# **Will Power**

The Nine Dragon Martial Arts Academy recently attended the WA Nogi Brazilian Jiu-Jitsu State Championships in Perth taking home 11 Gold and 6 Silver Medals.

The Australian Federation of Brazilian Jiu-Jitsu holds two state championships in Western Australian per year, the Nogi (without uniform) and Gi (with uniform). In the Nogi event competitors fight in a rash guard and Jiu-Jitsu shorts and skills are put to the test on the ability to submit your opponent without the manipulation of a heavy uniform.

The event which was hosted at the Craigie Leisure Centre in Perth on Sunday 18 March 2012 was host to some of the best Brazilian Jiu-jitsu practitioners in Western Australia and the Asia Pacific.

Beverley local, 8 year old William Kennedy was a winner in the Mixed All-Belts 8 year old 28kg taking out the division and the Gold Medal uncontested. However his skills were put to the test later that morning when he entered the 31kg division and fought his way through to take out a very well deserved silver medal only to be beaten by another Nine Dragon member from the Perth academy.

William who only recently took up Karate training has only been training for approximately two months under Chief Instructor and National Director of karate Michael Martino, a 6<sup>th</sup> Degree Black Belt with over 30 year's teaching experience. Michael says that as far as martial arts go Kempo is a very solid style and one of the preferred styles of MMA (Mixed Martial Arts) competitors. Made up of 30% hands, 30% feet, 30% ground work and 10% all things wild, Michael says the only negative he has come to appreciate of Kempo is the length of time it takes to get through the belts.

With the Gi State Championships scheduled for July Michael has indicated that he expects big things for a number of Beverly students.

Regional Development Trust Visit The CEO and I recently hosted a visit by representatives from the Regional Development Trust who has been undertaking a review of the Royalties for Regions Country Local Government Fund at the request of the Minister for Regional Development. The draft report has now been released for comment.

#### Avondale - Stakeholders Meeting

A meeting facilitated via Mia Davies MLC and Max Trenordan MLC was held recently at Parliament House between representatives of the Shire of Beverley, National Trust, Avondale Farm Project Association, Regional Development Council, Wheatbelt Development Commission and Minister Grylls' office. It was apparent that the concept and potential of Avondale as a regional heritage asset is acknowledged and generally supported. #### Easter Art Exhibition

The Art Gallery Committee and their band of helpers have again excelled in presenting the 44<sup>th</sup> Annual Easter Art Purchase Exhibition. Of the 320 entries 69 paintings were sold which is a record, and contrary to what's been occurring at other exhibitions. Many positive comments were made by visitors and the judges relating to the artwork, venue and professional manner in which the exhibition was staged.

#### Town Entry Statement

I am very pleased to report that Council has endorsed the recommendation of the Town Entry Statement Committee to accept the design submitted by Claire Broun entitled "The Gates" as the winning entry in the Town Entry Statement design competition. The project will now be costed prior to any works commencing. Thankyou to Cr Shaw for chairing the group and to all committee members for your contribution.

#### Caravan Park

The Garden Club have offered to assist with further development of the caravan park garden and have met with Council's Community Development Committee to discuss their ideas.


On track for another great year at the Beverley Agricultural Society. WE HAVE A FULL COMMITTEE!

# Joyce Oliver - Our Tribute



A public meeting was held in the Beverley Town Hall Lounge on Tuesday 18<sup>th</sup> October 1977 with twenty four persons present. After some discussion, Ruth Mann moved that a Beverley Historical Society be formed. That motion was seconded by Joyce Oliver. Joyce was to remain a member of the Beverley Historical Society for over thirty years. As a founding member, Joyce's interest in the Society and her commitment to its aims were a

product of her genuine attachment to her hometown of Beverley.

Born Joyce Marjorie Davey in the town on 8th March 1915, Joyce spent almost her whole life in Beverley. She lived in houses in Smith St, John St and Forrest St and finally at the Alex Miles Lodge. She attended the local school and joined the Girl Guides. She trained as a hairdresser operating from a couple of premises in Vincent St. Prior to the Second World War, she married Arthur Leslie Oliver, proprietor and editor of the *Beverley Times* newspaper. She had two children: Judith, who died as a baby, and Paul.

She regularly attended St Mary's Anglican Church (built by her father, Fred Davey) and was an active member of both the Ladies Guild and the Mother's Union.

