

SHIRE OF BEVERLEY PRESIDENT'S REPORT



New Election Regulations for Local Governments

With Local Government elections coming up on 21st of October, it is important that we understand the changes to the system of voting. The new system is by Optional Preferential Voting.

Under this new system, you can still vote for as many or as few candidates as you wish <u>BUT IF</u> you wish to vote for more than one candidate YOU MUST NUMBER THE BOXES of the candidates for whom you are voting. DO NOT USE CROSSES, TICKS, OR ANY OTHER MARK. If you do, your vote will be invalid. <u>If you do not know any candidate you are not compelled to cast a vote for them.</u>

This election will be by Postal Vote only. You should already have your Postal Vote. The Shire Office will be open on Saturday 21st October but Electors' may choose to post their papers back to the Electoral Commission or hand deliver them to the Shire office at any time, up to and including Polling Day. The Shire office will be open to receive votes on Polling Day, Saturday 21st from 8:00 am to 6:00 pm.

Local Government Convention

The Annual Local Government Convention was held in Perth from Sunday 17th September until Tuesday 19th September. Organised by the Western Australian Local Government Association its aim is to bring Local Government Councillors and senior staff together to hear of ideas and developments through which Local Governments might assess their programmes in their respective communities. One of the highlights was an informative presentation on the new development in social media; namely, CHATGPT. The power of this programme is already being used widely with 110 million people accessing it in its first two months of its launch. Its application seems unlimited and I am sure many of the techno savvy members of Beverley are already across this?

Both the Premier, the Hon. Roger Cook and the Federal Minister for Local Government the Hon. Kristy McBain addressed the convention but sadly their speeches contained more in the way of motherhood statements than messages of substance. Many delegates were expecting matters of substance in these times of economic uncertainty.

Upcoming matters.

- ☆ A new Disability Access and Inclusion Plan (DAIP) for 2023 2028 is being developed. A community survey will be conducted on this plan and copies of the survey form will be available from the Shire office.
- ★ Submissions are invited for the leasing of seven reserves for cropping for the three years commencing 1st April 2024. Submissions close at 4pm, Tuesday 31st October 2023. Forms are available from the Shire office or the shire website.
- ☆ Shire is progressing a grant application for the first stage of the swimming pool redevelopment. If successful, a new loan will be raised for \$1 million to complete the funding for this project. Short of something catastrophic, this will be the last substantial loan raised by the Shire for some years.
- ☆ Regarding the swimming pool, season passes are available from the Shire for the summer season.
- ↑ The new 22 seat Community Bus that was ordered some months ago and promised for delivery in October, has been delayed. From the last information received (20th September), we have been advised that the bus is in production in October and should be delivered in late November, early December? So, I suppose we should hope that it is delivered to Beverley before Christmas.

RESTRICTED BURNING 2023

From October 3rd a permit to burn will be required

A permit can be applied for online on the Shire of Beverley website (https://www.beverley.wa.gov.au/services/emergency-services/fire-control)

If you are unable to apply for a Permit online yourself, please visit the Beverley CRC (141 Vincent St) who can assist you to submit an application. Alternatively you may be able to get a friend or family member to assist you to submit the application online.

Please be aware that an application for a Permit to Burn can take up to 48 hours to approve so please take this time frame into account when deciding when you wish to burn.

Note: Burn start date must be at least three working days from the application date (for example if you wish to burn on the weekend the application needs to be made on Wednesday or before). Burn End Date must be a maximum of 14 days from Start Date.

No burning whatsoever is permitted on days of HIGH or above FIRE DANGER or where WINDS EXCEED 20 km/hr. Harvest bans and the prohibiting of vehicle movement in paddocks are broadcasted daily on RadioWest and ABC radio.

