President Report February 2014

Annual Electors Meeting

Thankyou to the community members who attended the recent Annual Electors meeting, this vear held at the Function and Recreation Centre and including a slide show of various activities over the last 12 months

In addition to the "statutory requirement" of these meetings, the Shire of Beverley take the opportunity to provide an update of events and activities, answer an array of questions (which generally aren't related to the Annual Report) and enjoy informal interaction between community members, Councillors and senior staff once the meeting is concluded

You may have seen an article written recently by the President of the Western Australian Local Government Association questioning the need for these annual meetings which are a statutory requirement to present the previous financial year Annual Report to electors. It represents a period which has concluded 6 months prior and has already been endorsed by Council and submitted, as required by legislation, to the Department of Local Government.

Although our meeting took around an hour, the statutory component took 8 minutes with a small number of attendees, so one does wonder about the time and cost in holding these meetings when the Annual Report is readily available, Council

meetings commence with public question time, and the newly legislated Integrated Planning Framework requires Local Government to have a Strategic Community Plan, which is developed and reviewed following community consultation.

2013 Variety Christmas Concert and Christmas Light Competition

Due to the earlier time frame for submitting notes for the January Blarney (and now perhaps becoming a distant memory for some!) I would like to make mention of the enjovable Christmas event held at the Platform Theatre in December and thank Beverley Station Arts for putting this together for the community to enjoy. Thankyou also to everyone who participated in the Christmas Light competition which once again created a lot of interest and talented displays, and to Valery Seeber for her enthusiasm co-ordinating this project.

State Government Cuts to Road Funding

Recently announced State Government cuts to road funding are very disappointing and of

great concern. The underfunded road task is an ongoing challenge as many roads in the State were not built for the type and volume of traffic now accessing them and they remain Local Government responsibility.

Leeuwin Sailing Challenge

The Shire's Community Grants Programme provided sponsorship for Noah Leonhardt to participate in a Leeuwin Youth Explorer challenge. Councillors have since been treated to an enlightening presentation by Noah of his experiences aboard the sailing ship during his week-long trip of a lifetime.



TRAILS MASTER PLAN INVITATION TO COMMUNITY MEETING

The **Shire of Beverley** has commissioned Mike Maher of Transplan Pty Ltd (recreation trail planning and design specialist) to prepare a Trails Master Plan for the Shire of Beverley.

The purpose of the Master Plan is to develop a strategy for the future development and maintenance of a series of trails throughout the Shire – to cater primarily for activities such as walking and off road cycling (mountain biking).

It is important that key stakeholders and interested people in the community have an opportunity to contribute to the shaping of this important trail strategy.

You and your colleagues are invited to attend a community meeting with Mike Maher to discuss a range of matters impacting on the Trails Master Plan, including:

- The location, condition and level of use of existing trails in the Shire.
- The need for additional trails and where these might be developed.
- Constraints and barriers to trail use, and management and maintenance issues.

There will also be an opportunity for those attending to provide information on historical matters that could be considered for inclusion on interpretive panels along any existing and proposed trails.







CHALLENGED BY CHOICE ON LEEUWIN VOYAGE

Early in 2013, the Leeuwin Ocean Adventure Foundation came to the York District High School to tell students about the Youth Explorer Voyage on the STS Leeuwin sailing ship. I knew I enjoyed being out on the water in my Dad's tinny, fishing on holidays, so I decided to ask my parents if I could give it a try.


I applied for and was successful in receiving a Children's Trust Scholarship towards the voyage which was set for December 2013. I also received sponsorship from the Beverley Shire, Beverley Lions Club, the Beverley Weight Watchers and my parents. So on Monday 16 December, I stood nervously on the dock at the B Shed Fremantle, looking at a ship that did not look big enough for the forty odd youth standing right along side me. I farewelled my mum who was there to see me off and walked over the gangway. After several hours of safety training and settling into our bunks, we set the heading and set sail.



The first night we anchored near Rottnest Island where we spent the night getting to know each other. My first challenge came when I was asked to climb to the second highest gallant (top square sail) to tie up the sail. It was extremely high and I was very nervous.

On the second day we had a great breakfast cooked by chef Aidan, then got straight into 'happy hour' which is cleaning the ship. We lifted anchor and sailed west. In total we sailed approximately 125 miles west, and then zigzagged back towards Rottnest. Seasickness was a problem because of the rough swell with myself and many other sailors having to be clipped to the spew line.

