# **FIRE BREAK ORDER**



### **BUSH FIRE ACT 1954**

All owners and occupiers of land are required on or before 15 November every year to provide and thereafter maintain free of all inflammable material until 15 April of the following year, firebreaks as stipulated in the manner described in the following schedule.

#### **SCHEDULE**

#### **RURAL LAND**

#### **Buildings and Haystacks**

A firebreak of at least 4 metres wide and not more than 60 metres from the perimeter of all buildings (including temporary dwellings e.g. caravans) and/or haystacks or groups of buildings and/or haystacks so as to completely surround the buildings, haystacks and/or fuel dumps.

#### **Bulldozed Bush**

A firebreak 20 metres wide shall be maintained immediately inside the external boundaries of all land which has been bulldozed, chained or prepared in any similar manner for clearing by burning (whether it is intended to burn the bush or not).

#### Stationary Pumps/Motors

A firebreak 4 metres wide shall be cleared and maintained around all stationary pumps and motors.

#### Harvesting Operations

During the period when harvesting operations are being conducted, there shall be provided in the same paddock or within 400 metres of that paddock an operational independent mobile fire-fighting unit having a water capacity of not less than 650 litres. The tank of the unit shall be kept full of water at all times during the harvest operations. The responsibility to supply the unit, being that of the landowner.

#### **Operation of Plant and Machinery**

During the restricted and prohibited burning times, all harvesters and trucks carting grain shall not be operated on rural land unless fitted with a fire extinguisher. On days of HARVEST BANDS there shall be no movement of any vehicles within paddocks.

#### Paddock Burns

At any time throughout the year, where a landowner intends to burn paddocks, the following must be provided to prevent escape of fire:

- 1. A firebreak 2.2 metres wide clear of all inflammable material completely surrounding the area to be burnt.
- 2. An operational fire-fighting unit having a capacity of not less than 650 litres.
- 3. Permits to burn may be required. Contact your Fire Control Officer for details.

#### TOWN SITE LAND

All lots with an area of 2.024 ha (5 acres) or less, shall be clear of all inflammable material or have grass mown to a height no greater than 15cm.

#### **GENERAL INFORMATION**

#### Fuel Dumps

You shall remove all flammable materials or material likely to become flammable during summer from land occupied by bulk storage tanks and/or drums used for storage of liquid fuel whether the bulk storage tanks and/or drums contain liquid or not. This includes the land on which ramps for holding the drums are constructed. The flammable free ground must be maintained to a distance of at least 4 metres outside the perimeter of any drum, stack of drums or drum ramp or bulk storage tank.

#### Variations to Requirements By the Order.

For permission to provide firebreaks in alternative positions or by alternative date or to take alternative action to abate fire hazards on the land, an application must be made no later than 14 days prior to the date firebreaks are required. If permission is not granted by the Shire or its duly authorized officer, you shall comply with the requirements of this notice.

#### Penalty for Failure to Comply

The penalty for failing to comply with this notice is a fine of up to \$1000. If the owner or occupier fails to carry out the works required by this Firebreak Order the Shire of Beverley may enter the land and prepare the firebreaks at the cost of the owner or occupier.

#### Burning

If the requirements of this notice are carried out by burning, such burning must be in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Bush Fire Act 1954.

#### Amendment 20 to Town Planning Scheme No.2

Notice is hereby given that the local government of the Shire of Beverley has prepared the abovementioned town planning scheme amendment for the purpose of:

- 1. Inserting access provisions for properties without frontage to a constructed public road where residential development is proposed.
- 2. Requiring planning consent where a variation to Council's Fencing Policy is proposed.

Documents setting out and explaining the town planning scheme amendment have been deposited at 136 Vincent Street, Beverley, and will be open for inspection during office hours up to and including 8.30 am to 4.00 pm.

Submissions on the town planning scheme amendment may be made in writing and lodged with the undersigned on or before 26 October 2011.

### EXTENSION OF THE ZERO BLOOD ALCOHOL LIMIT AND INCREASE TO DRINK AND DRUG DRIVING PENALTIES

#### Issue

Commencing 1 October 2011, the zero Blood Alcohol Content (BAC) limit applying to novice drivers will be extended to include drivers of buses, taxis, heavy vehicles, small charter vehicles, vehicles carrying dangerous goods, recently disqualified drivers, and persons driving on an extraordinary licence (EL).

