

Shire President's Report January 2013

Annual Electors Meeting

Thank you to community members who attended the 11/12 Shire of Beverley Annual Electors meeting in December. The Local Government Act requires that an annual meeting is held following confirmation of reports relative to the completed financial year.

At the Beverley meeting the opportunity was also taken to provide updates on current projects and activities occurring within the Shire.

Local Planning Strategy

As mentioned in the November Blarney, the draft Local Planning Strategy is available for public comment until 31st January 2013. The Strategy document can be viewed on the Shire website or in hard copy at the Shire office or Community Resource Centre.

Plant and Works Committee

The Plant and Works Committee will be undertaking a review and update of the 10 year road programme, commencing mid January. Comments or issues you would like to raise can be directed via email or in writing to the Shire office to the attention of the Works Supervisor.

Swimming Pool's 50th

If you haven't been to the Beverley Pool for awhile, perhaps you should, and see how terrific it's looking! The water is extremely inviting (even if a tad chilly at times), Bruce, Nemo and friends have found a place on the wall of the pump building, a diving board should just about be ready for plenty of action and new shade covers are on the way.

Christmas Lights

There were some great lighting displays in the businesses and around the town, with some new lights purchased by the Shire finally going up near the fountain in front of

the Old School Building. Thankyou to everyone who participated, both in getting lights up and for making selections for the people's choice awards.

Avondale

The historic Avondale Farm has educational, tourism and regional development potential.

Once so valued by the State Government that funds were committed toward developing the property as a permanent feature in recognition of agriculture, Avondale now has the potential, if developed in a practical and sustainable way, to become a public and educational facility in the promotion of agriculture, now and into the future.

Whilst the National Trust executive team have reluctantly agreed the property be prepared for sale following several years of inability to attract funding to commence implementation of the Masterplan, the Shire of Beverley and Avondale Farm Project Association have by no means given up in trying to secure a future for the property, and continue working with the National Trust in this regard.

Beverley Station Arts

Thankyou to Beverley Station Arts for organising and staging the free Family Christmas Concert held at the Platform Theatre. Council and BSA are currently working on a Management Agreement for the Railway Station Cultural Precinct to

facilitate continued usage of the area for the community, and support growth of the Arts in the Beverley District and surrounding region.

Radio West Feedback

This year the Shire has been involved with the "Around the Towns" segment on Radiowest. To ascertain who listens to the segment and also information that could be included, feedback is welcomed from community members.

Moving into 2013

I would like to thank Shire Staff and fellow Councillors for embracing their roles and working for the betterment of our community through 2012. The next 12 months will be busy again as progress is made implementing current plans, more planning is undertaken, and issues such as the Metropolitan Local Government reform unfold.

John Lane, Mark Stevens, Jenny Rayner and Graeme MacDonald all requalified their AAC.


Maree Thornton qualified in PAC.





CALL FOR LOCAL LEADERS TO DRIVE REGIONAL DEVELOPMENT

"I encourage interested community members who have a vision for the region to submit an Expression of Interest to represent the community and to be an active contributor. It is vital that there is diversity and strength represented in our RDA committee," Cynthia said.

Expressions of Interest are open now and you are encouraged to have yours submitted by Wednesday 16 January 2013. Appointments will be made by Minister for Regional Australia, Regional Development and Local Government, the Hon Simon Crean MP.

Matched giving program benefits festival

December 2012

Environmental advisor Gemma Ridgway grew up in the small Wheatbelt town of Beverley, leaving for university studies but returning home each harvest time.

Now based at BHP Billiton Worsley Alumina's Boddington Bauxite Mine, Gemma's volunteer work with the Beverley Harvest Festival was given a boost through the company's Matched Giving Program. BHP Billiton will match \$10 per volunteer hour and with Gemma volunteering 48 hours the festival will receive \$480 in addition to her volunteer time.

The volunteer - run festival was held last month on a fully functioning farm owned and operated by the National Heritage Trust.

