SHIRE OF BEVERLEY PRESIDENT REPORT - OCTOBER 2019



Local Government Elections 19 October 2019

Early voting in the Shire of Beverley Local Government elections is now open at the Shire office polling booth during normal office hours 8.30am–4pm up to Friday 18 October. The polling booth will be open on Saturday 19 October 8am–6pm. Anyone requiring a postal vote will need to contact the Shire no later than 11 October 2019. There are 6 candidates and whilst voting is non-compulsory I strongly encourage you to take an interest in your Council and cast your vote to fill the 4 vacancies.

Central Country Zone Meeting

The Central Country Zone of Local Governments includes the 15 Shires of Beverley, Brookton, Corrigin, Cuballing, Dumbleyung, Kulin, Lake Grace, Narrogin, Pingelly, Quairading, Wagin, Wandering, West Arthur, Wickepin and Williams. A Zone meeting was held at the town hall on Friday 30 August 2019. Beverley last hosted this meeting in August 2015. Many of the delegates visited the Cornerstone building with glowing accolades for what has been achieved.

Roadworks

Tree lopping has been occurring on the western side of the Shire. Whilst \$80,000 is included in the 19/20 budget to prune tree overhang along roadsides this task is a never-ending challenge. Maintenance grading has continued. The airstrip has been sprayed and minor repairs undertaken on the bitumen section of the runway.

Bridge Maintenance

The Shire of Beverley is responsible for maintaining 34 bridges and to be eligible for bridge refurbishment and replacement funding the Shire is required to carry out annual inspections and keep up routine maintenance which includes vegetation control, bridge deck drainage, road surface on bridge and approaches, pile banding, stringer and corbel bolting, end grain treatment, bolt tightening, eradicate and prevent termite/fungi, deck and expansion joint maintenance, delineators and maintenance. quardrail embankments and waterways. That's a lot of bridges to look after, including some of the oldest in the state and in the case of Kokeby East Road also one of the longest, without a lot of external funding to do so. Main Roads WA carry out detailed inspections every 5 years and have requested that fences be removed from bridges to allow them access, if they are unable to, the bridge could be load rated to 10 tonne. The Shire asks for your understanding in finding a solution to this request and will be in touch with various landowners in the near future.

Old School Building

Council has resolved that the Old School Building become a Civic Centre to conduct all Council business and have requested that that a Concept Design be produced as proposed in the 19/20 budget. This change will enable much needed space in the Administration building to support day to day running of the shire.

360° Flights

Did you know you can follow the flights of a glider and the Silver Centenary on the aeronautical booth in the Cornerstone Visitor Centre? The photographer set up a 360 degree camera in each of those planes to record the flights. Viewers are able to shift the screen around and see what the pilot and passenger are viewing from take-off through to landing. It's very easy to use however if you need help ask a CRC staff member during the week or come in on the weekend for a look when the volunteers are at the Visitor Centre.

Avondale Farm Community Day

It was really pleasing to see so many visitors at the successful National Trust Avondale Farm Community Day which included the launch of short stay accommodation now available at the property, new signage around the heritage precinct and walk trail, potential of the Ag Museum as well as a range of activities and stalls for visitors to enjoy.

Councillors Ridgway and Shaw retiring

Cr Lew Shaw and I have not renominated for the forthcoming Local Government Elections. We both commenced in 2007 and have greatly appreciated the opportunity to represent our community and share in the planning, development and progress which Council over that time has championed. Cr Shaw was Deputy President 2009 – 2011. I was Deputy President for 2 years and have been President for the last 10. With our retirement Council will no longer have broad acre farming representation. Thank you to our wonderful Beverley community and best wishes to the incoming Council.

Well that month surely went quick. But it was great to get around and see some familiar faces and also some new faces. I want to say a big thank you to the organising committee and all the volunteers that put on another great Beverley Show. It was well attended and from a police perspective the crowds were very well behaved.

The only disappointing part of that weekend was that there were some windows smashed at the school, the old convent on Dempster Street and also a house on Bartram Street. All the windows were smashed by small rocks. If anyone has information in relation to those damaged windows then give us a call.

