President Report - February 2015



Waste Water Re-use Project - Completion in Sight

Completion of the waste water re-use project should finally occur in the near future. Unfortunately it won't be in time to negate the requirement to pay for additional water for oval reticulation before the end of this summer.

Water Corp has advised they will be installing air valves between the oval and Waste Water Re-use Plant during February and March and will be attempting to cause as little disruption as possible during this process.

Shire Road Works

Reseals are underway and these should be completed in February. Construction works are being undertaken on Morbinning Road, after which the works crew will be moving onto the Dale Kokeby and Edison Mill roads.

Tourism Steering Committee

As advertised in the January Blarney the Shire is seeking expressions of interest to form a Tourism Steering Committee to investigate the possibilities of a Beverley Tourism Planning Framework as an economic development opportunity for the district. It is proposed that the Steering Committee will initially be a small working group who will facilitate wider discussion and consultation amongst the community.

Toilet Block Installation at Platform Theatre

A new toilet block for use during events and activities at the Railway Station Cultural Precinct is currently being installed at the Northern end of the grounds. It is proposed to have this functional in time for the "Ballet in Beverley" on Friday 20th February when the Charlesworth Ballet Institute are presenting "Sleeping Beauty".

First Council meetings for 2015

The Corporate Strategy Committee is due to meet on 10th February and the first monthly Council meeting will be held on Tuesday 24th February commencing at 2pm.

Shire staff member Sue Collins retires at the end of January. Councillor's and Staff recently recognized Sue's involvement with the Shire of Beverley over the last 8 years at a farewell function, where Sue and John were wished all the best in retirement and future travel plans.



Cleaning tips

News Straight from the Broomstick

It is with great sadness that I have to bring everyone's attention to a negative event. Two beautiful kangaroos from the bush near my place were severely attacked by dogs, the young male died out in the bush. The female whose pouch had been bitten completely open was trying to survive while raising her joey at foot. As soon as we saw her we had been trying to capture her and bring her into care, by the time we had been able to do so her she was so severely emaciated, dehydrated, infected and fly blown. As soon as we got her into care we sedated her and started cleaning up her wounds and removed as many maggots as we could. The following morning we took her to our vet where they put her under anaesthetic and scraped off all of the necrotic tissue and gave all of her wounds proper clean. We then put her on two different antibiotics and vitamin B injections. Every day we had to flush out her wounds, until the wound had started to heal. After my vet had confirmed a dog attack I contacted the ranger and explained the situation to him. He informed me that all dogs must be kept on a lead at all times when off of your own property. So no dogs would have been out anywhere near the bush to attack these kangaroos. I have put up more cameras and I have increased my dump road patrols for dogs, which I will hand off to the ranger if I find any. So words of warning do not allow your dog off of your property off of a lead.

Sadly after eight days in care the doe passed away her joey however is doing very well with her mob looking after her. The mob of kangaroos called this bush and my property home long before I moved here. I feed them and protect them and they in return look after my released kangaroos. I love this mob of kangaroos and would do anything in my power to protect them from dogs and illegal shooters and anyone or anything that threatens them.

We have also been very busy with a few joeys in care all doing well with most of them coming from the kangaroo relocation from Ellenbrook. It was an extremely positive experience with over 200 land locked kangaroos being sedated and moved away instead of being culled at the expense on the developer. We all hope that more translocations instead of culling that will happen in the future. This was the first time this had ever been done with a totally wild mob so it was great to see such a high success rate. I am extremely proud of everyone who worked so hard to ensure that these translocated kangaroos were treated with extreme care and dignity and their welfare considered above all else.

Hope everyone had a wonderful Christmas and New Year and that we all look forward to a great 2015.



Information on Indigenous matters.

As, by this time we all know, that the year ending 2014 ended very badly with bad omens. Sadly it was reported on TV news media that there were 2 tragic deaths in custody within a 30 day time period. A lady in her early 20's and an indigenous man in his early 30's. A procession was held in protest in Perth in mid December and our Premier apologised profusely to the bereaved families. It should be noted here by all our readers, when an indigenous person dies, it is not only the immediate family that mourns, their whole community mourns as they are all part of one family, this is a part of the indigenous culture.

In the case where a mother dies and passes on to the spirits people and her ancestors, then the children left behind will then be cared for by all the other mothers and grandmothers in the community. They will be loved and looked after just like their very own children, in other words, they all become part of the same family.

Community culture land identity values respect spirits people water fire. What does all of this mean to indigenous people? A doctor of anthropology tried to find out all she could about families residing in remote areas. The facts are, that many years ago a lady anthropologist, white and of slender build, wore a long flowing white dress covering her toes, she wore no shoes and went by the name of Dr Olive Pink.

