Vincent Street

Thank you to everyone for your patience as the contractors repair parts of Vincent Street damaged by water undermining the hotmix. The process of repair has involved the use of cement stabilization to overcome the problem.

Repairs are expected to be complete in the first week of February.

At the Electors' meeting in December 2023, I was able to report on a new funding programme that had been identified: - "Finally, we come to a potential project that has very recently been identified but has yet to go to full Council for discussion and approval. A federal government funding scheme known as Regional Precincts and Partnership Program (rPPP) is open for application for projects that are based on partnerships covering a relevant area identified as a Precinct.

Divided into two Stages, with Stage one being funding just for planning and Stage two, being applications for funding for the actual work."

Full Council met for a workshop on Wednesday 17th January with Mark Casserly as facilitator. The purpose of the workshop was to gain a better understanding of the requirements of the Programme and the potential for Beverley as we identify the many projects that could be developed for the betterment of the community. The initial stage is to work towards an application for funding to carry out all the planning needed to progress to stage two.

It is apparent that this programme is unusual in its size with the amount of funding available and Mark Casserly highlighted that in all his years of consulting he has never encountered a Programme of this size.

The five-hour workshop explored the Programme and identified 10 areas that would form the basis of the eventual application. But. Before we can even contemplate the final application, there is a significant amount of work to be completed. A part of this work will be a process of community consultation, details of which will be developed over the coming months.

Parking in Vincent Street.

Information provided by the Beverley Post Office has been received regarding the driveway into the building. A vehicle was photographed parked across the driveway blocking access for Post Office staff and potentially Telstra.

This was not an isolated incident and that some people choose to place their egos and selfishness above community consideration is disappointing to say the least. In fact, 'disappointing' is very much a wet lettuce criticism and I am sure stronger criticism is warranted!

The driveway into the Post Office is a Clearway. No Parking permitted at any time.

Beverley does not have any parking By-laws at present as they are too hard to police and generally create ill will in the community. We rely



Dress Standard for Fighting Fires

The minimum standard of dress for ALL persons attending a fire is:

- LONG PANTS
- LONG SLEEVE SHIRT
- BOOTS

Any person not conforming to this standard and not meeting minimum training standards will be requested by the Fire Control Officer to leave the fire ground. If you choose to remain on the ground, it is at your own liability.





Beverley Men's Shed

With the festive season now a distant memory our membership is looking forward to celebrating the 15th anniversary of The Beverley Men's Shed Incorporated, the date of this being 8th January 2009, with celebrations to be held on Saturday March 16, 2024, but that is not when it all began.

Friendships in small communities are often forged from similar interests and isolated locations, country communities are renowned for helping each other especially in times of need or natural disaster, the history of the Country Women's Association is well known throughout the entire country, their ability to support Women and families in need together with local organisations has been seen through the eyes of many generations, but there was never any group to offer social support to the Men in our society until Men's Shed's started to appear, and like most 'Shed's' ours was brought together by a group of guys with similar interests over a shared cuppa who were our founding members.

And so, when did this all begin? Beverley Men's Shed records show that a meeting was held

on 31st January 2007 with the then Shire CEO Mr Keith Byers, Mr Harold Anderson, Mr Fred Bremner, Mr Bernie Howell and Mr Richard Jas together with Councillors Mr Neil Flood and Mr Bill McDonald where information for similar projects in Darkin and Mukinbudin was



shared, with much discussion regarding Insurance, wheelchair toilets, hours of use and cleaning of the 'Old Fire Station Building' (now Heritage listed) as the proposed site for the group. Further communications in February 2008 revealed that the proposed original name for the group was to be the 'Beverley Social Interactive Group' with membership limited to 'citizens of the district who are either retired or recipients of a pension' with a membership fee of \$40.00 per year, that name and fee were never agreed to and as our membership are aware the only requirements now are to be male, over 18 and to have respect for others in the group, plus of course paying your annual fee, ironically now set at \$40.00 plus GST! Yes, when the group became incorporated it took on the responsibility of 'proper bookkeeping' and can (if members agree) take on work contracts having all the necessary dotted 't's and crossed 'I's and mandatory Australian Business Number the Tax office requires.

It did not take long for the word to get around in the Beverley district and the Men's Shed Roll at July One, 2011, shows a membership of 69, sadly many of these men have passed on or now enjoy other interests, times change, but many of those members are happy to pass on their experiences in life to the 'new guard' with our paid-up membership sadly only 36.

And over the years members have contributed (being a member is a contribution in itself) towards the establishment of what everyone shares (and enjoys) today.

We have a fully functioning kitchen housed in the old heritage listed building behind the old fire station where some of the guys show off their culinary skills catering for our 'morning teas' and once a month a 'Big Breakfast' (for an additional fee) alongside this is our 'workshop' where members are free to



take on projects using their metal or wood working skills, this building was built using funding from the Lotteries Commission and completed and officially opened by his excellency Dr Ken Michael AC, governor of Western Australia on May Twelve 2010, with the 'Old Fire Station' building being utilised for recreational purposes including Pool, Darts, Table Tennis, Audio and Visual entertainment and a Library, (also used for committee meetings) but we still required more space, so with the membership having more diverse interests a further building was added in 2018 giving members more room to breathe. Naturally some of our members are no longer with us and our thoughts and condolences go out to their families.

