National General Assembly of Local Government

Council supported my attendance at the above event in Canberra in June, where I joined with representatives from our RTG partners to hear updates, network with other Council representatives and seek information for our grouping relating to regional development, health and aging, NBN and also meet with Tony Crook MP at Parliament House. This collective approach was worthwhile as the population of our communities are quite small when compared to many of the Eastern states councils.

The conference was opened by the Prime Minister with around 80 of the 900 delegates from WA.



SHIRE OF BEVERLEY CORPORATE STRATEGIC PLAN

The Shire of Beverley has initiated a new draft Strategic Plan to guide community development over the next five years to ensure that the hopes and aspirations of our residents are integrated into the government's reform process which is currently underway.

In addition to the work Council is undertaking, funding has been provided by the government to engage consultants to assist in the wider planning process being investigated for the Regional Transition grouping of Beverley, Cunderdin, Quairading, Tammin and York to provide an overarching plan for the region into which our plan would integrate.

The Government has also provided funding for the development of a Forward Capital Works Plan to address the requirements of the Shire over the next five years. This plan sets out how infrastructure will be funded, how funds will be spent and also identifies funding deficiencies.

To assist Council to test the assumptions and responses it has received that underpin the draft plan, a **public meeting is proposed in the Town Hall on Tuesday, 5 July 2011, commencing at 7.00 pm** and we strongly urge you to attend.



**THE GIFT OF SIGHT - WA
LIONS CELEBRATE 25 YEARS**



Lions Clubs all over Western Australia will celebrate the 25th anniversary of the Lions Eye Bank on July 1.

The creation of the Eye Bank remains one of many major achievements of the Lions Save-Sight Foundation (WA) Inc., which was formed at the Lions 1970 conference in Albany.

Beverley Lions Club Inc, public relations chairman, Lion Marion Alexander said Lions members were instrumental in the formation and funding of the Eye Bank in Western Australia.

'Since its inception in 1986, more than 3400 people have received corneal transplants—vastly improving their quality of life by improving or restoring their vision,' she said.

'Local Lions members should be proud of their contribution to improving the health and life quality of so many Western Australians.'

Lions Save-Sight Foundation Chairman PCC Ambrose Depiazzi said the Foundation also opened up community discussion about the often sensitive issue of tissue donation.

'We knew that corneal transplantation was the only option for many people who were blind because their corneas were damaged or diseased,' he said.

'We set about finding ways to raise public awareness about the benefits of corneal transplantation and along with the Australian Kidney Foundation developed a donor pledge card which allowed people to make an informed choice.'

As well as forming the Lions Eye Bank, the Lions Save-Sight Foundation also established the Lions Chair in Ophthalmology at The University of Western Australia in 1975, which led to the creation of the internationally-renowned Lions Eye Institute (LEI) in 1983.

LEI Managing Director Professor David Mackey said as a not-for-profit organisation, the Institute relied heavily on community support.

'The Lions Clubs in Western Australia have been extraordinary and their leadership has allowed us to fund vital equipment, scholarships and research over many years,' he said.

'Right from the beginning, the Lions Save-Sight Foundation set itself the objective of creating programs that educate, prevent and cure eye disease - as well as establish a world-leading research centre. It is a great legacy to the people of Western Australia and the wider world.'



Cybersecurity for Small and Medium Enterprises

Very few businesses operate without some form of online activity, whether it's banking, buying and selling, a company website or just an email account.

To be effective, Australian businesses need to be online.

Growth in online transactions for and by Australian businesses has been phenomenal. Online transactions service PayPal – a National Cybersecurity Awareness Week partner – represents more than 34,000 Australian businesses and has seen transactions increase 19 per cent year on year.¹

Managing cybersecurity risk is just one of the many challenges for any successful business, but particularly for small to medium size enterprises (SMEs). If risk is not managed, the impact of cybersecurity breaches can be costly and time consuming and, using the example of customer or client information being accessed, can lead to legal issues and reputation damage.

