SHIRE OF BEVERLEY PRESIDENT'S REPORT



Election Results for Shire of Beverley

With the elections now behind us, I am pleased to report that the successful candidates are, Mrs. Dee Ridgway, Mr. Chris Lawlor, and Mr. Darryl Brown. I would also like to thank Mr. Barry Shardlow for nominating for these elections and showing a willingness to participate in local government. A reminder to everyone that at this election the Shire began the process of reducing total Council numbers from 9 to 7. The Council will now stand at 8 until 2025.

The pleasing thing about this election was that 669 votes were received, the biggest turnout ever for a Shire election. Of these votes 5 were deemed informal.

Notwithstanding this pleasing aspect of the election, it could be said it was the only pleasing aspect of it. Mrs. Natalie Ashworth was the official Returning Officer and had to undertake a significant amount of training in preparation for dealing with the election. Council Chambers resembled Houston Space Centre on Saturday night. Simon Marshall and Ali Lewis were also in attendance to conduct the count. The count took 2 hours to complete and we then had to wait for a further hour and a half before the Electoral Commission was able to give the all clear on the final result. However, the Electoral Commission did not formally declare the result until Sunday morning.

A big thank-you to Natalie Ashworth for all her efforts, especially as the count on Saturday night meant she missed most of her daughter's 21st birthday celebrations! Thank you also to Simon and Ali for their time and efforts.

Until now, elections have been conducted in-house and the night of the count has been one where the community are welcomed to attend and where refreshments are shared at the conclusion. Much more of a community atmosphere. The results are also known as soon as the counting has concluded.

Optional preferential voting did not deliver a 'fairer' result. Neither did it deliver a sense of community involvement. The postal voting did deliver a greater community participation, which can only be a good thing. BUT ALL OF THIS AT A COST TO THE COMMUNITY OF \$18,000+!

As a result of all this, Council will review the whole process and take their concerns to the Central Country Zone and WALGA to get support for any changes Council might deem appropriate.

Finally though, thank you to everyone who chose to return a postal vote even though voting at Local Government elections is <u>NOT</u> compulsory.

Other Matters

- A new Disability Access and Inclusion Plan (DAIP) for 2023 2028 is being developed. Submissions for this closed on 27th October but there will be 2 workshops to further develop this. Both workshops will be held on Thursday 2nd November. The first at 10:30am in the meeting room at Cornerstone and the second at 6:00pm in the Amenities building at the oval. It would be very much appreciated if those wanting to attend could please register their interest by ringing the Shire office on 9646 1200.
- A Master Trails Plan is being developed with assistance of Tredwells. An on-line survey can be found at https://www.surveymonkey.com/r/BeverleyTrailsMasterPlan for your contribution.
- Further information on the progress of the Stage 1 work to the swimming pool has been received with some dismay. The original indicative cost of this work was received at \$1.2 million. Based on this, Council was prepared to raise a new loan of \$1 million to cover the bulk of the cost. Since the October Blarney Report, the indicative cost of this work has now risen from \$1.2 million to \$2.9 million without any seeming reason?? For those who can remember, conditions today are similar to 1973!

Bushfires and water supply

A message for fire fighters

Before you hook into the water supply call us 24/7 on 13 13 75

What to do in an emergency...

Before you hook into the water supply system, **call us on 13 13 75** (24/7). If we know where you're headed, we may be able to help maintain supply or provide an alternative location that has better pressure.

Unfortunately, there is no guarantee that we can prolong water supply or pressure, and experience has shown that once a town is threatened, supply and pressure are at risk.

Hydrant location – if you are unsure where the closest hydrants are located, please contact DFES or our Operations Centre on 13 13 75, who will provide you with the exact locations.

Testing – if you intend to test hydrants in your area, please let us know first, in the event of any discoloured water complaints from nearby properties.

Broken hydrants - any issues with hydrants should be reported up through DFES. DFES will contact Water Corporation and a work order will be actioned immediately.

Reminder to the community – help us spread the word that people cannot rely on mains water during a bushfire due to the risk of power cuts, fire damage and extreme demand.



