On Friday 03 May the Town Hall came alive with 29 kids buzzing about doing hip hop, enjoying a sausage sizzle or two but most importantly coming up with their own ideas and suggestions for initiatives they would like to see in future years!

As part of the National Youth Week, the Shire of Beverley hosted the event to make sure the hopes and visions of the younger generation are considered and planned for. Shire President Cr Dee Ridgway, Cr Peter Gogol, Cr Belinda Foster and Cr David White were all on hand not just to cook an awesome BBQ but to hear the kid's ideas first hand.

To get the creative ideas flowing, the day was facilitated by Liz Brennan from RDA Wheatbelt who hosted some big idea brainstorming and "leap into action" sessions.

These sessions, one in the morning and the other in the afternoon allowed the kids to freely voice their own opinions and democratically pick their favourite ideas. The middle of the day was hosted by Urban Youth Crew Effects who put on a hip hop exhibition and then a workshop to teach the kids a few moves. A big thank you to RDA Wheatbelt Youth Support Officer, Lyn Kay for organising Urban Youth Crew and helping make the event successful.

The three most sought after projects (out of the more than 50 big ideas) included a skate park, go kart tracks and hip hop workshops. However there were plenty of other good suggestions such as movie nights, a community garden, youth graffiti walls and lots, lots more! President Report June 2013

Wheatbelt Aged Care Planning

Consultation and planning is underway for an overall Wheatbelt Integrated Regional Aged Care Plan. Thankyou to those who participated in the Beverley workshops in May of which the consultant was particularly taken by the participation and information gleaned from the segment held at the Beverley Men's Shed.

The findings continue to highlight deficiencies across the Wheatbelt regarding the gap in Federal funding that communities could be receiving for aged care support compared to what is actually being received, which reinforces the outcome of last years Beverley Aged Care Plan. The Beverley plan has been provided to the consultant as the Shires contribution toward the Wheatbelt project.

It is clear that the majority of people prefer to remain in their community as they age, receiving community care either in their own home or downsizing to something smaller that will still allow them to live independently.

The regional aged care planning process aims to look at all facets of aged care including "age friendly" communities, community and residential care, and aged persons housing.

Dawson St Independent Living Units

In terms of a well built, low care, lock and leave lifestyle home, which is conveniently located to shops and community facilities, allowing the residents to comfortably and easily remain in their own home and age in place for as long as they wish, it is extremely disappointing that these exceptional villas have not yet been leased.

Until resolved it will be difficult to progress any further housing projects in our community. Council has a review underway.

Youth Forum

In May the Shire of Beverley teamed up with RDA Wheatbelt to hold the Beverley Youth Forum. This was a successful day where ideas were gained directly from youth in our community in a fun way which can now be used by Council as a basis for future activities, budgeting and planning to best utilise available resources. I would particularly like to recognise the efforts of Ali Lewis toward planning and preparation for this event and a very big thankyou to the younger members of our community for vour participation.

Roadworks

Road safety works through the Black Spot funding initiative have been completed by the shire boys at the junction of Valentines Rd and York Williams Rd. Gravel sheeting on the York Williams Rd north of Westdale Rd is progressing well. The Shire is assisted with funding for this through Roads to Recovery.

<u>Avondale</u>

Various partnerships and funding sources continue to be investigated for Avondale by both the Shire and the National Trust in an endeavour to achieve a sustainable outcome for the property and retain public access. The Shire has engaged a consultant to assist develop a business plan in support of an application to the 13/14 Regional Country Local Government Fund to upgrade visitor amenities and accessibility at Avondale with the guidelines yet to be released.

It was very pleasing to see such a good rollup for the first of the monthly get togethers by the machinery museum volunteers, especially as seeding was underway. As with many facets of Avondale the volunteers play an extremely important role and the Shire, which became custodian of the collection the transfer of Avondale's in management to the National Trust, recognises that it would be difficult to further develop the museum without this ongoing support. The CEO and I have recently visited the WA Tractor Museum at Whiteman Park.

Thankyou to Bruce Mann who is the outgoing President of the Avondale Farm Project Association. Bruce has committed a significant amount of and energy toward the time progress of Avondale. Congratulations incoming to President Sue Martin. Thankyou and farewell to Harold Anderson for his involvement at Avondale and the many other community groups he and Margaret have contributed to during their time living in Beverley.

