Brief Report on the Rubbish Tip Fire

On Tuesday 12 November at approximately 6am a fire started in a green waste pile. Due to a strong south easterly wind blowing, the fire spotted into the solid waste pile igniting that and subsequent spotting then ignited some bush between the tip and the Water Corp's waste ponds.

Firefighting efforts were directed at extinguishing the bushland that had ignited and beginning to contain the two tip piles that were on fire. The tip loader was used to assist these firefighting efforts by spreading out the burning green waste so that water and foam application was more effective.

The tip grader was used to cut and reinforce containment breaks around the site and the backhoe was employed to start digging out the solid waste so that the water and foam application on that pile was also more effective.

Thanks to David Adams for his bulk water carrier and large excavator that assisted with the efforts on the solid waste pile and to David Johnson for bringing in his 30,000L water tanker to further assist the firefighting efforts.

Approximately 20 local farm firefighting units had turned out to assist along with the appliances of the Beverley VFRS and all three of the Shire's BFB heavy appliances. It is estimated that over 100,000L of water and 120L of Class A firefighting foam were deposited on the fires.

Due to the terrific support and excellent resources employed, the fire had been contained by approximately 9am and

firefighting efforts continued into the "mop up" phase where water and foam continued to be applied until all heat had been removed from all ignition points.

Welfare in the form of sandwiches made quickly by Beverley Country Kitchen and cold water were distributed to the onsite personnel at approximately 10.30am. All volunteers and all but one Shire staff member were able to leave the site by 12.30pm.

Thank you again to <u>ALL</u> <u>VOLUNTEERS</u> and Shire Staff who were able to assist to quickly bring the fire under control. As always, all efforts are valued and appreciated by your Community and Council.

Work is underway on a 2 km stretch of Westdale Road near Kettlerock Gully Bridge. The Vincent Street bridge was unfortunately delayed in the reopening of the two lanes, however is now open and operational. Repairs will be carried out on Morbinning Road during December.

In 2019 alone three of our citizens have tripped and sustained significant injuries SO а decision to remove them was made whilst other tree pruning was occurring around town. As part of the future main street redevelopment, tree planting in large pots is included in the plan. As with projects, many large the redevelopment will be dependent upon external funding.

On Monday 25 November 2019 the Annual Electors Meeting was held at the Cornerstone Building. Six community members attended the meeting which is held to adopt the Annual Report. As previous vears the per Presidents Report from the 2018/19 financial year is included on page 33 of the Blarney.


WASTE AND RECYLING IN BEVERLEY





BEVERLEY HISTORICAL SOCIETY HONOURS TWO LONG SERVING MEMBERS

Members of the BHS and the community came together at the Dead Finish Museum on 11 November to honour Mrs Maree Hutchinson and the late Mrs Peg Kempton. These two ladies have been outstanding foundation members, willingly giving very long service to the Society and the community.

Maree joined when the Society was formed in 1977 (42 years so far). She was the first secretary for three 3 years and again for 2 years. She has been President for 5 years, Vice President for 11 years, done weekend roster to open the Museum, helped with Year 2 visits, exhibitions, show displays, bus groups and many more – probably at least 250 duties. And Maree has helped raise funds and done much research with Ruth Mann and others in Beverley, at the Battye Library, from her own library etc. to set up the Dead Finish Museum.

We love Maree's wonderful memory and her sharing of knowledge at our meetings. President Joy Smith said "After all Maree has been associated with the Smith, Edwards, Sims and Hutchinson families – no wonder she knows so much about this town, its farm's and people."

It was with an immense sense of pride that Maree, in the presence of her three sons Kim, Peter and Brett and their families and friends, unveiled her honour plaque on the door of the "Nursery room".

Peg Kempton also joined the Beverley Historical Society soon after the foundation meeting and was an inspirational and hardworking member until her passing in January 2016.



Pegs contributions to the society were many – 9 years as President (3 terms), had the idea of setting up a "Beverley Room", the historic fences in the garden, the cellar floor 'window', helped with the Shire`s first Heritage index and the Beverley History Book and of course helped with much fundraising, research and setting up of the Dead Finish Museum.

Peg was a keen gardener and helped maintain the museum gardens.

