President Report

July 2015

Beverley Industrial Land

Council continues to alternate between optimism and frustration regarding the long awaited and much needed development of industrial land in Beverley. Regular contact is maintained with the Department of Lands, Landcorp is ready to proceed when given the go-ahead, and a further delay is being followed up through the office of the Hon Mia Davies MLA.

2015/16 Budget

The Shires 2015/16 budget is nearing completion with Council aiming for review and adoption in July.

Corella Control

The Shire of Beverley has a license for the control of little and long billed corellas in the town. This will involve shooting at different times during the next few months by delegated registered individuals.

Town Signs

Work has commenced to install the updated Visitor Information Bay signage near the Dead Finish Museum. The Town Entry Statements have arrived in town and are due to be installed in the near future, subject to main Roads endorsement of their location, which has been pending for many months.

Footpath Planning

Information is being collected regarding location, lengths, widths and condition of current town footpaths. Data will be collated into a Path Maintenance and Replacement Programme in the same manner as the Shire has a 10 Year Road Programme. This will assist at budget time and would also support grant applications to improve the age friendliness of our communities as is being considered by the Beverley, Brookon and Pingelly Aged Support and Care Alliance.

RV Friendly

Council has resolved to submit an application to become an RV Friendly Town and nominate Apex Park as a maximum 48 hour stopover location. It is proposed to include a donation box at the site and request visitor details. The process to become designated as RV Friendly takes approximately 4 – 6 weeks. Council has requested that a complete review of this proposal be undertaken in June 2016.

Mens Shed Painting Project

Thank you to the Beverley Mens Shed who have taken up the challenge to paint the building where the Community Bus is kept (next door to the Mens Shed). Their assistance is greatly appreciated!

Monjerducking Catchment Group Funds reclaimed

Thanks to the efforts of Wayne and Heather Kendrick, funds from the former Monjerducking Catchment Group which had been sitting idle as “unclaimed moneys” have been reclaimed and forwarded to the Shire of Beverley. Council was receptive to a suggestion that the funds be used for future rehabilitation of County Peak, linking in with the Shire’s Trails Masterplan.

“Bulldozing the Avon” Presentation to Council

Following Council’s June meeting local author Mr Fred Bremner presented two signed copies of his most recent production “Bulldozing the Avon”. These will be kept in the Town Library.

July Already!

It’s somewhat hard to believe we are into the second half of 2015. The recent rain was much needed by everyone, particularly the agricultural industry. Hopefully this will continue for a favourable season and frost does not become the crippling factor for that to be achieved.

Compulsory Microchipping for ALL DOGS as of 01 November 2015

The Shire of Beverley has received notice from the Department of Local Government and Communities that from 01 November 2015 it is compulsory for all dogs to be microchipped.

Amendments to the *Dog Act 1976* made in November 2013 provided that from 01 November 2015 the owner of a dog that has reached 3 months of age must ensure the dog is microchipped.

A dog is exempt from the microchipping requirement if a veterinarian issues a certificate stating that the implantation of a microchip may adversely affect the health and welfare of the dog. The certificate cannot apply in respect of a dog that is under three months of age.

When a person registers their dog, they will be required to provide proof that the dog has been microchipped by providing their local government with the microchip number.

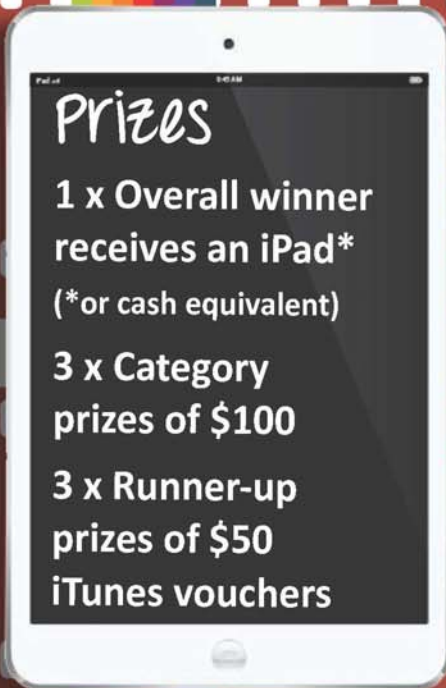

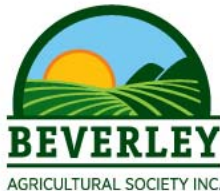

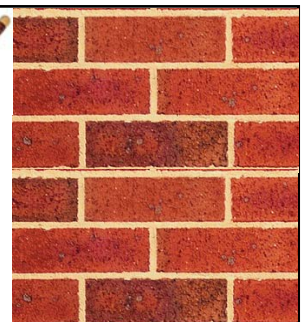

The challenge reflects those often faced by the RFDS as they assist those in remote areas during medical emergencies, and also as they go above and beyond in their daily delivery of health, family and community support. Despite growing demand for services, Federal Government funding has remained largely unchanged since 2006.

