

President's Report

Structural Reform/Amalgamations
Whilst only a briefing, the lack of community representation at the recent information session held on 7th February prior to the annual electors meeting was concerning.

The South East Avon Regional Transition Group comprises of the Shires of Beverley, Cunderdin, Quairading, Tammin and York and electors are encouraged to keep up to date with its "transitional" progress. The issue of amalgamations has not gone away as some would believe, however no matter what decisions are finally made by Council and ultimately the community, there are beneficial outcomes from the process we are involved in.

The Current State Business Case has been completed and will shortly be available for public viewing, including an abridged version (which will take much less time to read!) and a Strategic Community Plan has also been completed for each of the communities, once again this and an abridged version will be available for public viewing. As a matter of interest, the work commenced by Council last year to review our own strategic plan has been fed into that document.

Service Delivery Plans and a Future State Business Case are being developed to identify how current facilities and services can be provided by an amalgamated group and there will be more information coming out for you to keep informed about this through fliers, community forums and by the end of March, development of a website that will include not only information and copies of the plans, but also an active question and answer section.

A plus has been that Integrated Planning Documents such as Asset Management Plans, Forward Capital Works Plans, Community Strategy Plans and Long Term Financial Plans have been or will be completed (at the governments expense) placing us ahead of our peers as these documents are required for all local governments by July 2013.

There has been a lot of work undertaken in this whole RTG process, with Councillors endeavouring to keep abreast of the mountain of

information and the CEO and myself and usually several of our Councillors attending many (many) meetings/forums in addition to our own Council meetings and workshops. It has been busy!!!

Annual Electors Meeting

Thankyou to those who attended the recent annual electors meeting. Whilst some Shires question the worth of holding these meetings, besides being a legal requirement to do so, I welcome the opportunity to interact with our community.

<u>Central Country Zone of Local</u> Governments

Beverley is hosting the next Central Country Zone meeting on Friday 2nd March. The zone encompasses Councils from a large regional area

including Corrigin, Lake Grace, Dumbleyung, Wagin, Williams and all Councils in between.

Suncorp Bank Community Ambassador Adam Gilchrist

Adam Gilchrist is regarded by critics worldwide as the greatest wicketkeeper/batsman to have ever played the game.

Adam is the only Australian wicketkeeper to have captained his country in both Test and One-Day International cricket. He was the first batsman in Test cricket history to hit 100 sixes. He also holds the world record for a wicketkeeper after playing 96 consecutive Tests without ever being dropped for form or injury. An inspiring team player, he has taken over 400 dismissals in one day internationals and scored over 8699 runs at a phenomenal strike rate of almost 97 runs per 100 balls.

In 2004 he was selected in Richie Benaud's All Time Greatest Team, sharing this illustrious honour with fellow Australians Sir Donald Bradman, Dennis Lillee and Shane Warne. As recognition for his lifetime achievements, in 2010 Adam was chosen to receive an Order of Australia.

Now Gilly has swapped his Baggy Green for a wide-brimmed hat as he sets out as the Suncorp Bank Community Ambassador to shed light on the importance of being Sunwise.

Hobbyhorse Challenge

We have commenced negotiations with possible participants in a Public Program initiative. The aim is to develop a permanent collection of hobbyhorses, that can be used in education programs at Avondale. Basic concept is to give out hobbyhorse heads to targeted school groups (and invited artists) and the completed hobbyhorses will be on display at the Beverley Clydesdale and Vintage day 24 June 2012. Aim is to highlight the importance of the working horse in the development of agricultural areas of the state, Avon region, and Avondale. The Men's shed have agreed to cut the head (small fee) and assemble the completed head onto broom handle and wheels. Artists have been invited to decorate a horse, and their creation will be auctioned on the day to cover costs of the project, and hopefully raise some funds for more horses, in the future. Maintenance

Unfortunately, during the summer the homestead garden has taken a "beating". With regular watering from now on perhaps we will be able to revive some of it. The two Cape Lilacs have suffered extreme damage from the white cedar grub (as with most of these trees in the district!). The Section 95 crew have commenced regular visits to Avondale again and they have been fantastic in undertaking the heavier work.

