#### PRESIDENT'S REPORT 21 December 2010

# Local Government Structural Reform

The issue of representation was again debated at the December Regional Transition Group (RTG) meeting held in Quairading and it was again resolved to address representation when more information was available through development of the Regional Business Plan.

It is proposed to hold a function for all Councillors within the South East Avon Regional Transition Group early in the New Year, involving Beverley, Cunderdin, Quairading, Tammin and York.

#### **Community Grants**

The Shire has applied for \$20,000 from the Rural Business Development Corporations' Dry Season Assistance Scheme to be used for the purpose of fostering community spirit and providing community benefit. Council has resolved to invite interested community groups to submit an application for some of this funding to support an idea they may wish to progress on behalf of the community. Please see details and submission requirements elsewhere in Blarney.

#### <u>Railway Station Community</u> <u>Christmas Event</u>

Poor seasonal conditions and the desire of the Beverley Art Gallery Society to hold a community Christmas event at the Platform Theatre saw them team up with Regional Development Australia, the Shire and a very generous local sponsor to bring the "Variety Youth Choir" and band "Shine" to Beverley for a free family concert.

"Fantastic", "awesome", "amazing", were some of the comments following the "Let hope Shine through the Dust" Christmas Concert and Picnic held on 17<sup>th</sup> December. Family, community and friends who attended were in awe of what an amazing facility has been created in our town at the Railway Station Precinct.

The use of the Platform Theatre by the school for their presentation night and then the family concert two nights later are an indication of the capability of the venue and the Beverley Art Gallery Society are to be congratulated for their inspiration, determination and hard work in driving the development of this facility.

#### Grain Transport Routes

Beverley has raised concerns in relation to the lack of consideration toward potential grain traffic on the Quairading to York Road following announcement of closure of the tier three rail line between Quairading and York and the announcement of \$10M funding to upgrade the Quairading to Cunderdin Road under the premise that grain will be trucked directly to the standard gauge line.

#### **Roads Inspection**

A road inspection will be undertaken by Councillors and staff on Thursday 10<sup>th</sup> February 2011. If there is something you would like them to look at please let the office know.

#### Mobile Telephone Coverage Deficiency Survey

Council needs your assistance to develop a register of problem areas in our shire relating to mobile phone coverage. Please complete the survey included in this Blarney and return to the Shire office as soon as possible.

#### Avondale Plan

Work on the "Avondale Masterplan" is progressing. A Flora & Fauna Management Plan is underway and a draft Farm Management Plan has been presented to the Steering Committee. A consultant has also been nominated to progress the Business Planning process. The Shire President and Deputy Shire President are representatives on the Steering Committee.

Don't forget to have a look at the aerial view "Opportunities" Masterplan for Avondale which is on display in the window of the Shire Office for public interest and comment.

#### Local Emergency Management Committee

A meeting was recently held at the Council Chambers to reactivate the Local Emergency Management Committee. Representatives from the Shire, Police, FESA, Bush Fire Brigade, Ambulance and Beverley Hospital were present.

#### PLANNING FOR THE FUTURE DEVELOPMENT OF TOWNS AND RURAL AREAS COMMENCES

The Shire of Brookton and the Shire of Beverley have recently agreed to commence the process of reviewing the planning, for the future of both municipalities, for the next 10 years.

The proposed Local Planning Strategy (LPS) will be a broad land use strategy that will ensure that there is coordinated development of the area.


While the LPS focuses on land use considerations (e.g. development, subdivision, zoning and infrastructure coordination), it also considers wide ranging economic, resource management, environmental and social issues at a strategic level.

A finalised LPS will influence the direction and type of development/ subdivision in the townsites and throughout the municipalities. It will set out longer term directions for land use and development including the growth of urban areas and other forms of subdivision/development including hobby farms (now called rural-residential and rural small holding areas).

The Shires do not have a LPS. A Joint District Rural Strategy was finalised in 2000. While it is still used, given it is the key strategic planning document for the Shires, some aspects are now dated.