Our team, (*Team ATOM*), is registered to participate in this year's race and aims to raise \$20,000 by the conclusion of the event in September 2015.

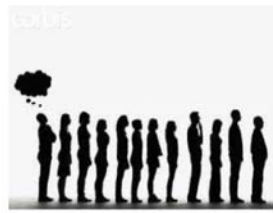

About HACC

The HACC Service is part of the Beverley Health Service Multi Purpose Service (MPS), in which the Commonwealth funding for residential aged care, HACC and State health care funding have been combined with the aim of providing flexible health services to meet the health needs of the local community.

Who can access services

The HACC target population comprises of persons living in the community who, in the absence of basic maintenance and support services, are at risk of premature or inappropriate long-term residential care, including:

- (i) older and frail persons, with moderate, severe or profound disabilities;
- (ii) younger persons with moderate, severe or profound disabilities; and
- (iii) their carers.

HACC service provided

- ❖ Meals on Wheels
- ❖ Home Help
- ❖ Home Maintenance
- ❖ Day Centre
- ❖ In- Home Respite care
- ❖ Local Transport

If you are in need of any of the above services, please contact Beverley Health Service 9646 3200 or the HACC Coordinator 9646 3213 to arrange a visit by a regional assessor who will determine your eligibility.

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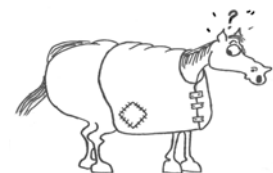

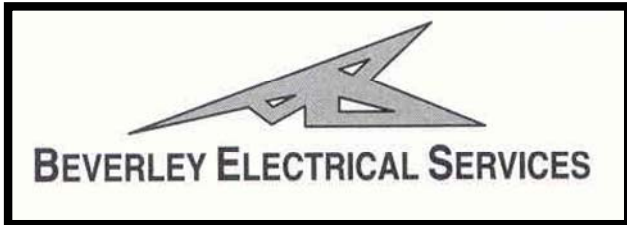

Beverley Garden and Tree Society

Sixteen members gathered at the CWA rooms for our June meeting and enjoyed the wood stove which we lit to heat up our casserole lunch.

We also had a bring and buy and what a many and varied things there were for us to buy. Plants, vegies, succulents, preserves, pie melons (which were grabbed up as we remembered our mothers making melon and ginger jam) and cakes.

We spent some time discussing the Rose Show and are looking forward to combining with the CRC and the RSL to keep this popular show as part of our year's calendar.

A lot of fun was had discussing the show and the theme of 'Sustainability'.

We are still waiting for decent rain to kick our gardens along but there are things to do while we wait. Remember to feed your citrus and remove any fruit which is diseased and cook it in a plastic bag to stop it spreading. Many mandarin tree owners have reported fruit fly so be vigilant.

Sometimes the garden can be a disappointment and no matter what we do the results are less than we expect. We need to remember to add trace elements a few times a year and doing soil tests can help a lot .

Poppy seeds and everlasting can still be planted. Just rake them in and water well and off they will go. Vegetable seeds like cabbage, cauliflower, kale can still go in and the seedlings available like leeks, onions, broccoli.

