President's Report 22/2/2011

Regional Transition Group / Amalgamation

- Dominic Carbone and Associates have been endorsed by the Board of the South East Avon Regional Transition Group (SEARTG) to prepare a Regional Business Plan. Dominic Carbone is the Executive Officer for SEAVROC and has previously worked with each of the RTG partners in various capacities.
- Community consultation is to be undertaken as part of developing the draft Regional Business Plan.
- The aim of the Business Plan is to provide information for Communities to make an informed decision about their future and guide the process of how this might occur. The plan will endeavour to identify the benefits or otherwise of amalgamation, both from an economic and social point of view. No decision has been made if an amalgamation is to proceed.
- The Regional Business Plan will investigate amalgamating Beverley Council with Cunderdin, Quairading, Tammin and York, including retention of services, local identity, community representation, a shop front in each of the current Shires and cost implications.
- Funding has been provided by the State Government to develop the Regional Business Plan. Councils have not however been reimbursed for the Staff and Councillor commitment required as part of the process.
- Following development of the Business Plan, another round of Community consultation will be held prior to any decisions being made which would move the group toward amalgamation.
- The subsidiary model which was being pursued by SEAVROC in the structural reform process was not supported by the Minister for Local Government. Brookton is still a member of SEAVROC, however have chosen to form an RTG grouping with Pingelly to investigate the possibility of amalgamation.
- Your Councillors are very keen for electors to take an interest and be involved in the consultation process, particularly following a request made at the annual electors meeting for more community information relating to the structural reform process being participated in by the Shire of Beverley.

<u>Storm</u>

The sudden severe storm on Saturday 29th January caused havoc to businesses, private property and infrastructure around the Beverley district and it is anticipated the clean up and repair work will be ongoing for many months to come if not for the rest of the year.

In the immediate aftermath of the storm, with numerous sections of road impassable, shire staff and many rural landowners worked long hours to ensure at least a minimum level of road accessibility, which I'm sure was greatly appreciated by those requiring access, including FESA and Western Power.

With the SES fully pre-occupied due to damage elsewhere, there were many in our community out helping others who didn't fare so well, with at least two families requiring temporary accommodation and many homes tagged to have electrical checks prior to reinstatement of power to their properties. The extended power outage was a challenge in itself.

With the various natural disaster events that have been occurring around Australia and now in New Zealand our experience could be viewed as humbling. Never the less, this was a disaster event in our district and debriefs involving Councillors, FESA services, Police, Department of Child Protection Emergency Assistance and the Local Emergency Management Committee have been held to review the response.

There is information elsewhere in the Blarney relating to the ongoing clean-up.

Recreation Feasibility Report

Mark Casserly from CCS Strategic made a presentation to Councillors and community group representatives on 10th February, utilising the new screen and projector in the town hall. The proposal was well received and the submission made to the Department of Sport and Recreation (DSR) for funding assistance supported, the outcome of which is still several months away.

The Community Sporting Recreation Facilities Fund (CSRFF) Small Grants was identified in the recreation feasibility review as an opportunity to obtain assistance for relocation and upgrade of the multipurpose courts. Council has since resolved to support an application which will most likely occur in the second funding round this year.

There is now an urgency to identify the outcome of the Amenities building roof damage as many groups will be requiring the use of a community building on the oval with the commencement of winter sports.

Town Entry Statements

The Town Entry Statement Committee has held several meetings and recently took the opportunity of sending representatives to a Public Art Seminar which encompassed an array of topics, including town entry statements. The Committee have since agreed to investigate the prospect of engaging assistance from an arts specialist to formulate a unique project relating to Beverley, along with funding possibilities to support this. It is anticipated there will be community engagement in developing a proposal for the town entry statements.




In Memory of Jann Howard





\$5,000 Western Australian Grants for Women Program 2011 now open.

Women's Interests Minister Robyn McSweeney today announced oneoff annual grants of up to \$5,000 to eligible community groups and organisations which provide services to West Australian women.

Grants will be provided to applicants who run projects to strengthen the social and economic wellbeing of women; increase their participation in the community; promote positive images of women; and encourage a sense of leadership and safety.

"The one-off grants, worth \$80,000 in total, are on offer to help community organisations and not-for profit groups encourage greater participation of women in our communities," Mrs McSweeney said.

"2011 is a unique year as we mark the centenary of International Women's Day where we hope to continue promoting the equality of women by developing projects that highlight and strengthen women's economic, political and social accomplishments."

The Minister said eligible groups and organisations must be incorporated not-for-profit organisations; or unincorporated organisations or community groups applying through the auspices of an incorporated body or local government, to be eligible to apply.

Projects delivered in 2010 as part of the grants program included:

- Relationships Australia (WA) ran events to bring women together who had experienced domestic violence and gave women skills designed to enhance their personal safety.
- Small Business Centre Goldfields ran 'Women in Business -Personal Mastery' - one-day programs designed to give women extra skills to achieve results in their businesses.
- Manjimup Family Centre 'Rainbow Mum's project supported local mothers with post-natal depression and issues relating to social isolation.

Successful applicants are expected to complete their projects within 12 months of their grant allocation.





Background

The experimental stem cell breast-growing technique - called Neopec - could replace breast reconstructions and implants within years. The trial offers hope to more than 5000 Australian women who lose their breasts to cancer each year.

Scientists from the Bernard O'Brien Institute of Microsurgery in Melbourne are working on implanting fat cells, which will multiple rapidly and be shaped into the breast removed during cancer surgery.