The process of formulating the LPS has recently commenced. An *Issues Paper* has been prepared (www.beverley.wa.gov.au) and recently the Shires have appointed *Edge Planning & Property* (town planning consultancy) to prepare the draft LPS.

There are a number of opportunities to get involved throughout the



process. Wide ranging consultation is proposed prior to formulating the draft LPS and during the formal advertising stage.

The process for preparing and finalising a LPS typically takes time. Realistically, it is expected the Brookton-Beverley LPS will be finalised in 2012.

#### Don't turn a Night out into a Nightmare

Have you or a friend ever lost a valuable item such as a phone or wallet after a night out? Or maybe something more serious, like said or done something you regret, been in an accident or ended up in an emergency department after a night out?

Local Health Promotion Officer, Danielle Williams stated that, "These things happen far too often in our community as a result of people getting drunk. But you can stop these incidents from happening to you by making responsible decisions and always planning ahead for a night out ".

"For example, eat before and while you are drinking, organise a lift home or take a swag, alternate your drinks with non-alcoholic drinks and avoid drinking games. One of the most powerful actions you can take is to stand up for others facing peer pressure. If you feel comfortable, take a stand against those who pressure others into drinking", stated Danielle Williams.

"You can even suggest activities that you and your friends can do that are not centred around excessive alcohol consumption, such as a Wi night, movie night or dinner where everyone brings a specially cooked dish. Or hang out with friends that make you feel good about yourself and who don't pressure you into drinking", stated Danielle Williams.

The new national guidelines for alcohol consumption recommend that adults drink **no more than four standard drinks on a single occasion** to reduce the risk of alcohol-related injury arising from that occasion.



Hello all,

With the start of a new year Kerry and I want to give you some crime prevention advice.

Tips when leaving your home:

- At night, leave inside lights on which would normally be on if you were at home;
- Consider using electronic timing devices that turn the TV, radio or lights on and off at selected times;
- Keep doors and windows locked at all times and activate alarm systems when leaving your home;
- Consider installing movement-activated external lighting; and
- Make windows more secure by fitting locks, security screens or external roller shutters.

Tips when leaving you vehicle:

- Always lock your vehicle
- Never leave keys in the ignition even when filling up with petrol or popping into the shop
- Ensure windows including sunroofs are closed

If you leave cash, GPS units, CD's, bank cards, handbags, laptop computers, cash, and mobile telephones in your vehicle you increase the risk of your vehicle being targeted by an offender. Remove valuable items from your vehicle to avoid being a victim of crime.

Remember that preventing crime is everyone's business, by taking a few simple precautions you can make life harder for criminals and protect yourself, your belongings and your home.

For non-urgent police matters and advice on reporting crime, call the Police Assistance Centre on 131 444. If you have information on criminal activity, call <u>Crime Stoppers</u> on 1800 333 000 and if you wish, your call can be treated as anonymous.

Telephone and email scams are becoming more of an occurrence and you need to be vigilant about giving your personal details to people. Giving your credit card details or bank details to organisations over the phone or by email may see you become a victim of these scams. My advice to you is to be wary of anyone asking for these details. Confirm the details of the person you are dealing with. This may mean ringing the company they say they're phoning from and confirming their details. If you have any concerns regarding these scams, contact Consumer Protection on 1300 30 40 54.

Just remember that if it is too good to be true. Then it probably is.



# Nominations open for rural women's group.

Women from across the State are invited to become involved in the Rural Remote and Regional (RRR) Women's Network of Western Australia.

Agriculture and Food Minister Terry Redman today encouraged rural and regional women who wanted to make a difference to nominate for the network's reference group.

"Women who are active in their local community and interested in areas including health, education, small business, agribusiness, local government and indigenous affairs would be an asset to this reference group," Mr Redman said.

The reference group's role is to set the strategic direction for the RRR network, a State-wide communications network for women.

"The network brings together women from rural and remote areas of WA to recognise, promote and expand the contribution they make in their communities," the Minister said.

Expressions of interest are being called for the positions of chair and a member of the reference group for a three-year term. Reference group members will be appointed by the Agriculture and Food Minister and the Regional Development Minister.