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Juices versus Smoothies

Juice is basically a smoothie with the fibre removed. This means that fresh green juices are an opportunity to seriously load up on nutrients, at much higher densities than with smoothies (and I really mean it... you will load up!) that's because you can only drink so much, and with a smoothie, the fibre adds volume that fills you up using a fraction of the produce that your stomach can hold if you removed the fibre and drank it as juice. So the question is which one is better, smoothies or juices, and the answer to this is "both" have their place in a raw way. I am not referring here to orange juice, pineapple, carrot or beetroot juices. Those are all fine for what they are (liquid desserts, basically), but today I am writing about juice and smoothies as a way to add a daily megadoses of pure liquid vitality that is almost magical, due to high nutrient density and chlorophyll, stemming primarily from the heavy use of greens and vegetables. The reason that not all juices are equal is that there are some juice recipes which have a high fruit content (same for smoothies), which isn't always the healthiest route to go. Don't get me wrong, I am a fan of "whole" fresh fruit and vegetables by chewing them which is necessary for our teeth and digestion too. Organic fresh-pressed green juices rarely need any fruit because using cucumbers and celery in them mellows out any bitterness or intensity from dark greens. As for green smoothies, I am more liberal with the fruit and I'll usually include 2 pieces or sometimes one piece fruit and a small carrot plus greens, water and any other nutrient-dense additions I feel like adding, such as protein powder, cacao nibs, and herbs. Sea vegetables such as kelp or dulse flakes are nice to add to smoothies to, there are heaps of ways to make a smoothie tasty and if you are hungry there is no better way as to make a smoothie. We all know fibre is important. Fibre plays a vital role in health. That's precisely why I opt to have both green juices and green smoothies in my life. While I see green juice as a powerful nutrient-dense elixir that is healing, energizing and massively health promoting, I see green smoothies as satiating, grounding and colon-cleansing (from the fibre). But if I had to choose one or the other perhaps because you are just starting out and only want to buy one machine for your kitchen at a time... I would go more for a green juice than a green smoothie. However, there a couple of considerations that will help guide you in picking which to start with. First, if you are in need of a way to quickly and dramatically improve your health, perhaps because you are fighting disease, then I would go with green juice, hands down. On the other hand, if you are simply looking for more healthy options in your life, you are not in ill health, and you are a cheerleader for the mantra that 'prevention is hot', then smoothies are a great way to start. Or, if you are looking to get more nutrition in your life, but you don't want to spend a lot of money on the produce, then consider green smoothies. Or if you are looking to add health to your life while taking very little time out of your day, green smoothies are much faster and easier than juicing. If you would like to lose weight, the fibre in smoothies makes them very filling as a super healthy, low-calorie meal replacement. And finally, there's the equipment cost. Smoothies require only a blender. A quality high-speed blender such as a Vitamix (which is my favourite) will save time but is on the expensive side, however in theory any blender will do.

Average blenders cost less than juicers and can be used for a lot of things in the kitchen beyond making smoothies. Juicers, in contrast, are more complicated machines and tend to cost more and are usually used only for juicing. It's worth repeating: I think having both machines and drinking both juice and smoothies is the ideal way to go. They really do different things for different purposes, and both are important.

How do you get green smoothies to be thick and creamy?

Creamy smoothies mean extra content (more protein, fibre, carbs, etc.). This makes creamy green smoothies a great replacement for meals or post-workout drinks. Without further adieu, check out four of my favourite cream boosting tips:

Use fruits with soluble fibre. Soluble fibre makes your stomach feel full. It attracts water and forms a gel-like consistency, which helps to slow and regulate the digestive system making you less hungry. Here are some fruits that are high in soluble fibre and can thicken up a smoothie quick:

- ☺ Bananas frozen or fresh are great (I keep overripe bananas, peeled and chopped up, in the freezer), Avocados, Mangos, ripe Pears, and Peaches.
- ☺ Frozen fruit helps thicken and chill our green smoothies.
- ☺ Use a creamy liquid-base such as Almond Milk, Coconut Milk, Rice milk or any other Nuts. Nut butter is great too as long as its salt less.
- ☺ Add chia seeds. Chia seeds have tons of nutritional value and they also do a great job of boosting the cream factor. Soaking the chia seeds for 10 minutes before blending makes it a thick creamy gel. The benefit on chia seed will be explained in my section "Super food" because that's where they belong to.

Add your liquid.

The first thing to add into your blender is the liquid, which is usually around 1 to 2 cups. Keep in mind the more liquid you add, the more watery or runnier your smoothie will be. If you prefer a thicker consistency, use slightly less liquid. Liquids to use are filtered water or real spring water (no tap water please), nut milk, coconut milk or water, fruit juices, green or black tea, fermented liquid such as rejuvelac or kefir.

Add your base

The base is what will provide a creamy smoothie texture. Think of it as the body of your smoothie. Many smoothie recipes call for a banana or two. They are a terrific base and provide your smoothie with a nice creaminess and sweet taste. Overripe bananas are great to use up. Other fruits mentioned in my article will also do the trick. Water rich fruits like watermelon and pineapple won't give you that creamy smoothie consistency. Adding ice is a quick and easy way to thicken a smoothie full of water laden fruits.

