

President's Report 24/1/2011

Community Grants

The Shire has applied for \$20,000 from the Rural Business Development Corporations' Dry Season Assistance Scheme to be used for the purpose of fostering community spirit and providing community benefit. Council has resolved to invite interested community groups to submit an application for some of this funding to support an idea they may wish to progress on behalf of the community. Roads Inspection

A road inspection will be undertaken by Councillors and staff in the second week of February. If there is something you would like them to look at please let the office know by Monday 7th February.

Recreation Facilities Planning

On Thursday 10th February at 5.00pm Mark Casserly from CCS Strategic Management will make a presentation to Councillors and community group representatives regarding the feasibility report he has prepared in relation to recreation facilities at the Beverley Oval. Meeting venue: Amenities Building.

Forward Capital Works Plan

Local Governments are required to develop a 5 year Forward Capital Works Plan and funding has been provided by the Department of Regional Development and Lands for this to occur. The plan addresses infrastructure assets only and is a program of capital projects anticipated to be undertaken by the Council, whether it be through renewal, expansion, upgrade or new assets. It is to be reviewed annually, linking into the budget and 4 year financial plan and also provides useful information in relation to funding sources and funding gaps of proposed works. Councillors were involved in a workshop during January to help finalise the Beverley document.

Beverley Gym

Have you been thinking about joining? There are currently 42 members, and the maintenance, cleaning and replacement costs involved in providing this facility are easier justified with the more members there are. Rate Pavers Survey

The Shire of Beverley will shortly commence the process of writing the documents that will guide the development of the Shire for the next 10 years. To guide the content of the documents, it is critical that the Shire obtains direction from the people that live here, by seeking community views and comments.

The proposed Local Planning Strategy (LPS) will be a broad land use strategy that will ensure that there is coordinated development of the area and it will outline where development/subdivision is supported and not supported. The Corporate Strategic Plan (CSP) will guide the social and economic development of Beverley.

While the LPS focuses on land use considerations (e.g. development, subdivision, zoning and infrastructure coordination), the CSP is concerned with business and job creation opportunities as well as lifestyle outcomes. Both documents consider wide ranging economic, resource management, environmental and social issues at a strategic level.

These strategic plans will have a direct impact on all members of the community. Therefore it is important the community has input into how they are written. These are your strategic plans. The plans will influence how you will live in Beverley and the opportunities that are afforded. This is your opportunity to influence the development of Beverley. Although there will be further more extensive opportunities to comment prior to the strategic plans being finalised, once finalised the plans will directly influence Beverley's development for years to come.

If you have concerns about the rules and regulations that govern development in Beverley, if you do not like aspects of the way Beverley has developed, if you want to influence the future of the Shire, come and have your say at the community consultation day on 24th February 2011 at the Beverley Town Hall. The Shire needs your direction.

Hello Beverley,

The month of January has been an interesting one for the start of the year, but all in all from a policing perspective not too bad;-). Now it is the start of February and the kids go back to school (parents cheer) and those lucky enough to have extended holidays will now get back on the band wagon and head back to work.

Whilst the wheels get back in motion, please remember that the school zones are 40km/per hour in and around all schooling facilities. The school zones will be monitored so ensure that you are all doing the right thing.

Whilst on that note, as well as monitoring school zones, local police are targeting SEATBELTS. are still too many children either not in a seatbelt at all or not correctly restrained in a child seat. If your child is in a seat, GREAT, however if they do not have the belt fastened correctly you are still liable for a hefty fine. It is soooo important to ensure the safety of your children whilst in any vehicle (they are precious). If your child is 7 years of age or under, they are not legally permitted to sit in the front seat and must be in a child restraint. For more information on child restraints, please feel free to come into the police station and grab an information sheet from the front counter. I have noticed that it is not just children who forget to wear seatbelts; there are a couple of re-offending adults in this town who continually drive without a seatbelt, YOU WILL BE FINED! Moral of the story, put it on, it will save your life.

Four Wheel motor bikes (unregistered): There have been a number of complaints with regards to a small handful of quad bikes getting around on Railway Street, Forrest Street, and Bartram Street. Unregistered vehicles are not permitted to be on the road under any

circumstances. The road on Railway Street is partially gravelled; it is still a road and therefore if you are caught riding you will be summonsed to appear in court. I understand that there are a couple of you that are not necessarily behaving recklessly, however it is disturbing others and so therefore it is an issue that police will now act upon. Quad bikes can be ridden on private property, unfortunately that's about it too.

FACEBOOK: Ahhhhhhh, our worst Our young people of nightmare: Beverley have become more and more reckless about the information, rumours, bullying and innuendo that is being posted on the internet, in particular Facebook. Parents it is vital that internet use is properly supervised. Get techy and learn how to navigate Facebook (its actually pretty user friendly). Your children are using these internet sites via their mobile phones (or each other's) and often during school. We as a community need to work together and tighten the reins on this issue, its getting out of hand. The seriousness of some of the content on this website, put there by our own local young people can land them in jail (I AM NOT JOKING!). Please have a family meeting and talk about facebook and other social networking sites that your kids may be using.

