We've had a lot of queries regarding the new recycling program and wanted to compile some local information for you.

To receive a refund, you will need a Scheme ID which you can register for on the Containers for Change website here https://consumer.containersforchange.com.au/create-account?scheme=WA

Eligible containers can be dropped off in bags at a bag-drop located at the end of Council Rd near the cardboard recycling bin.

Please make sure you place your Scheme ID is legible on your bags (tape and permanent marker work just fine).

Currently, bag drop off is on Wednesday and Saturday afternoons from 1pm until 4pm. In the future, a separate bin will be permanently placed there and emptied weekly – meaning you can drop your bags off at any time!

Refunds appear to be processed within approximately 72 business hours.

Dedicated to Brian Clifford Tyrer Born 26 May 1951 Passed away 22 November 2020

A sincere and heartfelt thanks to all of those who attended the service in Brookton on Friday 04 December 2020. The service was a wonderful tribute to Brian and a farewell to an amazing person.

Brian grew up in Brookton with his older brother Noel and younger sister Raelene. He was conscripted into the army the year he turned 19, taking him interstate as part of the 2 year compulsory recruitment. During this time he was awarded most outstanding soldier and was an expert rifleman. On returning to WA, he started life as a butcher at the shop in Brookton run by his father James Tyrer.



Brian married Barbara Jackson during his mid-20s and his two sons, Jay and Peter, were born shortly after. He was dedicated to hard work and looking after his family, most of all his boys. He got involved in racehorses at a young age and had a couple of winners. He loved to study the form guide and enjoyed having a bet or two while enjoying a beer on a Saturday afternoon. In the year 2000 Brian welcomed another child into the family - a daughter named Tina (he had Tina after going up north). He travelled north, worked



in Marble Bar as a station hand and then settled in Port Hedland for a short time before heading back down the coast and then started the Kalbarri shop (in addition to T-Bone and Sons in Beverley).

Brian's many hobbies included duck shooting, fishing and sport. He even managed to jump out of a plane, parachuting 3 times! He continued butchering as well as countless other projects until he was first diagnosed with non-Hodgkins lymphoma in 2011. Following chemotherapy he made a recovery and was working as hard as ever. Unfortunately cancer was detected again in 2019 and he would have to undergo regular chemotherapy along with intense radiation. Brian fought cancer until his body could not handle any more. Despite this, he did not let it get in the way and rarely complained, even though he was ill. There was always a project of job that had to be done and he enjoyed keeping busy and achieving his goals. Brian dedicated his life to his family and will be remembered for his generosity, kindness and incredible sense of humour.

He is gone but not forgotten, his accomplishments and determination will be remembered through all of those who knew and loved him. He will be missed by many and his legacy passed down to his children and grandchildren for a long time to come. Brian was and always will be an extraordinary person who led an extraordinary life.

On a personal note, the family would like to thank the nursing staff and doctors who cared for him right to the end. A big thank you with appreciation and gratitude to the Beverley community as a whole who have been so supportive, not just in the final days but for many years of previous loyalty and kindness.

You are forever in our hearts.



Garden club meeting for December was replaced by a pre-Christmas lunch. Twenty eight members sat down in the dining room of the Hotel Beverley which was nicely decorated for the occasion. The next meeting will be held on Tuesday 02 March at a place to be announced at a later date. We hope the 2021 will be a calm and peaceful year with no return of the dreaded Covid19 virus.

Gardening in January


It's pretty hot out there at the moment, and it definitely isn't the ideal time to be planting much. That said, you can try eggplant, zucchini, cucumber, capsicum, chillies and tomatoes; towards the end of the month.