BICYCLE SAFETY

October sees the return of the Beverley Heroic and also as the warmer weather approaches there will be more people riding their bicycles (including many school children). There is a lot of laws out there in regards to both motorists and cyclists, but a couple of main rules are:

A driver of a motor vehicle must pass a bicycle travelling in the same direction at a safe distance, being 1 metre on roads where the posted speed limit is 60 km/h or less; and 1.5 metres on roads where the posted speed limit is more than 60km/h.

This law allows drivers to cross centre line markings, including single and double continuous white lines and painted islands, to give the correct amount of space to the cyclist, but only when it is safe to do so, and when the driver has a clear view of oncoming traffic. The penalty for contravening this law is \$400 and 4 demerit points.

The driver of a vehicle shall not permit the rider of a bicycle to attach himself or herself to, or be drawn by, the vehicle. \$100 infringement.

A person shall not ride a bicycle within 2 metres of the rear of a motor vehicle, over a distance of more than 200 metres. \$100 infringement.

Cyclists can ride two side-by-side on the road, with up to 1.5m between riders; \$50 infringement if more than two and more than 1.5 metres apart.

Cyclists must wear a secure helmet; \$50 infringement

Cyclists not allowed to pass on left of a vehicle that is turning left; \$100 infringement

AGRICULTURAL MUSEUM

WATERHATCH RD, BEVERLEY

Once again the third weekend of the month saw the Beverley Ag Museum open to the public. On the Saturday morning our small group of dedicated volunteers were set the goal of providing working items from the museum to contrast with Beverley Transport and Boekeman Machinery's modern equipment as a part of an 'old & new' display of transport and farming technology. This was exhibited near the Shearing Shed for the National Trust Avondale Farm Community Day held on Sunday 22 September.

As can be the case with older machinery there were starting problems, the cooler air did not help our efforts, but with the use (in some cases) of the crank handle the air was soon filled with oily smoke from the engines.

Firstly please note our services are strictly for the needy and Centrelink recipients (office behind Beverley Medical Practice).

No 2. Very Important Information. For all Australian families - New rules and criteria for people with disability (DSP) and new start allowance. TV Channels - Radio Reports - 7-12 September 2019. Due to a new Centrelink point system, around 30% of recipients, have been taken off the DSP and transferred to new smart allowances. The savings, shown of TV channels, is 4 to 5 billion dollars. According to TV reports most affected are those recipients that are in the 50-65 age group, and the younger groups. Also affected are those who have a disability. TV showed a young lady with MS who is constantly in pain with mobility problems. Was on the DSP Centrelink cancelled it. Put her on Newstart telling her she was fit to work. Her family were devastated. Both these groups and their families will be facing serious financial hardships. They all believe because of their disability, no one will give them a job. The financial loss is huge, from \$880 a fortnight to \$560 new start per fortnight. These battlers now have to live on \$40 per day. Apart from cutting down centre benefits, they now have to face, that payment will be made. So far we know that 80% will be on the card and 20% is yet to be decided. On the spot drug tests may be ordered.

A few months ago, the Salvation Army officer stated that 30% of homeless (mainly women) are in the age group of 56-65. The burden on the Salvation Army to help these people. Whole families are affected and will all be facing financial hardship. Please contact your member for Pearce for information as to what centre current point system means and what the medical requirements are and who actually qualifies for the DSP suggestion only. Those who have long term medical conditions and also currently in pain and suffering, keep all medical reports, Centrelink may ask for these documents. According to national radio 12-09-2019, there are some lawyers who are giving legal advice on the Newstart and DSP matters.

Consumer Protection - Fair Trade Act. Once again TV reports show offices of fair trading consumer protection commission. RECD May complaints Re. Faulty goods (2) examples were shown (children strollers and cots) were cited, some to be dangerous. There is talk now about forming a register to name and shame sellers who sell family goods, and who breach the fair trading act. Currently the fair trading act seems to tell us the buyers and the seller's rights. The purchasers who buy the goods that are faulty, have the right to return them to the seller's. For either repair or full refund. Most sellers to keep their good name, refuse to comply with the act. Inform the FTC for further action. Lodge a formal complaint. Note. In further (no-one is above the law).