Add fruits and/or Vegetables

Now that you have got your liquid and base ready, it is time to add the fruits and/or vegetables. This is also a great time to experiment, get creative, and have fun exploring the various combinations. If you are making a green smoothie with the likes of spinach, kale, beet greens, dandelion greens, arugula, or lettuce, you may want to cut the greens into smaller pieces depending on the power of your blender. You also may want to add the greens into your blender last, after adding any optional add-ons.

Optional Add-ons This is where you can really take your smoothie to the next level of nutrition and tastiness, and have lots of fun doing so. Many of the add-ons below can be incorporated into a number of recipes. After some different approaches you will intuitively know which add-ons to use in which recipes. Add-ons such as Nutritional Yeast, Kelp, Macca,

Quinoa, Wheat grass or Spirulina, Hemp Seed.

Sweeteners

Most smoothie recipes include enough sweet fruit to bypass a sweetener but if not, there is always honey, stevia, maple syrup and dates. Sweeteners such as agave nectar or Xylitol are very controversial so you better stick with honey or extra fruits.

Salt

A dash of a high quality salt will increase the minerals and improve the taste of your smoothie. I prefer Celtic sea salt or pink Himalayan salt. There are a plethora of good salts to choose from just make sure to avoid white table salt, there is too much fake in it to be nutritional.

Spices

You can also adjust the taste and healthiness of your smoothie by using common spices. Cinnamon, vanilla, ginger, nutmeg and cayenne are a few of my favourites.

Protein powder

If you are making an after workout smoothie or simply looking to get more protein into your diet, add a high quality protein powder. My very favourite is a good hemp protein powder. This is available in organic form and I also use hemp seeds for making milk.

Super foods*

There are an abundance of superfoods available to boost the nutrition of your smoothie such as raw cacao (not cocoa), macca, flax seeds, Goji berries, Spirulina, coconut products (oil, shreds, flakes, meat), bee pollen, acai powder and juice, aloe vera.

Blend it up

Now that you have added all your lovely ingredients into your blender, it's show time.

Add some ice cubes to keep the whole thing cold. Depending on your blender and smoothie ingredients, you may need to start out on a low setting or pulse before getting up to top blending speed. Some fancy blenders even come with a handy smoothie button for extra easy smoothie making. I like to blend my smoothies until the liquid is fully circulating within the blender for about 5 seconds. Total blend time is usually between 30 – 60 seconds depending on the ingredients. It may take you a few stop and goes to get the thing moving. You will soon get the hand of it and soon you will be an expert too. Blending is like riding a bike, once you have learned it you will not forget.

Recipe Corner - Happy blending

Tip for making any smoothies. The base is always liquid. You can use good filtered water, rejuvelac or what I always have at hand is green tea. I brew green tea in larger amounts say 3-4 cups, fill it in a bottle and keep it in the fridge. I use it most of the time as a base for all my smoothies. Green Tea one of the healthiest teas on Earth. I will go into it some time later.

Love Your Heart Smoothie

This simple and delicious smoothie is packed with healthy nutrients.

- ¼ cup water or cold green tea
- Juice of one lemon
- 1 cup spinach leaves
- ¼ cup mint
- 1 cm fresh ginger root
- 1 medium beetroot (skin on, cut into quarters)
- 1 apple (skin on, cut into quarters)
- 1 carrot (skin on, cut in half)
- 1 cup ice cubes

Place all ingredients into the Vitamix container or in your high powered blender in the order listed and secure lid. Start on low, increase speed until you reach highest setting. Process for 30 seconds on high speed (not longer). Drain in milk bag squeezing out all the liquid, drink straightaway.

Good Morning Green Smoothie

- ½ cup water, cold green tea or rejuvelac
- 1 cup green grapes
- ¼ cup cucumber
- ½ kiwi peeled
- ½ medium apple seeded
- ¾ cup broccoli
- ½ inch slice lemon peeled
- 1 cup ice cubes

Place all in your high speed blender, increase speed as you go to highest position, and blend for about 1 minute.

Smoothie Combination:

- Beetroot – Carrot – Ginger – Apple (red)
- Kale – Parsley – Carrot – Apple
- Beetroot – Carrot – Celery - Cucumber

Triple Berry Smoothie

With their high levels of antioxidants, vitamins and minerals, berries have been linked to all kinds of health benefits, including heart health, enhanced brain function and improved eyesight.