Speaking about Peg, our secretary Morag Whitney said, "Peg was always ready for a laugh and was known to have wheeled the old cane bath chair to the museum from the hospital and later with a dummy in the chair - to & from the Beverley show display! "

Peg had many anecdotes about the people and places of Beverley and the district and loved the quirky and amusing things – she made "dry" history entertaining.

In the presence of Peg's brother Robert Bartram, Bruce Mann unveiled a plaque to honour Peg on the "Beverley Room" Door.

Both Peg and Maree were born in Beverley and lived on farms until they both retired into town. Both ladies then really dedicated themselves to the Society and we will be forever grateful.



AGRICULTURAL MUSEUM Waterhatch Road, Beverley

Even with the heat (during the 40°+ spell) most of our dedicated volunteers attended the November gathering for maintenance at the museum (last one for this year) on the third Saturday. Our first priority was given to completing the relocation of machinery used for display at the National Trust open day held in September.

Duayne and John H had to undertake minor repairs to the Farmall Tractor's ignition system before it would start, once done the Farmall was placed back into its display location.

Usually the Ferguson X35 requires the fuel system to be bled, so rather than waste use of the battery and place undue wear on the starter motor, Duayne and John A decided to 'bleed first' only to be surprised that the system was free of air already. With all haste once started, the Fergie was then attached to the front of the Jones Minor Baler which required some more than skilful manoeuvring by Duayne (with visual support from Eric and both Johns) to locate it back to its parking/display spot. It was then



jacked up onto blocks and stands due to the age of the tyres. Now our Ferguson X35 is quite reliable but does suffer from 'heavy breathing' (should be locked up!) and without a breeze that day there was a certain haze in the air.



By this time Kevin and Kerry had arrived and it was decided to give the Field Marshall Tractor a start (we try to alternate between the 'Working items' so they are all kept in good running condition). The first problem arose was discovered when it the decompression valve was stuck open; to get to this valve is quite a task having to remove various panels for spanner access. Although there appeared to be a reasonable amount of fuel in the tank it was determined that it needs to be much higher to avoid air locks.

With these problems solved it was then a case of trying to start the tractor using the various means available. Everyone eventually had a

go on the crank handle, getting slower and slower (well it was a hot day!) but the Field Marshal was having none of it. When our group resume the maintenance and restoration days at the museum early in 2020 it will be on the 'to do' list to try again.

In between our attempts at swinging the handle we had our 'bring & share' break taking the opportunity to 'chew the fat' about all things local, reading machinery magazines and discussing what we would like to achieve in the future.

RESEARCH RETURNS TO AVONDALE FARM



The National Trust of Western Australia is pleased to announce that Living Farm will be the new leasee at Avondale Farm starting March in 2020.

This progressive York based agricultural research company was selected to lease the property conduct valuable agricultural research on behalf of WA farmers. The National Trust's CEO, Julian Donaldson said "we are excited to have a research company back at Avondale Farm, reconnecting with the sites history and providing a valuable resource to the farming community."

In line with Living Farms' growth strategy this lease will extend the business's ability to aggregate multiple trials in one location and deliver more efficient field days to farmers and customers. Living Farm is cementing itself as a leader in crop research in Western Australia and MD Richard Devlin said "access to the high-quality land at Avondale Farm complements our growth strategy of delivering quality results and focused research to farmers and agribusinesses locally, interstate & internationally. We feel privileged that our contribution will assist in maintaining this important piece of land and that we can restore its research focus."

Along with leasing Avondale Farm, Living Farm has acquired land in York for specific research purposes. This will allow greater control of trial sites, the ability to set up rotations and optimise trial results. This expanding research will also promote investment in plant, equipment and people creating employment opportunities in the Avon region.

The National Trust of Western Australia works to raise knowledge, awareness, understanding and commitment to Western Australia's natural and cultural heritage. The Trust achieves this objective through the conservation and interpretation of heritage places it manages on behalf of the community and government of Western Australia, and through its education and learning programs.

Avondale Farm is located between two rivers and its fertile land sustained Aboriginal people for thousands of years. Snapped up by the colony's first Governor, James Stirling, it passed through several

hands before the government established a soldier settlement scheme here. When this was unsuccessful Avondale was set up as an agricultural research station. Several important agricultural breakthroughs were made here.