<u>Vandalism</u>

Quite often I hear comments from visitors to our town regarding how lovely they think Beverley is and how friendly the people are. I also hear of people who chose to live here because of it, wanting to be part of our community. For the majority of us, the vandalism that occurred over several weekends around Easter time, particularly in the main street precinct, was disappointing.

Repairing and cleaning up is costly and disheartening for the affected parties, and in the case of the Shire, it means a total waste of resource that could be better allocated elsewhere for more positive community benefit. If anyone has information regarding any acts of vandalism in or around Beverley please let the Shire or Local Police know.

The plan, which is now in its final draft, targets key areas of Learning, Connectivity, Leadership, Building Community and Services on-line, and Building Digital Innovation.



BEVERLEY COMMUNITY PARALEGAL INFORMATION SERVICES

The following information courtesy of ABC Radio National – recently the Salvation Army carried out a survey amongst recipients and the results indicate that 98% have no savings, 50% have children, 50% have insufficient food to feed their children and 50% need help to pay their bills. The main problem is the lack of housing and high rental costs.

Currently the minimum wage is \$630.00 per week and the ACTU is seeking a wage increase of \$30.00 per week for the "working poor" which would bring the minimum wage up to \$660.00 per week.

457 Visas for skilled overseas workers are conditional on several factors including type of job, the location of the job and for how long (as per TV Reports). Fees vary from \$440.00 to \$880.00. All other visa fees are expected to double from 1 July 2013. For further information phone Department of Immigration before you think of sponsoring anyone.


The following matters have been handled this month – financial hardship, urgent rental accommodation, Centrelink Referrals and support to non-profit organisations. Plight of our needy concerns were lodged to both Prime Minister Gillard and the Leader of the Opposition, Mr Tony Abbott.

ID documents are witnessed on a daily basis

Concerns that residents raised were Restraining Orders, property and vehicle damage, Neighbourhood disputes, abusive/threatening behaviour – I advised them to contact the Police. Where someone is fearful of being physically assaulted or the safety of their children please report the matter to the police as soon as possible and keep a record of the time, place and threats made and whether a VRO is warranted. Damage to vehicle/ property s a civil matter. VRO's are also dealt with in a Criminal Court.

Neighbourhood disputes – if a fall out leads to a dispute beware of malicious gossip it can end up in a Civil Court. If defamation/slander is proven, the Court can award hefty damages based on the defendant's status/reputation in the community. My personal experience led me to lodge a complaint against a person, who is hardly known, whose abusive and threatening behaviour had to be stopped. At this point in time, I am waiting for legal advice and proof as to who said what and will thereafter proceed with legal action if warranted.

Finally, on a happier note – Many thanks to the Shire President, Councillors, CEO and DCEO for their invitation to join them for lunch with Judy Moylan MP and Mr Christian Porter, former State Attorney General, an enjoyable time was had by all. Mal G Roberts

- 2. To attend a three day workshop at Perth and Albany relating to Certificate in Good Governance for Indigenous Corporations.

Unfortunately Mal Roberts and Mitch Henry were unable to attend due to different dates and time factors and other community commitments.

Radio National ABC reported on 21 May 2013 that the suicide rate amongst Indigenous youth (some as young as 12 years old) is four times greater that their non-indigenous counterparts. Elder Eggington and other Indigenous leaders discussed their joint concerns on 21 May with Premier Colin Barnett. This is a very disturbing and sad state of affairs, where young people choose this horrendous path. The sad loss has tragic consequences for all involved family, friends, teachers, etc. and remains with them for all time. It can be said that in many cases the mates who are left behind are almost half non-indigenous.

For years voices from all quarters are lobbying both State and Commonwealth governments to help with this problem. We hope this recent survey will be a wake-up call to all concerned Australians.

EYES REFET

Hello All,

As the months seem to fly past, so does it seem does the vehicles. We have been getting reports lately of people driving around in their vehicles around town like idiots. It only takes a split second for a pedestrian to walk out on to the road or a car to pull out from a side street and **BANG** you have just killed someone. That's how easy it could happen. While I paint a gloomy picture and that is a worst case scenario, I am trying to highlight the fact that something's are beyond your control. But if you stick to the speed limit and don't drive recklessly i.e. burnouts, you greatly reduce the risk of crashes occurring and increase yours and other people's chances of getting home safely.