Brian Beddall has commenced work on the brakes, and water pump of the FX Holden Ute.

John Hawke has completed the cab for the International C30, and is now waiting for the engine, etc to be replaced so he can fix the cab to the chassis.

The John Deere Model "D" tractor has a seriously flat back tyre. Are we going to look at replacing it?

The Avondale collection has been very fortunate to acquire a fully restored, and operational 1968 Bedford J1. Many thanks to the thoughtful donation of, ex Beverley resident, Charles Wynton.

Sandalwood soil erosion project

In March 2012 we will be planting the sandalwood seeds, hopefully, with volunteer support. We will be putting oats in for a hay crop in the inter-rows to help manage the weeds, and in 2013 the hard seed perennial pastures should take off, along with the sandalewood!

Hello Beverley,

A quick well done is in order for the Beverley Art Gallery Society. I have heard nothing but raving reviews about the most recent entertainment to hit town, 'Abbasolutley.' It would be such a wonderful thing if more locals supported these events, because without the support they will cease to exist. It was a relatively good turn out overall and a great night. (I have a medical certificate for my non-attendance⁽³⁾).

As you are all aware I have not been working in Beverley for quite some weeks due to a lingering injury. Constable BOUND has come across from Northam and has been assisting Darrell with the day to day duties; I would like to take this opportunity to thank him for holding the fort. I am unsure when I will be back on deck, but I am around and the station still remains in operation without me (believe it or not ©).

Darrell has been keeping me up to date on the latest events in Beverley and the surrounds. There was a burglary in town at the Country Kitchen and now some graffiti on the window of Café 6304 (or what was). We are seeking to speak to any person who knows anything about either of these incidents and who is responsible for them. Seeing such a childish act of vandalism really leaves me questioning the maturity of those responsible. If you have any information, you can contact the Beverley Police Station or email us at the address below. A volunteer member of our Saint John Ambulance crew had her car broken into whilst they were out saving lives between the hours of 11.30pm and just after midnight on 21/02/2012. This has made us and the Saint John Ambulance VOLUNTEERS very angry and disappointed at such a thoughtless act. Again we are looking for information with regards to this incident. It's not good enough that we have people in our community volunteering their time to help others and they return to find their personal items have been stolen. ONE DAY IT COULD BE YOU THAT NEEDS SAVING!!!!

There have been a number of Juveniles observed walking or riding their bicycles around the streets of Beverley during late hours of the night with no particular destination or real reason to be out. I doubt very much whether the responsible adults that care for these children are aware of them sneaking around, but it has to STOP. It's a very natural conclusion to draw an inference between an offence committed over night and a group of kids

wandering around on the same night. Police will always question those kids first.

In order to tackle this growing problem, if police see juveniles (children under 18yrs) walking the streets late at night, they will be picked up by police and taken to the police station. The parent of that child or children will be called to come and collect them and the Department of Child Protection will be notified in every instance. Please be responsible for your children and make it your business to know where they are at all times.

If a member of the community observes suspicious behaviour at any time of the day or night, please do not hesitate to contact 131444. You will get through to the Police Communications in Perth, however they will despatch the task to local police or those on duty and it will be dealt with. You can try 9646 3333 first, this is the direct Beverley phone number and if we are on, we will answer the call. If not you will be put through to Northam, continue to lodge you complaint with them and we will be notified.

Remember the Beverley E-Watch Initiative.

Thank you to all those that have registered so far, this is a great initiative and is an opportunity to give the community a way to communicate what is happening around the shire to their local police, instead of having to leave messages with outside offices.

If you haven't received a brochure you can go to either the police station or the shire and collect one. Otherwise you can email Beverley.Crime.Ewatch@police.wa.gov.au and register to become a member.

So I want to leave you with one word for the upcoming couple of months "VIGILANT". Be vigilant around town and protecting your property.



Digital TV Switchover – Wheatbelt Community Fact Sheet

Under the Australian Government's Digital Switchover program, analog TV signals are being switched off around Australia, region by region, between 2010 and 2013. After December 2013 all areas of Australia will receive digital signals only. To continue to watch TV after this time you will need to have a digital TV or set-top box.