If you are having legal issues, contact a lawyer for legal advice. Do not contact Mal Roberts.

What does the Aboriginal flag represent?

QUICK ANSWER

The Aboriginal flag of Australia is a symbol of national unity for the Aboriginal people. The top half of the flag, which was created in the 1970s, is black, which represents the Aboriginal people. The bottom half of the flag is red, representing the country's red earth. In the center of the flag is a yellow circle, which is meant to represent the sun.

FULL ANSWER

In addition to representing Australia's red earth, the red color on the bottom half of the flag also reflects the spiritual connection that the Aboriginal people have to the land. The yellow circle representing the sun also has a special significance, as Aborigines believe that the sun is the giver of life and the protector of the people

The Aboriginal flag was created in 1970 by Harold Thomas, a Luritja man, and was first flown in Adelaide's Victoria Square to commemorate National Aborigines Day on July 12, 1971. The next year, it was used at the Aboriginal Tent Embassy in Canberra. In 1995, the Australian government made the Aboriginal flag one of the country's three official flags, along with the flag of Australia and the Torres Strait Islander flag. The latter flag represents another subsection of Australia's aboriginal population.

Exposure draft legislation for an economy-wide cash payment limit of \$10,000

Quick Facts

Rationale: The introduction of an economy-wide cash payment limit is a recommendation from the Black Economy Taskforce and sends a strong signal to the community that it is not acceptable to avoid tax and other obligations by paying with cash.

Start date: 1 January 2020 and for certain AUSTRAC reporting entities from

What transactions are covered by the cash payment limit?

The limit applies to all cash transactions equal to or in excess of \$10,000, except for those that meet the conditions specified in the draft Currency (Restrictions on the Use of Cash-Excepted Transactions) Instrument 2019.

What are examples of exempt transactions?

All cash deposits and withdrawals from your bank account with an authorised deposit-taking institution (ADI), exchanging foreign currency and all consumer to consumer transactions such as selling a second-hand car but excluding real property transactions.

Are there any new reporting requirements?

This will not impose additional reporting requirements on businesses and consumers

What happens if you break the limit?

From 1 January 2020 it will be a criminal offence to make or accept a payment from businesses that includes \$10,000 or more of cash. It is also offence to make or accept a cash donation equal to or in excess of \$10,000. The maximum penalty is up to two years imprisonment and/or 120 penalty units (\$25,200).

How does the cash payment limit apply to payment plans?

The cash payment limit will apply to the total price of a single supply of goods or services, regardless of whether the price is split into a series of payments over time.

The total cash payments made towards the final price paid must not equal to or exceed \$10,000. The remainder of the payments must be made electronically or by cheque.



Making IT Simpler

Managing Passwords

With the increasing criminal activity on the Internet (e.g. break-ins to Internet sites; theft of personal information; identity theft; and scams), it is time to consider how you protect your information better, particularly using passwords.

What prompted me to write this article? In my June 2019 article I described a video recording scam. More recently I have been receiving more scam emails from several different scammers, with a new twist. They claimed to have my 'password'. I found that it IS one of my passwords – for an Asian airline website. Obviously, the website has been broken into and any personal information including the login and password, has been sold to scammers. The password is not used elsewhere and there is no critical personal information there. So, I am not worried.

However, what is more worrying is that the airline has not advised me or their other customers of the security breach — which they have a moral obligation to do. This indicates that if a website has been compromised you are unlikely to be informed to enable you to take action to protect your private information. You therefore need to use good password practice.

Password good practice

- Have a unique password for EACH device and website
- · Avoid giving passwords to potentially dangerous sites
- Do not keep passwords in an easily accessible place, e.g. on your desk, in your handbag, in a notebook, in an unencrypted file on your PCs, phones or tablets.
- Use long passwords less than 11 characters is easy to crack
 21+ random characters takes years to hack
- Use all different character types, lower and upper case letters, numbers and other characters – e.g. ()-+=_!@#\$%^&*{}[[.
- Do not use names or dictionary words a computer-based dictionary search takes little time or effort these days.
- · Avoid recycling old passwords.
- Be especially careful with passwords for banks, medical information etc.
- Avoid keeping the passwords in the 'cloud'. If you do,

take special care where passwords are kept (physically) and whether they are encrypted, and who has the encryption keys. You cannot afford to trust anyone or any organisation you do not know with passwords.