- 1 ½ cup water, cold green tea or rejuvelac*
 - ½ cup vanilla low-fat yogurt
 - ½ cup red grapes
 - ½ cup each frozen berries (strawberries, blueberries, raspberries)
- Place all ingredients into blender, increase speed until you reach highest setting, blend for 1 minute or until desired consistency is reached, using the tamper to press the ingredients into the blades. You don't need to add ice cubes if the berries are frozen.

*Rejuvelac is a fermented drink. I will cover this topic at a later stage.

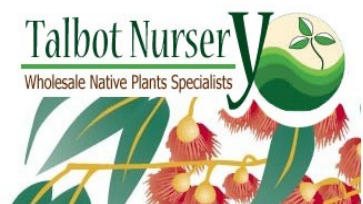

Small landholder news

At this time of year plants will start to slow down but there is still plenty to do around your property.

If you are intending on doing any grafting later in the year collect dormant wood from stone or pome fruit and store in a cool room/fridge, wrapped in damp paper sealed in a plastic bag, until spring.

Monitor stock for a drop in condition as cold weather sets in. You may need to increase roughage supplement as cold slows pasture growth. Livestock need to have enough food to ensure that they can maintain their body temperature.

Your animals will also require shelter. If you have manmade shelters for your animals check after rain events to ensure that they are not excessively muddy or waterlogged. Shelters which remain wet for long periods after rain can cause problems for animal's hooves. Consider improving the facilities for next season and if significant works are required, put in temporary measures.

Pretty but poisonous and harmful; the three prime targets which need to be controlled now before they develop flowers and seed heads are cape tulip, Paterson's curse and arum lily. For information on control methods and management strategies visit the Department of Agriculture and Food website agric.wa.gov.au.

An updated version of the Department of Agriculture and Food's 'The Land is in your Hands' is now available electronically for property owners looking for information on managing their property more sustainably. For a copy of the revised document contact the Small Landholder Information Service small.landholder@agric.wa.gov.au.

Don't forget to rotate the different families of vegetables in your vegetable patch e.g. brassicas, legumes etc. This practice will maximise yield by minimising pests and diseases, reduce chemical use and manage nutrient requirements. Continue planting beetroot, broccoli/cabbage/cauliflower family, carrots, celery, lettuce, peas and parsnips. Last plantings of potatoes and strawberries.

If you are getting low on fire wood and you harvest your own remember to keep yourself safe by: wearing the appropriate PPE, never operating a chainsaw alone, considering the tree (you don't want it to move unexpectedly) and don't overdo it. Cutting and stacking wood can be tiring so take breaks and get someone to give you a hand. Store wood out of the weather so that it can dry out if damp.

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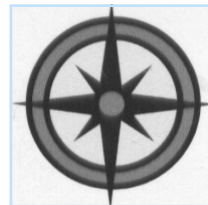
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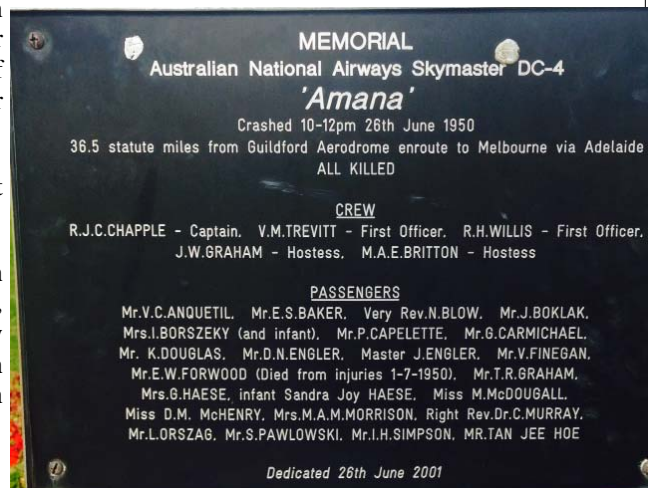
65th Anniversary of the 'Amana'

On Friday 26th June 2015, flowers were laid at the 'Amana' memorial site in front of the Aeronautical Museum on Vincent Street, to mark the 65th anniversary of one of WA's worst air disasters.

The Douglas DC-4 Skymaster aircraft departed from Perth, Western Australia for an 8 hour flight to Adelaide. It crashed 18 minutes after take-off, 32 nautical miles (59 km) from Perth Airport. All but one of the 29 occupants were killed in the accident and the sole survivor died six days later.

