governments

With Local Government elections coming up in October, it is important that we understand the changes to the system of voting. Unfortunately, it seems the legislation has been designed to make it as complicated as possible going from a simple 'first-past-the-post' to Optional Preferential Voting.

Optional Preferential Voting

You can still vote for as many or as few candidates as you wish <u>BUT IF</u> you wish to vote for more than one candidate YOU MUST NUMBER THE BOXES of the candidates for whom you are voting. DO NOT USE CROSSES, TICKS, OR ANY OTHER MARK. If you do, your vote will be invalid. <u>If you do not know any candidate you are not compelled to cast a vote for them. EXAMPLE:</u>

<u>Annual Beverley Show</u>

Despite the many setbacks and hitches experienced by the Show Committee, the day turned out to be a success. Perfect weather and any number of attractions making it one of the busier days. Congratulations to President Mick Martin, the Committee, and all the volunteers who made it work.

Local Roads

Comments and questions have been received about the work on many of the roads since the storm in March and an apparent lack of progress to repair them.

The damage caused by the storm was indeed significant and in totality, beyond the resources of the Shire of Beverley. While urgent repairs have been carried out to at least make the roads safe, they have not been repaired to a suitable standard so please drive with caution. An application to DFES to have our region declared a catastrophic event was made and it has taken some time to have the Department make that declaration. Now that it has been made, a contractor has been engaged to assess the total damage in order that it might be costed. Once it has been costed, tenders can then be let to enable the selection of a contractor to make the repairs. This might seem to be an inordinately complex process for such urgent work and the Shire has been very frustrated by the slow progress throughout.

As stated earlier, at an estimated cost of \$3,000,000, this is beyond the capacity of the Shire and the external funding is crucial.

In the meantime, our regular maintenance programme is now playing catch-up allowing for the time given to making many of the damaged sections suitable and reasonably safe for the public. While this is very frustrating for everyone, working through the process has been even more frustrating for Shire staff to try and gain the funds due to the Shire under the storm declaration process. Why in this country do we have to make everything so hard to achieve?










LOCAL GOVERNMENT ELECTIONS 2023

Local Government Elections are scheduled to be held on Saturday 21 October 2023, subject to the date of The Voice Referendum.

This year the WA Electoral Commission will be looking after the Shire of Beverley's Election and it will be held as a postal election.

The Shire will have three vacancies, all being four year terms.

If you are interested in becoming a Councillor we suggest getting in contact with one of our current Councillors, attending a Council meeting or visiting the Department of Local Government website https://www.dlgsc.wa.gov.au/local-government/local-governments/council-elections

To be a Councillor, you would be involved in running an organisation with the responsibility of attending meetings to make decisions that have a major impact on our lifestyle. As a representative of your community you will hopefully find the role enjoyable, challenging and stimulating with involvement in matters as diverse as strategic planning, the environment, financial planning, town planning and roads.

Subject to the Referendum date, nominations will open on 31 August 2023 and close at 4:00pm sharp on 7 September 2023.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ORDINARY ELECTION CALL FOR NOMINATIONS Shire of Beverley

An Ordinary Postal Election will be held on Saturday, 21 October 2023 in the Shire of Beverley to fill the following vacancies:

District

3 Councillors

4 year terms

Nominations Open on Thursday, 31 August 2023 Nominations Close at 4:00pm Thursday, 7 September 2023 Nominations must be lodged with the Returning Officer:

- at any time during the above period by arrangement; or
- between 2:00pm and 4:00pm Thursday, 7 September 2023 (close of nominations) at the Shire of Beverley, 136 Vincent Street, BEVERLEY.

Nominations Requirements

Candidates are required to lodge with the Returning Officer:

- a completed nomination in the prescribed form, signed and witnessed. This form is available from the Returning Officer or the Western Australian Electoral Commission (www.elections.wa.gov.au);
- a single A4 page profile of not more than 1,000 characters (including spaces) containing information about the candidate;
- a nomination deposit of \$100 (cash, EFT, bank cheque or postal order);
- a recent passport-sized photograph (optional);
- every candidate must have completed the online course titled Local Government Candidate Induction, available at www.dlgsc.wa.gov.au, prior to nominating; and
- (optional) in addition to your A4 profile, you may provide additional information that you consider to be
 relevant to your candidature. This written statement must be not more than 2,000 characters (including
 spaces), must be in the English language and is for publication on the local government's official
 website.

The Commission has developed an online system called Nomination Builder to assist candidates to complete their nomination form which includes the candidate profile. This is the preferred method of completing the nomination form and profile for elections conducted by the Commission. Candidates complete their nomination details and profile, print the completed form which has a reference number allocated and lodge it with the Returning Officer. The nomination builder can be accessed via www.elections.wa.gov.au.

You cannot use Nomination Builder to prepare the additional information.

Where an agent lodges a nomination on a candidate's behalf, it must be in the prescribed form with a written authorisation signed by the candidate.

The documents may be hand delivered or posted to the Returning Officer and must be received by the close of nominations.