Before Dr Olive went on her walk about from one remote community to another, she obtained permission from the elders of their communities. Once she was invited, she would be offered tin huts in which she would be sharing with the aboriginal women. In the beginning, what she found hardest was to earn the trust and respect of these first people and how important their land, culture, identity and values are and once accepted by one community, she was then getting to be well known as the white lady, the ghost lady, as when first sighted this lone white figure, in a white dress, created fear amongst some who saw her for the first time, as a spirit from the past. Dr Olive Pink's book was part of the reading material towards my degree on indigenous management. In a nutshell, her words: "One would never learn how to understand the Aboriginal cultures, their values, connection and identity towards their land, unless you are accepted to be and live as part of this one big family".

Returning to Work - Getting ourselves back on track!

EnergySafety releases Parkerville report

Energy*Safety*'s report into the pole failure that caused the Parkerville bushfire on January 12, released today, shows the private power pole failed because of rot and termites.

The report follows the January 15 finding that the bushfire originated from the failure of a privately owned point-of-attachment pole (PA pole) at 180 Granite Road, Parkerville.

When the pole toppled, it caused the customer's submains cable to pull through the hole at the bottom of the main switchboard enclosure, causing a short-circuit. Hot metal globules then fell and ignited vegetation at the base of the PA pole.

Director of Energy Safety Ken Bowron said Energy *Safety* had completed a thorough investigation into the cause of the private pole failure.

"Closely linked with that investigation is the issue of ownership of, and responsibility for, power poles and service apparatus on private land," Mr Bowron said. "This has been the subject of detailed consideration by Energy*Safety* and the State Government.

"Our investigation found the pole failed due to extensive damage from fungal decay or rot and termites.

"The *Electricity Act 1945* makes no provision for the maintenance of private electrical installations. Under common law, property owners have a duty of care to maintain their power assets in a safe condition, but there is no legislative requirement for an owner to inspect their installation to ensure it is safe.

"The Act also deals with the responsibilities of a network operator in relation to the maintenance and safety of service apparatus.

"Based on the available evidence and existing legislation, Energy*Safety* will not be taking any legal action," Mr Bowron said.

"The clear finding of the report is that the pole failed because it was rotten and had been infested by termites," Mr Bowron said. "In hardwood poles such as jarrah, this is very hard to assess because the rot is usually internal and below ground level.

"Therefore, the age of the pole is the best guide. Poles older than 25 years are at the end of their service life and could be unsafe."

Owners of private power poles and lines have a duty of care to maintain their electrical assets, and are urged to have them inspected by a licensed electrical contractor.

Lyme Disease Association of Australia

Australia's peak advocacy association for tick-borne diseases The LDAA's mission is to:

- Advocate for individuals and families living with Lyme disease;
- Gather support to educate and lobby governments, doctors and local communities;
- Act as a conduit between international developments, treatments and other Lyme communities; and
- Fundraise to facilitate improvements for people living with Lyme disease.

Release of Australian Lyme disease patients and tick bite location maps



The exact number of people with Lyme disease in Australia is unknown as public health officials do not collect any data because the disease is not notifiable.

The Lyme Disease Association of Australia decided to remedy the situation. Part of which includes an <u>interactive</u> <u>map</u> as part of our broader <u>program of works</u>.

There are two maps;

The first plots individuals with an officially confirmed cases of Lyme disease by residential suburb, while the second is of tick bite locations that have resulted in an individual contracting Lyme disease.

The maps provide a cumulative representation of the data obtained through our surveys from 2011 onwards.

Small landholder news Small Landholder Information Service



Summer is definitely here and so is the New Year! Have you been considering all the things that need doing, or that you would like to do, around your property? Make a list and decide what is achievable for 2015.

By making a list, and setting a deadline, you can start to tick off the items you complete as you go. This can be great motivation to keep the ball rolling and achieve what you set out to at the beginning of the year.

Now is a good time to undertake any maintenance on your earthworks (contour banks, dams, etc.) before the first winter rains.

Monitor pasture quantity and quality if you have stock grazing. Supplementary feeding may be required in many areas.

It is important to monitor ground cover, if it falls below 50% coverage then there is an increased risk of soil erosion by wind and heavy rain. Options for reducing wind erosion for this season are limited, stock should be moved out of paddocks which have eroded areas to prevent the problem from getting worse.

Sheep owners will need to make sure they have supplies of sky blue ear tags for lambs born in 2015.

The dusty conditions, flies and bright sunlight that come with the summer months and physical irritation can cause pinkeye in sheep and cattle. Pinkeye is a bacterial infection that can cause blindness. If you are concerned and think your stock may have pinkeye contact your local vet.

For those irrigating crops, ensure irrigation is adequate to reduce plant stress.

In the south-west, now is the time to pick figs, beans, capsicums, cucumbers, eggplant, grapes, melons, passionfruit, pumpkins, stone fruit, tomatoes and avocados.

Maturing crops of cucumbers, melons, pumpkins, squash and zucchini may be affected by powdery mildew disease, which is seen as a white deposit under the leaves. Preventative sprays are available, contact your local rural supply store.