She enjoyed going to the Beverley races and was a keen member of the Beverley Golf Club helping with activities such as catering and raffles.

Her friends remember her as being calm, serene and unruffled. On the putting green, she took her time to remove any tiny pebble or leaf before committing to the shot, regardless of the next group of golfers waiting. Neither Joyce nor Arthur learned to drive a motorcar and people picking her up often had to pause while she made sure her cat, Snowy, had foodstuff available.

She was very well-organised, precise and fastidious in her daily life. Friends recall she was most particular that a table be set according to her high standard - at home, at golf club dinners and, in later years, in the dining room at the Alex Miles Lodge. She was an excellent seamstress and maintained a particular elegance in her clothing and hair style.

In later life she was always very appreciative of those who assisted her. When she had Meals on Wheels delivered to her home, the volunteers looked forward to the wrapped lolly they would receive from her as thanks. At the Alex Miles Lodge she always helped with chores such as washing and wiping the dishes.

Her eyesight deteriorated over time, but she loved to play Chinese Checkers at HACC days, choosing the red marbles as they were the ones she could see best.

Joyce remained very perceptive right till the end. She was interested in everything and had a fantastic memory for Beverley history, people, houses, events and places of business. This attribute was greatly appreciated by the Beverley Historical Society and, in fact, she posted a letter containing information for the Society's records in the last few days of her life.

Joyce was Treasurer of the Beverley Historical Society for five years from 1983 to 1987 and attended meetings up until 2010. At the first meeting in 2010 someone wondered what the date was and Joyce gently mentioned she knew the date was 8<sup>th</sup> March as it was her birthday – she was 95! She made many interesting and valuable donations to the Society and the Dead Finish Museum, though she would occasionally ask to borrow them back for a short time. The Museum's largest artefact came courtesy of Joyce – the last printing press of the *Beverley Times* now resides in our garden.

She died in Mandurah on 8<sup>th</sup> January 2012, just two months short of her 97<sup>th</sup> birthday. This remarkable woman was a true and honourable citizen of Beverley. *Compiled by the Beverley Historical Society 2012*


Fantastic week with lots of great work and fantastic food for us all to eat.



Hello Beverley,

We hope that you have all had a wonderful break over the Easter period and are settling back in to everyday life in down town Beverley. It was a busy period for the police as you can imagine, especially having to deal with some unnecessary behaviours.

It has become evident that there are a few people in town who feel the need to leave black marks all over our roads and not only put their own lives at risk but also the lives of innocent parties.

Reckless driving of any nature is not tolerated by the Beverley Police and a zero tolerance approach is being taken. We have already taken action and seized one vehicle for a period of 28 days. Charges have been laid against two people in separate incidents, for Reckless Driving and also Dangerous Driving.

Please be advised that members of the public who witness this kind of behaviour on our roads are urged to contact their local police and report the incident. Please bear in mind the registration of the vehicle, the type of vehicle and if possible the description of the driver. Note the time of day and obviously the place where the incident occurred. You can be assured that with this information, police will in most cases be able to seize the vehicle and take action against the person responsible for the vehicle.

Whilst on the subject of vehicles and driving behaviours, police have seen an increase in people drink driving over the past month within Beverley and also York. Do not grow complacent; there are police around even when you think they are not. It is no longer a question of whether you will get caught or not, it is a question of WHEN you will be caught. REMEMBER–It is only a matter of time, don't take the risk.

On a lighter note, take care during this unrestricted fire period, it is still quite dry out there and best practice is to remain cautious and maintain control of the fires that you light. Farmers, it is time to commence the RAIN DANCE so that we have another Bumper season. SO GET JIGGLING ©!

# **AVONDALE DISCOVERY FARM – IT'S WORTH SAVING** PRESERVE THE PAST, PROMOTE THE OPPORTUNITY, PROGRESS A SUSTAINABLE FUTURE

# Executive Summary

Avondale's long and colourful history dates back to the early settlement of Western Australia when the property was part of land originally assigned to Governor James Stirling in the 1830's.

The growing Avondale estate changed ownership several times, eventually becoming a state farm in 1910. It was subdivided and sold to returned soldiers following World War 1 as repatriation farms. The remaining homestead block was eventually vested in the Department of Agriculture in 1924, retained as an Agricultural Research Station for over 80 years.