The work of the Agricultural Research Station began in 1926 involving experiments with wheat and superphosphate fertiliser. In 1930, a Laboratory was constructed to research the 'Braxy-like disease' now known as pulpy kidney that had plagued sheep in the area since 1915. Dr Harold Bennetts succeeded in creating a vaccine in 1931, the crowning achievement of the Research Station. This was followed by many farming innovations and trials which made major contributions to Wheatbelt agriculture throughout the twentieth century

In 1979 Avondale featured in the sesquicentenary celebrations morphing into a tourist destination. Now in the hands of the National Trust, the place is once again farmed while still welcoming visitors to the site.

Avondale Farm is about 6kms west of the Wheatbelt town of Beverley and 31kms south-east of York.





Staying safe in summer

With a surge in the number of Western Australians treated for snake bites in the last year, the Beverley Sub Centre wishes to highlight the importance of first aid as we head towards peak snake season.

From July 2018 to June 2019, 169 people in WA were treated by paramedics for snake bites. By comparison, 104 people were treated in the 12 months to June 2018, and 120 in 2016.

More than 66 per cent of cases occurred in country WA, with the Wheatbelt (31), South West (29) and Pilbara (15) topping the list. Margaret River had the highest single number of emergency calls with seven, while 57 patients were treated in and around Perth, most in the South West (14) and North West (13) metropolitan areas.

Five of the world's 10 most venomous snakes live in Australia and unfortunately there are still many myths surrounding snake bite treatment. Our message is simple, but could be lifesaving – know first aid, even it's at a basic level.

The most important thing if you're bitten by a snake is to call triple zero (000), even if you're unsure of the snake type. People should lie flat, remain as calm and still as possible, and then bandage the bite starting from the fingers or toes and wrapping upwards."

Common snake bite symptoms include headaches, blurred vision, nausea, drowsiness and difficulty breathing, speaking or swallowing.

Downloading the St John First Responder smartphone application, which can dial triple zero (000) and provide operators with an exact GPS location, may save a life, especially in remote locations.

It's also important that if you are going walking in bush areas you take a first aid kit with you.

The Beverley sub-centre wishes our community a very, very safe and relaxing Christmas and New Year.

FIRST AID FACT SHEET Snake Bite

Snake bites are not common in Australia, but all should be treated as life threatening. Snakes force venom out under pressure through fangs in the upper jaw. The spread of snake venom depends on its absorption through the lymphatic system.

Caused by

+ Fangs puncturing the skin.

Signs & symptoms

- + Visible in an hour or more after the person has been bitten.
- In children signs and symptoms may appear within minutes.
- Puncture marks or scratches, may bleed.
- + Nausea, vomiting and diarrhoea.
- Headache, drowsiness, giddiness or faintness.
- Double or blurred vision, drooping eyelids.
- Voice changes, trouble speaking or swallowing.
- + Pain or tightness in the throat, chest or abdomen.
- Breathing difficulties, respiratory weakness or arrest.

What to do

- 1. Follow DRSABCD St John Action Plan.
- 2. Lay the casualty down, rest and reassure.
- 3. If the bite is on a limb, apply a broad pressure bandage over the bite site as soon as possible.
- Then apply a further elasticised or firm bandage - start at fingers or toes and move up the limb as far as can be reached. Apply tightly but without stopping blood flow.
- 5. Splint the limb including the joints on either side of the bite.
- 6. Ensure the casualty does not move.
- Urgent medical aid. Call Triple Zero (000) for an ambulance.
- 8. Write down the time that the casualty was bitten and when the bandage was applied.

DO NOT

- Wash the venom off the skin (it may aid in identification).
- + Cut the bitten area and try to suck venom out of the wound.
- + Use a tourniquet.
- Try and catch the snake.

Note arain prices, load the truck -WHERE'S he got the chaser stuck?! Change the tyre, switch to Mace -Can we keep up at this pace?





The 2018/19 Annual Report was adopted at the Annual General Meeting of Electors on Monday 25 November 2019. For community interest please find below the Presidents Statement in relation to the 2018/19 Financial Year from outgoing Shire President, Dee Ridgway.