Regional Development Minister Brendon Grylls said the diversity of the RRR network's members was a vital ingredient to its success.

"The network brings together the views and values of women from different backgrounds, skills, industry sectors and from across all parts of the State," Mr Grylls said.

"It also examines key issues impacting on rural and regional communities. I urge all interested women to nominate by the closing date of Monday, January 31, 2011." 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#### Funding boost to rural boarders as country hostels mark 50 years.

The State Government has boosted financial assistance to families whose children board away from home in the 50th anniversary of one of the State's best-known country boarding services.

The Country High School Hostels Authority (CHSHA) tonight celebrated half a century of providing accommodation to high school students from some of the most remote parts of Western Australia.

Speaking at the 50-year celebrations, Education Minister Liz Constable said the authority's nine co-educational boarding facilities had been a vital provision for students attending country schools from Broome to Esperance.

"Since 1960, CHSHA boarding accommodation has enabled rural parents to send their children to a more accessible high school in a nearby town as an alternative to going to boarding school in Perth," Dr Constable said.

Regional Development Minister Brendon Grylls said the Government had again this year provided an increase in financial assistance to parents whose children board away from home.

"This year, Royalties for Regions is again playing a key role in boosting the State Boarding Away from Home Allowance to \$2,050, an increase on 2009 and a big improvement on 2008 when it was just \$1,215," Mr Grylls said.

"This allowance is extremely important for families, some of whom are experiencing financial hardship due to the economic downturn and drought conditions."

Former State Governor Lieutenant General John Sanderson and champion Olympic athlete Shirley Strickland have been among the students who have boarded at CHSHA colleges.

CHSHA operates boarding facilities at Broome, Geraldton, Moora, Merredin, Narrogin, Northam, Albany, Esperance and a metropolitan campus for gifted and talented students at City Beach.

"Throughout the years, the State Government has continued to invest in CHSHA facilities," Dr Constable said.

"Major additions and improvements have taken place in Narrogin and Albany and I was delighted to officially open Albany Residential College earlier this year."

Dr Constable said some changes to the design of boarding facilities in the past 50 years had seen open dormitories give way to bedroom studies, with integrated bathrooms rather than being in one ablution block.



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#### Increase to Seniors Card Safety and Security Rebate as Fire Season Commences

Jim Chown MLC, Member for the Agricultural Region has urged all Western Australian Seniors Card holders to take advantage of an additional \$200 into the current Seniors Card Safety and Security Rebate towards fire safety and electrical devices.

The initial scheme, introduced in July 2009, included the allocated monies for the purchase of up to \$200 for security devices such as alarms, security door screens and sensor lights.

Mr. Chown explained that the expan-

sion for the scheme effectively allows further opportunities for seniors to protect their homes and will allow seniors to continue to claim up to \$200 towards security devices, as well as up to \$200 towards fire and electricity safety.


"The threats of home invasion or electrical faults are concerns for every Western Australian senior citizen, which is why the Barnett Government is contributing more towards additional safety devices in homes of seniors." Mr Chown said.

"Every person deserves to feel safe in their homes, and the WA State Government has increased the funding for this scheme in the hope that Western Australian Seniors will be able to address their personal safety needs."

"The additional \$200 rebate can be put towards the purchase and installation of such items as fire extinguishers, fire blankets, mainspowered smoke alarms and residual current devices."

"I encourage seniors within the Agricultural Region to take advantage of this offer as we enter the fire season, to help increase home safety and peace of mind."

"We recognise that when the agriculture industry is experiencing hardship, so too do local businesses," Ms Finlayson said.

"The grants are easy to access and quick to process and are provided via a voucher system through the SBDC and Small Business Centres.

"The first step in accessing the grants is to arrange a 'needs assessment' to establish which services will best suit individual circumstances. This assessment can be undertaken by an SBDC Business Advisor, or your local Small Business Centre Manager, and a voucher for an amount of up to \$1,500 can be provided."


Once a voucher has been issued, an appointment can be made with the applicant's preferred service provider. Wherever possible, applicants are encouraged to engage the services of local providers to allow a flow-on benefit to local businesses.