In addition some monetary penalties and disqualification periods for drink and drug driving offences have increased.

# Drivers of Passenger Vehicles with capacity to carry more than 12 adult passengers, including the driver.

The new legislation will provide that when a person is driving a vehicle that is equipped to seat more than 12 adult passengers, including the driver, *the driver cannot have any alcohol in his or her body when carrying any passengers, regardless if they are paying or non-paying passengers.* 

Some examples of passenger vehicles, equipped to carry more than 12 adult passengers including the driver, are buses, large people movers, and troop carriers.(<u>ie The Community Bus</u>)

If the driver is driving the vehicle alone with no passengers, the usual 0.05% BAC will still apply.

### President's Report October 2011

#### **Local Government Elections**

Voting is now open for the Shire of Beverley South Ward elections. Please see relevant information elsewhere in the Blarney.

#### <u>Recreation Facilities Upgrade and</u> <u>Repair Work</u>

At the September Council meeting the tender for architectural services for the Beverley Oval and Recreation Centre (new works) was awarded to ADC Projects.

Tenders will open shortly for repair work to the storm damaged Amenities Building with Council expecting a timeline for completion to accommodate the 2012 winter sporting season.

#### **Draft Local Planning Strategy**

The draft Shires of Brookton and Beverley Local Planning Strategy was adopted by Beverley Council at its September meeting. The Strategy will be referred to the Western Australian Planning Commission for certification prior to formal advertising.

#### Community Emergency Services Manager

Council has supported the employment of a Community Emergency Services Manager jointly with the Shire of York to develop, implement and co-ordinate the delivery of community emergency services. The 3 year position is funded by FESA with an annual contribution from each Council. Justin Corrigan will commence duties on 3<sup>rd</sup> October.

#### <u>Tier 3 Rail</u>

Council supports retention of tier 3 rail lines and the work being undertaken by the Wheatbelt Railway Retention Alliance.

### Meals on Wheels 30<sup>th</sup> Anniversary

An afternoon tea was held in early August to recognise volunteers, community achievement and Shire support toward providing this invaluable service over so many years. Minister Robyn McSweeney MLC, Minister for Community Services, Seniors and Volunteering and Youth was a special guest who also visited the Youth Centre, being most impressed by her trip to Beverley.

### <u>Thank you Councillors and</u> <u>Farewell Mal!</u>

I would like to take this opportunity to thank the current Council for their time, dedication and level headed approach toward the important roles of planning, responsible budgeting and representing our community over the last two years. With the lingering uncertainty in relation to structural reform Council has overseen a planning process to ensure the community can be informed in their decision making regarding the future direction of our Shire.

I would also like to recognise Cr Mal Roberts who is retiring as a Shire Councillor after 14 years of service.

# What identification do I need to provide to apply for my first Western Australian (WA) Driver's Licence?

From 5 September 2011, there are number of key documents you must supply to apply for your first WA driver's licence. A combination of compulsory and secondary identification documents are required to be presented by you before you can be granted with a WA driver's licence. *One document must show your signature. Original documents only, certified copies will not be accepted.* 

#### Compulsory Category A - Establishment of Identity document

- Australian Birth Certificate (not an extract) issued by Births, Deaths and Marriages (BDM), not a commemorative one
- New Zealand Birth Certificate (not an extract), issued by Births, Deaths and Marriages NZ
- Confirmation of birth letter (issued by BDM)
- Citizenship or Naturalisation documentation (issued by the Department of Immigration)
- Evidence of Resident status (issued by the Department of Immigration)
- Immigration papers (issued by the Department of Immigration) such as a current Visa (not an electronic Visa)

# Secondary Category B - Link between Identity and Person Current Australian driver's licence or learner's permit

- (with photo and signature not expired more than six (6) months)
- Australian Passport (not expired more than two (2) years)
- Current overseas passport (not expired)
- Parental identification and statutory declaration (form M101). Parent must attend with the child and present current driver's licence for identity verification

# Secondary Category C – Evidence of identity operating in the community

- Current Australian EFTPOS or Credit Card
- Medicare Card
- Electoral Enrolment Card (less than two (2) years old)
- Centrelink or Department of Veteran Affairs Healthcare or Pension Card
- Current Security Guard/Crowd Control Licence
- Marriage Certificate (issue by BDM), not a commemorative one.
- Current photographic student ID

- You must supply original documents, *certified copies will not be accepted*. One document must display your signature.
- All documents provided will be copied and retained by Driver and Vehicle Services. These documents will be recorded against your driver's licence details. You will retain your original documents.
- These requirements supersede any identity requirements
   previously published by Driver and Vehicle Services.