Many SMEs don't have or can't justify quality in-house technical support to help assess and manage cybersecurity risk. Home-based businesses can be even more exposed where family members may also use business computers and other communications technology for their own purposes.

An investment in new technology for a SME must have a clear benefit to the business. When doing the sums on technology upgrades or extensions, SME owners and operators should factor in costs for appropriate security software and other mechanisms to protect business integrity.

The Department of Broadband, Communications and the Digital Economy has listed its top tips to help Australians be secure online. Whilst these messages target consumers, they are equally important for SMEs:

1. Install and renew your security software and set it to scan regularly.
 2. Turn on automatic updates on all your software, including your operating system and other applications.
 3. Think carefully before you click on links and attachments, particularly in emails and on social networking sites.
 4. Regularly adjust your privacy settings on social networking sites.
 5. Report or talk to someone about anything online that makes you uncomfortable or threatened – download the Government's Cyber-safety Help Button.
 6. Stop and think before you post any photos or financial or personal information about yourself, your friends or family.
 7. Use strong passwords and change them at least twice a year.
 8. Talk within your family about good online safety.

HANDY HINTS

For would-be winners in the next Beverley show.

These tips were given by Aileen Hickey from the CWA who was a well known instructor and show judge.

Schedule: check the rules, the judge has to judge according to the schedule, so you must enter according to the schedule, e.g., 3 distinct varieties means 3 different varieties.

Collection: 2 or more is a collection

Preserves: No manufacturers' names, trademarks, etc. on jars and lids. If painting lids, do so well ahead, say 12 months, to prevent paint smell. No rust inside lids. Clean and dust jars. To present for judging, do not use wet cloth to clean jars, use paper towel. The best thing for polishing jars is an old stocking.

Jam: must be properly set. The jam must not move if you tip the jar of jam upside down. No bubbles in the jam. Labels should be in proportion to the jar, not wrapped around the whole jar. Place label 2/3 to 3/4 up jar, not at the bottom of the jar.

Cakes: Line tins properly. Prevent bubbles in the cake by mixing smoothly. No rack marks on top or bottom of cakes—this will lose points. If your cake cracks across the top it is usually because the mixture is too dry or oven temperature is not correct.

Scones: Scones should be uniform in size with even colour and no sogginess.

Flowers:

Specimen: One only, no buds. Remove buds carefully.

Bowl: width is 1½ times height. Opening is half the width. A container is anything that is not a bowl.

Arrangements: height - 1½ times above the vase. Present on a mat, doyley, etc.

Confidence online doesn't make you cyber secure

Australia's a big country, and it's a big world – and so much of it is at our fingertips thanks to the reach of the internet and the communications technology in the hands of just about everybody.

Mobile phones are now much more than just a tool for making calls. The smartphone revolution has changed what we do with a handset. PayPal Australia noted that in 2010 alone the total number of mobile payments made through it increased 14 fold.¹

Most Australians update their phones every two years, so it's easy to see how forecasts that smartphones will reach 100 per cent take-up in the next two yearsⁱⁱ are well-founded. With so many Australians having access to this technology, it makes sense that many more things that we once required a computer for are now possible on our phones.

But just like with a computer online, taking risks with cybersecurity on your phone can mean unwittingly sharing personal information. What information do you have on your phone? Email accounts? Address books? Diaries? Is your phone password protected? For many people the smartphone is a convenient all-in-one pocket-sized necessity.

The checklist here allows anybody to assess if their phone data is as secure as it should be:

- Turn on security features
- Put a PIN on your phone and a different one on your SIM card
- Encrypt your data
- Install security software from a reputable provider
- Check for updates to your phone's operating system regularly
- Be smart with WiFi
- Back up your data regularly
- If you decide to recycle your phone, make sure you delete all your personal information first



What to do with your tax return – save, invest or spend?