As part of the 150th anniversary celebrations for the State of Western Australia, the Department of Agriculture commissioned a project that would remain a permanent feature and provide a lasting recognition of the contribution by the agricultural industry to the development and economy of the State. The project involved restoration of the homestead and stables, fencing the 54 Ha bush reserve and creation of what became one of the largest machinery collections of its kind in Australia with items donated from throughout the state(1). This "Avondale Project" was opened by HRH Prince Charles in 1979 as part of the State's sesquicentenary celebrations.

There was immense community concern that Avondale's vast history and opportunity would be lost for future generations when the Department of Agriculture announced the property was to be divested. Community and political lobbying resulted in its transfer to the National Trust (WA) in 2009.

The Trust and Community have been working on many projects since, however a major injection of capital to reverse many years of inadequate asset management has been elusive, and the property continues to be at risk of being lost for future generations.

### <u>NEW PROGRAM OFFERS</u> <u>HOPE FOR SMOKERS</u> <u>WANTING TO QUIT</u>

Smokers in the Wheatbelt now have access to the Wheatbelt Quit Smoking program which offers support and hope to those who want to quit. The twelve week individualised program has three support options including nicotine replacement therapy advice, Fresh Start group sessions and motivational SMS or emails.

Rachael Biddulph and Sarah Potts local Health Promotion Officers at the Avon and Central Wheatbelt Primary Health Service have received *Fresh Start* facilitator training from The Western Australia Cancer Council to provide the course locally.

*Fresh Start* groups have been highly successful in helping WA smokers beat their habit. Sessions cover nico-tine addiction, managing withdrawal symptoms, weight control, stress management, recognizing and planning for possible obstacles to quitting, staying stopped and enjoying being a non-smoker.

*Fresh Start* is different because it gives people an understanding of why they smoke. Armed with this knowledge, smokers can apply the quitting strategies provided in the course to their personal circumstances. The group sessions are also a great incentive and source of support.

# State NRM Program Community Grants 2012

The Government of Western Australia is committed to helping communities undertake projects that protect and restore their local environment.

This year they have pledged \$3 million towards State NRM Program Community Grants to support onground activities of local community groups.

Grants of between \$10 000 and \$50 000 are available for any on-ground activity that will assist in the conservation, restoration, rehabilitation or enhancement of a local natural asset. This can include land, water, marine and biodiversity assets.

#### Who can apply?

Catchment and community groups, industry groups, not for profit organisations, local government authorities and education institutions are eligible for these grants.

Applicants can lodge more than one project proposal and current and past applicants can apply.

State Government agencies, regional NRM organisations and individuals are not eligible to apply directly for these grants but may partner with eligible groups.

We also ran a workshop and made some elves (see picture). The day was enjoyed by all and we are looking forward to having more workshops in the near future.



# Crana Aboriginal Corporation Inc. Community Awareness

On the 2nd day of April 2012, OneLife and Crana organised a two hour session at the Beverley Amenities building. The topic highlighted 'Staying Safe & Solid and Suicide Awareness".

This OneLife Suicide Prevention program helps one to learn and understand the essential skills to help others and the warning signs of suicide:

- When should you be worried
- Where to get help.
- Learning how to talk to people.
- Who may be suicidal-about their feelings and worries
- Learning what other help is available for you to contact and DOING IT.

Difficult times: Some things in peoples lives may put them at risk of suicide. These people need support when things happen such as: Sadness, family problems, loss of loved ones, no money, ill health, pressures and stresses in caring for sick loved ones and also when a family member or friend have been incarcerated in prison.

The facts and evidences say most people have thoughts of suicide from time to time. People who do think along these lines are in pain and are not well, but may not have a mental illness. The session also covered topics: the importance of yarning with friends, families or colleagues; taking time to ask them how they are going. If they are hurting keep trying to get them help.

This session was coordinated by Brett Lambadgee and two colleagues. An Indigenous perspective with a safe cultural program-taking into account Aboriginal world wide beliefs and culture. As Noongar people have a holistic culture, services and programs should aim to empower them through: Safe Space, discussing distressing issues and affirming and empowering through social, physical, mental and emotional, environmental, spiritual and governmental aspects of health and well being.

Note: A previous OneLife Suicide Program of Prevention and Awareness was held at the RSL hall on the 23 March 2012. Both sessions had a good turn out. The atmosphere was friendly and the lunches were tasty and well presented.

