The Aussie Outback Campfire

The event was created by CRC committee member Dalene Davies who had expressed that our community needed to share good old fashioned campfire cooked meals such as: dampers, camp oven stews, baked pumpkins and fire roasted meats in a relaxed country atmosphere and thanks to funding from Linkwest, Shire of Beverley and the Beverley CRC, it happened.

Dalene and her band of helpers prepared fire drums, wood, camp ovens, food and refreshments for the hungry guests and whilst the food finished off cooking Dalene and Val taught the group of keen guests how to cook damper. This cooking demonstration attracted more than just kids and there was damper cooking on sticks in ovens with butter and golden syrup everywhere. We were all entertained by an impromptu performance by one of the members from the Sandgroppers Caravan Club playing the trumpet and singing. The food was superb and many guests helped themselves to seconds and thirds.

It was fantastic to see our local residents mingle with the visitors and make them all feel welcome to our community, our staff at the centre received some excellent feedback from all of the guests. A big thank you to Dalene, Val, Errol and Janet for your assistance in running the event.

Basic Damper

Ingredients

- ⇒ 4 cups Self Raising Flour
- ⇒ 1 cup of milk (long life milk is ideal)
- ⇒ 1 tsp salt
- ⇒ ½ cup water
- ⇒ 1½ tsp of butter

Preparation

1. Sift together all dry ingredients and rub in butter.
2. Make a well in the flour and pour in milk and water.
3. Mix with a knife until your dough holds together. (Dough should be sticky to touch - not dry)
4. Sprinkle with a little flour and turn out onto a lightly floured surface.
5. Place into a pre-heated (hot) camp oven on a foil lined trivet or round cake tray and bake for 35 to 40 minutes.

Tip: Your damper is cooked if it sounds hollow when tapped! (If the fire is too hot, remove the camp oven to the side warming plate and top it with hot coals or heat beads). Remember to always be safe around the fire.

On behalf of the Sandgropper Caravanners Inc. we would like to sincerely thank the Beverley CRC for inviting our group to join in the Aussie Outback Campfire held at the caravan park on 13 May. The meal provided was absolutely amazing, and all of our members enjoyed the food and the company. Once again, many thanks for a wonderful evening.

President Report **June 2016**

2016/2017 Draft Budget

The 2016/2017 budgetary process is well underway. Council has endorsed the draft Fees and Charges and Capital Expenditure Schedules for inclusion in the draft 16/17 Budget.

You might be interested to know that many fees and charges are set by legislation or regulation such as dog and cat licensing and building fees, meaning the State must review them in order for a change. Local Government planning fees for example haven't been reviewed for over five years which means the cost of service delivery might not be recovered, putting pressure on rating levels to make up the shortfall.

Community Healthy Lifestyle Package

Council proposes to introduce a "Community Healthy Lifestyle Package" in 2016/2017 which combines a 12 month gym membership and swimming pool season pass for a 10% saving.

In April the Minister for Local Government launched the *MyCouncil* website, presenting a snapshot of all WA Local Governments and how they are raising, spending and managing their money. Data has been included from the last four years of Local Government's Annual Reports and Compliance Audit Return, which is already publicly available, and has been brought together so members of the public can more easily find and view this information. Beverley has performed exceptionally well.

Whilst the website provides an interesting analysis it needs to be viewed in context as direct comparisons of financial ratios can be misleading if not looking at the broader picture. Local Governments are constantly working to improve performance and produce positive outcomes for their communities.

Measures being introduced by the State Government for greater transparency and accountability between Local Governments and the community, which also includes new gift disclosure requirements and the imminent introduction of the Auditor General to the sector, is far beyond that required of both the State and Federal Governments.

Draft Beverley Tourism Plan and Tourism Framework

Council received the Draft Beverley Tourism Plan and Beverley Tourism Framework at its May meeting and has proposed an allocation in the 16/17 budget to initiate implementation. The draft is available for public viewing and comment.

Community consultation to develop the Beverley Strategic Community Plan 2013 – 2017 identified tourism as an economic development opportunity with priorities to "facilitate and promote Beverley as a tourist destination and participate in regional tourism strategies and initiatives". Further consultation has been undertaken by the Tourism Steering Committee to support development of the Tourism Plan and Framework.