So you've just put in your tax return and are waiting patiently for some of your hard earned cash to come back your way. Some of us may already have an idea of how we want to spend the money, but for those who haven't here are some things to consider. Firstly, sit down on your own or with a planner and focus on your financial goals, assessing your needs versus wants. It may even help to list five goals that you require money to achieve. This should then make it easier to decide on the best approach to either save, spend, or invest your tax return.

To Save

For shorter-term goals, it's hard to go past a high interest savings account. Online savings accounts are on offer by most banking institutions and credit unions, and term deposits also offer competitive interest rates. For any savings option, it's important to shop around for the right product, remembering to compare fees. With so many great deals around and consumer awareness at its peak, banking institutions have come up with enticing deals to stay competitive. Also look at the fine print and keep in mind the deadline for your short term goal. Term deposits typically have a penalty for early withdrawal and some high interest deposit accounts require minimum monthly deposits or zero withdrawals in order to 'earn' the higher interest rate for the month. Paying off debt is also a form of saving. An extra lump sum payment towards your credit card debt, personal loan or mortgage can save you significant amounts in interest and reduce the overall time it takes you to pay these off.

To Invest

Investing your tax return may be more suitable for your medium and longer-term financial goals. Investing into your super fund may be a smart option if you are eligible for the Government Co-contribution. For those eligible, the Government will dollar match non-concessional (personal after-tax) contributions to super up to a maximum of \$1,000. There are not many other investment strategies that can achieve a 100 per cent return within one year. Other investment strategies that can benefit from the extra annual top up include managed funds and share portfolios. Your investment decisions should take into account your expected timeframe to access the funds and should always relate back to your goals. Your personal risk profile should also factor in to your decision making. Speaking to a financial planner will help you identify your level of comfort with respect to investment market volatility and the risks of investing versus the expected returns. Knowing where you sit on the scale between conservative and aggressive can help guide your decisions when it comes to investing your hard earned money in the stock market.

To Spend

Unfortunately (or fortunately for some) getting our tax return back the same time as stocktake sales can be too tempting for many. Some spending is necessary to ensure we have the basics, like household items or insurance (or sometimes that new pair of shoes!), so play it smart and think about those top five financial goals that you need money to achieve. Being able to direct some or all of your tax return to a spending goal might enable you to tick a top five item off your list and provide some motivation towards planning for the other four goals.

Sprouting Seeds

I believe sprouts are vital for health in the 21st century. As mentioned in last month's Blarney, it is living food. When we eat sprouts daily, we provide building material for the growth and repair of the body. It is preventive medicine. Sprouts are literally super foods to build health and act as a prophylactic, meaning sprouts act to prevent illness.

Using a big variety of sprouts will give you all you need to provide the body with wholesome food. They have a cleansing action that stimulates the body to flush out toxic wastes.

Growing sprouts is fun.

It is an activity that children can take part in, and even be responsible for, in the home. They grow quickly and watching the progress brings wonderment to the eyes of children (and adults) I may add. It never ceases to make me happy if the tiny roots emerge from a closed seed.

Methods of sprouting seeds.

Little or no expense is required to get started with sprouting. A clear glass jar lets you watch the transformation and different stages of the growing seed. Straight, wide-necked jars are practical and easy for cleaning and removing the swollen seeds. For years I have used 1 litre Fowlers Vacola preserving jars and I find these a good size for two people. Most of the time I have 2 or 3 different sprouts growing. *Whatever containers are used for any sprouts, cleanliness of utensils is important.* Besides several glass jars you will also need:

- Several pieces of net type material to fit over the jars, about 8 cm larger in diameter than the jars. These pieces of material could be of net curtain material, nylon material, cheese cloth or even mosquito netting or nylon fly gauze, in fact anything that will allow water to flow through quickly and fine enough, so that the seed being sprouted cannot escape through the weave of the fabric. I have even used Chux cloth. However I have permanently settled for nylon fly gauze, this can be boiled in hot water now and then to be sterilised.
- A few strong rubber bands for

securing the net over the top of the jars, to hold the seeds in, when the jar is placed upside down for draining the rinse water away. Again I use old rubber seals from the Vacola jars, the small and the large one depending on the jar. They are strong and hold the gauze and the weight of the sprouts when tipping over.