- Lettuce can be grown at the tail end of January, but consider popping them under a shade cloth tent.
- Try Lemongrass if you haven't already. Its woody nature helps prevent too much damage from the heat. Though wait until things cool down for any other herbs.
- Still time to pop in some asparagus, just find a cooler spot in the patch.
- It's not too late for watermelon and rockmelon.
- Plants feel the need for a feed at this time of year. A seaweed tea or low environmental impact liquid fertiliser is perfect. Throughout the growing period diluted worm teas can be added to your garden every couple of weeks. This will help keep up the growth and fruiting capabilities of your plants. Apply to the soil early in the morning, in the concentrations mentioned on the packet.
- Pretty up the patch with these flowering fancies: marigolds and sunflowers. Popping these in around your veggies will give some colour and interest to the patch, and act as beneficial insect attractors!
- Consider a green manure crop to add some life and love to an overworked patch. This will improve your soil incredibly. For a bit of forward planning, you'll find it well worth the effort!
- Water smarter at this time of year. Water first thing in the morning and instead of quickie irrigation, a nice deep drink a couple of times a week is far more beneficial!
- If you haven't done already, look into drip irrigation. This will put the water where it is needed as well as reducing the risk of powdery mildew when the leaves get wet.

Mulching tips

- Top up mulch on your veggie patches, herb gardens and ornamental beds, especially important if you are heading off this holidays.
- A hot summer tip is to mulch after watering the patch to a depth of about 7cm. Keep mulch clear of plant stems... especially young seedlings.
- Choose sustainable, low environmental impact mulch, one that will enrich your soil as it breaks down.

President's Report 2020

Another year gone by and such a different year it has been.

At the meeting following the AGM in October we welcomed two new members Leonie Taylor and her mother Denise Strange (Boyle). Welcome. Leonie volunteered to update our wedding photo books. She gave us an idea of what she intended and we were delighted. Thanks Leonie.

In October 2019 we had our annual visit from the Year 2 class from Beverley District High School. They had a great time and as usual presented us with a booklet of the fun they had at the Museum. Thanks to all who helped prepare for the day and help on the day of the visit.

In December after a quick meeting, we covered up all our displays and then went to the Beverley Hotel for our Christmas dinner. We had a lovely meal together and then retired for the summer season.

2020 saw us open in March and close again in April for 2 months, due to the COVID-19 pandemic. This of course disrupted plans for Easter, when we planned to have a display of hats and early household items, fans, toasters, irons etc. It also stopped a possible visit to St Peters Church just over the border in York. It also put a halt to a planned talk by Margaret Mourach and to having a display at the Beverley Show.

In June we had a social gathering/meeting to discuss a few things, mainly research that was ongoing, and sift through correspondence that was accumulating. We discussed our way back from the pandemic lockdown and what we had to do to comply with regulations in order to reopen the museum. These things done, with the help of the Shire of Beverley we reopened on the 12th July. Morag opened up, with a good supply of hand sanitizer and surgical gloves. She had a few visitors that had signed on to the Route 120 Challenge to research historic figures living in the towns along Route 120 (Great Southern Highway) from York to Albany.

Our first official meeting back was the following day (13th July) with a good attendance of members eager to be out of lockdown. The Wheatlands Chapter of Museum & Galleries Australia was cancelled this year.

The committee decided to purchase a new (second hand) fire-proof-to-2-hour rated filing cabinet this year. The Society put the paperwork in for a Shire grant and were successful in getting the \$1500 grant that we asked for. The cabinet will be purchased as soon as possible.

At our September meeting we welcomed a new financial member, Adam Freeman. We look forward to his involvement.

In 2022 the Dead Finish building will be 150 years old. We have had a few discussions at meetings and we went to a Shire meeting about our intension to have some celebrations in the community and the possibility of enlisting their help in some way. The Roads Board/Shire started in 1871 and so their 150 years is in 2021.

We also went to Jacinta Murray who is the Tourism Officer for the Shire and we discussed strategies. Jacinta followed up and with Shire approval have started up a community group to celebrate these milestones. Glenys Petchell and Joy Smith are representing the Beverley Historical Society.

We have had good numbers visiting the Museum since we reopened and along with a few caravan clubs, the Veteran Car Club and individual groups visiting out of our regular opening days we had 193 people come through the museum this year to date.