The Beverley Tourism Plan and Framework is a strategic document which aims to support community planning for assets and initiatives that are sustainable and enhance what we already have. Beverley has many features, activities, events and attributes (including its people!) however a coordinated approach to capitalize on our potential and to market and promote ourselves is lacking.

With the work that has been progressing to develop the Draft Tourism Plan and Framework it was timely to read Stephen Scourfields comments in the May 7th Weekend West following his recent visit to the Wheatbelt and an overnight stay in Beverley.

CRC Neighbourhood House Week

Congratulations to the Community Resource Centre who hosted "The Great Aussie Outback Campfire" at the Caravan Park Campers Kitchen in celebration of Neighbourhood House Week. The crowd was large, with locals joined by visitors from the Sandgroppers Caravan Club, also providing the musical entertainment, and the food was AMAZING!

York Chidlow Road Speed Changes - Wheatbelt Highway Safety Review

An inaugural Western Australian Highway Safety Review was conducted in the Wheatbelt, "a region that has

been overrepresented in road trauma statistics for an extended period". The Summary Report is available for viewing at www.rsc.wa.gov.au/wheatbeltreview.

"It is expected that the Wheatbelt Highway Safety Review (WHSR) will result in improved road trauma outcomes for the region and build greater commitment to implementation of treatments aligned with the safe system approach." The York to Chidlow section of Great Southern Highway has been identified as one of the problem areas and for those who travel this section of road you would be aware of the change in road speed signage.

Main Roads Wheatbelt Manager Craig Manton advised Local Government representatives at a recent Zone meeting in Corrigin that works identified to improve safety on this road requires additional funding and as an interim measure a review of speed limits was undertaken in an endeavor to improve safety outcomes immediately.

Frustration evident amongst road users at this speed limit change should be directed to lobbying the State Government to commit funding for completion of the necessary roadworks. It is likely Highway Safety Reviews will be extended to encompass other State routes and regions in the future, so the sooner funding is committed to this road the better.

ActiveSmart – Have you registered?

In May most Beverley residents would have received a letter from the Minister for Sport and Recreation, Hon Mia Davies MLA, which provided an introduction to the ActiveSmart program and an invitation to join. If you haven't received a letter you can still join (contact the Shire or register at www.activesmart.com.au), as the program is open to all our residents. It would be terrific if Beverley were to have the highest percentage of participants per head of population! Have you joined yet?

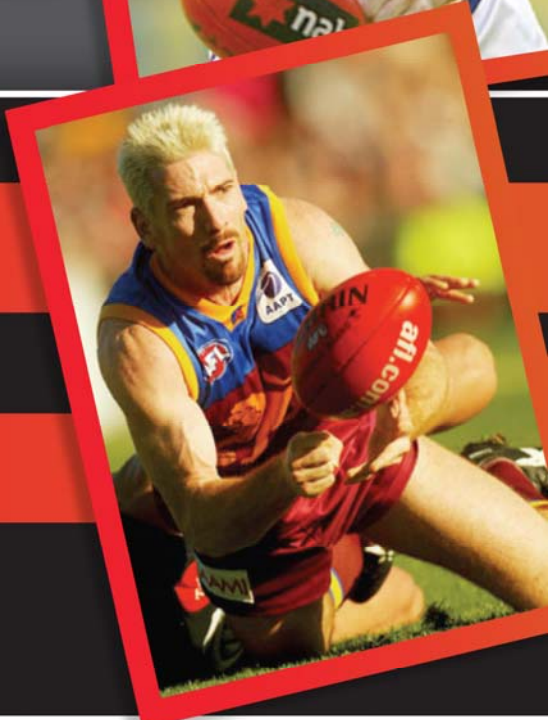
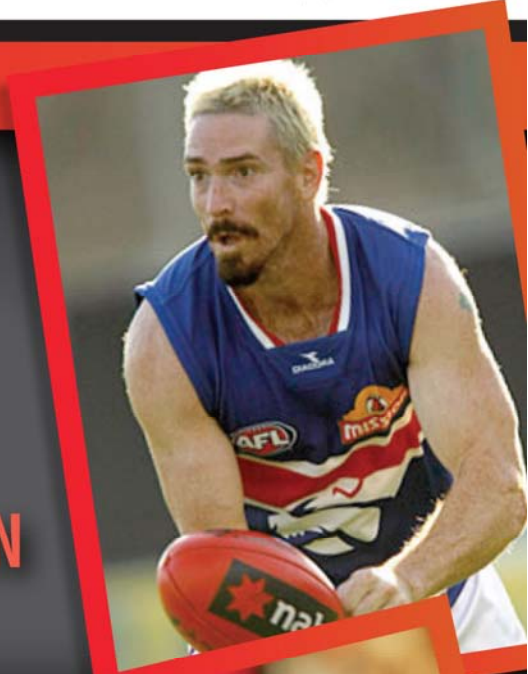

