#### Annual Electors Meeting – Monday 16th November

Thankyou to community members in attendance at the Annual Electors Meeting held on Monday 16<sup>th</sup> November where the 2014/2015 Annual Report was received. Minutes from the meeting are available on the Shire website or Shire office.

#### Meeting with Christian Porter MP

The Shire President, CEO and Community Development Officer recently met with Hon Christian Porter MP, Federal Member for Pearce, to provide an update on Shire of Beverley projects and initiatives. This included the Multipurpose Community Centre, Tourism Planning Framework, mainstreet revitalization concept, town walk-trail interpretation and aeronautical museum significance assessment. The topic of main street revitalization was surprisingly an area of particular interest to Minister Porter.

#### Strategic Community Plan 2013 - 2017

A desktop review of the Strategic Community Plan has been undertaken by Council and is available for public comment until 4<sup>th</sup> December 2015. Copies are available from the website or Shire office. A full review of the SCP is due to be undertaken in 2017.

#### Transwa Bus Stop Relocation

Council has supported relocation of the Transwa bus pick up and drop off point from Queen St to the Information Bay area. Several incidents have occurred where vehicles parked near the Queen St/ Vincent St intersection have blocked the Transwa bus from making a safe turn, this has included vehicle damage. Following a meeting between Shire and Transwa representatives, which included a "road test" in a bus, it was agreed to move the location to the southern entrance of the Information Bay area.

#### <u>Town Hall Roof</u>

Replacement of the town hall roof is well underway, and possibly even completed by the time you are reading this!

#### Railway Station

Completion of remediation works to the Railway Station building is a very welcome outcome that will enable this terrific community facility to soon be back in action. Exposed aggregate laid after removal of the gravel surround to keep water away from the building has added an interesting new touch to the area. #### <u>Citizenships</u>

You might be interested to know that since 2010 there have been 34 Australian Citizenships undertaken in Beverley over 12 citizenship ceremonies (held in the Shire Council Chambers). The majority of recipients have been Beverley residents at some stage, and many still live here. ### Water Harvest Project

For many years, water has been supplied to the public oval, parks and gardens and for public works from the Town Dam and the Waterhatch bore. To supplement this supply a project to construct two catchment dams within the townsite has been developed. The project involves using the already good system of kerb to kerb bitumised streets serviced by underground drainage to capture what would under normal circumstances drain into the Avon River. A fully lined basin at the east end of Edwards Street and a fully lined basin located on the vacant land (Lot 34) adjacent to Beverley District High School (site of BMX track) will be constructed to capture this runoff for a short period before being electrically pumped over several days to the Town Dam located on Hunt Road.

### Aerial inspection of the water pipeline

#### November- December 2015

#### **Unmanned Aerial Vehicle use in November**

During November – December the Water Corporation plans to carry out a number of aerial inspections of water mains in the Goldfields and Agricultural Region using an Unmanned Aerial Vehicle (UAV), also known as a drone, so we can better identify problems and support future improvements.

The UAV will fly at an approximate height of 60 metres, to photograph both sides of the pipe. It may photograph up to 15 metres on either side of the pipeline, most of which is rural land and roads. It has an electric motor so makes very little noise.

#### **Respecting your privacy**

Any identifiable personal information in these images will be obscured, and can be removed from the footage if requested. Images of private property can also be deleted on request. Our contact details are below if you would like to discuss privacy with us.

We have engaged a licenced UAV contractor, Altitude Imaging to carry out this work. Altitude Imaging is a member of the Association of Australian Certified UAV Operators (ACUO) and follows an Industry Code of Conduct.

## Are you a water self-supplier?

A self-supplier is a person not served by the scheme water system and who obtains their own domestic and/or livestock supply from rainfall tanks, bores or dams.

Low rainfall in 2015 in some areas has resulted in low run-off into water tanks, lack of flow to storage dams and reduced groundwater recharge.

Streamflow in many areas has also been significantly reduced.

Users reliant on all these sources for livestock and domestic water need to be aware of these changes.

- Do you have enough closed storage for house and garden needs?
- Have you got a current fire plan and enough water in storage?
- Have you reviewed and adjusted your business operations to match your water supply e.g introduced efficiencies, assessed stock water needs, reviewed feed requirements, etc?
- Have you made arrangements with water carters or let your local shire know if you are carting water more than 40km from your farm gate?