Gemma put some of the knowledge she has acquired at Worsley to good use in developing a risk assessment and control plan for the festival.

"It is great to be able to continue to contribute to my home community while working for Worsley," Gemma said.

A big number of Worsley employees participate in the Matched Giving Program, which benefits a broad range of community groups.

As well as supporting volunteering, the program also matches dollar-for-dollar funds employees raise or donate to registered charities or community groups.

The 150th Anniversary of the Consecration of St. Pauls Anglican Church, Beverley.

A congregation of over 70 people filled the little St. Paul's Anglican Church, and overflowed into the graveyard, for a communion service held by Archbishop Roger Herft, on Saturday, November 10th 2012.

The service was to celebrate the 150th anniversary of its consecration by Bishop Hale in 1862. The church, 5 kilometres north of Beverley, was built in 1859 of hand-made bricks and with a shingle roof. Apart from local people, the crowd included some from neighbouring areas, Perth, Albany and as far away as Adelaide and Melbourne.

The Archbishop, and his wife, joined the congregation after the service for a luncheon held in the hall at St. Mary's, the Parish Church of Beverley.

The church and its graveyard, the sixth oldest church in the state, stand alone on a site where the original town of Beverley was planned. However, a few years later the township was moved to its present site. It remained the Parish Church until St. Mary's was built in Beverley in 1892. The scholarly and remarkable Rev. Frederick Lynch, rector of the nearby St. Peter's Church, Gilgering, served there for 29 years, until his death at the age of 73. With no longer a rector in Beverley, a service is only held when there is a fifth Sunday in the month.

St. Paul's stands on land near the Avon River brought from the Edwards family for ten shillings, in early 1859. The well-preserved church registers record the marriages, christenings and burials and include the names of Edwards, Broun, Barrett-Lennard, Lukin and Parker, all pioneering families of the area.

By about 1970, the church was in very poor condition, made worse by the Meckering earthquake of 1968. As the local parish had little money, there was talk of demolition. However, Mr Geoffrey Barrett-Lennard, (Peoples Warden), volunteered to supply all the materials, organized a team of descendants, and with the help of several local tradesmen, drains were dug to prevent rising damp, cracks were repaired and outside walls rendered.

St. Paul's was listed by the National Trust of Australia in 1973. In recent years grants from the Heritage Council of W.A. have enabled the stained glass windows to be restored and other repairs made. The little church is now in excellent condition, and recent work has resulted in a neat and tidy graveyard.

With a small, elderly congregation, and only a few services a year one wonders what the future of this historic church and its graveyard will be.

Please note - If you ever wish to see this historical church, it is located on the Top Beverley Road.



Annual Report for 2011/2012 of The Beverley Historical Society for delivery at the 35th AGM on Monday October 8th 2012

Membership: Current membership stands at 15 whilst meeting attendances usually range between 8 to 10 members.

The Late Joyce Oliver: It was with sadness that we lost one of our foundation members in the late Joyce Oliver who passed away on January 8th, 2012, just two months short of her 97th birthday. I understand that Joyce held the position of Treasurer for five years during the mid 1980s. She was a regular attendee and contributor at our monthly meetings right up until she left Beverley in 2010.

In memory of Joyce, the Society held a small morning tea at the Museum, attended by a group of her friends. Joyce was keen to 'rescue' the old Beverley Times printing press from the Beverley Showgrounds and as a result it now stands in the garden by the Museum, where we plan to have some cover erected over it.

Easter: Members were kept busy over Easter with the Museum open over the four days with a wide variety of clothing, dresses etc on display. Some members of the Beverley Quilters group added extra interest with a lovely display of quilting work. I understand that over a hundred visitors passed through over the four days.

Bus Tours: Between May 15th & August 26th we had five bus tours call at the Museum. These comprised of:- two buses from Elite Tours; two buses from Chauffeur Services; plus a small bus with men from Northam & Wundowie.

Museum Visitors: For the twelve months from October 2011 to 2012 the total visitors (including scheduled Sunday openings, many Saturday afternoons, occasional midweek tourists, the Year Twos from the Beverley School and the bus groups above) was about 450.