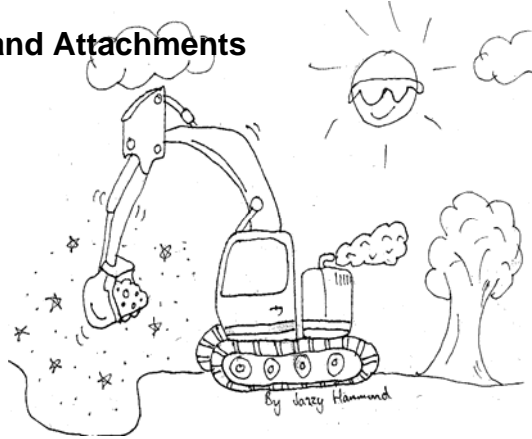

Beverley Quilting Group

Many of our ladies are on holiday, hopefully finding somewhere warmer than we have been experiencing lately.

Pat has been working since the beginning of April on a quilt for her youngest son. Most of the fabrics for this project were found in Pat's stash which is made up of Jelly Rolls (several meters of different designs cut into 2 1/2" strips), left over fabric from other quilts and 'fat quarters' (being a square quarter of a meter). There are a few prints of Kiwi fruit appearing in some of the blocks so some new fabric is also being used, this one bought when Pat and her husband recently visited in New Zealand.

Each block is being completed by piecing (sewing the pieces together) the top and then quilting it to the batting and backing. While this takes extra time when the blocks are made the finishing of the quilt is much quicker, and easier to quilt a small block than quilt a large king sized quilt. There needs to be 72 blocks to finish this quilt, the second one Pat has made using this process, so we are seeing many months of this dedicated work.

Country Women's Association - BEVERLEY BRANCH

At the CWA May meeting we have been honoured to have two very special guests. Dr Olay from the Beverley Medical Practice gave us a very enlightening insight to osteoporosis. He gave those present a very well presented talk on what osteoporosis is, what causes it and how to prevent it.

We were also given a detailed sheet on the foods we should include in our diets to maintain strong, healthy bones and also included the importance of vitamin D which we do absorb from sunlight but also in many cases it is important to include an added intake of calcium and vitamin D.

Another highlight of the day was a talk from Colleen Mearns who is involved in "The Shoe Box" scheme which uses attractively covered shoe boxes containing many small gifts suitable of a given age for children. These gifts are distributed to children in the regions north of Australia where poverty is so prevalent. Colleen showed us many examples of suitable contents which can be made or purchased and also indicated that there are labels which are used to indicate the age suitability.

Our Beverley Branch is to undertake the completion of 20 of these boxed gifts and our members invite anyone who would like to join us with this project.

There will be a craft day at the CWA centre on 8th June when we hope to be able to start this project together. Members and non members are all welcome to join in the task.

Dob in a Dealer Australia's fight against ICE

Minister for Justice, The Hon Michael Keenan joined Crime Stoppers Australia on Monday 22 February to launch a national Dob in a Dealer campaign.

Crime Stoppers' Dob in a Dealer campaign calls on communities to come together in the fight against ICE.

All law enforcement agencies are collaborating in ICE detection but Dob in a Dealer is a community engagement campaign focused on gathering local intelligence and engaging every Australian in contributing to making their communities safer places. Crime Stoppers provides the community with a safe and secure avenue to pass on information confidentially.

The Dob in a Dealer campaign has received Federal funding of \$1 million in order to take the campaign across the country. Crime Stoppers will be visiting local communities asking residents to be active participants in reporting those that are involved in the manufacture and supply of ice and other illicit drugs.