### Warriors Wellbeing Work/Life Balance – Strike it right!

How many times have we heard the phrase "getting the balance right"? What does this mean to you? If we look up the word "balance" in the dictionary (yes I still have the book version) we will find 18 definitions, depending of course on the context in which the word is to be used.

The context of a work/life balance also depends on individual circumstances and attitude; whether we are single or married, studying, self-employed, contracting, FIFO, caring for someone or raising a family.

Ask yourself "do I have my work/life in balance?" To assess this firstly identify the prominence of work in your situation. Does it challenge/drive you, is it enjoyment, a sense of satisfaction and/or purpose or is it just a means to an end (that is if we don't work we don't get paid, if we don't get paid we can't live the life we want or do the things we enjoy)? Is it a mix of both?

The "life" side of things for most of us is enjoying some form of interaction with other people. This can happen through our hobbies, sport, children, family, religious congregation, social/community groups, or by volunteering (ironically work can also be one of these).

The definition which (I think) is the best fit when considering "work/life balance" is to have these two areas "well-proportioned and harmonious".

Our work/life balance can be disrupted when we are under pressure, feeling distressed or even embarrassed by an event and as blokes we may then disengage from others and try to solve problems and deal with stressors alone. Unfortunately by doing this we remove ourselves from valuable support systems, which in turn creates and exacerbates feelings of loneliness and isolation.

Remember to maintain and re-engage with social opportunities as this is a significant part of positive mental health, coping and overall wellbeing. Something as simple as taking timeout, communicating (remember its part of the problem solving process), having a laugh with others (this may expose us to different ways of thinking of doing things) and even in busy times scheduling time to have that game of bowls, timeout with the kids or partner, is essential.

Having a busy life may lead us to feel that there is more to do than what seems reasonable in any given day. We all get equal measures of time, there is 24 hours in a day for everyone. Why then is it that for some of us 24 hours never seems enough, while others seem to have plenty of time? Perhaps we need to ask ourselves "is time the problem, or is it our ability to manage our time"? How much we have on our plate varies throughout the year, so we need to be aware to continually monitor our time to ensure that for the majority of the year we have a well-proportioned and harmonious work/life balance.



## **Specialised Learning Programs**





#### Lyme is an old disease, not a new disease.

Diagnosis of borreliosis relies on clinical symptoms, a history of a tick bite, though not always known. Confirmation with testing is often not possible. Borrelia – the bacteria that causes Lyme disease –is the only known bacteria with 21 or more plasmids, 12 linear and 9 are circular\*. These plasmids code for active genes, pseudogenes and phages (bacterial virus) which can be used for survival and assist with dissemination in the host. They can also assist in exchange of antibiotic resistant genes. This genetic variability decreases the reliability of diagnostic tests to confirm diagnosis.

\*To compare, *Staphylococcus aureus* – the bacterium that causes antibiotic resistant golden staph infection – has only one plasmid. So imagine the plasmid capability of Borrelia bacteria.

Borrelia also has the unique ability to release blebs which are fragments of DNA enclosed in a membrane that is pinched off from the bacteria. They may contain plasmid DNA incorporated into the genome by horizontal transfer. The role of blebs is not clear but they may contribute to the inflammatory response in the body and to tissue damage (MacDonald & Kuehn, 2012; Charon et al, 2009)

Borrelia can live in a symbiotic fashion in biofilm with other micro-organisms (<u>Sapi et al</u> 2012). Pathogen colonies living in biofilms can be resistant to antibiotics.

**Borrelia reproduces very slowly.** Borrelia infections are treated with antibiotics. For more information see <u>Current Treatments</u>. The common penicillin-based antibiotics (Beta-lactams) kill bacteria with a cell wall and when the bacteria are dividing. However, Borrelia has a slow reproduction time. Although we do not know the rate in host tissue (in vivo), in lab experiments (in vitro) it has been shown to divide once

every 24-48 hours (<u>Jutras et al</u>, 2013). This is unlike Streptococcus throat bacteria which reproduce every 20 minutes. Streptococcus bacteria need to be treated for 480 life cycles which equals 7 days of antibiotic treatment.

So, 480 life cycles of Borrelia would be close to 480 days.

In theory to treat Borrelia infection for 480 life cycles you may need to take antibiotics for 2.5 years in order to get the infection under control. The aim of antibiotic treatment is to decrease the bacterial load so that the immune system can control the infection. Therefore earlier Lyme and other tick borne infections are treated faster the recovery.