# The following is an extract from an article in Have-a-go News, No. 233 August 2011 (Page 55)

THREADING the maze of information, services and accommodation options for residential aged care can be daunting.

Accommodation alternatives are designed to cater to the level of assistance required by each individual. High and low care facilities, as well as premium services, dementia specific and respite care are available to ensure individuals are placed in a facility that provides for their specific choices, nursing and personal care needs.

When looking for an aged care facility, it is important to understand what type of home you are considering, what services you are seeking and the locality you would prefer. Some of these factors may affect the cost and the services that you will receive.

Whilst the Australian Government helps with the cost of residential aged care, it also expects those who can afford it to contribute to the cost.

A resident's financial status is assessed by Centrelink and will fall into one of three categories.

- \* Fully Supported assets of less than \$39,900;
- Partially Supported assets between \$39,500 and \$102,544; and
- \* Non-Supported assets greater than \$102,544.

A pension concession card does not entitle a person to fully supported status when entering aged care.

Once financial status is determined, daily fees and possible accommodation charges or Bonds are calculated.

Every resident pays a Daily Care Fee - currently \$40.25 per day. On top of this, and as determined by your financial status, you may be asked to pay an Income Tested Fee. All fees are set by Centrelink, not individual providers.

If your assets are above \$39,000 an Accommodation Bond can be charged. Accommodation Bonds are guaranteed by the Federal Government and assist aged care providers to continue to build new facilities. Bonds are usually financed by the sale of a family home and are returned once a person leaves a facility, minus statutory retentions as set down by the Government.

Bonds are determined by the minimum value placed on a room by the provider, the level of your assessed assets and the minimum level of assets that a resident must retain.

Monies paid as a Bond are not taxable and are not considered when calculating pension entitlements or Income Tested Fees. In some circumstances you may find yourself better off financially following the payment of a Bond.

The process of finding and entering an aged care facility can be daunting, not to mention emotional, for all involved. The following extract is from Information Sheet No. 9 of July 2011– Australian Government - Department of Health and Ageing, sent to me by MP Judi Moylan.

From Information sheet no. 9 Fees and Charges for Residential Aged Care - An Overview, used by permission of the Australian Government

# Fees and Charges for Residential Aged Care - An Overview

Residents in Australian Government subsidised residential aged care can be asked to pay fees as a contribution towards accommodation costs, living expenses and the cost of their care. There are protections in place to ensure that care is affordable for all residents. The Government recognises that not all residents can pay for the cost of the care they receive, and so provides substantial subsidies to assist with these costs.

Details on dollar amounts have not been included in this information sheet. For this detailed information, residents or their nominated representatives can call **1800 200 422**.

Current rates of aged care fees, charges and thresholds are listed on the Schedule of Resident Fees and Charges which is available on the Department of Health and Ageing website: www.health.gov.au.

#### What are the fees

A resident may be charged for the care and services provided, as follows:

- Basic daily fee as a contribution toward accommodation and costs of daily living.
- Income tested fee as a contribution towards the costs of care.
- Accommodation payment as a contribution towards capital accommodation costs.
- Extra services charge applies to residents occupying extra service places (both permanent and respite) for the provision of a significantly higher standard of accommodation services and food.
- Additional service fee where the resident requests or agrees to additional services (such as newspapers and hairdressing).

The level of the residents daily fees and accommodation payments can be negotiated between the residents and/or their representative, and the aged care home.

However, the Australian Government sets the maximum level of the daily fees and accommodation payments a resident can be asked to pay to the aged care home.

#### **Basic Daily Fee**

All residents in aged care, including respite residents, can be asked to pay a basic daily fee as a contribution towards accommodation costs and living expenses, like meals, cleaning, laundry, heating and cooling.

The maximum basic daily fee for all permanent residents who first enter an aged care home on or after 20 September 2009 is 84% of the annual single basic age pension. This is also the maximum fee for all respite residents, excluding those receiving respite care on an extra service basis.