The process relies on surgeons implanting a biodegradable synthetic breast-shaped chamber beneath the skin on a woman's chest to act as a scaffold for the new breast to grow in. They then redirect a blood vessel from the woman's underarm through the chamber to a 5ml piece of the patient's own fat, which spontaneously grows to fill a fist-sized space and form a new breast over the next four to six months.

Professor Morrison will present the latest developments in this very promising experimental work. All members of the public are welcome to attend.





An extra set of hands for rural families in WA

WA farmers needing a break are now linked to a national network of people who can look after their properties.

The Department of Agriculture and Food WA has formed an alliance with Frontier Services, which runs the successful Outback Links Program.

"In the case of WA, the program initially is seen as beneficial to farmers who need time out due to the dry season," department Regional Operations and Development executive director Greg Paust said.

"The beauty of this program is that it's well established and operates all year. It's not just the dry season when farmers might need a break."

The program primarily exists to minimise the isolation found in some parts of remote Australia, by linking skilled volunteers with individuals and families who need help.

During the past three years, a growing number of volunteers have:

- Given respite to palliative, sick or elderly station dwellers;
- Provided childcare and education, freeing rural women for other tasks;
- Given station assistance in times of flood recovery and drought;
- Provided station caretaking to enable those on the land to tend to off-farm commitments;
- Assisted with practical advice on IT, or building and machine maintenance.

The volunteer workforce comprises people of all ages, skill levels, backgrounds and nationalities. All have been police-checked and they are insured.

"Through Outback Links we can provide help based on the skills of available volunteers at any given time," Outback Links co-ordinator Davida Melksham said.

"If you are a rural person who needs help, you only need to call or e-mail and ask. And that's a big step, as many rural families hesitate to ask for assistance.

"We have set up the service so it's a

two-way street. Our volunteers provide farmers and graziers with the assistance they require without depleting already stretched financial resources, and the volunteers get to live and work in another part of the country. It's a simple concept which just works."

From 1 January 2011, there will be further changes to Youth Allowance and ABSTUDY.

You may be affected by these changes if:

- you are receiving or thinking of claiming Youth Allowance or ABSTUDY, or
- your family home is in an outer regional, remote or very remote area of Australia.

About the Independence rules

If you apply for Youth Allowance or ABSTUDY you will be assessed as dependent or independent.

Being independent for Youth Allowance or ABSTUDY means that your parents' income and assets are not taken into account when determining your eligibility or rate of payment. If you are already considered independent for Centrelink purposes, then changes to the independence criteria probably won't affect you.

Age of Independence

From 1 January 2011, the age of independence will change from 24 to 23 years of age. This means if you receive Youth Allowance or ABSTUDY as a full-time student or an Australian Apprentice, you are automatically independent when you turn 23 years of age. The age of independence will then change from 23 to 22 years of age on 1 January 2012.

Independence through workforce participation

If you have supported yourself in full-time paid employment for at least 18 months in one or more jobs, within a period of two years, then you may be considered independent for Youth Allowance or ABSTUDY. Full-time employment means that you have worked an average of 30 hours per week throughout the 18 months. The hours that you work each week can be averaged over periods of no more than 13 weeks.

From 1 January 2011, if you are a full-time student and you need to live away from home to study because your parents' home is in an area considered to be Outer Regional Australia, Remote Australia or Very Remote Australia according to the Australian Standard Geographical Classification, you may also qualify for independence if you:

- have worked part-time (at least 15 hours a week) for at least two years since leaving school, or
- have been out of school for at least 18 months and have earned at least 75 per cent of the maximum rate of pay under Wage Level A of the transitional Australian Pay and Classification Scale or the relevant modern award generally applicable to trainees in an 18-month period.

To be assessed as independent under these arrangements, you must also satisfy the following criteria:

- you are a full-time student
- you need to live away from home to undertake full-time study, and
- your parents' annual income is less than \$150 000 in the applicable tax year.



View from the Shed The Importance of **Special Places**

Have you ever returned from a holiday and made a comment like "isn't it great to be able to sleep in my own bed?" We may have had the best holiday but there is nothing quite like the reassurance of our home surroundings and things like our own bed to give us a great sense of security because of its familiarity.

When we stop to think about these personal needs they are part of our psyche from a very young age, when a little child is in unfamiliar territory they don't venture too far from mum or dad. As adults we tend to see some of this behavior as childish, and think we can grow out of this sort of reliance on familiarity but the truth is we all need a sense of personal security.

In Hugh Mackay's latest book "What Makes Us Tick" he devotes a whole chapter on the importance of understanding and knowing about our inbuilt desire to know "my place"

One of the important things to remember is that we need to take time to identify where our special place(s) are. These places are fundamentally a place to retreat to when we are under pressure, or need to be alone to think out a problem. If we don't have these places identified it can increase our stress levels significantly. It is also important to realise these places are always real - cyber space doesn't fit the bill.

It is interesting to look at where these places are for people, it can be a favorite spot on the farm, sometimes just a special chair, often it is the car or the truck or maybe the bedroom. Most times we also have more than one place, perhaps one at work and one at home. What is important is to realise that these special places are important so we can be alone and gather our thoughts about what to do next.

I know people are going to be facing up to some pretty important decisions with budget reviews in the near future; make sure you give yourself and those around you time in their place to consider the decisions being made. If you have teenage children you will know what happens when they are in conflict

with you, stomping off to their room to consider options.

In our busy world this time of quiet contemplation is often ignored and is often the difference between a good decision and one made in haste. As Hugh Mackay says it is one of the key desires that drives us, and critically important to our wellbeing in many ways. We are still like children in many ways, find your special place and use it.