It is also that time of year when there is more agricultural equipment being towed on the roads. In the past I have asked the general public to be careful when driving along the roads when you're near oversized vehicles. I still like that to occur, however I am asking the farmers that are operating and managing the oversized vehicles on the road to be also careful when transporting equipment from one farm to another. A couple of Sunday's ago people towing some equipment through the main highway of Beverley have knocked down a power line, causing the occupant of the house to lose power for several hours until Western Power could arrive. Whilst this is not a regular occurrence it just shows that if you're not prepared these things can happen.

I ask you all to take care on the road when moving the agricultural equipment along the road and make sure that you have all the correct signage and pilot vehicles and also that if you are not permitted to, you are not to move equipment after sunset.

Whilst on safety on the roads I have noticed some horse riders along the road at night not wearing any safety equipment i.e. reflective vest etc. For the safety of you and other road users I think it would be a good practice if you did utilise some type of reflective equipment of lighting when riding horses on the main road at night.







Station Visits

The Narrogin Probus Club visited the Station on Monday 20th May. There were around 30 members - some who had worked on the railways reminisced of times spent at the Beverley Station in its hay day, others recounted travelling by train Narrogin to Perth return, and all were very complimentary of the Gallery and Platform Theatre with the promise to return and see a show when the season recommences.

Sir Claude Hotchin Collections

On Thursday 9th May I had the pleasure of helping officiate the opening of an exhibition at the NEXIS Gallery in Narrogin. Local artists of the Dryandra country area also exhibited their works in the 'Gathering Vision' exhibition alongside the Town of Narrogin collection and 38 Claude Hotchin bequests which had been hidden from public view whilst the town hall was being restored. As we in Beverley have only 14 works bequeathed from Sir Claude Hotchin we are able to keep ours on permanent display. It was indeed timely that only last month a delightful little watercolour painted by Lady Hotchin was passed on to the Gallery. The miniature was given to our donor Shirley by Stan Thompson, Sir Claude's secretary and longtime friend. We have loaned it to the Narrogin gallery for the duration of their exhibition.

More History

Ever on the lookout for stories about the Station from days gone by, Lance and Merilyn Marchesi have been able to extract some fascinating words from an aunt, Billie Farnell, whose parents Jack and Ethel Wilkinson ran the tea rooms at the Station from 1939 to 1947. Here is her description of the tea rooms:

"The café area and dining room were huge and all in all there were about 25 rooms in the place, counting under the stairs and the bathroom. The stairs and the bar were kept polished to a perfect shine as they were beautiful jarrah - I wonder where they went! May Hamersley used to get down on her hands and knees and polish the lino in the café and dining room every week, she didn't have a weight problem. They had number nine wood stove and the scones, pasties and pies were all cooked by Mum. The baked dinner for the trains were also cooked and they had starched white tablecloths which Mum ironed with a petrol iron each Tuesday - God help us if we played up on that day! They didn't take the refreshment rooms on after the war because of the price control, they could only charge 2/6d for a three course meal and that had been set all through the war. We had a cook who lived in the little cottage between the railway station and the tea rooms, I think he must have been of German descent and maybe was a prisoner of war during the war, his name was Dolf.

It was DC power so there were no mod cons like we have now, and it was a chip heater and wood stove. There were no electric jugs or toasters either. I would come home from school and eat the butter out of the frig. We had one of those. We had what was called 'icy balls' to cool the beer. There was a cellar under the bar and the kegs were kept down there as well as the wine. I think Dad used to bottle the wine from a barrel and then they would have a top put on with a seal around them. The cellar had that smell of spilt beer from when the kegs were opened, and was very dampish, but cool. There was a set time the bar had to be opened after the nine o'clock train, and because the bars closed at 6pm at the pubs the locals used to gather there for a late drink, however they overstepped the mark and hadn't closed on time and Mum got real mad and got the huge fire hose and hosed them all out of the bar, the men were terribly offended and vowed never to come back, but they did! I think there was a drink problem even then".