Research: Research is always ongoing and included an inquiry seeking information regarding the Beverley Scout movement (Troop 30) and some interesting information & items have been forthcoming.

Beverley Show: As 2012 is "The Year of the Farmer" the Society decided to concentrate our Show display on "The Farmer's Wife" and the role that women play and have played over the years in everyday farm life. I believe an interesting and eye-catching display was provided.

Visit by Heritage Consultant, Cathy Day: Cathy Day, along with her assistant, Shaun, spent time with us at the Museum from Monday to Wednesday September 3rd to 5th 2012. Cathy catalogued and photographed many of our items considered to have great significance, our members providing details of each item's history where possible. It is envisaged that the information Cathy has accumulated, will be provided to us at a later date and should prove to be very valuable. Cathy did this work free-of-charge, as it was part of her studies on small museums throughout the State. The Society appreciates Cathy and Shaun's time and I would like to add my personal thanks to those members who made themselves available over the three days.

Visit by Members from State Heritage Office and Heritage Council: On Tuesday September 4th we had a brief visit from some members of the State Heritage Office and the Heritage Council, I think seven in all. They were accompanied by the Beverley Shire President and a few local Shire Councillors. The touring party had a look through the Museum and we were given a short address by one of the visitors.

Improved Foot path Access to Museum:

Our thanks to the Shire for the provision of a concrete path off Morrison St to the building. This is a great improvement when receiving tour buses particularly under wet conditions.



Proposed Replacement of Post & Rail Fence: Due to aging and weathering we have decided to replace the Post & Rail fence. However obtaining suitable timber is proving a little difficult at the moment.

Garden Plaque: To mark the Garden & Tree Society's 30th Anniversary the Beverley Historical Society is organising a plaque to be attached to a stone and placed in the garden adjacent to the Museum. To highlight the occasion the Garden & Tree Society will be having morning tea in the Garden on Saturday November 24th between 10am & 2pm.

Graffiti: Unfortunately we were recently the victim of a small amount of graffiti on some of the verandah posts and it's to be hoped this is only a one off occurrence. Thanks to the Shire for cleaning it off.

Computer: Thanks to Lotterywest the Society now has a laptop & printer /scanner.

Thanks: In conclusion my sincere thanks to all fellow office bearers and in particular Morag for her work as Secretary, often opening the Museum on a Saturday afternoon & for contributing informative notes in the Beverley Blarney each month, and thank you to Erica for your diligent work as Treasurer.

Thank you also to all of those members who have given up time to attend meetings, go on roster, worked on research & generally contributed in any way to the Society's wellbeing, not forgetting Delys & Erica's work in the garden.

HISTORY OF THE BEVERLEY GARDEN & TREE SOCIETY

[As presented at 30th Anniversary of the
Beverley Garden & Tree Society]

The **inaugural meeting** of the society was held at the CWA Rooms in Vincent Street, Beverley, on November 22, 1982 at 8 o'clock in the evening. There were 29 people present with a ratio of 26 females to 3 males. This pretty much represents the gender ratio we have at meetings 30 years later. There were 13 apologies. After some discussion the name of Beverley Garden and Tree Society was decided.

A **Steering Committee** to determine aims, constitution and organisation of the Society's affairs for six months was elected: Blair Doncon as Chairperson, Jenny Jones as Secretary and Jan McMullan as Treasurer with a committee of Norma Adams, Dorothy Barrett-Lennard, Margaret Blight, Ruth Mann, Judy Richards and Mary Shaw.

Meetings were to be held on the fourth Monday of each month except December and January.

Subscriptions were to be \$5.00 per annum. Remarkably the annual subscription has not changed in the 30 years! Jenny Jones was given a vote of thanks for initiating the meeting.

The **Constitution** was presented and confirmed by members at the June 27 1983 meeting.