What does digital TV have to offer the Wheatbelt?

Many areas that have traditionally not been able to access high-quality free to air television will now be able to do so. Regional and remote areas will also have the ability to access the same channels as the major cities. Viewers who in the past have been unable to receive digital TV through their normal antenna because of issues relating to local interference, terrain or distance from the transmitter in their area will have access through the VAST network

What does the digital switchover mean for me?

In some areas broadcasters will be upgrading existing towers to receive digital TV signal. If this is the case in your area all you will need to receive digital TV is a digital set top box or digital capable TV. Ensure at the time of purchase that you ask if the box you are buying is suitable for your area of residence.

In regional areas that currently receive TV reception from a local analog self-help tower, broadcasters may not be upgrading the facility to digital. In these circumstances the provider of the self-help tower will have two options:

- 1) Upgrade the tower at their own expense and be responsible for the ongoing costs and maintenance of the facility; OR
- The community serviced by the tower moves to the Viewer Access Satellite Television (VAST) network

The equipment required for receiving digital TV in areas that are not serviced by a tower are a satellite dish and a digital set top box. If you have an existing satellite dish and currently access regional free to air TV through the Optus Aurora platform, you may only need to purchase a VAST set top box to upgrade to digital TV

To find out what is happening in your area visit the mySwitch website.

Viewer Access Satellite Service (VAST)

To access digital TV, some towns in regional and remote Australia will need to switch to the new VAST service. The VAST service is a direct to the home digital television satellite service which covers all of Australia. It employs cutting edge transmission technology to provide high quality viewing of the same number of television channels that are available in capital cities in both standard definition (SD) and high definition (HD).

Eligible viewers will generally be able to access the VAST service about six months before the switch to digital TV in their area. The retail cost for a high definition VAST set-top box with the smart card is about \$280 (inc. GST). A satellite dish is about \$100–\$500, depending on the size of the dish required (to find out the recommended dish size for your area, go to mySwitch). Installation costs will depend on your location and the individual circumstances of your household.

What is the Satellite Subsidy Scheme (SSS) and how can I access it?

Households in regional and remote areas that currently rely on TV reception from a local analog self-help tower, which is not being converted to digital, may be eligible for the Satellite Subsidy Scheme (SSS). Under SSS, the Australian Government will subsidise the installation of a satellite dish, VAST set-top box, smart card, associated cabling and installation of the equipment. There are no ongoing fees to receive VAST. A one year warranty is provided for digital television reception equipment installed under the Satellite Subsidy Scheme and the Household Assistance Scheme. In SSS applicable areas the fixed household contribution will be between \$200 - \$350 and the Government will cover all remaining costs.

Only certain areas across regional and remote Australia are eligible for the SSS. To be eligible the area you live in must be identified as relying on TV reception from an analog self-help retransmission tower not being converted to digital. Eligible householders will be sent a letter inviting them to apply for the subsidy when it opens in their area. You can also confirm your eligibility and apply for the SSS by visiting the Digital Ready website at www.digitalready.gov.au

Commercial dwellings are not eligible for the SSS.

What is the Household Assistance Scheme (HAS)?

The Australian Government is providing extra assistance for people receiving Age Pension, Disability Support, Carer Payment, Department of Veterans Affairs Service Pension or Income Support Supplement. If you receive the full rate for any of these payments, and have not already converted to digital, contact Centrelink to see if you are eligible for HAS.

If you are eligible you will receive the following package free of charge:

- · a high definition (HD) set top box
- · the set up and installation of the set top box
- · instructions on how to use it
- · any necessary upgrades to cabling and antenna systems, where eligible.

Digital TV for hotels, motels and caravan parks in VAST Service Areas

There are three main options for accommodation providers in regional/remote areas that will be serviced by VAST:

- 1) Install a satellite dish and VAST set top box for each unit
- 2) Install a Master Antenna System (SMATV) to distribute the signal to units
- Upgrade an existing Master Antenna TV (MATV) analog distribution system to provide the VAST service to units

To find out more about these options visit the "For Industry, Property Managers" section on the digital ready website at: http://industry.digitalready.gov.au/

How Can I make Sure I am Digital TV Ready?