Payment for services rendered will be made by the SBDC, directly to the service provider. "The State Government has allocated \$500,000 to help small businesses in declared areas and we are keen to ensure these funds are used in the most effective way possible," Ms Finlayson said.

In addition, the SBDC can provide free advice on cashflow, debt management, and business planning as well as referrals to other relevant services and information.

#### Why Taking a Break is Important

After the season we have had everyone is thinking of ways to pull in our expenditure and cut their budgets. One thing that should not be deleted is a holiday. In the scheme of things the cost of a holiday is not a major expense and it is critical to take a break.

We often hear about physical detox programs. We are aware that we sometimes need to take action to cleanse our body of various toxins, and we know that it has a huge impact on our physical health; consider a holiday break as a detox program for our minds.

This year has been particularly difficult for many which means that distress levels are significantly above normal thus making the need to take a break more important than ever. Sometimes we can consider holidays a luxury, and expendable, this thinking can be a risk to our wellbeing and very counter-productive with our capacity to think clearly.

When we consider our reaction to a holiday it is important to understand how our body and mind reacts to the process of rejuvenation. - The first part is usually the time we feel exhausted and sometimes a bit sick with headaches or digestive problems. This reaction is normal; our body is dumping out distress. It seems this happens to many people and can put people off taking holidays. (People make comments that every time they go on holiday they get sick, so I don't have holidays any more). If you are one of these people your body is giving you a pretty clear message, take a break!
- After this we usually relax and enjoy ourselves. This second phase is when we forget our worries and just switch off and make the most of where we are,

not worrying too much about the problems at home.

The third phase starts a couple of days before we head back home. Our brain starts getting back to business, but usually with a refreshed approach and a more focused and positive attitude looking for solutions going forward.

Personally I think this happens because we tend to focus our attention, while on holidays, on fun and family, these are the important aspects of our life that will sustain us no matter how difficult things are back home.

I hope you can all get away sometime over the next two months, see it as positive therapy, not a burden on the budget, it will definitely help going into 2011.


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# Check ewe condition before joining

Sheep producers are advised to monitor the condition score of their ewes and to carefully evaluate feed strategies before joining them to maximise the value of their flock.

Department of Agriculture and Food development officer Mandy Curnow said research had shown ewes joined in condition score 3 could make a significant difference to reproductive rate of the sheep flock and therefore the income earned.

Research by the department and Victorian Department of Primary Industries as part of the lifetimewool project, funded by Australian Wool Innovation, has demonstrated ewes in better condition have higher fertility and weaning rates.

"The impact of extra condition at joining equates to an average response of about 20 extra lambs per 100 ewes per additional condition score – although some flocks are more responsive than others," she said.

"In WA we have seen a range of between an extra five lambs and 35 lambs per 100 ewes between score 3 and 2 at joining.

"With lambs worth about \$50 per head net of production costs, that is a considerable increase in the potential income from lambs turned off."

The research also showed the production performance of progeny from ewes in better condition was also superior, boosting the value of the overall flock.

But with grain prices so high, Ms Curnow cautioned growers to do their sums carefully before embarking on supplementary feeding to increase rather than just maintain condition.

"In a poor season there is an increased likelihood of ewes being at lower condition at joining, particularly for winter lambing flocks," she said.

"Generally, it doesn't pay to feed grain to gain condition score, especially at today's prices, as the value of extra production is less than the cost of extra feed."

Ms Curnow also cautioned producers on the use of 'flushing' animals with lupins to increase ovulation rates prior to joining. "Although it is often spectacularly successful in late lambing flocks, it is variable and can be quite expensive on a whole flock basis when feeding at rates of up to 500 grams per head per day at a cost of about \$280 per 100 ewes," she said.

"Also, if ewes are in low condition they can be more responsive to lupins, however, they are unlikely to put on condition over autumn and then are at greater risk in late pregnancy and birth."





Both Beau and Daniel played very well and from their results have been chosen in the Wheatbelt Under 14 Development Squad.