Amazing to think that all these years later on the same spot where the tea rooms stood is now the Platform Theatre where people gather to meet and mingle.





GENERAL HAPPENINGS AROUND THE FARM

- There are several tour groups booked for visits to Avondale over the next few months



Exotic pest birds sighted in Beverley.

The Department of Agriculture and Food Western Australia recently received a call about the possibility of some Invasive / Exotic birds at large in and around the Beverley town environment. In particular a report of an 'Alexandrine parrot' and this was confirmed by a photograph which was taken by a local out around the town rubbish tip/rifle range/motor x track.

It has also been reported that there may be a small flock of 'Rainbow lorikeets' at large. These are also a significant pest if left in the wild.

Both species are not native to WA and have shown they have the potential to establish readily WA.

It is important, not only for agricultural, but also environment reasons, that they are removed from the environment before they become established.

These incursions are taken seriously by the Department and it is keen to follow-up on reports from the public as quickly as possible. The Department's management focus is to stop / reduce social impact, prevent establishment in the Western Australian environment and protect the associated Agricultural Industries that have strong interest in keeping these introduced species from their produce.


I was surprised to learn recently that we have some exotic parrots in Beverley. One is an Alexandrine Parrot (please refer to adjacent article for photo). These parrots are not native and could be a threat to our bush reserves. Parrots like the Rainbow Lorikeet which has also been seen around Beverley in a small flock of about 8 birds. These birds are very aggressive to other parrots and chase them away from nesting hollows so Parrots like the native Smoker Parrot are forced out of their nesting places and end up not being able to breed which could lead to local extinctions of these are other bird species. We already have a serious problem with other feral species like feral cats, foxes and rabbits and we don't seem to be able to get on top of them and we all know the problems they cause to our native flora and fauna. We have a chance to win against these parrots if we act now before the numbers get to high. If you see any unusual parrots around please contact Paul Manera from the Department of Agriculture and Food in Northam I guarantee he will treat the birds humanely and respectfully and this will be a great help to our native species in our reserves.

Still on the subject of feral species I went to a great workshop on weeds. The weeds they were talking about were Bridal Creeper, Tamarisk and Boxthorn. It was great to learn what other places are doing to try and eradicate these terrible and invasive weeds. This workshop was organised by Natural Resource Management and I fully recommend it to any one if you get the chance. The presentations were fun and informative and there were about 50 people there. Weeds are normally not very exciting but the presentations most certainly inspired us to do more to get rid of these weeds. Our Bushlands can't stay healthy if we don't eradicate these terrible weeds of national significance especially bridal creeper.

About HACC

The HACC Service is part of the Beverley Health Service Multi Purpose Service (MPS), in which the Commonwealth funding for residential aged care, HACC and State health care funding have been combined with the aim of providing flexible health services to meet the health needs of the local community.

Who can access to Services

The HACC target population comprises of persons living in the community who, in the absence of basic maintenance and support services, are at risk of premature or inappropriate long-term residential care, including:

- (i) older and frail persons, with moderate, severe or profound disabilities;
- (ii) younger persons with moderate, severe or profound disabilities; and
- (iii) their carers.

Referrals for HACC Services can be made by anyone in the community on behalf of a potential client or by the client.

Cardiovascular Health & Wellbeing



Following on the back of Heart week (May 5-11th) we thought it was time to have a more in-depth look at cardiovascular health and the effect it has on our life.

Cardiovascular diseases (CVD) are the category of diseases that involve the heart or blood vessels and refers to any disease that affects the cardiovascular system, the most common being heart attack and stroke. It's our biggest killer! Out of the 140,000 deaths a year in Australia CVD are responsible for around some 46,000. CVD are responsible for the highest rates of hospitalisations and deaths in regional and remote Australia. Yet it's largely preventable.

Factors that contribute to CVD include family history (which we can't change) but some of the others we can change by making healthy lifestyle choices such as:

maintaining a healthy diet; doing regular exercise; reducing our alcohol intake (take a couple of days off a week); maintaining our body weight; being smoke free; reducing our salt intake; and looking after our psychological wellbeing.

Important risk factors are:

blood pressure cholesterol and not being aware of these basic benchmarks So our message is that it's vital to have regular check-ups.