My achievements throughout the sail included climbing to the highest point on the ship, the main mast, where only those who successfully climb it can read the message at the top. I met some awesome people including a group of youth from Karratha and I hope to have many of these as good friends for a long time. On the Leeuwin voyage I pulled ropes, set sails, furled sails, did team games



This was a fantastic experience! It challenged me and I learnt a lot and I am very grateful to the Shire of Beverley, the Beverley Lions Club, the Beverley Weight Watchers and my parents for sponsoring me. I am now eligible to return to sail on the Leeuwin as a volunteer Trainee Watch Leader. I would recommend the Youth Explorer Voyage to anyone.

The Beverley Shire has sponsored the Opportunity Shop for 6 and a half years by providing a spacious and well located rent-free venue from which we can trade, firstly at The Old School Building (currently CRC) and for the past 3 years at The Child Health Centre. We have been extremely appreciative of this gesture of goodwill. The Shire has willingly made the building secure, tended to minor repairs and painted and maintained the buildings and garden for us. Due to the dangerous deterioration of interior of the Child Health Centre and the uncertainty of its future, this arrangement will cease after Easter and WE WILL BE HOMELESS......unless we can find a new venue and attract new sponsor(s) to help us pay the rent.

The Hospital Auxiliary is searching for an unoccupied building of at least 2 reasonably sized rooms in a well-suited location (preferably main street) and a benefactor with whom we can enter into an arrangement to offset some or all of the rent payment.

We have been quoted figures of \$100 and over per week to rent a vacant building in Vincent Street. If the Auxiliary is forced to pay weekly rent from our minimal takings (we open for sales 2 hours a week), our volunteers will be working to simply pay the rent. There will be very few dollars remaining to donate to the Hospital Services in our own town.

For this reason, we hope there may be a property owner who can offer us a rent free home or a sponsor who can commit to paying all or part of our rent for a set period of time e.g. 2 years or longer.

The Op Shop is a valuable asset to our community members, whether that be as a support for the patients and residents of the Lodge, Hospital and Allied Health Services (potentially, that could be you) or as a bargain basement for those in need or simply as a drop-off point for unwanted goods.

Please consider whether you might be in a position to enter into a short/long term arrangement with The Beverley Hospital Auxiliary to maintain the presence of The Opportunity Shop.





BEVERLEY HISTORICAL SOCIETY REPORT

Seventy-five years ago, this month, a head on rail collision occurred at Mt Kokeby. The following article appeared in the 'West Australian' on Tuesday 21 February 1939. The photos used here were taken at the scene by a local resident.

TRAINS COLLIDE HEAD ON SMASH AT MT KOKEBY Trucks Telescoped by Impact

BEVERLEY, Feb, 20.—The Perth-bound mixed train from Narrogin collided head-on with a Narrogin-bound goods train at Mt Kokeby siding, about seven miles from Beverley about 1 p.m. today. As a result of the smash both engines and the leading trucks sustained serious damage, two trucks which were immediately behind the engine of the goods train being telescoped and their loading of superphosphate scattered over the permanent way, while a truck of coal attached to the engine of the mixed train was scattered when the woodwork of the truck was splintered by the impact. The permanent way was torn up and the lines displaced, but despite the force of the collision the only injuries suffered were facial abrasions by a member of the crew of one train and a child passenger.



It was fortunate that the Perth-bound train was a mixed one, as the leading trucks undoubtedly saved the passenger coaches from damage by acting as a buffer. As it was passengers had a frightening moment as the trains met and they were thrown from their seats. The Perth-bound passengers were stranded at Mt Kokeby until a Diesel car travelling to Katanning, which was in the Beverley station at the time of the collision, went to Mt Kokeby and picked them up. It took the passengers to Beverley, where a further wait was necessary while an engine and van were procured from York and a train made up to take them on their way. They left Beverley about two and a half hours behind the scheduled time.

Gangs of workmen from stations on each side of Mt Kokeby were quickly on the scene of the accident. The first work which engaged their attention was the clearing of a line to allow the Diesel train to proceed on its way.

The accident occurred on the southern end of the Mt Kokeby station. The goods train had passed through the station on the main line and had just backed on to a loop to allow the Perth-bound



mixed train through. It had cleared the points, but before they could be changed over the mixed train appeared and swung on to the loopline, the driver apparently being under the impression that the points were set for the main line. The resulting crash was heard over a mile away and a few people who were watching the approach of the mixed train had an exciting moment when they saw what was about to happen.