STATEMENT BY SHIRE PRESIDENT 2018/2019

2018/2019 has again been a productive year for the Shire of Beverley. Councillors and staff, guided by the Strategic Community Plan 2017 – 2027, have continued to plan, manage and implement initiatives for the ongoing advancement and sustainable future of Beverley on behalf of our valued community.

Rate levels remained at a modest overall increase of 2.5% which is below the 10 year financial plan projection. Council is mindful of economic challenges for constituents along with increasing State Government fees and charges, which also create challenges for the Shire's budget.

Of significant note during the year was the completion, transition to using, and official opening of the Beverley Cornerstone Multipurpose Community Centre which is proving to be a valuable facility in servicing the needs of community, business and visitors.

Strategic activity over the year has included consultation and development of plans for Aquatic Centre redevelopment, Youth Activity Precinct, County Peak and Town Heritage Trails. The ongoing strategic officer role co-funded with the National Trust has seen some success in advancing sustainable initiatives for the future of Avondale Farm, and strategic planning for the Ag Museum at Avondale is underway. Discussion with relevant authorities to enable future development of facilities at Yenyening Lakes has commenced and implementation of the Tourism Planning Framework is resulting in an increasing number of visitors to the town. Unfortunately plans for the construction of an alternative river crossing as a back up to the town's one bridge will not proceed due to the exorbitant cost to construct.

The Shire's ongoing renewal of Council's assets has included a robust road capital and maintenance investment programme, footpath construction, town hall kitchen upgrade, continuing refurbishment of units at Hunt Road Village, and reserve allocation for the Vincent Street Urban Design Renewal. Amid an environment of decreasing State Government funding and increasingly competitive grants from other sources Council has supported the engagement of external assistance in the development and preparation of grant applications.

Appreciation is extended to the Shire's staff, particularly CEO Steve Gollan, Deputy CEO Simon Marshall, Manager of Planning Stefan de Beer, Manager of Works Steve Vincent and Executive Assistant Ali Lewis. This last financial year has been particularly busy and Beverley is indeed fortunate with the quality and commitment of our staff and the positive relationship that exists between Council and Administration.

Thanks are extended to Deputy Shire President Cr Chris Pepper and my fellow Councillors for their time and commitment as elected members representing our growing community.

I am not renominating as a Councillor at the forthcoming Local Government Elections and take this opportunity to recognise and congratulate Council and Staff for the sound oversight and progress which is being undertaken within the Shire for our constituents and community, which I look forward to seeing continue.



<u>Garden Tips</u>

HELP POTS TO STAY COOL

<u>Potted plants</u>, especially those in terracotta pots, are vulnerable to overheating. Lightly

mulch and, where possible, position them out of hot western sunshine. Remember that standing potted plants in saucers of water encourages root rot and mosquito breeding. Instead, stand them in saucers filled with sand, and keep the sand moist. This ensures roots stay cool and plants remain healthy. If potted plants dry out to the point where re-wetting is hard, soak them in a bucket of water for half an hour, then drain.

WATER EARLY TO AVERT MILDEW

Water in the cool of the day. The best time to water your garden is morning but, if you water in the afternoon, allow enough time for foliage to dry out before sunset. This reduces the risk of mildew and other fungi attacking leaves, and there's less chance you'll get caught by the evening shift of mosquitoes or sandflies. Mildew frequently attacks roses, pumpkin, melon, zucchini and cucumber. Spray plants weekly with a solution made from one part cow's milk to 10 parts water. Repeat after heavy rain or irrigation. This remedy won't reverse mildew damage, but it's an effective preventative.

ADD NUTRIENTS TO THE WATER

If you can only water occasionally, try to water plants deeply and use that opportunity to simultaneously feed and correct mineral deficiencies. Apply a soluble fertiliser with added seaweed. Water in potash around the base of fruit trees, especially <u>citrus</u> to improve fruit flavour and juiciness. The potassium in potash generally helps to improve plant vigour and resistance to foliar fungi.

PROTECT NEW PLANTINGS

Freshly planted <u>vegetable and flower seedlings</u> are likely to need a bit of sun hardening. Shelter them with 50 per cent shadecloth, old net curtains, dead palm fronds, or leafy branches for a week or two. This helps them establish without harm.