It has been a long standing tradition in the Beverley community that 29 flowers are laid at this site on the anniversary of the crash.

Mr Peter Chapple (son of the Captain of the Amana) bought both sons James and Rob from the Eastern States to see the crash site, located 19kms NW of York with Roma Patton and Shorty McNamara. The family members visited Beverley on Thursday 25th June and looked through the Aeronautical Museum and then on Friday 26th June laid flowers at the Amana wheel.

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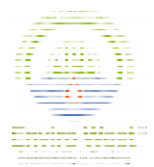

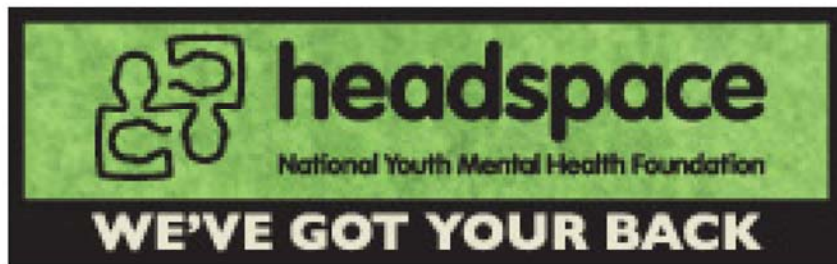

Myths about Lyme Disease in Australia

There are a variety of myths in circulation regarding Lyme disease in Australia. Below is a list of the most common myths along with an explanation to assist in dispelling such. There is no Lyme disease in Australia - FALSE. This is **false**. The misconception that Lyme disease does not exist in Australia is based on a study in 1994 by Russell and Doggett. There were numerous problems with this study and its methodology, which are the focus of an upcoming article in the Medical Journal of Australia. By contrast Willis was able to identify the bacteria that causes Lyme Disease in Australian ticks in 1995. In addition to this [Carly and Pope found an Australian strain of Borrelia, Borrelia Queenslandica in 1962. A 1959 study by Mackerras isolated Borrelia on Australian fauna](#) – kangaroos, wallabies and bandicoots, this was also omitted. Adding to this is the fact that a large number of diagnosed Lyme Disease patients in Australia have never travelled out of Australia. More study desperately needs to be done on Lyme Disease in Australia.

Putting Methylated Spirits, Vaseline or Ether on a tick will help remove it - FALSE

This is **false and dangerous**. It is vital that nothing is added to the tick and that the tick is not squeezed or it will inject its host with the disease ridden contents of its stomach. [Please visit our tick removal section for the correct removal process.](#)

The tick that causes Lyme disease is not in Australia - FALSE

This is **false**. This assumption is based on the false understanding that only deer ticks can transmit Lyme Disease – this has been proven to be false for many years in the USA and Europe, where there are numerous ticks that transmit Lyme Disease – some of which are in Australia. The main tick areas in Australia are outlined on [the Karl McManus Foundation website](#).

Lyme disease cannot be transmitted from one person to another - FALSE

This is **false**. Lyme disease has been found in stillborn babies who's mother was infected with Lyme disease (see [here](#) for numerous citations). There are a growing number of children in Australia diagnosed with Lyme disease who have never travelled out of Australia and who's mother has Lyme disease. Syphilis and Lyme disease have similar etiologic, clinical, and epidemiologic characteristics (and both are caused by spirochete bacteria).

Because Syphilis can be transmitted sexually there is a theory that Lyme disease can also be transmitted sexually (backed up by the fact that the bacteria that [causes Lyme disease has been found in semen and vaginal secretions](#)). More study needs to be done on the sexual transmission of Lyme disease, which is currently a controversial diagnosis.

Lyme disease testing is 100% reliable - FALSE

This is **false**. Testing for Lyme Disease is not currently reliable, and so the diagnosis of Lyme disease is a clinical diagnosis based on medical history and clinical symptoms. The testing is unreliable for two reasons – firstly the bacteria that causes Lyme Disease often does not reside in the blood but in tissues, heart, nervous system, in collagen and in joints, which makes it very difficult to isolate during a blood test. Secondly, testing

for an immune response to the Lyme Disease bacteria is hampered by the fact that the Lyme Disease bacteria directly suppresses the immune system and the production of antibodies against the bacteria. This means that there is a high level of false negative blood test results for Lyme Disease. The consequences of this fact are that a negative result for a blood test for Lyme Disease is not proof that a patient does not have Lyme Disease, rather that their immune system has not been able to mount an adequate defence against the infection. Anecdotally it has been found that the sicker a patient is with Lyme Disease, the higher the chance that they will receive a negative blood test – sometimes after successful treatment of the Lyme Disease and resolution of symptoms, the blood test will come back positive, when it was previously negative. Adding to this is the fact that the testing for Lyme Disease in Australia is very unreliable – [most Lyme Disease patients send their blood to the USA or Germany for testing](#).