For whatever reason many past members no longer attend the shed meetings, you are always welcome to come down and 'chew the fat' regardless of past experiences, unless you have a 'life ban'! And talking of 'life' we are privileged to honour five current life members, Fred Bremner, the late Ken Colpitts, the late Colin Hancock, Bernie Howell and Ken Sherwood, all being recognised for their contributions to 'The Shed' and its members.

And with the 15th Anniversary now passed, preparations are underway for our celebratory party when all passed and current members (and their families) are urged to attend on Saturday March 16 at 3.30pm, obviously if you can advise our Secretary Bob if you (and yours) are coming before February 26 please so he can organise the catering etc, it is a very important date for our group with our newer members looking forward to hearing the many stories (please no fishermen's tales!) of the Men's Shed past.

MAINTAINING ORDER IN THE BEVERLEY DISTRICT


Military Posts/Troop Stations

Beverley's earliest government building was a military post for troops from the 21st Foot and later the 51st Foot sent from Britain to the Swan River Colony to help keep order. Referred to as the Dale Station, the post was on the east bank of the Dale River on a road known as King George Sound Road. No trace of this road remains. The subsequent York-Williams road is on the western side of the river. The site of the Dale Station is on a farm property known for over a hundred years as The Barracks in recognition of its early military use.

Little remains of the military outpost now apart from scattered stones, portions of mud brick & some fragments of broken crockery. There were two separate buildings, several hundred metres apart. It is believed the station building itself had 3 areas: one central room as a station office, a second was perhaps a living area for single men, while the third area was stables. There is a 1930 photo of the ruins of the other building which appears to be two adjoining cottages used as living quarters for married soldiers and their families.

A similar post was also established at St Aubyn's, south east of township (east of airfield on Bremner Rd). These posts were only in existence for a few years from the late 1830s to the mid-1840s.

Mounted Police from the York Police Station patrolled the area until Beverley got its own station.

MAINTAINING ORDER IN THE BEVERLEY DISTRICT Police Stations in Beverley Township

- 1861 First Police House/Station (24 x 12ft 7.3 x 3.7 metres) built by James Bartram in Hunt Rd, specifically for lease to police. It had a lean-to, a lock-up & a stable. Constable Edwards & family moved in on 21 March 1861. It was also a post office run by Mrs Edwards. Remains of the mud brick building are incorporated into the house at 21 Hunt Rd.
- 2. **1868** Purpose-built Police Station and Post Office on corner of Hunt Rd & Elisabeth St. Edwards family moved in & wife Ann again became post mistress while daughter Suzannah trained as the telegraph operator. Edwards retired in 1882. His place was filled by Constable Hackett who was murdered in 1884. Constable Doherty was stationed there subsequently for 12 years. PC Corry was the last officer appointed to this station. The building was demolished in 1920s.
- 3. **1911 Police Cottages, Office & Lock-up** at 55 Bartram St behind the Court House in Vincent St. PC Martyn then PC McDonald were appointed Bailiffs of the Beverley Court in 1911 so it is likely they were the first to reside in Bartram St. The building was renovated in 2013 by the National Trust with the former police station incorporated into the house next door. The lock-up is still at the rear of the building.

Some of the police officers appointed to the Bartram St Station include: PC Johns, PC Honner, PC Naismith, PC Rea, PC Catt, PC Vivicombe, PC Thomson, PC Bruce Williams, PC TMJ Healy, PC Arthur Cole, PC Whitney, Constable Kevin Brady, Constable Frank Simonds, Sergeant Brian Bradshaw, Constable Michael Healy, and Senior Constable Brian Werndly.

Police at other Localities

Police Constables were also stationed at significant other places in the district, especially when convict road parties were working and camping in the area. In 1884, when there was a hue and cry for the murderers of PC Hackett, PC Eaton, who was stationed at Yangedine, was called in to assist.

Eggfruit not so Eggsellent!

February 2024

In a world of Solanaceous garden delights such as capsicums, tomatoes, chillies and eggplants, an unwelcome pest often goes unnoticed until harvest time: *Sceliodes cordalis*, more commonly known as the eggfruit caterpillar. This common garden grub has a craving for plants belonging to the Solanaceae family and can turn your hardearned produce into a feast for their insatiable appetite.

Biology and management

Eggfruit caterpillars begin their journey when the small brown moth lays her tiny, white oval eggs. These eggs are predominantly laid on the stem or calyx of the developing fruit. They hatch tiny white ravenous caterpillars, which bore into the fruit through the stem or calyx. This disguises their entry point. Munching and pooing their way through the inside of the fruit, the caterpillars often turn bright pink or red in colour as they mature. Eggfruit caterpillars are particularly hard to detect as there's rarely any external signs of infestation of the fruit. These gluttonous grubs eventually chew their way out of the fruit to pupate, and later emerge as adult moths.

