President Report – May 2016

ActiveSmart – Are you going to participate?

Beverley residents (and those of 11 other Wheatbelt Local Government areas) will be invited to become "ActiveSmart" by participating in a programme overseen by the Department of Sport and Recreation which encourages us to increase activity levels, change long term habits (that may not be so healthy!) and connect with others in our community. BBP Age Friendly Housing Business Case and Grant Application

A business case for the Beverley, Brookton, Pingelly (BBP) Aged Housing Project is nearing completion and will form the basis for a combined grant application being co-ordinated by the Wheatbelt Development Commission. The outcome for Beverley, if the application is successful, would be installation of 6 pre-fabricated units during 2018 and another 6 toward the end of 2019.

CBH – Network Strategy

CBH recently announced its Network Strategy which identifies over 90% of the annual crop is received at 100 CBH sites, with another 102 sites receiving the balance. It proposes that future maintenance and capital investment will be focused on the core 100 sites and that minimal expenditure will occur on the remaining sites until they reach the end of their useful life. The Beverley CBH site is identified as one of 28 which have opened once or less in the last five years.

CBH's Network Strategy proposal to ensure the "*network remains cost effective, efficient and competitive, meeting grower and customer needs*" may not be palatable to all, however growers I have spoken to are receptive in the face of competition and potentially increasing handling and freight charges. The Network Strategy also affects Local Government as inevitably there will be more traffic on roads for which they are responsible.

Response to an enquiry regarding possible future use of the Beverley site by the Shire has been favourable, however is pending an identified use not detrimental to the CBH Group. With this in mind Council proposes to investigate the possibility of relocating the works depot from the town centre into the industrial precinct.

County Peak

A grant application submitted by Greening Australia in 2015 to develop a rehabilitation plan for County Peak was unfortunately not successful. A rehabilitation plan and its subsequent implementation would be a prelude to establishment of a Pioneer Trail at County Peak as proposed in the Shire of Beverley Trails Masterplan. Although this project is not included in Councils short term planning, if there is interest from within the community to take on the rehabilitation project please let me know.

Acting Shire President

In a rare occurrence Council was required to elect a Councillor to undertake the duties of Shire President for a period in the second half of March due to an overlap in the respective holiday arrangements of the Shire President and Deputy Shire President. Councillor Lew Shaw capably undertook this role, which included chairing the March Monthly Council meeting.

ANZAC Day - Lest we Forget

Thank you to the Beverley RSL for organising the dawn and mid-morning ANZAC day services in Beverley at which a large number of local residents and visitors were in attendance. A wreath was laid by the Shire President and Deputy Shire President on behalf of the Citizens of Beverley (thankyou flower fairies - Delys and Pat!). LOCAL GOVERNMENT PENSIONER RATES CONCESSION FOR 2016- 2017

As part of the 2015/16 State Budget, the state government announced that from the rating year commencing 1 July 2016, the 50% concession allowed to eligible pensioners on local government rates would be restricted to a capped amount. Western Australia was the only State not to provide a dollar cap on Local Government Rates.

The pensioner rates capped amounts will be set each year, consistent with the manner in which senior's rates caps are set. The gazettal of the cap amounts usually occurs in late June, prior to the commencement of the rating year. The pensioner rate capped amount has been announced as \$750 for 2016/17.

The Shire does not administer the laws in regards to pensioner concessions. If you wish to lodge a complaint regarding the capping of the pensioner rebate you will need to contact your local Member of Parliament.

Each tie was washed and when dried carefully taken apart then

cut into the appropriate size to sew into blocks. A stiffening fabric was ironed onto the under side of each piece to stabilise it.

All the different colours are blending together very well with the striped fabric being used make interesting to patterns. There is still a long way to go as there is with most quilts, this being a labour of love for her husband's next birthday.

Warriors Wellbeing Article Getting a Good Night's Sleep

There are those extra busy times on . the farm like the coming seeding season where it's all go. It may mean longer than normal hours and possible sleep deprivation. A lack of sleep not only reduces our ability to perform work effectively, it also reduces our ability to work safely.

Some have regarded sleep as a useless waste of time with no interrupted sleep. Some factors that As a general rule, if we can't sleep, purpose - NOT TRUE.

Science and medicine are discovering more and more about the role of sleep, especially deep sleep, and its influence on our mental and physical wellbeing and health.

How much sleep do we really need? Eight hours seems to be the standard amount of sleep recommended at night but this is not true for everyone:

- Infants and toddlers need most - 9 to 10 hours at night plus day naps;
- School age including teenagers - do best with 9 to 11 hours at night;
- Most adults 7 to 8 hours a night;
- Older adults need the same as younger adults but sleep lighter and for shorter periods than younger adults.
- Some people just need fewer hours of six or less a night without ill effects. The need for less or even more sleep can run in families (suggesting a genetic basis).