The treatment of neuroborreliosis is even more complicated as penetration into the central nervous system (CNS) by many antibiotics is limited, so the treatment time for neuroborreliosis would be more than 3 years. This is not unlike mycobacterium tuberculosis (TB) infection in the CNS where treatment involves more than 3 years of antibiotics. (It is believed that Trench Fever in WW1 was the same bacteria as Lyme). (With thanks to the Karl McManus Foundation for this text. #### New program for expectant parents arrives in the Wheatbelt

Expectant parents in the Wheatbelt now have access to a free program to help ease the transition into parenthood.

Towards Parenthood has been developed by The Parent-Infant Research Institute (PIRI) to prepare soon to be mothers and fathers for the emotional, social and psychological changes that may arise as they become parents.


Sarah Dixon, local Towards Parenthood coach, said that this program is unique. "The focus is not on the physical aspects of the pregnancy, delivery and postpartum but rather more broadly on assisting parents to manage the complex demands of parenthood."

The program has been brought to the Wheatbelt through a successful joint funding application by the Wheatbelt Mental Health Service, SIHI Maternal Health Project and Wheatbelt Population Health as part of the Wheatbelt Perinatal Project.

Towards Parenthood consists of a self-directed workbook, supported by optional weekly contact by trained coaches. Topics include: Towards motherhood, Towards fatherhood, We're expecting! Preparing for parenthood, Caring for yourself is caring for your baby, From lovers to parents: managing relationship changes, Keeping some balance in your life, Healthy thinking, health self, Caring for your newborn baby, and Welcome to 'The Club'!

The program has been assessed by PIRI through randomised control trials. "Results show a decrease in depression, anxiety and stress associated with parenthood, and an improvement in recovery from postnatal depression", said Sarah.



#### Emergency Services Volunteer Fuel Card to help volunteer groups by February

The *Royalties for Regions* Emergency Service Volunteer Fuel Card (ESVFC) will be rolled out in February next year, after a recent announcement of the application process timeline.

The Fuel Card, a Nationals WA election commitment, was announced earlier this year and will provide eligible brigades, groups and units (BGUs) with a \$2000 fuel card each year to support their services and volunteers.

Applications open on **Monday November 23** and will need to be submitted by **Sunday January 10**, with the first fuel cards to be sent out in February next year.

Nationals Members for the Agricultural Region, Hon Martin Aldridge MLC said the announcement came just in time for BGUs and residents preparing for the rapidly approaching fire season.

"The ESVFC is about providing emergency service volunteers, who often dip into their own pockets to help others, with a bit of support," Mr Aldridge said.

"This announcement is timely given summer is a particularly busy period for many of our regional volunteers."

Mr Aldridge, who has a wealth of

experience in the emergency services sector, drove the ESVFC policy heading into the last election and has advocated for its swift introduction since his election in 2013.

He said the parameters around provision of the card would ensure the benefits ended up with volunteers.

"Responsibility for distributing the ESVFC amongst active, registered volunteers of the BGU will fall with the officer-in-charge," Mr Aldridge said.

"This ensures the fuel card will be fairly distributed to contributing volunteers."

The ESVFC is restricted to private or recreational fuel purchases only and must not be used to purchase fuel for an operational vehicle or vessel.

#### Design plans approved for Beverley Health Service refurbishment

The planned upgrades to the hospital at Beverley Health Service are taking shape with schematic designs for the upgrades to the original building now completed.

The hospital's Health Services Manager, Michelle Bauer, said the planned upgrades under the Southern Inland Health Initiative would provide the local community with access to the latest modern medical facilities, providing safe care in an appropriate environment.

"The changes being made to our Emergency Department will make it easier to use, providing more streamlined access for staff and improving patient care," Ms Bauer said.

As part of the refurbishment, the current Emergency Department and procedure room will be combined to create a larger Emergency Department with a new resuscitation bay and acute treatment bay.

"Opening up the two rooms will mean staff can more easily attend to two patients in Emergency at the same time," Ms Bauer said.

The number of consult rooms for outpatient visits will be increased from one to three which means that allied health, which is currently situated in a separate building at the front of the hospital site, will be moved under the hospital roof and closer to the ED.

"These three consult rooms will be multipurpose rooms to allow consults for child health, mental health, and allied health including physiotherapy on site," Ms Bauer said.

"The rooms will also be telehealth enabled, so regional people can link with their specialists via videoconference for outpatient appointments, reducing the need to travel great distances for treatment."