Dress Standard for Fighting Fires

The minimum standard of dress for ALL persons attending a fire is:

- LONG PANTS
- LONG SLEEVE SHIRT
- BOOTS

Any person not conforming to this standard and not meeting minimum training standards will be requested by the Fire Control Officer to leave the fire ground. If you choose to remain on the ground, it is at your own liability.

HAROLD WILLEY & PIONEER RADIOS

Wooden Console Radio located in the Dining Room of the Dead Finish Museum.



Console radios were a very important part of a family social life from 1930 to 1960 in the period preceding the television. This radio was made in Beverley by Harold Willey a local handyman/electrician. The radio was made for the Bartram family for use in their home at "Emerald Hills", six miles west of Beverley. Mr Willey bought all the mechanical pieces then inserted them in the cabinet he constructed from local timber. Neither the dial nor the interior metal components have any distinguishing marks or brands. Peg Kempton (nee Bartram), who donated the radio in 1991, remembers it arriving when she was a small child, so its date is about 1938. Mr Willey had a shop in Central Buildings, Vincent St, but also travelled to farms in the district to mend all sorts of things.

Mr Harold Willey was offered the contract to show "talkies" in the York Town Hall in early 1931 with a Talkie apparatus invented by Selby Ford (inventor of Beverley's bi-plane, the

'Silver Centenary'), showing an obscure film So This Is College at the first showing.

REMARKABLE WIRELESS RECEPTION IN BEVERLEY.

Hearing that exceptional wireless results had been achieved this week, we interviewed Mr. G. E. L. Wrench, who has a Short-Wave Receiver and learnt from him that on Tuesday morning last, at 3.45 a.m., he was listening to dance music from a station on about 48 metres in Kenya, South Africa, for some time, when the station announced that it was 11 p.m. and was closing down; this was followed by "God Save the King." Searching for another station he was startled to hear a voice coming in with such volume that it became necessary to close the doors to avoid waking sleepers in the house. The subject matter was a lecture in English on Film Production and continued for some time; at its conclusion the announcer called "hullo, hullo, this is Moscow, the Trade Union Radio Station of the United Soviet Socialist Republics, Postal Address, Palace of Labour, Solianka, Moscow, the address you have just heard was by Comrade Eisenstein, Director of Film Production who has just returned from a World tour in connection with the five year plan." He then proceeded to give the News Service which was of a local character and dealt with vast works in hand, one item being that there was being opened before the end of this month an immense steel rail and bar rolling mill which would be the largest in Europe if not in the world. On completion of the News Service he announced that they were then crossing over to Red Square and that the Bells of the Kremlin would be beard to chime midnight. From Red Square the roar of the traffic could be distinctly heard together with motor horns and engine whistles in the distance; after this came musical chimes and the deep tones of a bell sounding twelve, which could have been heard a hundred yards away, closing with a Band playing. The local time was then 5.5 a.m. During the session the announcer gave out that the next session in English would be held on Thursday, June 9th at 11 p.m. (their time) and explained that this time was equal to 8 p.m. Greenwich Mean Time or 9 p.m. British Summer Time. The Short-Wave Receiver on which this was heard was constructed locally to the order of Mr. Wrench, by Mr. Harold Willey.


DEPRESSION AWARENESS MONTH






We enjoyed meeting the many people who helped make our school what it is today, at the 150th Celebration on the 15th September. Seeing all the photos of past Beverley students was fantastic!

Our assembly highlighted some ancient methods of schooling that we found concerning. For example:

- Spartan children were removed from their parents at seven years of age. They were then trained by the government to be warriors.
- Spartans also encouraged stealing, as it was good for learning how to be sneaky during wars.
- Tudor students were required wear a hat and carry a dagger to sharpen their quill.
- Story books were seen as frivolous and a waste of time in the Tudor era. They learned using a 'hornbook' which has the alphabet and Lord's Prayer on one side, and room to write on the other.
- Raspberry Lemon, Evil, Toilet, Baboon, Lettuce Burger and Happy were real Victorian names.