I thank once again the Garden Club for their work in the Museum's garden. Thank you to Glenys Petchell for dealing with the mail and for her reports in the Blarney on our behalf. Thanks also to Erica Murray for duties involved with being the treasurer and Morag for her wonderful secretarial work. Morag thanks also for all the research you have so ably done this year and every year. Also, a big thank-you to our committee and members for their research and re-committing to the Museum after such a disruptive start to the year.

Gauge Your Guts - Why it's Important!

As a nation we are continually being told that we are fat and getting fatter with two thirds of Australian adults now considered overweight or obese. This is no surprise when most of us are living a more sedentary lifestyle and eating more highly processed foods. While we might like to joke at the pub about our '6-pack turning into a keg' there are some serious risks to our health and wellbeing if our panels are bulging. Carrying around extra weight increases our risk of chronic illnesses including type 2 diabetes, cardiovascular disease (pump and pipes), and some cancers including bowel, kidney, and thyroid. So, how do we determine if we are carrying around risky levels of excess fat?

Two of the main recognised methods are body mass index (BMI) and waist circumference. The BMI is a quick measure that compares our weight to our height. The BMI is a useful but not perfect measure because of its inability to distinguish fat mass from lean mass and the distribution of body fat. The waist circumference (measured from tummy button) is a good measure of the risks associated with excess weight because of its ability to indicate fat in the high-risk locations. It is well known that excess fat around our middle carries the risk of obesity related health issues due to its link to visceral fat (the dangerous fat that coats our internal organs). Due to hormonal differences, our stomach area is where blokes often store fat, as opposed to women where it often gets deposited on the hips and thighs. In general, the risk thresholds for adult waist measurements are:

	Waist Circumference	
	Men	Women
Risk Range	94 cm to 102 cm	80 cm to 88 cm
High Risk Range	Greater than 102 cm	Greater than 88 cm

Keep in mind, this is a guide only and identifying risk should always involve a discussion with our GP about a holistic approach to our current health behaviours. If after gauging our guts we find that our panels are bulging, there are some simple steps we can all take to reduce that waistline:

- **Move more** walking the dog or kicking the footy are good places to start and incorporates exercise into our daily lives.
- Choose smaller portion sizes adopt an eating pattern where our food intake matches our calorie needs.
- Adopt a healthy diet eat more fruit and veg, less junk food and sugary drinks.
- **Limit alcohol intake** drink no more than two standard drinks per day, incorporate alcohol-free days and remember "low carb beer" isn't necessarily low calorie!

Don't be tempted by unsustainable "fad diets" that promise quick results and may involve eliminating foods that contain necessary fuel that our bodies need. Remember, we always need to consult our GP or other health professional (dietitian, physiotherapist etc.) if we plan on making substantial exercise or dietary changes.



Dawn Edwards - Beverley Hospital Auxiliary member 1968-2020 58 years of unbroken and dedicated service.

Good morning to you all. Welcome to this special morning tea in the beautiful surrounds of the Railway Station Arts precinct. Today, we show our appreciation to Mrs Dawn Edwards and honour her outstanding contribution of 58 years of unbroken service with the Beverley Hospital Auxiliary.

I particularly want to welcome Judy Edwards one of Dawn's three daughters, Mr Trenton Greive, Operations Manager WA Country Health Service and Michelle Bauer HSM Beverley, various guests who are past Auxiliary committee members or those who are present representing their late mothers who worked alongside Dawn during the early decades.

Over the past 16 years of my being a member of the Beverley Hospital Auxiliary, Dawn has amazed me with her accurate memory of all things to do with the Alex Miles Lodge -of which she was a founding committee member-, the Beverley Hospital and in particular, the Beverley Hospital Auxiliary. Recently, Dawn and I chatted about the beginnings of her service with the Auxiliary. Forgive my inaccuracies or if I am a little loose with the truth.

Quote "The best present anyone can give to another human being or an organisation or a community is TIME" and Dawn Edwards has given 58 years of her time to the Beverley Hospital Auxiliary.

