## Shire President's Report June 2012

### South East Avon Regional Transition Group (SEARTG)

The Business Plan Future State and Service Delivery Plans are yet to be completed and Community Information Sessions will then follow. Due to this delay, a decision regarding amalgamation has been deferred until the end of August.

A website is now available to view information relating to the SEARTG. A press release is included elsewhere in the Blarney and Council has requested that a printed copy of website content be made available in the town library.

Council will be sending an information letter to residents and rate payers in early June. If for some reason you don't receive this please ask for a copy from the Shire office.

### Vincent St Traffic

Traffic counts taken in Vincent St near the Telstra phone box over a 5 ½ week period during February/March recorded a **daily average of 1266 vehicle movements!** (The weekday average was higher at 1346). Speed results have shown 98% of the traffic is travelling under 50kph (and 80% under 40kph). Whilst very noticeable when it does happen, the percentage of speeding traffic is not high. If you do see someone inappropriately using the main street and have some details then Council and the Police would be interested in that information.

### Dawson St Independent Living Units Open Day

The units are near completion and an open day will be held on Friday 15<sup>th</sup> June for the community to view them. Please see details elsewhere in the Blarney. Councils preference is for these units to be taken up by someone locally, however will also consider the Perth market if needed so the next ones can be commenced.

### Kerbside Collection 18<sup>th</sup> June 2012

The next town kerbside collection is scheduled for Monday 18<sup>th</sup> June. Council undertakes to provide this service at least once each year and details are provided elsewhere in the Blarney regarding what can be included for collection.

Shire staff have made contact with Avon Waste seeking information regarding the potential to introduce a fortnightly household recycling collection.

### Avondale

As reported in the May Blarney funding remains an issue for Avondale. Many small projects have been undertaken through a range of grants and opportunities, and the events continue to be well supported and popular, however the run down state of the infrastructure, allowed to occur when in the hands of the State Government, needs some serious funding to reverse this decline and return the property to the attractive amenity that it was when the Discovery Farm Project opened in 1979.

The Shire of Beverley, Avondale Farm Project Association (volunteer group) and National Trust WA are working together to try and attract the funding to progress Avondale toward becoming economically sustainable and a place that visitors, including travellers to Western Australia, choose to come to. This will not happen in its current state. Avondale is a Regional Project with State Significance that requires us at the local level to also make it a community priority. Please consider joining the friends of Avondale and/or register as a volunteer by contacting Dina Barrett-Lennard at Avondale on 96461004.

In order to extend the life of the existing Beverley Refuse Site we now have sections for different types of rubbish. These sections are:

- Aluminium Cans
- Glass
- Green Waste
- Household Furniture
- Plastic

There are also sections for the following, however, please see the Refuse Site Manager – Graham before dropping off these items:

E-Waste  
Building Waste  
Toxic and Dangerous Goods

NB: Charges apply for the disposal of Building and Toxic and Dangerous Goods.

As we are endeavouring to extend the life of the refuse pit and also help the environment it would greatly appreciated if loads could be separated before dumping.

At present Council is investigating the feasibility of supplying a recycling bin to each household that is currently issued with a household refuse bin.

**The Rubbish Tip is open Saturday, Sunday and Monday - 8.00am – 4.00pm excepting Christmas Day and Total Fire Ban Days.**

**We would also like to remind you that if you are transporting refuse to the tip in a trailer or the back of a ute, etc., it requires to be covered and secured as per Road Traffic Code 2000.**