The **Aims** of the Beverley Garden & Tree Society were and are:

1. To improve knowledge of different plant families & their culture;
2. To encourage the establishment & maintenance of home gardens;
3. To encourage use of trees in the rural landscape;
4. To encourage civic beauty & roadside plantings & preservation;
5. To promote friendship & share knowledge

Activities in those first years included:

Display Table & Bring & Buy at each meeting

Guest speakers re Main Road Department policy, herbs, fruit trees, flower arrangements, Planting by the Moon Propagation by cutting & seeds, of native & other plants.

Road verge planting; local garden walks; bush walks

Day trips; an Autumn Flower Show

At the **first AGM** President Blair Doncon reported:

If asked to describe our formative year, I would use the word 'interesting'. I use such a neutral adjective because I believe the year had its share of 'highs' and 'lows', of rewards and disappointments. For example the planned bus trip to Garden Week was cancelled due to lack of interest. Some guest speakers faced poor attendances which was a pity, and I personally am very disappointed about the Main Road Department's regulations covering what can be grown on

road verges. In fact it horrified me to hear their definition of a tree as being a "fixed, unmoveable object".

On the bright side however, good attendances of from twenty to forty people were treated to some extremely interesting days. These included a floral art demonstration, a talk on how to grow native trees from seeds, a pruning demonstration at Avondale, and a very well attended and even more efficiently executed 'tree plant' on Pattons road. I say efficient because by the time your far-from -efficient or punctual President arrived, it was all over; well done!

That leads me to apologise for my non-attendance at many meetings. I find it very difficult to make day-time meetings because of farming commitments.

Thanks must go to Jenny Jones whose knowledge, ability, patience and enthusiasm seem boundless. Without her drive the group would simply not have been formed. On behalf of everyone, Jenny, thank you!

Thanks must also go to the committee members, many of whom put in a lot of work. Thanks are also due to the Beverley Shire for their cooperation throughout the year.

In conclusion I ask all members to contribute towards making our Society a vital organisation in 1984; by attending meetings and letting office bearers know what interests you, and thereby enabling them to organise interesting meetings Good luck for eighty four!

The Financial Statement showed a balance of \$151.93.

A **Local Garden Competition** was first organised in 1986 to be judged in late September (actually turned out to be mid-October). Judges came from Perth. There was \$80 prize money divided into four categories:

Town garden won by Mrs Joy Smith;
Farm garden won by Mrs Moia Sims;
Colour patch won by Ron & Norma Adams; and

Outdoor living won by Mrs Mary Thomas. Meetings continued at the CWA until February 1987 and the first meeting in the Dead Finish was in March 1987. Sometime in the early 1990s the meetings were moved to afternoons. I will finish with a brief history of the Dead Finish Garden.



Dead Finish Garden

The **first official mention** of involvement in this Garden here was made by Ruth Mann at the July 1983 meeting who reported that the Society had

been asked to participate with the Management of the Dead Finish in landscaping the immediate area near the building and round the Tourist Information Bay. Members agreed that this could be the community project for the next year, 1984.

Discussions & planning continued through 1984 and in June 1985, it was reported that **garden plans** had been drawn up by Jenny Jones and looked very promising. The Shire

was starting to proceed with some work and it seemed that the Garden Society would be able to begin work on the gardens in the near future. All the area was to be sprayed with Round Up in July.

In November 1985 it was reported that all the landscaping at the Dead Finish had been completed, the couch grass sprayed several times and all was in readiness to plant the trees and shrubs in May or June the next year when the season broke.

May & June 1986 meetings were **busy bees** at the Dead Finish. Approximately 12 members helped to plant trees, shrubs & ornamentals. It was reported in the minutes: *"It was hard work digging and planting. A task well done. With soaking winter rains which followed soon after the planting the plants should grow very well and enhance the drive through our town. Thanks to Jenny Jones who organised the trees to plant and had all the gardens planned out with stones placed around."*

The garden has continued to grow and develop over the years with the addition of reticulation, historic fences, a birdbath, scarecrows, seats, a sundial, an arch, etc.