Water supply in a bushfire

This information could save your life

While leaving high-risk bushfires is the safest option, if you plan to stay and defend your home, you must have an INDEPENDENT water supply and pumping capability. This typically requires water tanks of at least 20,000 litres, pump and generator.

This is required as mains water supply and pressure cannot be quaranteed during a bushfire due to the risk of power cuts, fire damage and extreme demand.

Use the Department of Fire and Emergency Services resources to develop your personal bushfire plan: mybushfireplan.wa.gov.au. You can also download the My Bushfire Plan app via the App Store or Google Play to access your bushfire plan anytime - even without an internet connection.

To support bushfire plans, if you have groundwater bore access to surface water, you can take and store emergency water without it counting against your annual entitlement. For more information on this, and for the location of emergency bushfire water supplies in dryland agricultural areas, visit the Department of Water and Environmental Regulation website.

Drinking water

We recommend you keep a supply of drinking water on hand throughout summer in case your water supply is interrupted.

Assistance for customers affected by bushfire

After a bushfire, we can assist you with issues such as damaged water meters and payment difficulties. If you have been affected by bushfire please call us on 13 13 85.

The Emergency WA website emergency. wa.gov.au/ provides emergency information and community safety warnings. Call **000** in a life-threatening emergency or the SES 132 500 for emergency assistance.







Mains water supply cannot be guaranteed during a bushfire

Water Corporation is prepared for bushfire season. However, we cannot guarantee that water pressure or water supply will be maintained in the event of a bushfire. Extreme demand, fire damage and power cuts can all result in a total loss of water.

If you plan to stay and defend your property during a bushfire, you must have your own independent water supply and pumping capability, You cannot rely on mains water.

Harvest Bans And Extreme Fire Danger Warnings

No burning whatsoever is permitted on days of HIGH or above FIRE DANGER or where WINDS EXCEED 20 km/hr. Harvest bans and the prohibiting of vehicle movement in paddocks are broadcasted daily on RadioWest and ABC radio.

Dress Standard for Fighting Fires

The minimum standard of dress for ALL persons attending a fire is:

- LONG PANTS
- LONG SLEEVE SHIRT
- BOOTS

Any person not conforming to this standard and not meeting minimum training standards will be requested by the Fire Control Officer to leave the fire ground. If you choose to remain on the ground, it is at your own liability.





November is Lung Cancer Awareness Month

Did you know?

Lung cancer is the third most common cancer affecting both women and men in Western Australia.

In 2019, 693 Western Australian men and 564 Western Australian women were diagnosed with lung cancer.

Common symptoms of lung cancer include:

Coughing or spitting up blood (once or more)

Or, for more than four weeks:

- A new cough or change to your usual cough
- A lot of chest infections
- Finding it hard to breathe
- · Losing weight without trying
- Not feeling hungry
- Pain in your chest and/or shoulder
- Feeling tired or lacking energy
- Changes to your voice, such as hoarseness or croaky voice

If you have coughed up blood, even if it was just once, it's important to tell your doctor, clinic nurse or Aboriginal health worker straight away.

If you have had any of the other symptoms for more than four weeks, tell your doctor, clinic nurse or health worker. It doesn't mean you've got lung cancer - often these symptoms turn out to be something less serious. But it's important to tell your health professional and get checked out to be safe.

If it is lung cancer, the earlier it's found, the earlier it can be treated.

Backyard Buddies

Ants in your plants, and pavers?

Want to know what your problem ants are and how to control them? You've come to the right place.

There are thousands of ant species in Australia, and most are difficult to identify without a microscope and specialist knowledge. There are very effective baits for some species, while others require control using sprays. Other species rarely need any control and can be left alone. Unless you know the species of ant, control can be guesswork, which can waste your time and money, and involve the unnecessary use of pesticides.

By submitting samples for identification, you can learn about the species of ants at your property and how to control them, plus you'll contribute to ant surveillance in WA. Detections in recent years of exotic and problematic species such as the African black sugar ant, red imported fire ant and browsing ant, is a testament to the ability of ants to arrive in WA via freight and cargo. Their rapid detection provides the best chance of eradication and prevents the economic, social and environmental impacts caused by these ants.