Note: The Department of Veterans' Affairs pays the basic daily fee for Australian ex-prisoners of

war in Australian Government subsidised residential aged care.

#### Income Tested Fee

Residents (other than respite residents) may be asked to pay an income tested fee, depending on their income and the level of care they require (Refer to Information Sheet 11 – Income Tested Fees for Residential Care for more detail).

This fee is paid directly to the aged care home. No resident will pay more than they can afford, and no resident will pay more than the cost of their care.

The Australian Government sets the maximum amount a resident can be asked to pay to the aged care home.

#### Accommodation Payment

The two types of accommodation payment are accommodation bonds and accommodation charges. (Refer to Information Sheet 16 – Accommodation Bonds for Residential Aged Care and Information Sheet 15 – The Accommodation Charge for Residential Aged Care for more detail).

#### Accommodation Bond

Residents with sufficient assets who require low (hostel) level care or who enter an extra service place may be asked to pay a bond.

The Australian Government sets the minimum assets a resident must retain when establishing the bond amount. A resident cannot, therefore, be charged a bond amount that would leave them with less than the minimum asset amount. Where a bond is are payable, the amount and payment method can vary and should be negotiated with the aged care home.

The aged care home is able to retain a monthly amount from the bond for the first five years, and the balance of the bond is repaid to the resident or their estate when they leave the aged care home.

#### Accommodation Charge

A resident with sufficient assets who requires high (nursing home) level care (but not on an extra service basis) may be asked to pay an accommodation charge. Whether a resident requires high level care is determined at the time of entry to a permanent place by the evidence available at that time.

While the Department of Health and Ageing or the aged care provider will inform the resident of the maximum amount of accommodation charge they can be asked to pay (based on the value of their assets), the actual amount payable can be negotiated between the resident and the aged care provider.

If a resident chooses not to have an asset assessment, or has assets above the upper assets threshold, the amount of the accommodation charge they may be asked to pay will be the maximum applicable rate.

#### Financial Hardship Assistance

Financial hardship provisions are there for residents who would face genuine financial hardship if they were required to pay residential aged care fees and charges. To receive an application for financial hardship assistance call **1800 200 422**.

#### **Financial Information**

Financial decisions, for instance about how to pay an accommodation bond or charge, can have different effects on a person's pension, aged care fees and tax. People are advised to seek expert financial information to help make these decisions.

A free Financial Information Service is available through Centrelink. To make an appointment call Centrelink on **13 23 00**<sup>-</sup>.

Services provided to our residents (Beverley and adjoining towns) during September 2011.

- 1. Seeking justice for prison resident under deportation order. Matter very complex–no legal brief. Help currently offered by the prison chaplain and prison JP.
- 2. Matters pending with both government ministers of health and transport problems.
- 3. Compensation/ex gratia payment resting with MLA Grylls and Attorney General's office (obtained legal advice).
- 4. One civil matter legal action pending under Barrister's advice.
- 5. Wills and enduring power of attorney. I was unable to offer legal advice, as this is not my role or brief. These matters were then referred to seek help from either a solicitor or the Citizens Advice Bureau. Once these documents are prepared, I would then organise the second witness required to execute such documents.
- 6. Estate matters. Witnessing/ attesting relevant documents as well as writing trust fund and superannuation documents.
- Home and hospital visits to see terminally ill and aged care residents and help with information and witnessing documents.

Centrelink: I am led to believe that there are new more stringent rules which apply to recipients on the new start allowance and disability support pension.

On a personal note: Pensioner, orphans, needy families. My first involvement with pensioners took place in 1986. I was elected Honorable Secretary/organiser of the Pensioners Action Group, Forrest Place, Perth, a very high profile group which attracted media attention, politicians, union leaders and senators to our monthly meetings.

1991– Orphan Foundation overseas. I was blessed in offering some help to enhance the quality of these young children's lives. Since then, to date, in a very small way I have been involved with overseas widows and frail aged homes (there are no pensions). When there is not enough funds to go around a large number of needy families are given rations such as rice, flour, oil, lentils, potatoes and onions. (No unemployment benefits). Australia:- Save the children and Christian Blind Mission–I try to help whenever funds are available.