Other refurbishments include a new meeting room, upgrades to the staff station and clean utility areas, a modified Ambulance entry, an upgraded kitchen with new equipment, and improved security across the whole site. The main entrance will also be remodelled and a new four-bay gopher (mobility-scooter) parking area will be added.

Chairperson of the Local Health Advisory Group and member of the District Health Advisory Council, Keith Murray was one of the key stakeholders invited to be part of a community consultation meeting regarding the refurbishment. "When local community members heard about the substantial upgrades they were met with excitement," Mr Murray said.

"The upgrades provide the local community with security and tenure to the future as far as health is concerned."

The Beverley Health Service redevelopment is funded by the State Government's Royalties for Regions as part of the half a billion dollar Southern Inland Health Initiative being delivered by the WA Country Health Service. The Southern Inland Health Initiative capital works program is more extensive and complex than any project previously undertaken by the WA Country Health Service, with new builds and upgrades to 37 hospitals and health services in the Wheatbelt, South West, Great Southern and Midwest.

In the Wheatbelt, Merredin, Northam and Narrogin hospitals are being redeveloped as well as upgrades to 23 small hospitals and health centres across the region.

The next stage of the project, the building tender process, is about to get underway. Construction is due to start around March 2016. To find out more, go to <u>www.health.wa.gov.au/</u><u>southerninland</u>.

#### Core values, goals and philosophy

As with many common ventures and businesses, there is generally a core set of values and goals that are unwritten and, in many instances, unspoken but are determined by the common values and conduct of the individuals involved in the business or venture.

It is our view that the members of a business will gain significant benefit from determining the core values, goals and philosophy of the Business so as to ensure that all members and participants in the venture can be guided and influenced by those core values, goals and philosophy. The early establishment of those values, goals and philosophy prepare a Business to manage, in a constructive, meaningful and objective manner, challenges that will confront the Business from time to time. Those values, goals and philosophy will also assist the owners and managers of the Business correct any deviation that may occur in the direction of a business over time, as can happen when one is working in the Business.

An example of a set of core values could be the values of honesty, integrity, respect for others, courage and loyalty.

An example of a core goal might be to ensure that the debt to equity ratio never exceeds 50%.

An example of the core philosophy of a farming business can be to establish and maintain a profitable, competitive and modern farming business that utilises world best practice at all times.

In our experience, the core values, goals and philosophy of a farming business already exist within the minds, attitude and culture of the farming family but are not openly discussed or documented. It is our recommendation that they be discussed and documented and regularly used to guide the direction of the Business.

#### Family farming business constitution

Once the farming family has considered the differing expectations of the generations that are represented within the Business and established its core values, goals and philosophy, it is our recommendation that the Business take the time to establish a constitution for the Business.

The constitution will document the expectations of the generations of individuals owning and operating the Business, the core values, goals and philosophy of the Business, the strategic plan for the Business, its rules of governance, policies and procedures, make provision for the resolution of disputes and for the transfer of ownership and control of the Business from time to time, whether it be occasioned by the entry of a new partner or partners, the retirement or disability of a partner or the death of a partner.

The constitution also has the ongoing benefit to the Business of guiding its advisors, including its accountant and lawyer, in the process to be utilised when assets of the Business are being transferred from one generation to another and the documents that will need to be prepared to effect the transfer of ownership and control.

The constitution will also assist your lawyer in the preparation of your Wills and Enduring Powers of Attorney as the latter documents must be consistent with the constitution and your own goals which should be, if the above pathway is followed, reflected within the constitution.

#### Project Numbat to look for signs of Numbats

For the third year in a row, Project Numbat has teamed up with the Department of Parks and Wildlife to search for numbat diggings at Boyagin Reserve near Brookton and Pingelly.

Project Numbat is a not for profit organisation which raises and awareness and funds for the conservation of our state emblem the Numbat. Less than 1,000 Numbats remain in the wild and they are most under threat by foxes and feral cats which predate on them. The Wheatbelt's important remnant reserves such as Boyagin Nature Reserve and Dryandra Woodland fortunately contain self-sustaining populations, however this cannot be determined without monitoring.

Over three full days, two teams of four people searched for numbat digs systematically across different vegetation types at Boyagin Nature Reserve. Numbats dig for termites and consume up to 20,000 termites per day via their long sticky tongue. These digs tend be shallow, have a U shape to one side and occur in groups. This means it is important that the Project Numbat volunteers are well trained, as many

different types of animal digs can be found. This monitoring technique can be used to determine the numbat's presence and density from year to year.