For ant identification services, we request that only dead specimens are submitted. This will prevent any unintended spread of the ants, whilst keeping the postie happy!

Sampling instructions

- Brush ants into a sealed container, Ziplock bag or collect ants using the sticky side of transparent tape and fix this gently to a piece of paper.
- Place sample in the freezer for 1-2 hours to kill any live ants.
- Label samples with the collection location e.g. backyard, kitchen, bathroom, driveway etc., and include a note with your name, address, contact number and email address.
- Deliver or post to: Pest and Disease Information Service (PaDIS), Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development, 3 Baron-Hay Court, South Perth WA 6151.

Any suspected exotic ant species should be reported for biosecurity screening to the Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development.

Political correctness is a doctrine which holds forth the proposition that it is entirely possible to pick up a bit of shit by the clean end. In my opinion, political correctness is a major inhibiting factor when interpreting bureaucracy and applying common sense (often the ingredient missing out of lots of decision making) in our daily life. This ultimately can affect our wellbeing.

Bureaucracy on its own does have its place, however at times it can limit how we do things because of the many layers of rigid rules that can complicate getting the job done on the ground. This occurs in everyday life whether completing tedious processes, filling out pages of paperwork, or dealing with a system that appears to be more focused on processes rather than helping achieve an outcome.



When a disaster strikes (i.e. catastrophic fires, floods and droughts) or personal health and safety issues arise in our life, layers of bureaucracy are not always helpful, they can exacerbate an already tense environment. We have spoken to many blokes who feel both frustrated and restricted in their reactions to these disasters because of the many lavers of procedures that had to be adhered to. Common sense was taking second place!

The point about the effects of this political correctness doctrine, is that it enshrines both bureaucracy and common sense and quite often masks/dilutes what should be done and said and can also inhibit robust discussions

Blokes, by our own nature are hard wired to be action orientated i.e. we want to solve problems, and we want to do stuff now. Once this is stifled by political correctness, a few things can start to happen:

- normal stress can become distress;
- short cuts can be taken (with increased risk);
- our natural problem-solving process is inhibited;
- blokes shut down and stop seeking help (we go into our cave and don't come out);
- It creates an us versus them mentality.

So where have we gone wrong and how can we make changes?

- Don't allow political correctness to mask what should be done and said. Sometimes we must be critical and blunt about our processes to keep them relevant and up to date;
- Bureaucracy should facilitate what we do, not dictate how we do it (not create barriers and thus frustrate people who are trying to deal with a challenging situation at the coal face);
- The common sense rule should be applied to everything we do. I repeat, apply it to everything we do:
- People/communities have the innate ability to band together and deal with stressful situations. This should be fostered thus empowering individuals and communities rather than disempowering through micro-management and removing them from vital decisions regarding their own lives and local community;
- Language is always important. Appropriate language that can be understood needs to be used. A robust discussion is vital to air all points of view and to prevent mistakes being repeated.

Remember at the end of the day we are responsible for our own wellbeing. Hopefully these suggestions, encourages communities to claim back some responsibility and ownership. This would bring about positive change not only in blokes lives but the whole of the community.

working order again, alas the 'open air' parking was


not a realistic location given its bright new red coat of paint, so on July 4 2017 Mr Szczecinski donated it to the Ag Museum where it can be appreciated by the public.

Paul continued his work on the International C30 Truck carrying out more electrical work and taking measurements for securing the newly fabricated step.

Bob and John A refitted the 'Stationary Engine area' safety fences after the Shire had attended to the underground stormwater pipes. Gerry established the



Brake Master Cylinder would need to be removed from the Holden Ute and given the location of it not the best job to do, rolling around on the ground at 74 years of age, we may need to encourage some younger people to join the group!



After removing and cleaning the Spark Plugs, Gerry also found that the Bedford Truck misfire seems to only be present once it has warmed up, so possibly a mechanical issue, which sounds like it could be expensive given her age, but she runs and being a 6 cylinder, the 'uninitiated ear' would never tell the difference.