Controlling this pest can be challenging and requires well-timed management during all life stages. Make sure to remove any weeds from the Solanaceous family (e.g., nightshade) to reduce their breeding sources in the garden. Moths and eggs can be controlled using light traps, or by spraying insecticidal soap on the calyx. These soaps can affect the delicate wings of the adult moth, making it too slippery for her eggs to stick to the calyx, and may also desiccate the eggs. As freshly hatched caterpillars, there is a very short window for control before they enter the fruit. Target the stems and calyx with caterpillar control products. Look for ingredients such as spinosad or the biological control 'BT' (Bacillus thruigiensis). These insecticides become virtually ineffective once the caterpillars burrow into the fruit, as they are well-protected inside. If infested fruit is found, remove and discard to break their lifecycle.

Report your capsicum criminals!

Although eggfruit caterpillars are a wellestablished species, it's the small white caterpillars that may be confused with the larvae of the non-established and reportable Queensland fruit fly (Qfly). Qfly is a significant pest of over 300 fruits and vegetables. You can report suspicious larvae in your produce to MyPestGuide or contact the Pest and Disease Information Service by sending in photos of the larvae and cut-open fruits. Report early to keep your Solanaceous garden delights safe from unwelcome feasters!

Alcohol - Taking Time to Consider Our Drinking Behaviours

When a new year comes around it gives us a chance to focus on ourselves, our drinking habits and the importance of a healthy balanced lifestyle. Speaking with a group of blokes about this, I asked them to have a think about their attitudes towards drinking which one bloke replied, "I just love the taste". This is a fair enough response, and it's also the same problem I have with my kids, who love ice cream and chocolate, but trying to teach them that you don't have it every day takes effort.

The fact that going alcohol-free for a month is seen as a challenge for many, highlights just how prevalent alcohol use is in Australia. Alcohol is our most widely used and most accepted drug, and over time it has formed part of our Aussie culture and identity. Its use and associations are many, including advertising, sport, social occasions, celebrations and within the workplace culture. Peer pressure does not only happen to teenagers! Think of the last time you were encouraged to have a drink when you were not planning to. As Joe E. Lewis once quoted "I distrust camels, and anyone else who can go a week without a drink". There seems to be an underlying normalisation, glamorisation and justification for drinking which is also present in pop-culture, movies (The Hangover) and social media (my friend who posts it's beer o'clock').

Now I am not saying I'm a shining light leading by example when it comes to abstaining from having a drink, my arm is often twisted a bit too easily. We should all take the chance to have a think about our own individual drinking habits, behaviours and attitudes:

- · What example do I set when I drink?
- · How often/how much am I drinking?
- Is it to relax?
- Is it to cope or deal with stress?
- · Is it habitual or has it become a dependency?

For those who do enjoy a night out, here are a few points to help reduce unhealthy drinking behaviours:

• What mood/state of mind am I in before I drink? Alcohol is a depressant but can also enhance negative behaviours i.e. anger, aggression and reckless risk taking;

What sort of situation/crowd am I drinking with? Personal safety is up to us! Am I with people I know and trust in a safe environment or am I out with random individuals in a public space?
Self-regulate by knowing your limits and plan ahead. Organise a designated driver, take a swag, don't risk it!

• Harm minimisation could involve having a decent meal before going out, serve finger food at parties and remember alcohol dehydrates so drink water before, during and after drinking alcohol;

• Having alcohol-free days is important. At least 2-3 days per week will show two benefits: 1, I can go without a drink and 2, has regenerative effects on the liver (along with many other health benefits).

I recently saw a creative post showing a picture of our political leaders with the caption *No matter who wins they will not fix your life, better plan on doing it yourself.* Like a lot of things in life, and especially alcohol, we can't expect governments and multimillion dollar ad campaigns to reduce the risk, control our use and fix alcohol related problems. Moderation, awareness, responsibility, and balance is the key to our alcohol use.



Main Roads will shortly be sealing the shoulders and rehabilitating the Great Southern Highway between Brookton and Beverley. Audible edge lines will also be installed.

Dates for construction are not yet confirmed. Works are likely to commence in January 2024 until April 2024 when there will be a break over winter and construction will resume around September/October 2024.


During rehabilitation works there will be width restrictions for heavy vehicles. If you need to move wide agricultural equipment during the times above please get in contact with us on 138 138 so that we can discuss movements.

There will also be a gravel surface and significant distances of speed restrictions during the works. We ask that you plan extra time for your journey.

Shoulder sealing and installing audible edge lines help prevent run-off road crashes by providing a greater distance for drivers who veer off the road to recover. These works are part of a program that will see more than 8,500 kilometres of rural roads treated and is a huge step towards preventing deaths or serious injury on our regional road network.

Timber bridge 311 (near Smart Road) is also due for replacement and the road will be realigned 2 kilometres either side of the bridge. This will be done at a future time.