This sounds too difficult – how can I manage all these passwords? You can see from my own experience above how vulnerable you could be if passwords are not managed securely. It is impossible to remember all those passwords, especially if you use random characters! What I do is keep all my passwords in an encrypted Excel file. I keep the file on my local PC and only open it when I need to access a password. Then I only need to remember one password.

How to create an encrypted password file. Many people are not aware that Microsoft Office programs (Word, Excel, etc.) have an easy facility to encrypt and password protect files. Go to the 'File' tab – in the left hand panel select "Protect Document", then click on "Encrypt with Password" and follow instruction. CREATE A COMPLEX BUT MEMORABLE PASSWORD AND DO NOT FORGET IT! Preferably do not write it down.

Password managers. Opening a password file each time you need a password can be tedious and can also expose the contents of the password file to the Internet. Instead you can use a Password Manager. A password manager store all your passwords as you create then or creates them for you. Whenever you go onto the website it will fill in the username and password details for you.

Search on the Internet for a "password manager". Preferably use one that keeps the password file on your PC, phone or tablet - and NOT in the cloud – that is much more secure.



Beverley GARDEN AND TREE SOCIETY

The September meeting was replaced by a trip to Toodyay. 15 members boarded the community bus at the Dead Finish Museum with our trusty driver, John at the wheel. We picked up another member in York and headed to Northam where we stopped for a quick morning tea by the Avon river. The weather threatened but finally decided to play nice so it was sunny by the time we reached Toodyay.

The first garden we visited was largely a dry land garden with a wonderful collection of succulents and cacti which were artistically displayed among rocks and gravel. There was also a great collection of old, rusty pieces of machinery and treasures. There were terraces down towards the river which flowed at the bottom of the block. We had a lovely wander along the paths until it was time to find some lunch.

Toodyay has a diversity of places to lunch so we made our various choices and afterwards somehow seemed to meet up at the Christmas shop for a browse before boarding the bus again to find the second garden. Thankfully Linley had her GPS working and we were soon at our destination.

This was another steeply sloping block, so typical of Toodyay and has been a labour of love for its owner. Up the steep driveway we found a shady patio area which we passed through to the back yard. Once again it was well terraced but upward this time and planted with mostly natives apart from the lowest area which was a lawn. For those with the energy and good knees, a great view was visible from the highest terrace. A great day was had by all and we returned to Beverley by 4pm.

Next meeting will be on Tuesday 01 October at the Dead Finish at 10.30am. Please bring items for the "Bring and Buy".

The weather is certainly warming up and summer is fast approaching but there is still plenty to do in the garden during October.


Vegies to plant in October include – beetroot, capsicum, cucumber, lettuce, pumpkin, tomato, zucchini, carrot and sweet corn.

Flowers to plant in October include – alyssum, marigold, petunia, portulaca, salvia, cornflower, lobelia and snapdragon.

October is a great time to attend to the following tasks in the garden:

- Repot orchids as soon as they have finished flowering. They need repotting every 3-4 years
- Cut stems of kangaroo paw flowers and display inside. Leave a stump 10-20cm long where a second flush of flowers will appear from dormant buds
- Ensure your irrigation system is in good working order. Clean filters, flush the drip lines, sprinklers and drippers and repair any holes
- Composting worms start to eat more food now that it is warming up. Chop up scraps finely to speed up the process
- Be sure to keep on top of couch grass and kikuyu in garden beds. These can regrow from any tiny pieces that are left in the ground
- Tomatoes should be rotated to new parts of the garden every year to reduce the chance of diseases ruining your crop
- Buddleja, tea tree, daisies, marigolds, lavender, bottle brush and grevillea are all great for attracting butterflies to your garden and now is a great time to plant them
- Prune native shrubs by about a third every 12 months or so to keep them compact and bushy and to stimulate new growth
- Plant native succulents such as pigface around your house as a fire retardant barrier
- Prune only the flowered stems of proteas. Un-flowered stems are next season's blooms
- Plant annuals now for Christmas colour. For sunny spots plant alyssum, petunia, salvia and vinca. For shade plant impatiens





Help us find you in an emergency

Pinpointing your exact location can become difficult in an emergency situation. The St John First Responder App sends your GPS coordinates to the operator when you call Triple 000 for an ambulance, speeding up the time it takes to confirm your location and dispatch and ambulance.