Since my illness I remember that in this troubled world, when you reach out a hand in their hour of need, this kind gesture plays a huge part in the lives of vunerable overseas children and needy families and puts food in their mouths. (Most needy families/ children have no tables to speak of, they sit and eat on the floor.) This is portrayed on our TV sets.

# From Darrell and Kerry BEWARE OF THE TRUCKS

With harvest only just around the corner there will be an increase of vehicles on the road, especially trucks. While drivers of both trucks and cars have to be mindful of the road rules and each other, driving a truck that is fully laden can be a tough job. As a driver of a car you need to appreciate that it is very hard for a truck to stop suddenly or take evasive action safely. So when driving around town and especially on some of the smaller, narrower roads you need to be mindful of the trucks.

It doesn't hurt to be extra careful and pull over to the side of the road and let them pass if you are on a narrower road, or if you are coming up to a bridge and a truck is coming from the opposite direction you can stop and allow him to go through first.

Remember that the trucks can't stop as quickly as you can in a car. So drive smart and drive safe.

### CHANGES TO THE LAW RELATING TO DRINK AND DRUG DRIVING OFFENCES

As of the 1<sup>st</sup> October 2011 there are changes to the penalties for drink driving. Basically the penalties are increasing for drink and drug driving offences.

However there are some changes to the laws that may relate to some of you which you need to be aware of.

There is now a zero blood alcohol content (BAC) for drivers of:

- Heavy vehicles with a GCM exceeding 22.5 tonnes (whether at full capacity or not)
- Passenger vehicle (e.g buses) equipped to seat more than 12 adults including the driver, while carrying passengers (whether on payment or not)
- Vehicles carrying dangerous goods
- Holders of extraordinary licences
- Recently disqualified drivers.

A recently disqualified driver is a person that has been convicted of a drink driving offence (DUI, refuse breath or blood test, second 0.08%). You are a recently disqualified driver for 3 years from the time you recommence driving after your conviction.

# How prepared are you for a bushfire?



# CHECKLIST – PREPARING YOUR PROPERTY

The majority of houses can survive most bushfires with preparation and planning. There are many ways that you can improve the chance of your property surviving a bushfire even if you aren't there to defend it. Use this checklist as a guide to preparing your home.

#### STARVE THE FIRE

Clear around your home so that embers will have less chance to start a fire when they hit the ground. This will also help reduce the damage caused by the fire.

- □ Cut long grass and dense scrub.
- □ Regularly rake up leaf litter and twigs under trees.
- □ Prune lower tree branches (up to two metres off the ground) to stop a ground fire spreading into the canopy of trees.
- □ Remove shrubs and small trees under and between larger trees
- □ Clear vegetation along the boundary of your property to create a firebreak. Make sure you meet your local government's fire break requirements.
- □ Keep roof gutters and valleys clear of leaves and bark.

#### MAKE A SAFETY ZONE

Within the safety zone:

- □ Create a 20 metre circle of safety around your home and other buildings. This area needs to be cleared of all rubbish, long dry grass, bark and material that may catch fire.
- □ Create and maintain a minimum two metre gap between your house and tree branches.
- □ If possible, plan your garden so that your vegetable garden, lawn, pool or patio is on the side of the house likely to face a fire (where the bush is).

#### FILL THE GAPS

Houses usually catch fire when embers get into the roof space, a wall cavity, on to ledges or under the house. Prevent sparks from entering your house by blocking all the gaps.

- □ Block any gaps under floor spaces, in the roof space, under eaves, external vents, skylights, chimneys and wall cladding.
- Delta Place metal fly wire mesh on all windows, vents and evaporative air conditioners to keep sparks and embers out.

#### FIX THE FIRE TRAPS

- Do not pile wood against or near the house.
- □ Remove any timber, rubbish and old junk lying around.
- □ Move all fuel containers into a shed away from your house and have a firebreak around it.
- □ Keep gas cylinders on the side of the house furthest away from the likely direction of a fire (where the bush is). Ensure the pressure relief valve is directed away from the house. Store gas cylinders upright and secure them with a metal chain to a secure, non-combustible post to prevent cylinders from falling over.

#### PROTECT YOUR ASSET

- □ Have a sufficient independent water supply of at least 20,000 litres and a petrol, diesel or a generator powered pump capable of pumping 400 litres per minute.
- □ Check that your home and contents insurance cover is adequate. Take into consideration renovations, fixtures and additions such as swimming pools, sheds, gazebos, luxury fittings or new appliances.