This Garden is **much admired** by visitors to the museum & the town and is a lasting testament to the volunteers from the Beverley Garden & Tree Society who have put so much hard work into this genuine community garden. They all deserve our acclamation.



CONCLUSION

In conclusion, the Beverley Garden & Tree Society has achieved its original aims and, in doing so, made a significant contribution to the Beverley Community through public gardening, through garden education and most importantly through providing locals – especially those new to Beverley – with opportunities for social get-togethers, a chance to get out of the house & and just have a chat about gardens or anything else that interests us. Here's to another 30 plus years.





Hello All,

UP CLOSE & PERSONAL

A police officers job is a very unique one. It was this uniqueness coupled with the diversity that first appealed to me when considering becoming a police officer.

The greatest satisfaction I get is from helping others; you as an individual and in turn the wider community. Taking the time to listen to each and every person I come into contact with and doing my utmost so that you feel you have been heard and understood and leave feeling the encounter was a positive and worthwhile experience. Policing in a country town is far more up close and personal and thereby rewarding.

Without a doubt the hardest part of my job is notifying a person or family of the death of a loved one. I wish to convey the following scenario with the intention of saving a life:-

It's 2.00 am, I'm off duty at home and asleep in bed. The mobile phone that is permanently by my side rings, waking me and the rest of our household. It's bad news, there's been a crash; SJA are in attendance at a single car roll over, the driver is trapped and request police assistance. The adrenalin starts to pump and the mind goes into overdrive.

While racing to get into uniform and driving into the station, a million thoughts run through your head. You meet your work colleague at the station and automatic pilot kicks in while you grab all your gear and jump in the patrol car.

Enroute to the scene we plan for the worst and hope for the best. We receive another phone call with an update; the driver of the crashed vehicle is not doing well and will be airlifted from the scene.

On arriving, FESA are trying to extract the trapped driver from the carnage while SJA officers are reassuring him/her, providing the necessary medical treatment, all be it limited by the restricted access.

We speak to one of the SJA officers who give us their opinion of possible injuries. We automatically begin to survey the scene, leaving the experts to treat the injured driver whose well being is our main concern.

Safety of everyone involved is paramount. We need to ensure that those working on the road do not become another victim; as you can imagine everyone's attention at this point, is on the person trapped in the car.

Finally the driver is cut free. SJA officers stabilise the unconscious patient, load the victim into the rescue helicopter before it takes off for Perth.

A crash scene can tell a story. We do our best to gather what evidence we can to start to try and piece this puzzle together. Firstly we need to identify the driver, track down and notify relatives. As is often the case in a small country town, the attending officers know the patient, someone who lives in our town, a local.

A few minutes later our phone rings again with another update, the patient has died on the way to the hospital

You are filled with an overwhelming sense of sadness and dread. Sadness at the loss of a life and the dread of having to face a complete stranger, look them in the eye and tell them what no one every wants to hear.

The younger the person, the harder it is to deliver this news. Without even noticing, the minutes have turned into hours. You begin to prepare yourself to deliver the news. The drive seems to take forever; there is no conversation between us, just deafening silence in the car as we make our way to speak with the family.

Your feet feel like lead as you make your way to the front door, your heart races as you knock, a light is turned on inside and a voice calls out “Who is it?” Of course there is a feeling of panic when that person hears it is police and opens the door; it can’t be good news when police arrive at that time of the day. And so I say those words that every parent never wants to hear; “I’m so sorry to have to tell you your son/daughter/wife/daughter died in a car crash tonight.....”

Every person reacts differently. It NEVER gets any easier having to bear this news and as a parent I can relate to the sense of loss. We spend time with every family and try and have answers to the flood of questions but often we cannot answer the most important one WHY?

After filling out the reams of paper back at the office and a dozen phone calls later, it is now daylight as you head home to try and sleep but it is elusive. Your thoughts are with the family that have just suffered one of the most devastating blows, their lives will never be the same again.