- You also need an assortment of sprouts to start with. To get started with seeds in a jar, try mung beans, alfalfa, fenugreek and lentils as these are good varieties to begin your sprouting career. Use 1 – 2 tablespoon of seeds to a 1 litre jar. As seeds can expand in volume approximately 8-10 times during germination, keep in mind, that 1 rounded tablespoon of seed can sprout to 1 cup full or more. The smaller the seed variety, the greater will be the increase in volume (eg. 1-2 tablespoon alfalfa seed may expand to 3-4 cups of sprouts, 1 cup lentil seeds to 5-6 cups of sprouts, 1 cup mung bean seeds to 9-10 cups of sprouts). And you need good water to rinse your sprouts during the day. During the hot whether it is necessary to rinse them 2 -3 times a day. In warm weather seeds grow considerably faster than during cooler winter temperatures. Always let the water drain thoroughly.

HENG'S RECIPE

TERIYAKI BEEF WITH STIR FRY MIXED VEGETABLES

INGREDIENTS

Two pieces of thick cut Scotch Fillet Steak
Teriyaki Sauce
Oyster Sauce
Sesame Oil

Broccolini
Zucchini
Cherry Tomatoes
Coriander



METHOD

Marinate two thick cut pieces of Scotch fillet steak with Japanese Teriyaki sauce. Grill over hot cast iron plate or BBQ plate 3 minutes approx each side. Preferably medium rare.

Stir fry zucchini and other vegetables, broccolini, carrots and cherry tomatoes for colour in oyster sauce (4 tbs). Add salt to taste. Sprinkle a small dash of sesame oil.

Arrange sliced grilled steak above vegetables and garnish with fresh coriander leaves. Sprinkle some pepper.

Inspecting your seeds especially the larger ones is a must. Broken seeds, debris and stones, which obviously will not sprout, can kill a whole batch of sprouts during the growing process and can also be detrimental to your teeth! After inspecting place the seeds in the jar and $\frac{3}{4}$ fill with cold water. With some seeds, it is an advantage to use hot water (eg. mung, adzuki and peas). I use only tepid water and my sprouts are doing great. After adding water and seeds, give the jar a stir with a spoon or just swish them gently around in the jar. Sometimes tiny seeds will float on top, but with careful shaking or stirring they will eventually sink to the bottom. The seeds will swell during this time and increase to double and triple the size. Put jars at an angle and place on your dish rack to drain. This soaking period is referred to as the 'imbition phase' which literally means to absorb knowledge". In every seed is the knowledge from the Universe and every tiny seed knows exactly what to do when given the right environment. Leave seeds soaking in the jar 8-12 hours. Usually I let the seeds soak overnight, and I know that while I sleep, my seeds are waking and the jar is becoming a 'live food factory' in my kitchen. It always amazes me when the tiny tips have emerged and I know I am on the way to have yummy sprouts in a few days. After the soaking period, place the netting and the rubber over the jars let the water drain completely. The next step is to up end the jar, to stand at a 45 degree angle. If your jar is a narrow neck (where water could collect around the seed at the neck), then use this jar, but completely up end the jar on the dish drainer, which will allow all water to drain away. Never use hot water for rinsing, as it may spoil seeds. After draining off the rinse water, gently rotate the jar by rolling it in the hands several times. This helps to loosen some seeds that tend to bunch and stick together. The gently rotating action is important, so as not to damage the fine roots that are developing or shoots unfolding, as broken or damaged seeds may ferment and spoil the whole batch.