# Managing Your Health to Prevent Falls

In 2010, the Australian Bureau of Statistics revealed, those who were 65 years and over made up 22.3% of the Beverley population. According to Department of Health of Western Australia, the highest rate of hospitalisations due to falls were observed in both males and females 65 years and over between 2000-2008. Falls and their associated injuries can have severe health consequences and are the leading cause of injury hospitalisations for older people. The Department of Health Western Australia reported that males are more likely to be hospitalised and

treated for a head injury and females are more likely to be treated for an injury to the elbow or forearm.

Chronic health conditions such as heart conditions, diabetes, Parkinson's Disease, arthritis, osteoporosis, high/low blood pressure, depression and dementia can increase the risk of falling, by causing the person to feel dizziness, confusion, lightheadiness, slowed reactions, reduced awareness of surroundings, blurred vision or a drop in blood pressure.

Leonie Hill of the Beverley diabetic support group says "it is so important that people, who have type one or type two diabetes, speak with their local GP or contact the support group for guidance on how to best manage their diabetes"

"Having a personal action plan that manages your health can increase your mobility and can prevent falls from occurring in the first place".

Four ways to manage your health include; 1. Assessing your lifestyle such as asking yourself if you have a well balanced diet, can you quit smoking or reduce your number of cigarettes and did you engage in 30 minutes of activity today; 2. Knowing and understanding your condition, what are the symptoms associated with your health condition, 3. Talking with your GP about your medication, what side affects increase your risk of falling and 4. Participating and finding a balance in life, is there a social group you can join or recreational activities you can participate in

Residents of Beverley with a chronic health condition are urged to contact their local GP or the Beverley diabetic support group on 96464 149 to discuss the best options in managing long-term health conditions and how to reduce the risk of falling.



# Beverley Community Information / Referral & Paralegal Services

GENERAL INFORMATION: This information is provided in **good faith**, if one needs to go further on any matters, please seek an opinion from an informed source or Legal Advice as the issues are of a sensitive and serious nature.

AGED CARE: Last week Prime Minister Gillard announced that there will be new changes to this system. The following are said to be extracts from newsprint and TV media reports.

The changes reflect to:- Nursing home entry fees, bond and criteria, nursing beds.

- 1. Age care applicants will be means tested.
- 2. Capping will be fixed at \$25,000/-
- 3. Previously the bond/ accommodation charges would vary from individual nursing homes, some would be as high as \$500,000/-.
- Each resident is expected to contribute ie those who could afford to pay
- 5. Option lump sum ability to pay.

- 6. Option could include "Charging up or offering your home as security"
- 7. The time limit to sell you home will be extended.
- 8. The Australian Government will be providing another 2,500 plus bed s for low care residents.

NB Radio comments and TV reports on the above indicate that these above changes are most welcome, some experts in the medical and age care profession say the system is never the less complex. Therefore the old adage applied ie when in doubt, seek advice from age care bodies. Centrelink or even legal advice, before you even contemplate to place a LOVED FAMILY MEMBER INTO AGE CARE. Of course the prima facie step is your LOCAL GP. Then proceed from there. At this point in time, most families are heavily involved.

(Extracts from Sheet No 15 Australian Government is attached.)(See facing page)

LAND TRANSFER FORMS: Due to recent identity fraud, the witness or qualified person has an obligation to verify that both the parties produce a 100 point check and also witness this separate ID form eg Passport.= 70 pts, Driver's License = 40 pts, Centrelink/Medicare = 25 pts, Birth Certificate = 70 pts, Bank/Health Insurance cards = 20 pts.

Please note that the point system may vary. When I am unsure, I do phone and seek verification from the Authorities concerned.

CITIZENSHIP: Witnessing of photograph and application. The requirement is that the applicant is know to the witness for AT LEAST ONE YEAR. This is a legal requirement, which I am obliged to follow.

CENTELINK: According to TV reports there is a move to recover 3.6 billion dollars from Centrelink recipients from those who are overpaid and others who are not genuinely entitled to benefits. Thousands of investigators will be employed to recovered \$320 million from Newstart and \$420 million from the disability section and the rest of the shortfall will be recovered from other From a personal recipients. perspective, I am unsure what this actually means, as the statement was very short and more or less on the above lines, and is for general information only.