Our job is far from over and so begins the quest to try and get an answer to that all-important question. Sometimes we just cannot work out WHY and the question will never be answered, leaving the family to ponder on the endless possibilities. But more often than not, we do know why, and it saddens the family even more when they find out the accident was totally preventable. Their sense of loss is compounded each and every Christmas that follows, it will never ever be the same again.

Plan, prepare and if necessary pause. PLAN your route and allow plenty of time to get there. PREPARE yourself, be well rested to concentrate on the task at hand and ensure your vehicle is well maintained. If you have young children keep plenty of toys and games within their reach so you are not distracted. PAUSE - if you start to yawn or feel even a little tired STOP and have a break. Take time out to make sure you and your family arrive safely at your destination and everyone has another Christmas they will never forget - for all the right reasons.

There is a reason behind everything we do – infringements for speeding and no seat belts, random breath tests etc. So please remember, the next time you are stopped by police, we have you and your safety in mind ALWAYS.



A dedicated group of Natural Resource Management Officers (NRMOs) from Shires across the Wheatbelt have been recognized for their hard work in delivering a 4 year Caring For Our Country funded Project, winning the 'Government Leading by Example' Award at the WA Environment Awards held recently.

The Project, *Perennial Farming Systems Targeting Wind Erosion Within the North Eastern and Southern Wheatbelt Regions of WA*, was also recognized as a finalist in two other categories, 'Environmental Sustainability' and 'Bush, Land and Waterways'.

The seventeen shires collaborated through the agreement of three separate Regional Organisation of Councils (ROC); North Eastern Wheatbelt Regional Organisation of Councils (NEWROC), Wheatbelt East Regional Organisation of Councils (WEROC) and South East Avon Voluntary Regional Organisation of Councils (SEAVROC).

The project targets Wheatbelt farmers to incorporate perennial systems into their agricultural enterprises to address wind erosion and environmental degradation issues and has provided 1,243,792 seedlings and 95 ha of perennial pasture seed to re-vegetate a total area of 1,175ha of land.

Project Manager Lisa Clark said "The Project is a great example of how Natural Resource Management projects can be delivered across a large region encompassing a land area of over 3 million hectares".

"Providing an NRM service to farmers is becoming essential in our changing climate where the ongoing adoption of sustainable agricultural practices is vital to ensure the future of our farms" she said.

Although the project is in its final year, the group have planned to continue to implement regional scale NRM Projects including a 6 year revegetation, restoration and pest control project across the Shires commencing next year, funded by the Federal Government's Biodiversity Fund.







Normally Affidavits and other Court and Legal documents are prepared by Law firms.

ALCOHOL AND DROWNING

Alcohol and swimming - what is the problem?

Alcohol contributes to:

- At least 20% of all adult drowning deaths in Australia.
- Over 40% of drowning deaths of 15-29 years olds.

How is alcohol a problem?

Even a small amount of alcohol can have a number of effects which increase the risk of drowning:

- **Impaired judgement and risk taking** can lead to bad decision making and an inability to identify and manage a difficult situation.
- **Impaired coordination and reaction time** stops you responding quickly to emergencies.
- **Disturbances of the inner ear** affects your ability to tell “up” from “down” underwater.
- **Restricted lungs and blood vessels** can restrict your ability to swim and shout for help if in trouble.
- **Reduced effectiveness of CPR** (resuscitation methods) reduces the chances of surviving near-drowning.
- **Hypothermia sets in faster** through increased loss of body heat.

Alcohol and water safety checklist

Remember alcohol and water activities don't mix well, but if you're planning to drink while enjoying water activities:

- Eat food before drinking alcohol.
- Drink plenty of water and non-alcoholic drinks between alcoholic drinks, especially in summer.
- Avoid swimming after drinking alcohol.
- Participate in water activities before drinking alcohol and not afterwards.
- Avoid drinking if supervising children near water.
- Avoid water activity alone or at night.
- Avoid swimming in conditions or environments that are unfamiliar.
- Have someone around who isn't drinking.
- Avoid diving or jumping from objects not intended as diving platforms at dams, creeks, and rivers.