What are the effects of lack of sleep? While we're sleeping, our body is busy tending to physical and mental our health and getting us ready for another day. Lack of sleep leads into:-

- Mood swings; .
- Drowsiness and irritability during the day;
- Impaired judgement and reaction time;
- Poor concentration, hinders memory, attention:
- Poor physical coordination dangerous accidents;

High blood pressure, heart disease:

- Depression.
- Regularly sleeping less than 5 hours is associated with poor physical health. There is a • debate whether poor health causes lost sleep or lost sleep . results in poor health?

Sleep may be more difficult to come by as we age and this can be traced to treatable health issues that cause . could cause sleep difficulties:-

- Sleep disorders sleep-apnoea, restless leg/arm doesn't stimulate us. syndrome, leg cramps;
- from conditions Pain headaches;
- A frequent need to urinate;
- Illness depression, coughing, shortness of breath:
- Medications some medications can disrupt sleep; Menopause - hot flushes, night sweats.

Some helpful tips for getting a good night's sleep are:-

- Go to bed and get up at the same time each day, this synchronizes our body clock;
 - Aim for daily exercise before

evenings;

- Avoid caffeine, nicotine and alcohol:
- Relax before bed i.e. warm shower/bed or reading;
- Keep bedroom quiet, dark and a comfortable temperature;
- Use bedroom/bed only for sleeping or intimacy - not as a lounge room for watching TV, studving i.e. the bed is associated with sleeping;
- Follow medication advices.

Beverley Historical Society presents **Our Tribute to Peg Kempton**

Peggy Winifred Bartram was born on 2 April 1934 at Beverley. Her parents were Ena (nee Fleay) and Leo Bartram. She has one younger brother, Robert. The family lived at Emerald Hills near the Dale River off Waterhatch Road. The Bartram family had a reputation for liking a jest - tall tales, amusing verses & practical jokes were a part of Peggy's upbringing. As a child she had pets – a dog, a cat, a pony & several lambs. During WW2 an Italian POW was assigned to the family farm and he taught Peggy some Italian words.

Peggy was first educated by correspondence with her mother as tutor. After a year or so a little bike appeared so that Peggy could ride the 3½ miles to Waterhatch Rd to catch the school bus. School was then in the Vincent St building now the CRC. One of her first experiences there was having an immunisation injection. She was not impressed & told her mother when she got home - she wouldn't be having that ever again!





She left school aged about 15 and went to a dressmaking school in Perth. For entertainment in the city she enjoyed dancing, basketball, ice-skating and going to the pictures. But she always wanted to be a nurse. She was presented to the WA Governor, Sir James Mitchell, with thirteen other debutants at the CWA Jubilee Ball in Beverley Town Hall in June 1951 when she was 17 years old.

She began Nursing in the Mount Hospital and later found work in the Beverley Hospital where she stayed at the Nurses Quarters on the corner of Forrest and Edward streets. One young lad remembers her giving him a tetanus injection - just as the needle was about to go in the upper arm Peg said, "You're a muscley young bugger, aren't you?" This unexpected swear word achieved its aim by taking the lad's mind off the needle.



In 1954 on November 24th at age 20 she married local lad Bob Kempton at St Mary's Church Beverley. They bought land west of Beverley on Dobaderry Road and began to live and farm on what they called "The Block".

She worked nursing part time while on the farm. She found the dark areas of the old hospital buildings rather spooky when on night duty, not helped when one night a farmer pulled up with a corpse in his truck wanting to know where it could be put.

In the late 1980's they built a house in Forrest Street and moved to retirement. Bob and Peg went on several trips overseas to Britain, Europe, Madagascar, Sri Lanka and Canada.

She was a keen gardener, planting exotic and indigenous plants. She had 'greenfingers' and her plants would often thrive when the plants of others didn't. Visits to Perth or Northam for doctors' appointments usually involved stopping at a nursery for new plants. She joined the Beverley Garden and Tree Society and was President for several years. Busy bees in the Dead Finish garden were a regular event.

Peg supported Bob's interest in race horses, horse-racing and the Beverley Race Club of which he was the last President. Race days always began with the making of plates of sandwiches for committee members and visitors. If the weather was cold Peg made a big pot of soup as well.

Peg became involved with several Beverley sports clubs. She played bowls, went to Country Week, was Ladies Secretary for three years and Ladies Champion in 1981-82. She loved her golf too, taking part in competitions at home and away. She was very involved with the Golf Ladies Committee from 1963 holding positions of Treasurer, Tea Secretary and match committee member. One year she was Ladies Captain. She also played tennis and, with her cousin, enthusiastically entered the ladies doubles at one Easter Tournament, but they met the club champions in the second round and were bundled out very quickly.

Bob and Peg bought a house in Albany where she went several times a year. They bought a boat and for many years she accompanied Bob on fishing expeditions. She loved Albany but found the weather didn't suit her arthritis in later years. Beverley family and friends often accompanied her for a laugh-filled journey & holiday.