If you have declared weeds on your property now is a good time to plan for controlling winter growing weeds. One method of being able to monitor the success of your weed control is to map infested areas or take regular photographs.

Dangerous solar dc isolating switches (NHP brand)

Energy *Safety* has issued a public warning about dangerous switches used in some solar systems installed between July 2013 and 10th October 2014.

Director of Energy Safety Ken Bowron said today the switches formed part of solar photo-voltaic installations.

"They are used to disconnect the current produced by solar panels so electricians can work safely on the electrical installation of a home or business," Mr Bowron said.

"The switches listed below are faulty and the supplier has voluntarily agreed with ACCC to do a recall of their products".

The defective brand and models are:

All NHP dc Solar Isolator Switches type KDA-432 and KDM-432

"The defective switches were sold between July 2013 and 10th October 2014," Mr Bowron said. "It is important that anyone who had a solar system installed between these dates checks if any of the defective switches have been fitted to the installation."

What do they look like?

Some solar installations will have two of these switches: one on the roof near the solar panels and another mounted close to the inverter which converts the solar direct current into the normal 240 Volt alternating current used in premises. This second switch and inverter are usually wall-mounted near the building's main switchboard.

"If you have these switches installed, you should shut down the solar system immediately by following the shut-down procedure appearing on a label in the main switchboard or mounted near the inverter" Mr Bowron said.

"If you are unsure or cannot identify the types of isolators you have, check your operating manual or invoice. If you are still unsure, contact the company that sold the solar system for further advice".

You do not need an electrician to shut the system down. However, you should seek assistance from the solar company if you are unsure of how to carry out the shut-down procedure safely. The system will only be electrically safe once it is shut down.

"Above all, do not attempt to get up on your roof to check the switch there," Mr Bowron cautioned. "There is no need to do this.

"If you have identified such switches within your solar installations, please contact the electrical contractor or solar company who performed the installation to organise the replacement of the switch".



The year 2014 has been one of the busiest since we started this service some 19 years ago.

COMMUNITY INFORMATION Welfare and Centrelink

There has been radical changes to benefits; such as who qualifies, disability pension criteria, youth allowance, zero tolerance interview system, hidden camera investigations, what constitutes Centrelink fraud and the list gets bigger by the week. When it comes to new methods to target the needy in the community as depicted in most TV channels as recent as December 2014 and January 2015.

Disability Pensioners

The Minister for Welfare has made it very clear that he would like to see ALL Disability Support Pensioners do/perform some type of work; i.e. even a few hours per day.

TV reports: A huge crackdown on welfare recipients: in the last quarter end September 2014.between 230,000 and 300,000 benefits were either cancelled or suspended. The investigators are using high tech IT equipment plus according to Centrelink ĆEO, they use a sophisticated method of inter cross referencing between ALL government departments, as well as hidden cameras.

These methods used, as shown on TV: disability pensioners, claiming benefits, stating that they were unable to work, but pictures shown that some were fit and able to work in heavy lifting jobs, other held three jobs, three separate bank accounts. Other recipients, who were on the disability pension for years, earned between \$30,000 and \$300,000 in Centrelink CEO when total. questioned about this stated "some recipients have paid some of the money back to Centrelink, even so we treat this as fraud, even if all the monies are paid back, they will still have to face a prison sentence".

My comments: Some of the hidden cameras captured almost every move that some of the recipients made, such as: walking to Centrelink offices, drawing and depositing monies into different





banks, driving cars and so on. Centrelink are within their rights under the Federal Welfare Act, insisting that they are only doing their job.

Over the years a large number of recipients, who have lost benefits have faced financial hardship and serious financial problems, some in Beverley almost losing their homes.

Hardship provision: 1. Tell Centrelink your problem. 2. Inform your lenders and other creditors. At this stage you may and will need legal advice, some and see me and I will assist, through a Community Legal Service and this will help sort out calls from creditors and a visit from the Bailiff.

Family Court/Children Matters: For

some 3 months I have been rather busy helping applicants in seeking legal advice, as to how to interpret the affidavit submission procedures. The wordings must be set out clearly in the proper format as and when children are part of the affidavit, due care and diligence must be taken when filling in each page. Recently a document had to be re-sworn 3 times, as in each case by the judge wanted. The running hand or slap/dash method will not be accepted by the courts. Ensure that you print clearly and make your request known to the court, especially when it comes to: Children/custody, visitation rights, custody time/extension, and any mutual change has to be ratified by the Family Court Judge.

When an applicant comes to me and is unsure of their legal right, I usually phone a solicitor in their presence and then put the applicant on to the phone.

Car Dash Cameras: The police state that they provide indisputable evidence. The micro chip can be taken out and given to the police, in the matter of accidents, or when asked for. I have checked with the police as to the fitting and the dash camera and the 2 dangling wires must not obstruct the driver's view at any time.
