

<u>Local Government Elections – Saturday 17th October 2015</u>

The Shire of Beverley received 6 nominations for 5 vacancies in the forthcoming Local Government elections. Since the close of nominations and draw of positions on the Ballot Pater one candidate has withdrawn. The Local Government Act 1995 states a candidate may only withdraw their nomination before the close of nominations and as this did not occur, the election must still continue and all six names are to appear on the ballot paper.

Essentially the Shire of Beverley must have an election, regardless of the fact there are now only 5 candidates available to fill the 5 vacancies. The requirement to continue the election also must be done with the ballot paper containing the 6 names, although one candidate has advised of their withdrawal. This is a frustrating situation which comes at a cost to rate payers.

A letter has been forwarded to the Minister for Local Government expressing Councils frustration at this absurd situation and wasted expense, particularly when the Minister has been critical in recent media of Local Government generally in relation to expenditure and rate increases.

Additionally, your vote is still needed to ensure a by-election is not required as could be the case without a clear indication from electors as to whom they would like to represent them!

Please cast your vote for the forthcoming Beverley Local Government election at the Shire office, early voting commences on Thursday 1st October during office hours and concludes at 6pm on Saturday 17th October. This is the first year all electors within the Shire of Beverley are entitled to vote for any candidate due to the removal of wards.

Cr Chris Pepper Retiring

Cr Chris Pepper will retire from Council as of the October 2015 Council elections. Chris commenced as a Beverley Shire Councillor in 2009 and has been Deputy Shire President for the past 4 years. His experience and background have proved invaluable to Council and his contribution much appreciated. We hope you do eventually get that caravan Chris and Pat and take some time out!

Successful Lotterywest Grant

Hon. Mia Davies MLA recently presented a cheque to the Shire following a successful application to Lotterywest for \$745,000 toward the Multipurpose Community Centre. An outcome to the Federal National Stronger Regions Fund round 2 application should be known by the end of the year.

Visitors to Beverley

The Shire has recently hosted an array of Local Government visitors: Local Government Managers Association (LGMA) board meeting with delegates attending from around the state; LGMA joint branch meeting for Wheatbelt representatives; Rick Mazza MLC who met informally with Council prior to the August Council meeting after a visit to Avondale and Beverley town tour; Central Country Zone (CCZ) meeting of which there are 16 regional Local Government members with delegates travelling from as far afield as Lake Grace, West Arthur, Dumbleyung and Kulin; West Australian Local Government Association (WALGA) State Councillors and staff for afternoon tea and a walk around the Avondale heritage precinct and a Beverley town tour on their way to Narrogin for a State Council Meeting and Regional Forum. The group included WALGA's new President Cr Lynne Craigie and CEO Ricky Burges. The recreation building and lessor hall were successfully used for the LGMA and CCZ meetings, and the Shire has received very favourable feedback in relation to its facilities and the hospitality provided to the various groups.

Strategic Community Plan

Council is currently undertaking a desktop review of the Strategic Community Plan as required by the legislated Integrated Planning Framework.

Town Hall Roof

Tenders for the Town Hall roof repair have been advertised, closing on 12th October.

Road Maintenance

The graders have been working on Potts, Northborne, Rickeys, Barrington, Glencoe, Gors, Bateman, Blackburn, St Jacks and Murray roads. Verge spraying has been undertaken in various sections of the shire.

BBP

The Beverley, Brookton and Pingelly (BBP) Aged Support and Care Alliance continue to meet and are currently investigating age friendly housing initiatives with a view for a similar project for the group. The respective Community Resource Centres are liaising to provide local RAC training for gopher owners and operators.

Draft Urban Design Proposal

Thankyou for feedback received to date on the draft urban design proposal relating to the area from Hunt Rd – Vincent St intersection to the Vincent St bridge. This is available on the Shire website, on display in the window at the Shire office and all main street businesses have been provided a copy. Please contact the Shire as soon as possible with your comments or if you require further information. A revised concept plan will be developed upon review of these submissions.