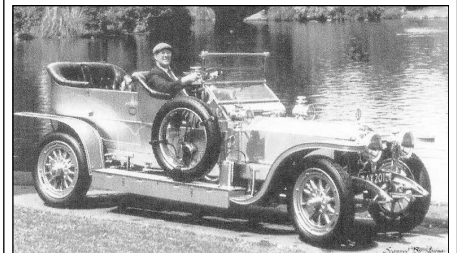

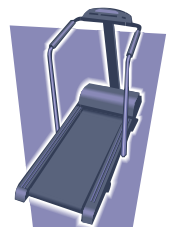

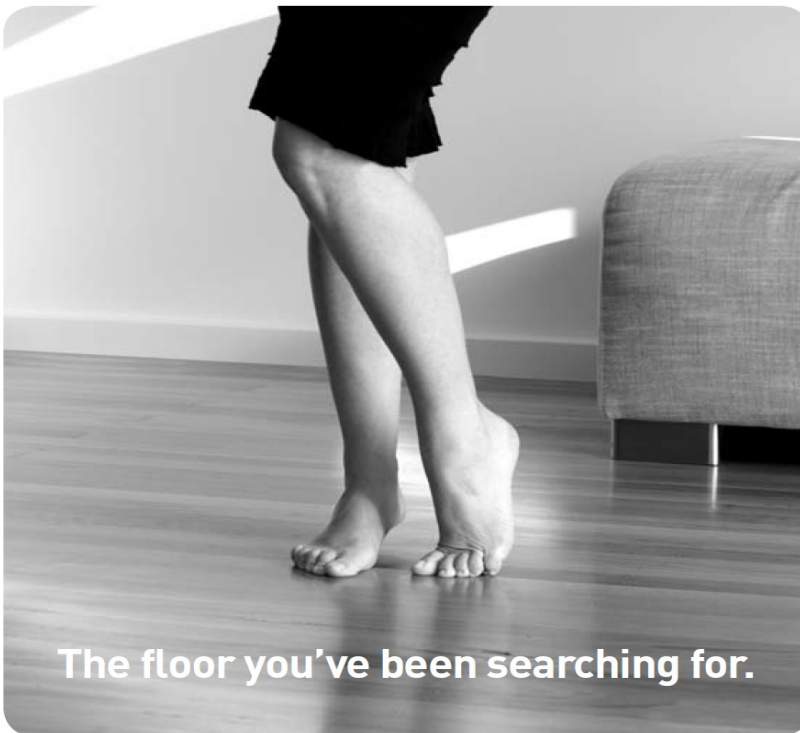
## MOVING FARM EQUIPMENT

Winter is on us and seeding will be in the minds of all people living in the Wheatbelt. This is a high risk time with long hours coupled with early starts and late finishes in the dark of early morning or late evening.

- Protect yourself and other road users by thinking safety all the time.
- When travelling in a vehicle have your **headlights on** so other road users can see you in the dull light of the early mornings and late afternoons, and maybe day. Been seen Been Safe.
- When moving large farm equipment on public roads, that includes shire roads and main roads, remember to have your **flashing lights on** as well as head lights and an **escort vehicle**.
- Have your **UHF radios turned to channel 40**. This a common channel used by most trucks and quite a few light vehicles.
- **Broadcast your position, size and direction** on Channel 40 on your UHF to alert heavy vehicles that there is a large slow moving vehicle ahead, especially on windy and hilly sections of road.

All instructions are included in the kit. Details are to be written on the packet provided so that after scanning by Western Diagnostics, the results can be notified to you and your Doctor. This test does not actually identify cancer but is an indicator of occult (unseen) blood which may need further investigation. The cost is \$8.00 per kit and the handling and testing is on a voluntary basis, by Beverley Pharmacy, CWA and Western Diagnostics.

These test kits will be available each year in May and it is encouraged that testing is done annually.

Next meeting will be on Thursday 14<sup>th</sup> June at 10.00am for morning tea followed by meeting and "Bring and Share lunch". Conference motions will be discussed and voted on at Branch level.

## Find Bowel Cancer Early

Bowels – there, we said it! The ‘b’ word! As much as we might be embarrassed when it comes to discussing our bowels, talking to your doctor about any changes in your bowel habits just might save your life.

Bowel cancer is the second most common cancer in both men and women. It is also known as colorectal cancer. The earlier bowel cancer is found the greater the chance of successful treatment. If bowel cancer is found early, 90% of

patients will be alive five years after diagnosis. So, it’s important to act on any unusual symptoms as early as possible.

Symptoms can include:

- Blood in your poo
- A change in usual bowel pattern
  - Straining to go to the toilet (constipation)
  - Looser bowel motions (diarrhoea)
- Abdominal pain and bloating
- Loss of weight for no obvious reason
- Loss of appetite
- Symptoms of anaemia
  - Unexplained tiredness
  - Weakness
  - Breathlessness

Knowing what is normal for your body is important as it will be easier to notice when something is different.

Go and see your doctor if you have had any of these symptoms for more than four weeks – they would rather see you earlier than later so don’t put it off. Remember that your doctor is used to talking about bowels and bodily functions.

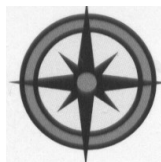

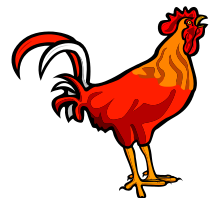

### BEVERLEY HISTORICAL SOCIETY

The May meeting of the Society was attended by nine members with three apologies.