Over 130,000 Western Australians have downloaded the app which also contains a number of other resources, including:

- First aid instruction guides helping you to treat a range of injuries and illnesses.
- Defibrillator (AED) locator showing all the defibrillator locations near you.
- Upload the location of new defibrillator (AED) locations that aren't currently appearing on the app.
- Locate nearest medical centres and emergency departments including live ED waiting time information.
- Patient transport services information.
- · Your first aid course information and refresher reminder notices
- · First aid tips and special offers keeping you up to date with handy first aid information.

Help others in an emergency situation

The St John First Responder app allows qualified first aiders in Western Australia to sign up and become a registered first responder. If a nearby emergency occurs (in a public place within 500 meters), you will be notified and given the opportunity to assist until the ambulance arrives.

To become a first responder, you will need to provide evidence of having completed a first aid course within the last three years. Minimum qualification level of HLTAID001 Provide cardiopulmonary resuscitation. We now offer the ability to become a BASIC level first responder in the app, by uploading your Photo ID.

St John First Responder is a free app and available on Apple's App Store and Google Play.





Warrior Wellbeing Article THE BLOKE WHISPERER ... (Talking to Blokes About Health And Wellbeing)

Getting blokes to talk openly and frankly about health issues can sometimes be a struggle, especially if they feel like they can't show vulnerability, or they don't want to worry others with their problems. Whilst I'm the first to admit that talking about fishing and footy is great, we need to be open to broadening the range of topics that we are happy to cover in general conversation.

The importance of this is bought into sharp focus when you see that blokes are on the wrong side of the ledger in terms of all the preventable cancers, cardiovascular disease, suicide rates, workplace accidents/deaths and motor vehicle trauma. There's some serious stuff we need to talk about, but currently, many of us aren't!

Sometimes when trying to address this, the old adage about getting in touch with our feminine side gets wheeled out, but it's important that we realise that men and women are hard-wired differently. We communicate differently, show our emotions differently, take risks and like to win, however if a bloke feels in a safe place he will talk. The following are some useful tips when chatting to blokes:

- Shoulder to Shoulder Talk: Blokes tend to feel much more comfortable talking side by side. A shared task or sport is often a great starting point. A few explanations have been offered as to why this is our favoured stance: Blokes can find direct eye contact challenging; They place less emphasis on reading someone's face and tend to take others by their word.
- Steer Away from the Language of Failure: Blokes can be quite sensitive to turns of phrase like "suffering from" or "needing help". This to them may suggest that in some way they are failing themselves or their family. Therefore rephrasing "seeking help" to "taking control" may help your cause.
- **Don't Make it a Big Conversation:** If you are concerned for a bloke in your life, it can be tempting to prepare yourself for one big chat. This can feel like an ambush and be counterproductive. Instead, mention health and wellbeing in passing, even if initially it is framed around someone else. Once the topic is introduced, let it run its course. It may take a couple of conversations to explore or explain your concerns and get him talking comfortably.
- **Persist:** If it's worrying you, it's probably worrying him. A bloke's initial reluctance to engage may just reflect a nervousness around the subject matter. A second or third approach won't go astray. After that it's probably time to give him some space with the option to take up the offer when it suits him.
- **Mr Fix It:** Guys tend to be task oriented and prefer that approach when talking about and tackling problems. They want to have a clear purpose, therefore a general discussion around feelings just doesn't cut it! Conversations that are goal oriented and have a clear direction are the most effective.

Of course, every bloke is different, but if we start to play to our strengths rather than highlighting our weaknesses, inevitably the lines of communication will become stronger. If we can achieve this then the health and wellbeing outcomes for men can only improve.