- Look on the mySwitch website to find out when your area is switching to digital TV and what service you will be receiving
- 2) Ensure that your television is digital compatible
 - If you are not sure whether your TV is digital or analog an easy way to tell is to see if you can watch ABC2, ABC3 or SBS Two. If you can then your TV is digital and you don't have to do anything further
 - If your TV is analog you will need to either buy a digital set-top box for each analog TV (costs start at around \$30 for a standard definition set-top box) you use or buy a digital TV
- Check to see if you are eligible to receive any assistance either through the Satellite Subsidy Scheme (see the mySwitch website) or the Household Assistance Scheme (contact Centrelink on 1800 556 443)
- 4) If you are worried about your picture quality, talk to an endorsed Antenna Installer. Call 1800 20 10 13 or visit <u>www.digitalready.gov.au</u> for a list of endorsed Antenna Installers in your area. If you are renting, talk to your landlord about any antenna issues before upgrading.

About 30 people came along to Reserve Pool for a Saturday afternoon meeting on a glorious sunny day and expressed their interest in helping the reserve. As well as the great turn out of Dale locals and wider Beverley residents, we were also supported by people from the Toodyay Naturalist Club and Wheatbelt NRM.

We formulated a loose plan to enhance and conserve the reserve, involving fencing, understory planting in treed areas, and next year, replanting the overstory in a large cleared section. Other topics discussed were on how to control public access (so car parking areas) and signage to promote respectful visits. It was great to have so much local input to these topics.

Wheatbelt NRM immediately offered to support our efforts by funding fencing, understory planting and some signs this year. This generosity will allow us to start activities early. Within the next few months, planting days and other opportunities for public involvement can be announced. Wheatbelt NRM has also offered to "sponsor" us, which will allow the group to operate legally until we wade through the incorporation process ourselves.

Toodyay Nat's club brought along some books to kick start our resource collection, some of the newsletters they create so we have an example to model on and a wealth of experience in dealing with the legal ins and outs. Their support is very much appreciated.

Currently, the group is writing up a management and publicity plan which will keep us on track and enable us to apply for funding. Also, we are starting the incorporation process.



SEAVROC Young Farmers Meet with Hon. Terry Redman MLA, Minister for Agriculture

On Thursday 2nd February 2012, 13 members of the SEAVROC Young Farmers group that undertook a tour to Queensland last year, met with Hon. Terry Redman to discuss the World Congress on Conservation Agriculture that they attended and their subsequent tour of south east Queensland. This was also an opportunity for the group to raise any issues currently being faced in agriculture in Western Australia.

A presentation was given by the Young farmers and this outlined what information they had learnt during their trip to Queensland, and what practices they have been able to implement on their own farming properties since their return. The group explained that even though agricultural conditions were quite different in Queensland, technologies and practices used were able to be transferred into farming practices in Western Australia, particularly those relating to precision agriculture and adapting to a changing climate.

Opportunities regarding post farm gate activities such as training and educational opportunities to increase farm productivity were discussed, and as a result future programs may be implemented to assist farming businesses. Grain marketing was highlighted as an important area that with more training businesses may add to their bottom line. Another key issue that was raised by the group was the retention of quality employees in the region and how restrictions on international worker visas was negatively impacting on the amount of staff training required and high turnover of staff.

The event was also attended by Hon. Mia Davies MLC, Dexter Davies (Principal Policy Advisor - Agriculture and Food), Scott Mitchell (Chief of Staff), David Bowron and Pam l'Anson from the Department of Food and Agriculture.



The Young farmers were also able to interact and gain valuable information from these industry leaders and create new networks that will assist with their farming practices going forward. They encouraged all of the young farmers to promote the agricultural industry with positive stories in 2012, The Year of the Farmer, rather than continue to allow only negative press to reach our city counterparts.

Kicking off the year for a healthy start

Term one provides the opportunity for more than 500 children from the Wheatbelt to take part in a variety of fun physical activities after school thanks to their involvement in the Australian Government's Active Afterschool Communities (AASC) program.