For blokes we especially say, know your blood pressure. We have put over 2,000 blokes a year through our health and wellbeing awareness program "Fast Track Pit Stop" and it is common for blokes, young and old, not to know their blood pressure or what it means.

There is no firm rule that defines high blood pressure but generally speaking the lower the blood pressure the better. As a rough guide normal to high blood pressure is between 120/80 and 140/90mmHg. What do these numbers mean? Well here is a layman's Interpretation for you:

120/80 - 120 when the heart is pumping the blood (systolic blood pressure);

120/80 - 80 when the heart is resting between pumps (diastolic blood pressure);

Some of the warning signs for a heart attack may include pain, heaviness or tightness in one or more areas of the upper body combined with other symptoms which may include shortness of breath, dizziness or a cold sweat. People may experience a single symptom, a combination of symptoms or have the symptoms masked by other things going on in their life.

The stroke warning signs will mostly show some weakness of the face, arm or leg or a change in speech. If you think someone may have experienced a stroke an easy reminder on what to check is commonly referred to as FAST:-

Face; Arm; Speech; and Time

A heart attack occurs when a blood clot completely blocks the flow of blood, seriously reducing the flow of blood to the heart muscle, whilst seventy five per cent of strokes are due to a blocked blood vessel stopping the supply of blood to part of the brain.

With all CVD the single most important thing for both survival and recovery is to get treatment within an hour. This quite often comes from bystanders (we are all primary carers) and someone who can perform CPR and/or has access to a defibrillator.

In WA St Johns Ambulance has an extensive network of more than 420 automated external defibrillators (AEDs) placed in strategic locations within communities across the State (locations are given with any Triple Zero (000) enquiry) and a phone call for an ambulance.

Cardiovascular Health and Wellbeing is serious stuff. We talk a lot about other health issues including physical issues for blokes (commonly prostate); mental health issues (situational distress) and social/spiritual issues (bloke's identity). However it's important to remember that the CVD category of diseases takes the most lives' and causes the most hospitalisations of any. Blokes - book in to see your GP for a **service** visit, not just when you are suffering. Cheers



Beverley Historical Society Dale Discovery Field Trip Thursday 2 May 2013

Leaving from the Dead Finish we met others at the Dale Hall. Across the road at 'Hillside',



is the dry-stone barn built by John Withnell in the middle of the 19th century. Still in use after



150+ years, the beautiful rock walls are a tribute to the skill of a man whose father was also a stonemason.

Up Luptons Rd to an old school building in a backyard. Once the



school on Westdale Rd west of Butcher's Rd corner, this was transported just after the war & used as a house, until the family home was completed. Pupil's names written in pencil on the

wall are still visible. Further along on the left of

Luptons Rd we come to the site of the Tin Hall, also called the Dale River Hall. This community



hall served as both a school and a social meeting place. It was lined with wood panelling to shoulder height.



At 'Oakland' we go through the farm gate, across the paddocks and up the slope to a hilltop position where the remains of a charcoal pit can be clearly seen.



Used for the production of charcoal during the war years, 240,000 bags of charcoal were delivered to Perth for use in cars fitted with gas producers.



On the way we stopped briefly at two school sites on Westdale

Rd then went up the Brookton Hwy to the first West Dale School east of Jones Rd.

Stopping briefly at the old shop & garage near the Westdale Bin we picked up photos of the business before it closed.

We had lunch at our final stop at the last Westdale Primary School near the Dale Bin now a private home.



The school building from near Jones Rd was moved to this site at one time to act as living quarters for the Westdale teacher.



Porcelain dolls - Georgiana Tita

People had dolls with faces made of porcelain. Porcelain is used to make other things like plates. If dropped, the faces will easily break. Now the dolls' heads will not break.

Oil lamp - Frederick Ochtman

My object is an oil lamp. Lamps were the only lights they had in the house. They were made from metal and had glass around the wick. Today we have electricity.

Old Type writer - Alfee Stevens

Type writers were made in 1902. They had to press hard and if they made a mistake they would have to scrunch it up. It is made out of metal.

Wash board - Sophie Kilpatrick

A wash board was a tool for the clothes. They scrub the clothes on the metal. It is made of metal and wood.