"We are asking people to make an anonymous call to Crime Stoppers, or to report online if they have information about people manufacturing or distributing ICE in their community" said Bryan Roach, Crime Stoppers Australia Chair. "Dob in a Dealer is a campaign for the community by the community. When it comes to ICE, Australian's have had enough. Our aim is to make everyone aware that to deal with the ICE problem affecting our families and friends, that they must help. We want everyone to know that if they have any information on those who are manufacturing and supplying ICE in our communities to Dob in a Dealer by contacting Crime Stoppers."

Crimes relating to methamphetamine or ICE continue to be a concern for police as there remains a strong correlation between those who commit drug offences and those committing other crimes.

Community information is vital to help stemming the flow of ICE across the country and the Dob in a Dealer campaign is one of the initiatives backed by the Federal Government in a multi-pronged approach to addressing methamphetamine manufacture and use.

The national roll out of the campaign comes on the back of strong results from the Victorian based campaign which saw communities playing an important role in providing information anonymously to Crime Stoppers and ice reports increase by over 150%.

Crime Stoppers is aware that some people reporting may have an existing addiction to drugs or may be family members of someone suffering an addiction. Crime Stoppers will refer those who require assistance to local health care agencies where they can discuss treatment options.

The April meeting took the form of a visit to a composting company at Chittleborough Rd.

Twenty five members travelled in convoy out to the company and were treated to a most interesting presentation on the make up of soils and how to treat them. The barrage of questions following the presentation indicated the interest of members. We walked over the complex and saw how the compost was made. The company mainly serves the agricultural industry but the same pointers apply for our gardens.

This week (5th May as I write) we planted some vegetables in the potager garden at the Dead Finish. Annual flowers are already in but we fancy our chances in the Beverley Show, so have planted some brassicas and silver beet. The little citrus trees we put in last year have a small amount of fruit. The lemonade tree particularly is bearing well. Visitors are always welcome in the garden so go and have a look.

The welcome weather is boding well for our gardens and vegies, the down side of the rain is weeds and there will be many a sore back in the coming weeks. Be kind to yourself and don't over do it.

OUT IN THE GARDEN:

- ☞ Transplant artichokes now and be rewarded in the spring.
- ☞ Feed and mulch deeply asparagus.
- ☞ Roses need to be fed six weekly to push them along and have them at the peak of their health and keep in mind the Rose Show in October.
- ☞ Flowers to plant now include pansies, hollyhocks, everlastings, statice, stocks and poppies.
- ☞ Vegetables can include kale, cauliflowers, cabbage, silver beet, broad beans and peas.

June's outing is a visit to King's Park and a native plant nursery. As usual we will need an extra trailer to bring back the plants.

Enjoy the fine gardening weather and try something new just for fun!

BEVERLEY NATURALISTS CLUB

What a great start to the season with some great rainfall totals. The bush is looking green and healthy from the rain.

The Beverley Naturalists Club has started a HANDS FOR EARTH program for Beverley and will be inviting people to come along and have breakfast with us and then we will do about an hour of cleaning the illegally dumped rubbish in the bush along the Nicholas Road. This very special bush reserve which we have named the Beverley Airfield Reserve and has some very significant flora and fauna including some endangered species. We will start with our first day being **Tuesday 14 June** at about 8am for breakfast. We will meet along the Nicholas Road. We have to do it on a day when the tip is closed because we will have trailers parked on the edge of the road and there is too much traffic on days when the tip is open. We will be mindful of the weather and if it is raining we will cancel. We will also do an afternoon event as well on **Tuesday 28 June** we will meet at about 3pm on Nicholas Road and have afternoon tea and soup and buns and then clean up after that. We need to remove all the old metal out of the bush.

Did you know that some of the big trees out on the Nicholas Road are in excess of 350 years old? Can you imagine how much the world has changed around them. I have been trying to imagine what this area would have been like when these trees were first growing. These

trees are very important and to even lose one would be disastrous. We must try and protect this area at all costs. The federal government has declared all Wheatbelt woodlands as threatened ecological communities which gives them protection. The Beverley Airfield Reserve has a great representation of Salmon Gums with this stand being the biggest intact old growth woodland in the Avon Valley. We also have Wandoo and York gum well represented out there as well as the big old River gums along the Avon River. This reserve is also the home to the endangered Red Tailed Phascogale and many different species of wildlife and wildflowers.