The Year 2/3's have been learning about the important jobs that volunteers do in our community, engaging in discussion about the significant impact you can have by having a positive active role in your community. So, to further their understanding, on Friday the 4th of August they embarked on an adventure around Beverley to visit our local emergency personnel.

The first stop was at the Beverley St John W.A sub center where they were met by Linda, Chad and Steve. The students had lots of questions about the different ambulance volunteer roles and the ambulance. Excitement peaked, not when the sirens went off, but when they got to explore the sub center and found Annie in the drawer! They were also relieved to find out that if in the event that their leg was ever chopped off, the 'chopper' would arrive, not to chop off the other leg, but to fly them to hospital. We then swapped



gifts, cards for hearts and lollipops and were on our way.



Not far down the road we reached the Beverley Volunteer Fire Brigade, where there was a barrage of questions and interest about the white fire truck. The students were intrigued to find out that the white trucks are for bush fires, they were also surprised that there were many tools and equipment stored inside the fire truck, not just water. With questions firing from all directions the Fire Fighters did what they do best and acted quickly by allowing each student to test the fire hose. With the scene now under control and some wet on-lookers, thanks to our Fire Fighters in training, it was time to move to our next

destination. On our way across town, we engaged in road safety talk and discussed why it is important to check before you cross the railway line even if the lights aren't flashing.



The focus of most of the meeting was firmly on the annual display at the Beverley Agricultural Show and we will endeavour to echo this year's theme of "Educate & Innovate – the Rural Way".

The ROSE SHOW is also on our minds and hopefully on any rose growers minds too. We have settled on Friday the 27th of October as the date due to the very cold winter and hope to have a great many entries. Aphids are already infesting some plants so please keep a good eye out for them and treat them quickly in whatever method you prefer.

The next meeting will be replaced by a visit to Clive Nicholls' garden at 10.30am on Tuesday the 5th of September. Please bring a chair and cup/mug. There will be a busy bee at the Dead Finish garden prior to the meeting so please come along at 9am if you are able to assist.

September is the beginning of spring and time to get ready for the warmer days ahead. It's a great time to plant pretty much anything and undertake an outdoor spring clean. There's lots to do in the garden but don't get overwhelmed; just aim to do a little each week and you'll have it under control in no time. Top tips for Planting in September:

- Plant seeds for flowers and vegetables for summer
- Fertilise strawberries to encourage a bumper crop
- · Get weeds under control
- Apply a slow-release lawn food to all grassed areas
- Use a metal rake to remove any build-up of thatch
- If looking a bit sparse reseed or returf bare areas of the lawn
- Increase watering of potted plants as the weather warms up
- Apply a slow-release fertiliser to all potted plants
- Tidy up ornamental grasses to promote new growth
- Fertilise all plants and lawns as growth resumes
- · Prune hibiscus and also prune plants that flowered in winter and early spring
- Plant herbs such as parsley, mint, coriander, and oregano
- Renew mulch on garden beds cover the soil with compost and then cover with a layer of mulch
- Watch for pests on new growth such as aphids and snails. Aphids can be squashed or treated.
- Snails and slugs can be trapped or deterred
- Repot potted plants that are root bound
- Divide herbaceous clumping plants as new growth resumes
- Dead head spring annuals and bulbs.



BEVERLEY HISTORIC MOTORCYCLE RACE

Motorcycles first appeared in 1901 at the same day of the Beverley to Perth Cycle Race and followed some hour after the scratch push bike rider left.

The League of WA wheelmen decided in June 1904 to have a Motorcycle race over the same 116 mile course starting 2 hours after the cyclist race in July of that year. The full story is available at the Dead Finish Museum.

The Vintage Motorcycle Club of WA have each year been over the past 30 years honouring those brave motorcyclists by riding as a re-enactment over a similar course.

The machines used by the current riders are of manufacture prior to 1931 and will be on display at the Beverley Men's Shed on Sunday 10th of September from 9am till 10am when they will then set off towards York, Toodyay, and Mundaring.

Empowering men to take responsibility for their wellbeing and health, that's our core focus here at The Regional Men's Health Initiative. We do this in light of the adverse statistics that represent men's health in general and the notion that for a large proportion of men developing their health knowledge is not seen as a priority. This fits with men having a more functional view of their health i.e. not seeking help until we are virtually physically impaired by the problem. We often challenge men on these points but what does it really mean as a bloke to take responsibility for his own wellbeing and health?

As blokes we take responsibility and make a lot of informed decisions throughout our lives, on a variety of things such as family, work and social issues. Why then should decisions about our wellbeing and health be any different?

Too many blokes are running into trouble because we keep avoiding and putting off looking after our wellbeing and health. Just being a passive participant is not good enough, we need to be the one in the driver's seat in all areas of our health be it physical, mental or social/spiritual.