Children will be given an opportunity to try sports including swimming, hockey, tennis, circus, gymnastics, squash, basketball, athletics and lacrosse in a fun, safe and friendly environment with trained community coaches.

In the Wheatbelt there has been strong support for the national program, with 17 local primary schools and outside school hours care services funded to provide AASC activity sessions.

"We are providing children with the opportunity to play aquatic games for our AASC sessions this term, and the children are incredibly excited. They can't wait for the afternoon school bell so they can get stuck into playing a new sport, making new friends and having fun," said AASC Site Coordinator David Watkins.

The AASC program encourages children to participate in sport afterschool and encourages them to join a sporting club if they enjoy the experience. By participating in the program, children will learn the importance of being healthy and active, meet new friends and develop new personal and physical skills.

The AASC program is an Australian Government initiative delivered by the Australian Sports Commission in up to 3,270 schools and outside school hours care services across Australia. Each term, up to 190,000 children participate in up to 70 different sports and 20 structured physical activities after school.

Fact Sheet Active After-school Communities in Western Australia — Playing for Life



Children in Western Australia are benefiting from the Active After-school Communities (AASC) program, which is credited with getting inactive children active and strengthening communities.

The AASC program is a free Australian Government initiative delivered nationally by the Australian Sports Commission. It provides primary school children with free sport and other physical activity programs after school.

The program has been embraced by children, parents, schools and after-school care providers in Western Australia, as well as coaches with community sporting clubs. The program achieves a high level of overall satisfaction with parents, who believe their children like participating due to the program's focus on having fun.

'The kids love it because they are playing and having fun,' one parent from Perth says. According to another parent, 'They are always talking about it, so you know they think it is fun'.

Program delivers agree this is the reason for the AASC program's success. A deliverer from South West Netball, a community sporting organisation based in Busselton, describes the program as fantastic: 'I know that the kids love it. They love the games. If it's fun, they're interested.'

Getting inactive children active in Western Australia

Research finds the majority of parents in Western Australia admit their child would not be playing another sport if they were not involved with the program. This demonstrates the large role the program plays in getting inactive kids active.

A parent from Perth says the program is educating your kids that there is the option to be active rather than sitting inside watching TV. It shows them that they have the option to go outside and he active.

Other surveyed parents say their child is more interested in joining in with school sport after becoming involved with the AASC program, and many have gone on to join a local sporting club. As one Western Australian parent says, My kids were not keen on doing sports, but the program activities have made sports more appealing and enjoyable for them. Now they are more likely to give things a go'.

Program deliverers also notice a marked improvement in children's attitudes towards sport. An afterschool care provider in Western Australia says, "We had a couple of kids who never really did much in the way of physical activity but they like the program because it's all about fun and having a go, not how good you are'.

Many program deliverers say the wide range of activities on offer is a factor in the program's success. In Western Australia in particular there is an emphasis on children enjoying the opportunity to learn circus skills such as juggling, walking on stilts or riding a unicycle.

Sports on offer range from soccer, netball and lacrosse to lawn bowls and squash. This variety enables children to find a sport that suits them and encourages less active children to get involved. As a program deliverer from Squash Magic in Bridgetown says, "It's not all about the mainstream sports'.

A large majority of community coaches believe children of all ability levels feel welcome particij in the program. An after-school care provider in Western Australia says, 'The program gives th an opportunity to try different things ... to give them a taste of something different ... this helps overcome their lack of confidence'.

The program is inclusive and according to a deliverer with South West Netball, 'Everybody's in and everybody is doing something. Nobody sits out and nobody misses out'.

Strengthening communities in Western Australia

As a result of the AASC program, many Western Australian community sporting clubs are building

Community coaches say their ability to deliver sport to children has been increased, as the program equips them with the necessary skills to teach that age group.

The teaching philosophy of the AASC program is 'great', according to a program deliverer with South West Netball. 'You've got all your materials there, you really haven't got an excuse, it's a given to you, you just have to get out there and deliver it in the right way for it to have a positive effect on the kids'.

The benefits of the AASC program flow onto the wider community, stimulating community involvement and promoting the social inclusion of people from a variety of ethnicities and socio economic backgrounds.