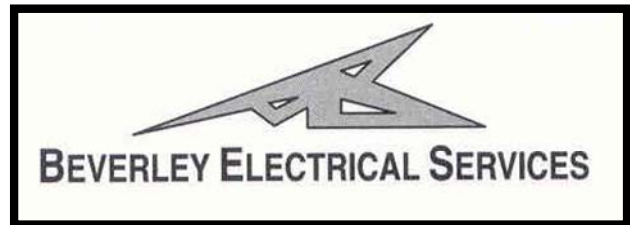

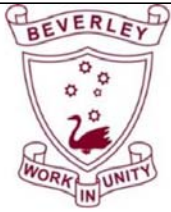

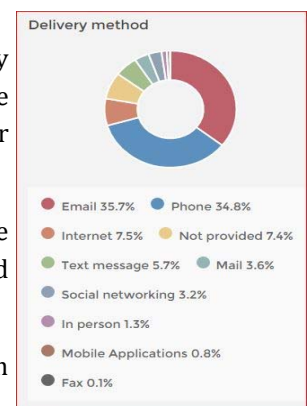

File Organisation and Archives

Many people keep their files without any folder structure or without a good naming convention. This can make files difficult to find. You can use the search facility but if you don't know the name or where it is stored this may not help.

Default Folders: In your user area there are a number of default folders: Desktop; Documents; Downloads; Music; Pictures; Videos. Files put into the correct folder will be easier to find. Try not to keep files on the Desktop and keep only downloaded program files in the Downloads folder – move other files into the most appropriate folder.

Folder structure: Consider the Default Folders as a filing cabinet and create an equivalent file structure as you would find in a cabinet:

- Default Folder 1 (file cabinet)
 - Sub-folder 1 (drawer 1)
 - Sub-sub-folder 1 (file holder 1)
 - Files
 - Sub-folder 2 (drawer 2)
 - Etc.

Folder and file names: Use meaningful names for your sub-folders and files. This makes them easier to organise and find. It is worthwhile including a Topic, Date, and Description in the file name. Put dates in reverse order (see panel). For photos put the date first, then folders will sort and present in the right date order.

File Archives: To reduce backup time and reduce clutter in your folders it is worth creating an archive for files used rarely or needed to keep as a historical record (e.g. tax records). Use a similar file/naming structure as for your working files. When archiving files update **all** archives

Using Dates in File Names

If you use dates in your file names (e.g. for photos) put the date in reverse order: year; month; day (e.g. 160601 for 1 Jun 2016). This way the files will sort and present in date order. If you use the Australian date order (010616) all the files for the first day of **all** months will be at the top, then all the files for the second day, etc.

copies, then delete the files from your working folders to reduce future backup size/time.

Archive storage: Keep at least two copies of your archives then it will not be necessary to back up your archive. Two copies ensures that if one is damaged e.g. by a disc failure or accidental deletion the archive can re-created.

Keep archives on separate discs to avoid total loss e.g.

- ⇒ Use two or more external hard drives.
- ⇒ Keep **only one** copy on your PC and others on external hard drives.
- ⇒ Do not keep the Archive in your default folders or you will keep backing it up unnecessarily. Instead put it in the library user area.
- ⇒ Alternatively on some PCs the internal hard drive is split into two partitions. If so put the archive on the second partition (usually Data disc D:).
- ⇒ If you live in a fire prone area keep one archive away from your home, e.g. in a bank vault.

Getting into the driver's seat ... it's your health!

Supporting men to become empowered and take responsibility for their wellbeing and health; that's our core focus at the Regional Men's Health Initiative. We do this in light of the adverse statistics that represent men's health in general and the notion that for a large proportion of men developing their 'health knowledge' is not seen as a priority. This fits with men having a more functional view of their health i.e. not seeking help until we are virtually physically impaired by the problem. We often challenge men on these points, but what does it really mean as a bloke to take responsibility for your wellbeing and health?

As blokes we take responsibility and make a lot of informed decisions throughout our lives, on a variety of things such as family, work and social issues. Why should decisions about our wellbeing and health be any different?

Too many blokes are running into trouble because we keep avoiding and putting off looking after our wellbeing and health. Just being a passive participant is not good enough, we need to be the one in the driver's seat in all areas of our health be it physical, mental or social/ spiritual.