Taking responsibility for our wellbeing and health means becoming an active and informed healthcare consumer. It means scheduling regular service visits with our doctor and being aware of issues that affect us at certain stages of our lives, such as the potential for prostate problems as we get older. We also need to consider issues that could be common in our families (hereditary) and discuss these with the doctor. It's a bit of a generalisation but how many of us guys rely on our wives or partners for our health when it comes to

our diet i.e. what food is in the house and what we eat for dinner?

Remember that it's not our wife's, mate's or doctor's wellbeing and health, it's ours. Good wellbeing and health can only happen if and when we as blokes take responsibility!

While taking charge is important it doesn't mean we have to go it alone, we all need help sometimes. From a community educator and support worker perspective, this often means our role involves walking beside someone helping to establish relevant pathways of support. It could also be simply listening to and validating people's issues and accompanying emotions. We see it as, walking beside the ute with the window down but not hopping in, it's your ride, you are the one in the driver's seat!



Our key message ... before it at all gets too much... Talk to a Mate®!! requires us to take some responsibility in that it's important we identify who our mates are so that when the shit hits the fan (and it does happen) we have a plan in place to address things.

Biosecurity Blitz

Wherever you live and whatever the size of your backyard, you can help protect WA's agriculture, forests, and natural ecosystems into the future.

The Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development's (DPIRD's) Biosecurity Blitz is back in 2023, with a special focus on reporting backyard pests and diseases.

The Biosecurity Blitz aims to protect Western Australia's backyards and agricultural industries from an increasing number of exotic threats, such as the recent incursions of polyphagous shot-hole borer (PSHB), myrtle rust and Queensland fruit fly (Qfly).

By checking your backyard for pests and diseases and reporting what you find, you'll learn about these organisms, help protect your garden, regional biodiversity and the local food and nursery industries in Western Australia.

Every report helps!

Your report helps to increase the likelihood that serious pests and diseases will be detected early, providing the best opportunity to eradicate or contain them.

If your report turns out to be a common pest, that data may be used to support WA's export trade.

Look - snap - report

This year the Biosecurity Blitz runs from 16 October to 16 November – that's 31 days to look for, take a photo, and send in a report of every pest and disease in your backyard.

The Harper Fence

The system of using smaller branches to slot between posts to create a simple fence was devised by Charles Harper, a Beverley landowner later MLA. The fence used no nails or precision woodworking.

HARPER FENCES - IN THE NEWS

Beverley Times, Saturday 2 March 1918,

Mr. J. M. Craig wrote asking for permission to erect a Harper fence to connect with fence on new deviation to allow his sheep to travel under culvert to water. The request was granted under certain specified conditions.

Beverley Times, Friday 18 December 1931

DESTRUCTION OF FEED.

Mr. T. H. Jackson sustained some serious loss as a result of the fire which came on to his property on Saturday, December 5th. Altouether 400 acres of feed was destroyed in addition to 11/2 miles of Harper fencing. The orchard suffered severely and about 18 acres of crop was spoilt. The house was saved except for some slight damage but the sheep pens adjacect were burnt. Damage sustained was only partly covered by insurance.

Beverley Times, Friday 2 February 1945

Fencing and Feed Destroyed at Roesland

Much of the old Harper fence bor dering the main road at Messes F & H Blechynden's Roesland property some three miles from Beverley, as well as about 30 acres of feed, were destroyed as a result of a fire which broke out after the passing of a train on Wednesday last. Lit between the railway sine and the main road the flames jumped the roadway under the influence of a strong easterly and made rapid progress until checked by firenghters.

Beverley Times, Thursday 24 December 1959. St Mary's Stained-Glass Window

The window represents the Apostles' Creed in a series of nine medallions.

1) I believe in God the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, and in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord,

A hand represents the Father; the sun and the moon... stars and the sea are shown in the spandrels. On a background of St. Church, with Mrs. Adamson's grave, and of Haisthorpe, with its original Harper fence and paddocked sheep, the Son is shown as the youthful Good Shepherd.

Beverley Times, Friday 10 August 1962 Extract from Frank Lodge's Journal

Eastern end of the property consisting of the 2000 acres afterwards sold to me was entirely fenced with jam timber fences called "Harper" fences from Mr. Charles Harper of Woodbridge, Guildford. were composed of two upright posts wired together, placed at intervals of about 6 feet, and small timber laid horizontally between them. This was used

as a horse paddock.

As a contributor to the current review of the Regional Exhibition Touring Strategy, Beverley Station Arts was invited to attend the 2023 WA Regional Visual Arts Summit, August 10 -13. Jenny Broun and Marylou Hutchinson were fortunate to be included in this jampacked conference centred around social, cultural and economical activity in the regions. There were informative curator and artist talks held at both John Curtin Gallery and UWA Lawrence Wilson Gallery, discussions on working interculturally, collaborative programming, artist pitch sessions, and venue pitches - including Beverley Station Gallery!

The Summit was linked to the Regional Arts Triennial 'Open Borders' survey exhibition at John Curtin Gallery, which showcased a compelling cross section of regional WA contemporary art practice. 

Well done to all our juniors who played their last junior game for Beverley. We look forward in seeing you wearing the red and black in the senior games in the future.