We have certainly learned of the benefits of going to school in 2023!

On the 14th and 15th of August the staff and students were lucky enough to have Holly-Ann Martin from Safe4Kids visit the school for a series of educational sessions on Protective Education. Holly spent two lessons with each class over the two days, covering several very important topics that included consent, recognising early warning signs, persistence, how to choose a safety team, public and private body areas, safe and unsafe secrets, and social media and internet safety.



During her time at Beverley DHS Holly taught our students a series of strong messages including:

"We all have the right to feel safe all of the time"
"We can talk with someone about anything"
"Say no, if you feel unsafe"
"My body, is my body and it belongs to me"

From Pre-primary to Year 10 all students engaged in conversation with Holly about the topics being taught, our older students were provided with a lot of resources on protecting themselves on the internet, while our younger students made calls to the Kids Helpline, where as a class they were able to talk to a qualified counsellor to see how easily it is to access help. Holly also hosted a staff training session, spending two hours providing staff from Beverley, Meckering, Pingelly and Cunderdin, with the skills they need to continue to educate students on Protective Education and how to manage a disclosure.

On Monday night, after a long day teaching students and teachers, Holly continued to the Beverley Town Hall to present to 40 members of the local and surrounding communities. Our fantastic volunteers Hazel Martin and Issy Freeman, provided their time to run a free crèche to allow parents to attend this important event.

During her short time in Beverley, Holly was able to share a great deal of important knowledge with community members of all ages, strengthening our awareness on how to identify and act on child abuse. This will hopefully allow us as a community, to work together to combat the ever-rising numbers of recorded child abuse.

Beverley District High School would like to thank Holly-Ann Martin for her dedication to the prevention of child abuse through the Protective Education she shares. We would also like to thank Hazel Martin and Issy Freeman for volunteering their time to run the creche. We would also like to thank and acknowledge the Shire of Beverley who provided a grant to cover half of the cost of this valuable community wide experience, this would not have been possible without your help!

Be breast aware this October!



October is Breast Cancer Awareness Month

so it's an important time to shine a light on the impact that breast cancer has on many Australians. It's also important for people to get to know common breast cancer symptoms.

Women from regional Western Australia (WA) are known to delay going to a medical clinic when they were experiencing symptoms, with many experiencing self-doubt about the existence of the symptom. In 2019, 1,899 women in WA were diagnosed with breast cancer, and 259 women lost their lives to it.

If you're unsure about a possible symptom, you should make an appointment to discuss the change with your doctor, clinic nurse or Aboriginal health worker as soon as possible. This is particularly important if it's been more than four weeks since you first noticed the change. Cancer treatments have improved in recent years, and it is much easier to successfully treat breast cancer if it is found early. The more it spreads, the harder it is to treat. So, we must Find Cancer Early.


Everyone's breasts are different. It is important that you get to know what your breasts look and feel like, so you know what is normal for you. There is no right or wrong way to check your breasts.

Common symptoms of breast cancer include:

- A lump or hard area in your breast or underarm, especially if it is only on one side
- A change in the size, shape or feel of your breast
- Change in the look of your breast, including redness, rash, or your skin looks like the skin of an orange, or is wrinkling in small folds
- Changes to the nipple, like it's pulled inwards, leaking, itchy or has a sore that won't heal
- Breast pain or discomfort, especially if it is only on one side
- · An area of the breast that feels different to the rest

You can give yourself the best chance to Find Cancer Early, by going to see a doctor, clinic nurse or Aboriginal health worker straight away if you have any of the symptoms above. The benefits to Finding Cancer Early is that treatment is easier, and you can be around longer to do the things you love doing with the people you love.

Don't tip toe through these tulips!

You might have recently noticed these pretty looking flowers when walking through the bush, spotted them growing along roadsides or seen them in paddocks, particularly in the Southwest of the state. Members of the Iridaceae (Iris) family, these lovely looking flowers are actually a serious and widespread weed in Western Australia. They are commonly called the One-leaf and Two-leaf Cape Tulip.