A report was presented re the meeting late in April at New Norcia of the Wheatlands Chapter of Museums Australia. Four members attended and participated in the sharing of information & concerns of museums from Wongan Hills to Merredin to Brookton & places in between. After the meeting we were privileged to be taken on a tour of the New Norcia Monastery by one of the monks, Dom Chris, who has been there for 32 years. We saw areas not usually open to tourists such as the parlour, the refectory, the library, the music room & the Monastery Chapel. Restoration & maintenance of historic buildings is an on-going project for the community.

Bus tours to the Dead Finish Museum have been organised for Friday 8 June and Thursday 21 June. A group from Elite Tours visited on Tuesday 15 May & found much to interest them. Quite a few had connections of one sort or another to Beverley.

Research carried out by members included locating school photos of Sheehan children who resided in Beverley in the 1930s and providing information about Charles Dawson, original owner of the *Beverley Times*, to a John Dawson in Beverley, England. In return we received copies of documents from 1784 through to 1825 re Charles Simmons and his family. Dr Charles Simmons was the Colonial Surgeon who came to the Swan River Colony with Governor Stirling and was allocated a grant of land in the Avon Valley. He is credited with naming Beverley in honour of his home town in England.

Donations to the Museum included a 1950s Matador Super Home Knitting Machine and a book of Great Australian Shearing Stories.

## **WA DRIVER'S AND VEHICLE LICENCE ALERT SERVICE**

From 10 May 2012, Driver and Vehicle Services (DVS) will provide a free electronic licence renewal reminder service, Licence Alert. Licence holders can subscribe to receive an electronic licence alert (either an SMS or email message) when their WA driver's or vehicle licence is near expiry. They can subscribe online through the DVS website, over the counter at a DVS centre, or over the phone through the customer contact centre.

Licence Alert is an elective service that will complement the existing issue of hard copy posted renewal notices.

### **Licence holders can subscribe in one of the following ways:**

- Online through the DVS website
- Over the phone through the customer contact centre; or
- Over the counter at a DVS centre

Customers will **not** be able to receive alert messages where:

- They are not the holder of a WA driver's or vehicle licence
- A vehicle (or trade plate) is licensed in a company/organisation name
- Their vehicle licence is seasonal

### **Message Content**

Email and SMS messages from DVS will not contain licence holder name or contact details.

Currently email and SMS messages will only relate to driver and vehicle licences nearing expiry.

Licence holders will not be required to respond to any Licence Alert messages. All replies will be automatically discarded.

Only one message will be sent for each nominated licence.

Message text will be customised based on elected preferred payment method and licence conditions.

### **Changing Subscription Details**

If a licence holder changes their email address or mobile number they will need to change their subscription details. This can be done online, by telephone or over the counter in the same way as the original subscription.

If electing to change details online the licence holder will need to:

- Log in to Licence Alert and choose the option 'Change Subscription'
- Input the original subscription details
- List the driver's and vehicle licences/subscriptions that they want their new contact details applied to

### **Cancelling Subscription Details**

Subscribers can opt out of the Licence Alert service at any time. This can be done online, by telephone or over the counter in the same way as the original subscription.

To opt out of Licence Alert online the licence holder will need to:

- Log in to Licence Alert and choose the option 'Cancel Subscription'
- Input the original subscription details and save by clicking the 'Cancel Subscription' button

Licence holders will not be required to cancel or opt out of Licence Alert when they sell a vehicle that was subscribed to the service, as long as they have provided DoT with an MR9 Notification of Change in Vehicle Ownership form.

## A View from the Shed Time Management

As we prepare for seeding it is important to consider looking after our most valuable resource, us! Sometimes we can be so busy preparing machines, ordering fertiliser and chemicals that we forget about ourselves.

Everyone knows that a shortcut is often the longest way home. When we take shortcuts regarding our wellbeing it increases our risk factors dramatically i.e. working longer than a ten hour shift increases risk significantly.

What men in particular don't do well is consider the consequences of risk taking. Consequences are

something we must live with, so in your preparation for seeding limit your personal risk, and if what you are planning is an overstretch, reconsider your options.

In addition to the usual seeding preparations perhaps we should follow the lead of other industries, such as mining and construction, where clear guidelines on safe parameters for work have been implemented.