#### POTENTIAL AMALGAMATION PROPOSAL FACT SHEET

"YOUR FUTURE - YOUR CHOICE"

Who is involved in the Amalgamation Business Case Process?	The Shires of Beverley, Cunderdin, Quairading, Tammin and York have formed the South East Avon Regional Transition Group (SEARTG) to prepare a business case that will examine the potential benefits of amalgamating.
What is involved in the RTG Business Case Process?	The Business Case will consider the Current and Future State of local government in the SEARTG.
	The Current State involves examining all of the operations of the 5 local governments to provide a snapshot of the current way each Shire does its business.
	The Future State will examine a new service delivery model and structure for the proposed new local government. The Future State will then be assessed in terms of potential benefits in improvement in services and whether there are any potential savings or additional costs in the proposed new service delivery model and structure.
Why is amalgamation being looked at?	It is believed that there are a number of potential benefits that may result from amalgamation. Such benefits may include improved service delivery across the region, more flexibility in adapting services to meet changing customer needs, greater capacity as a single local government to deliver larger infrastructure projects, and potential reduction of duplication in services and facilities.
What will happen if the local governments support amalgamation?	The completed business case will provide a recommendation on whether there are enough potential benefits to proceed with amalgamation. The completed report will be referred to the 5 SEARTG member local governments to consider the recommendation.
	If the recommendation is supported by the 5 SEARTG member local governments, the business case along with the supporting resolutions of the 5 local governments will be referred to the Local Government Advisory Board for review and to make a recommendation to the Minister.
	The Minister will then consider the recommendation from the Local Government Advisory Board and make a decision on whether the amalgamation should proceed.
Where will I access services if amalgamation occurs?	The proposed amalgamation model is based on a Place Management approach with local area service centres being retained in each main town. The Shire administration centre and customer services will be maintained under the Place Management model.
Where will staff work if amalgamation occurs?	One of the key principles that has been agreed to by the 5 SEARTG member local governments is minimal displacement of the existing workforce. The future structure of the organisation is currently being determined, but will take into account retaining staff in their current locations, wherever possible.
When will amalgamation occur?	If supported, amalgamation could occur as early as 1 July 2013.

#### **Gwambygine Homestead**



After several false starts the Beverley Historical Society and friends had an enjoyable and interesting excursion to the recently restored Gwambygine Homestead on Friday 9 September 2011.

We were met by Pamela Stratham-Drew and Nick Drew who were happy to share their knowledge of the history of the building. Situated high on the bank of the mile-long permanent Gwambygine Pool, the homestead is in an attractive location.



The original centre wing was built in 1836 making it one of the earliest buildings in the colony of Western Australia. It was built by Thomas Carter with help of the sons of the owner, J B Wittenoom. The walls were rammed earth made of a mixture of local clay, sand and straw. Some of this original building material can still be seen in an old chimney stack.



The homestead is a typical farm home of colonial times, being just one room wide with verandahs both sides that provide access between the rooms. Wings have been added over the years, plus power and plumbing. It is still privately owned by the daughter of the last resident, Brian M Clifton, who died in 1998.



The homestead has very few furnishings at the moment but there is a plan to have a minimal number of pieces in each room.



Following our inspection we enjoyed our afternoon tea beside the river in the warm spring sunshine.

Then on the way back to Beverley, several people called into St Peter's Anglican Church at Gilgering to take a close look at the many interesting headstones there.

# There's a lot happening in our backyard!

## New species of Wheatbelt spider

The chance discovery of an unusual looking spider in the backyard of a Grass Valley home has lead to the identification of a new species of trapdoor spider.

John Cornish noticed an unusual white headed, black and brown-legged spider on his back veranda in July.

Using a jar, he carefully captured the spider and took it to the Department of Environment and Conservation's Northam office.

Staff then called upon spider expert Mick Davis from Wheatbelt NRM, who soon realised the significance of the discovery.

"This spider has been nicknamed the albino trap door spider, and is about the size of a 50 cent piece," Mick Davis said.

"We've handed it to the WA Museum, which has identified it as a new species of trap door spider from the Idiopidae family."

Mark Harvey is the WA Museum's curator of arachnids and myriapods.

He said the species was similar to a group of spiders found further north at Ballidu and Eneabba.