#### The Accommodation Charge for Residential Aged

#### Accommodation payments

There are two types of accommodation payments that may be payable to aged care homes:

- Residents requiring high care other than on an extra service basis may be asked to pay an accommodation charge;
- Residents requiring low care or entering an extra service place (at high or low care) may be asked to pay an accommodation bond.

(Refer to Information Sheet 16 – Accommodation Bonds for Residential Aged Care for more detail)

Whether a resident requires high care is determined at the time of entry to a permanent place by the evidence available at that time. Relevant evidence may include the assessment by an Aged Care Assessment Team, assessment by the aged care home if the person has been receiving respite care, and other evidence such as doctors' or hospital records.

Respite residents cannot be asked to pay an accommodation payment.

# What is an Accommodation Charge?

An accommodation charge (the charge) is a daily amount a resident may be asked to pay when they enter high care. The accommodation charge is fixed from the date of entry into care until they are discharged from care for a period greater than 28 days. A resident cannot be asked to pay the charge more than a month in advance. By law, it must be used by the home to improve building standards, and the quality and range of aged care services provided.

A charge can only be levied by an aged care home that is certified as meeting minimum building and care standards. Information on a home's certification status can be found on the department's website at www.health.gov.au or by calling the Aged Care Information Line on 1800 500 853\*

# Can a resident defer payment of their Accommodation Charge?

Yes. A resident can agree with the aged care provider to defer payment or pay it from their estate. The aged care provider is entitled to charge interest on the unpaid amount at no more that double the lowest pension deeming rate applicable at the time of entering the home (currently 6%).

### Determining a resident's assets

The maximum amount of a resident's accommodation bond or charge depends on the amount of their assessable assets.

Centrelink or the Department of Veterans' Affairs (DVA) undertake assets testing for entry into permanent residential aged care on behalf of the Department of Health and Aging. Centrelink undertakes all assessments except those for people who receive a means tested pension from DVA. Assets assessments can be undertaken before a person enters residential aged care.

An assets assessment is not compulsory unless a person wants to find out if they are eligible for government assistance with their accommodation costs for permanent residential aged care.

To apply for an assets assessment a person or their authorised representative must complete a "Permanent Residential Aged care - Request for an Assets Assessment" form. This form is available from the Aged Care Assessment Team who determines eligibility for residential aged care or by contacting the Aged Care Information Line on 1800 500 853\*.

### Will a resident's home be "protected"?

The value of a resident's former home will not be counted as an asset if, at the time of the assets assessment or the date of entry into care (whichever is earlier):

- the partner or dependent child is living there;
- a carer who is eligible for an income support payment has been living there

for at least two years;

• a close relative who is eligible for an income support payment has been living there for at least five years.

Aged care residents who pay an accommodation charge are able to rent out their former home without the value of the home or the rental income affecting their aged care fees and, if applicable, their pension.

The former home is exempted from the pension assets test for two years for all people entering residential care (and longer if the person's partner remains living in the home).

### Gifting

Assets gifted away from 10 May 2006 over \$10,000 in a single financial year or \$30,000 in a five financial year period will be included in a resident's assets assessment.

As a result, a resident may not be eligible for government assistance with their accommodation costs.



## A View from the Shed Reactions to "Distress"

We often talk about the dangers of stress in our lives but perhaps we need to remember that it is stress that actually gets us through the day. What we would be better to talk about is excessive stress or having too many things that are stressful in our lives; this can then lead us to a point of "Distress."

Most people will experience "Distress" from time to time and it is important to recognise how we react to these situations. Very often we unwittingly cause significant damage to those closest to us because of our behavior when in "Distress."

Some common reactions to "Distress" are temper outbursts, lack of sleep, excessive alcohol consumption, feeling alone and isolated and a strong sense that no one cares. The unfortunate consequence is that if we are suffering from "Distress" it is probably the most important time when we need family and friends for support.

It is often said that "a problem shared is a problem halved" have you ever considered why that may work? Talking about the problem can create a word picture and may create additional ideas, provide clarification and help gather perspective to come to a resolution.

At this time of year, with budgets and bank reviews occurring, keep in mind the importance of clear thinking. Don't let personal reactions to "Distress" push friends and family away. We need to know our particular reactions to distress and guard against the negatives they may create. We also need to be patient with the people who care about us, even if they don't understand our problems specifically, talking it over will help put things in perspective and may create solutions.