The Hospital Auxiliary commenced in 1944 or thereabouts, but it was suggested in later years by Mrs Lindsay Richardson [dec'd] that an Opportunity Shop be set up in Beverley [1961]. Mrs Richardson noticed that a church group in Katanning had established an Op Shop and thought this could well be a charitable service in Beverley, with all funds raised assisting health care within the community. And I welcome her daughter Rosemary who is with us today.

Tom, Dawn's husband, "dobbed her in" to join the committee whilst enjoying a beer at the pub with other like-minded community men. At that time, the committee was composed of both male and female members. Dawn, as a farmers' wife and busy mother of three young daughters, was coerced into joining. That was in 1962. Who would have thought that 58 years later, she would still be working diligently as a volunteer with the group.

The meetings of the Auxiliary originally took place in the upstairs lounge of The Freemasons Hotel, then later at the Beverley Hospital Board Room. Dawn remembers the lavish afternoon teas being provided by Hospital Chef Ernie Bryant.

The first location of the Op Shop was in a side room of The Freemasons Hotel, kindly loaned rent free for the purpose by the owners at the time and later continued by licensees Tom and Molly Doyle. Over more recent years, the Opportunity Shop has had to relocate to the original Old School Building in Vincent Street [behind the blue fountain], The Child Health Centre where the Cornerstone building now stands and to its current location in the old Roads Board building adjacent to the Town Hall. Dawn has "moved with all of these moves". She has stressed the importance of a main street location, insisted that monies raised be directed solely towards the local community health facilities as per the Constitution of the Auxiliary. She has vigorously helped to find each new location. Dawn remembers that the first pieces of furniture used in the Op Shop were home-made clothing racks made using leftover metal pipe. When the relocation was made to The Old School Building, Dawn strongly supported the President Mrs Anne Szczcesinski [whose mother Marj Cooper was also an Auxiliary member], when she suggested that the beautiful timber counter that had been a part of the Hotel room, should make the move up the street too! As no-one objected or missed it, the Auxiliary acquired ownership - the first real piece of furniture for the Auxiliary. "The counter..... it's coming with us!".

Dawn has fulfilled several positions on the committee over the years. She has been the President three times and was President before the current instrumental in Hospital was built. At the same time, she was an active member in the establishment of The Alex Miles Lodge. She has been the efficient Op Shop Roster Secretary for many years now and we admire her tenacity in hand delivering all those rosters rather than wasting good money on postage! There are over 50 volunteers who take turns to work in the Opportunity Shop on opening days. Dawn knows more people in town than any of us. And has always been welcoming to the new person when their name is added to the list.

She has demonstrated to all past and present committees that it is indeed a privilege to be a part of

this highly regarded volunteer group.

The duties performed by Hospital Auxiliary members has altered somewhat during her 58 years of service. As well as operating the Op Shop, members regularly drove patients to Perth for appointments, sewed curtains for the Hospital at a Busy Bee at The Bowling Club [Dawn is quick to say she is/was not a sewer but I am sure she would have been involved somehow], delivered Christmas gifts to Hospital patients & Lodge residents. Auxiliary members used to regularly visit the patients in Hospital and spend time with them. Dawn remembers the Auxiliary putting the finishing homely touches to the new Hospital before the official opening, the Auxiliary also provided a book trolley service for the patients. And in 1979, the Auxiliary purchased a flagpole for WAY 79 and placed it at the front of the Hospital where it still stands today with a plaque indicating the donor. With changes in the Health system and the subsequent disbanding of a local community Hospital Board, the spending of Auxiliary funds now needs more scrutiny than in the early years. No-one has more knowledge and experience in adhering to the principles set by the Auxiliary's Constitution than Dawn. Her advice is respectfully given, when decisions are being made on where to channel our hard-earned funds. When changes were made to our Constitution in 200, Dawn carefully reminded us of responsibilities to the community but agreed that services further afield used by rural people should also be beneficiaries. For example Cancer Council's accommodation units at Crawford Lodge where country people and their carers/family can stay during treatment, Royal Flying Doctor services, accommodation at Ronald McDonald House for families of seriously ill children.

Dawn has seen many changes in both the role and the functioning of the Hospital Auxiliary, all the while adhering to the principles of this charitable organisation.