Taking responsibility for our wellbeing and health means becoming an active and informed healthcare consumer. It means scheduling regular service visits with our doctor and being aware of issues that affect us at certain stages of our lives, such as the potential for prostate problems as we get older. We also need to consider issues that could be common in our families (hereditary) and discuss this with the doctor in view of our lifestyle choices. It's a bit of a generalisation but how many of us guys rely on our wives or partners for our health when it comes to our diet i.e. what food is in the house and what we eat for dinner.

Our key message "before at all gets too much, talk to a mate..." requires us to take some responsibility in that it's important we identify who our mates are so that when the s..t hits the fan, and it does happen, we have a strategy plan in place to address things.

While taking charge is important it doesn't mean you have to go it alone, we all need help sometimes. From a community educator and support worker perspective this often means my role involves walking beside someone helping to establish relevant pathways of support. It could also be simply listening to and validating people's issues and the emotions they associate with them. We see it as, *walking beside the ute with the window down but not hopping in* - it's your bus, you are the one in the driver's seat!

Remember that it's not your wife's, mate's or doctor's health and wellbeing, it's yours. Good health and wellbeing can only happen if and when we as blokes take responsibility!

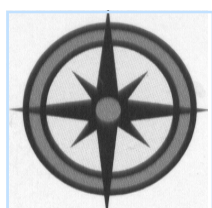

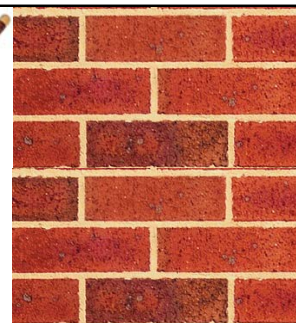

African acacias

Most trees are a welcome addition to the landscape - providing shade and shelter, fodder for livestock, delicious fruit and nuts for human consumption, food and habitat for wildlife and beautiful flowers.

However, some trees pose a major threat to agriculture and the environment. African acacias are particularly threatening to the Western Australian ecosystem.

Karoo thorn (*Vachellia karroo*, formerly *Acacia karroo*) is one of these species. It has been found in Western Australia and other parts of Australia in the past. Being native across a wide part of Africa, it is perfectly adapted to the WA environment including most of southern WA.

It has flowers and leaves similar to Australian wattle species and can reach to a height of 12 metres. Its most distinctive feature is large white thorns, which can grow up to 10cm long in V-shaped pairs. With its large menacing thorns, karroo thorn can form dense, impenetrable thickets. One large tree can produce up to 19,000 seeds per year and the seeds can last in the soil for up to seven years!

Karoo thorn is a target of the Boosting Biosecurity Defences Agricultural weed surveillance project funded by Royalties for Regions. For further information see: our website: agric.wa.gov.au and search for 'weed surveillance'.

Giraffe thorn (*Acacia erioloba*) is another African acacia that has been found in WA in the past. It also has distinctive large white thorns in V-shaped pairs, as well as felty ear-shaped seed pods. If found in WA, karroo thorn and giraffe thorn must be reported and eradicated.

Look-a-likes

No Australian wattles have large thorns like these (see above). Native acacias like *Acacia pulchella* (Prickly Moses) are prickly shrubs with much smaller leaves and thorns.

Vachellia farnesiana, which is not a declared plant, can be found scattered through the State's wheatbelt, North West and the Kimberly. *Vachellia nilotica*, which is declared, has previously been found

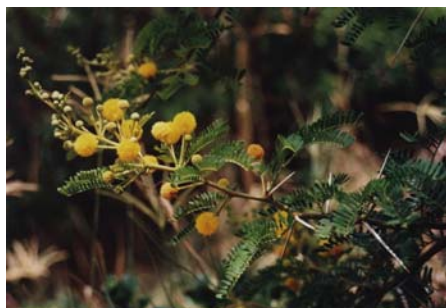

Alternatively email photographs and location information to: info@agric.wa.gov.au or call 1800 084 881. Don't order seeds from the internet until you have checked they are permitted species (phone Quarantine WA on 9334 1800).

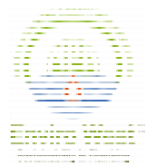

Unlike our teeth, horse's teeth continue to erupt or grow throughout most of their life, especially in their early years. They are also constantly being worn down due to the grinding action horses use to chew their feed. You should have your horse's teeth seen to by a professional every 12 months. This is just a guideline, periods between dental visits will depend on the individual horse.