Two tier testing of Lyme disease is accurate - FALSE

This is **false**. "The step 1 tests are insufficiently sensitive to be used as "screening" tests. [Trevejo R, JID 1999; 179:931–8.] Western blots, increase specificity but, following a step 1 test, further decrease overall sensitivity. The bands included in the Western blot interpretation schemes were chosen on a statistical, rather than a clinical, basis.[Dressler F. JID 1993; 167:392-400.] Recently, the C6 peptide ELISA alone was proposed as an alternative to the two-tier approach. Unfortunately, the C6 ELISA also lacks adequate sensitivity for clinical use.[Bacon R. J Infect Dis 2003; 187:1187- 99]." (quoted from the ILADS website – we couldn't explain it better ourselves).

If you have a negative Lyme disease blood test, you don't have Lyme disease - FALSE

This is **false**. Lyme Disease is a clinical diagnosis based on medical history and clinical symptomology. Please see above regarding testing – you can also see [here](#) for more information.

Lyme disease is rare in Australia - FALSE

This is **false**. Lyme Disease diagnosis is not common, but Lyme disease itself appears to be grossly under diagnosed in Australia and there are at least 15,000 people with Lyme Disease diagnoses in Australia (and conservative estimates suggest another 200,000 undiagnosed people) – this does not make it rare, especially when most Dr's are not trained in diagnosing or treating Lyme disease. Lyme Disease is often misdiagnosed as MS, Motor Neurone Disease, Parkinson's Disease, Lupus, Alzheimer's Disease, Fibromyalgia, Chronic Fatigue, and numerous psychiatric illnesses. Because the symptoms of Lyme Disease are unique to each person and because so many body systems can be involved it is a difficult disease to diagnose without specific training. For a more complete listing of symptoms of Lyme Disease, please see [here](#). More research into the extent of Lyme disease in Australia needs to be done.

A one off dose of Doxycycline after a tick bite can prevent you contracting Lyme disease - FALSE

This is **false and dangerous**. As it increases the chance of you going on to have long term Lyme Disease – at least 28 days of specific antibiotics are required to lower the chances of contracting Lyme Disease. Treatment of acute or chronic

Lyme Disease requires treatment for much longer.

Everyone gets the Lyme disease rash - FALSE

This is **false**. Only 35% of people with Lyme Disease get the classic bulls-eye rash.

If you didn't get bitten by a tick you can't have Lyme disease - FALSE

This is **false**. Only 30% of people who are diagnosed with Lyme Disease remember a tick bite. The tick injects local anesthetic into your skin before it bites you, so that it may stay attached longer. This means that most people don't remember the tick bite at all.

If you remove a tick within 36 hours it cannot give you Lyme disease - FALSE

This is **false**. At any time during the tick being attached it can regurgitate the infectious disease containing contents of its stomach into your blood stream. This is why removing the tick carefully is so important, as squeezing the tick has the same effect.

If you have Lyme disease, you just need 1 month of antibiotics and it is cured - after that it is Post Lyme Syndrome - FALSE

This is **false**. Lyme disease can affect every system in the body. Because it is a slow replicating bacteria it is also very difficult to kill. For this reason some people will be on antibiotics for up to 2.5 years (or longer), especially if they are very sick, have been sick for a long time or have neurological Lyme Disease. Lyme disease is treated until a period of time after all symptoms have resolved (to make sure that the majority of bacteria are killed) – stopping treatment prematurely dramatically increases the likelihood of a relapse, and a higher bacterial load than before treatment, which can prolong treatment even further.

There is only 1 type of Lyme disease - FALSE

This is **false**. There are 14 genospecies of *Borrelia burgdorferi sensu lato* (the bacteria that causes Lyme disease) – which includes *BB sensu stricto*. This diversity is thought to contribute to the antigenic variability of the spirochete and its ability to evade the immune system and antibiotic therapy, leading to chronic infection.