Some things to reflect on when considering your wellbeing include:

- **Fatigue management;** limiting your working time to no more than 14 hours in a 24 hour period. This includes travel to and from the job so you must have at least ten hours off in every day. Seeding might be over a relatively short

period but this work strategy should not be compromised.

- **Pre start exercises;** I would be surprised if many farmers begin a shift with some limbering up exercises. It is a known fact that this type of start to the day significantly reduces muscle injuries.
- **Factored in regular breaks;** this also reduces the impact of fatigue and increases our capacity to beat boredom, which often leads to expensive mistakes and machine damage.
- **Suitable dietary needs;** how often are you eating and what are you snacking on? It is not just about good meals it is also about good snacks that are nutritious and correctly timed. A good meal is very beneficial at the beginning of a shift and a light meal at the end is beneficial in helping to promote good sleep.
- **Adequate sleep;** for most people this is about seven to eight hours in every twenty four hour cycle. It is not possible to reduce this and still function properly. Remember this is "sleep" not just being in bed!
- **Family time;** it is important to factor in a day off regularly. Preferably a day every week but at least one day in fourteen should be set aside. I know we feel pressure to keep going, but remember this is about maintaining maximum production and sometimes we make the mistake of thinking working longer is a smart option. Most times this leads to costly lapses in concentration with the potential for damaging consequences.
- This time of year is hectic, but a controlled and planned approach will pay dividends. Don't overstretch without considering what could happen as we all know sometimes disasters do happen unnecessarily.

## A tale from the Artist in Residence during May 2012 – Derek L Newton

Phantom visitors, creaking building, and leaning dunny, what ever next?

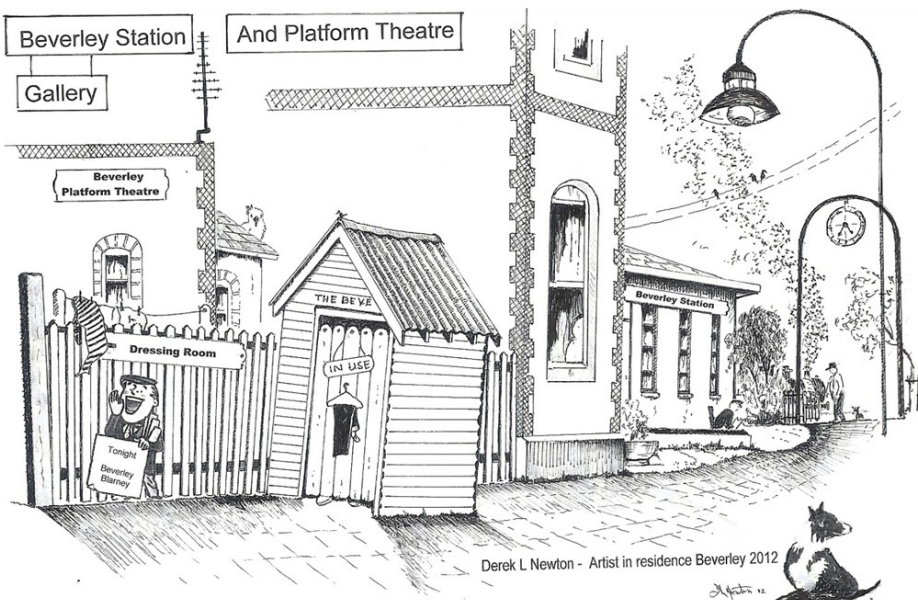
Settling down to watch TV for the rest of the evening, about 10pm "bang" the power went off, all went black. I sat there dismissing what I had read earlier in the visitors book about a gallery ghost. A little relieved I worked my way back in search of the meter box, but found nothing in the cottage; I climbed the steps to the studio, running my torch along the walls and over the art collection but no meter box.

At the entrance to the small gallery shop hung a black shawl over a wire frame, I had seen it earlier but in the torchlight it took on a different appearance. Composing myself I spotted the meter box on the wall behind the shawl and politely asked "her" permission to squeeze past, opened the box and flicked the power back on. I wandered back through the cottage and upstairs to find that a light bulb had exploded in the main bedroom with fragments of glass on the bed and floor.

I awoke in the early hours next morning as a train ambled through the station, the building groaned, but I managed a little smile, the floor boards creek, the dunny leans, the lights go out and the midnight train rocks the station, what a lovely Wheat belt town especially with a little artistic licence added.