Since the close of nominations, one candidate has withdrawn their nomination, however due to the withdrawal being received after the allowed deadline, the *Local Government Act 1995* requires that the election still be held and the candidates name is still recorded on the Ballot Paper.

On 17 October 2015, there will no longer be wards in Beverley, so everyone on the electoral roll is entitled to one (1) vote.







Warriors Wellbeing Article What is Loss and Grief?

Grief is a universal, instinctual and an adaptive reaction to loss, in particular the grief from the loss of a loved one. Feelings of loss are very personal and only you know what is significant. Less obvious losses can also cause strong feelings of grief such as loss of possessions, job, relationship, health, or physical ability.

Loss is an inevitable part of life and grief is a natural part of the healing process that varies for different people. The grieving process allows those left behind after a death to accept the person is no longer around.

When experiencing and reacting to grief, it is common to:

- feel like you are "going crazy"
- have difficulty concentrating
- feel sad or depressed, anxious, nervous or fearful
- be irritable or angry (at the deceased, oneself, others)
- feel frustrated or misunderstood
- feel like you want to escape
- experience guilt or remorse
- be ambivalent, lack energy and motivation
- feel numb.

Each one of us has an individual style of coping with painful experiences (there is no right or wrong way). Some people don't show their grief in public but only express it in private. We don't always know how people are coping simply by what we see.

The following tips may help generate ideas about how to manage feelings of grief:

- talk to family, friends or a mate
- engage in social activities
- exercise, eat healthy foods
- take time to relax, listen to music
- seek counselling or join a support group
- be patient and let yourself feel grief.

The length of the grief process is different for everyone. It takes time to heal and this may not be just days it can be weeks, months and even years.

Grief comes in waves. When the ship is first wrecked, you're drowning, surrounded by wreckage reminding you of the ship that was and is no more, and all you can do is float. As you float you hang onto a piece of wreckage for a while in the form of a physical thing (a memory or photograph), it may even be another person floating with you, and for a while that's all you can do is float. In the beginning you had 100 metre waves crashing over you 10 seconds apart barely allowing you to breath. After a while (maybe weeks or months) the 100 metre waves still come crashing over you but they are now further apart allowing you to breathe and function without as much difficulty. There will be triggers of grief that will arise (a song, a place, a photo) and a wave will come crashing but in between there is life. Somewhere down the line (it is different for everybody) you will find the waves are only 80 or 50 metres, they still come but are further apart. You will be able to see them coming (special anniversary days) but now you can prepare yourself for the waves, knowing you will come out the other side, soaking wet, spluttering and still hanging onto a piece of wreckage but you will come out. Intermittent waves never stop coming and you don't really want them to but you will survive them.

If you feel you are not coping seek professional help from your GP or a counsellor.





Need ideas for your small property? During spring there are plenty of shows and field days to attend. If you have previously been to the Perth Royal Show and enjoyed learning about farming and agriculture a visit to one of the regional shows might be an experience well worth the travel.

As we head towards summer pastures will be starting to dry off and landholders considering buying in hay should be aware that this is a common way for weed species to spread. When feeding out hay over summer this often means that hay is spread across your property, spreading weed seeds with it.

Besides spreading weeds, weed seeds can get caught in your animals' coats, ears or eyes. Grass seeds that become lodged in ear, eye and mouth cavities can cause serious problems and pain. If you suspect that you animal might have a problem with a grass seed speak to your vet.

Continuing with weeds, summer weeds can rob subsequent crops of soil nitrogen and stored soil water. By identifying the summer growing weeds you are going to control on your property you can order supplies, book contractors and make a plan. Controlling these weeds early will conserve valuable soil nitrogen and moisture for use by the crop during the following season.

Regarding fresh produce, October is the ideal time for first plantings of basil, beans, capsicums, cucumbers, pumpkins, table tomatoes and sweet corn. If you are planting new crops into your vegetable garden don't forget to build up the soil so your vegetables have plenty of nutrients.

If you are irrigating ensure that your system is operational as plants will be vulnerable to heat stress if they are young or fruiting. Check system for leaks and blockages. If your system is a few year old consider taking the time to see if it is still operating as efficiently as it was when your first installed it.