The only symptoms you get with Lyme disease is arthritis - FALSE

This is **false**. One symptom of Lyme Disease can be atypical arthritis, however, it is not the only symptom. A more [detailed symptom list is available here](#).

Lyme disease only gives physical symptoms- FALSE

This is **false**. The bacteria that cause Lyme disease can penetrate into the brain, they can cause numerous neurological and psychiatric symptoms in some patients – for more information, please see [here](#) (psychiatric Lyme disease treatment tools).

Lyme disease isn't that serious - FALSE

This is **false**. Lyme Disease (particularly neurological Lyme disease) can be fatal. [Visit the Karl McManus Foundation for Karl McManus's story.](#)

The Centres for Disease Control and Prevention's definition of Lyme disease misses a lot of Lyme disease patients- TRUE

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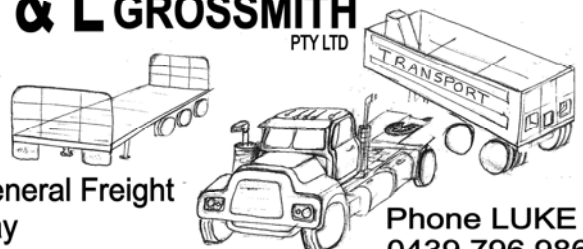

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Working with Warriors Understanding Anxiety

Anxiety is an umbrella term for feelings of fear, nervousness, apprehensiveness or worry such as negative thoughts and seeing potential threats where they don't exist.

Everybody gets anxious at times and some anxiety actually helps us to function well BUT anxiety can become a problem when:

- It happens too often;
- It goes on for a long time;
- it stops us from doing things that we want to do.

Symptoms can be *psychological* (feeling frequently worried, tired, irritable and weepy with difficulty concentrating) and/or *physical* (including rapid breathing, rising blood pressure and pounding heart, a sense of restlessness or feeling on edge, muscle tension, sleep disturbance and nausea/sickness).

There is no single cause for anxiety but there are several factors that may contribute to its development:

- *Brain Chemistry* - most strongly implicated here are imbalances of serotonin and dopamine that regulate thought and feeling - makes for feeling depressed and anxious;
- *Heredity* - anxiety disorders run in families. Children are at higher risk if parents have an anxiety disorder- learned behaviour;
- *Life Experiences* - any distressing or traumatic experience may be ground for the development of anxiety. Exhaustion and certain medications can also be triggers for anxiety;
- *Drug Use* - stimulant drugs like amphetamines and caffeine can trigger anxiety. Prolonged amphetamine use can cause feelings of panic and anxiety that last for years after the drug is stopped.

Some tips that may help you deal with your anxiety include:

- Self-awareness - identify the symptoms early. Ask yourself "what is making me feel this way?" You may be able to change the "anxiety-making circumstances" but if not you can deal with it better if you acknowledge it;
- Interpret it positively - anxious about a situation? Instead of viewing as threatening put a positive interpretation which will reduce the anxiety to a more manageable level;
- A little anxiety is a good thing - too much is damaging but too little can mean you may not perform to your best ability. View anxiety as a resource you can manage;
- Diet - the gut flora can get out of balance eg. use more probiotics and omega3 foods. Research has shown maintaining a balanced diet can reduce anxiety symptoms.
- Exercise boosts levels of vital brain chemicals like serotonin, dopamine and norepinephrine that may reduce stress and anxiety.
- Relaxation and meditation programs – can help reduce stress, anxiety and depression. You can find many resources for these online eg. progressive muscle relaxation.
- Therapy - there are some good programs that are offered by psychologists/counsellors that help to re-program those unhelpful and negative ways of thinking that underpins anxiety.

Situations, or life events, can come from many places including relationship issues, financial burden, physical health, trauma, or just dealing with difficult times. As these situations develop we need to take steps to reduce anxiety for ourselves and for those close to us. *Remember ...before it all gets too much... Talk to a Mate!*

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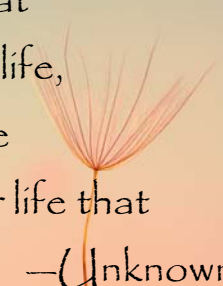

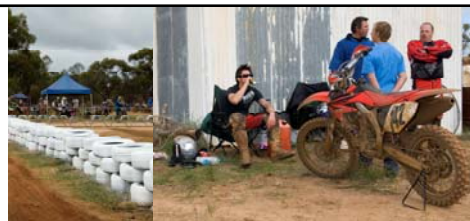