## EYES ON THE STREET<sup>WA</sup>

Hello Beverley,

Darrell and I would like to congratulate our young people for taking our warnings seriously and putting on a helmet when riding their bicycles. For the most part I am pleased to see a lot more of our youngsters wearing their helmets when riding their pushbikes. It's now time for the adults to also consider the Road Traffic Act and wear a helmet when riding a pushbike; it is a \$50 infringement for any person who is 16 years of age or older if stopped by police, so please lead by example and wear a helmet (it could save your life).

I would like to also take this opportunity to thank Senior Constable Heather Leach for relieving in our town whilst Darrell was away, she was extremely impressed by the friendly nature of our town; she has now returned to sunny Wongan Hills, thankyou Beverley for being you☺.

The Beverley police have received complaints in relation to vehicle stopping in the middle of Vincent Street to chat to pedestrians crossing the road. This does happen often and we have fallen guilty of these ourselves. Please be sure to take notice of the traffic behind you before chatting to people on the street, it is the safest option to park your vehicle and continue your conversations, therefore you are not causing any kind of hazard to other road users.

A number of teenagers have been spoken to by police in relation to their antisocial behaviour both within town, and at our youth group and also on FACEBOOK!!! It is not acceptable to deal with any kind of conflict with violence from any person; it is also not acceptable to provoke such violence using FACEBOOK as a place to hide behind. If you have a problem with somebody or you are unable to be friends with a particular person, block their profile from your FACEBOOK page and do not get sucked in to the things that are said on this social networking site. The best course of action is to ignore the bad behaviour; I am telling you people will get bored of hassling you if you ignore them, its true!

All violence and assaults are taken very seriously by police and a zero tolerance approach is being taken. **It is not an excuse to say "BUT HE/SHE SAID ..... ABOUT ME ON FACEBOOK"** If you assault any person, you will face consequences for your actions, so **THINK FIRST, ACT SECOND.**

This brings us to another matter of young people roaming the town at all hours of the night. It is not acceptable for young people under the age of 18 years to be walking through our town at all hours of the night into early hours of the morning. Juveniles in Northbridge are taken home when they are located roaming the streets, the same thing will happen in Beverley. Parents please ensure you know where your children (teenagers) are at all times and implement a curfew time that is suitable to your household. Darrell and I do not expect to see any young person wandering the streets of Beverley without an adult past 10pm, on any night.

It will be expected that a responsible adult collect their children from the Beverley Youth Group on Friday nights at the end of the night. Police are no longer happy for young people to walk home alone and unaccompanied from youth group, simply because of the recent disagreements between teenage peer groups.

As the weather becomes colder, the rain will not be too far behind. So please be careful out on our roads. Driving according to the road conditions will greatly reduce any chances of a crash on our roads. Slow down by 5 km per hour, during the wetter conditions, it may not seem like a lot, but when stopping in an emergency it makes a major difference.

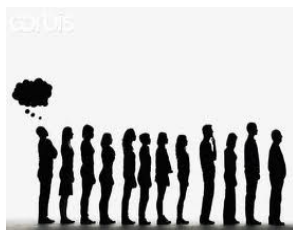

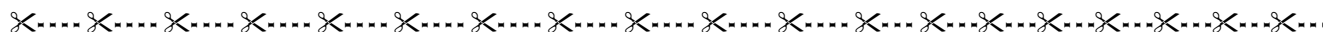

## What is a Hoary-headed Grebe?

This was a question we had to answer on Wednesday the 16<sup>th</sup> of May, when a strange waterbird was found by Tess Hawke on Forrest Street. This little bird had feet similar to a duck and a beak like a chook (as shown in the photographs). You could tell Tess is a teacher because she gave me a lot of homework including identifying this little bird before we could figure out how to look after it. This proved very difficult as we could not positively identify him using the internet or books. I then rang WWF in Northam and spoke with Mike Griffith who thought it might have been a Grebe. We then photographed the little guy and emailed the photos to him who was able to positively identify him as a Hoary-headed Grebe. Our particular Grebe was a teenager which made it harder to identify as pictures only show adults and chicks.

We discovered that Grebes are diving waterbirds that cannot fly

very well. They live in fresh or brackish water but not salt water and feed on the water insects. We had to then work out where it had come from and how it had gotten to Forrest Street. The closest source of water suitable for the grebe we could find was the town dam on the Great Southern Highway. With permission from the Shire of Beverley we went and checked out the dam with great success for we had found 3 other little Grebes living there. Later on we took our little grebe down and released him which was such a happy moment for the family that were not expecting to see there relative again. While we were releasing our little fella we discovered that a fox had most probably grabbed this bird and for some reason dropped him on Forrest Street. This was such a happy and successful wildlife story from Phyllis's Witchy's Kangaroo Rescue and Wildlife Care.