Have you checked your water quality lately? Total dissolved solids (TDS) and salinity provide a guide to water quality, the concentration of calcium, magnesium, nitrate/nitrite and sulphate ions may also need monitoring especially if using ground water as they can cause purgative or toxic effects. Troughs should be regularly cleaned to ensure that salinity and algae growths do not become a problem.







Healthy Body – Healthy Mind

Make you own Nut Milk

Almost all raw nuts or seeds can be used for making milk except cashews. You can also use cooked grains such as rice, quinoa, millet, amaranth, buckwheat. Raw oats, shredded or desiccated coconut make tasty milk too.

Drinking cow's milk or not is a big guestion these days. Due to the extreme processes that milk goes through and the high amounts of antibiotics, hormones, and genetically-modified substances that cows are continually exposed to, I believe there are real and eminent concerns associated with drinking milk from cows. All cows release toxins through their milk, as milk is a natural exit-portal for substances that the body cannot use. The "ingredients" which are added to cow's Milk makes it a not very desirable drink. The claim that calcium is only available by drinking cow's milk is not true either. Cow's milk has a very high carbon footprint; it is neither the greenest or healthiest milk available. Milk consumption per capita has been on a steady march downward at a rate of 25% during the last 30 years according to research while alternatives like soy, almond and rice milk has averaged annual sales growth of 10.5 %. However there are many other sources where you get good quality calcium for your bones. There are other health issues associated with the white stuff, which range from dairy intolerance through to high cholesterol. Loaded with calories and heavy on the saturated fat, cow's milk certainly isn't the diet conscious choice for putting in your cuppa. Milk does have some health benefits though - calcium for example as mentioned before, but that aside, there are better choices that are both low in fat and good for the planet. There are great plant sources to get the calcium the body need such as collard green, broccoli, kale, bok choy, figs, oranges, sardines, canned salmon, white beans, tofu/soy beans, spinach, celery, kelp, blackstrap molasses, sesame seeds,

brazil nuts, almonds. However, if you like milk there is always the opportunity to make your own nut milk. Healthy substitutes are almonds, rice, soy, coconut, and hemp seeds (my favourite).

The ultimate powerful, dairy-free milk guide

Tools you need: Nut milk bag or cheesecloth, high speed blender, glass jars for storage.

- Basic steps for all: 1 cup organic unsalted nuts or seeds, pinch of salt, sweetener such as honey, dates or raisins (no sugar please), 3-4 cups of good filtered water (no tap water).
- ♦ Soak your seeds or nuts prior to making milk. Soaking is necessary to release enzyme inhibitors and improve nutrient digestion/assimilation.
- Do not use your soaking water for milk; all of your inhibitors are in there, so use fresh filtered water. Rinse soaked ingredients well.
- Blend on your highest setting until smooth.
- ◆ Strain using your nut milk bag or a cheesecloth, draped over a bowl or large glass, pour blended contents through fabric.

Squeeze from the top down gently all liquid out. Bottle it up, label it and keep in fridge. Milk will keep in fridge for 3-4 days.

Add-ins when blending are ¼ tsp vanilla extract, 2 tsp. raw honey or maple syrup, pinch of fine ground sea salt, dates pitted, pinch of cinnamon, cardamom or cacao. In general ½ cup of raw nuts or seeds and 2 cups pure filtered water makes wonderful smooth milk like drink. Nuts which need soaking are as follows:

Almonds, Pecans, Walnuts 8-12 hours, Brazil, Hazel Nuts, Macadamia and Pine Nuts don't need soaking, Sesame Seed unhulled 6-8, hulled Seeds no soaking, Sunflower Seeds 4-6, Pepitas (Pumpkin Kernels) 6-8.





Finding Prostate Cancer Early



Throughout the Wheatbelt Region of WA, the *Find Cancer Early* Campaign is urging people to pay attention to changes in their body and if they notice differences that may be symptoms of cancer, to tell their Doctor.