MULCHING BENEFITS

A layer of mulch limits moisture loss from the soil and saves you the job of weeding. The trick is getting the depth right. Generally, you need a 50-75mm layer. But only mulch to about 50mm in native gardens or gardens that aren't irrigated. If the mulch is too thick, rain won't always make it down to the soil.

General Information Services provided to Beverley Residents. Please note that all future submissions to the Beverley Blarney will be place by Sylvia Seddon who is the Secretary of BVCS and authorised by Mal Roberts, President.

Synergy accounts- it has come to our notice that people are finding it difficult to pay their accounts. Contact Synergy to arrange a payment plan. TV advised that there have been 80 thousand disconnections this year.

For the last 30 years, Mal Roberts and Sylvia Seddon have been tirelessly working for the community to address serious concerns. For example dental services, writing to our local MP regarding our doctors Visa extension, problems with telcos, poor service and reception, writing to Federal Members of Parliament, lack of legal aid services, shortage of Homeswest rentals for low income earners. These general community concerns had to be raised, sometimes with the Prime Minister and other Senior Ministers to seek their help. These are all general issues that Mal Roberts will no longer be addressing as BVCS is not incorporating.

Mal Roberts has discussed this matter with Steve Gollan, CEO of Beverley Shire, as to who residents should be referred to. In the first instance, residents should contact relevant agencies for assistance.

Justice of the Peace duties. Mal Roberts has always been busy with the witnessing of all legal and court documents including sworn affidavits. Please note that BVCS does not receive any funding and bear our own day to day running costs (mobile phone, CRC secretarial services etc.)

I have had to withdraw my resignation as it has not been accepted and I will remain on as a committee member and director.

Some of our committee members are in hospital and have very serious health problems.

I am negotiating and speaking with two of the biggest class action law firms. These cases are still pending. The clients have been ripped off by an insurance company for 6 years.

I will be lodging a formal complaint against one of the health providers in the N.D.I.S. Providers. Once again, the funding has been drastically reduced in caring for a child who is permanently incapacitated.

All Government bodies recognize our status of CRANA, our ABN number and our role in the community. We are authorised to issue a certificate of Aboriginality, recognized by the office of the Registrar of Indigenous Corporation and Mal Roberts is a duly authorised person to represent CRANA.

Finally, our President Mitch Henry has also not been too well. I wish him, and all other sick members, 'all the best'.



THE HUNT BEGINS!



THE HUNT BEGINS



Guard your BBQs, monitor your pet's food and check the insects you scoop from the pool. European wasps, we are looking for you!

They look like wasps but don't fly with dangling legs. Instead, they fly more like bees. They are **black and yellow** like a paper wasp, but with completely **black antennae** (feelers) and a nest 10x the size. You won't find it under the fence capping though, these pests prefer to hide their nests **underground**, just beneath the surface. The nest will contain thousands of wasps and the entrance can be as small as a 20 cent coin.

They're annoying like flies and **they like the foods** and drinks that we do, even your pet's food isn't safe – but swat one and you'll discover **they sting** repeatedly. Accidentally swallow one that has crawled into your drink, or disturb their nest or step on it, and you will be seeking **urgent** medical attention!

This pest has threatened to establish in WA since six nests were found and destroyed near Fremantle in 1977. Widely established across most of southern Australia, these 'cane toads of the South' hitchhike their way into WA each year, and this is the 43rd year spent competing in a sophisticated game of 'Hide and Seek' against this highly adaptable and dangerous pest.

The summer and autumn months present the only window of opportunity we have to detect, locate and eradicate European wasp nests from your homes, parks and bushland reserves.



If not found by May, nests release hundreds of fertile queens who can start nests of their own, and the population can explode. If this happens, these pests will be here to stay.

This year we are heavily focused on the Perth hills (Darling Scarp) where nests are particularly difficult to detect and locate, but European wasps can turn up anywhere, so everyone must keep watch.

Join the hunt and **LOOK** for the behaviours described – these are unique amongst the insects in WA. **REACT** by covering food and monitoring drinks if wasps are seen in your area, or restrict access to any suspect nests. **REPORT** all suspect activity and nests to the Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development via the reporting options below.