As the name suggests, One-leaf Cape Tulip typically has only one leaf per plant. The flower colour ranges between orange and salmon pink with a yellow centre. It reproduces via both seed and annually renewed corms. The seeds and corms sprout in autumn after rain, with up to 60% of corms potentially staying dormant each year.

Two-leaf Cape Tulip has a similar looking flower but can be distinguished by having two to three leaves per plant. It sprouts in autumn and flowers in spring. However, unlike the one-leaf variety, it doesn't seed, but produces cormils on its stems. Why control: Both varieties of cape tulip are a serious weed of pastures, roadsides, wastelands, and bushland. In pasture, livestock often selectively graze clovers and other more palatable species, which allows cape tulip to flourish. However if eaten, all parts of cape tulip are toxic to livestock while the plant material exists - whether it is alive, dying or dead. Spraying with herbicides does not remove its toxicity.

When to control: The optimal time for chemical control of both plants is July to September, when they flower, and the corm is exhausted. After this time the plant material will start to dry out, making any kind of chemical difficult for the plant to absorb.

If you have missed the opportunity to control this year, all is not lost. Take note of where you have seen Cape Tulip so you can be prepared and ready to control it for the next season.

Getting a Good Night's Sleep

There are times in business when it's all go, whether it's on the farm during seeding and harvest or meeting deadlines at work. It may mean working longer than normal hours and possibly becoming sleep deprived. A lack of sleep not only reduces our ability to perform work effectively, it also reduces our ability to work safely. Some have regarded sleep as a useless waste of time with no purpose - NOT TRUE. Science and medicine are discovering more and more about the role of sleep and its influence on our wellbeing and health.



How much sleep do we really need?

- Infants and toddlers 9 to 10 hours at night plus day naps;
- School age including teenagers do best with 9 to 11 hours at night;
- Most adults 7 to 8 hours a night;
- Older adults need the same as younger adults but sleep lighter and for shorter periods.

Some people just need fewer hours of six or less a night without ill effects. The need for less or even more sleep can run in families (suggesting a genetic basis but it is incredibly rare).

What are the effects of lack of sleep? While we're sleeping, our body is busy tending to our physical and mental health and getting us ready for another day. Lack of sleep can lead to:

- Drowsiness and irritability during the day;
- Poor concentration hindering memory and our ability to pay attention;

- Poor physical coordination increasing the risk of accidents:
- High blood pressure which is one of the main risk factors for heart disease:
- · Depression.

Regularly sleeping less than 5 hours is associated with poor physical and mental health and wellbeing.

Sleep may be more difficult to come by as we age, and this can be traced to treatable health issues that cause interrupted sleep. Some factors that could cause sleep difficulties:

- Sleep disorders like sleep-apnoea, restless leg/arm syndrome, leg cramps;
- Pain from conditions like arthritis, heartburn, back pain, headaches;
- · A frequent need to urinate;
- Illness depression, coughing, shortness of breath;
- Medications.

Some helpful tips for getting a good night's sleep are:

- Go to bed and get up at the same time each day, this synchronizes our body clock;
- · Aim for daily exercise before evenings;
- Relax before bed i.e. warm shower, reading and avoid caffeine, nicotine and alcohol;
- Establish your pre-sleep routine (usually 3 things);
- Use bedroom/bed only for sleeping or intimacy – not as a lounge room for watching TV.

Generally, if we can't sleep, we shouldn't lie in bed. Leave the bedroom and do a quiet activity that doesn't stimulate us. To help maintain a healthy lifestyle we all need to contemplate what is an adequate amount of sleep for us personally and visit our GP for treatment if we are amassing a huge sleep debt.

Thank you to our 2023 committee on a successful year with our Winter Sports. To every single person who has helped in anyway this year, the committee says thank you.