"The difference is in the way they mate, and the structure of the male pedipalp which transmits sperm to the female," Mark Harvey said.

"The spider is venomous, but is not considered dangerous."

Mark Harvey said the spider was yet to be formally named.

Wheatbelt NRM's Mick Davis said the discovery raised the question of whether there were other species in the area waiting to be discovered.

"The finding is significant, as it highlights the richness of our wheatbelt backyards - where something never seen before can literally just walk up to your back door," Mick Davis said.

"It's fantastic people like Mr Cornish are keeping their eyes open and making the effort to find out more about our unique biodiversity

"Protecting quality bushland on farms from grazing by stock, rabbits and weeds is an easy way for farmers to help protect the Avon's natural heritage

"Wheatbelt NRM's Bushcare Grants are an excellent way of getting additional funding to off-set costs to farmers for a diverse range of activities."

Applications for Wheatbelt NRM's Bushcare grant are now open.

Caring for our Country Project 2009-2013 - Perennial Farming Systems Targeting Wind Erosion within the North Eastern and Southern Wheatbelt Regions of WA

WEROC, SEAVROC and NEWROC Natural Resource Management (NRM) are seeking expressions of interest from landholders who are interested in planting Perennial Pasture seed (including Lucerne), Sandalwood hosts, Brushwood, Saltbush, Oil Mallees, and/or Swamp Sheoak on low/poor production areas that are at risk of wind erosion in 2012 with considerations also going to areas where salinity is a significant threat.

The species indicated can be integrated successfully into farming systems to tackle not only wind erosion but also salinity, soil health, enterprise diversity and water management. As the focus of the project is Wind Erosion the species will be implemented through wind breaks, alley farming systems and through improved perennial pasture systems.

### View from the Shed What is a Healthy Community?

Recently I received an award for my work in helping to maintain healthy communities in rural WA. As I contemplated the award and what it meant, it crossed my mind that it is a bit of a contradiction to award an individual if you are talking about communities.

For something to be considered a community it surely means a group of individuals working together to achieve a common goal. Personally I feel that we achieve very little on our own, we develop skills based on our own interests for sure but they usually reach their full potential when we apply our personal skills with the talents and skills of others.

When we apply this basic logic to the concept of a healthy community it keeps in perspective how important every member of that community is because of the skills and talents they bring to the life of the community.

•**Team Attitude** not everyone is a captain, but a captain without a team has little chance of achieving.

As country people I think we are way better at building healthy communities, as long as we accept the part we have to play and work to achieving our goals. These things can never be achieved alone.

### View from the Shed

It doesn't seem to matter where I travel in the Wheatbelt at present the crops are looking beautiful. Every farmer I talk to also says they haven't seen the country looking this good for many years and there is a half hearted expectation that it could be a good year.

Because of the difficulties experienced in the last few years, with droughts and poor prices, most rural people are very reserved about getting their hopes up too early. We all know there is a long way to go before harvest and lots of things may go wrong, but have we allowed the negative "may happens" to take away some of the positives we are seeing at present with this season.

Unfortunately rural people have a reputation for never being satisfied with the weather no matter what. Our city cousins translate this into a perception that we are perpetual wingers.

I think it is really important for our mental health to allow ourselves to experience the positive side of this season. When I look at the beautiful crops, the healthy fat sheep and cattle, water lying in ditches on the roadside I feel like celebrating.

I think we can compare what we are going through to a person who has had a serious accident, maybe suffered brain damage, and has to learn to walk again. When that person takes one step, for the first time, there is a sense of overwhelming happiness at the achievement. It's not that they are restored to normal that we celebrate, it is the fact they are on the journey to recovery.

As farmers we can learn from this, allow yourself to experience the joy of what we see and sense the potential to be, like the rehabilitation of a damaged person, see the potential as well as the risks and then our hopes will be rekindled.

When someone says "don't the crops look great?" rather than saying "BUT" say "yes they do" it helps restore our belief that life isn't all negative.

It is also good to remind ourselves that there is no such thing as an "average" season. Averaging is a tool devised by accountants and politicians but reality isn't like that, no one I know wants to be "average". We have bad years and good years. In rural WA we should expect some good years, and I think this may be one of them.

Make the most of what we are experiencing, it will help us cope when we hit another bad spot, and we will.