Peg was related to many of Beverley's families and made many friends though her community activities. Her friends say she was generous, popular and good fun. She liked to ride her bicycle and one time she and a friend cycled round the town counting pine trees in order to oppose the removal of the Town Hall pine trees. Friends say they always had a laugh when in Peg's company.



The Beverley Historical Society and its Dead Finish Museum became one of Peg's passions in later years. She was very interested in the history of Beverley and supported the formation of the Society in 1977. She was not able to attend a lot of meetings at first but from 1990 onwards devoted considerable time to the Society and the Museum. She was President for three separate terms totalling nine years. She made the original proposal that one of the rooms in the Museum become 'The Beverley Room' as a showcase for local treasures.

She initiated or enhanced many of the Museum's other displays and projects including: the recovery & setting up of various historic fences in the garden; the series of special exhibitions involving the loan of family artefacts in the 1990s; assisting with the Shire of Beverley's *Municipal Heritage Index*; being one of the consultants for the publication of the Beverley Shire's book *Beverley: Our Journey Through Time*; helping devise an historic bus tour of Beverley still available to visiting groups; aiding in the setting up of Annie Lucy's room; managing the installation of the floor window that enables viewing of the cellar

Backyard Buddies

May 2016 - Horsetails

When agricultural or environmental weeds are found early enough it is possible to eradicate small or isolated infestations with prompt action. Often it is keen-eyed members of the public who set the process in motion by recognising and reporting new weeds. The weeds featured this month are horsetails (Equisetum which species), primitive are non-flowering perennials dating back to the Palaeozoic Era.

Horsetails are targets of the Boosting Biosecurity Defences Agricultural weed surveillance project funded by Royalties for Regions (information see: <u>https://agric.wa.gov.au/n/3835</u>).

Horsetails (*Equisetum* species) have occasionally been sold as ornamentals, and they are also of interest to people who take the risk of making their own herbal remedies. Sometimes they are used in permaculture or as pond plants.

The erect, jointed stems are of two kinds. Vegetative stems are green and ribbed. They can be a single stem or have whorls of slender leaf-like branches. Fertile stems can be green, white or pale brown, topped by fruiting cones. On both stems the true leaves are reduced to a papery ring around each joint. Once established, the main means of spread is by rhizomes rather than spores.

In a backyard the worst horsetails can do is smother the area, but if they escape into farmland the consequences are dire. They are toxic to livestock, and in high ensities they can reduce crop yield because they produce substances that inhibit the growth of other plants.

In the past, infestations of a horsetail called scouring rush (*E. hyemale*) have been found in the Perth metropolitan area at nurseries in Bedfordale and the Wanneroo area, and a home garden in Morley. Like all horsetails this one has a high silica content, and the common name arose from the old practice of using the stems to scrub pots and pans. Several other species, including common horsetail (*E. arvense*) have been found in the eastern states.

Please report any horsetails seen in the wild, in gardens or at weekend markets. If you have horsetail plants, do not attempt to dispose of them yourself. Please call us for advice as horsetail plants generate readily from fragments. Always take care when ordering plants or seeds via the internet, and never dump any garden rubbish in the bush.

Cloud Storage and Backup

Now there are crypto viruses around (see my March Blarney article) it is now more important than ever to ensure you have a secure storage and backup of your personal information. I will go through the advantages and disadvantages of cloud storage and backup.

Cloud Storage

Every PC manufacturer and software provider seems to be offering cloud storage facilities, often free. But you need to be aware of what is being provided.

Advantages:

- It is easy to transfer information between different devices, i.e. PCs, tablets and smart phones.
- A copy of your information is kept in a remote location so if something goes wrong with your device (very common) then you have a copy in the 'cloud'.

Disadvantages:

- Where is the information kept? Cloud storage facilities are somewhere in the world where? Most are not in Australia, many in the US. Some cloud facilities have mirror copies in Australia – does yours? This information is difficult to find but it is important to know. World events can change circumstances very rapidly.
- How good is your Internet coverage? If you are not in the town then Internet connection is often poor and expensive. Information moving between your device and the cloud can cause significant delays and/or costs
- If your information is corrupted (see panel) then the corrupted information can be copied to the cloud and overwrite your good stored copy.
- How well is the information secured? Is it encrypted? Cloud centres have been hacked and identities stolen although is not often publicized widely. If the storage is in another country you have no redress.

Cloud Backup:

Cloud backup is a more secure form of backup used mainly by businesses and professionals. In principle it is similar to cloud storage, but less disadvantages. Of course you will need to pay for this services. It is worth considering for personal use. Advantages:

- Because they are professional paid-for facilities then security will be better and more flexible.
- Information is usually stored so that previous versions are not overwritten older versions can be recovered if the current version is corrupted
- There are many services available in Australia
- Services often provide encryption. If the facility is hacked there is no useful information for the criminal. •

Disadvantages:

- Cloud backup services do not usually provide cloud storage. Use Cloud storage for working document exchange and cloud backup for permanent storage.
- Disadvantages concerning internet coverage still apply.