Thanks to Tess Hawke who saved this strange looking bird because it would not have been able to get



home any other way.

Thanks to Mike Griffith from WWF for identifying the Grebe.

Thanks to Melanie Rowley District Wildlife Officer Narragin DEC for her help and advice.

**Biodiversity Fund – Funding Success!**

*Connecting Biodiversity Across the Wheatbelt of Western Australia*

SEAVROC, NEWROC and WEROC have been successful in obtaining \$2.037 million through the Clean Energy Future Biodiversity Fund to run a six-year revegetation, rehabilitation and pest control project 'Connecting Biodiversity Across the Wheatbelt of Western Australia'. The project will be delivered across 15 Shires including the Shires of Beverley, Brookton, Cunderdin, Quairading, Tammin, York, Nungarin, Trayning, Kellerberrin, Bruce Rock, Yilgarn, Westonia, Mt Marshall, Koorda and Merredin.

Up to 135 landholders across the WA Wheatbelt will be provided with opportunities to expand native habitats and connect fragmented native vegetation remnants on their properties through revegetation and biodiverse plantings. Fencing will be provided to help protect existing high-value native vegetation and each landholder will take part in a regional pest control program to help control the spread of foxes and rabbits through these newly created landscapes. Overall, the project will encourage healthy and resilient ecosystems, which are essential in our changing climate. The protection and restoration of native vegetation will also contribute to building and securing natural carbon stores.

As well as providing extensive landscape scale on-ground works, the project will also provide landholders with the opportunity to gain knowledge on the importance of connecting landscapes and restoring valuable remnant vegetation, through workshops and printed publications that will be produced throughout the project.

Landholders will have several opportunities to participate in the project with the first round of applications opening later this year.

## BEVERLEY HORSE AND PONY CLUB



The club arranged for the horse dentist and the vet to come up to the club at the start of this month so that members could have their horse's teeth done, and also drench them for sand and immunise them. Despite it being a miserable wet day a large number of our members took advantage of this opportunity and their horses are ready for the season ahead. It is always a good idea to get your horse's teeth checked every twelve months so that they get all the benefit from their feed as the sharp points are removed reducing the chances of mouth ulcers and allowing the horse to chew properly.

Our May rally was a lovely day for riding. Our senior riders were in the saddle early for an intensive lesson. The rest of the riders started at their normal time. Felicity and Marika had their groups working hard on the flat and over the jumps. Annette and Tess had the younger riders in their yard getting their parents to practice their running to keep up with the trotting ponies. Horsemastership lessons saw a wide variety of activities from labelling parts of the horse to identifying types of bits.



We welcomed new member Jacinta Gom to our club this rally. She doesn't have her own pony yet but thanks to Tess & Tealah she was able to ride *Tommy*.

At lunch time Garry Johnson from Saddles Plus gave a talk to the parents and riders on the importance of saddle fitting and demonstrated how to fit the saddle on Evie's pony *Blue*. He then went on to fit saddles for a number of our members who had either got a new pony, new saddle or just wanted to make sure that their saddle still fitted their pony properly. As our equine friends change shape it can really affect the way a saddle fits so to ensure that your pony or horse is comfortable and not getting a sore back from the saddle it is a good idea to have your saddle professionally fitted at least every couple of years.



After lunch while ponies were having their saddles fitted our members were busy in groups beautifying hobby horses for Avondale. A base coat of paint had been done earlier in the day by Denise Blechynden (thank you Denise) allowing the riders to create some very bright hobby horses. Lots of fun was had by all as our members demon-

strated excellent team work & artistic skills to get the job finished before the end of the day so that the hobby horses would be ready to be tethered.

The club will be hosting the Pony Club Active Riding Championships again this year on the 15<sup>th</sup> & 16<sup>th</sup> September. This is major fundraiser for our club.

On a very serious note we would like to remind all horse and pony owners to keep an extra close eye on their animals for sand colic this season. Already I have heard of a large number of very serious cases including one who had to be put down. This seems to be a bad year for colic with even very knowledgeable people around the state having been affected. It is definitely better to get the vet to drench your pony, if you suspect they may have sand, than to have them end up in Murdoch Veterinary Hospital on a drip or worse.