Eye-witnesses state that when the trains met the two superphosphate trucks attached to the engine of the goods train telescoped and were thrown high into the air, coming to rest as a tangled mass of wreckage. Both tenders were twisted round at an angle to the engines to which they were attached.



Breakdown gangs are busy clearing up the debris and a breakdown train from Perth will arrive tomorrow to restore the engines to the rails.

It was announced last night that the Railway Department would conduct the usual departmental inquiry into the accident.





GETTING BACK INTO WORK AFTER YOUR HOLIDAY

Quiet often after a holiday or a break it is difficult to get back into work and work habits. This affects us both physically and mentally, it is pretty normal! Physically - we may be a bit out of condition due to the extra eating, drinking and relaxing rather than exercising. This may restrict our capacity to do some of our physical jobs so make sure you ease yourself into physical tasks if that is what your job entails. Plan out a daily routine which allows enough time for work, rest, exercise and play. There is some thought provoking outcomes from recent research into truck crashes by the Truck Crash Research Centre based in South Australia. One of the research outcomes is that the majority of truck accidents (more than 90%) happened on the outward bound journey of the truck trip!

There are many reasons for this, but primarily it is a combination of being physically tired coming off the holiday break and/or mentally our headspace is not focused on the job at hand. That is we are preoccupied with either the great holiday we have just had, the rostered break, relationship issues, family issues that may have been going on in our life. Prioritising these issues and dealing with them is an important part of our life. It does take a little time to adjust back to the workplace routine. Occupational Health & Safety provides the legislative framework that gives the employees and employers safety guidelines to adhere to.

It is part of our culture and attitude however (especially prevalent in males) to risk taking, winning and getting the job done. These are the factors that we have to address, be aware of, and talk about so that as blokes we understand why we sometimes cut corners and how that may affect safety in the workplace. Our health and safety is ultimately our individual responsibility. Prepare yourself by being well rested and be alert when you're getting back into it. Enjoy your work in 2014 and get the work life balance right.

Hello Everyone,

Blimey. How warm has it been? There was never any mention of 45+ degree days when I was interviewed for WAPOL in a very cold, very wet, very rainy London 7 years ago. Nothing like starting off the Blue Line with a grade A Pommy moan is there!

So, what's to report? There have been a few instances of petty but nonetheless mindless damage to a number of commercial properties in the town. This has raised a couple of points; 1. Parents, do you know where your kids are during the hours of darkness? And 2. There's more CCTV than you may think in this town. Smile, because some of you have been caught on candid camera...... Whilst we've been on afternoons we've taken a number of children who we've found wandering around the town at 11.30pm and later back to their parents. Bearing in mind many of the instances of damage have occurred during the hours of darkness it should come as no surprise that the finger of blame ends up being pointed at those wandering around during the wee small hours.

Another issue which makes gives me cause for concern is the fact there has been a number of fights in the town between teenagers. We have come down very hard on those we found filming these incidents and have seized a number of mobile devices. In case you were thinking that once you'd uploaded the footage to the web and then deleted it from your device it was gone, think again, it hasn't. Thankfully it seems to have stopped now so please let's not have it happening again.

I was walking my crazy dogs the other day and parked outside the bank was a very nice car with all its windows down, satnav on the dashboard, iPhone in its cradle and a laptop on the back seat. I made mention to the owner that it might be a good idea not to have those items on such open display. I was met with indifference and that's fine, whatever, but could you afford to lose that much valuable equipment to an opportunistic thief? I'm not getting all preachy but, well, I think you know what I'm saying......

Anyroadup (remember those Lancashire sayings, that's one of them again) what's <u>really</u> been happening? Yes, I've had an animal related incident again. It wasn't quite on par with the devil sheep incident but it was nonetheless interesting. If you'd have been at the side of the police station a couple of Friday evenings ago you'd have seen me chasing an escaped goose up and down the road. I like my food (as you may have noticed, you don't get a figure like mine by eating salad) and I'm particularly fond of goose. The thing is, I prefer it ready to eat or at least ready for the pot. I chased this bird up and down before it leapt to its escape and back into the garden whence it came. At least I got support and encouragement from Ian. 