And in conclusion....

I remember thinking when first I joined the Auxiliary in 2004 and never having previously met Mrs Edwards, that here is a lady who will soon teach me what this organisation is all about, if I just sit quietly and listen! Frightened might describe my feeling! Gradually, I came to realise that Dawn was passionate about the reason for the Auxiliary being in existence and was and still is determined that it will not fade away as it has in so many other rural towns where volunteer support is always dwindling and the health system, through necessity, is less community based.

She has been a tireless worker, dedicated to the cause and a true historian who provides a pathway for those who have the same desire to serve the community. Her ideas & advice are always welcomed if not always acted upon. How many times has the conversation about whether or not to stock shoes in the Op Shop been robustly discussed at Dawn's tactful insistence? Or how ruthless we all should be when sorting our donated items in order to maintain the high standard of the goods we sell.

Dawn has decided its time for her leave the committee but I know she will always hold a special place in her heart for the Hospital Auxiliary and the service it provides.



Dawn has become a friend for whom I always have had and always will have the utmost respect. And I am sure those sentiments are echoed by you all present today.

Thankyou Dawn. It's been fun and a rare privilege to work beside such a gracious and honourable person. We salute you!

How to check in on someone

Helping others and providing support can make a difference for someone who is having problems and going through a tough time. If you think someone you care about isn't going so well, try the following tips on how to support them and continue to check in on them.



Talk

For most people, just asking if they are okay and listening can make a difference.

By simply being there for someone, they can feel less alone and more supported to open up and talk about how they are really feeling.

Asking open ended questions that require a response is a good way to start the conversation.

FOR EXAMPLE:

- How are you going? What's been happening in your life lately?
- You don't seem quite yourself lately, is something bothering you?
- You seem upset or worried, what's going on? Can I help with something?
- I've noticed you're not going out much lately, anything going on?



Do an activity together

Activities create conversation. Find an opportunity during everyday life activities to start the conversation and ask them how they are really feeling. Try doing activities together such as:



GOING FOR A WALK

GOING TO AN EVENT TOGETHER

GOING FOR A COFFEE OR A MEAL



Listen

Just being there for someone and offering a listening ear can make a difference.

- Show them that you care and are here to listen to them
- 2. Have patience, let others talk and don't judge.
- 3. Be reflective by repeating what they have said.
- Keep calm and accept that they may disagree with you.

After a challenging 2020, the sub centre is looking forward to 2021 when we have some exiting activities planned. As we move forward in 2020, we hope you enjoy reading of the beginning of the sub centre serving our community 85 years ago.

1934 - 1935 A District Asset

A Public Meeting was called on December 22, 1934, to consider establishing a St. John Ambulance Association Branch in Beverley and to acquire a motor ambulance for the district. During the meeting a motion by Mr. Jas Carr was passed to this effect.

"... As pointed out by Mr. Noonan of the York Sub Centre:

'A trained brigade of qualified First-Aid men and a properly equipped ambulance is a great acquisition to a district.'

£300 was considered necessary to establish the Centre. Of this, £150 was provided by the Charities Commission, the remainder being raised by local donations, through an Ambulance Appeal. This included a Ball and a Barn Dance.

The following Office Bearers were elected, being

Mr. F. McDonald as CHAIRMAN

Mr. F. L. Duffield as SECRETARY

Mr. J. Carr as TREASURER

The van was to be located in Mr. W. White's garage for convenience.

In May 1935, an ambulance was ordered at a cost of £300 and incorporated all the latest improvements and was a distinct improvement on the majority of ambulances now operating in the State. The most notable improvements being a roomier body, stretches provided for 2 patients, seats for the attendants and interior lighting. The van was mounted on a Bedford chassis.

In October 1935, the ambulance was fully equipped and ready for service with a squad of 6 trained St. John Ambulance and First-Aid attendants. It could be summoned for service at any time by telephoning the

Sunday, 27th October was the first call for the ambulance when a young woman was removed from her home to the Beverley Hospital.