Now: the Beverley Police with the tremendous support of the Shire of Beverley, have set up a FREE Charity Concert to be held on the town oval on the 26 FEB 2011, 5.30pm -10.30pm. The event is called 'FROM ONE EXTREME TO THE OTHER' (Drought to Flood). concert is designed to build community resilience in the aftermath of our driest season on record. Our drought declared region has seen many a farmer scratching their heads and wondering if it's worth carrying on. As a community we would like to recognise the hard work that farmers do on a daily

basis, and give them a night out free of worry surrounded by the support of our local community.

THREE BANDS WILL BE PLAYING ON THE NIGHT, THERE WILL BE FACE PAINTING, BALLOONS AND A BOUNCY CASTLE FOR THE KIDS. IT IS AN **ALCOHOL FREE EVENT**, BRING YOUR FAMILY AND A PICNIC AND ENJOY THE NIGHT.

Donations will be graciously received for our Carnarvon neighbours, who are still trying to recover from the devastating floods. All donations received will go to the 'Lord Mayors Disaster Relief Fund." This fund is specifically designed to assist the flood victims of our North West region of Western Australia, namely Carnarvon and surrounding communities.

from Robyn McSweeney MLC, Minister for Child Protection: Community Services; Seniors and **Volunteering; Women's Interests;** Youth.

In 2009, the Barnett Government introduced the Seniors Safety and Security Rebate, which enables Seniors Card holders to claim a rebate of up to \$200 per household towards buying and installing eligible home security devices. have embraced the scheme and are appreciative of the financial assistance available to them to improve home security.

Since the program's introduction, seniors have requested that the rebate be extended to include items that prevent electrical faults and provide warning of a fire. response to these concerns, and in light of the evidence of fatalities due to fire and electrical faults, I am please to advise that the Seniors Safety and Security Rebate has been extended to cover eligible electrical and fire safety items. This now means a Seniors Card holder can claim up to \$200 on the purchase and/or installation of residual currency devices, mains wired smoke alarms, fire extinguishers and blankets.

This is in addition to the \$200 available for the purchase and/or installation of home security products. Seniors Card holders who have already accessed the \$200 home security rebate may also apply for the electrical and fire safety rebate.

Both components of the Safety and Security Scheme will end on 30 June 2012, and Seniors Card holders must lodge an application prior to the 31st March 2012.

As Minister for Seniors, I will continue to encourage initiatives that assist Seniors to feel safe and secure in their own homes, while maintaining their independence.

As a WA Seniors Card holder, you can claim a rebate of up to \$200 per household towards buying and/or installing eligible home security devices whether you own or rent your home. A further \$200 per household is available for the purchase and installation of electrical and fire safety items.



The project is targeted towards people aged between 12 to 25 years and living within the Government's Drought Pilot Region in Western Australia.

Keep watch for weeds

The public has been reminded to keep watch for significant weeds which could germinate after recent rainfall.

The call from the Department of Agriculture and Food comes after the discovery of the declared weed Mexican Poppy in Bunbury.

Technical officer Brett Vukelic said six plants had been discovered on a construction site in the city during a routine inspection by the department.

"Mexican Poppy is a P2 declared weed in the South West, which means it must be destroyed," Mr Vukelic said.

"While it is established in the WA rangelands, it is rarely seen in the South West.

"The discovery is a good reminder for the public to remain alert and to check the department's website or to call its Pest and Disease Information Service to get any suspect weeds identified." The department is coordinating the removal of the plants and is investigating the source of the infestation.

The blue-green-grey plant grows to one metre in height, has extremely prickly leaves, pale yellow poppy-like flowers, hollow stems and a 'pepper shaker' seed capsule. The plant oozes yellow latex if cut.

Mexican Poppy is native to central America but is now found in Queensland, New South Wales and WA.

The weed is toxic to stock but few deaths occur as the plant is unpalatable and not readily eaten, however seed contamination could pose a risk to stock feed.

Foetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder

Foetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder (FASD) describes various effects that may occur in a foetus whose mother consumed alcohol during pregnancy, the most extreme form is Foetal Alcohol Syndrome (FAS). The effects of Foetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder can last a lifetime and include physical, mental, behavioural and learning disabilities.

Alcohol is harmful to a foetus as it is a neurotoxin (poison) and a teratogen which is a substance proven to cause birth defects and permanent brain injury. Areas of foetal development that may be interrupted include normal growth being inhibited, facial features developing abnormally and permanent brain damage occurring.

There is no known safe amount of alcohol that can be consumed during pregnancy. The National Health and Medical Research Council recommends that not drinking alcohol is the safest option for women who are pregnant or planning a pregnancy.

"It is important to support women who are pregnant or planning pregnancy to not consume alcohol. This may be achieved by providing non-alcoholic drinks at social occasions, selecting outings less focused on alcohol (a movie rather than the pub) and encouraging their partners to abstain from alcohol prior to and during pregnancy", stated Danielle Williams, local Health Promotion Officer.






